#### SPECIAL ACTS (EXTENSION OF TIME) ACT, 1915.

WALSALL CORPORATION ACT, 1914.

Whereas by Section 1 of the Special Acts (Extension of Time) Act, 1915, as extended by the War Emergency Laws (Continuance) Act, 1920, it is provided that where the time within which a duty is to be performed or a power may be exercised under any Special Act is limited, an application may be made to the appropriate Government Department for an Order under the said Act extending that time, but only in cases where the time is due to expire within twelve months of the date of the application, provided that, without prejudice to the making of any further Order, no time shall be extended under any such Order for more than a year:

And whereas by Section 90 of the Walsall Corporation Act, 1914, a local Act, the Walsall Corporation were empowered to apply to His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Home Department, within two years after

the passing of the said Act (namely, the 7th August, 1914) to appoint a Commissioner to make a scheme for the alteration of the wards of the said Borough, and the increase of the number of Councillors of the said Borough in the manner therein provided:

And whereas on the application of the Walsall Corporation an Order was made on the 16th May, 1916, by the Secretary of State for the Home Department extending the time within which an application might be made under the said Section 90 of the Walsall Corporation Act, 1914, for a period of twelve months from the 7th August, 1916; and a further Order was made on the 15th May, 1917, extending such time for a period of twelve months from the 7th August, 1917; and a further Order was made on the 20th April, 1918, extending such time for a period of twelve months from the 7th August, 1918; and a further Order was made on the 7th August, 1919, extending such time for a period of twelve months from the 7th August, 1919:

And whereas on the 14th June, 1920, an application was made to me on behalf of the said Corporation for an Order under the said Act extending the time within which an application may be made under the said Section 90 of the Walsall Corporation Act, 1914, for a further period of twelve months from the 7th August next:

And whereas before dealing with the said application I required the said Corporation to publish notices of the said application and of the time when the same would be taken into consideration, and such notices have been duly published accordingly:

And whereas I am satisfied that in the circumstances of the case the time in respect of which the said application is made should be further extended:

Now, therefore, I do hereby order that the time within which an application be made under the said Section 90 of the Walsall Corporation Act, 1914, shall be extended for a further period of twelve months from the 7th August, 1920.

#### WARRANT INSTITUTING "THE KING'S MEDAL FOR NATIVE CHIEFS."

*GEORGE, R.I.*

Whereas We have taken into Our Royal consideration the loyal and zealous services rendered to Us and to Our Empire by Native Chiefs or other Native Dignitaries in Our Colonies and Protectorates and in other territories in East and West Africa, or elsewhere, which are under the administration or surveil-

lance of Our Principal Secretaries of State for Foreign Affairs or for the Colonies;

And whereas We are desirous of recognizing such services by some mark of Our Royal favour;

Now We do by these Presents for Us, Our heirs and successors, institute and create a new Medal to be awarded to such Native Chiefs or other Native Dignitaries as aforesaid who by their zeal in Our service and loyalty to Us and to Our Empire may have merited or may hereafter merit such distinction.

2. The Medal shall be of silver, or in exceptional cases of silver-gilt, and shall be designated and styled "The King's Medal for Native Chiefs." It shall be worn around the neck pendent from a chain of silver or silver-gilt as the case may be.

3. The obverse of the Medal shall bear Our effigy and on the reverse shall be depicted a merchant vessel, plying, under the protection of a ship of war, outside a harbour illuminated by a tropical sun.

4. The medal shall be awarded with the approval of one of Our Principal Secretaries of State by Our Governor or other Our Representative for the time being in the Colony, Protectorate or other territory in which the Chief or Dignitary may be resident.

5. The names of the recipients of the Medal shall be published in the Government Gazette of the territories concerned, or in such other manner as may be deemed practicable.

6. If any Chief or Dignitary to whom the Medal is awarded be guilty of any grave misdemeanour, he may be deprived of it by Our Governor or other Our Representative as aforesaid with the assent of one of Our Principal Secretaries of State, but the Medal may, with the like assent, be subsequently restored to him.

7. Upon the death of any recipient of the Medal it shall forthwith be returned to Our Governor or other Our Representative as aforesaid, unless he shall in any instance deem otherwise expedient, but in no case shall the Medal be worn by any other than the Chief or Dignitary to whom it was awarded.

THE PROFITEERING ACTS, 1919 AND 1920,  
ORDER (NO. 9), DATED 2ND AUGUST, 1920,  
MADE BY THE BOARD OF TRADE UNDER SECTION 2 OF THE PROFITEERING (AMENDMENT) ACT, 1920, (10 AND 11 GEO. V., c. 13).

Whereas Section 2, Sub-section (2), of the Profiteering (Amendment) Act, 1920 (10 and 11 Geo. V., c. 13), provides that the Board of Trade may by Order extend Section 1 of the Profiteering Act, 1919 (9 and 10 Geo. V., c. 66), to any process of manufacture or to the repairing, altering, dyeing, cleaning, washing or otherwise treating of any articles mentioned in the Order and processes incidental thereto, subject to such modification as may be neces-

sary to adapt the provisions of that section thereto:

Now, therefore, the Board of Trade do hereby extend Section 1 of the Profiteering Act, 1919 (9 and 10 Geo. V., c. 66), to the repairing, altering or washing of all articles of wearing apparel (except boots and shoes), and of cloths and dusters, table and bed linen, blankets, towels, mattresses, pillows, bolsters and curtains, and to any processes incidental thereto; to the repairing, altering or cleaning of clocks and watches, and to the repairing or altering of boots, shoes and umbrellas subject to the following modifications, namely:—that the words "sale," "seller" and "price" shall include treating or offering to treat in any of the manners aforesaid, any person so doing, and the charge for so doing respectively.

This Order shall come into force as from the ninth day of August, 1920, and may be cited as the Profiteering Acts, 1919 and 1920, Order (No. 9).

The KING has been graciously pleased to confer the Decoration of the Albert Medal upon Mr. David Fraser, Chief Engineer, and Mr. Aaron Edward Higgins, Third Engineer, of the Steamship "Melville Dollar," of Vancouver, British Columbia.

On the 27th August, 1919, when the Steamship "Melville Dollar" was in the North Pacific Ocean, the main steam pipe burst, killing the Second Engineer and five Chinese Firemen.

Attempts were immediately made to get down into the engine-room to rescue the injured and to shut off steam from the boilers. The Chief Engineer, Mr. David Fraser, tried first, but was not able to get beyond the fiddle door, being badly scalded about the arms, throat and face. The Master and Mates then fitted up two tarpaulins as wind-sails, in order to force as much air as possible down the skylights into the engine and boiler-rooms.

Meanwhile, Mr. Aaron Edward Higgins, Third Engineer, having wrapped himself in coverings as a protection against the still escaping steam, made several attempts to get to the valves, but he was driven back each time by the high-pressure steam which filled the engine-room. The Master then descended with him and put a bowline around him as a life line, and Mr. Higgins made another attempt, this time reaching the burst part of the steam pipe, but he became exhausted and found it impossible to get to the valves, and had to be pulled back by the life line.

It was not until an hour and a half after the explosion that the pressure in the boilers fell sufficiently to permit a descent, when the bodies were removed, the fires drawn, and the steam shut off, which was done by Mr. Higgins.

Both officers incurred very considerable risk in rendering the services, as the engine-room was filled with super-heated steam, and Mr. Fraser had to be removed to hospital on account of his injuries.

## PROPOSAL TO FIX MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES FOR CERTAIN CLASSES OF MALE AND FEMALE WORKERS.

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour, and dated the 31st October, 1918, the Trade Board established under the Trade Boards Act, 1918, in England and Wales for the Milk Distributive Trade, as specified in the Trade Boards (Milk Distributive) Order, 1920, HEREBY GIVE NOTICE, as required by Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, that THEY PROPOSE TO FIX General Minimum Time Rates and Overtime Rates for Certain Classes of Male and Female Workers, and to DECLARE the normal number of hours of work in the trade for the purpose of the application of the Overtime Rates, as follows:—

## PART III.

SECTION (i).—As respects Whole-Time Workers employed by the week or longer period the Proposed General Minimum Time-Rates set out in Parts I. and II. above are for a week not exceeding 48 hours, and no deduction from such rates shall be made where in any week the number of hours worked is less than 48, except where the worker is absent without the permission, given or obtained, of the employer or his

agent. In such a case a proportionate deduction may be made according as the number of hours of employment in any week is less than 48.

SECTION (ii).—As respects other workers, the Proposed General Minimum Time-Rates set out in Parts I. and II. above are for a week of 48 hours, and shall be subject to a proportionate deduction according as the number of hours of employment in any week is less than 48.



## PART IV.

*Proposed Overtime Rates for Male and Female Workers (all Ages).*

SECTION (i).—In accordance with Section 3 (1) (c) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, the Trade Board propose to declare the normal number of hours of work in the trade to be as follows:—

In any week, 48 hours.

On any day other than Sundays and customary public and statutory holidays, 7 hours.

On Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, 6 hours.

SECTION (ii).—The Overtime Rates in respect of hours worked by a worker in excess of the declared normal number of hours of work in the trade shall be as follows:—

(a) For the first two hours of Overtime on any day except the day which constitutes the usual weekly half-holiday, Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, the Overtime Rate shall be equivalent to Time-and-a-Quarter; that is to say, One-and-a-Quarter times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable.

(b) For Overtime after the first two hours of Overtime on any day except Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, and for all Overtime on the day which constitutes the usual weekly half-holiday, the Overtime Rate shall be equivalent to Time-and-a-Half; that is to say, One-and-a-Half times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable.

(c) For all Overtime worked on Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, the Overtime Rate shall be equivalent to Double Time; that is to say, Twice the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable.

Provided, that where it is or may become the established practice of an employer only to require attendance on six days in the week:—

(1) The Overtime Rates shall be payable only where on any day (except Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays) the number of hours worked exceeds eight; and in the case of Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, the Overtime Rates shall be payable only where on any of these days the number of hours worked exceeds six.

(2) All hours of work on the seventh day shall be paid for at Double Time, if the normal working week of 48 hours has been previously completed.

## PART V.

For the purpose of this Notice the following definition shall apply:—

A Shop Assistant shall be deemed to be a male or female person wholly or mainly employed in a shop in serving customers and/or in checking in and out.

## PART VI.

The proposed Rates set out in the respective Scales A, B and C in Parts I and II of this Notice shall apply as follows:—

SECTION (i).—The Rates set out in Scale A shall apply to areas administered by Rural District Councils, but shall not apply to any town or village within any Rural District Council Area having a population exceeding 10,000.

SECTION (ii).—The Rates set out in Scale B shall apply to all areas other than those specified in Sections (i) and (iii) of this part of this Notice.

SECTION (iii).—The Rates set out in Scale C shall be applicable to London; that is to say, the City of London and the Metropolitan Police Districts, except such parts as are administered by a Rural District Council.

## PART VII.

The above proposed Minimum Rates of Wages shall apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, to all workers in England and Wales as specified in Parts I and II above, in respect of any time during which they are employed in any branch of the trade specified in the Trade Boards (Milk Distributive) Order, 1920; that is to say:—

1. (a) The wholesale or retail sale of fresh milk, when carried on as a main or distinct business, or as a distinct branch or department of a business.

(b) The sale of food or drink for consumption on the premises, or of other goods when any such sale is carried on in association with and as a subsidiary part of such business, branch or department as aforesaid, if such sale involves the employment of workers who are principally employed in the sale specified in (a) above.

2. (a) The following operations, when incidental to the sales specified in 1 above:—

(i) Boxing, parcelling, labelling, weighing, measuring, checking, bottling, unpacking, packing.

(ii) Collecting, delivering, despatching, horse-keeping, cleaning vehicles.

(iii) Portering, lift or hoist operating, timekeeping, storing, stock-keeping, warehousing, cleaning premises.

(iv) Pasteurising, cooling, separating of milk.

(v) Cleaning utensils or receptacles.

(vi) Blending, testing, sampling.

(vii) Other incidental operations.

(b) Clerical work or canvassing when incidental to and carried on in conjunction with the work specified in 1 above.

But excluding any operations in:—

(a) The transport of goods by common carriers.

(b) Any industry or trade concerned exclusively with carting and operations incidental thereto.

(c) Post Office business.

(d) Agriculture within the meaning of the Corn Production Act, 1917.

## PART VIII.

SECTION (i).—The above General Minimum Time-Rates and Overtime Rates shall be paid clear of all deductions other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments, or deductions authorized by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any Superannuation or other Provident Fund.

SECTION (ii).—The above proposed Minimum Rates of Wages are without prejudice to workers who are earning higher rates of wages, to workers of greater skill or length of experience, or to agreements made or that may be made between employers and workers for the payment of wages in excess of these minimum rates of wages.

The Trade Board will consider any objections to the above Proposals to Fix which may be lodged with them within two months from 6th August, 1920. Such Objections should be in writing and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her full name and

address), and should be sent to the Secretary, the Milk Distributive Trade Board (England and Wales), 5, Chancery Lane, London, W.C. 2.

It is desirable that Objections should state precisely, and so far as possible with reasons, what is objected to.

PROPOSAL TO VARY AND TO FIX MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES FOR FEMALE WORKERS.

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour, and dated 31st October, 1918, the Trade Board established under that Act, for that branch of the Box Trade in Great Britain which is engaged in the making of Boxes or parts thereof, made wholly or partially of paper, cardboard, chip or similar material, HEREBY GIVE NOTICE, as required by Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, that they PROPOSE TO VARY the General Minimum Time-Rates and Piece-work Basis Time-Rates for Female Workers at present fixed and set out in the Schedule to their Notice dated the 13th November, 1919, and effective under the Order of the Minister of Labour dated 12th November, 1919, and that they PROPOSE TO FIX Overtime Rates for Female Workers and to DECLARE THE NORMAL NUMBER OF HOURS OF WORK in the trade for the purpose of the application of the Overtime Rates as shown in the Schedule set out below.

- (i) The General Minimum Time-Rate for Learners under 14 years of age shall be 11s. 6d. per week of 48 hours or 2½d. per hour, and on reaching the age of 14 they shall be entitled to the amount shown in Column I. above, as if they had commenced at 14.
- (ii) A Learner shall cease to be a Learner and be entitled to the full General Minimum Time-Rate for a Worker, applicable to her under Part I., Section I., upon the fulfilment of the following conditions:—

Age of entering upon employment.	Conditions.
Under 15 years of age ... ..	The completion of not less than 4 years' employment, and the attainment of the age of 18 years.
15 and under 17 years of age ... ..	The completion of 3 years' employment.
17 and under 20 years of age ... ..	The completion of 2 years' employment.
20 years of age and over ... ..	The completion of 1 year's employment.

- (iii) A Learner returning to the Trade after absence shall not serve a longer period as a Learner than would be required if she were entering the trade for the first time.
- (iv) For the purposes of reckoning the General Minimum Time-Rate applicable to a Learner who has had previous employment in the trade, and the length of time during which she may continue to be employed as a Learner, the provisions of this Section shall be held to apply to the whole period of her employment in the trade.

## PART II.

*Proposed Variation of Piece-work Basis Time-Rates for all Female Workers.*

(a) Workers other than Home-workers, from 8½d. to 9¼d. per hour.

(b) Home-workers, from 8½d. to 9¼d. per hour.

In the case of all Female Persons employed on Piece-work each Piece-Rate paid shall be such as will yield in the circumstances of the case not less than 9¼d. per hour to an Ordinary Worker. Provided that in determining as to whether any Piece-Rate satisfies the foregoing conditions, regard shall be had only to the earnings of workers other than Learners.

## PART III.

*Proposed Overtime Rates for all Female Workers.*

In accordance with Section 3 (1) (c) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, the Trade Board hereby propose to declare the normal number of hours of work in the trade to be as follows:—

In any week, 48.

On any day (other than Saturday), 9.

On Saturday, 5.

Provided that all hours worked on Sundays and on Customary Public and Statutory Holidays shall be regarded as Overtime to which the Overtime Rates shall apply.

The Trade Board propose to fix Minimum Rates for Overtime in respect of hours worked by a worker employed in any branch of the trade specified in Part V of this Schedule in excess of such declared normal number of hours as follows, that is to say:—

(a) For workers employed on time-work:—

1. For the first two hours' Overtime on any day, except Saturdays, Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays the Overtime Rate shall be equivalent to Time-and-a-quarter, that is to say, One-and-a-Quarter times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable.

2. For Overtime after the first two hours of Overtime on any day except Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, and for all Overtime on Saturdays, the Overtime Rate shall be equivalent to Time-and-a-half, that is to say, One-and-a-half times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable.

3. For all time worked on Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, the Overtime Rate shall be equivalent to Double Time, that is to say, Twice the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable.

(b) For workers other than learners (as defined in Part IV of this Schedule) employed on Piece-work:—

Workers other than Learners employed on Piece-work shall be entitled to receive in respect of each hour of Overtime worked, in addition to Piece-Rates, each of which would yield, in the circumstances of the case, to an Ordinary worker not less than the Piece-work Basis Time-Rate applicable, the appropriate Piece-work Basis Time-Rate, One-half of the appropriate Piece-work Basis Time-rate, or One-quarter of the appropriate Piece-work

Basis Time-rate, according as the Overtime Rate which would have been payable under the provisions of paragraph (a) of this Section if the worker had been employed on Time-work were Double Time, Time-and-a-half, or Time-and-a-quarter respectively.

(c) For Learners (as defined in Part IV of this Schedule) employed on Piece-work:—

Learners employed on Piece-work shall be entitled to receive in respect of each hour of Overtime worked, in addition to Piece-Rates, each of which would yield, in the circumstances of the case, to an Ordinary worker not less than the Piece-work Basis Time-rate applicable, the appropriate General Minimum Time-rate, One-half of the appropriate General Minimum Time-rate, or One-quarter of the appropriate General Minimum Time-rate, according as the Overtime Rate which would have been payable under the provisions of paragraph (a) of this Section if the worker had been employed on Time-work were Double Time, Time-and-a-half, or Time-and-a-quarter respectively.

Provided that:—

(a) Where it is or may become the established practice of an employer only to require attendance on five days a week the Overtime Rate shall only be payable where on any day the number of hours worked exceeds 9½.

(b) Where it is or may become the established practice of an employer to require attendance only on alternate Saturdays, the normal number of hours of work for the week in which attendance on Saturday is required shall be deemed to be 50.

(c) Where an employer requires attendance on any week-day, not being a Statutory or Customary Public Holiday on which it is not the established practice of the employer to require attendance, all time worked thereon during the otherwise normal working hours of such day shall be paid for at Time-and-a-quarter for the first two hours and Time-and-a-half thereafter.

(d) Notwithstanding the provisions of this Section as to payment of Overtime where a worker who has worked Overtime in any week is absent during any normal working hours in the same week for any reason other than illness or other reasonable cause unavoidable by the worker, payment for the Overtime worked shall only be made at the appropriate rate if and when the hours during which the worker was absent have been recovered in such week.

*Note.*—The hours which female workers, young persons and children are allowed to work are subject to the provisions of the Factory and Workshop Acts.

## PART IV.

SECTION I.—A Female Learner is a worker who:—

(a) Is employed by an employer who provides such Learner with reasonable facilities for practically and efficiently learning the branch or branches of the trade (as carried on by the employer subject to the provisions of this Section) in which the Learner is for the time being employed; provided that no person shall be deemed to be a Learner if employed for a longer period than six months

on any one or more than twelve months on any two or more of the following processes, viz.: carrying about; collecting work from benches and machines; Lidding-up (other than round boxes); Tying-up and Nesting, except in so far as such processes may be incidental to any other process upon which the worker may be engaged.

(b) Has received a certificate or has been registered in accordance with rules from time to time laid down by the Trade Board, or has made application for such certificate or registration, which has been duly acknowledged and is still under consideration.

Provided that the certification or registration of a Learner may be cancelled if the other conditions of learnership are not complied with.

Provided that an employer may employ a Female Learner on her first employment without a certificate or registration for a probation period not exceeding eight weeks, but the probation period shall be included in her period of learnership.

Provided that notwithstanding compliance with the conditions contained in this Section a person shall not be deemed to be a Learner if she works in a room used for dwelling purposes and is not in the employment of her parent or guardian.

SECTION II. — The expression "Home-worker" shall be held to mean a worker who works in her own home or in any other place not under the control or management of the employer.

#### PART V.

The above proposed rates shall, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, apply to all Female Workers who:—

(i) Are engaged in manufacturing processes upon boxes or parts thereof made wholly or partially of paper, cardboard, chip or similar material, and, generally, to all workers directly connected with such processes; or

(ii) Are engaged in transferring material from the store-room to the factory or workshop, and to workers engaged in transferring finished boxes from the factory or workshop to the warehouse, if such workers are also to any considerable extent engaged in connection with the work of distributing the material among, or collection of the finished boxes from, the workers engaged in the processes of box-making.

They shall not apply to Female Workers who:—

(i) Are wholly or mainly engaged in occupations in a store-room which involve no change in, or treatment of, the material necessary to its being made into boxes; or

(ii) Are wholly or mainly engaged in a warehouse on occupations directly connected with the storage or despatch of finished boxes which involve no examination or change in the form of such boxes; or

(iii) Are wholly or mainly engaged in transferring material in bulk from the store-room to the factory or workshop; or

(iv) Are wholly or mainly engaged in transferring finished boxes from the factory or workshop to the warehouse for despatch to customers; or

(v) Wherever employed are engaged as clerks, telephone attendants, and others

whose work stands in a relationship to the trade similar to that of such workers.

#### PART VI.

SECTION I.—The above proposed Minimum Rates of Wages shall be paid clear of all deductions other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments or deductions authorised by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any Superannuation or other Provident Fund.

SECTION II.—The above proposed Minimum Rates of Wages are without prejudice to workers who are earning higher rates of wages.

The Trade Board will consider any Objections to the above Proposals which may be lodged with them within two months from the 5th August, 1920. Such Objections should be in writing and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her full name and address), and should be sent to The Secretary of the Paper Box Trade Board (Great Britain), 5, Chancery Lane, London, W.C. 2.

It is desirable that the Objections should state precisely, and so far as possible with reasons, what is objected to.

#### ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

*(DATED 6TH AUGUST 1920.)*

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

1.—(1.) Sheep brought from the Island of St. Kilda or Dune Island or Soay Island or Boreray Island, in the county of Inverness, shall not be landed in any other part of Great Britain unless they are accompanied by a licence authorising the movement of the sheep to premises for detention under this Order granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which those premises are situate, and such licence shall operate as an authority to land the sheep at any place with a view to their removal to premises situate in the District of the Local Authority by whose Inspector the licence is granted and not elsewhere. The licence shall be available for twenty-one days, inclusive of the day of issue, and no longer.

(2.) The sheep shall be moved from the place of landing to the place of detention specified in the licence by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay, and during the movement they shall, so far as practicable, be kept separate from all sheep not being moved with a licence under this Order.

(3.) Sheep moved to a place of detention with a licence under this Order shall not be moved therefrom, except for the purpose of being dipped, unless and until they have been dipped twice by the owner or person in charge of the sheep, with an interval of not less than seven and not more than fourteen days between the dippings, by a thorough immersion in a sheep-dip approved by the Minister for sheep-scab or purporting to be so approved, in the presence and to the satisfaction of an Inspector of the Local Authority.

(4.) The owner or other person in charge of sheep detained under this Article shall, until they have been dipped twice in the manner prescribed by this Order, keep the same separate from other sheep.

(5.) After completion of the movement the licence shall forthwith be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest police station in the same District by the person in charge of the sheep at the time of completing such movement.

(6.) This Article does not restrict the removal of any carcase of a sheep.

2. If a sheep is landed or moved in contravention of this Order, the owner of the sheep, and the person in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the landing or movement, and the person landing or moving, or conveying the sheep, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it knowing it to have been landed or moved in contravention as aforesaid, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

*Commencement.*

3. This Order shall come into operation on the twenty-third day of August, nineteen hundred and twenty.
