The following Statute made by the Governing Body of Wadham College, Oxford, on the 10th day of June, 1920, has been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of its having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions of the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877.

WADHAM COLLEGE, OXFORD.

STATUTE to alter and amend the Statutes made by the Commissioners appointed under the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877, and approved by the Queen in Council in the year 1882, in relation to Wadham College, in the University of Oxford, such amending Statute being duly made at a General Meeting of the Governing Body of the said College specially summoned for this purpose, held on the 10th day of June, 1920, and passed by the unanimous votes of those present and voting.

In Statute XII, after Clause 5, insert the following new Clause, to be numbered (6):-

" (6) Subject to the consent of the Visitor, the College may, if its revenues admit, increase the stipends of the Warden, the Fellows, and all officers of the College, and also the pensions of those who receive pensions from the College funds, or the stipends or pensions of any one or more of the above-

mentioned by an advance not exceeding fifty per cent, of the sums now fixed by the Statutes. Such increase however shall in-Such increase however shall involve no diminution in the assessed contribution of the College to the Common University Fund; and in the event of any deficiency of the revenues of the College in any year, shall be postponed to any charges for University purposes imposed by any Statute in force on November 20th, 1919, and not subsequently repealed."

In clause (6) (now to be clause (7)), for "in the foregoing clause" read "in clause 5," the numbers of the subsequent clauses to be altered also.

NATURALIZATION.

The Secretary of State for the Home Department gives notice that on the 29th September, 1920, he made Regulations under Section 19 (j) of the British Nationality and Status of Aliens Act, 1914, entitled the Naturalization Regulations, 1920, which, with the sanction of the Treasury, fix the amount of the fee payable in respect of the grant of a certificate of naturalization to any person (other than a woman who was a British subject previously to her marriage to an alien), and the registration of the certificate and the oath of allegiance in respect thereof at £10. this sum, £1 is payable on the submission of an application, and is in no circumstances returnable, and the remaining £9 is payable on the receipt of the decision to grant a certificate.

 - " At the end of two years from the date of the establishment of the Trade Board, twelve representative members to be chosen by lot from among the members representing employers and twelve representative members to be chosen by lot from among the members representing workers (in each case excluding additional representative members appointed under paragraph 6 of the Principal Regulations) shall retire from the Trade Board."

BERKSHIRE AND DISTRICT (MUZZLING AND CONTROL OF DOGS) ORDER OF 1920 (No. 2).

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Prohibition of Movement of Dogs out of Inner Controlled Area.

1. No dog shall be moved out of the Area described in the Schedule hereto (hereinafter referred to as "an Inner Controlled Area"), unless it is accompanied by a licence of the Ministry, authorizing such movement and signed by an Officer of the Ministry, and any such licence may be subject to such conditions as to the detention and isolation of the dog or otherwise as the Ministry may think necessary or desirable and shall be specified in the licence: Provided that this Article shall not apply to:

—(a) the movement of a dog under a licence granted by the Minister under the Importation of Dogs Order of 1914 and the Importation of Dogs (Amendment) Order of 1918 (No. 2) to a port in Great Britain for shipment, or to a place of detention for the purpose of detention and isolation; or (b) the movement of a dog through such area by railway from a place outside the area to another place outside the area without unnecessary delay and without being re-booked within the area.

Control and Muzzling of Dogs in Inner Controlled Area.

- 2.—(1) A dog in an Inner Controlled Area shall at all times—
 - (a) whilst in or on any public place be efficiently muzzled with an effective wire cage muzzle, and shall also be led by a person with a collar and chain or other attachment: Provided that the requirement as to leading shall not apply to a dog in charge of a competent person while being used for the driving or tending of cattle or sheep;
 - (b) whilst in or on any other place be-
 - (i) confined in a kennel or other enclosure from which the dog cannot escape;
 or
 - (ii) secured to some premises by a collar and chain; or
 - (iii) efficiently muzzled with an effective wire cage muzzle.

Provided that paragraph (b) shall not apply to any pack of hounds while being exercised under the supervision of two or more competent attendants or to any dog in charge of a competent person while being used for the capture or destruction of vermin or rabbits.

- (2) The provisions of this Article shall not apply to any dog confined in a suitable hamper, crate, box or other receptacle, so constructed as to render it impossible for such dog while so confined to bite any person or animal.
- (3) Article 4 (Control of Dogs in Scheduled District) of the Berkshire and District (Muzzling and Control of Dogs) Order of 1920, hereinafter referred to as "the principal Order," shall not apply to an Inner Controlled Area.

Scizure, Detention, and Disposal of Uncontrolled Dogs.

- 3.—(1) Any dog found in or on any public place in an Inner Controlled Area in respect of which the provisions of this Order as to control or muzzling are not being complied with, may be seized by the Local Authority or by the police, and any dog so seized shall be dealt with by the Local Authority in the manner directed by Article 5 of the principal Order (Seizure, Detention, and Disposal of Uncontrolled Dogs), which Article shall apply accordingly.
- (2) Articles 2 and 3 of the principal Order shall apply to dogs moved in contravention of this Order.

Offences.

- 4.—(1) If a dog is moved in contravention of Article 1 of this Order, the owner of the dog, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the dog, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the dog is moved shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.
- (2) If any dog is not kept under control in manner prescribed by this Order, the owner of the dog, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Local Authority to Enforce Order.

5. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Commencement.

6. This Order shall come into operation on the thirtieth day of September, nineteen hundred and twenty.

7. This Order may be cited as the Berkshire and District (Muzzling and Control of Dogs) Order of 1920 (No. 2).
