

ver: The Marechal de Choiseul is Encamped with most of the Horse at Ostofen, and the rest of their Troops are divided in small Bodies. The Troops of Munster under the Command of Major General Eberfeldt are come to Ladenburg, from whence they will continue their March, to join the Army of the Allies.

Lomburg, Jul. 20. The Ministers of the several Princes who employ their Offices for accommodating the Differences between the King of Denmark and the Duke of Holstein, continue to meet together, though hitherto without making any great Progress in this Affair.

From on Board the Britannia off Ushant, the 16th of July. On the 3d instant my Lord Berkeley sent His Majesty's Ships the *Burford*, the *Newcastle*, and a Fireship to *Groy*, with Orders to Land on that Island; and at the same time some of our small Vessels were sent along Shore. On the 4th the Fleet came to an Anchor about two Leagues off *Bell-Isle*; and our Barges and Pinnaces were immediately Manned, and ordered to Land upon *Howat*, one of the Islands called the Cardinals, which they did without any opposition, made themselves Masters of the whole Island, and burnt the Town of *Howat*. They afterwards did the like upon the Island of *Hodicke*; and killed and brought off much Cattle from both: There is upon each of the Cardinal Islands a Fort with a deep Ditch and a double Wall, to which the Inhabitants and some Soldiers retired, but these Fortifications not hindring us from doing all the Mischief we thought fit, we did not attempt them. The 5th the *Kent*, the *Boyn*, the *Torbay*, and two Dutch Men of War, with the Long Boats of divers other Ships, and Seven Hundred Soldiers and Marines were sent to join the *Burford* and *Newcastle* at *Groy*, who finished what Captain *Fitz-Patrick* had begun; having destroyed there above Twenty Villages: And, in all, we have burnt on these several Islands above 1300 Houses, killed and brought away at least 1300 Head of black Cattle and Horses, and taken Twenty Boats and small Vessels. We gave the Enemy a very great Alarm all along their Coasts, where they are forced to keep great numbers of Horse and Foot for their Defence, to the great Charge of the Country, and Hindrance of their Harvest. The 6th my Lord Berkeley detached several Men of War and the Bomb Vessels under Capt. *Mees*, to Bombard *St. Martins* in the Isle of *Ree*. On the 8th we heard great firing from thence. On the 10th the Fleet sailed from *Bell-Isle*. The *Medway* retook the *Roe Ketch*, which was taken by a *St. Maloes* Man of War. The 14th the *Severne* brought in a French Banker of 90 Tun and 22 Men, laden with Fish. On the 15th the *Content* retook a *West-India* Ship laden with Sugar from *Nevis*. This day appeared in sight of our Fleet 4 French Men of War, supposed to be *Nesmond's* Squadron; some of our Frigats gave them Chace, and the Enemy made all the sail they could to get back to *Brest*. Capt. *Mees* is not yet returned to the Fleet, nor have we yet any account of what has been done at *St. Martins*.

Falmouth, July 16. The 16th arrived here the Spanish Expedition in 4 days from the *Greys*; and the Spanish Alliance went out this day on her Voyage thither.

Plymouth, July 19. This day Rear Admiral *Nesmond* came into this Port with the Squadron under his Command from Cruising.

Yarmouth, July 20. Yesterday came into our Road a Fleet of above 100 sail of laden Colliers bound to the Southward.

Whitehall, July 20. The Association of the Benchers, Associates, Baristers, and Students of *Lincoln's-Inn*, was Presented to their Excellencies the Lords Justices by Sir *John Hawles*, His Majesty's Solicitor-General, and other Benchers of the same.
