At the Court at Buckingham Palace, the 13th day of August, 1920.

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 12th day of August, 1920, in the words following, viz. :—

“ Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, or to the widow or relative of a deceased Officer, Seaman, or Marine, shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions, as are from time to time directed by Order in Council :

“ And whereas by Section 2 of the Officers of the Royal Naval Reserve Act, 1863, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that the Admiralty may enrol Officers of the Reserve to the Royal Navy

under, and subject to, such Rules, Orders and Regulations as the Admiralty may, with the consent of Your Majesty in Council, from time to time establish :

“ And whereas under the Pensions (Increase) Bill, 1920, it is proposed to make provision, subject to certain conditions and restrictions, for the increase of certain pensions granted before the 4th day of August, 1914, and subject to certain further limitations for the increase of similar pensions granted subsequently to that date to certain pensioners therein referred to :

“ And whereas by Clause 6 of the said Bill it is proposed to be enacted that any increase in a pension granted under any Order in Council for the grant to persons who have been in the Naval or Military service of the Crown of benefits corresponding to those provided under the Act, shall not be taken into account in determining the amount of, or eligibility for, a special Greenwich Hospital pension under Section five of the Greenwich Hospital Act, 1869, as amended by Section four of the Greenwich Hospital Act, 1898 :

“ And whereas we are of opinion that subject to like conditions and restrictions

(a) Officers and men of Your Majesty's Naval and Marine Forces.

(b) The widows of such Officers and men.

(c) Members of Queen Alexandra's Royal Naval Nursing Service and Nursing Service Reserve.

(d) Riggers and Yardcraft men pensionable under Your Majesty's Order in Council bearing date the 2nd day of June, 1915, and previous Orders.

(e) Teachers in the Girls' and Infants' Schools of Your Majesty's Royal Marine Forces who are pensionable under Orders in Council dated the 18th day of May, 1897, and the 10th day of February, 1905,

who are in receipt of retired pay or pension granted before the 4th day of August, 1914, as well as certain of them who have been or may hereafter be granted retired pay or pension subsequently, but with effect from a date not later than the 13th day of August, 1920, should receive increases of retired pay or pension:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to empower us to grant at our discretion increases of retired pay or pension to Officers and men of Your Majesty's Naval and Marine Forces, to their widows, to members of Queen Alexandra's Royal Naval Nursing Service or Nursing Service Reserve, to Riggers and Yardcraft men and to Teachers at the Royal Marine Schools under the conditions specified in the Schedule annexed hereto, provided that no such increase shall be granted until such time as the aforesaid Pensions (Increase) Bill, 1920, shall have received the Royal Assent.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals.

"Regulations regarding the increase of pensions.

"Definitions.

(1) For the purpose of these Regulations:—

(a) The term "pension" includes the retired pay of an Officer and the term "pensioner" includes an Officer in receipt of retired pay.

(b) The expression "married person" includes a widower or widow with one or more children under 16 years of age dependent on him or her and the expression "unmarried person" includes a widower or widow having no such child.

(c) The terms "child" and "children" include a step-child or step-children of the pensioner, but do not include any person over the age of 16 years.

"Pensions to which these Regulations apply.

(2) The pensions which may be increased under these Regulations are pensions which have been granted, or which may hereafter be granted with effect from a date not later than the 13th day of August, 1920, to

(a) Officers and men of the Royal Navy, Royal Marines and Naval Reserve Forces.

(b) Widows of Officers and men of the Royal Navy, Royal Marines and Naval Reserve Forces.

(c) Members of Queen Alexandra's Royal Naval Nursing Service and Nursing Service Reserve.

(d) Riggers and Yardcraft men of Your Majesty's Dockyards.

(e) Teachers in the Girls' and Infants' Schools of Your Majesty's Royal Marine Forces.

"Conditions of eligibility.

(3) The conditions for the increase of pensions under these Regulations are:—

(a) The pensioner must reside in the British Islands.

(b) Except as provided at (c) hereunder the pensioner must have attained the age of 60 years or have been retired or discharged on account of physical or mental infirmity.

(c) The pensioner, if the widow of an Officer or man, and in receipt of a pension as such, must have attained the age of 40 years.

(d) The pensioner must satisfy the Admiralty that his or her means, including his or her pension and any increase thereof granted under these Regulations, do not exceed one hundred and fifty pounds a year if he or she be an unmarried person or two hundred pounds a year if he or she be a married person.

"Limitations on the amount of Increase of Pensions.

(4) The following limitations shall apply to all increases of pension granted under these Regulations:—

(a) When the existing pension does not exceed £50 a year it may be increased by 50 per cent.

When the existing pension exceeds £50 a year, but does not exceed £100 a year in the case of an unmarried person, or £130 a year in the case of a married person, it may be increased by 40 per cent.

When the existing pension exceeds £100 a year, but is less than £150 a year in the case of an unmarried person, or exceeds £130 a year, but is less than £200 a year in the case of a married person, it may be increased by 30 per cent.

Provided that

(i) If the amount to which a pension may be increased under the above scale is less than the amount to which a smaller pension might be increased, it may be increased to the latter amount.

(ii) no pension shall be increased by an amount greater than is sufficient to bring the total means of the pensioner, including the increased pension, up to £150 a year in the case of an unmarried person, or £200 a year in the case of a married person.

(b) When a Naval Pensioner is also in receipt of another or other pensions in respect of which increases may be granted, the Admiralty may, at its discretion, treat all the pensions as one pension of an amount equal to the aggregate amount of the said pensions for the purpose of determining the percentage increase to be granted under the above scale in respect of the Naval Pension.

(5) The following further limitations shall apply to pensions granted or re-assessed since the 4th day of August, 1914:—

(a) No pension which is larger than a pre-war pension by reason of a re-assessment or revision of regulations made since the 3rd day of August, 1914, shall be increased under these regulations by an amount greater than is sufficient to make the increased pension equal to the amount to which the pre-war pension might have been increased under Rule (4).

(b) No pension granted with effect from a date later than the 3rd day of August, 1914, shall be increased under these regulations by an amount greater than is sufficient to make the increased pension equal to the amount which might be granted under existing regulations or any amended regulations which may be promulgated before the 31st day of December, 1920.

Provisions respecting Greenwich Hospital Pensioners.

(6) With the exception of

(a) age pensions and increased age pensions granted to seamen and marines on attaining 55 and 65 years of age respectively, and

(b) pensions granted to widows of seamen and marines,

which are chargeable partly to Navy Votes and partly to the funds of Greenwich Hospital, no pension, the cost of which is not chargeable wholly to Navy Votes, shall be increased under these regulations.

(7) An increase in a pension granted under any of these Regulations shall not be taken into account in determining the amount of, or the eligibility for, a Greenwich Hospital Special Pension under Section 5 of the Greenwich Hospital Act, 1869, as amended by Section 4 of the Greenwich Hospital Act, 1898.

(8) The cost of all increases of pension granted under these Regulations, including those referred to in Rule 6 above, the cost of which is chargeable partly to Navy Votes, and partly to the funds of Greenwich Hospital, shall be charged wholly to Navy Votes.

Provisions regarding Commuted Pensions.

(9)—(a) These Regulations shall not apply to any pension or part of a pension which has been commuted.

(b) No pension which has been increased under these Regulations shall be commuted in whole or in part thereafter.

(c) In considering any application for increase of pension under these Regulations by a pensioner who may have commuted some part of his or her pension after the 13th day of August, 1920, the Admiralty shall consider such pension as of an amount equal to the amount of the pension before such commutation for the purposes of determining the means of the pensioner and the amount of the increase to be granted in respect thereof under these Regulations.

Miscellaneous Provisions.

(10) The Admiralty may prescribe the manner in which the means of a pensioner are to be calculated for the purpose of these Regulations, and may require from time to time of all pensioners who claim, or may be in receipt of, an increase of pension under these Regulations, a declaration in such form as may be prescribed regarding their means of livelihood and condition as regards dependants.

(11) An increase of pension granted under any of these Regulations may be reviewed with a view to increase, reduction or cessation, whenever a change in the circumstances and means of livelihood of the pensioner renders such review necessary.

(12) These Regulations shall have effect from the first day of April, 1920.

(13) In all matters pertaining to the interpretation of these rules, including the eligibility of any pensioner, or class of pensioners, for

benefit thereunder, the decision of the Admiralty shall be final."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.—

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by the Coroners Act, 1844, it is (amongst other things) enacted that when and as often as it shall seem expedient to the Justices of any County that such County should be divided into two or more districts for the purposes of that Act or that any alteration should be made of any division theretofore made under that Act, it shall be lawful for the said Justices in General or Quarter Session assembled, to resolve that a Petition shall be presented to His Majesty praying that such division or alteration be made, and thereupon to adjourn the further consideration of such Petition until notice thereof shall be given to the Coroner or Coroners of such County as hereinafter provided; and that the Clerk of the Peace shall give notice of any such resolution to every Coroner for such County and of the time when the Petition will be taken by the said Justices into consideration and the Justices shall confer with every such Coroner who shall attend the meeting of the Justices for that purpose touching such Petition, having due regard to the size and nature of each proposed district, the number of the inhabitants, the nature of their employment, and such other circumstances as shall appear to the Justices fit to be considered in carrying into execution the provisions of the said Act; and such Petition, with a description of the several proposed districts and of the boundaries thereof, with the reasons upon which the Petition is founded, shall be certified to His Majesty under the hands and seals of two or more of the Justices present when such Petition shall be agreed to, and the Clerk of the Peace for such County shall forthwith give or send a true copy of such Petition, certified under his hand, to every Coroner for such County, and that it shall be lawful for His Majesty, if He shall think fit, with the advice of His Privy Council, after taking into consideration any such Petition and also any Petition which may be presented to Him by any Coroner of the same County concerning such proposed division or alteration, or whenever it shall seem fit to His Majesty to direct the issue of a Writ *de Coronatore Eligendo* for the purpose of authorizing the election of an additional Coroner above the number of those who have been theretofore customarily elected in such County, to order that such County shall be divided into such and so many Districts for the purposes of the said Act as to His Majesty, with the advice aforesaid, shall seem expedient, and to give a name to each of such districts, and every such Order shall be published in the "London Gazette":

And whereas by the Local Government Act, 1888, the powers and business of the said Justices in respect of the matters aforesaid in each County were transferred to the Council of such County:

And whereas by an Order in Council made on the 26th day of June, 1861, under the provisions of the hereinbefore first recited Act, the County Palatine of Lancaster was divided into six Districts for Coroners' purposes and the purposes of the said Act, which said Districts were named respectively the Lancaster, Preston, Blackburn, Salford, Rochdale and West Derby Districts, and such Districts were to comprise respectively the several parishes, townships and places set forth and enumerated in the said Order:

And whereas by an Order in Council made on the 5th day of February, 1870, under the same provisions of the said hereinbefore first recited Act, the said Salford and Rochdale Districts of the said County were divided into three Districts, which said Districts were named respectively the Salford, Rochdale and Bolton Districts and such Districts were to comprise respectively the several parishes, townships and places set forth and enumerated in the said Order:

And whereas by an Order in Council made on the 18th day of August, 1916, the Salford Hundred portion of the Borough of Bacup was transferred from the Rochdale Coroner's District of the said County to the Blackburn Hundred Coroner's District of the said County:

And whereas a Petition has been presented to His Majesty by the County Council for the County Palatine of Lancaster praying for the transfer of the portion of the Township and County Borough of Bury, which was formerly part of the Townships of Birtle-cum-Bamford and Heap, from the Rochdale Coroner's District to the Bolton Coroner's District, for the transfer of the two portions of the Township and Borough of Middleton, which were formerly parts of the late Townships of Prestwich and Great and Little Heaton, from the Salford Coroner's District to the Rochdale Coroner's District, and for the name of the Bolton Coroner's District to be altered to the Bury Coroner's District:

And whereas the said Petition, with the reasons upon which it is founded, has been duly certified to His Majesty:

And whereas all the provisions in that behalf of the hereinbefore first recited Act have been duly complied with:

And whereas the Coroners for the said County have not presented any Petition to His Majesty concerning the said proposed alterations:

And whereas the Chancellor and Council of the Duchy of Lancaster have recommended the making of an Order in Council in accordance with the prayer of the said Petition:

And whereas His Majesty has, with the advice of His Privy Council, taken into consideration the said Petition and is minded to make such alterations as aforesaid:

Now, therefore, His Majesty in Council, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased to order, direct and declare, as it is hereby ordered, directed and declared:—

1. From and after the date hereof, alteration shall be made of the division heretofore made of the County Palatine of Lancaster for

Coroners' purposes, and for the purposes of the Coroners Act, 1844, as follows, that is to say, (a) the portion of the Township and County Borough of Bury (formerly part of the Townships of Birtle-cum-Bamford and Heap), shall be transferred from the Rochdale Coroner's District to the Bolton Coroner's District of the said County; (b) the two portions of the Township and Borough of Middleton (formerly parts of the Township of Prestwich and the late Townships of Great and Little Heaton) shall be transferred from the Salford Coroner's District to the Rochdale Coroner's District.

2. The name of the "Bolton Coroner's District" shall be altered to the "Bury Coroner's District."

3. The said Districts shall respectively comprise the several parishes and places in that behalf prescribed and mentioned in the Schedule hereto.

4. This Order shall be published in the "London Gazette."

is declared that any Order in Council made under the said Act, extending any enactment or regulation to the Isle of Man, may be revoked by Order in Council:

And whereas the Acts, Order in Council, and Regulations set out in the second Column of the Schedule annexed hereto were extended to the Isle of Man by the respective Orders in Council set out in the third Column of the said Schedule, subject to the adaptations contained therein:

And whereas it is expedient that the said Acts, Order in Council, and Regulations should no longer extend to the Isle of Man:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the Orders in Council set out in the third column of the Schedule annexed hereto shall be revoked.

Fibre Drafter, Dresser or Dyer, Bass Sorter, Dyer, Cutter, Rougher, Mixer or Finisher, 9½d. per hour.

C.—For all other Female Workers:—
Workers of 18 years of age and over, 8½d. per hour.

Workers of 17½ and under 18 years of age, 7½d. per hour.

Workers of 17 and under 17½ years of age, 6½d. per hour.

Workers of 16½ and under 17 years of age, 6d. per hour.

Workers of 16 and under 16½ years of age, 5½d. per hour.

Workers of 15½ and under 16 years of age, 4½d. per hour.

Workers of 15 and under 15½ years of age, 4d. per hour.

Workers of 14½ and under 15 years of age, 3½d. per hour.

Workers under 14½ years of age, 3d. per hour.

Provided that in the case of any worker who enters the trade for the first time at or over the age of 16 years, and who is employed on Time-work, the General Minimum Time-Rate payable during the worker's first twelve months' employment shall be the respective minimum rates set out above appropriate to a worker in the immediately junior age-group in lieu of the General Minimum Time-Rates otherwise applicable.

Provided also that the Rates set out in paragraphs A, B and C above shall NOT apply to Hand-loom Weavers (other than Damask Seating Hand-loom Weavers), to Home-workers, or to Apprentices, as defined in Part VI of this Schedule.

VARIATION PROPOSED.

SECTION I.—For Female Workers who are employed in one or more of the following occupations, and who have not had less than three years' experience in one or more of such occupations:—

Horse Hair Sorter, Hackler, Drawer or Buncher; Power-loom Weaver, Winder, Damask Seating Hand-loom Weaver, Curler, Spinner, Hair Dyer, Cloth Starcher, Carpet Weaver:—

When employed at 18 years of age and over, 9½d. per hour.

When employed at 17½ and under 18 years of age, 8½d. per hour.

When employed at 17 and under 17½ years of age, 7½d. per hour.

SECTION II.—For Female Workers who are employed in one or more of the following occupations, and who have not had less than three years' experience in one or more of such occupations:—

Fibre Drafter, Dresser or Dyer, Bass Sorter, Dyer, Cutter, Rougher, Mixer or Finisher:—

When employed at 18 years of age and over, 9½d. per hour.

When employed at 17½ and under 18 years of age, 8½d. per hour.

When employed at 17 and under 17½ years of age, 7½d. per hour.

SECTION III.—For all other Female Workers:—

Workers of 18 years of age and over, 8½d. per hour.

Workers of 17½ and under 18 years of age, 7½d. per hour.

Workers of 17 and under 17½ years of age, 6½d. per hour.

Workers of 16½ and under 17 years of age, 6d. per hour.

Workers of 16 and under 16½ years of age, 5½d. per hour.

Workers of 15½ and under 16 years of age, 4½d. per hour.

Workers of 15 and under 15½ years of age, 4d. per hour.

Workers of 14½ and under 15 years of age, 3½d. per hour.

Workers under 14½ years of age, 3d. per hour.

Provided that in the case of any worker who enters the trade for the first time at or over the age of 16 years, and who is employed on Time-work, the General Minimum Time-Rates payable during the worker's first twelve months' employment shall be the respective minimum rates set out in Section III above appropriate to a worker in the immediately junior age-

group in lieu of the General Minimum Time-Rates otherwise applicable.

Provided also that the Minimum Rates set out in Sections I, II and III above shall NOT apply to Hand-loom Weavers (other than Damask Seating Hand-loom Weavers).

PART III.

Proposed Overtime Rates and Proposed Variation of Overtime Rates for Certain Classes of Male and Female Workers.

SECTION I.—In accordance with Section 3 (1) (c) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, the Trade Board have declared the normal number of hours of work in the trade in any week to be 48.

Provided that all hours worked on Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays shall be regarded as Overtime to which the Overtime Rates shall apply.

SECTION II.—The Trade Board propose to fix Overtime Rates and to vary the Overtime Rates fixed by the Trade Board and set out in their Notice dated 30th July, 1920, so that in lieu of such Overtime Rates, Overtime Rates calculated on the General Minimum Time-Rates set out in Sections I, II and III of Part I, and Sections I, II and III of Part II of this Schedule shall apply in respect of hours worked by a Worker in excess of the declared normal number of hours of work in the trade as follows, that is to say:—

A.—Workers employed on Time-work.

(1) For the first four hours of Overtime in any week the Overtime Rate shall be One-and-a-Quarter times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, Time-and-a-Quarter.

(2) For Overtime after the first four hours of Overtime in any week, the Overtime Rate shall be One-and-a-Half times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, Time-and-a-Half.

Provided that for all time worked on Sundays and on Customary Public and Statutory Holidays the Overtime Rate shall be Twice the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, Double Time.

B.—Workers employed on Piece-work.

Workers employed on Piece-work shall receive in respect of each hour of Overtime a Piece-rate which would yield, in the circumstances of the case, to an Ordinary Worker, at least the equivalent of the appropriate Piece-work Basis Time-rate or General Minimum Time-rate, as the case may be, with the addition of:—

(1) As respects each of the first four hours of Overtime in any week, a sum equivalent to One-quarter of the appropriate Piece-work Basis Time-rate or General Minimum Time-rate, as the case may be;

(2) As respects each hour in excess of four hours of Overtime in any week, a sum equivalent to One-half of the appropriate Piece-work Basis Time-rate or General Minimum Time-rate, as the case may be;

(3) As respects each hour of employment on Sundays and on Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, a sum equivalent to the appropriate Piece-work Basis Time-rate or General Minimum Time-rate, as the case may be.

Provided that the above Overtime Rates shall not apply to Hand-loom Weavers (other than Damask Seating Hand-loom Weavers).

PART IV.

Proposed General Minimum Piece-Rates for Hand-Loom Weavers.

The Trade Board propose to fix General Minimum Piece-Rates for Hand-loom Weaving as follows:—

Proposed Overtime Rates for Hand-Loom Weavers (other than Home-workers).

The Trade Board propose to fix Overtime Rates for Hand-Loom Weavers (other than Home-workers) employed on Piece-work to which the General Minimum Piece-Rates set out in Part IV of this Schedule are applicable, in respect of hours worked in excess of the number of hours declared by the Trade Board to be the normal number of hours of work in the trade as follows:—

Hand-Loom Weavers (other than Home-workers) shall receive in addition to payment at not less than the appropriate General Minimum Piece-Rates:—

- (i) As respects each of the first four hours of Overtime in any week, 2d. per hour;
- (ii) As respects each hour in excess of four hours of Overtime in any week, 4d. per hour;
- (iii) As respects each hour of employment on Sundays or on Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, 8d. per hour.

PART VI.

SECTION I.—For the purpose of this Notice the expression "Home-worker" means a worker who works in his or her own home, or in any other place not under the control or management of the employer.

SECTION II.—For the purpose of this Notice the expression "Apprentices" means Indentured Apprentices and Unbound Learners employed under an agreement, written or verbal, providing for the proper instruction of the Learner in one or more of the occupations specified in Parts IA, IB, IIA or IIB of this Schedule.

PART VII.

SECTION I.—The respective Minimum Rates set out in this Schedule shall apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts and of this Notice, to all workers in Great Britain who are employed during the whole or any part of their time in any branch of the Trade specified in the Trade Boards (Hair, Bass and Fibre) Order, 1919; that is to say:—

The drafting, dressing or mixing of bass, whisk or similar fibres or horse hair or other hairs and the curling or weaving of hair or fibre, or of mixed hair and fibre, and all preparatory, finishing, warehousing or packing operations incidental to or appertaining to all or any of the above processes, but excluding any of the above operations or processes where they are carried on in association with

or in conjunction with the manufacture of brushes or brooms, and excluding also the dressing of animal skins.

SECTION II.—The Minimum Rates set out in this Schedule shall be paid clear of all deductions other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments, or deductions authorised by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any superannuation or other provident fund.

SECTION III.—The Minimum Rates set out in this Schedule are without prejudice to Workers who are earning higher rates of wages.

The Trade Board will consider any Objections to the above Proposals which may be lodged with them within two months from the 27th August, 1920. Such Objections should be in writing, and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her full name and address), and should be sent to the Secretary of the Hair, Bass and Fibre Trade Board (Great Britain), 5, Chancery Lane, London, W.C. 2.

It is desirable that the Objections should state precisely, and so far as possible with reasons, what is objected to.

JUTE TRADE BOARD (GREAT BRITAIN).

PROPOSAL TO VARY AND FIX CERTAIN MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES FOR CERTAIN CLASSES OF FEMALE WORKERS IN THE COUNTY BOROUGH OF BOOTLE.

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour, and dated 31st October, 1918, the Trade Board established under the Trade Boards Act, 1918, for the Jute Trade in Great Britain, as specified in the Trade Boards (Jute) Order, 1919, hereby give notice, as required by Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, that they propose to vary the General Minimum Time-Rates at present fixed and set out in the Schedule to their Notice dated 3rd June, 1920, in their application to certain classes of Female Workers in the County Borough of Bootle, and to fix Overtime

Rates for certain classes of Female Workers employed on Time-work in such area, and to declare the normal number of hours of work in the trade for the purpose of the application of the Overtime Rates, the Proposed Minimum Rates of Wages and the proposed normal number of hours of work being as shown in the Schedule set out below.

The Minister of Labour has given his consent to the Notice of Proposal to vary being given.

SCHEDULE.

PART I.

Proposed Variation of General Minimum Time-Rates for Certain Classes of Female Workers in the County Borough of Bootle.

SECTION I.

For Female Workers of 18 years of age and over, from 32s. to 30s. per week of 48 hours.

For Female Workers of 16 and under 18 years of age, from 28s. to 26s. per week of 48 hours.

SECTION II.—The above proposed General Minimum Time-Rates are weekly rates, based on a week of 48 hours, and they shall be subject to a proportionate deduction according as the number of hours spent by the worker in the factory or workshop under contract of employment in any week is less than 48.

PART II.

Proposed Overtime Rates for Certain Classes of Female Workers employed on Time-Work.

SECTION I.—In accordance with Section 3 (1) (c) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, the Trade Board propose to declare the normal number of hours of work in the trade to be as follows:—

In any week	48
On any day (other than Saturday)	8½		
On Saturday	4½

Provided that all hours worked on Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays shall be regarded as Overtime to which the Overtime Rates shall apply.

SECTION II.—The Minimum Rates for Overtime in respect of hours worked by the classes of Female Workers specified in Section I of Part I of this Schedule employed on Time-work in excess of the declared normal number of hours shall be as follows, that is to say:—

(a) For Overtime on any day, except Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, the Overtime Rate shall be equivalent to Time-and-a-half, that is to say, One-and-a-half times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable.

(b) For all time worked on Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, the Overtime Rate shall be equivalent to Double Time, that is to say, twice the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable.

(c) The Overtime Rates shall be payable where on any day (not being a Sunday or Customary Public or Statutory Holiday) the number of hours worked exceeds 8½, or in the case of Saturday exceeds 4½; notwithstanding that the number of hours worked in the week does not exceed 48.

NOTE.—The hours which Female Workers, young persons and children are allowed to work are subject to the provisions of the Factory and Workshop Acts.

PART III.

The above Minimum Rates of Wages shall apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, to the classes of Female Workers in the County Borough of Bootle, specified in Section I of Part I of this Schedule, in respect of all time during which they are employed in any branch of the trade specified in the Trade Boards (Jute) Order, 1919, that is to say:—

The preparing, spinning and weaving (a) of jute or (b) of jute and any other fibre, except flax or hemp,

Including

(1) The preparing and spinning of waste reclaimed at any stage, and

(2) All packing, despatching, warehousing, storing, or other operations incidental to or appertaining to any of the above-mentioned work; but

Excluding

(1) The calendering, bleaching, dyeing or finishing of any of the above-mentioned materials, and

(2) The preparing or spinning of materials required for the making or remaking of (a) rope (including driving rope and banding), (b) cord (including blind and window cord, but excluding silk, worsted and other fancy cords), (c) core for wire ropes, (d) lines, (e) twine (including binder and trawl twine), (f) lanyards, (g) net and similar articles, when such preparing or spinning is carried on in the same factory or workshop as the said making or remaking; and

(3) The making or repair of sacks or bags; and also

(4) The weaving of carpets, rugs or mats.

PART IV.

SECTION I.—The above proposed Minimum Rates of Wages shall be paid clear of all deductions other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments or deductions authorised by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any superannuation or other provident fund.

SECTION II.—The above proposed Minimum Rates of Wages shall be without prejudice to workers who are earning higher rates of wages.

The Trade Board will consider any objections to the above proposals to vary and fix which may be lodged with them within two months from 28th August, 1920. Such objections should be in writing and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her full name and address) and should be sent to the Secretary of the Jute Trade Board (Great Britain), 5, Chancery Lane, London, W.C. 2.

It is desirable that the objections should state precisely, and so far as possible with reasons, what is objected to.

MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES (AS FIXED AND AS VARIED) FOR FEMALE AND MALE WORKERS.
Effective as from 30th August, 1920.*

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour, and dated 31st October, 1918, the Trade Board established under that Act and the Trade Boards Provisional Orders Confirmation Act, 1913 (as varied by the Trade Boards (Shirtmaking) Order, 1920), for the Shirtmaking Trade in Great Britain as defined in the Appendix to the aforementioned Trade Boards (Shirtmaking) Order, 1920, having given due Notice on 3rd May, 1920, of Proposal to Vary the General Minimum Time-Rates and Overtime Rates and to Fix Piece-Work Basis Time-Rates for Female and Male Workers, HEREBY GIVE NOTICE THAT THEY HAVE VARIED the General Minimum Time-Rates and Overtime Rates for Female and Male Workers so previously varied and fixed by them on 22nd November, 1919, and 27th February, 1920, and HAVE FIXED Piece-Work Basis Time-Rates for Female and Male Workers, and that the Minimum Rates of Wages as Varied and Fixed, together with the rates which remain unaffected by this variation, are shown in the Schedule set out below, which is incorporated herewith.

And the Trade Board FURTHER GIVE NOTICE that they have received notification from the Minister of Labour that he has made an Order dated 26th August, 1920, under Section 4 (2) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, confirming the Minimum Rates of Wages as Varied and Fixed by the Trade Board, and specifying 30th August, 1920,* as the date from which such Minimum Rates of Wages shall become effective.

* Should this date not correspond with the beginning of the period for which wages are paid by an employer who pays wages at intervals not exceeding seven days, the rates shall become effective as from the beginning of the next full-pay period, but in no case later than 5th September, 1920.

The General Minimum Time-Rate for Female Learners under 14 years of age shall be 6s. 6d. per week of 48 hours.

(1) The above General Minimum Time-Rates for Female Learners shall apply subject to the following provisions:—

(a) The above weekly rates are subject to a proportionate deduction according as the number of hours of employment is less than 48.

(b) The advances to be given to learners commencing at under 21 years of age shall become due as from the first Monday in January and July of each year. In the application of this Clause the following rules shall be observed:—

(i) A learner's first advance shall become due as from the first Monday in January or

July as the case may be, provided that she is in employment in the trade on such day, and has not had less than three months' employment.

(ii) A learner's advance subsequent to the first advance shall become due as from the first Monday in January or July, as the case may be, if she is in employment in the trade on such date, and if the total period of her employment on such date exceeds the completed period of six months by not less than three months.

(iii) A learner who leaves and re-enters the trade shall, on re-entry, be entitled to a

rate determined by reference to the number of periods of six months during which she has been employed in the trade. For the purpose of this rule an odd period of employment of not less than three months shall count as six months of employment.

(2) A learner shall cease to be a learner and be entitled to the full General Minimum Time-Rate applicable to her under Section 1 above upon the fulfilment of the conditions appropriate to her as set out below:—

Age of Entering upon Employment and Conditions.

Under 15 years of age, the completion of not less than 3 years' employment and the attainment of the age of 18 years.

15 and under 16 years of age, the completion of not less than 2 years' employment and the attainment of the age of 18 years.

16 and under 21 years of age, the completion of 2 years' employment.

21 years of age and over, the completion of 1 year's employment.

(3) The calculation of the period of employment of a learner shall be made subject to the following provisions:—

(a) No female learner shall be held to be entitled to the full General Minimum Time-Rate under Section 1 above until she has attained the age of 18 years, notwithstanding any employment she may have had.

(b) Any female who has left and re-entered the trade shall not, after re-entry, serve as a learner longer than is provided by this Section in the case of a person of the same age entering the trade for the first time.

(4) For the purpose of reckoning the General Minimum Time-Rate to which a learner is entitled and of determining the date on which she ceases to be entitled to be employed as a learner, a learner shall be entitled to include all previous employment in any branch of the Shirtmaking Trade as defined in Part V of this Schedule, but service prior to the age of 14 shall be disregarded.

(B)—*Male Workers.*

SECTION I.—*Male Cutters:*

(a) Special or Measure Cutters as defined in Section III of Part IV of this Schedule, or Pattern Cutters or Pattern Takers who are employed as such during the whole or a substantial part of their time and who have had not less than five years' experience after 19 years of age. Provided that the experience of Special or Measure Cutters shall include three years' experience in Measure Cutting, 1s. 9d. per hour.

(b) Cutters, other than those specified in Sub-Section (a) of this Section, of 22 years of age and over who are employed during the whole or a substantial part of their time in Cutting and who have had not less than five years' experience in Cutting, 1s. 7d. per hour.

For the purposes of Sub-Section (b) of this Section the term "Cutting" shall be deemed to include the operations of Hooking-up, Folding, Marking-In or Marking-Out, and Dividing.

SECTION II.—*Male Workers (other than Male Cutters as specified in the preceding Section):—*

Workers of 22 years of age and upwards, 1s. 4d. per hour.

Workers of 21 and under 22 years of age, 1s. per hour.

Workers of 20 and under 21 years of age, 10½d. per hour.

Workers of 19 and under 20 years of age, 9d. per hour.

Workers of 18 and under 19 years of age, 7½d. per hour.

Workers of 17 and under 18 years of age, 6d. per hour.

Workers of 16 and under 17 years of age, 5d. per hour.

Workers of 15 and under 16 years of age, 4d. per hour.

Workers under 15 years of age, 3d. per hour.

PART II.

Piece-Work Basis Time-Rates for Female and Male Workers.

SECTION I.—(a) All Female Workers other than Home-workers, 9½d. per hour.

(b) All Female Home-workers, 9½d. per hour.

In cases where a worker is employed on Piece-work, each Piece-Rate paid must be such as would yield, in the circumstances of the case, an amount not less than the Piece-work Basis Time-Rate to an Ordinary worker (that is, a Female Worker of ordinary skill and experience).

SECTION II.—(a) Special or Measure Male Cutters, as defined in Section III of Part IV of this Schedule, or Male Pattern Cutters, or Male Pattern Takers who are employed as such during the whole or a substantial part of their time and who have had not less than five years' experience in Cutting after the age of 19 years. Provided that the experience of Special or Measure Cutters shall include three years' experience in Measure Cutting, 1s. 10½d. per hour.

(b) Male Cutters, other than those specified in Sub-Section (a) of this Section, of 22 years of age and over, who are employed during the whole or a substantial part of their time in cutting and who have had not less than five years' experience in Cutting, 1s. 8½d. per hour.

For the purposes of Sub-Section (b) of this Section the term "Cutting" shall be deemed to include the operations of Hooking-up, Folding, Marking-In or Marking-Out and Dividing.

In cases where a worker is employed on Piece-work, each Piece-Rate paid must be such as would yield, in the circumstances of the case, an amount not less than the Piece-work Basis Time-Rate to an Ordinary worker (that is, a Male Worker of ordinary skill and experience in the processes concerned).

PART III.

Overtime Rates for Female and Male Workers.

SECTION I.—In accordance with Section 3 (1) (c) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, the Trade Board have declared the Normal Number of Hours of Work in the Trade to be as follows:—

In any week	48
On any day (other than Saturday)	9
On Saturday	5

Provided that all hours worked on Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays shall be regarded as Overtime to which the Overtime Rates shall apply.

SECTION II.—Overtime Rates for Workers employed on Time-Work.

The Overtime Rates for Male and Female Workers in respect of hours worked by a worker engaged on Time-Work in excess of the normal number of hours of work in the trade, as declared by the Trade Board and set out in Section I of this Part of this Notice, shall be as follows:—

1. For the first two hours' Overtime on any day, except Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, the Overtime Rate shall be one-and-a-quarter times the minimum rate otherwise applicable, that is to say, Time-and-a-Quarter.

2. For the second two hours' Overtime on any day, except Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, the Overtime Rate shall be one-and-a-half times the minimum rate otherwise applicable, that is to say, Time-and-a-Half.

3. For all time worked on Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, and for Overtime after the first four hours' Overtime on any other day, the Overtime Rate shall be twice the minimum rate otherwise applicable, that is to say, Double-Time.

4. For all hours worked in any week in excess of 48, the Overtime Rate shall be Time-and-a-Quarter, except in so far as higher Overtime Rates are payable under the provisions of paragraphs 2 and 3 above. Provided that:—

(a) Where it is or may become the established practice of an employer to require attendance only on five days a week, the Overtime Rate shall only be payable where on any day the number of hours worked exceeds $9\frac{1}{2}$.

(b) Where it is or may become the established practice of an employer to require attendance only on alternate Saturdays, the normal number of hours for the week in which attendance on Saturday is required shall be deemed to be 50.

SECTION III.—Overtime Rates for Workers employed on Piece-Work.

1. A Female Worker of the classes specified in Section I of Part I A of this Schedule and a Male Worker of the classes specified in Section I of Part I B of this Schedule, employed on Piece-work, shall be entitled to receive in respect of each hour of Overtime worked, in addition to Piece-Rates, each of which would yield, in the circumstances of the case, to an Ordinary Worker not less than the respective appropriate Piece-work Basis Time-Rates, as set out in Part II of this Schedule, the appropriate Piece-work Basis Time-Rate, or one-half of the appropriate Piece-work Basis Time-Rate, or one-quarter of the appropriate Piece-work Basis Time-Rate, according as the Overtime Rates, which would have been payable under the provisions of Section II of this part of this Schedule, if the worker had been employed on Time-work, were Double-Time, or Time-and-a-Half, or Time-and-a-Quarter respectively.

2. All Male Workers, other than those specified in Section I of Part I B of this Schedule, and Female Learners as specified in Section II of Part I A of this Schedule employed on Piece-work, shall be entitled to receive in respect of each hour of Overtime

worked, in addition to Piece-Rates, each of which would yield, in the circumstances of the case, to an Ordinary Worker not less than the respective appropriate General Minimum Time-Rates, the appropriate General Minimum Time-Rate, or one-half of the appropriate General Minimum Time-Rate, or one-quarter of the appropriate General Minimum Time-Rate, according as the Overtime Rates which would have been payable under the provisions of Section II of this Part of this Schedule, if the worker had been employed on Time-work, were Double-Time or Time-and-a-Half, or Time-and-a-Quarter, respectively.

NOTE.—The hours which female workers, young persons and children are allowed to work are subject to the provisions of the Factory and Workshop Acts.

PART IV.

For the purpose of this Notice the following definitions shall apply:—

SECTION I.—A Female Learner is a Worker who—

(a) Is employed during the whole or a substantial part of her time in learning any branch or process of the trade by an employer who provides the learner with reasonable facilities for such learning; and

(b) Has received a certificate or has been registered in accordance with rules from time to time laid down by the Trade Board, or has made application for such certificate or registration which has been duly acknowledged and is still under consideration. Provided that the certificate or registration of a learner may be cancelled if the other conditions of learnership are not complied with.

Provided that an employer may employ a female learner, on her first employment, in the branch or branches of the trade as described in Part V of this Schedule, without a certificate or registration for a probation period not exceeding four weeks, but the probation period shall be included in her period of learnership.

Provided that notwithstanding compliance with the conditions contained in this Section a person shall not be deemed to be a learner if she works in a room used for dwelling purposes and is not in the employment of her parent or guardian.

SECTION II.—The expression "Home-worker" shall be held to mean a worker who works in her own home or in any place not under the control or management of the employer.

SECTION III.—A Special or Measure Cutter is a Worker who—

(a) Is able to take a complete set of measures and cut from model patterns; and

(b) Has sufficient technical knowledge to alter patterns (excluding Stock Patterns).

PART V.

The above Minimum and Overtime Rates shall apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, to all workers in Great Britain in respect of any time during which they are employed in any branch of the trade specified in the Trade Boards (Shirtmaking) Order, 1913 (that is to say, the making from textile fabrics of shirts, pyjamas, aprons, and

other washable clothing, worn by male persons, excluding articles the making of which is included in paragraph 1 of the Schedule to the Trade Boards Act, 1909, and excluding articles which are knitted or made from knitted fabrics), but which are *not* engaged in the making of handkerchiefs, neckties, scarves, mufflers, gloves, socks, stockings, spats, gaiters, hats, caps (other than chefs' caps and hospital ward caps), infants' millinery, baby linen, and such articles of clothing as are made for children without distinction of sex.

Provided that they shall not apply to:—

1. Any male or female workers engaged merely as Clerks, Messengers, Salesmen or Saleswomen, Travellers, or Persons engaged in cleaning premises.

2. Any female workers engaged in work ordinarily carried on in a Stock-room or Warehouse, or as Packers.

(3) Any male or female workers whose work stands in a relationship to the trade similar to that of the classes of workers specified in paragraph 1 of this Proviso and any female workers whose work stands in a relationship to the trade similar to that of the classes of workers specified in paragraph 2 of this Proviso.

PART VI.

SECTION I.—The above Minimum Rates of Wages shall be paid clear of all deductions other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments, or deductions authorised by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any Superannuation or other Provident Fund.

SECTION II.—The above Minimum Rates of Wages are without prejudice to workers who are earning higher rates of wages.

Pilots flying between London and Paris and over Northern France are warned that the burning of cordite is taking place at Dannes, 5 miles north of Etaples, France (Latitude 50° 36' 0" N., Longitude 1° 37' 0" E.).

Amendment of Article 2 of the Foreign Animals Order of 1910.

1. Article 2 (Prohibition of bringing Cattle, Sheep, Goats or Swine from Scheduled Country into a Port in Great Britain) of the Foreign Animals Order of 1910 is amended in the manner hereinafter appearing:

Prohibition of bringing Cattle, Sheep, Goats or Swine from Belgium into a Port in Great Britain.

2. It shall not be lawful to bring into a port in Great Britain any cattle, sheep, goats or swine—

- (a) brought from a port in Belgium; or
- (b) brought from a port in any other country if the animal since it was taken on board at that port has entered a port in Belgium, or

(c) taken from the United Kingdom, the Channel Islands, or the Isle of Man into a port in Belgium.

Provided that this Article shall not apply to any vessel not bound to a port in Great Britain which comes into a port under stress of weather or for repairs.

3. This Order may be cited as the FOREIGN ANIMALS (AMENDMENT) ORDER OF 1920, and shall be read with the Foreign Animals Order of 1910.

To incorporate with the Order such of the provisions contained in the Schedule to the Electric Lighting (Clauses) Act, 1899, as are applicable to cases where the undertakers are the local authority and to apply such provisions to the undertaking to be authorized by the Order subject to such variations and exceptions as may be contained therein.

MYNYDDISLWYN ELECTRIC LIGHTING ORDER.

1.
