The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as

Contraction of Scheduled District.

1. The East Sussex and District (Foot-and Mouth Disease) Order of 1920 shall be read and have effect as if the area described in the Schedule hereto were excluded from and ceased to form part of the Scheduled District described in that Order.

Short Title.
