And whereas it is further provided by the said Act that where any powers and duties are transferred by virtue of the said Act, the transfer is to take effect as from a date to be fixed by Order of His Majesty in Council:

And whereas by the Ministry of Labour (Transfer of Powers) Order, 1919, there were transferred to the Minister of Labour the powers and duties then vested in the Minister of Pensions by Section 3 (1) (j) of the Naval and Military War Pensions, &c., Act, 1915, as amended by Section 1 of the Naval and Military War Pensions (Transfer of Powers) Act, 1917:

And whereas by Section 9 of the War Pensions (Administrative Provisions) Act, 1919, the provisions of the Naval and Military War Pensions, &c., Act, 1915, and any Act amending the same, including that Act, which are applicable to officers, were extended so as to be applicable to nurses:

And whereas doubts have arisen as to whether the powers and duties transferred under the Ministry of Labour (Transfer of Powers) Order, 1919, included powers and duties in relation to nurses:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. (1) There shall be transferred to the Minister of Labour the powers and duties of the Minister of Pensions under the Royal Warrant for the retired pay of officers disabled, and for the pensions of the families and relatives of officers deceased, and for the pensions of nurses disabled in consequence of the present war, dated the 1st August, 1917, so far as that Royal Warrant relates to disabled officers undergoing training, and disabled nurses undergoing training, and Articles 7 and 27 of the said Royal Warrant shall have effect accordingly; and the Minister of Labour shall be the sole administrator and interpreter of the said Royal Warrant so far as it relates to such officers and nurses as aforesaid.

(2) The transfer to the Minister of Labour of the powers and duties as regards Officers shall be deemed to have taken effect as from the 1st day of May, 1919, and the transfer of the powers and duties as regards nurses shall be deemed to have taken effect as from the 29th day of October, 1919.

2. It is hereby declared that the powers and duties of the Ministry of Pensions, which were transferred to the Minister of Labour by the Ministry of Labour (Transfer of Powers) Order, 1919, include and always have included, since the passing of the War Pensions (Administrative Provisions) Act, 1919, the powers and duties in relation to nurses referred to in Section 9 of that Act.

3. This Order may be cited as the Ministry of Labour (Transfer of Powers) (No. 2) Order, 1920.

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being, or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions, and provisions, as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas by Orders in Council bearing dates the 1st day of April, 1881, and the 8th day of August, 1911, it is provided, *inter alia*, that Surgeons (now styled Surgeon-Lieutenants) of Your Majesty's Fleet must pass a prescribed Professional Examination to qualify for promotion to the rank of Staff Surgeon (now styled Surgeon Lieutenant-Commander) and certain regulations are laid down as to the advancement or retirement of these Officers conditional upon the result of this examination,

and whereas, further, Your Majesty was graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council bearing date the 11th day of May, 1918, to authorize us during the period of hostilities, and for 12 months thereafter, to dispense with this examination:

"And whereas Your Majesty was graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, bearing date the 22nd day of January, 1920, to approve, *inter alia*, of Surgeon-Lieutenants being eligible for promotion after 6 years instead of 8 as formerly:

"And whereas we consider that, in view of this reduction of qualifying service, it would be conducive to the efficiency of the Service to require Medical Officers to pass a Professional Examination after promotion to the rank of Surgeon Lieutenant-Commander, but before promotion to Surgeon-Commander, instead of prior to promotion to Surgeon Lieutenant-Commander, and also that it would be expedient to make certain consequential alterations in the regulations governing the promotion of Surgeon Lieutenant-Commanders and to provide for their retirement in the event of failure to qualify at this examination:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to approve of the abolition of the examination for Surgeon Lieutenant-Commander laid down in Paragraph 5 (a) of the regulations sanctioned in Order in Council of the 1st April, 1881, together with the consequential regulations for accelerated promotion to Surgeon Lieutenant-Commander and compulsory retirement with a gratuity for failure to qualify for Surgeon Lieutenant-Commander, both conditional upon the result of that examination, which are provided in Order in Council of the 8th August, 1911, and to sanction the following regulations:—

"Surgeon Lieutenant-Commanders to be required to pass a qualifying examination for promotion to the rank of Surgeon-Commander, when they have attained between 2 and 6 years' seniority as a Surgeon-Lieutenant-Commander.

"Surgeon-Lieutenant-Commanders to be eligible for accelerated promotion to Surgeon-Commander according to the class of certificate obtained in the qualifying examination for promotion as follows:—

Special Certificate	... 18 months.
First Class Certificate	... 12 months.

The above accelerated promotion not to be granted on examination results alone, and an Officer also to be recommended as deserving advancement as a condition to such acceleration. The Admiralty to have power to reduce the several periods, if considered advisable, on the recommendation of the Director-General of the Medical Department.

"A Surgeon Lieutenant-Commander who fails to pass the examination to be allowed a second trial, but not to be granted accelerated promotion on the results of the second examination, whatever may be the class of certificate obtained.

"A Surgeon Lieutenant-Commander who fails to pass at this second trial to be compulsorily retired with such gratuity as the Admiralty may see fit to grant him, up to a maximum of £1,000, but not exceeding £100 for each complete year's full pay service.

"These regulations to apply to all Medical Officers entered on or after the 4th August, 1914.

"Officers entered before that date, who have been promoted to the rank of Surgeon Lieutenant-Commander without examination under the terms of Order in Council of the 11th May, 1918, to be allowed, if they wish, to take the examination for Surgeon-Commander, and should they obtain the requisite number of marks, to be eligible to receive an addition to their seniority calculated on the scale laid down in the foregoing regulations.

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to authorize with effect from the 9th June, 1920, the payment of Prize Money for Torpedo proficiency at the rates and under the conditions shown in the attached schedule.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their approval in these proposals."

"SCHEDULE.

"PRIZE MONEY FOR TORPEDO PROFICIENCY TO BE PAID UNDER THE FOLLOWING CONDITIONS:—

"(a) At an annual capitation rate of 5d. per head on the authorized complement, in vessels in which a torpedo armament is carried except submarines for proficiency in drill, loading, careful manipulation and maintenance, and satisfactory running of torpedoes.

"(b) To be calculated as from the date of commissioning or recommissioning of a vessel.

"(c) The amount due in respect of separate years to be payable at any time within the period of a ship's commission, provided that the total prize money distributed during the commission does not exceed the aggregate of the amount payable in respect of each separate year in commission, reckoning for this purpose any portion of an incomplete year as a full year.

"(d) No part of this allowance is to be used for any purpose other than the payment of money prizes for individual or collective proficiency in torpedo.

"(e) In Submarines. Prize money is to be payable at the rate of £1 per annum in each submarine affected, subject to the same conditions as above.

"(f) In Torpedo Boats and Destroyers payment of prize money at an annual capitation rate as at (a) to replace payment at the existing rate—£1 per vessel per annum."

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Henry Luke, Bishop of Chester, (testified by his having signed and sealed this Representation) we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all that part of the said Parish of West Kirby, which is described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should

be assigned as a District Chapelry to the said Church of Saint Andrew, West Kirby, situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The District Chapelry of Saint Andrew, West Kirby.'

REGULATIONS FOR THE CENTRAL COMMITTEE.

PROFITEERING ACTS, 1919 AND 1920.

Whereas under Section 2 of the Profiteering Act, 1919, the Board of Trade are authorized to establish Local or other Committees to whom the Board may delegate any or all of their powers under the Act (except the power of the Board to fix prices), and to make regulations and give directions as to the constitution,

powers and procedure of such Committees and the districts for which they shall act:

And whereas by Order, dated the 18th of September, 1919 (S.R. & O., 1919, 1516), the Board established the Central Committee and made the Regulations set out in the Schedule to the said Order, giving directions as to the constitution, powers and procedure of the said Central Committee:

And whereas it is now deemed expedient to amend the said Regulations:

Now, therefore, the Board, in exercise of the above recited powers, do hereby rescind Regulations 3, 6, 7, 8, 13, 14 and 19 of the said Regulations, and do hereby make the Regulations set out in the Schedule to this Order in lieu of the Regulations hereby rescinded.

SCHEDULE.

3. It shall be the duty of the Investigation of Prices Committee to carry out investigations, pursuant to Section 1 (1) (a) of the Act.

6. (a) The Committees appointed by the Central Committee, under Regulation 2 of the Regulations, dated 18th September, 1919, may add to their number any member of the Central Committee, and may appoint Sub-Committees, consisting of members of the Central Committee and such other persons (if any) as may be appointed for the purpose by the Board of Trade.

Such Sub-Committees shall have all the powers of the appointing Committee necessary for the carrying out of the duties assigned to them except the power to take proceedings in a Court of Summary Jurisdiction, and these Regulations and the Regulations dated 18th September, 1919, shall, so far as applicable, apply to such Sub-Committees. (b) The Central Committee, the Standing Committees appointed under Regulation 2 of the Regulations dated the 18th September, 1919, and any Sub-Committees appointed by the Chairman of the Central Committee under Regulations 13 and 14 of these Regulations, shall have power to take proceedings under Section 1 of the Profiteering Act, 1919, in a Court of Summary Jurisdiction.

7. The Board of Trade will appoint a Chairman of the Central Committee, who, when present, shall preside at any meeting of the Central Committee or of a Standing Committee. If the Chairman is absent from any meeting of a Committee, the members present shall choose one of themselves to preside, and that member shall, for the time being, have all the powers of the Chairman.

Provided always that the Standing Committees appointed under Regulation 2 of the Regulations dated 18th September, 1919, may, if they think fit, appoint a vice-chairman to preside at the meetings of the Standing Committee in the absence of the Chairman of the Central Committee.

8. The quorum of a Committee or sub-committee (including a Tribunal) shall be such number of members, not being less than three,

as the Committee or Sub-Committee may decide.

13. The written complaint shall be considered by a Sub-Committee consisting of members of the Central Committee appointed by the Chairman of the Central Committee, and in any case in which the Sub-Committee are of opinion that the complaint does not give the required particulars, or does not disclose *prima-facie* grounds for hearing the complaint, it shall be competent to the Sub-Committee after giving the complainant opportunity of being heard, to dismiss the complaint without calling upon the respondent, or to notify the complainant that unless further and better particulars or grounds of complaint, as the case may be, be given, the complaint will be dismissed; and in any such case unless such further and better particulars or grounds of complaint, as appear to the Sub-Committee to justify further action on their part, are delivered to them not more than seven days after such notification has been sent to the complainant, or within such extended time as may be allowed by the Sub-Committee, the complaint shall be dismissed. Complaints not delivered before the expiration of the fourteenth day after the date of the sale or transaction complained of, or within such extended time as may be allowed in any particular case, shall be dismissed forthwith.

14. If on the preliminary investigation or consideration of the complaint the Sub-Committee are satisfied that a *prima-facie* cause of complaint has been disclosed, the Chairman of the Central Committee shall appoint a Sub-Committee consisting of members of the Central Committee (hereinafter called the Tribunal) to hear the complaint, and at least seven days before the hearing of the complaint the Secretary of the Complaints Committee shall cause to be sent to the complainant and to the respondent notice in writing of the date and place fixed for the hearing.

19. If on the hearing of the complaint the Tribunal are satisfied that a profit has been made, or has been sought on the sale or offer for sale of an article, which is, in view of all the circumstances, unreasonable, the Tribunal shall declare the price which would yield a reasonable profit, and shall require the seller to repay to the complainant any amount paid by the complainant in excess of such price, and they may take legal proceedings against the seller before a Court of Summary Jurisdiction.

Provided that the profit sought or obtained shall not be deemed to be unreasonable

(a) in the case of a seller who was in the same way of business before the war, if the percentage rate of profit sought or obtained does not exceed the percentage rate of profit obtained by him upon the sale of similar articles before the war, due consideration being given to the relative costs and charges of carrying on the business; and

(b) in the case of a seller who was not in the same way of business before the war, if the percentage rate of profit sought or obtained by him does not exceed the average percentage rate of profit obtained by sellers in that way of business under similar conditions on the sale of similar articles before the war, due consideration being given to the relative costs and charges of carrying on the business.

The above mentioned proviso shall not apply in any case where the profit in respect of any transaction has been fixed by a scheme approved by the Board of Trade under Section 1 of the Profiteering (Amendment) Act, 1920, and further provided that where any scheme has been approved by the Board of Trade under Section 1 of the Profiteering (Amendment) Act, 1920, any profit sought or obtained on the sale of any article to which the scheme relates which does not exceed such profit as is allowed by the scheme shall not be deemed to be unreasonable.

In the matter of the Railway and Canal Traffic Act, 1888, in the matter of the Ministry of Transport Act, 1919, and the Ministry of Transport (Board of Trade Exception of Powers) Order, 1919. And in the matter of an application by the London and North Western Railway Company for a warrant authorising the abandonment of a certain portion of the St. Helens Canal.

WARRANT OF ABANDONMENT.

Whereas by Section 45, Sub-section (1), of the Railway and Canal Traffic Act 1888, it is enacted that where, on the application of a Canal Company, it appears to the Board of Trade that any Canal or part of a Canal belonging to the applicants (hereinafter referred to as an "unnecessary canal") is at the time of making the application unnecessary for the purposes of public navigation, the Board of Trade may, by warrant signed by their Secretary, authorise the abandonment by the existing Proprietors of such unnecessary Canal. And by Sub-section (2) of the same section it is enacted that in the case of an unnecessary canal no warrant of abandonment shall be granted unless the Board of Trade are satisfied:—

(a) That it is unnecessary for the purposes of public navigation.

(b) That the application has been expressly authorised by a resolution of a majority of the Shareholders of the Canal Company owning the canal present and voting at an extraordinary or special general meeting of that Company.

(c) That such public and other notices of the application have been given as the Board of Trade may require.

(d) That compensation has been made to all persons entitled to compensation by reason of the proposed abandonment of the Canal.

And whereas by virtue of Section 46 of the above mentioned Act the expression "Canal Company" in the hereinbefore recited section includes a "Railway and Canal Company" so far as relating to any canal of any such last mentioned Company;

And whereas by Section 2, Sub-section (1), of the Ministry of Transport Act, 1919, and the Ministry of Transport (Board of Trade Exception of Powers) Order, 1919, the powers of the Board of Trade in relation to canal undertakings were transferred to the Minister of Transport;

And whereas by a public Act of Parliament, 28 Geo. 2, Cap. 8, certain persons were ap-

pointed Undertakers and empowered to make and maintain the River or Brook called "Sankey Brook" and the three several Branches thereof "navigable, portable and passable for Boats, Flats and other Vessels" from the River Mersey below Sankey Bridges, up to Boardman's Stone Bridge on the South Branch, to Gerards Bridge on the Middle Branch thereof and to Penny Bridge on the North Branch thereof, all in the County Palatine of Lancaster;

And whereas by a public Act of Parliament 2 Geo. 3, Cap. 56, in order to render more effectual the navigation of the Sankey Brook the Surviving Undertakers appointed by the above mentioned Act of Parliament, 28 Geo. 2, Cap. 8, were empowered to make and maintain a navigable cut or canal from a distance of two hundred and fifty yards from the lock called Sankey Lock on the Sankey Brook, to join and communicate with the River Mersey at Fidler's Ferry;

And whereas the Sankey Brook Navigation and the Canal connected therewith were accordingly completed and the Undertakers incorporated by the name of the Company of Proprietors of the Sankey Brook Navigation, by virtue of the Sankey Brook Navigation Consolidation and Amendment Act, 1830 (11 Geo. IV., Cap. 61), by which Act the Company were, empowered, to make and maintain a Canal from the Sankey Brook Navigation and Canal at or near Fidler's Ferry, into and through the Townships of Penketh Cuerdley and Widnes, in the County of Lancaster, to join or communicate with the River Mersey at Widnes Wharf;

And whereas the Canal was accordingly completed and the powers of the Company of Proprietors of the Sankey Brook Navigation were vested in the St. Helens Canal and Railway Company by virtue of the Sankey Brook Navigation and St. Helens and Runcorn Gap Railway Amalgamation Act, 1845 (8 & 9 Vic., Cap. 117).

And whereas the Undertaking of the St. Helens Canal and Railway Company was vested in the London and North-Western Railway Company by virtue of the St. Helens Canal and Railway Transfer Act, 1864 (27 & 28 Vic., Cap. 296);

And whereas the London and North-Western Railway Company on the 27th day of February, 1920, made application to the Minister of Transport, pursuant to the hereinbefore recited Section 45, Sub-section (1), of the Railway and Canal Traffic Act, 1888, for a Warrant, authorizing the abandonment of the undermentioned portions of the St. Helens Canal, on the grounds that the same was unnecessary for the purposes of public navigation within the meaning of the said Section 45, Sub-section (1), of the Railway and Traffic Act, 1888, namely, the portion of the Ravenhead Branch of the St. Helens Canal, between the points where Bridgewater Street crosses the site of a former portion of such Ravenhead Branch of the Canal which was abandoned under the powers of the London and North-Western Railway Act, 1898 (61 and 62 Vic., Cap. 234), at the side of the Tavern Swing bridge (which was removed under the powers of the said Act) and a point 170

yards or thereabouts east of Bridgewater Street, in the County of Lancaster;

And whereas the Minister of Transport has satisfied himself on the matters referred to in the hereinbefore recited Section 2, Sub-section (1), of the Railway and Canal Traffic Act, 1888;

Now, therefore, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon him by Section 45 of the Railway and Canal Traffic Act, 1888, the Minister of Transport does hereby authorize the abandonment by the London and North-Western Railway Company of the aforesaid portion of the said St. Helens Canal.

In pursuance of the powers conferred on him by the Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, the Minister of Labour is pleased to establish a Trade Board for the Milk Distributive Trade in Ireland, as specified in the Trade Boards (Milk Distributive) Order, 1920, namely:—

1. (a) The wholesale or retail sale of fresh milk when carried on as a main or distinct business or as a distinct branch or department of a business.

(b) The sale of food or drink for consumption on the premises or of other goods when any such sale is carried on in association with and as a subsidiary part of such business, branch or department as aforesaid, if such sale involves the employment of workers who are principally employed in the sale specified in (a) above;

2. (a) The following operations when incidental to the sales specified in 1 above:—

(i) Boxing, parcelling, labelling, weighing, measuring, checking, bottling, unpacking, packing;

(ii) Collecting, delivering, despatching, horse-keeping, cleaning vehicles;

(iii) Portering, lift or hoist operating, time-keeping, storing, stock-keeping, warehousing, cleaning premises;

(iv) Pasteurising, cooling, separating of milk;

(v) Cleaning utensils or receptacles;

(vi) Blending, testing, sampling;

(vii) Other incidental operations;

(b) Clerical work or canvassing when incidental to and carried on in conjunction with the work specified in 1 above;

but excluding any operations in:—

(a) The transport of goods by common carriers;

(b) Any industry or trade concerned exclusively with carting and operations incidental thereto;

(c) Post Office business;

(d) Agriculture within the meaning of the Corn Production Act, 1917.

August, 1920, the Trade Board shall consist of:—

(1) Three appointed members, namely:—

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour, and dated 31st October, 1918, the Trade Board established under the Trade Boards Act, 1918, for the Rope, Twine and Net Trade as specified in the Trade Boards (Rope, Twine and Net) Order, 1919, having given due Notice on 12th April, 1920, of Proposal to Fix General Minimum Piece-Rates and to Vary the Overtime Rates for certain classes of Male and Female Workers, HEREBY GIVE NOTICE, as required by Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, THAT THEY HAVE FIXED the General Minimum Piece-Rates and HAVE VARIED the Overtime Rates set out in the Schedule to their Notice dated 1st April, 1920, in their application to certain classes of Male and Female Workers, the Minimum Rates of Wages as Fixed and as Varied being as shown in the Schedule set out below.

Overtime Rates for Certain Classes of Male and Female Workers.

The Overtime Rates for Male and Female Workers, employed on Piece-work for which General Minimum Piece-Rates have been fixed in Part I of this Schedule, to apply in substitution for the said General Minimum Piece-Rates in respect of hours worked in excess of the number of hours declared by the Trade Board in their Notice dated 1st April, 1920, to be the normal number of hours of work in the trade, shall, subject to the Provisions of Part III of the Schedule to the said Notice, be as follows:—

(a) For the first two hours of Overtime on any day except Saturdays, Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, the Overtime Rate shall be the appropriate General Minimum Piece-Rate with the addition of an amount equal to one-quarter of the Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate which, under the terms of the Trade Board's Notice, dated 1st April, 1920, would be applicable to the worker if he or she were employed on piece-work for which General Minimum Piece-

Rates had not been fixed by the Trade Board.

(b) For Overtime after the first two hours of Overtime on any day except Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, and for all Overtime on Saturdays the Overtime Rate shall be the appropriate General Minimum Piece-Rate with the addition of an amount equal to one-half of the Piece-work Basis Time-Rate which, under the terms of the Trade Board's Notice, dated 1st April, 1920, would be applicable to the worker if he or she were employed on piece-work for which General Minimum Piece-Rates had not been fixed by the Trade Board.

(c) For all time worked on Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, the Overtime Rate shall be the appropriate General Minimum Piece-Rate with the addition of an amount equal to the Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate which, under the terms of the Trade Board's Notice, dated 1st April, 1920, would be applicable to the worker if he or she were employed on piece-work for which General Minimum Piece-Rates had not been fixed by the Trade Board.

(d) All hours worked in any week in excess of 48 shall be paid for as Overtime irrespective of the number of hours worked on any particular day, and the Overtime Rate shall also be payable where on any day (not being a Sunday or Customary Public or Statutory Holiday) the number of hours worked exceeds nine, or in the case of Saturday exceeds five, notwithstanding that the number of hours worked in the week does not exceed 48.

PART III.

The above Minimum Rates of Wages shall apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, to all workers in Great Britain specified in Part I. of this Schedule in respect of all time during which they are employed in any branch of the trade specified in the Trade Boards (Rope, Twine and Net) Order, 1919; that is to say, the making or re-making of (a) rope (including driving rope and banding; (b) cord (including blind and window cord, but excluding silk, worsted and other fancy cords); (c) core for wire ropes; (d) lines; (e) twine (including binder and trawl twine); (f) lanyards; (g) net and similar articles; the bleaching, teasing, hackling, carding, preparing and spinning of the materials required for the making or re-making of any of the articles (a) to (g) above, when carried on in the same factory or workshop as such making or re-making; the manufacture of packings, gaskins and spun yarns, when carried on in the same factory or workshop as the making or re-making of any of the articles (a) to (g) above; the braiding or splicing of articles made from rope, cord, twine or net; the mending of nets and the winding, twisting, doubling, laying, polishing, dressing, tarring, tanning, dyeing, balling, reeling, finishing, packing, despatching, warehousing and storing of any of the above articles, where these operations or any of them are carried on in a factory or workshop in which any of the articles (a) to (g) above are made or re-made; but excluding the making of wire rope (unless made in the same factory or workshop as hemp or similar rope or core for wire rope); and excluding the making of net in connection with the lace curtain trade and the weaving of cloth.

PART IV.

SECTION I.—The above Minimum Rates of Wages shall be paid clear of all deductions, other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments, or deductions authorized by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any Superannuation or other Provident Fund.

SECTION II.—The above Minimum Rates of Wages are without prejudice to workers who are earning higher rates of wages.

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour, and dated 31st October, 1918, the Trade Board established in Great Britain under the Trade Boards Act, 1918, for the Button-making trade, as specified in the Trade Boards (Button-making) Order, 1919, having given due notice on 11th May, 1920, of Proposal to Fix General Minimum Piece-Rates and a Piece-work Basis Time-Rate for Female Home-workers, hereby give notice that they have fixed General Minimum Piece-Rates and a Piece-work Basis Time-Rate under Section 3 (1) (a) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, to apply in respect of Female Home-workers employed in the trade, and that the Minimum Rates of Wages as fixed are as shown in the Schedule set out below, which is incorporated herewith.

And the Trade Board further give notice that they have received notification from the Minister of Labour that he has made an Order, dated 9th August, under Section 4 (2) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, confirming the General Minimum Piece-Rates and Piece-work Basis Time-Rate fixed by the Trade Board, and specifying 14th August, 1920*, as the date from which such General Minimum Piece-Rates and Piece-work Basis Time-Rate shall become effective.

*NOTE.—Should this date not correspond with the beginning of the period for which wages are paid by an employer who pays wages at intervals not exceeding seven days, the rates shall become effective as from the beginning of the next full pay period, but in no case later than 20th August, 1920.

SCHEDULE.

PART I.

General Minimum Piece-Rates for Certain Classes of Female Home-Workers.

Carding Linen Buttons and Metal Trouser Buttons.

For workers to and from whose homes work is delivered and collected by the employer:—

1. For cards containing not more than 1½ dozen buttons per card, 12s. 6d. per 100 gross of buttons.

2. For cards containing more than 1½ dozen buttons per card:—

(a) Covered-back buttons, 10s. 9d. per 100 gross of buttons.

(b) Open-back buttons, 10s. 3d. per 100 gross of buttons.

For workers collecting work from and delivering work to the factory, workshop or warehouse:—

1. For cards containing not more than 1½ dozen buttons per card, 13s. 3d. per 100 gross of buttons.

2. For cards containing more than 1½ dozen buttons per card:—

(a) Covered-back buttons, 11s. 6d. per 100 gross of buttons.

(b) Open-back buttons, 11s. per 100 gross of buttons.

The General Minimum Piece-Rates set out above apply to the actual workers and not to the Middlewomen or Middlemen, and shall be paid on the basis that the employer provides the cotton for sewing the buttons.

PART II.

Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate for Certain Classes of Female Home-Workers.

For all Female Home-workers, other than those employed on carding linen buttons and metal trouser buttons, 8½d. per hour.

In the case of all Female Home-workers employed on Piece-work, to whom the General Minimum Piece-Rates do not apply, each piece-rate paid must be such as would yield in the circumstances of the case not less than 8½d. per hour to an Ordinary Worker, i.e., a worker of ordinary skill and experience in the class of work in question.

PART III.

For the purpose of this Notice the expression "Home-worker" means a worker who works in her own home or in any other place not under the control or management of the employer.

PART IV.

The above General Minimum Piece-Rates and Piece-work Basis Time-Rate shall apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts and of this Notice, to all Female Home-Workers in Great Britain in respect of all time during which they are employed in any branch of the trade specified in the Trade Boards (Button-making) Order, 1919, that is to say:—

The manufacture of buttons, button moulds, upholsterers' buttons or upholsterers' button-headed nails (excluding the shanks), from any material by the processes of cutting, sawing, stamping, pressing, turning, drilling, fancying, grinding, barrel-ling, polishing, japanning, lacquering, dyeing, colouring, painting, varnishing, sewing, crocheting, or the covering of button moulds, including:

(a) The manufacture of studs, links, or parts thereof, from any material other than metal, where such manufacture is carried on in association with or in conjunction with button-making, so as to provide a common or interchangeable form of employment for workers;

(b) The manufacture of shanks or buttons where carried on in association with or in conjunction with button-making;

(c) The carding of any of the above articles, wherever carried on;

(d) All despatching, packing, warehousing, or other operations incidental to or appertaining to the manufacture of any of the above articles;

but excluding:

(e) The manufacture of wooden button moulds;

(f) The covering of button moulds where carried on in association with or in conjunction with the making of wearing apparel.

PART V.

SECTION I.—The above Minimum Rates of Wages shall be paid clear of all deductions, other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments, or deductions authorised by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any superannuation or other provident fund.

SECTION II.—The above Minimum Rates of Wages are without prejudice to Workers who are earning higher rates of wages.

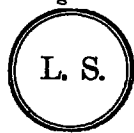

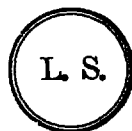
