The KING has been pleased by Letters Patent under the Great Seal to present the Rev. Arthur Ernest Duckett to the Perpetual Curacy and Titular Vicarage of Heeley, Sheffield, in the County of York and Diocese of Sheffield, void by the resignation of the last Incumbent and in His Majesty's Gift.

Notice of denunciation of the Treaty of Friendship, Commerce and Navigation, between Tonga and the United States of America, signed at Nukualofa on the 2nd October, 1886, was given to the United States Government by His Majesty's Government on behalf of the Queen of Tonga on the 28th July, 1919.

Provision was contained in Article XIV for the termination of the Treaty one year after notice had been given by either of the High Contracting Parties. In accordance with this provision and the terms of the notice of denunciation, the Treaty ceased to have effect from the 28th July last.

APPENDIX.

TRADE.

The Whip Trade, that is to say: ---

(1) The manufacture, whether by hand or by machine, of whips, including the operations known in the trade as:—

Stick-dressing, stocking, braiding, stitching, finishing, assembling, chequering, varnishing, sizing, rolling and similar operations when performed in the process of the manufacture of whips;

(2) The braiding of lashes when carried on in association with or in conjunction with

the manufacture of whips;

including

(a) The making of handles for bags, or the covering of walking sticks with leather, or the making of umbrellas or walking sticks, or the braiding of silver wire collars for whip handles, when carried on by workers mainly engaged in any of the operations specified in paragraphs (1) and (2) above;

(b) The sale of any goods when carried on by workers mainly engaged in any of the operations specified in paragraphs (1)

and (2) above;
(c) The warehousing of, the packing of, and similar operations in regard to any of the articles specified above, when carried on, in, or in association with or in conjunction with a business, or establishment, or branch, or department, or workroom mainly engaged in any of the operations specified in paragraphs (1) and (2) above; but excluding

(a) Any of the operations specified in paragraphs (1) and (2) above when carried on by workers mainly engaged in the manufacture of umbrellas or walking

sticks;
(b) The manufacture of whip thongs or mounts;

(c) All operations covered by the Trade Boards (Toy) Order, 1920.

TRADE BOARDS ACTS, 1909 AND 1918. STAMPED OR PRESSED METAL WARES TRADE BOARD (GREAT BRITAIN).

MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES FIXED FOR MALE AND FEMALE WORKERS.

Effective as from 11th September, 1920.*

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour, and dated 31st October, 1918, the Trade Board established in Great Britain under the Trade Boards Act, 1918, for the Stamped or Pressed Metal Wares Trade as specified in the Trade Boards (Stamped or Pressed Metal Wares) Order, 1919, having given due notice on 4th June, 1920, of Proposal to Fix General Minimum Time-Rates and Overtime Rates for Male and Female Workers, and Piece-work Basis Time-Rates for Female Workers, hereby give notice as required by Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, that they have fixed General Minimum Time-Rates and Overtime Rates for Male and Female Workers, and also Piece-work Basis Time-Rates for Female Workers, and have declared the normal number of hours of work in the Trade for the purpose of the application of the Overtime Rates, and that the minimum Rates of Wages as fixed are as shown in the Schedule set out below, which is incorporated herewith.

And the Trade Board further give notice that they have received notification from the Minister of Labour that he has made an Order dated 7th September, 1920, under Section 4 (2) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, confirming the Minimum Rates of Wages as fixed by the Trade Board and specifying 11th September, 1920,* as the date from which such Minimum Rates of Wages shall become effective.

*Should this date not correspond with the beginning of the period for which wages are paid by an employer who pays wages at inter-vals not exceeding Seven Days, the rates shall become effective as from the beginning of the next full-pay period, but in no case later than 17th September, 1920...

PART I.

General Minimum Time-Rates for Male and Female Workers.

SECTION (i).—Male Workers.

Workers of 21 years of age and over, 1s. $4\frac{1}{2}d$. per hour.

Workers of 20 and under 21 years of age, 1s. 2d. per hour.

Workers of 19 and under 20 years of age, 11½d. per hour.

Workers of 18 and under 19 years of age, 9d. per hour.

Workers of 17 and under 18 years of age,

8d. per hour. Workers of 16 and under 17 years of age, 7d. per hour.

Workers of 15 and under 16 years of age, 6d. per hour.

Workers under 15 years of age, 4½d. per

Section (ii).—Female Workers.

Workers of 18 years of age and over, 9d. per

Workers of 17 and under 18 years of age,

7½d. per hour. Workers of 16 and under 17 years of age,

 $6\frac{1}{2}$ d. per hour. Workers of 15½ and under 16 years of age,

 $5\frac{1}{2}$ d. per hour. Workers of 15 and under $15\frac{1}{2}$ years of age,

5d, per hour.

Workers under 15 years of age, 4d. per hour. Provided that in the case of Female Workers entering the trade for the first time at or over the age of 18 years the General Minimum Time-Rate applicable during the first two months of employment shall be 8d. per hour.

PART II.

Piece-work Basis Time-Rates for Female. Workers.

Workers of 18 years of age and over, 10d. per hour.

Workers of 17 and under 18 years of age, $8\frac{1}{2}$ d. per hour

Workers of 16 and under 17 years of age, $7\frac{1}{2}$ d. per hour.

Workers of $15\frac{1}{2}$ and under 16 years of age,

 $6\frac{1}{2}$ d. per hour. Workers of 15 and under $15\frac{1}{2}$ years of age,

6d. per hour. Workers under 15 years of age, 5d. per hour. In the case of Female Workers employed on Piece-work each Piece-Rate paid shall be such

as would yield, in the circumstances of the case, to an ordinary worker, at least the equivalent of the appropriate Piece-work Basis Time-Rate.

PART III.

Overtime Rates for Male and Female Workers (All Ages).

Section (i).—In accordance with Section 3 (i) (c) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, the Trade Board hereby declare the normal number of hours of work in the trade to be as follows :-

47 In any week • • • On Saturday ••• ...

Provided that all hours worked on Sundays and on Statutory Holidays shall be regarded as Overtime to which the Overtime Rates shall

Section (ii).—The Minimum Rates for Overtime in respect of hours worked by a worker, whether employed on Time-work or on Piece-work in excess of the declared normal number of hours, shall be as follows:

(a) For all hours worked on Sundays and Statutory Holidays the Overtime Rate shall be Twice the Minimum Rate otherwise applicable, i.e., Double Time.

- (b) For all hours worked in excess of fourand-a-half on Saturday, the Overtime Rate shall be One-and-a-Half times the Minimum Rate otherwise applicable, i.e., Time-and-a-Half, notwithstanding that the total number of hours worked in the week does not €~ceed 47.
- (c). For all hours worked in excess of 47 in any week, the Overtime Rate shall be equivalent to Time-and-a-Quarter for the first two hours and Time-and-a-Half thereafter, except in so far as higher Overtime Rates are payable under the provisions of Sub-Sections (a) and (b) of this Section.

NOTE.—The hours which female workers, young persons and children are allowed to work are subject to the provisions of the Factory and Workshop Acts.

PART IV.

The above Minimum Rates of Wages shall apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, to all workers in Great Britain in respect of all time during which they are employed in any branch of the trade specified in the Trade Boards (Stamped or Pressed Metal Wares) Order, 1919, that is to say:-

The manufacture from metals (other than precious metals) by the processes of cold stamping or cold pressing (including cutting or piercing) of cabinet fittings, window fittings, accessories, stationers' sundries, drapers' sundries, fittings for gas or electric light, fittings for suit-cases or handbags or purses, buckles, eyelets, ferrules, labels, collar studs, tie-clips, thimbles, photograph frames, stamped chains, bells, fancy nails (excluding the shanks), parts of safety razors (excluding the blades), parts of braces or suspenders, corset steels or busks, whistles, tin-openers, medals or any similar articles or metal parts of such articles;

Including, (a) The operations of annealing, hardening, barrelling, polishing, bronzing, nickelling, lacquering, japanning, non-vitreous enamelling, tinning or assembling, where these operations are carried on in association with or in conjunction with the manufacture of such stamped or pressed metal articles;

(b) The operations of carding, packeting, labelling, weighing, packing, warehousing or despatching, where these operations are incidental to or appertaining to the manufacture of such stamped or pressed metal articles;

But excluding; (a) The operations specified in the Trade Boards (Hollow-ware) 1913;

(b) The making of buttons or any operations incidental thereto;

(c) The making of coffin furniture or any

operations incidental thereto;

(d) The making of pins, hairpins, hooks and eyes, hair-curlers, snap fasteners or safety pins

or any operations incidental thereto;

- (e) The making of steel pens and the making of stationers' metal sundries or other similar metal articles when carried on as a subsidiary branch of work in association with or in conjunction with the making of steel pens, so as to provide a common or interchangeable form of employment for the workers
 - The minting of coinage of the realm;

(g) The process of hand-embossing.

PART V.

SECTION I.—The above Minimum Rates of Wages shall be paid clear of all deductions, other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments, or deduction's authorised by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any superannuation or other provident fund.

Section II.—The above Minimum Rates of Wages are without prejudice to workers who are earning higher rates of wages, or to agreements made or that may be made between employers and workers for the payment of wages in excess of these Minimum Rates of Wages.
