And whereas it is provided by Section 2 of the Customs (Exportation Restriction) Act, 1914, that any Proclamation made under Section 1 of the Exportation of Arms Act, 1900, may, whether the Proclamation was made before or after the passing of the Act now in recital, be varied or added to, whilst a state of war exists, by an Order made by the Lords of the Council on the recommendation of the Board of Trade:

And whereas by a Proclamation, dated the 10th day of May, 1917, and made under Section 8 of the Customs and Inland Revenue Act, 1879, and Section 1 of the Exportation of Arms Act, 1900, and Section 1 of the Customs (Ex-

portation Prohibition) Act, 1914, the Exportation from the United Kingdom of certain articles to certain or all destinations was prohibited:

And whereas by subsequent Orders of Council, and by the Proclamations dated respectively the 18th day of December, 1918, and the 12th day of March, 1919, the said Proclamation was amended and added to in certain particulars:—

And whereas there was this day read at the Board a recommendation from the Board of Trade to the following effect:—

That the Proclamation, dated the 10th day of May, 1917, as amended and added to by subsequent Orders of Council and by the Proclamations dated respectively the 18th day of December, 1918, and the 12th day of March, 1919, should be further amended by making the following amendments in, and additions to, the Schedule to the same:—

That the following headings should be deleted:—

(A) Calfskins;

Chemicals, drugs, dyes, dyestuffs, and medicinal and pharmaceutical preparations, the following:—

(A) Ergot of rye, and the liquid extract of ergot;

Forage and food which may be used for animals, the following:—

Cakes and Meals, the following:—

(A) Husk Meal;

Offals of corn and grain, the following:—

(A) Bran;

(A) Middlings;

(A) Milldust and screenings;

(A) Pollard;

(A) Sharps;

(A) Guanos;

(A) Hides, British and Irish, cattle;

Oleaginous kernels, nuts, seeds and products of all kinds:—

(A) Linseed;

(A) Phosphate Rock, namely Apatites, Phosphate of Lime and Alumina;

Provisions and Victuals which may be used as food for man, the following:—

(A) Confectionery manufactured wholly or partly of sugar;

(A) Game, dead;

(A) Poultry, dead.

That the following headings should be added:—

Provisions and victuals which may be used as food for man, the following:—

(A) Poultry, dead, except Imported Frozen Poultry

Now, therefore, Their Lordships, having taken the said recommendation into consideration, are pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the same be approved.

Whereof the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs and Excise, and all other persons whom it may concern, are to take notice and govern themselves accordingly.

The Cotton Waste Branch of the Waste Materials Reclamation Trade, that is to say:—

1. The collecting, sorting or grading of cotton waste when carried on in an establishment in which such operations are the main or principal business;

2. The following operations when carried on in or in association with or in conjunction with any establishment of the kind specified in paragraph 1 above:—

(a) The willowing, machining, breaking-up, scouring or putting down mixings of cotton waste;

(b) the collecting, sorting or grading of any of the materials or articles, other than cotton waste, specified in paragraph 1 or paragraph 2 of the Appendix to the Trade Boards (Waste Materials Reclamation) Order, 1920;*

(c) the operations specified in paragraph 3 of the Appendix to the above-mentioned Order, other than those specified in sub-paragraph (a) above;**

3. The operations of receiving, packing, compressing, teagling, craning, despatching or warehousing when carried on in association with or in conjunction with any of the operations included in paragraphs 1 and 2 above;

but excluding:—

(i) Any of the operations mentioned in paragraphs 1, 2 and 3 above when carried on in the establishment in which the waste materials are produced or in which they are used as raw materials for further manufacture;

(ii) the making or repairing of sacks or bags when carried on in a factory or workshop engaged solely or mainly in the making or repairing of sacks or bags.

** List of Materials and Articles:—*

Rags, waste paper, paper stock; woollen, worsted, jute, flax, hemp or other textile waste; textile clippings or cuttings; used bags, sacks or sacking; scrap rubber; scrap iron or other scrap metal; fur cuttings; rabbit skins; bones or fat; used tins; broken glass or earthenware; discarded clothing (including head-gear or foot-gear); discarded textile articles, old ropes; used bottles or used jars.

*** List of Operations:—*

PROPOSAL TO VARY GENERAL MINIMUM TIME-RATES AND OVERTIME RATES FOR CERTAIN CLASSES OF MALE WORKERS.

In accordance with the Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour, and dated the 31st October, 1918, the Trade Board established in Great Britain under the Trade Boards Act, 1918, for the Stamped or Pressed Metal Wares Trade, as specified in the Trade Boards (Stamped or Pressed Metal Wares) Order, 1919, HEREBY GIVE NOTICE, as required by Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918 (the Minister of Labour having given his consent to such Notice being given) that THEY PROPOSE TO VARY the General Minimum Time Rates and Overtime Rates for Male Workers at present fixed and set out in their Notice dated 9th September, 1920, in respect of Certain Classes of Male Workers, so that in lieu of such Minimum Rates the General Minimum Time-Rates and Overtime Rates for the classes of workers specified below, shall be as follows:—

For the purpose of the above proposed Rates the following definitions shall apply:—

BRAZIERS:

A Brazier of Grade I. is a Male Worker of 21 years of age or over employed on brazing and not fulfilling the conditions of Grade II. or Grade III. next hereinafter respectively defined.

A Brazier of Grade II. is a Male Worker of 21 years of age or over who has had not less than six years' experience as a Brazier and who is an expert in brazing in all classes of metal except aluminium.

A Brazier of Grade III. is a Male Worker of 21 years of age or over who, in addition to fulfilling the conditions of Grade II., as above defined, is also an expert in brazing aluminium OR is a charge hand with the duty of being responsible for all work and order in the shop.

BURNISHERS:

A Burnisher of Grade I. is a Male Worker of 21 years of age or over employed on burnishing and not fulfilling the conditions of Grade II. or Grade III. next hereinafter respectively defined.

A Burnisher of Grade II. is a Male Worker of 21 years of age or over who has had not less than six years' experience as a Burnisher and who is an expert hook and straight Burnisher at the vice and satisfactorily burnishes deep thin shell work at the lathe.

A Burnisher of Grade III. is a Male Worker of 21 years of age or over who in addition to fulfilling the conditions of Grade II., as above defined, is an expert in speed and quality in all classes of work OR is a charge hand with the duty of being responsible for all work and order in the shop.

DROP-STAMPERS :

A Drop-Stamper of Grade I. is a Male Worker of 21 years of age or over employed on drop-stamping and not fulfilling the conditions of Grade II. or Grade III. next hereinafter respectively defined.

A Drop-Stamper of Grade II. is a Male Worker of 21 years of age or over who has had not less than six years' experience as a Drop-Stamper and who undertakes all classes of deep or shallow work in all strengths of the metal used.

A Drop-Stamper of Grade III. is a Male Worker of 21 years of age or over who, in addition to fulfilling the conditions of Grade II., as above defined, is an expert in all classes of work OR is a charge hand with the duty of being responsible for all work and order in the shop.

DIPPERS WHO ARE ALSO BRONZERS:

A Worker of Grade I. is a Male Worker of 21 years of age or over employed on dipping and bronzing and not fulfilling the conditions of Grade II. or Grade III. next hereinafter respectively defined.

A Worker of Grade II. is a Male Worker of 21 years of age or over who has had not less than six years' experience as a Dipper and Bronzer and who is an all-round Dipper and Bronzer and also does art bronzing and colouring, or electro-plating or has a knowledge of electro-plating.

A Worker of Grade III. is a Male Worker of 21 years of age or over who, in addition to fulfilling the conditions of Grade II., as above defined, also has an expert knowledge of art bronzing or metal colouring or electro depositing and solutions OR is a charge hand with the duty of being responsible for all work and order in the shop.

BRASS POLISHERS :

A Polisher of Grade I. is a Male Worker of 21 years of age or over employed on polishing and not fulfilling the conditions of Grade II. or Grade III. next hereinafter respectively defined.

A Polisher of Grade II. is a Male Worker of 21 years of age or over who has had not less than six years' experience as a Polisher and is an expert in all processes of any class of common work and can emery-bob and mop best work.

A Polisher of Grade III. is a Male Worker of 21 years of age or over who, in addition to fulfilling the conditions of Grade II., as above defined, is also an expert in all processes of both common and best work OR is a charge hand with the duty of being responsible for all work and order in the shop.

PART II.

Proposed Variation of Overtime Rates.

Overtime Rates calculated on the proposed Minimum Rates specified in Part I. of this Notice, in the manner set out in Part III. of the Notice issued by the Trade Board, dated 9th September, 1920, shall apply in substitution for the proposed Minimum Rates otherwise applicable, as set out in Part I. of this Notice, in respect of all hours worked in excess of the number of hours declared by the Trade Board in the above-mentioned Notice, dated 9th September, 1920, to be the normal number of hours of work in the trade.

PART III.

The above proposed Minimum Rates of Wages shall apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, to all workers of the classes specified above in respect of any time during which they are employed in any branch of the trade specified in the Trade Boards (Stamped or Pressed Metal Wares) Order, 1919, that is to say:—

The manufacture from metals (other than precious metals) by the processes of cold stamping or cold pressing (including cutting or piercing) of cabinet fittings, window fittings, curtain accessories, stationers' sundries, drapers' sundries, fittings for gas or electric light, fittings for suit-cases or handbags or purses, buckles, eyelets, ferrules, labels, collar studs, tie-clips, thimbles, photograph frames, stamped chains, bells, fancy nails (excluding the shanks), parts of safety razors (excluding the blades), parts of braces or suspenders, corset steels or busks, whistles, tin-openers, medals or any similar articles or metal parts of such articles:—

Including—

(a) The operations of annealing, hardening, barrelling, polishing, bronzing, nickelling, lacquering, japanning, non-vitreous enamelling, tinning, or assembling where these operations are carried on in association with or in conjunction with the manufacture of such stamped or pressed metal articles;

(b) The operations of carding, boxing, packing, labelling, weighing, packing, warehousing or despatching, where these operations are incidental to or appertaining to the manufacture of such stamped or pressed metal articles;

But excluding—

(a) The operations specified in the Trade Boards (Hollow-ware) Order, 1913;

(b) The making of buttons or any operations incidental thereto;

(c) The making of coffin furniture or any operations incidental thereto;

(d) The making of pins, hairpins, hooks and eyes, hair-curlers, snap-fasteners or safety pins or any operations incidental thereto;

(e) The making of steel pens and the making of stationers' metal sundries or other similar metal articles when carried on as a subsidiary branch of work in association with or in conjunction with the making of steel pens, so as to provide a common or interchangeable form of employment for the workers;

(f) The minting of coinage of the realm;

(g) The process of hand-embossing.

PART IV.

SECTION I.—The above proposed Minimum Rates of Wages shall be paid clear of all deductions, other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by subsequent enactments, or deductions authorised by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any superannuation or other provident fund.

SECTION II.—The above Proposed Minimum Rates of Wages are without prejudice to Workers who are earning Higher Rates of Wages, or to Agreements made or that may be made between Employers and Workers for the payment of Wages in excess of these Minimum Rates of Wages.

The Trade Board will consider any Objections to the above Proposals which may be lodged with them within two months from the 20th September, 1920. Yorkshire (West Riding).—(1) An Area comprising the borough of Harrogate and the parishes of Starbeck, Pannal, Haverah Park, Hampsthwaite, Killinghall and Bilton, in the administrative county of the West Riding of the county of York (21 February, 1920).

(2) An Area comprising the petty sessional division of Dewsbury, and the parishes of Drighlington, Hunsworth, Cleckheaton, Clifton, Hartshead and Kirkheaton, in the administrative county of the West Riding of Yorkshire, and also comprising the county borough of Huddersfield (3 July, 1920).

RABIES.

Ogmore (*except the parish of Cwmdru and Llangynwyd Higher*), Miskin Lower (*except the parish of Rhondda*), and Caerphilly Lower (*except the parishes of Llanfabon and Gelli-gaer*);

(3) A District comprising:—

In the administrative county of Wilts:

The city of Salisbury and the boroughs of Devizes, Marlborough, Swindon and Wilton,
The petty sessional divisions of Salisbury and Amesbury, Tisbury and Mere, Warminster,

The following Districts are subject to restrictions imposed by Order of the Minister in connection with Rabies. In these Districts dogs are required to be muzzled, and the movement of dogs out of such Districts is prohibited, except by licence of the Minister and subject to quarantine:—

Westbury, Whorwells Down Devizes (*except the parishes of Chittoe, Bromham and Rowde*), Marlborough and Hungerford, and Everley and Pewsey; and the parishes of Chittoe, Bromham, and Rowde; and Calne (including the borough of Calne), Cricklade (including its detached part, *but excluding the parishes of Purton, Braydon, Cricklade, Leigh, Ashton Keynes, Latton, and Marston Meysey*) and Swindon (*except the parishes of Inglesham, Highworth, Hannington and its detached part, Blunsdon St. Andrew, and Castle Eaton*).

In the administrative county of Berks:
