## PAPER BAG TRADE BOARD (GREAT BRITAIN).

PROPOSAL TO VARY MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES FOR MALE AND FEMALE WORKERS.

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour, and dated the 31st October, 1918, the Trade Board established in Great Britain under the Trade Boards Act, 1918, for the Paper Bag Trade as specified in the Trade Boards (Paper Bag Trade) Order, 1919, HEREBY GIVE NOTICE, as required by Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, that THEY PROPOSE TO VARY the General Minimum Time Rates, Piece Work Basis Time Rates and Overtime Rates for Male and Female Workers set out in the Schedules of their Notices dated 22nd November, 1919, and 12th March, 1920, the variations proposed being as shown in the Schedule set out below.

The Minister of Labour has given his consent to Notice being given of Proposal to Vary the General Minimum Time Rates and Overtime Rates set out in the Schedule of the Notice dated 12th March, 1920.
