The KING has been pleased to award the Albert Medal to Mrs. Emmitt, wife of Mr. Frederick Emmitt, Station Master at Peshawar, in recognition of her gallant conduct on the occasion of a murderous attack upon her husband and son in December last.

On December 7th, 1919, Mrs. Emmitt and her children were sitting with her husband, who was in bed with fever. The eldest boy, aged 17, had occasion to go into the sitting-room, and as he entered that room he found an Indian coming in from the garden. On

the boy questioning the man as to what he was doing, the intruder immediately attacked him with an axe, breaking the boy's fore-arm. The boy closed with his assailant, and on his mother coming into the room she found that the man, who had dropped the axe, was stabbing her son with a dagger. She at once rushed to her son's assistance and seized the man, never relaxing her hold in spite of receiving a stab in her side. At this stage her husband came from his sick bed to the rescue; the Indian wrenched himself free from Mrs. Emmitt and stabbed Mr. Emmitt in the thigh. Thereupon Mrs. Emmitt again seized the man by the wrist, and in spite of receiving several more wounds on her hand and arm succeeded in getting hold of the handle of the dagger. Eventually, with the aid of some servants, the assailant was overpowered, and Mrs. Emmitt continued to show the greatest courage by ignoring her own wounds until both her husband and son had been attended to and sent to hospital. All three have now recovered, and their assailant, who proved to be a murderous fanatic, was tried, sentenced, and duly hanged. There can be no doubt that Mrs. Emmitt's bravery saved her son's life and probably her husband's too.

NOTICE OF INTENTION TO MAKE A SPECIAL ORDER, TO BE CITED AS THE TRADE BOARDS (MADE-UP TEXTILES) ORDER, 1920.

The Minister of Labour hereby gives notice that he intends, pursuant to the powers conferred upon him by Section I of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, to make a Special Order applying the Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, to the trade specified in the appendix to this notice, and to vary the Trade Boards (Rope, Twine and Net) Order, 1919, to the extent to which it is affected thereby.

Objections to the Draft Special Order must be sent to the above address within forty-two days from the 17th August, 1920.

APPENDIX.

TRADE.

The Made-up Textiles Trade, that is to say:—

1. The making from woven fabrics of any of the following articles, or the repairing thereof:—

taraulins; tents; marquees; rick, cart or wagon covers; nosebags; oilskin clothing or headgear or linings therefor; flags made of more than one piece; baths, basins, buckets, beds, cots, hammocks, ground sheets or similar articles; girths and articles known in the trade as horse-clothing.

2. The making of any of the following articles from fabrics of the kind specified in paragraph 1 above, or the repairing thereof, when carried on in association with or in conjunction with the making or repairing of any of the articles mentioned in the said paragraph:—

rope-bound coal and coke sacks; haver-sacks or knapsacks; outside and inside blinds or awnings; flags made of one piece; bunting decorations.

Including:—

(A) the following operations when carried on in association with or in conjunction with the operations specified in para-

graphs 1 and 2 above, viz., operations known in the trade as—

(i) the dyeing, oiling, tarring, chemically treating, or otherwise proofing of the fabrics mentioned in paragraph 1 and the preparation of dressings therefor;

(ii) cutting, sewing, finishing, stencilling or branding by hand or machine;

(b) The following or similar operations performed by hand or machine when incidental to and carried on in association with or in conjunction with the operations specified in paragraphs 1 and 2 above:—

(i) the splicing or braiding of rope, cord or twine;

(ii) the making of fittings of leather or webbing, including the assembling of metal or other parts;

(iii) the sewing or attaching to any of the articles mentioned in paragraphs 1 and 2 above of:—

(a) rope, cord or twine,

(b) leather, webbing or metal or fittings made thereof;

(c) the warehousing of, the packing of, and similar operations in regard to any of the articles mentioned in paragraphs 1 and 2 above, when carried on in association with or in conjunction with the operations specified in the said paragraphs;

(d) the warehousing of, the packing of, and similar operations in regard to any other articles when carried on in or in association with or in conjunction with any business, establishment, branch or department mainly engaged in any of the operations mentioned in sub-paragraph (c) above:—

but excluding:—

(i) the making of haversacks and knapsacks when made in association with or in

conjunction with the making of and as part of military web equipment;

(ii) the making of folding or deck chairs;

(iii) the making or repairing of horse clothing, girths and nose bags when carried on in association with or in conjunction with the making or repairing of leather saddlery or harness;

(iv) the making or repairing of rubberised articles;

(v) the making or repairing of tarpaulins or of rope-bound coal and coke sacks in an establishment, business, branch or department in which the making of sails is the main or principal business of the establishment, business, branch or department;

(vi) the printing by hand or machine of flags or parts thereof;

(vii) the operations mentioned in sub-paragraph (c) above, when carried on in or in association with or in conjunction with any business, establishment, branch or department mainly engaged in the warehousing of, the packing of, and similar operations in regard to corn sacks, flour sacks, coal sacks, sugar sacks, cement bags, sand bags, nail bags, potato bags, seed bags, and similar sacks or bags;

(viii) operations performed by workers directly employed by railway companies;

(ix) operations included in the Trade Boards (Hat, Cap and Millinery) Order, 1919;

(x) operations included in the Trade Boards (Linen and Cotton Handkerchiefs and Household Goods and Linen Piece Goods) Order, 1920;

(xi) operations included in the Trade Boards (Rope, Twine and Net) Order, 1919, but not specifically mentioned in this Order.

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour, and dated 31st October, 1918, the Trade Board established under the Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, for that section of the trade specified in the Trade Boards (Tailoring) Order, 1919, which is covered by the Regulations made by the Minister of Labour, and dated 15th January, 1920, with respect to Ready-made and Wholesale Bespoke Tailoring in Great Britain, having given due notice on 17th May, 1920, of Proposal, as therein shown, to Vary and Fix Minimum Rates of Wages for Male Workers, HEREBY GIVE NOTICE, that they HAVE VARIED the General Minimum Time-Rates and Piece-work Basis Time-Rates for Male Workers at present effective and set out in their Notice dated 27th November, 1919, issued by the Tailoring Trade Board (Great Britain) in their application to Male Workers employed in any branch of Ready-made and Wholesale Bespoke Tailoring in Great Britain specified in Part IV. of the Schedule hereof, and HAVE FIXED General Minimum Time-Rates and Piece-Work Basis Time-Rates for Male Workers employed in any branch of Ready-made and Wholesale Bespoke Tailoring in Great Britain specified in Part IV. of the Schedule hereof, to which the said Minimum Rates of Wages set out in the above-mentioned Notice, dated 27th November, 1919, do not apply, and ALSO HAVE FIXED Overtime Rates for Male Workers employed in any branch of Ready-made and Wholesale Bespoke Tailoring in Great Britain specified in Part IV. of the Schedule hereof, the Overtime Rates as fixed to apply in substitution for the Minimum Rates otherwise applicable as set out in Part I. of the Schedule hereto, in respect of hours worked in excess of the number of hours declared by the Trade Board to be the normal number of hours of work in the said branches of the Tailoring Trade, the Minimum Rates of Wages as Varied and Fixed being as shown in the Schedule set out below which is incorporated herewith.

And the Trade Board FURTHER GIVE NOTICE that they have received notification from the Minister of Labour that he has made an Order, dated 6th August, 1920, under Section 4 (2)

of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, confirming the Minimum Rates of Wages as Varied and Fixed by the Trade Board and specifying the 16th August, 1920,* as the date from which such Minimum Rates of Wages shall become effective.

SECTION II.

In cases where the worker is employed on piece-work, each piece-rate paid must be such as would yield, in the circumstances of the case, to an ordinary worker (i.e., a worker of ordinary skill and experience in the class of work in question) an amount not less than the piece-work basis time rate applicable.

* Should this date not correspond with the beginning of the period for which wages are paid by an employer who pays wages at intervals not exceeding seven days, the rates shall become effective as from the beginning of the next full-pay period, but in any case not later than the 22nd of August, 1920.

PART II.

Overtime Rates for Male Workers.

SECTION I.—In accordance with Section 3 (1) (c) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, the Trade Board hereby declare the normal number of hours of work in the trade to be as follows:—

In any week	48
On any weekday (other than Saturday)	9
On Saturday	5

Provided that all hours worked by a worker on Sundays and on Customary Public and Statutory Holidays shall be regarded as Overtime to which the Overtime Rates shall apply.

SECTION II.—The Minimum Rates for Overtime in respect of hours worked by a Male Worker, in excess of the declared normal number of hours of work in the trade, shall be as follows:—

(A) Male Workers employed on Time-work.

(1) For the First Two Hours of Overtime on any day, except Saturdays, Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, the Overtime Rate shall be One-and-a-Quarter times the Minimum Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, Time-and-a-Quarter.

(2) For the Second Two Hours of Overtime on any day except Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, and for all Overtime on Saturdays the Overtime Rate shall be One-and-a-Half times the Minimum Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, Time-and-a-Half.

(3) For all time worked on Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays and for Overtime after the first four hours of Overtime on any other day the Overtime Rate shall be Twice the Minimum Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, Double-time.

(4) For all hours worked in any week in excess of 48, the Overtime Rate shall be One-and-a-Quarter times the Minimum Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, Time-and-a-Quarter, except in so far as higher Overtime Rates are payable under the provisions of paragraphs (2) and (3) of this Section.

The Overtime Rates shall be payable where on any day (not being a Sunday or a Customary Public or Statutory Holiday) the number of hours worked exceeds nine, or in the case of Saturday, exceeds five, notwithstanding that the number of hours worked in the week does not exceed 48.

Provided that:—

(a) Where it is or may become the established practice of an employer to require attendance only on five days a week, the Overtime Rates shall only be payable where on any day the number of hours worked exceeds 9½.

(b) Where it is or may become the established practice of an employer to require attendance only on alternate Saturdays, the normal number of hours for the week in which attendance on Saturday is required shall for the purpose of calculating overtime be deemed to be 50.

(B) Male Workers employed on Piece-work.

(a) Male Workers of 22 years of age and over employed on Piece-work, in respect of whom a Piece-work Basis Time-Rate has been fixed and made effective, shall receive in respect of each hour of Overtime worked

as set out in this Part of this Schedule, in addition to payment at Piece-Rates each of which would yield, in the circumstances of the case, to an Ordinary Worker not less than the Piece-work Basis Time-Rate applicable, an amount equal to the appropriate Piece-work Basis Time-Rate, to One-Half of the appropriate Piece-work Basis Time-Rate, or to One-Quarter of the appropriate Piece-work Basis Time-Rate, according as the Overtime Rate which would have been payable under the provisions of paragraph (A) of this Section, if the worker had been employed on Time-work, were Double-Time, Time-and-a-Half, or Time-and-a-Quarter respectively.

(b) Male Workers under 22 years of age in respect of whom a Piece-work Basis Time-Rate has been fixed, employed on Piece-work, shall receive in respect of each hour of Overtime worked, as set out in this Part of this Schedule, in addition to payment at Piece-Rates each of which would yield, in the circumstances of the case, to an Ordinary Worker not less than the Piece-work Basis Time-Rate applicable, an amount equal to the appropriate General Minimum Time-Rate, to One-Half of the appropriate General Minimum Time-Rate, or to One-Quarter of the appropriate General Minimum Time-Rate, according as the Overtime Rate which would have been payable under the provisions of paragraph (A) of this Section, if the worker had been employed on Time-work were Double-Time, Time-and-a-Half, or Time-and-a-Quarter respectively.

SECTION III.—Where it is or may become the established practice of an employer to require attendance on Sunday instead of Saturday, the Minimum Rates for Overtime as set out above shall apply to workers in like manner as if in the provisions of this Schedule as to Overtime the word "Saturday" were substituted for "Sunday" and the word "Sunday" for "Saturday."

The hours which young persons and children are allowed to work are subject to the provisions of the Factory and Workshop Acts.

PART III.

For the purpose of this Notice the following definitions shall apply:—

SECTION I.—A Measure Cutter is a person—

(a) who is employed in any process of Measure Cutting and is capable of taking a complete set of measures, and of cutting any garment for a Male person from model patterns, and has sufficient technical knowledge to draft men's trousers and alter the balance and distribution of widths, lengths, etc., for any garment for a Male person (excluding alterations to stock patterns); and

(b) who has been employed not less than five years after the age of 19 in actual cutting processes, including not less than three years as a Measure Cutter as defined.

A Stock Cutter is a person—

(a) who is employed in—

(i) Marking-in or marking-up cloth or linings or other materials.

(ii) Laying-up, hooking-up or folding cloth or linings or other materials;

(iii) Cutting cloth or linings or other materials; and

(iv) Dividing; that is, the process ordinarily carried on by Cutters or their assistants, of dividing, parting, or separating

rating the parts of garments after being cut and of assembling them into suitable bundles for making up; and

(b) who has been employed not less than five years after the age of 19 upon the above processes, including not less than three years as a Cutter of any class specified in this Part of this Schedule.

A Knife Cutter or Knifeman is a person—

(a) who is wholly or mainly employed on Band, Electric or Hand Knife processes; and

(b) who has been employed not less than five years after the age of 19 as a Cutter of any class specified in this Part of this Schedule, including not less than three years' experience as a Knife Cutter or Knifeman as defined.

A Fitter-up is a person—

(a) who is employed in Fitting-up; that is, a process between that of cutting and that of sewing, baisting or machining, which consists of preparing or fitting accurately the various parts of the garment before being baisted, sewn or machined, such work of preparing or fitting being always done by shears or knives or other cutting appliances, sewing, baisting or machining forming no part or process of fitting-up; and

(b) who has been employed not less than five years after the age of 19 as a Fitter-up or Tailor as defined in this Section, including not less than three years as a Fitter-up as defined.

A Tailor is a person—

(a) who is employed in Sewing by hand in the process of making a garment or portion of a garment; and

(b) who has been employed not less than five years after the age of 19 as a Tailor as defined.

A Presser is a person—

(a) who is employed in Pressing-off by hand or by machine; and

(b) who has been employed not less than five years after the age of 19 in the processes of Pressing-off or Under-Pressing, including not less than three years as a Presser-off.

A Machinist is a person—

(a) who is employed in Machining, and is capable of machining any garment throughout; and

(b) who has been employed as a Machinist as defined not less than five years after the age of 19.

A Passer is a person—

(a) who is employed in examining Garments, either in the processes of being made up or upon their completion; and

(b) who has been employed not less than five years after the age of 19 as a Passer or Tailor as defined.

An Under-Presser is a person—

(a) who is employed in Pressing Processes other than Pressing-off; and

(b) who has been employed not less than three years after the age of 19 as an Under-Presser or Presser.

A Plain Machinist is a person—

(a) who is employed in the process of making up Plain Sleeves, Facings, Linings, Inside Pockets, Quilting, and Padding; and

(b) who has been employed not less than three years after the age of 19 as a Plain Machinist or a Machinist.

A Warehouseman is a person employed wholly or mainly upon one or more of the following operations, viz., the assembling, keeping, storing and distributing of stock, but *excluding* such operations included in the definitions of a Packer or Porter.

A Packer is a person employed wholly or mainly upon the operation of packing goods and materials, but *excluding* such operations included in the definitions of a Porter or Warehouseman.

A Porter is a person employed wholly or mainly upon one or more of the following operations, viz., unpacking, moving, loading or unloading of goods or materials, but *excluding* such operations included in the definitions of a Packer or Warehouseman.

SECTION II.—The expression "London District" means the Metropolitan and City of London Police Districts.

SECTION III.—The expression "Heavy Cotton Clothing" means articles of clothing for Male persons made wholly or mainly of cords, moles, or other fustians, jeans, drills or other similar cotton material, but *excluding* gabardine raincoats.

PART IV.

The above Minimum Rates of Wages shall apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, to all Male Workers in respect of all time during which they are employed in Great Britain in any branch of Ready-made and Wholesale Bespoke Tailoring, as defined in the Regulations made by the Minister of Labour, and dated 15th January, 1920; that is to say:—

Men's and Boys' ready-made and whole-sale bespoke tailoring; and all men's and boys' retail bespoke tailoring carried on in a factory where garments are made up for three or more retail establishments; and any other branch of men's and boys' tailoring which is not included within the scope of the Regulations dated 12th December, 1919, with respect to the Constitution and Proceedings of a Trade Board in Great Britain for Retail Bespoke Tailoring;

including:—

(1) (a) The altering, repairing, renovating or re-making of men's or boys' tailored garments, except where included within the scope of the above-mentioned Regulations with respect to Retail Bespoke Tailoring.

(b) The cleaning of such garments where carried out in association with or in conjunction with the altering, repairing, renovating or re-making of the garments;

(2) The lining with fur of the above-mentioned garments where carried out in association with or in conjunction with the making of such garments.

(3) All processes of embroidery or decorative needlework, where carried out in association with or in conjunction with the above-mentioned branches of tailoring.

(4) All warehousing, packing, and other operations incidental to or appertaining to any of the branches of tailoring in question.

but excluding:—

(1) The making of head-gear;

(2) The making of rubberised or oilskin garments;

(3) The making of boys' ready-made washing suits or sailor suits, where carried out in

association with or in conjunction with the making of garments to be worn by women or girls, or by children without distinction of sex.

PART V.

SECTION I.—The above Minimum Rates of Wages shall be paid clear of all deductions other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments or deductions authorised by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any superannuation or other provident fund.

SECTION II.—The above minimum rates of wages are without prejudice to workers earning higher rates of wages, or to agreements made, or that may be made, between employers and workers for the payment of wages in excess of these minimum rates of wages.

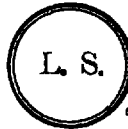

WILTSHIRE AND DISTRICT
(MUZZLING AND CONTROL OF
DOGS) ORDER OF 1920.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

PART I.

*Prohibition of Movement of Dogs out of
certain District.*

1.—(1.) No dog shall be moved out of the District described in the Schedule hereto, hereinafter referred to as "the Scheduled District," unless it is accompanied by a licence of the Ministry authorising such movement signed by an Officer of the Ministry, and any such licence may be subject to such conditions as to the detention and isolation of the dog or otherwise as the Ministry may think necessary or desirable and shall be specified in the licence: Provided that this Article shall not apply to—

(a) the movement of a dog under a licence granted by the Ministry under the Importation of Dogs Order of 1914 and the Importation of Dogs (Amendment) Order of 1918 (No. 2) to a port in Great Britain for shipment, or to a place of detention for the purpose of detention and isolation; or

(b) the movement of a dog through the Scheduled District by railway from a place outside the District to another place outside the District without unnecessary delay and without being re-booked within the District.

(2.) If any farm (except any detached part) is partly within and partly without the Scheduled District, the whole shall be deemed to be within the Scheduled District.

Seizure of Dogs in case of Default.

2.—(1.) If a dog has been moved in contravention of this Order or having been moved with a licence under this Order is not detained and isolated or otherwise dealt with as required by the conditions of the licence, an Inspector of the Ministry may seize the dog, and thereupon the Ministry shall detain and isolate it at the place of detention specified in the licence (if any) or any other place of detention selected by them for such time as the Ministry think necessary or expedient.

(2.) If the owner of the dog does not, within ten days after the expiration of the period of detention specified in the licence (if any) or such other period as the Ministry may think necessary or expedient and notify the owner, claim the dog from the Ministry and pay to them their expenses of detaining and isolating the dog, the Ministry may destroy or otherwise dispose of the dog as they think expedient.

*Notice of Detention in case of Illegal
Movement.*

3.—(1.) Where an Inspector or other Officer of the Ministry, or of a Local Authority, has reason to believe that a dog has been moved in contravention of this Order he may give notice to the owner or person in charge of the dog requiring that the dog shall be detained and isolated in accordance with the provisions of such notice, and that within a time specified in such notice the dog shall be moved to a place of detention for the purpose of such detention and isolation.

(2.) Such provisions may be inserted in the notice as the Ministry may think necessary or desirable for any of the following purposes, namely:—

(i) For prescribing and regulating the detention and isolation of the dog.

(ii) For prescribing the person by whom and the premises on which the dog shall be detained and isolated.

(iii) For regulating the movement of the dog to the place of detention.

(iv) For prescribing the confinement of the dog in a suitable hamper, crate, box, or other receptacle, or the muzzling of the dog, during its movement by railway, or along a highway or thoroughfare.

(v) For prescribing the mode of isolation of the dog.

(vi) For prescribing the notice to be given of the death or loss of the dog, or of any matter arising in connection with the movement, detention, or isolation of the dog and the persons by whom and to whom the notice is to be given; and

(vii) For prescribing the production of the notice for inspection by an officer of the Ministry or police constable, or officer of the Local Authority.

(3.) The operation of a notice under this Article may be terminated by notice to that effect given by an Inspector or other Officer of the Ministry or of the Local Authority to the owner or person in charge of the dog, on proof to the satisfaction of the Inspector or Officer that the dog was not moved in contravention of the said Order.

(4.) If the owner or person in charge of the dog, after receipt of such notice, fails to move the dog as required by the notice, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(5.) If the provisions inserted in any notice under this Article are not complied with, the owner of the dog and the person in charge of the dog and any person who being required to comply with any such provision fails to do so, shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

PART II.

Control of Dogs in Scheduled District.

4.—(1) A dog in the Scheduled District shall at all times:—

(a) whilst in or on any public place be efficiently muzzled with an effective wire-cage muzzle;

(b) whilst in or on any other place, be kept under control by being—

(i) confined in a kennel or other enclosure from which the dog cannot escape; or

- (ii) secured to some premises by a collar and chain; or
- (iii) efficiently muzzled with an effective wire cage muzzle; or
- (iv) accompanied by the owner or some person deputed by him and under effectual control.

(2.) The provisions of this Article shall not apply to—

(a) any pack of hounds while being exercised under the supervision of two or more competent attendants; or

(b) any dog in charge of a competent person while being used for sporting purposes, or for the capture or destruction of vermin, or for the driving or tending of cattle or sheep; or

(c) any dog confined in a suitable hamper, crate, box, or other receptacle, so constructed as to render it impossible for such dog while so confined to bite any person or animal.

Seizure, Detention and Disposal of Uncontrolled Dogs.

5.—(1.) Any dog in the Scheduled District which is not muzzled, or kept under control, as prescribed by this Order, may be seized by the Local Authority or by the police, and any dog so seized shall be dealt with by the Local Authority as follows:—

(i) If the dog is diseased or suspected, or has been bitten by a diseased or suspected dog, it shall be forthwith slaughtered.

(ii) If the dog has been exposed to the infection of rabies it shall be detained, slaughtered, or otherwise dealt with as the Local Authority think expedient, but so that the dog shall not, while detained by the Local Authority, be allowed to come in contact with any other animal.

(iii) In any other case the dog shall be treated as a stray dog seized under the powers conferred by section three of the Dogs Act, 1906.

(2.) No dog so seized shall be given or sold for the purposes of vivisection.

(3.) Every dog shall, for the purposes of this Article, be deemed to have been exposed to the infection of rabies which has been in the same shed, stable, building, kennel, field, or other place, or otherwise in contact with any diseased or suspected dog, or which has in any other way been exposed to the infection of rabies.

Prohibition of Holding of Exhibitions or Shows of Dogs in Scheduled District.

6.—No exhibition or show of dogs whether for sale or otherwise shall be held in the Scheduled District except with a licence of the Ministry, and any such licence shall be subject to such conditions as the Ministry may think necessary or desirable, and shall specify in the licence.

PART III.

GENERAL.

Offences.

7.—(1.) If a dog is moved in contravention of this Order, the owner of the dog, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or per-

mitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the dog, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the dog is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(2.) If any dog in the Scheduled District is not muzzled, or kept under control, as prescribed by this Order, the owner of the dog, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(3.) If a dog which is being moved or has been moved with a licence under this Order is not muzzled or confined or is not detained and isolated or otherwise dealt with as required by the conditions of the licence, the owner of the dog, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(4.) If any person holds, or causes or permits to be held, any exhibition or show in contravention of this Order, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(5.) If a person with a view unlawfully to evade or defeat the operation of this Order or of the conditions of a licence under this Order, allows a dog to stray, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(6.) If the owner or person in charge of a dog fails to give, produce, or do any notice, licence, or thing which by this Order, or by the conditions of a licence thereunder, he is required to give, produce, or do, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

Interpretation.

8.—In this Order—

“The Ministry” means the Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries.

“The Act of 1894” means the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

“Disease” means rabies, “diseased” means affected with rabies, and “suspected” means suspected of rabies.

“Public place” includes any street, highway, thoroughfare, public bridge, royal park, public park, garden or pleasure ground, common, unenclosed land, or other place to which the public have for the time being access.

Other terms have the same meaning as in the Rabies Order of 1919.

Local Authority to Enforce Order.

9.—The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Commencement.

10.—This Order shall take immediate effect: Provided that until the twenty-third day of August, nineteen hundred and twenty, a dog in or on any public place in the Scheduled District need not be muzzled if it is led by a person with a collar and chain or other attachment.

Short Title.

11.—This Order may be cited as the WILTSHIRE AND DISTRICT (MUZZLING AND CONTROL OF DOGS) ORDER OF 1920.
