### PRESENT.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

THEREAS by the Treaty of Peace between the Allied and Associated Powers and Germany, signed at Versailles on the Twenty-eighth day of June, 1919, Germany renounced in favour of the Principal Allied and Associated Powers all her rights and titles over her Oversea possessions:

And whereas the said Treaty having been duly ratified as therein provided came into force on the Tenth day of January, 1920:

And whereas it has been agreed between the Principal Allied and Associated Powers that the territories of Africa situate within the limits of this Order (being part of the territories formerly known as German East Africa) shall be administered by His Majesty the King, subject to and in accordance with the provisions of the said Treaty:

And whereas accordingly by treaty, capitulation, grant, usage, sufferance and other lawful means His Majesty has power and jurisdiction within the said territories (hereinafter called the Tanganyika Territory):

. Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers on this behalf by the Foreign Jurisdiction Act, 1890, or otherwise, in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with

the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Preliminary.

1. This Order may be cited as Tanganyika Order in Council, 1920.''

The limits of this Order are the territories comprised in the Tanganyika Territory, which includes the territories bounded on the east by the Indian Ocean; on the north by the frontiers of the East Africa and Uganda Protectorates; on the west by the Belgian Congo, including that part of the territories formerly known as German East Africa placed under the administration of Belgium in accordance with the hereinbefore recited Treaty; and on the south by the frontiers of Northern Rhodesia, the Nyasaland Protectorate and Portuguese East Africa, and within the territories comprised in the Tanganyika Territory are also included Mafia Island and all adjacent islands between the mouths of the Rivers Rovuma and Umba, which do not form part dominions of His Highness the Sultan of Zanzibar.

The said territories are in this Order referred to as "the Territory."

2. In this Order—
"Secretary of State" means one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State; "Public Lands" means all lands in the

Territory which are subject to the control of His Majesty, by virtue of any Treaty,

Convention, or Agreement, or of His Majesty's Protectorate, and all lands which shall have been acquired for the public service or otherwise howsoever;

"Gazette" means the Gazette of the

Tanganyika Territory;
"Person" includes Corporation;

Words importing the plural or the singular may be construed as referring to one person or thing or to more than one person or thing, and words importing the masculine as referring to females (as the case may require).

3.—(1) Where this Order or any Ordinance confers a power or imposes a duty, then, unless a contrary intention appears, the power may be exercised and the duty shall be performed from time to time as occasion requires.

(2) Where this Order or any Ordinance confers a power or imposes a duty on the holder of an office, then, unless a contrary intention appears, the power may be exercised and the duty shall be performed by the holder of the office for the time being or by a person duly

appointed to act for him.

(3) Where this Order or any Ordinance confers a power to make rules, regulations, or orders, then, unless a contrary intention appears, the power shall be construed as including a power, exercisable in the like manner and subject to the like approval and conditions (if any) to rescind, revoke, amend or vary the rules, regulations, or orders.

(4) Expressions defined in this Order shall have the same respective meanings in any Ordinances, rules, or regulations made under this Order, unless a contrary intention appears.

Administration.

4.—(1) His Majesty may, by a Commission under His Sign Manual and Signet, appoint a fit person to administer the Government of the Territory under the designation of Governor and Commander-in-Chief, or such other designation as His Majesty thinks fit, and the person so appointed is hereinafter referred to as the Governor.

(2) The said Governor is hereby authorized, empowered, and commanded to do and execute all things that belong to his said office, according to the tenour of any Orders in Council relating to the Territory, and of such Commission as may be issued to him under His Majesty's Sign Manual and Signet, and according to such Instructions as may from time to time be given to him under His Majesty's Sign Manual and Signet, or by Order in Council, or by His Majesty through one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, and to such laws as are now or shall hereafter be in force in the Territory.

(3) Every person appointed to fill the office of Governor shall, with all due solemnity, before entering on any of the duties of his office, cause the Commission appointing him to be Governor to be read and published in the presence of a Judge of His Majesty's High Court or, if there be no Judge of the said Court who is able to attend, in the presence of such other His Majesty's Officers in the Territory as can conveniently attend, which being done, he shall then and there take before him or them the Oath of Allegiance in the form provided by an Act passed in the Session holden in the Thirty-first and Thirty-second years of the Reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled "An Act to amend the Law relating to Promissory Oatha"; and likewise the usual oath for the due execution of the office of Governor and for the due and impartial administration of justice, which oaths the said Judge, or some other of His Majesty's Officers then present, is hereby required to administer.

- (4) Whenever the office of Governor is vacant, or if the Governor become incapable or be absent from the Territory, or is from any cause prevented from acting in the duties of his office, the person appointed to be Chief Secretary to the Government of the Territory, or if there be no such Officer therein, or such Officer be unable to act, then such person or persons as His Majesty may appoint under His Sign Manual and Signet, and in default of any such appointment the Senior Member of the Executive Council shall, during His Majesty's pleasure, administer the Government of the Territory, first taking the oaths hereinbefore directed to be taken by the Governor and in the manner herein prescribed, which being done, the Chief Secretary or any other such Administrator as aforesaid is hereby authorized, empowered, and commanded to do and execute, during His Majesty's pleasure, all things that belong to the office of Governor according to the tenour of this Order, and according to His Majesty's Instructions as aforesaid, and the laws of the Territory. Provided that the Governor during his passage by sea to or from any part of the Territory, or when, in the exercise or discharge of any powers or duties by this Order in Council or otherwise conferred or imposed upon him, he is in any territories adjacent to or near to the Territory, shall not be considered to be absent from the Territory.
- (5) In the event of the Governor having occasion at any time to be temporarily absent for a short period from the seat of Government, or, in the exercise or discharge of any powers or duties conferred or imposed upon him by His Majesty, or through one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, to visit any territories adjacent to or near to the Territory, he may by an instrument under the Public Seal of the Territory appoint the Chief Secre-tary, or if there be no such Officer, or such Officer is absent or unable to act, then any other person to be his Deputy within any part of the Territory, during such temporary absence and in that capacity to exercise, perform and execute, for and on behalf of the Governor during such absence but no longer, all such powers and authorities vested in the Governor (except the power of pardon), as shall in and by such instrument be specified and limited, but no others. Every such Deputy shall conform to and observe all such instructions as the Governor shall from time to time address to him for his guidance. Provided nevertheless that by the appointment of a Deputy as aforesaid the power and authority of the Governor shall not be abridged, altered, or in any way affected otherwise than His Majesty

may at any time think proper to direct.
5. The Governor shall have an Official Seal, bearing the style of his office, and such device as a Secretary of State from time to time approves, and such seal shall be deemed the Public Seal of the Territory, and may be kept and used by the Governor for the sealing of all things whatsoever that shall pass the Public Seal. And, until a Public Seal shall be provided, the seal of the Governor may be used as the Public Seal.

6. There shall be an Executive Council in and for the Territory, and the said Council shall consist of such persons as His Majesty may direct by Instructions under His Majesty's Sign Manual and Signet, and all such persons shall hold their places in the said Council

during His Majesty's pleasure.

7.—(1) The Governor may, with the approval of a Secretary of State, by Proclamation, define any boundaries of the territories for the time being within the limits of this Order, and divide those territories into provinces or districts in such manner and with such subdivisions as may be convenient for purposes of administration describing the boundaries thereof and assigning names thereto.

(2) If a question arises whether any place is or is not within the Territory, or within any province, and such question does not appear to be determined by any such Proclamation, or other evidence, it shall be referred to the Governor, and a certificate under his hand and seal shall be conclusive on the question, and

judicial notice shall be taken thereof.

8.—(1) All rights in or in relation to any public lands shall vest in and may be exercised by the Governor for the time being in trust for His Majesty, or if the Secretary, of State at any time with respect to all or any such lands by Order under his hand so directs, in such other trustee or trustees for His Majesty as the Secretary of State may appoint

(2) The Secretary of State may, when he thinks fit, by a like Order remove any trustee so appointed, and may appoint any new or

additional trustee or trustees.

(3) All mines and minerals being in, under or on any lands, in the occupation of any native tribe, or any members thereof, or of any person not possessed of the right to work such mines and minerals, shall vest in the Governor, or such trustee or trustees, in like manner as the mines and minerals in, under or on any public lands.

(4) The Governor, or such other trustee or trustees, may make grants or leases of any such public lands or minerals as aforesaid, or may permit such lands to be temporarily occupied on such terms and conditions as he or they may think fit, subject to the provisions of any

Ordinance.

(5) Subject as aforesaid, the Governor, in His Majesty's name and on His Majesty's behalf, may make and execute, under the Public Seal, grants and dispositions of any lands within the Territory which may be lawfully granted or disposed of by His Majesty: Provided that every such grant or disposition be made in conformity either with some Order in Council or law now or hereafter in force in the Territory, or with some Instructions which may be addressed to the Governor under His Majesty's Sign Manual and Signet, or through a Secretary of State.

9. A Secretary of State, or the Governor, subject to the directions of a Secretary of State, may, on behalf of His Majesty, appoint, or authorize the appointment of, such public officers for the administration of the Territory, under such designations as he may think fit, and may prescribe their duties; and all such public officers, unless otherwise provided by law, shall hold their offices during His Majesty's

pleasure.

10. The Governor may, upon sufficient cause to him appearing, suspend from the exercise of his office any person holding any office within the Territory, whether appointed by virtue of any Commission or Warrant from His Majesty or in His Majesty's name or by any other mode of appointment. Every such suspension shall continue and have effect only until Majesty's pleasure therein shall be signified to the Governor. In proceeding to any such suspension, the Governor is strictly to observe the directions in that behalf given to him by any

Instructions as aforesaid. 11. When any crime or offence has been committed within the Territory, or for which the offender may be tried therein, the Governor may, as he shall see occasion, in His Majesty's name and on His Majesty's behalf, grant a pardon to any accomplice in such crime or offence who shall give such information as shall lead to the conviction of the principal offender, or of any one of such offenders, if more than one; and further, may grant to any offender convicted in any Court, or before any Judge or other Magistrate, within the Territory a pardon, either free or subject to lawful conditions, or any remission of the sentence passed on such offender, or any respite of the execution of such sentence, for such period as the Governor thinks fit, and may remit any fines, penalties or forfeitures due or accrued to His Majesty

12. All Ordinances, Proclamations, Regulations, Rules or other public notifications shall be published in the Gazette and also in such other manner as the Governor may direct in

the case of any particular notification.

Legislation.

13.—(1) The Governor may make Ordinances for the administration of justice, the raising of revenue, and generally for the peace, order and good government of all persons in the Territory.

(2) In the making of any Ordinances, the Governor shall conform to and observe all rules, regulations and directions in that behalf contained in any Instructions under His

Majesty's Sign Manual and Signet.

(3) The Governor shall observe any general or special instructions of the Secretary of State with respect to the previous submission to the Secretary of State of draft Ordinances, to the making of Ordinances for particular purposes, to the amendment of Ordinances or draft Ordinances, and to other matters in relation thereto; but nothing in this provision shall affect the validity of any Ordinance.

(4) In making Ordinances, the Governor shall respect existing native laws and customs except so far as the same may be opposed to

justice or morality.

(5) The Governor shall sign every Ordinance made by him, and shall, at the first available opportunity, transmit two authenticated copies

thereof to the Secretary of State.

(6) The Secretary of State may disallow any Ordinance, wholly or in part, and upon such disallowance being publicly notified in the Gazette, the provisions so disallowed shail thereupon cease to have effect, but without prejudice to anything lawfully done or suffered thereunder.

(7) The Ordinances of each year shall be numbered consecutively and each may be cited by its number and year or by its short title

(8) Where a date for the commencement of an Ordinance is not fixed in the Ordinance it shall come into force on the day on which it is promulgated by the Governor.

(9) An Ordinance may apply to the Territory any Act or law of the United Kingdom, or of any legislature of India, or of any Colony or Protectorate, subject to any exceptions and modifications which may be deemed fitting.

(10) The Governor shall, at the first available opportunity after any rules or regulations are made under any Ordinance by any person or body authorized, transmit two authenticated copies thereof to the Secretary of State.

(11) An Ordinance shall not be repealable by any rules or regulations made under an

Ordinance.

(12) An Ordinance varying or affecting any Order in Council relating to the Territory shall not come into force unless it has been previously approved by the Secretary of State, and such approval shall be recited therein.

Application of Law.

14. The enactments described in the First Schedule to the Foreign Jurisdiction Act, 1890, shall apply to the Territory as if it were a British Colony or Possession, but subject to the provisions of this Order and to the exceptions, adaptations, and modifications following, that is to say:

(i) The Governor is hereby substituted for the Governor of a Colony or British Possession, and the High Court is hereby substituted for a Superior Court or Supreme Court, and for a Magistrate or Justice of the Peace of a Colony or British Possession.

(ii) For the portions of the Merchant Shipping Acts, 1854 and 1867, referred to in the said Schedule, shall be substituted Part XIII. of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894.

(iii) In Section 51 of the Conveyancing (Scotland) Act, 1874, and any enactment for the time being in force amending the same, the High Court is substituted for a Court of Probate in a Colony.

respect to (iv) With the Fugitive Offenders Act, 1881:

(a) So much of the 4th and 5th sections of the said Act as relates to sending a report of the issue of a warrant, together with the information, or a copy thereof, or to the sending of a certificate of committal and report of a case, or to the information to be given by a Magistrate to a fugitive, shall be excepted, and in lieu of such information the person acting as the Magistrate shall inform the fugitive that in the British Possession or Protectorate to which he may be conveyed he has the right to apply for a writ of habeas corpus or other like process.

(b) So much of the 6th section of the said Act as requires the expiration of fifteen days before issue of warrant, shall

be excepted.

- (c) The Governor shall not be bound to return a fugitive offender to a British Possession unless satisfied that the proceedings to obtain his return are taken with the consent of the Governor of that Possession.
- (d) For the purposes of Part II. of the said Act, the East Africa, Uganda and Zanzibar Proteotorates and the Tanganyika Territory and all British Possessions and Protectorates in Africa south of the Equator shall be deemed to be one group of British Possessions.

Provided that nothing in this Article con-

tained shall be taken to extend to the Territory the enactments mentioned in the Schedule to the Foreign Jurisdiction Act, 1913, or any of them.

15. Where under the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, or any amending Act, anything is authorized to be done by, to, or before a British Consular officer, such thing may be done, in any place in the Territory at which there is no Consular officer, by, to, or before such officer of the Government of the Territory as the Governor may appoint.

16. The Colonial Prisoners Removal Act,

1884, shall apply to and take effect within the Territory as if the same were a British Possession and part of His Majesty's dominions, sub-

ject as follows:-

The Governor is hereby substituted for the Governor of a British Possession.

Courts of Justice.

17.—(1) There shall be a Court of Record styled "His Majesty's High Court of Tanganyika" (in this Order referred to as the High Court). Save as hereinafter expressed the High Court shall have full jurisdiction, civil and criminal, over all persons and over all matters in the Territory.

- (2) Subject to the other provisions of this Order, such civil and criminal jurisdiction shall, so far as circumstances admit, exercised in conformity with the Civil Procedure, Criminal Procedure and Penal Codes of India and the other Indian Acts and other laws which are in force in the territory at the date of the commencement of this Order or may hereafter be applied or enacted, and subject thereto and so far as the same shall not extend or apply shall be exercised in conformity with the substance of the common law, the doctrines of equity and the statutes of general application in force in England at the date of this Order and with the powers vested in and according to the procedure and practice observed by and before Courts of Justice and Justices of the Peace in England according to their respective jurisdictions and authorities at that date, save in so far as the said Civil Procedure, Criminal Procedure and Penal Codes of India and other Indian Acts and other laws in force as aforesaid and the said common law, doctrines of equity and statutes of general application and the said powers, procedure and practice may, at any time before the commencement of this Order, have been or may hereafter be modified, amended or replaced by other provision in lieu thereof by or under the authority of any Order of His Majesty in Council, or by any Proclamation issued or by any Ordinance or Ordinances passed in and for the Territory: Provided always, that the said common law, doctrines of equity and statutes of general application shall be in force in the Territory so far only as the circumstances of the Territory and its inhabitants and the limits of His Majesty's jurisdiction permit, and subject to such qualifications as local circumstances may render necessary.
- (3) The High Court shall sit at such place or places as the Governor may appoint.
- (4) The High Court shall have a seal bearing the style of the Court and a device approved by the Secretary of State; but until such seal is provided a stamp bearing the words "High Court of Tanganyika" may be used instead thereof.
  - 18.—(1) The High Court shall be a Court of

Admiralty, and shall exercise Admiralty jurisdiction in all matters arising on the high seas or elsewhere or upon any lake or other navigable inland waters or otherwise relating to ships

or shipping.

(2) The following enactments of the Colonial Courts of Admiralty Act, 1890, that is to say, Section 2, Subsections (2) to (4), Sections 5 and 6, Section 16, Subsection (3), shall apply to the High Court as if in the said sections the said Court were mentioned in lieu of a Colonial Court of Admiralty, and the Territory were referred to in lieu of a British possession.

19.—(1) There shall be as many Judges of the High Court as may from time to time be

required.

(2) Every Judge shall be appointed by Letters Patent under the Public Seal of the Territory by the Governor in accordance with such instructions as he may receive from His Majesty through a Secretary of State, and shall hold office during His Majesty's pleasure.

(3) When there are more Judges than one, the principal Judge shall have such distinguishing title as the Secretary of State may approve.

(4) In any case of death, illness, or absence, or in any other emergency, the Governor may

appoint an acting Judge.

- 20. The High Court shall exercise full jurisdiction with regard to all crimes and offences committed before the commencement of this Order within the Territory, or for which the offender may be tried therein, and such jurisdiction shall be exercised in conformity with the law in force in the Territory at the date when such crime or offence was committed and in conformity either with the procedure in force in the Territory at that date or, at the discretion of the High Court, with the procedure in force under Article 17 (2) of this Order.
- force under Article 17 (2) of this Order.
  21.—(1) There shall also be a Special Tribunal, which shall consist of one of the Judges of the High Court appointed by the Governor to hold such Tribunal, sitting either alone or together with such other person or

persons as the Governor may direct.

- (2) The Special Tribunal shall exercise full jurisdiction in all civil causes and matters which arose before the commencement of this Order, and such jurisdiction shall, so far as circumstances admit, be exercised in conformity with the law and procedure in force in the Territory at the date when the cause of action arose, unless the Special Tribunal shall be satisfied that some other law is applicable to such cause or matter or that the procedure in force under Article 17 (2) of this Order is more suitable thereto, in which case it shall exercise the said jurisdiction in conformity with such other law or procedure.
- (3) All periods of prescription or limitation of rights of action, whether they began to run before or after the outbreak of war, shall be treated as having been suspended by the duration of the war. They shall begin to run again from the date of this Order.
- (4) The Special Tribunal shall also exercise such other civil jurisdiction as may be assigned to it by or under the authority of any Order of His Majesty in Council or by any Ordinance or Ordinances passed in and for the Territory, and shall exercise such jurisdiction in conformity with the law and procedure mentioned in Article 17 (2) of this Order.
- in Article 17 (2) of this Order.

  (5) The Special Tribunal may, with the concurrence of the Governor, delegate to any subordinate Court or to any officer in the

Territory all or any of its powers under this Order. Such delegation shall, however, be subject to such limitations and to such conditions either with regard to appeal or otherwise as the Special Tribunal shall think fit.

(6) No appeal shall lie from any order find-

ing or decree of the Special Tribunal.

(7) Any order or decree of the Special Tribunal may be executed in the same manner as similar orders or decrees of the High Court are executed, and the Special Tribunal may in its discretion transfer any such order or decree to the High Court for execution and the High Court shall proceed as if such order or decree had been made by itself.

22.—(1) Courts subordinate to the High Court and Courts of special jurisdiction may be constituted by or under the provisions of any

Ordinance as occasion requires.

(2) Provision may be made by Ordinance for the hearing and determining of appeals from any such Court by the High Court or otherwise.

23. Article 9 of this Order shall apply to the appointment of all Judges and Magistrates (other than Judges of the High Court), and to Registrars and other principal officers of the High Court in like manner as it applies to public officers.

24. In all cases civil and criminal to which natives are parties every Court shall (a) be guided by native law so far as it is applicable and is not repugnant to justice and morality or inconsistent with any Order in Council or Ordinance or any Regulation or Rule made under any Order in Council or Ordinance; and shall (b) decide all such cases according to substantial justice without undue regard to technicalities of procedure and without undue delay.

25. When any person has been sentenced to death the High Court shall transmit to the Governor a copy of the evidence, and the sentence shall not be carried into effect until con-

firmed by him.

26.—(1) Subject to the provisions of any Ordinance, the High Court may, with the approval of the Governor, make Rules for regulating the practice and procedure of the High Court and of all other Courts (except the Special Tribunal) which may be established in the Territory.

(2) The power to make Rules under this Article shall include (a) a power to fix fees and scales of remuneration, and (b) a power to regulate the conditions upon which persons may be admitted to practice as advocates or solicitors

in such Courts

(3) At the first available opportunity after such Rules are made, the Governor shall transmit an authenticated copy thereof to the

Secretary of State.

27. The Judge of the Special Tribunal shall have the same power to make Rules regulating the practice and procedure of the Special Tribunal as is conferred on the High Court by the preceding Article, and the provisions of that Article shall apply, mutatis mutandis, to Rules so made by the Judge of the Special Tribunal.

28.—(1) A Court under this Order shall not exercise any jurisdiction in any proceeding whatsoever over the Governor or his official or other residences or his official or other property.

(2) This Article shall not operate in bar of any proceeding against the Governor in his official capacity, where it is sought to establish any liability of the Government of the Territory.

Indemnification and Validation.

29.—(1) No action or other legal proceeding whatsoever, whether civil or criminal, shall be instituted in any Court for or on account of or in respect of any act, matter or thing done in the Territory during the war with Germany, or between the termination of such war and the date of this Order if done in good faith and done or purported to be done in the execution of his duty or for the public safety, or for the enforcement of discipline, or otherwise in the public interest, by a person holding office under or employed in the service of the Crown in any capacity, whether naval, military, air-force, or civil, or by any other person acting under the authority of a person so holding office or so employed; and if any such proceeding has been instituted, whether before or after the date of this Order, it shall be discharged and made void.

(2) For the purpose of this Article a certificate by the Governor that any act, matter or thing was done under the authority of a person so holding office or so employed as aforesaid shall be sufficient evidence of the facts stated in the certificate, and any such act, matter or thing done by or under the authority of a person so holding office or so employed as aforesaid shall be deemed to have been done in good faith

unless the contrary is proved.

30. Any sentence passed, judgment given, or order made before the date of this Order in the territories comprised in the Territory, by any military Court (other than a Court Martial constituted in pursuance of any Statute) in connection with the said war, or by any Court established for the administration of justice in the said territories shall be deemed to be and always to have been valid, and to be and always to have been within the jurisdiction of the Court

31. All laws, proclamations and other legislative acts made, issued or done before the date of this Order by the authority for the time being administering the said territories for the peace, order or good government thereof shall be deemed to be and always to have been valid and of full effect, notwithstanding that any such legislative act may have repealed or been inconsistent with the law previously in force in the said territories

Removal and Deportation.

32. Where an offender convicted before any Court is sentenced to imprisonment, and the Governor, proceeding under Section 7 of the Foreign Jurisdiction Act, 1890, authority in that behalf being hereby given to him, considers it expedient that the sentence should be carried into effect outside of the Territory the place shall be a place in some part of His Majesty's dominions out of the United Kingdom, the Government whereof consents that offenders may be sent thither under this Article.

33.—(1) Where it is shown by evidence on cath, to the satisfaction of the Governor, that any person is conducting himself so as to be dangerous to peace and good order in the Territory, or is endeavouring to excite enmity between the people of the Territory and His Majesty, or is intriguing against His Majesty's power and authority in the Territory, the Governor may, if he thinks fit, by order under his hand and official seal order that person to be deported from the Territory to such place as the Governor may direct.

(2) The place shall be a place in some part (if any) of His Majesty's dominions to which the person belongs, or the Government of which consents to the reception of persons deported under this Order, or to some place under the protection of His Majesty, or in the country out of His Majesty's Dominions to which that person belongs.

(3) An appeal shall not lie against an order

of deportation made under this Article.

(4) If any person deported under this Order returns to the Territory without the permission in writing of the Secretary of State (which permission the Secrétary of State may give) he shall be deemed guilty of an offence, and liable, on conviction, to imprisonment for any period not exceeding three months with or without a fine not exceeding five hundred rupees or florins; and he shall also be liable to be again deported forthwith.

(5) The Governor, by order under his hand and official seal, may vary or rescind any order of deportation under this Article.

(6) The Governor shall forthwith report to the Secretary of State every order made by him under this Article, and the grounds thereof,

and the proceedings thereunder.

34.—(1) Where, under this Order, a person is to be removed or deported from the Territory he shall, by warrant of the Governor under his hand and seal, be detained, if necessary, in custody or in prison, until a fit opportunity for his removal or deportation occurs, and then, if he is to be deported beyond sea, be put on board one of His Majesty's vessels of war, or, if none is available, then on board some other British or other fit vessel.

(2) The warrant of the Governor shall be sufficient authority to the person to whom it is directed or delivered for execution, and to the commander or master of the vessel to receive and detain the person therein named, in the manner therein prescribed, and to remove and carry him to the place therein named, accord-

ing to the warrant.

(3) In case of removal for any purpose other than deportation, the warrant of the Governor shall be issued in duplicate, and the person executing it shall, as soon as practicable after his arrival at the place therein named, deliver, according to the warrant, with one of the duplicates of the warrant, to a constable, or proper officer of police or keeper of a prison, or other proper authority or person there, the person named in the warrant, to be produced on the order of the proper Court or authority there, or to be otherwise dealt with according to law

35. Subject to the other provisions of this Order, all expenses of removal of prisoners and others, and the expenses of deportation, and of the sending of any person to any part of His Majesty's dominions or Protectorates, including expenses of maintenance, shall be defrayed in such manner as the Secretary of

State directs.

Supplementary.

36. All His Majesty's Officers, Civil and Military, and all other the inhabitants of the Territory are hereby required and commanded to be obedient, aiding and assisting unto the Governor and to such person or persons as may from time to time, under the provisions of this Order, administer the Government of the Territory.

37. In this Order the term "the Governor," unless inconsistent with the context, shall include every person for the time being administering the Government of the Territory.

38. His Majesty, His heirs and successors, in Council may at any time revoke, alter or

amend this Order.
39. There shall be reserved to His Majesty, His heirs and successors, His and their undoubted right, with the advice of His or their Privy Council, from time to time to make all such laws or Ordinances as may appear to Him or them necessary for the peace, order and good government of the Territory.
40. This Order shall commence and have

effect as follows:

(1) As to the making of any Warrant or appointment, the framing of Ordinances and Rules of Procedure, and the issue of instructions, and as to the provisions relating to indemnification and validation, and as to any other provisions necessary for bringing this Order into effect, immediately from and after the date of this Order.

(2) As to all other matters and provisions comprised and contained in this Order, immediately after this Order has been read and proclaimed within the Territory, and the time of such proclamation shall be deemed to be the time of the commencement

of this Order.

And the Right Honourable Viscount Milner, G.C.B., G.C.M.G., one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, is to give the necessary directions herein.



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### SCHEDULE.

### PRÆFATIO STATUTORUM FUNDATORIS. 1473.

In nomine Sanctæ ac Individuæ Trinitatis, Patris et Filii et Spiritus Sancti, necnon beatissimæ Mariæ virginis et sanctæ Katerinæ, omniumque sanctorum Dei. We the Master, Fellows and Scholars of St. Catharine's College in the University of Cambridge in exercise of the powers given to us by the 54th section of the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act 1877 (40 and 41 Victoria Chapter 48) do hereby make the following Statutes for St Catharine's College in the University of Cambridge, such Statutes to be in substitution for the existing Statutes of the said College, and do declare them to be Statutes wholly for the said College within the meaning of Section 30 of the said Act.

### STATUTE I.

### The Constitution and Government of the College.

- 1. The Visitor of the College shall be, as heretofore, the Crown acting through the Lord Chancellor of Great Britain for the time being.
- 2. The College consists of a Master, Fellows and Scholars. The Government of the College shall be vested in the Master and Fellows.
- 3. There shall be one College Meeting in the Michaelmas term in every year, on a day to be fixed by the Master, of which fourteen days' notice in writing shall be given to each of the Fellows. If any of the Fellows be absent from the Meeting in any year, he shall be fined a sum of Five pounds, and such fine shall be applied to such purposes as the Master and Fellows think fit.

The Master shall call meetings of the Master and Fellows whenever he may think it necessary and when a majority of the Fellows shall require him to do so, such requisition to be made in writing.

No Fellow shall be absent without sufficient reason from a College Meeting duly called.

No business shall be done at a College Meeting unless at least one-half of the whole body of Master and Fellows be present; but the Master and Fellows may delegate to any Committee or Committees of the whole body the transaction of such business as may seem to them fit.

No Fellow in statu pupillari shall be allowed to vote at any meeting until the expiration of one year from the date of his admission as Fellow.

- 4. Every Fellow shall leave with such person as the Master and Fellows may appoint the name of the place of address to which, when he is absent from College, notices intended for him should be sent; and in all cases in which notice is required to be given to any Fellow, it shall be sufficient that the notice be sent to such address by post or otherwise.
- 5. The College seal shall be kept in a box secured by two locks of different patterns, the keys of which shall be kept by the Master and the Bursar respectively.

Before the seal is affixed to any document it shall be copied into the College Register and shall be produced for inspection at a meeting of the Master and Fellows called for the purpose.

All deeds of importance affecting the property or interests of the College shall be copied into the College Register, and be kept in the Treasury, nor shall they be taken therefrom except for the defence of the rights of the College or other grave cause approved as sufficient by the Master and Fellows.

### STATUTE II.

The Master, President and Vice-Master.

1. There shall be in the College a Master or Keeper, of good life and conversation, well qualified by learning and experience of business, of at least thirty years of age, and a Master of Arts or of some equal or superior degree in the University of Cambridge or Oxford.

He shall exercise a general superintendence over the affairs of the College, as a place of education, religion, learning and research, and shall, whenever possible, take part in the College teaching and administration.

The Master shall receive in every year out of the revenues of the College as hereinafter provided a sum equal to two dividends of a fellow, but if he shall hold not the Canonry at Norwich he shall receive four dividends in lieu of two.

He shall not be absent from the College more than one hundred and eighty days in any year except on account of illness or other grave cause, nor shall he be absent from the College more than one-third of any term except on account of illness or other grave cause. If the Master being a Canon of Norwich resigns such Canonry without the leave of at least two-thirds of the Fellows, he shall ipso facto vacate the office of Master.

2. When the office of Master becomes vacant, the Senior resident Fellow shall, within three days after the vacancy is made known to him, give notice of the vacancy to all the other Fellows, whether present in College or absent, and summon them in writing to meet for the election of a new Master on some day not less than fourteen days nor more than thirty days after the date of such notice.

If, however, the vacancy of the office of Master is first made known to the said Senio: Fellow in the vacation after the Easter Term and before the sixteenth day of September in any year, the meeting for the election of a new Master shall be held on some day in the first week of the ensuing Michaelmas Term.

On the day appointed for the election the Fellows shall meet together at noon in the College Chapel. The prayers "Veni creator" and "Deus qui corda" shall be said; and the Fellows shall proceed severally to nominate and elect a duly qualified person for the office of Master.

If upon a first scrutiny there shall be no person nominated and elected by a majority of the whole body of existing Fellows, they shall proceed to nominate and elect a second time, and the process of nominating and electing shall be repeated as often as the Fellows think proper within forty-eight hours after the commencement of the first scrutiny. If at the end of the said forty-eight hours there be no person nominated and elected by a majority of the whole body of existing Fellows, the appointment of a Master for that turn shall be vested in the Visitor.

The person nominated or elected or appointed shall make the following declaration before he acts as Master, "Ego N. do fidem quod collegium sive aulam divae catharinae virginis, terras et tenementa, possessiones, redditus temporales et ecclesiasticos, jura et bona quaecunque collegii sive aulae praedictae regam, defendam, custodiam et gubernabo, et per alios

regi, custodiri et gubernari faciam quantum potero. Item statuta ejusdem collegii edita, et in posterum edenda, firmiter observabo. Item collegium sive aulam praedictam cum omnibus bonis ejusdem contra omnes adversarios ejus quantum potero tuebor et defendam. Et quantum in me fuerit, correctiones, punitiones, et reformationes justas et debitas faciam et exercebo ac per alios fieri et exerceri, quantum in me est, curabo."

3. The Master shall appoint in writing from time to time one of the Fellows of the degree of Master of Arts, or of some equal or superior degree, to represent him in his absence.

Such Fellow shall be called the President, and shall have the authority of the Master when absent in all college business.

The President shall receive out of the revenues of the College a yearly stipend determined by the Master and Fellows, and shall hold the office until such time as the Master shall appoint in writing some other of the Fellows in his stead.

4. If the Master shall have been convicted by a Court of competent jurisdiction of any crime, the Visitor may, if he think fit, proceed to enquire into the fact of such conviction, and if it be established may deprive the Master of his office.

If any three or more of the Fellows shall prefer to the Visitor a charge against the Master of disgraceful conduct, or of malversation in his office, or of gross neglect of duty whereby he has in their judgment become unfit to preside over the College, the Visitor shall with all convenient speed proceed to inquire into the facts of the case, and if the charge be established, may deprive the Master of his office.

5. If the Master shall at any time become incapable of performing the duties of his office, the Visitor on being satisfied thereof shall, upon the application of a majority of the Fellows, present at a meeting convened for the purpose of taking the matter into consideration, such majority consisting of at least a moiety of the whole number of Fellows, or upon the application of the Master himself, have power to appoint one of the Fellows to act in the Master's place during his incapacity and to assign to the person so appointed such portion as the Visitor shall think fit, not exceeding one-third, of the income assigned to the Master by these Statutes.

It shall be incumbent upon the Senior Fellow in residence to convene the meeting of the Fellows for the purpose mentioned in the foregoing paragraph, upon the request of any three or more of the Fellows, and to cause notice of such meeting to be sent to each of the Fellows.

The Fellow who shall be appointed by the Visitor to act in the Master's place shall be called Vice-Master. He shall retain his office, and receive the portion of the Master's income which shall have been assigned to him, until the Master shall be reinstated in his functions and powers, or shall cease to be Master. He shall exercise and perform all the functions and duties, and shall have all the powers and authorities of the Master except the power of consenting to any change of the Master's emoluments, and shall be bound to residence in the same manner, and be liable to depriva-

tion for the same causes and in like manner as the Master.

If the Vice-Master shall die or resign his office, or vacate his Fellowship or become incapable of discharging his duties, the Visitor shall have the like power upon the like application of appointing another of the Fellows to be Vice-Master in his room, and of assigning an income limited as aforesaid, to such Vice-Master.

If the Master shall at any time after the appointment of a Vice-Master again become capable of performing his duties, the Visitor on being satisfied thereof, shall have power to reinstate him in his functions and powers and in receipt of all his emoluments.

### STATUTE III.

### The Fellows.

· 1. Besides the Master there shall be in the College six Fellows, or more than six if the revenues of the College are sufficient to provide for the maintenance of more than six.

One of the Fellowships shall be deemed to be and shall be a Professorial Fellowship, and shall be held according to the terms and conditions prescribed by the Statutes of the University for Professorial Fellowships made under the powers of the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877.

2. Fellows shall be graduates of some University of recognised standing and shall be chosen for their learning, teaching ability, or administrative powers.

The Master and Fellows may elect to a Fellowship any specially qualified person whether or not he be a graduate of some University, provided that the election be made by the votes of not less than two-thirds of the whole body of Master and Fellows, and provided also that not more than one Fellowship be held under this provision at the same time.

3. A Fellowship is held in the first instance for three years.

Every ordinary Fellow except the Professorial Fellow must either (a) hold a College office or Lectureship or (b) be engaged in research approved by the College or (c) perform such duties or do such work for the College as the College shall from time to time require. He shail also (d) reside in Cambridge during full term unless he be engaged in research which in the opinion of the College necessitates absence from Cambridge, or unless he receives leave of absence from the College on account of illness or other grave cause. The Master and Fellows shall have power to determine from time to time what shall be held to constitute residence for the purpose of this statute.

A Fellowship may be renewed from time to time, but each renewal shall be for a period not exceeding seven years.

4. In addition to the ordinary Fellows there may be in the College not more than four supernumerary Fellows. Such Fellows shall exercise all the rights of Fellows except that they shall receive no dividend, but the Master and Fellows may make them a small allowance for travelling expenses and for residence in Cambridge during the College Meetings. They shall not necessarily be subject to any conditions, but the Master and Fellows may at any time attach any condition to a supernumerary

Fellowship, and at any time vary or revoke any such condition. A supernumerary Fellowship shall be held for as many years as the Master and Fellows shall determine in each case. A supernumerary Fellow may at any time be elected to an Ordinary Fellowship, in which case his supernumerary Fellowship shall become vacant. An ordinary Fellow, other than the Professorial Fellow, may declare his intention in writing of becoming a supernumerary Fellow, and if the Master and Fellows think fit, he shall be made a supernumerary Fellow at a meeting specially called for the purpose. The expression Master and Fellows includes the supernumerary Fellows but does not include Honorary Fellows.

- 5. During full term at least two Fellows, one of whom shall if possible be the Dean, shall reside in College, and during the Long Vacation Term at least one Fellow shall reside in College. The Master and Fellows shall determine which Fellows shall so reside and shall from time to time define what is meant by residence in College; they shall also assign a reasonable stipend for such residence, which shall be larger in the case of a Fellow who ordinarily lives outside the College.
- 6. The Fellows shall receive out of the revenues of the College during residence a moderate sum for commons, to be determined by the Master and Fellows, and the Master shall receive during residence twice the amount allowed to each Fellow. The Master and Fellows shall have power to determine from time to time what shall be held to constitute residence for the purpose of this statute.

The Master shall assign rooms in College to the Fellows severally, having regard to their seniority.

The use of rooms may be allowed to other members of the College by the Master and Fellows at their discretion, and the rents of such rooms shall be fixed by the Master and Fellows, and shall be paid as income to the College.

No Fellow shall be allowed to bring his wife or family to reside in College, unless special provision be made for that purpose and permission given by the Master and Fellows at a meeting called for the purpose of considering the question.

7. Every vacant Fellowship shall be filled within one year from the date of vacancy unless the same is suspended or unless the majority of the Master and Fellows, for reasons to be set forth in a College order, defer the election for a further period not exceeding one year.

The election of a Fellow shall be made by a majority of the Master and Fellows, and the Master shall give not less than fourteen days' notice in writing to all the Fellows, whether present in College or absent, of the day and hour appointed for election.

If upon a first scrutiny there be no person for whom a majority of the Master and all existing Fellows have voted, the scrutiny shall be repeated as often as the Master and Fellows think fit.

The Fellow elect shall make the following declaration before admission:

"Ego N. do fidem quod omnia statuta et ordinationes collegii sive aulae divae catharinae virginis, quatenus me concernunt, pro viribus observabo, et quantum in me est ab aliis socias faciam observari; magistro seu praefecto dicti collegii sive aulae qui pro tempore fuerit, in iis quae ad officium ipsius et statuta collegii praedicti pertinent obtemperabo; bonorum, terrarum, possessionum ac reddituum ejusdem collegii conservationem et amplificationem, quantum in me est, procurabo."

The seniority of the Fellows in College shall be determined by the dates of their admission as Fellows, and not by the times of graduation.

Fellows who are Bachelors in Arts, or Law or Surgery shall proceed in due course to the degree of Master in Arts or Law or Surgery, and Fellows who are Bachelors in Medicine shall proceed in due course to the degree of Doctor in Medicine, unless prevented by illness, or other cause approved by the Master and Fellows as sufficient.

8. The Master and Fellows may elect any person, whom they consider it desirable so to distinguish, to be an Honorary Fellow.

Such Honorary Fellow shall not have any voice or authority in the affairs of the College nor be entitled to any dividend or presentation to a Benefice, but he shall enjoy such other privileges and advantages as the Master and Fellows may from time to time determine.

The Master and Fellows may at any time terminate the tenure of an Honorary Fellowship.

9. If any Fellow shall pertinaciously disturb the concord or discipline of the College, or shall wilfully violate or neglect to comply with any of the Statutes, it shall be the duty of the Master and Fellows at a College Meeting, on proof of such misconduct, to admonish such Fellow; and if, notwithstanding such admonition, he shall contumatiously persist in such misconduct, the Master may, with the concurrence of the majority of such Fellows, other than the Fellow whose conduct is impugned, as are present at a College Meeting to which all the Fellows shall have been summoned, suspend such Fellow from the enjoyment of his Fellowship for such time as they shall think fit, or deprive him altogether of his Fellowship.

If any Fellow shall be convicted by a Court of competent jurisdiction of any crime, the Master shall, with all convenient speed, summon a Meeting of all the Fellows, exclusive of such Fellow. The Master and Fellows assembled at such meeting may, if they think fit, proceed to investigate the case, and if the fact of such conviction be established, the Master shall, if the majority of those present so determine, deprive such Fellow of his Fellowship and expel him from the College.

If the Master shall in any case think it proper to cause an inquiry to be instituted as to whether or not the conduct of any Fellow has been disgraceful and such as to render him unfit to be a Fellow of the College, or if any two Fellows shall prefer before the Master against any Fellow a charge of disgraceful conduct rendering him unfit in their judgment to be a Fellow of the College; the Master shall summon a meeting of all the Fellows other than the accused and the Fellows, if any, preferring such charge, the Master and Fellows assembled at such meeting shall proceed to investigate the case, giving the accused person an opportunity of being heard in his defence, and if such disgraceful conduct be proved, the Master shall, if the majority of those present so determine,

deprive the offending Fellow of his Fellowship and expel him from the College.

In any case of a sentence or suspension or deprivation and expulsion of a Fellow there shall be a right of appeal to the Visitor, who shall have power to annul the sentence or vary it at his discretion.

10. If a Fellow become the Head or a Fellow of any University or of any other College in any University, and if any stipend be attached to such Headship or Fellowship, his Fellowship shall thereupon become *ipso facto* vacant.

If a Fellow be admitted Master of the College his Fellowship shall thereupon become ipso facto vacant.

If a Fellow be instituted to a benefice in the gift of the College, the clear annual value of which after deducting all legal charges other than the pension if any of a previous incumbent is not less than £400, his Fellowship shall become vacant at the end of one year from the date of presentation.

If a Fellow accept a Professorship to which a Fellowship at another College is attached his Fellowship shall thereupon become *ipso facto* vacant.

A Fellowship shall also become vacant if the Master and Fellows decide at a meeting called for considering the question that this Fellow has without due cause failed to comply with the conditions attached to his Fellowship.

### STATUTE IV. The Scholars.

1. The Scholars shall be elected by the Master and Fellows without regard to their place of birth or school of education from among the students of the College or of the University, or according to the results of examinations instituted for the purpose from among persons who have not been admitted to the College or to the University; provided that in the case of the latter persons they are not more than nineteen years of age at the time of examination, and that the scholarships awarded to them be not tenable for a longer period than for two years certain, and that the annual value of each of such scholarships do not exceed eighty pounds inclusive of rent of rooms and all allowances.

Every Scholarship, including the Scholarship on Bishop Sherlock's Foundation in connection with the Library, shall become vacant when the holder of it is of sufficient standing for the degree of Bachelor of Arts, unless the Master and Fellows shall think fit in cases of special merit to prolong the tenure for a further period not exceeding the time when the holder is of sufficient standing for the degree of Master of Arts.

The Master and Fellows may promote a deserving student from one scholarship to another and in cases of special merit may give two scholarships to the same person and may at their discretion award gratuities out of the Scholarship Fund to poor and deserving students.

The Master and Fellows may deprive a student of his Scholarship or suspend his receipt of the emoluments for a definite time in case of neglect of study, or in case of failure in any University or College examination, or in case of unbecoming or disgraceful conduct, or of absence from residence in College without the permission of the Master and Fellows.

2. The Fund known as the Scholarship Fund shall continue to provide scholarships for open competition.

Scholarships and Exhibitions shall whenever possible be known by the name of the donor or of the person in whose honour the Scholarship or Exhibition is founded.

### STATUTE V.

The Tutor, Lecturers, and College Officers.

1. There shall be a Tutor, Bursar, Dean and such additional College Officers and Lecturers as the Master and Fellows shall from time to time deem necessary or useful. Their duties and stipends shall be fixed by the Master and Fellows from time to time.

The election to these offices shall be made by the Master and Fellows at the end of the Easter Term, to take effect at the beginning of the following Michaelmas Term, but in cases of emergency and at the election of a new Fellow a vacancy can be temporarily filled until the proper time for the next election.

Such temporary service shall not be counted in fixing dates for retirement or pension.

- 2. A Tutor shall in the first instance be appointed for a period of three years, at the end of which period the Master and Fellows may prolong his term from time to time, but no prolongation shall be for more than seven years at a time.
- 3. Any other College Officer or Lecturer may be appointed for a period not exceeding seven years, at the end of which period the Master and Fellows may prolong his term from time to time, but no prolongation shall be for more than seven years at a time, and no person shall hold any office or series of offices under the College for more than thirty-five years in all.
- 4. The Master and Fellows shall determine the fees to be paid by the students of the College for tuition, and shall determine in what proportion the aggregate sum shall be distributed.

### STATUTE VI.

### Retirement and Pensions.

- 1. The Master, Tutor, Lecturers and all other College Officers shall retire at the age of sixty-five years, unless the Master and Fellows shall prolong such tenure for a further period which may not in the case of the Master exceed fifteen years, or in other cases exceed five years, and in any event a Tutor shall retire when he has held such office for a period of twenty years (unless the Master and Fellows shall otherwise determine in any special case) and any Lecturer or other College Officer shall retire when he has served the College in one or more capacities for a period of thirty-five years.
- 2. A pension scheme shall be arranged with an Insurance Company of good repute, and the Master, Tutor, Lecturers and College Officers shall become entitled to pensions under it when they respectively have to retire under the foregoing clause or on account of ill health. The amounts of the pensions shall be fixed by the Master and Fellows acting under the advice of such Insurance Company. To provide the funds for such pensions there shall be deducted from the stipends and dividends such sum as the Master and Fellows, acting upon such ad-

vice, may from time to time determine, and in addition the whole or part of the Burrell Fund shall be applied for this purpose. A pensioner may commute his pension for a lump sum to be determined by the Master and Fellows acting on the advice of the Insurance Company.

This statute does not apply to a Professorial Fellow.

#### STATUTE VII.

### College Finances and Audit.

1. Subject to any special directions of the Master and Fellows the moneys payable to the Tuition Fund and the Caution Fund shall be received by the Tutor and these Funds shall be managed by him. The Master and Fellows shall from time to time determine what sums students shall contribute to these funds.

All other moneys shall, subject to any special directions of the Master and Fellows, be received by the Bursar, and placed to an account at some Bank at Cambridge. The Bursar or such other persons as may be appointed by the Master and Fellows shall make the proper payments out of the various funds. The revenues of specific trust funds shall be kept separate from the revenues which contribute to the College Stock or are applicable for maintaining the establishment.

2. Before declaring the dividend in any year, all things shall be done and paid which are required to be done and paid by the Statutes of the College, or by the Statutes of the University or by the ancient and approved customs of the College, or by the unrepealed ordinances contained in wills, indentures, or writings of what kind soever, or by any other lawful ordinance; and a sufficient sum of money shall be applied or reserved for repairing, rebuilding, enlarging or ornamenting the buildings of the College, for defraying the expenses of managing the College property, and for any other purpose which the Master and Fellows may deem to be necessary or advantageous to the College as a place of education, religion, learning and research. The sums payable to the University and administrative expenses shall so far as possible be debited pro rata against the various revenues and incomes in relation to which it is assessed.

Subject as aforesaid the yearly income of the College shall be divided and distributed among the Master and Fellows as follows, viz., to every Fellow such sum as the Master and Fellows shall fix for the dividend of the year being not greater than two hundred and fifty pounds free of income tax, exclusive of rooms and commons, and to the Master a sum equal to twice such dividend; unless he shall not hold the Canonry at Norwich, in which event the Master shall receive a sum equal to four times such dividend. Both the dividend and also the stipend and other fixed pecuniary emoluments of the Master, Fellows, and College Officers, shall be considered as accruing from day to day and shall be apportionable accordingly.

- 3. The College shall pay in every year to the University the sum authorized by the Statutes of the University made under the powers of the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877, to be levied from the College.
- 4. If at any time it shall appear to the Master and Fellows that the revenues of the

College are greater than the amount required to afford to every Fellow a dividend of two hundred and fifty pounds a year free of income tax, exclusive of rooms and commons, they may submit to the Visitor a scheme, approved by a majority of the whole body of Master and Fellows, for increasing the number of Feltowships or Scholarships or for providing a Fund for granting gratuities to poor and deserving members of the College in statu pupillari, or for applying the surplus in some other way for the benefit of the College or of the University, and the said Scheme, if approved by the Visitor shall thenceforth have the same force and effect as if it formed part of these statutes.

The Visitor shall not approve any scheme for diminishing the number of Fellowships below the minimum number prescribed by these statutes.

- 5. There shall be an annual audit of all the College accounts on a date as near as possible to St. Catharine's day. Prior to this the accounts shall be audited by two Auditors, one of whom shall be a Fellow and the other a Professional Accountant appointed by the Master and Fellows. The Auditors shall inspect all books and vouchers, ascertain the balances due, and shall be given all such information and explanations they may require, and shall make a report stating that they have examined the accounts and whether they are correct, and calling attention to any matters which they think should be considered by the Master and Fellows. An abstract of the accounts in a form approved by the Master and Fellows Fellows. together with a copy of the Auditors' report shall be circulated to the Master and Fellows at least seven days before the College Meeting at which the audit is to be held. meeting the Master and Fellows shall consider the accounts and if satisfactory approve them, but they may if they think fit require the production of any books or vouchers and further information and explanation from the Bursar or any other accountable party.
- 6. An abstract of the several accounts of the College relating to funds administered for general purposes, or in trust, or otherwise, shall be sent on or before the 31st day of December in each year to the Vice-Chancellor of the University for publication. The abstract shall be made as nearly as practicable in the form contained in the Schedule attached to these Statutes. An account of the receipts and disbursements of money, if any, raised under the borrowing powers of the College shall be sent yearly at the same time to the Vice-Chancellor for publication.
  - 7. No alteration in the specific sums mentioned in these Statutes shall be made in consequence of any change in the value of money or for any other reason, except by Statute made in accordance with the provisions of the fifty-fourth and fifty-fifth sections of the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877.

### STATUTE VIII.

Divine Services, Presentation to Benefices and Sale of Advowsons.

1. Whereas by the fifth and sixth sections of the Universities Tests Act, 1871, it is enacted as follows:—

"The Governing Body of every College subsisting at the time of the passing of this Act in any of the said Universities shall provide sufficient religious instruction for all members thereof in statu pupillari belonging to the Established Church.

"The morning and evening prayer according to the order of the Book of Common Prayer shall continue to be used daily as heretofore in the Chapel of every College subsisting at the time of the passing of this Act in any of the said Universities, but notwithstanding anything contained in the statute thirteenth and fourteenth Charles the Second, chapter four, or in this Act, it shall be lawful for the Visitor of any such College, on the request of the Governing Body thereof, to authorize from time to time in writing the use on weekdays only of any abridgement or adaptation of the said morning and evening prayer in the Chapel of such College instead of the order set forth in the Book of Common Prayer."

The Master and Fellows shall, if necessary, provide stipends from the revenues of the College for persons whom they may appoint to carry out these provisions, and shall also make such reguations as they may deem expedient for the due celebration of Divine Service and for the due maintenance of religious worship and discipline.

- 2. In presenting to the several Benefices in the patronage of the College the Master and Fellows shall have regard, in the first instance, to the Master and Fellows, the Officers, former Fellows and Officers, and former Scholars of the College, but it shall not be necessary to present any of these persons, and none of them shall have any claim to the presentation to any such benefice on the ground of seniority or on any other ground whatsoever.
- 3. Any advowson may be sold if a majority of the Master and Fellows present at a College Meeting so resolve, and so that as regards the safety and protection of the purchaser the recital in the deed of conveyance of a resolution in that behalf having been duly made at a College Meeting shall be conclusive that the sale was in fact authorized. The net purchase money arising from the sale of any advowson shall be placed to the credit of the Pension Fund.

### STATUTE IX

Preservation of Interests and Repeal.

1. The interests and conditions of tenure of emoluments of such of the Master and Fellows as were elected before the 21st day of June 1920 shall be regulated by the Statutes in force before the approval of these Statutes by the King in Council, provided that any of such Master and Fellows may within one year after the said approval of these Statutes signify to the Master and Fellows by writing under his hand that he wishes to be placed under the operation of these Statutes, and his interests and the conditions of tenure of his emolument shall be thenceforth governed by these Statutes, and shall accordingly be the same as if these Statutes had been in operation at the date of his election to such emolument, and his past services, if any, in the College or University office shall be of the same avail as if they had been services under these Statutes, but so that

in no case shall his rights in respect of a pension be diminished.

2. The Statutes of the College confirmed by Order of the Queen in Council, May 3rd 1882 are hereby repealed, save and except so far as regards the interests and conditions of tenure of emoluments of any person who before the confirmation of these Statutes became a member of the College, or before the 21st day of June 1920 was elected to a University or College emolument within the meaning of the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877, but the repeal of the said Statutes shall not be taken to revive the provisions of any former Statutes of the College which were repealed by the said Statutes.

### NOTICE.

PENSIONS COMMUTATION ACTS, 1871-1882.

In pursuance of the provisions of the Pensions Commutation Acts, 1871-1882, the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury have made the following regulations, viz.:—

### REGULATIONS.

### PATENTS FOR INVENTIONS.

THE PATENTS (TREATY OF PEACE) RULES, 1920.
DATED 24TH JULY, 1920.

By virtue of the provisions of the Trading with the Enemy Acts, 1914 to 1918, the Treaty of Peace Act, 1919, the Treaty of Peace Order, 1919, and the Order of the Board of Trade, dated 19th July, 1920, the Board of Trade do hereby make the following Rules:—

### Preliminary.

1. These Rules may be cited as the Patents (Treaty of Peace) Rules, 1920, and shall come into operation from and immediately after the 19th day of July, 1920.

### Interpretation.

2. In the construction of these Rules any words herein used, the meanings of which are defined by the Order of the Board of Trade, dated the 19th day of July, 1920, shall have the meanings thereby assigned to them respectively.

### Fees.

3. The tees to be paid under these Rules shall be those specified in the first Schedule to these Rules.

#### Forms.

4. The forms herein referred to are the forms contained in the second Schedule to these Rules. Such forms shall be used in all cases to which they are applicable and may be modified as directed by the Comptroller to meet other cases.

### Voluntary Dealings in or under Restored Patents, &c.

5. Where any assignment or assurance of a restored patent or of the benefit of a restored application or any licence under a restored patent has been agreed between parties, application for the consent of the Board of Trade to any such assignment, assurance, or licence shall be made on Patents Form No. 40 before the execution of the document effecting such assignment, assurance or licence. Such application shall be accompanied by a copy of the draft document proposed to be executed.

### Devolution of Title by Operation of Law.

6. Where any person claims to be entitled to the benefit of or any interest in a restored patent or restored application by virtue of operation of law, arising after the outbreak of war, he shall make application for the consent of the Board of Trade to his title as claimed being recognised upon Patents Form No. 41. Such application shall be accompanied by a copy of the instrument or other document under which the applicant claims title.

### Application for Licence under Restored Patent other than under Rule 5.

7. An application for the grant of a licence under a restored patent or a patent granted

upon a restored application shall be made upon Patents Form No. 42. Such application shall be accompanied by an unstamped copy and a statement in duplicate setting out fully the reason for making the application, the facts upon which the applicant bases his case, and the terms of the licence which he is prepared to accept. A copy of the application and of the statement will be transmitted by the Comptroller to the patentee at his address for service on the Register of Patents.

Upon such application being made and copy thereof transmitted to the patentee, the latter, if desirous of contesting the application, shall within one month of the receipt of such copy at his address for service, or such further time as the Comptroller may allow, leave at the Patent Office a counter-statement fully setting out the grounds upon which the application is contested and, on so leaving, shall deliver to the applicant a copy thereof.

Upon receipt of such counter-statement, and/or any further evidence the Comptroller may require, the Comptroller shall proceed to determine the application.

### Application for Revision of Licence.

8. An application for the revision of a licence, whether granted by the Board of Trade, the Custodian, or under these Rules under a restored patent, shall be made upon Patents Form No. 43. Such application shall be accompanied by an unstamped copy and a statement in duplicate setting out fully the facts upon which the applicant bases his case and the terms of such licence as he is prepared to accept or grant. At copy of the application and of the statement will be transmitted by the Comptroller to the patentee, at his address for service on the Register of Patents or the Licensee concerned, as the case may be.

Upon such application being made and copy thereof transmitted, the patentee or licensee, as the case may be, if desirous of contesting the application, shall within one month of the receipt of such copy at his address for service, or such further time as the Comptroller may allow, leave at the Patent Office a counterstatement fully setting out the grounds upon which the application is contested and, on so leaving, shall deliver to the applicant a copy thereof.

Upon receipt of such counter-statement and / or any further evidence the Comptroller may require, the Comptroller shall proceed to determine the application.

### Application for the Expropriation Taking Over or Selling Any Restored Patent.

9. An application for the expropriation, taking over or sale of any restored patent or a patent granted upon a restored application shall be made upon Patents Form No. 44. Such application shall be accompanied by an unstamped copy and a statement in duplicate setting out fully the reason for making the application and the facts upon which the Applicant bases his case. A copy of the application and of the statement will be transmitted by the Comptroller to the patentee at his address for service on the Register of Patents.

Upon such application being made and copy thereof transmitted to the patentee, the latter, if desirous of contesting the application, shall, within one month of the receipt of such copy at his address for service, or such further time as the Comptroller may allow, leave at the Patent Office a counter-statement fully setting out the grounds upon which application is contested and on so leaving, shall deliver to the applicant a copy thereof.

Upon receipt of such counter-statement and/ or any further evidence the Comptroller may require the Comptroller shall proceed to determine whether the application should be granted and be referred to a special tribunal for the settlement of terms.

Where it is decided to grant the application and refer it to a special tribunal for the settlement of terms application to be heard by the special tribunal shall be made upon Patents Form No. 45.

### Hearings.

10. Before deciding any issue raised under Rules 7, 8 and 9 of these Rules, or before exercising any discretionary power given to the Comptroller under the Order of the Board of Trade, dated 19th July, 1920, or these Rules, adversely to any party, the Comptroller shall

give ten days' notice, or such longer notice as he may think fit, to the party or parties as the case may be, of the time when he is prepared to hear such party or parties or their representatives.

#### Evidence.

11. In lieu of or in addition to any oral evidence that may be given at a hearing the Comptroller may require any party to file evidence by way of statutory declaration, and allow any declarant to be cross-examined on his declaration.

### Costs.

12. The Comptroller may award costs in any proceedings under these Rules, and direct how and by what parties they are to be paid. Further, in any case in which he thinks fit, the Comptroller may require any person initiating proceedings to give security for costs, and in the event of such security not being forthcoming, may dismiss the application in question.

(i) It is proposed that the General Minimum Time-Rates for Female Learners under 14 years of age shall be varied from 2½d. to 3d. per hour, and from the age of 14 they shall be entitled to the amounts shown in Column I. above, as if they had commenced at 14.

(ii) A Female Learner shall cease to be a Learner and be entitled to the full General Minimum Time-Rate applicable to her under Section I. of this Part of this Schedule upon the fulfilment of the following conditions:-

Provided that a Female Learner returning to the Trade after absence shall not serve a longer period as a Learner than would be required if she were entering the trade for the first time.

(iii) For the purpose of reckoning the General Minimum Time Rate applicable to a Female Learner who has had previous employment in the trade, and the length of time during which she may continue to be employed as a Learner, the provisions of this Sub-Section shall be held to apply to the whole period of her employment in the trade.

The weekly rates for Male and Female Learners set out in Section III. (b) of Part I. and Section II. of Part II. above shall be subject to a proportionate deduction according as the number of hours actually spent by the Learner in the factory or workshop in any week is less than 48.

### PART III.

Proposed Variation of Piece-Work Basis Time Rates for Female Workers.

All Female Workers:-

(a) Workers other than Homeworkers from 8½d. to 9¾d. per hour.

(b) Homeworkers: from 8½d. to 9¾d. per

hour.

In the case of Female Workers employed on piece-work, each piece rate paid shall be such as will yield, in the circumstances of the case, not less than  $9\frac{3}{4}$ d. an hour to an Ordinary worker, that is, a worker of ordinary skill and experience.

### PART IV.

Proposed Variation of Overtime Rates for all Classes of Male and Female Workers.

In lieu of the Overtime Rates at present fixed and set out in the Trade Boards Notices dated 22nd November, 1919, and 12th March, 1920, and effective under Orders of the Minister of Liabour dated 20th November, 1919, and 10th March, 1920, the minimum rates for overtime in respect of all hours worked in excess of the number of hours declared by the Trade Board in their Notice dated 22nd November, 1919, to be the normal number of hours of work in the trade shall be as follows, that is to say:—

A.—For Workers Employed on Time Work.

Workers employed on Time-work shall be entitled to receive Overtime Rates, calculated on the proposed General Minimum Time Rates, set out in Part I. and Part II. of the Schedule of this Notice, in the manner set out in Section 2 of Part III. of the Schedule of the Notice issued by the Trade Board and dated 22nd November, 1919, in substitution for the Minimum Rate which would otherwise be applicable.

B.—For Workers Employed on Piece Work.
 1.—All Male Workers including Male Learners.

All Male workers employed on Piece-work shall be entitled to receive in respect of each hour of Overtime worked in addition to Piece Rates each of which would yield in the circumstances of the case, to an Ordinary worker not less than the General Minimum Time Rate applicable the appropriate General Minimum Time Rate, one-half of the appropriate General Minimum Time Rate, or one-quarter of the appropriate General Minimum Time Rate according as the overtime rate which would have been payable under the provisions of Section 2 of Part III. of the Schedule to the Trade Board's Notice dated 22nd November, 1919, if the worker had been employed on Time-work, were Double-Time, Time-and-a-half, or Time-and-a-quarter respectively.

II.—Female Workers.

(i)—Female Workers other than Learners employed on Piece-work shall be entitled to receive in respect of each hour of Overtime worked, in addition to Piece Rates each of which would yield, in the circumstances of the case, to an Ordinary worker not less than the Piece-work Basis Time Rate applicable, the appropriate Piece-work Basis Time Rate, One-half of the appropriate Piece-work Basis Time Rate, or One-quarter of the appropriate Piece-work Basis Time Rate, according as the Overtime Rate which would have

been payable under the provisions of Section 2 of Part III. of the Schedule to the Trade Board's Notice dated 22nd November, 1919, if the worker had been employed on Timework, were Double-Time, Time-and-a-half, or Time-and-a-quarter respectively.

(ii)—Female Learners employed on Piecework shall be entitled to receive in respect of each hour of Overtime worked, in addition to Piece Rates, each of which would yield, in the circumstances of the case, to an Ordinary worker not less than the Piece-work Basis Time Rate applicable, the appropriate General Minimum Time Rate, One-half of the appropriate General Minimum Time Rate, or One-quarter of the appropriate General Minimum Time Rate according as the Overtime Rate which would have been payable under the provisions of Section 2 of Part III. of the Schedule to the Trade Board's Notice dated 22nd November, 1919, if the worker had been employed on Timework, were Double Time, Time-and-a-half or Time-and-a-quarter respectively.

### PART V.

For the purpose of this Notice the following definitions shall apply:—

SECTION I.—A Machine Tackler shall be deemed to be a male person who is engaged in setting, adjusting, and keeping running Paper Bag Machines, and in superintending and carrying through all other operations that can be performed in whole or in part by such machines.

SECTION II.—A Male Learner is a worker under 21 years of age, who while employed is engaged during the whole or a substantial part of his time in learning some branch or process of the trade.

A Female Learner is a worker who

- (i) Is employed by an employer who provides such Learner with reasonable facilities for practically and efficiently learning the branch or branches of the trade in which the Learner is for the time being employed; and
- (ii) Has received a certificate or has been registered in accordance with rules from time to time laid down by the Trade Board, or has made application for such certificate or registration, which has been duly acknowledged and is still under consideration. Provided that the certification or registration of a Learner may be cancelled if the other conditions of learnership are not complied with.

Provided that an employer may employ a Female Learner on her first employment without a certificate or registration for a probation period not exceeding eight weeks, but the probation period shall be included in her period of learnership.

Provided also that notwithstanding compliance with the conditions contained in this Section, a person shall not be deemed to be a Learner if she works in a room used for dwelling purposes, and is not in the employment of her parent or guardian.

SECTION III.—The expression "Homeworker" shall be held to mean a worker who works in her own home or in any other place not under the control or management of the employer.

### PART VI.

The above proposed Minimum Rates of Wages shall apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, to all workers in Great Britain in respect of all time during which they are employed in any branch of the trade specified in the Trade Board's (Paper Bag Trade) Order, 1919, that is to say, the manufacture from paper (including gauze-lined or cloth-lined paper) of any bag or container without a gummed flap, including the operations of packing, parcelling, warehousing, receiving, store-keeping, despatching, timekeeping, lift-operating and cleaning, when these operations are carried on in connection with paper-bagmanufacture and including the printing of paper bags when the printing apparatus is attached to the making apparatus, but excluding the manufacture of bags or containers with ungummed flaps (for use in the transmission of printed matter or samples) when made by the same process as gummed envelopes and excluding the manufacture of receptacles from cardboard, such as boxes, cartons or skillets.

### PART VII.

Section I.—The above proposed Minimum Rates of Wages shall be paid clear of all deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments, or deductions authorised by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any Superannuation or other Provident Fund.

II.—The above proposed general minimum time rates are without prejudice to workers who are earning higher rates of wages.

The Trade Board will consider any Objections to the above Proposals to Vary which may be lodged with them within two months from the 26th July, 1920. Such Objections should be in writing and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her full name and address), and should be sent to the Secretary, The Paper Bag Trade Board (Great Britain), 5, Chancery Lane, W.C. 2. It is desirable that the Objections should

state precisely, and so far as possible with

reasons, what is objected to.
