TRADE BOARDS ACTS, 1909 AND 1918. READY-MADE AND WHOLESALE BE-SPOKE TAILORING TRADE BOARD (GREAT BRITAIN).

PROPOSAL TO VARY MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES FOR CERTAIN CLASSES OF MALE WORKERS.

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour, and dated 31st October, 1918, the Trade Board established under the Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, for that Section of the Tailoring Trade specified in the Trade Boards (Tailoring) Order, 1919, which is covered by the Regulations made by the Minister of Labour, and dated 15th January, 1920, with respect to the Ready-made and Wholesale Bespoke Section of the Tailoring Trade in Great Britain, hereby give notice, as required by Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918 (the Minister of Labour having given his consent to such Notice being given), that they propose to vary the General Minimum Time-Rates, Piece-work Basis Time Rates and Overtime Rates at present fixed, and set out in the Schedule to their Notice dated 13th August. 1920, and effective under an Order of the Minister of Labour, dated 6th August, 1920, in their application to certain classes of Male Workers, the proposed Minimum Rates of Wages being as shown in the Schedule set out below

SCHEDULE. PART 1.

Proposed Variation of General Minimum Time-Rates and Prece-work Basis Time-Rates for Uertain Classes of Male Workers.

SECTION I .- For Cutters, Knife-Cutters or Knife-men, Fitters-up, Tailors, Machinists and Passers, as defined in Part III of this Schedule:-

Proposed Variation. General Minimum Time-Rate. From 1s. 2d. per hour to 1s. 5d. per hour.

Piece-work Basis Time-Rate.

From 1s. 3½d. per hour to 1s. 6½d. per hour.

SECTION II .- Workers who commence employment in the trade at or over the age of 19 may receive for a period of six months, in substitution for the appropriate General Minimum Time-Rates set out in Sub-Sections (E) and (F) of Section I of Part I of the Schedule to the above-mentioned Notice, dated 13th August, 1920, a General Minimum Time-Rate of 33s. per week of 48 hours, or 84d. per hour, and thereafter for a period of six months a General Minimum Time-Rate of 38s. per week of 48 hours, or 9½d. per hour. Provided that these General Minimum Time-Rates shall be increased by 6s. per week of 48 hours, or 11d. per hour, in the case of any such worker who is 22 years of age or over. Workers to whom this Section applies shall, on the expiration of one year's service in the trade, receive such General Minimum Time-Rates as they may be entitled to under the provisions of the above-mentioned Notice, dated 13th August,

Section III.—The weekly rates set out above are based on a week of 48 hours, and are subject to a proportionate adjustment according as the number of hours of employment in any week is less than 48.

PART II.

Proposed Variation of Overtime Rates for Certain Classes of Male Workers.

Overtime Rates, calculated on the General Minimum Time-Rates set out in Part 1 of this Schedule, in the manner specified in Part II of the Schedule to the above-mentioned Notice, dated 13th August, 1920, shall apply, in substitution for the rates set out in Part I of this Schedule, in respect of all hours worked in excess of the number of hours declared by the Trade Board in the Schedule to the abovementioned Notice, dated 13th August, 1920, to be the normal number of hours of work in the

Note.—The hours which young persons and children are allowed to work are subject to the provisions of the Factory and Workshop Acts.

PART III.

For the purposes of this Notice the following definitions shall apply:—

A Cutter is a person:

(a) Who is employed in:(i) Marking-in or marking-up cloth or linings or other materials.

(ii) Laying-up, hooking-up or folding cloth or linings, or other materials.

(iii) Cutting cloth or linings, or other materials.

(iv) Dividing—that is, the process ordinarily carried on by cutters or their assistants, of dividing, parting, or separating the parts of garments after being cut, and of assembling them into suitable

bundles for making up; and

(b) Who has been employed not less than three years and less than five years after the age of 19 as a cutter or knife-man, as defined in this part of this Schedule.

A Knife-cutter or Knife-man is a person:—
(a) Who is employed on Band, Electric or

Hand-knife processes; and

(b) Who has been employed not less than three years and less than five years after the age of 19 as a Knife-cutter or Knife-man, as defined in this Part of this Schedule.

A Fitter-up is a person:

(a) Who is employed in Fitting-up—that is, a process between that of cutting and that of sewing, baisting or machining, which consists of preparing or fitting accurately the various parts of the garment before being baisted, sewn or machined, such work of preparing or fitting being always done by shears or knives or other cutting appliances, sewing, baisting or machining forming no

part or process of fitting-up; and
(b) Who has been employed not less than three years and less than five years after the age of 19 as a Fitter-up or Tailor, as defined

in this Part of this Schedule.

A Tailor is a person:-

(a) Who is employed in Sewing by hand in the process of making a garment or portion of a garment; and

(b) Who has been employed not less than three years and less than five years after the age of 19 as a Tailor, as defined in this Part of this Schedule.

A Presser is a person:-

(a) Who is employed in Pressing-off by

hand or by machine; and

(b) Who has been employed not less than three years and less than five years after the age of 19 as a Presser as defined in this Part of this Schedule or as an Under-Presser as defined in Section I of Part III of the Schedule to the above-mentioned Notice dated 13th August, 1920.

A Machinist is a person:

(a) Who is employed in Machining other than as a Plain Machinist as defined in Section I of Part III of the Schedule to the above-mentioned Notice dated 13th August,

1920; and

(b) Who has been employed not less than three years and less than five years after the age of 19 as a Machinist as defined in this Part of this Schedule or as a Plain Machinist as defined in Section I of Part III of the Schedule to the above-mentioned Notice dated 13th August, 1920.

A Passer is a person:

(a) Who is employed in examining garments, either in the processes of being made up or upon their completion; and

(b) Who has been employed not less than three years and less than five years after the age of 19 as a Passer or Tailor as defined in this Part of this Schedule.

PART IV.

The above Minimum, Rates of Wages shall apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, to all Male Workers specified in this Notice in respect of all time during which they are employed in Great Britain in any branch of Ready-Made and Wholesale Bespoke Tailoring as defined in the Regulations made

by the Minister of Labour, and dated 15th January, 1920; that is to say:

Men's and Boys' ready-made and wholesale bespoke tailoring; and all men's and boys' retail bespoke tailoring carried on in a factory where garments are made up for three or more retail establishments; and any other branch of men's and boys' tailoring which is not included within the scope of the Regulations dated 12th December, 1919, with respect to the Constitu-tion and Proceedings of a Trade Board in Great Britain for Retail Bespoke Tailoring; Including.

(1) (a) The altering, repairing, renovating or re-making of men's or boys' tailored garments, except where included within the scope of the above-mentioned Regulations with respect to Retail Bespoke Tailoring;

(b) The cleaning of such garments where carried out in association with or in conjunction with the altering, repairing, renovating

or re-making of the garments;

(2) The lining with fur of the abovementioned garments where carried out in association with or in conjunction with the making of such garments;

(3) All processes of embroidery or decorative needlework, where carried out in association with or in conjunction with the above-mentioned branches of tailoring;

(4) All warehousing, packing and other operations incidental to or appertaining to any of the branches of tailoring in question; But excluding:

The making of head-gear;
 The making of rubberised or oilskin

garments;

(3) The making of boys' ready-made washing suits or sailor suits, where carried out in association with or in conjunction with the making of garments to be worn by women or girls, or by children without distinction of sex.

PART V.

SECTION I.—The above Minimum Rates of Wages shall be paid clear of all deductions other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments or deductions authorised by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any superannuation or other provident fund.

Section II.—The above Minimum Rates of Wages are without prejudice to workers earning higher rates of wages, or to Agreements made, or that may be made, between employers and workers for the payment of wages in excess of

these Minimum Rates of Wages.

The Trade Board will consider any Objections to the above Proposal to Vary which may be lodged with them within two months from 3rd October, 1920. Such Objections should be in writing and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her full name and address), and should be sent to The Secretary of the Ready-Made and Wholesale Bespoke Tailoring Trade Board (Great Britain), 5, Chancery Lane, London, W.C. 2.

It is desirable that the Objections should state precisely, and so far as possible with

reasons, what is objected to.

GENERAL MINIMUM PIECE-RATES (AS VARIED) FOR FEMALE HOME-WORKERS, EFFECTIVE AS FROM 2ND OCTOBER, 1920.*

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour, and dated the 31st October, 1918, the Trade Board established under the Trade Boards Act, 1918, for the Rope, Twine and Net Trade as specified in the Trade Boards (Rope, Twine and Net) Order, 1919, having given due notice on 24th June, 1920, of Proposal to Vary General Minimum Piece-Rates for Female Home-Workers HEREBY GIVE NOTICE, as required by Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, that THEY HAVE VARIED the General Minimum Piece-Rates for Female Home-Workers, set out in the Schedule of their Notice dated 1st June, 1920, and that the General Minimum Piece-Rates as varied are as shown in the Schedule set out below.

And the Trade Board FURTHER GIVE NOTICE that they have received notification from the Minister of Labour that he has made an Order dated 30th September, 1920, under Section 4 (2) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, confirming the General Minimum Piece Rates Varied by the Trade Board, and specifying 2nd October, 1920,* as the date from which such General Minimum Piece-

Rates shall become effective.

* NOTE.—Should this date not correspond with the beginning of the period for which wages are paid by an employer who pays wages at intervals not exceeding seven days, the rates shall become effective as from the beginning of the next full pay period, but in any case not later than 8th October, 1920.

The above General Minimum Piece-Rates shall apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, and of this Notice, to all Female Home-Workers in Great Britain in respect of all time during which they are employed in any branch of the Trade specified in the Trade Boards (Rope, Twine, and Net) Order 1919; that is to say, the making or remaking of (a) rope (including driving rope and banding); (b) cord (including blind and window cord, but excluding silk, worsted and other fancy cords); (c) core for wire ropes; (d) lines; (e) twine (including binder and trawl twine); (f) lanyards; (g) net and similar articles; the bleaching, teazing, hackling, carding, preparing and spinning of the materials required for the making or remaking of any of the articles (a) to (g) above, when carried on in the same factory or workshop as such making or remaking; the manufacture of packings, gaskins and spun yarns, when carried on in the same factory or workshop as the making or remaking of any of the articles (a) to (g) above; the braiding or splicing of articles made from rope, cord, twine or net; the mending of nets and the winding, twisting, doubling, laying, polishing, dressing, tarring, tanning, dyeing, balling, reeling, finishing, packing, despatching, warehousing and storing of any of the above articles, where these operations or any of them are carried on in a factory or workshop in which any of the articles (a) to (g) above are made or remade; BUT EXCLUDING the making of wire Rope (unless made in the same factory or workshop as hemp or similar rope or core for wire rope), AND EXCLUDING the making of net in connection with the lace curtain trade and the weaving of cloth.

PART IV.

SECTION I.—The above General Minimum Piece Rates shall be paid clear of all deductions, other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments or deductions authorised by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any Superannuation or other Provident Fund.

Effective as from the 4th October, 1920.*

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour, and dated 31st October, 1918, the Trade Board established under the Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, for that section of the trade specified in the Trade Boards (Tailoring) Order, 1919, which is covered by the Regulations made by the Minister of Labour, and dated 15th January, 1920, with respect to Ready-made and Wholesale Bespoke Tailoring in Great Britain, having given due Notice on the 10th June, 1920, of Proposal as therein shown to Vary and Fix Minimum Rates of Wages for Female Workers, HEREBY GIVE NOTICE that they HAVE VARIED the General Minimum Time-Rates and Piece-work Basis Time-Rates for Female Workers at present effective and set out in the Notice dated 27th November 1919 issued by the Tailoring at present effective and set out in the Notice dated 27th November, 1919, issued by the Tailoring Trade Board (Great Britain), in their application to Female Workers employed in any branch of Ready-made and Wholesale Bespoke Tailoring in Great Britain specified in Part V. of the Schedule hereof and HAVE FIXED General Minimum Time-Rates and Piece-work Basis Time-Rates for Female Workers employed in those branches of Ready-made and Wholesale Bespoke Tailoring in Great Britain specified in Part V. of the Schedule hereof to which the said Minimum Rates of Wages set out in the above-mentioned Notice dated 27th November, 1919, do not apply, and also HAVE FIXED Overtime Rates for Female Workers employed in any branch of Ready-made and Wholesale Bespoke Tailoring in Great Britain specified in Part V. of the Schedule hereof, the Overtime Rates as fixed to apply in substitution for the Minimum Rates of Wages otherwise applicable, as set out in Parts I. and II. of the Schedule hereto, in respect of hours worked in excess of the number of hours declared by the Trade Board to be the normal number of hours of work in the said branches of the Tailoring Trade, the Minimum Rates of Wages as Varied and Fixed being as shown in the Schedule set out below, which is incorporated herewith.

And the Trade Board FURTHER GIVE NOTICE that they have received notification from

the Minister of Labour that he has made an Order dated the 2nd October, 1920, under Section 4 (2) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, confirming the Minimum Rates of Wages as Varied and Fixed by the Trade Board, and specifying the 4th October, 1920,* as the date from which such Minimum

Rates of Wages shall become effective.

* Note.—Should this date not correspond with the beginning of the period for which wages are paid by an employer who pays wages at intervals not exceeding seven days, the rates shall become effective as from the beginning of the next full-pay period, but in any case not later than the 10th October, 1920.

The General Minimum Time-Rate for Learners under 14 years shall be 3d. per hour. Such Learners shall from the age of 14 be entitled to the amounts shown in Column I. above, all employment prior to that age being disregarded.

(i) The advances to be given to Learners commencing at under 21 years of age shall become due as from the first Monday in January and July of each year, the Learner being entitled to her first advance on the first Monday in January or July, as the case may be, provided that she has been in the trade at least three months.

(ii) A Learner shall cease to be a Learner and be entitled to the full General Minimum Time-Rate applicable to her under Section I. of this Part of this Schedule upon the fulfilment of the conditions appropriate to her as set out below:—

Overtime Rates for Female Workers.

Section I.—In accordance with Section 3 (1) (c) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, the Trade Board hereby declare the normal number of hours of work in the trade to be as follows:-

In any week, 48.

On any day (other than Saturday), 9.

On Saturday, 5. Provided that all hours worked by worker on Sundays and on Customary Public and Statutory Holidays shall be regarded as Overtime to which the Overtime Rates shall apply.

SECTION II.—The Minimum Rates for Overtime in respect of hours worked by a Female Worker, in excess of the declared normal number of hours of work in the trade shall be

(A) Female Workers, as specified in this

notice, employed on Time-work:

(1) For the first two hours of Overtime on any day, except Saturdays, Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, the Overtime Rate shall be equivalent to One-and-a-Quarter times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable—i.e., Time-and-a-quarter.

(2) For the second two hours of Overtime on any day except Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, and for all Overtime on Saturdays, the Overtime Rate shall be equivalent to One-and-a-Half times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise

applicable, i.e., Time-and-a-Half.

(3) For all time worked on Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays and for Overtime after the first four hours of Overtime on any other day, the Overtime Rate shall be equivalent to Twice the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise

applicable, i.e., Double Time.
(4) For all hours worked in any week in excess of 48, the Overtime Rate shall be Oneand-a-Quarter times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, i.e., Time-and-a-Quarter, except in so far as higher Overtime Rates are payable under the provisions of paragraphs (2) and (3) of this Sub-Section. The Overtime Rates shall be payable where on any day (not being a Sunday or a Customary Public or Statutory Holiday) the number of hours worked exceeds nine, or in the case of Saturday, exceeds five, notwithstanding that the number of hours worked in the week does not exceed 48.

Provided that:

(a) Where it is or may become the established practice of an employer to require attendance only on five days a week, the Overtime Rates shall only be payable where on any day the number of hours worked exceeds 91/3.

(b) Where it is or may become the established practice of an employer to require attendance only on alternate Saturdays, the normal number of hours for the week in which attendance on Saturday is required shall be deemed to be 50.

(B) Female Workers, as specified in this

notice,

ce, employed on Piece-work:
(1) (a) Cutters, Trimmers and Fitters-up (as specified in Section I. (b) of Part I. of this Schedule), and (b) Learners (as specified in Section II. of Part I. of this Schedule), employed on Piece-work shall receive in respect of each hour of Overtime worked, in addition to payment at Piece-Rates, each of which would yield, in the circumstances of the case, to an Ordinary worker not less than the General Minimum Time-Rate applicable, an amount equal to the appropriate General Minimum. Time-Rate, One-Half of the appropriate General Minimum Time-Rate, or One-Quarter of the appropriate General Minimum Time-Rate, according as the Overtime Rate which would have been payable under the provisions of paragraph (A) of this Section, if the worker had been employed on Time-work, were Double Time, Time-and-a-

Half, or Time-and-a-Quarter, respectively.
(2) All other Female Workers employed on Piece-work shall receive in respect of each hour of Overtime worked, in addition to payment at Piece-Rates, each of which would yield, in the circumstances of the case, to an Ordinary worker, not less than the Piecework Basis Time-Rate applicable, an amount equal to the appropriate Piece-work Basis Time-Rate, One-Half of the appropriate Piece-work Basis Time-Rate, or One-Quarter of the appropriate Piece-work Basis Time-Rate, according as the Overtime Rate which would have been payable under the provisions of paragraph (A) of this Section, if the worker had been employed on Time-work, were Double Time, Time-and-a-Half, or

Time-and-a-Quarter, respectively.

Section III.—Where it is or may become the established practice of an employer to require attendance on Sunday instead of Saturday, the Minimum Rates for Overtime, as set out above, shall apply to such worker in like manner as if in the provisions of this Notice as to Overtime the word "Saturday" were substituted for "Sunday," and the word "Sunday" for "Saturday."

Note.—The hours which females, young persons and children are allowed to work are subject to the provisions of the Factory and Workshop Acts.

PART IV.

For the purpose of this Notice the following definitions shall apply:-

Section I.—Cutters, Trimmers and Fittersup are workers who are substantially occupied in one or more of the following processes:-

(a) Marking-in or marking-up cloth or linings, or other materials.

(b) Laying-up, hooking-up or folding cloth or linings, or other materials.

(c) Cutting cloth or linings or other materials.

(d) Trimming, that is, the process as ordinarily carried on of cutting and assembling together the linings and fittings of garments.

(e) Dividing, that is, the process as ordinarily carried on by Cutters or their Assistants, of dividing, parting or separating the parts of garments after being cut, and of assembling them into suitable bundles for

(f) Fitting-up, that is, a process between that of cutting and that of sewing, baisting, or machining, which consists of preparing and fitting accurately the various parts of the garment before being baisted, sewn or machined, such work of preparing and fitting being always done by shears or knives or other cutting appliances; sewing, baisting or machining forming no part or process of fitting-up.

Section II.—A Female Learner is a worker who:

(a) Is employed during the whole or a substantial part of her time in learning any branch or process of Ready-made and Wholesale Bespoke Tailoring by an employer who provides the learner with reasonable facilities for such learning; and

(b) Has received a certificate, or has been registered in accordance with rules from time to time laid down by the Trade Board, or has made an application for such certificate or registration, which has been duly acknowledged and is still under consideration. Provided that the certification or registration of a learner may be cancelled if the other conditions of learnership are not complied with.

Provided that an employer may employ a Female Learner on her first employment in any branch or branches of Ready-made and Wholesale Bespoke Tailoring, specified in Part V. of this Schedule, without a certificate or registration for a probation period not exceeding four weeks, but in the event of such learner being continued thereafter at her employment, the probation period shall be included in her period of learnership.

Provided that notwithstanding compliance with the conditions contained in this Section, a person shall not be deemed to be a Learner if she works in a room used for dwelling purposes, and is not in the employment of her

parent or guardian.

Section III.—A' Home-worker is a worker who works in her own home, or in any place not under the control or management of the employer.

PART V.

The above Minimum Rates of Wages shall apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, to all Female Workers in Great Britain in respect of all time during which they are employed in any branch of Ready-made and Wholesale Bespoke Tailoring as defined in the Regulations made by the Minister of Labour and dated 15th January, 1920, that is to say:

Men's and boys' ready-made and wholesale bespoke tailoring; and all men's and boys' retail bespoke tailoring carried on in a factory where garments are made up for three or more retail establishments; and any other branch of men's and boys' tailoring which is not included within the scope of the Regulations dated 12th December, 1919, with respect to the Constitution and Proceedings of a Trade Board in Great Britain for Retail Bespoke Tailoring; Including(1)

(a) The altering, repairing, renovating or re-making of men's or boys' tailored garments, except where included within the scope of the above-mentioned Regulations with respect to Retail Bespoke Tailoring.

(b) The cleaning of such garments where carried out in association with or in conjunction with the altering, repairing, renovating or re-making of the garments.

(2) The lining with fur of the above-mentioned garments, where carried out in asso-ciation with or in conjunction with the

making of such garments.

(3) All processes of embroidery or decorative needlework where carried out in association with or in conjunction with the abovementioned branches of tailoring.

(4) All warehousing, packing and other operations incidental to or appertaining to any of the branches of tailoring in question..

The KING has been graciously pleased to approve of the award of the Albert Medal to Mr. Harry Smith, Commissioned Engineer, R.N., for gallantry in saving life at sea. The following is the account of the services

in respect of which the decoration has been

conferred:

On the 13th May last, while H.M. Torpedo Boat Destroyer "Rob Roy" was proceeding at utmost speed on a full-power trial, a fire broke out in the forward boiler-room.

With entire disregard of his own safety, Mr. Smith immediately went below to search for the two ratings who were still there, and to shut off the boilers under extreme difficulties owing to the heat, escaping steam and water, well knowing in doing so the danger he ran from the burning oil fuel and the unconsumed gases accentuated by the confined and congested space of a destroyer's boiler-room.

Owing to his prompt action and presence of mind, Mr. Smith localised the damage and

saved the lives of all who were below.
