From on Beard the Britannia off Ushant, the 16th of July. On the 3d instant my Lord Berkeley sent His Majesty's Ships the Burford, the Newcastle, and a Fireship to Groy, with Orders to Land on that Island; and at the same time some of our small Vessels were feat along Shore. On the 4th the Fleet came to an Anchor about two Leagues off B.#-Iff:; and our Barges and Pinnaces were immediately Manned, and ordered to Land upon Howar, one of the Islands called the Cardinals, which they did without any opposition, made themselves Masters of the whole Island, and burnt the Telescope Action. the Town of Honat. They afterwards did the like upon the Island of Hodicke; and killed and brought off much Cattle from both: There is upon each of the Cardinal Islands a Fort with a deep Ditch and a double Wall, to which the Inhabitants and some Soldiers retired, but these Fortifications not hindring us from doing all the Mischief we thought fit, we did not attempt them. The 5th the Kew, the Boyn, the Torkay, and two Dutch Men of War, with the Long Boats of divers other Ships, and Seven Hundred Soldiers and Marines were fent to join the Burfors' and Newcastle at Groy, who finished what Captain Fitz-Patrick had begun; having destroyed there above Twenty Villages: And, in all, we have burnt on these feveral Islands above 1300 Houses, killed and brought away at least 1300 Head of black Cattle and Horses, and taken Twenty Boats and small Vessels. We gave the Enemy a very great Allarm all along their Coasts, where they are forced to keep great numbers of Horse and Foot for their Defence, to the great Charge of the Country, and Hindrance of their Harvest. The 6th my Lord Berkeley detached several Men of War and the Bomb Vessels under Capt. Mees, to Bombard St. Martins in the Isle of Ree. On the 8th we heard great firing from thence. On the 10th the Fleet filled from Bell-1ste. The Med-The Medway retook the Roe Ketch, which was taken by a St. Maloes Man of War. The 14th the Severne St. Maloes Man of War. brought in a French Banker of 90 Tun and 22 Men, laden with Fish. On the 15th the Content retook a West-India Ship laden with Sugar from Nevis. This day appeared in fight of our Fleet 4 French Men of War, supposed to be N. smood's Squadron; some of our Frigats gave them Chace, and the Enemy made all the fail they could to get back to Breft. Capt. Mees is not yet returned to the Pleer, nor have we yet any account of what have been loss as the second of t has been done at St. Marrins.
