SUPREME COURT ENGLAND, FUNDS.

The following notice is hereby given, in accordance with Section 1 of the Rules Publication Act, 1893:—

I, The Right Honourable Frederick, Lord Birkenhead, Lord High Chancellor of Great

Britain, with the concurrence of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, do hereby, in pursuance of the powers contained in the Court of Chancery (Funds) Act, 1872, the Supreme Court of Judicature Act, 1875, the Supreme Court of Judicature (Funds, &c.), Act, 1883, the Supreme Court of Judicature (Procedure) Act, 1894, and of every other power enabling me in that behalf, propose to make the following Rules:—

1. The following words shall be inserted at the end of Rule 45 of the Supreme Court (Funds) Rules, 1915:—

"3. In any case in which funds in Court of a value not exceeding £500 are, under or by virtue of any of the Trading with the Enemy Acts or the Treaty of Peace (Germany) or the Treaty of Peace (Germany) Order, 1919, or anything done or suffered thereunder, transferable or payable to the Custodian or to the Controller of the Clearing Office as the case may be, directions of the Court in writing under the signature of a Master shall be sufficient authority to the Paymaster to deal with such funds or the income thereof and shall be treated as equivalent to an Order. Provided that any such directions shall be given upon a Summons which shall be in such form and shall be served on such person or persons (if any) as the Master may direct.

2. These Rules may be cited as the Supreme Court Funds Rules (Enemy Funds in Court), 1920.

And I, the said Frederick, Lord Birkenhead, Lord High Chancellor, with the same concurrence as aforesaid, hereby certify that on account of urgency these Rules should come into immediate operation, and hereby make the said Rules to come into operation forthwith as Provisional Rules, in accordance with the provisions of Section 2 of the Rules Publication Act, 1893.

**TRADE BOARD ACTS, 1909 AND 1918.
BRUSH AND BROOM TRADE BOARD.
(GREAT BRITAIN.)**

**MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES AS VARIED AND
FIXED FOR MALE AND FEMALE WORKERS.
EFFECTIVE AS FROM 3RD SEPTEMBER, 1920.**

In accordance with the Regulations made under section 18 of the Trade Boards Act,

1909, by the Minister of Labour, and dated 31st October, 1918, the Trade Board established in Great Britain under the Trade Boards Act, 1918, for the Brush and Broom Trade, as specified in the Trade Boards (Brush and Broom) Order, 1919, having given due notice on 10th May, 1920, of Proposal to Vary and Fix General Minimum Piece Rates and Overtime Rates in respect of Male and Female Piece Workers, hereby give notice, as required by section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, that they have (1) Fixed General Minimum Piece Rates for Male Workers for Machine Pan Work in Bristles or Mixtures, for Male Drawing Hands on Machine work, for certain classes of Limers and Nailed Stock, and for Female Drawing Hands on Machine Work; (2) Varied the General Minimum Piece Rates for Male Workers for Hand Finishing; (3) Varied and Fixed General Minimum Piece Rates for Male Workers for Pan Work and certain General Minimum Piece Rates for Female Workers on Hand Drawing; and (4) Have Cancelled a certain General Minimum Piece Rate for Hand Drawing for Female Workers.

The Trade Board further give Notice, that they have Varied and Fixed Overtime Rates in respect of all Male and Female Piece Workers as follows:—

The Minimum Rates for Overtime to apply in substitution for the Minimum Rates otherwise applicable in respect of all hours worked by all Male and Female Piece Workers in excess of the number of hours declared by the Trade Board to be the normal number of hours of work in the trade, shall be as follows, subject to the provisions of Section II. of Part II. of the Schedule to the three Notices Varying and Fixing Minimum Rates of Wages, and all dated 2nd September, 1920, viz.:—

(a) For the first two hours' overtime on any day, except Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, the Overtime Rate shall be:—

(i.) For Male workers, the General Minimum Piece Rate applicable or, where no General Minimum Piece Rate has been fixed by the Trade Board, a Piece Rate which would yield in the circumstances of the case to an ordinary worker at least the same amount of money as the General Minimum Time Rate, with the addition in both cases of one-quarter of the General Minimum Time Rate, which would be applicable to the worker if he were employed on Time Work.

(ii.) For Female Workers, the General Minimum Piece Rate applicable or, where no General Minimum Piece Rate has been fixed by the Trade Board, a Piece Rate which would yield in the circumstances of the case to an ordinary worker not less than 9½d. per hour, with an addition in both cases of 2½d. per hour.

(b) For overtime after the first two hours of overtime on any day, except Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, the Overtime Rate shall be:—

(i.) For Male Workers, the General Minimum Piece Rate applicable or, where no General Minimum Piece Rate has been fixed by the Trade Board, a Piece Rate which would yield in the circumstances of

the case to an ordinary worker at least the same amount of money as the General Minimum Time Rate, with the addition in both cases of one-half of the General Minimum Time Rate which would be applicable to the worker if he were employed on Time Work.

(ii.) For Female Workers, the General Minimum Piece Rate applicable or, where no General Minimum Piece Rate has been fixed by the Trade Board, a Piece Rate which would yield in the circumstances of the case to an ordinary worker not less than 9½d. per hour, with an addition in both cases of 4½d. per hour.

(c) For all time worked on Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays the Overtime Rate shall be:—

(i.) For Male Workers, the General Minimum Piece Rate applicable or, where no General Minimum Piece Rate has been fixed by the Trade Board, a Piece Rate which would yield in the circumstances of the case to an ordinary worker at least the same amount of money as the General Minimum Time Rate, with the addition in both cases of the General Minimum Time Rate which would be applicable to the worker if he were employed on time work.

(ii.) For Female Workers, the General Minimum Piece Rate applicable or, where no General Minimum Piece Rate has been fixed by the Trade Board, a Piece Rate which would yield in the circumstances of the case to an ordinary worker not less than 9½d. per hour, with an addition in both cases of 9½d. per hour.

(d) For all hours worked in any week in excess of 48 the Overtime Rates shall be as set out in sub-paragraphs (i.) and (ii.) of paragraph (a) above for Male and Female Workers respectively, except in so far as higher Overtime Rates are payable under the provisions of paragraphs (b) and (c) above.

And the Trade Board further give notice, that they have received notification from the Minister of Labour that he has made an Order, dated the 28th August, 1920, under section 4 (2) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, confirming the Minimum Rates, as Varied and Fixed by the Trade Board, and specifying 3rd September, 1920*, as the date from which such Minimum Rates shall become effective.

*NOTE.—Should this date not correspond with the beginning of the period for which wages are paid by an employer who pays wages at intervals not exceeding seven days, the rates shall become effective as from the beginning of the next full-pay period, but in no case later than 9th September, 1920.

BOOT AND SHOE REPAIRING TRADE BOARD (GREAT BRITAIN).

MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES (AS VARIED) FOR CERTAIN CLASSES OF WORKERS.

*Effective as from 6th September, 1920.**

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour and dated 31st October, 1918, the Trade Board established under the Trade Boards Act, 1918, in Great Britain, for the branches of trade specified in the Trade Boards (Boot and Shoe Repairing) Order, 1919, having given due notice on 12th April, 1920, of Proposal to Vary, as therein shown, the General Minimum Time-Rates and Overtime Rates as set out in the Notices issued by the Trade Board and dated 15th November, 1919, and 12th April, 1920, and effective under the Orders of the Minister of Labour dated 12th November, 1919, and 8th April, 1920, respectively, hereby give notice that they have Varied General Minimum Time-Rates and Overtime Rates for certain classes of Workers, the Minimum Rates as varied being shown in the Schedule set out below.

And the Trade Board further give notice that they have received notification from the Minister of Labour that he has made an Order, dated 28th August, 1920, under Section 4 (2) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, confirming the Minimum Rates as Fixed and as Varied by the Trade Board and specifying 6th September, 1920,* as the date from which such Minimum Rates shall become effective.

* Should this date not correspond with the beginning of the period for which wages are paid by an employer who pays wages at intervals not exceeding Seven Days, the rates shall become effective as from the beginning of the next full-pay period, but in no case later than 12th September, 1920.

SCHEDULE.

PART I.

General Minimum Time-Rates for Certain Classes of Male Workers.

SECTION I.—For Male Workers of 21 years of age and over who have had at least three months' experience in working one or other of the machines specified in this section and who are employed during the whole of their time.

(a) In operating power sole-stitchers or in operating both power sole-stitchers and Blake (or Richardson) machines, 80s. per week of 48 hours.

(b) In operating Blake or Richardson machines, 75s. per week of 48 hours.

SECTION II.—For Male Workers of 21 years of age and over other than those specified in Section I above.

(a) When employed in operating power sole-stitchers, 1s. 8d. per hour.

(b) When employed in operating Blake or Richardson machines, 1s. 6½d. per hour.

SECTION III.—For Male Workers who are employed as Pressmen and who are responsible for Cutting and Costing, 75s. per week of 48 hours.

PART II.

Overtime Rates for Certain Classes of Male Workers, as specified in Part I of this Schedule.

Overtime Rates, calculated on the General Minimum Time-Rates set out in Part I of this Schedule in the manner set out in the Schedules of the Notices issued by the Trade Board and dated 15th Nov., 1919, and 12th April, 1920, shall apply, in substitution for the rates set out in Part I of this Schedule, in respect of all hours worked in excess of the number of hours declared by the Trade Board in the Schedules of the Notices dated 15th November, 1919, and 12th April, 1920, to be the normal number of hours of work in the trade.

PART III.

Overtime Rates for Male and Female Workers Employed on Piece-Work on Work to which General Minimum Piece-Rates are Applicable.

SECTION I.—In accordance with Section 3 (i) (c) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, the Trade Board have declared the normal number of hours of work in the Trade to be as follows:—

In any Week	48
On Saturday	4
On Monday	8
On any other week-day	9

Provided that any other day not being Sunday may, by agreement in writing between an employer and a worker, be substituted in place of Saturday as the weekly short day, and in such case the normal number of hours on such substituted day shall be four, and the normal number of hours on Saturday shall be nine.

Provided also that all hours worked on Sundays and on Customary Public and Statutory Holidays shall be regarded as Overtime, to which the Overtime Rates shall apply.

SECTION II.—The above-mentioned provisions shall not prejudice a worker's claim to a half-holiday on Saturday where it is now given.

SECTION III.—The Minimum Rates for Overtime to apply in respect of hours worked by a worker (so far as is allowed under the Factory and Workshop Acts), employed on Piece-work for which General Minimum Piece-Rates have been fixed, in excess of the declared normal number of hours shall, subject to the provisions of Part II and Part III respectively, of the Notices issued by the Trade Board and dated 15th November, 1919, and 12th April, 1920, be as follows:—

(a) For the first two hours' Overtime on any day, except Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, the Overtime Rate shall be the General Minimum Piece-Rate otherwise applicable, as fixed by the Trade Board and set out in their Notice dated 12th April, 1920, and effective under the Order of the Minister of Labour dated 8th April, 1920, with an addition of 4½d. per hour.

(b) For Overtime after the first two hours of Overtime on any day, except Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, the Overtime Rate shall be the General Minimum Piece-Rate otherwise applicable, as fixed by the Trade Board and set out in their Notice dated 12th April, 1920, and

effective under the Order of the Minister of Labour dated 8th April, 1920, with an addition of 9d. per hour.

(c) For all time worked on Sundays and on Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, the Overtime Rate shall be the General Minimum Piece-Rate otherwise applicable, as fixed by the Trade Board and set out in their Notice dated 12th April, 1920, and effective under the Order of the Minister of Labour dated 8th April, 1920, with an addition of 1s. 6d. per hour.

PART IV.—General.

SECTION I.—The weekly Minimum Rates set out in Part I of this Schedule are weekly rates based on a week of 48 hours, and are subject to a proportionate deduction according as the number of hours of employment in any week is less than 48.

SECTION II.—The respective Minimum Rates of Wages set out in this Schedule shall apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, to all workers in Great Britain in respect of all time during which they are employed in any branch of the Trade specified in the Trade Boards (Boot and Shoe Repairing) Order, 1919, that is to say, the repairing, wherever carried on, of boots, shoes, slippers, and all kinds of leather footwear, *including* the making of bespoke hand-sewn, riveted or pegged leather footwear, but *excluding* the manufacture of leather footwear on a large scale, the repairing of saddlery and leather goods other than leather footwear, and the retailing of leather footwear.

SECTION III.—The Minimum Rates of Wages set out in this Schedule are without prejudice to workers who are earning higher rates of wages.

AIR MINISTRY NOTICES TO AIRMEN.

EXPLANATORY STATEMENT.

1. Information relating to aërial navigation, wireless telegraphy, aerodromes and landing grounds, Customs stations, prohibited areas and other questions of urgent and general interest, is issued, in the form of printed "Notices to Airmen" in a consecutively numbered series, by the Air Ministry when considered necessary for the benefit of Pilots and others directly interested in aviation.

2. "Notices" containing information of an urgent nature are given out in the first instance by wireless telegraphy.

3. It is important that all Pilots actually engaged in flying should make themselves acquainted with these "Notices to Airmen" as

soon as they appear. Arrangements have accordingly been made for their display at terminal and customs aerodromes at home and abroad, and for their distribution to, among others:—

The technical and daily Press.

The Aeronautical Associations and Clubs.

Licenses of permanent aerodromes.

Lloyds.

H.B.M. Representatives abroad.

4. Copies of the "Notices" can be obtained direct from the Secretary, Air Ministry. Pilots employed by aviation firms should arrange to secure "Notices" regularly through their employers, and unattached Pilots can obtain copies through their Association or Club.

5. The latest "Notices" can also be seen at all Civil Aerodromes, and copies can be obtained personally from the C.A.T.O.'s at Croydon and Lympne.

6. When abroad the latest "Notices" can be seen at the Customs Aerodrome in the country visited.

MOTOR CAR ACT, 1903.

BOROUGH OF BLACKPOOL.

MOTOR CAR ACT, 1903.

COUNTY OF WEST SUSSEX.

Whereas by sub-section 1 of Section 9 of the Motor Car Act, 1903, it is enacted that within any limits or place referred to in regulations made by the Local Government Board with a view to the safety of the public on the application of the Local Authority of the area in which the limits or place are situate, a person shall not drive a motor car at a speed exceeding ten miles per hour;

And whereas the power to make such regulations has been transferred to the Minister of Transport;

Notice is hereby given, that the County Council of West Sussex have made application for a regulation to be made in pursuance of the said sub-section putting the above mentioned provisions of that sub-section in force within the limits comprising the following roads or parts of roads in the Parish of Durrington, that is to say:—

So much of Offington Lane as extends from Poulter's Corner to a point 50 yards north of Ashacre Lane, being a distance of 500 yards; and also the road leading from Offington Lane through Ashacre Lane, Salvington and Durrington villages to a point 250 yards south of Swandean Cross Roads, being a distance of 2,045 yards.
