The KING has been pleased by Letters Patent under the Great Seal to present the Rev. Arthur Ernest Duckett to the Perpetual Curacy and Titular Vicarage of Heeley, Sheffield, in the County of York and Diocese of Sheffield, void by the resignation of the last Incumbent and in His Majesty's Gift.

Notice of denunciation of the Treaty of Friendship, Commerce and Navigation, between Tonga and the United States of America, signed at Nukualofa on the 2nd October, 1886, was given to the United States Government by His Majesty's Government on behalf of the Queen of Tonga on the 28th July, 1919.

Provision was contained in Article XIV for the termination of the Treaty one year after notice had been given by either of the High Contracting Parties. In accordance with this provision and the terms of the notice of denunciation, the Treaty ceased to have effect from the 28th July last.

The KING has been graciously pleased to grant unto Arthur Fuller-Acland-Hood, of Ranworth Hall, in the County of Norfolk, Esquire, Lieutenant-Colonel (retired) in His Majesty's Army, and unto Miriam Anne, his wife, His Royal Licence and Authority that they may discontinue the surname of Fuller, and that they may take and henceforth use the surname of Reynardson in addition to and after those of Acland-Hood; that he the said Arthur Fuller-Acland-Hood may discontinue the Arms of Fuller, and that he may bear the Arms of Reynardson quarterly with those of Acland and Hood; the said Arms being first duly exemplified according to the Laws of Arms and recorded in His Majesty's College of Arms, otherwise the said Royal Licence and Permission to be void and of none effect.

And to command that the said Royal Concession and Declaration be recorded in His Majesty's said College of Arms.
