WHEREAS by Royal Commission, dated the 19th day of March, 1919, Commissioners were appointed to deal with claims in respect of the user of Inventions, designs, drawings or processes on behalf of the Crown in the cases and manner therein more particularly specified; AND WHEREAS by the Patents and Designs Act, 1919, it was enacted as follows, that is to say:

Section 8.—“ For section twenty-nine of the principal Act, the following section shall be substituted:—

“ 29.—(1) A Patent shall have to all intents the like effect as against His Majesty the King as it has against a subject:

“ Provided that any Government Department may, by themselves or such of their

agents, contractors or others as may be authorized, in writing, by them at any time after the application, make use or exercise the invention for the services of the Crown on such terms as may, either before or after the use thereof, be agreed on, with the approval of the Treasury, between the Department and the Patentee, or, in default of agreement, as may be settled in the manner hereinafter provided. And the terms of any agreement or licence concluded between the inventor or Patentee, and any person other than a Government Department, shall be inoperative so far as concerns the making, use or exercise of the invention for the services of the Crown:

"Provided further that, where an invention which is the subject of any patent has, before the date of the patent, been duly recorded in a document by, or tried by or on behalf of, any Government Department (such invention not having been communicated directly or indirectly by the applicant for the patent or the patentee), any Government Department, or such of their agents, contractors or others as may be authorised in writing by them, may make, use and exercise the invention so recorded or tried for the service of the Crown, free of any royalty or other payment to the patentee, notwithstanding the existence of the patent. If in the opinion of the Department the disclosure to the applicant or the patentee, as the case may be, of the document recording the invention, or the evidence of the trial thereof, if required, would be detrimental to the public interest, it may be made confidentially to Counsel on behalf of the Applicant or Patentee, or to any independent expert mutually agreed upon.

"(2) In case of any dispute as to the making, use or exercise of an invention under this section, or the terms therefor, or as to the existence or scope of any record or trial as aforesaid, the matter shall be referred to the Court for decision, who shall have power to refer the whole matter or any question or issue of fact arising thereon to be tried before a Special or Official Referee or Arbitrator upon such terms as it may direct. The Court, Referee or Arbitrator, as the case may be, may with the consent of the parties, take into consideration the validity of the patent for the purposes only of the reference and for the determination of the issues between the applicant and such Government Department. The Court, Referee or Arbitrator, further in settling the terms as aforesaid, shall be entitled to take into consideration any benefit or compensation which the patentee or any other person interested in the patent may have received directly or indirectly from the Crown or from any Government Department in respect of such patent."

Section 15.—"After section fifty-eight of the principal Act the following Section shall be inserted:—

"58A.—The registration of a design shall have to all intents the like effect as against His Majesty the King as it has against a subject:

"Provided that the provisions of Section twenty-nine of this Act shall apply to registered designs as though those provisions were herein re-enacted and in terms made applicable to registered designs."

Section 22 (2).—" the provisions of this Act relating to the terms on

which an invention or registered design can be made, used, or exercised by or on behalf of a Government Department shall not come into operation until such time as may be fixed by Order of the Board of Trade."

And whereas by an Order of the Board of Trade dated the 23rd day of April, 1920, it was ordered that Section 29 (1) and (2) of the principal Act as amended by Sections 8 and 15 of the Patents and Designs Act, 1919, should come into operation on the 23rd day of April, 1920:

Now Know Ye that We, reposing great trust and confidence in your knowledge and ability, have authorized and appointed, and do by these Presents authorize and appoint you the said Sir Charles Henry Sargant (Chairman); Robert John, Baron Rayleigh; Sir Charles Edward Ellis; Sir George Lewis Barstow; Sir James Johnston Dobbie; Sir William Pearce; William Temple Franks; Lionel Henry Hanbury; Robert Frederick Norton and Robert Young to be Our Commissioners to exercise such additional and extended powers and to act for such additional purposes as hereinafter appear, that is to say:

(1) The provisions contained under Head 2 of the said Royal Commission dated the 19th day of March, 1919, shall apply to any such agreement or proposed agreement whether as regards a patented invention or registered design as is mentioned or referred to in sub-section (1) of section 29 of the Patents and Designs Act, 1907, in its substituted form as enacted by Section 8 of the Patents and Designs Act, 1919 (hereinafter referred to as "the substituted section 29").

(2) The provisions contained in the said Royal Commission dated the 19th day of March, 1919, with reference to patented Inventions shall mutatis mutandis and so far as applicable apply to registered designs.

(3) If any such dispute as is mentioned or referred to in Sub-section (2) of the substituted Section 29 shall arise as regards either a patented invention or a registered design and the owner of the patent or registered design as the case may be and the Government Department concerned shall agree to the matter being referred for decision to the said Commissioners instead of to the Court or otherwise as mentioned in the said sub-section (2) the Commissioners may proceed to decide and settle such dispute with authority to investigate and determine so far as may be necessary for the purposes of proceedings before them all questions of infringement and validity of the patent or the design involved: Provided that any powers hereby given to the said Commissioners shall only be exercised by them upon the application of the owner of the patent or registered design as the case may be and upon his agreement to accept the decision settlement and determination of the Commissioners.

And it is hereby provided and declared that the provisions of the Arbitration Act, 1889, or any statutory re-enactment thereof shall not have any application to proceedings under the said Royal Commission dated the 19th day of March, 1919, or these Presents.

**CARGOES EX ENEMY VESSELS SEIZED
BY PORTUGAL.**

*Foreign Office,
October 4th, 1920.*

With reference to the notification which was published in the London Gazette of May 18 last, respecting the release of Allied and Neutral merchandise found on enemy vessels in Portuguese harbours, a translation of a further Decree now issued by the Portuguese Government is appended:—

DECREE No. 6928, September 11, 1920.
(Translation.)

The state of war having now ceased and it being desirable to provide for the delivery from henceforward on a normal basis of the goods belonging to Allies or Neutrals, discharged from the enemy ships seized in Portuguese waters, and thus return to the observance of the Customs legislation as far as it may be applicable: I hereby, having heard the advice of the Council of Ministers and in accordance with the provisions of the sole paragraph of Article 2 of the Decree No. 4560 of the 8th of July, 1918, decree as follows:—

ARTICLE I.

From the date of this Decree, the delivery is permitted, in accordance with Portuguese Customs legislation, of the goods which were on board the ships of enemy nationality seized in the ports of Portugal, her Islands and Colonies, and which at the time of the seizure of the vessel conveying them were the legitimate and undoubted property of persons or bodies of Neutral or Allied nationality who had not disposed of them by a sale completed by the receipt of an equivalent of their value.

(1.) Claims for delivery, duly supported by documents, shall be produced at the head offices of the Custom Houses.

ARTICLE II.

In cases in which the documents of ownership of the goods are missing, the procedure to be followed is that prescribed in Article 478 of the Regulations of January 31st, 1888.

ARTICLE III.

If the goods have already been sold at a public auction the owners shall receive the proceeds thereof in cash, once their right has been established in accordance with the terms of this Decree.

(1.) In the case of goods already requisitioned the owners shall receive their value in accordance with the respective records.

ARTICLE IV.

The owners of the goods or their legal representatives may lodge a petition at the Custom Houses praying that an advertised auction shall not take place; such petition shall have a suspending effect when authenticated by the competent Consulate.

(1.) If after the expiration of thirty days counting from the presentation of the petition the party concerned has not produced the documents necessary to support his right as owner of the goods, founded on the records of the case, the suspending effect referred to in this Article shall cease, without prejudice to the right conferred by Article III.

ARTICLE V.

Claims concerning the ownership of goods belonging to Neutrals and Allies, at present within the jurisdiction of the procurator of the Republic, may, on a previous authorisation from the Government, be transferred to the respective Custom Houses if the parties concerned agree thereto.

ARTICLE VI.

The Custom Houses shall always demand from the claimants a duly authenticated certificate in which the Consul concerned attests to the nationality of the goods in accordance with the terms of Article 1.

ARTICLE VII.

Legislation to the contrary is hereby revoked. The President of the Ministry and the Ministers of all the Departments shall accordingly carry this Decree into effect.

The KING has been pleased to award the
Albert Medal to Fireman Thomas William
Brown, of the Newcastle-upon-Tyne Fire
Brigade, in recognition of his gallantry in
saving life in the following circumstances:—

On the 23rd December, 1919, at about
4 p.m., a fire, which speedily attained serious
proportions, broke out at Cross House, West-
gate Road, Newcastle-on-Tyne, in the base-
ment of the building, where cases containing
a large quantity of cinematograph films were
stored, and flames were quickly shooting up
the lift shaft and the staircase.

The work of the Fire Brigade was performed
under most difficult and dangerous conditions,
owing to the great heat, noxious fumes and ex-
plosions caused by the burning films. Flames
were already shooting across the street on one
side of the building when the Brigade arrived
on the scene within a few seconds of the call
having been received, and it was from the
windows of the upper floors that a large
number of the rescues were effected; the action
of Fireman Thomas William Brown in reach-
ing the top of the building by means of a hook
ladder being an outstanding feature of the
work of rescue.

A 50 ft. fire escape had been pitched on one
side of the building, and Brown, having
ascended the escape, fastened to a window on
the fourth floor a 14 ft. hook ladder which he
carried, and by this means enabled thirteen
persons to escape. He then threw up the
hook ladder to the main cornice above, which
projected 2½ feet from the building, and with
great coolness and daring ascended to the
parapet, where he effected the rescue of three
other persons by making fast the hook ladder
in another position and attaching it to a 65 ft.
escape. There was great risk of the hook
slipping while the Fireman was ascending the
ladder some 70 feet from the ground, seeing
that by reason of the overhang of the cornice
the ladder was clear of the wall.

Upwards of 100 persons were in the building when the fire broke out. Twelve deaths resulted, 57 were rescued, while 50 others effected their escape from the windows of the lower floors.

The Right Honourable Edward Shortt, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, has appointed Bernard Fred Kerridge, Esq., to be a Junior Inspector of Mines under the Coal Mines Acts, 1887 to 1919, and has directed him to act also as an Inspector for the purposes of the Metalliferous Mines Regulation Acts, 1872 and 1875, and of the Quarries Act, 1894; and has, further, appointed him to be an Inspector of Factories and Workshops for the purposes of the Factory and Workshop Act, 1901.

And whereas it is provided by sub-section (1) of Section 2 of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, that every Special Order may be varied or revoked by a subsequent Special Order;

And whereas the Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, do not apply to the trade specified in the Appendix to this Order, except as regards such processes or operations as may be covered by the Trade Boards (Rope, Twine and Net) Order, 1919;

And whereas the Minister of Labour is of opinion that it is expedient that the Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, should apply to the trade specified in the Appendix to this Order;

ARTICLE 1.—The Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, shall apply to the trade specified in the Appendix to this Order.

ARTICLE 2.—The Trade Boards (Rope, Twine and Net) Order, 1919, is hereby varied by the exclusion therefrom of any processes or operations comprised therein, which are specifically mentioned in the Appendix to this Order.

ARTICLE 3.—This Order may be cited as the Trade Boards (Made-up Textiles) Order, 1920.

APPENDIX.

TRADE.

The Made-up Textiles Trade, that is to say:—

1. The making from woven fabrics of any of the following articles, or the repairing thereof:—

Tarpaulins; tents; marquees; rick, cart or wagon covers; nose-bags; oilskin clothing or headgear or linings therefor; flags made of more than one piece; baths, basins, buckets, beds, cots, hammocks, ground sheets or similar articles; girths and articles known in the trade as horse-clothing.

2. The making of any of the following articles from fabrics of the kind specified in paragraph 1 above, or the repairing thereof, when carried on in association with or in conjunction with the making or repairing of any of the articles mentioned in the said paragraph:—

Rope-bound coal and coke sacks; haver-sacks or knap-sacks; outside and inside blinds or awnings; flags made of one piece; bunting decorations.

Including:—

(A) The following operations when carried on in association with or in conjunction with the operations specified in paragraph 1 and 2 above, viz.:—Operations known in the trade as—

(i) the dyeing, oiling, tarring, chemically treating, or otherwise proofing of the fabrics mentioned in paragraph 1 and the preparation of dressings therefor;

(ii) cutting, sewing, finishing, stenciling or branding by hand or machine;

(B) the following or similar operations performed by hand or machine when incidental to and carried on in association with or in conjunction with the operations specified in paragraphs 1 and 2 above:—

(i) the splicing or braiding of rope, cord or twine;

(ii) the making of fittings of leather or webbing, including the assembling of metal or other parts;

(iii) the sewing or attaching to any of the articles mentioned in paragraphs 1 or 2 above of.—

(a) rope, cord or twine,

(b) leather, webbing or metal or fittings made thereof;

(C) the warehousing of, the packing of, and similar operations in regard to any of the articles mentioned in paragraphs 1 and 2 above, when carried on in association with or in conjunction with the operations specified in the said paragraphs;

(D) the warehousing of, the packing of, and similar operations in regard to any other articles when carried on, in or in association with or in conjunction with any business, establishment, branch or department mainly engaged in any of the operations mentioned in sub-paragraph (C) above;

but excluding:—

(i) the making of haversacks and knapsacks when made in association with or in conjunction with the making of and as part of military web equipment;

(ii) the making of folding or deck chairs;

(iii) the making or repairing of horse-clothing, girths and nose-bags when carried on in association with or in conjunction with the making or repairing of leather saddlery or harness;

(iv) the making or repairing of rubberised articles;

(v) the making or repairing of tarpaulins or of rope-bound coal and coke sacks in an establishment, business, branch or department in which the making of sails is the main or principal business of the establishment, business, branch or department;

(vi) the printing by hand or machine of flags or parts thereof;

(vii) the operations mentioned in sub-paragraph (C) above, when carried on, in or in association with or in conjunction with any business, establishment, branch or department mainly engaged in the warehousing of, the packing of, and similar operations in regard to corn sacks, flour sacks, coal sacks, sugar sacks, cement bags, sand bags, nail bags, potato bags, seed bags, and similar sacks or bags;

(viii) operations performed by workers directly employed by railway companies;

(ix) operations included in the Trade Boards (Hat, Cap and Millinery) Order, 1919;

(x) operations included in the Trade Boards (Linen and Cotton Handkerchief and Household Goods and Linen Piece Goods) Order, 1920;

(xi) operations included in the Trade Boards (Rope, Twine and Net) Order, 1919, but not specifically mentioned in this Order.

1. Any of the following operations when performed in or in connection with any business, establishment, branch or department carried on by way of trade or for the purpose of gain, viz.:—

Lathering, shaving, sponging, cutting, singeing, shampooing, brushing, combing, waving, dressing, tinting, dyeing, bleaching, or similar operations performed on hair growing on human beings.

2. Any of the following operations when performed in or in connection with any business, establishment, branch or department in which any of the operations specified in this paragraph or in paragraph 1 above are the main or principal business of the business, establishment, branch or department, viz.,

(a) the designing, making or renovating of wigs, whiskers, beards, moustaches,

fringes, toupees, switches, pads, frames, pincurls, partings, transformations, or similar articles for human use or adornment;

(b) the making of hair-lace or hair-net for use as a foundation for any of the articles mentioned in sub-paragraph (a) above.

3. Any of the following or similar operations preparatory to the making or renovating of the articles mentioned in paragraph 2, above, when performed in or in connection with any business, establishment, branch or department in which any of the operations specified in this paragraph or in paragraph 2 above are the main or principal business of the business, establishment, branch or department, viz., operations known in the trade as—

measuring, cleaning, drying, sorting, carding, drawing, mounting, mixing, weaving, sewing, knotting, dressing, craping, tinting, dyeing, matching, curling, plaiting.

Including:—

(a) The making or designing of wigs for dolls when carried on in or in association with or in conjunction with any business, establishment, branch or department engaged in any of the operations included in paragraphs 1, 2 or 3 above, by workers who are also engaged in any of the operations included in the said paragraphs;

(b) razor setting, hand or vibro massage, perfuming, electric treatment, depilatory operations, chiropody or manicure when carried on in association with or in conjunction with any of the operations included in paragraph 1 above;

(c) the retail sale of any articles when transacted in association with or in conjunction with any of the operations included in paragraphs 1 or 2 above by workers also engaged in any of the operations specified above;

(d) the following or similar operations when incidental to the sales or operations specified above, viz., operations known in the trade as—

(i) bottling, boxing, parcelling, bagging, packeting, labelling, packing, checking, unpacking;

(ii) weighing, measuring, mixing;

(iii) polishing, cutting, grinding, crushing;

(iv) collecting, delivering, despatching;

(v) time-keeping, storing, stock-keeping, warehousing, portering, lift or hoist operating, cleaning premises;

(vi) cleaning or adjusting implements, cleaning utensils or receptacles;

(e) the washing, ironing, or drying of towels, hair cutting cloths or similar articles when incidental to and performed by workers also engaged in any of the operations specified above;

but excluding:—

(i) the transport of goods by common carriers;

(ii) operations performed by workers engaged in any industry or trade concerned exclusively with carting and operations incidental thereto;

(iii) Post Office business;

(iv) operations included in the Trade Boards (Hair, Bass and Fibre) Order, 1919, but not specifically mentioned in this Order;

(v) operations included in the Trade Boards (Toy) Order, 1920, but not specifically mentioned in this Order.

TRADE BOARDS.

THE TRADE BOARDS (SACK AND BAG) ORDER, 1920.

SPECIAL ORDER, DATED OCTOBER 4, 1920, MADE BY THE MINISTER OF LABOUR UNDER SECTION 1 OF THE TRADE BOARDS ACT, 1918, APPLYING THE TRADE BOARDS ACTS, 1909 (9 EDW. 7, C. 22) AND 1918 (8 & 9 GEO. 5, C. 32), TO THE SACK AND BAG TRADE.

Whereas the Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, apply to the trades specified in the Schedule to the Trade Boards Act, 1909, and to the trades specified in the Schedule to the Trade Boards Provisional Orders Confirmation Act, 1913, and the Minister of Labour is empowered under and by virtue of Section 1 of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, to make a Special Order applying the Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, to any specified trade to which they do not at the time apply, if he is of opinion that no adequate machinery exists for the effective regulation of wages throughout the trade, and that accordingly, having regard to the rates of wages prevailing in the trade, or any part of the trade, it is expedient that the Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, should apply to that Trade;

And whereas the Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, do not apply to the Trade specified in the appendix to this order, and the Minister of Labour as respects that trade is of the opinion aforesaid:

Now, therefore, the Minister of Labour, in pursuance of the powers in him vested by Section 1 of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, and by any other Statute in that behalf, does hereby make a Special Order that from and after the eighth day of October, 1920, the following provisions shall have effect (that is to say):—

Article 1.—The Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, shall apply to the Trade specified in the appendix to this Order.

Article 2.—This Order may be cited as the Trade Boards (Sack and Bag) Order, 1920.

4. Any of the operations mentioned in paragraph (b) above when carried on in or in association with or in conjunction with any business, establishment, branch or department mainly engaged in the warehousing of, the packing of, and similar operations in regard to made-up textile articles other than sacks or bags, whether rope-bound or not, of the kind mentioned in this order;

5. Operations included in the Trade Boards (Waste Materials Reclamation) Order, 1920.

FRANCE: AERODROMES, CUSTOMS, AND WIRELESS STATIONS.

It is hereby notified:

Previous Notices to Airmen regarding Aerodromes, etc., in France are revised as follows:—

1. AERODROMES.

St. INGLEVERT (Lat. 50° 53' 0" N., Long. 1° 44' 30" E.), approximately 5 miles S.S.E. of Calais, was opened as a Customs Aerodrome on 20th May. (See Plan annexed.) Customs personnel are on duty during the day only. Petrol, oil and water supplies are available, and a handling party is stationed on the aerodrome. There are two hangars in the S.E. corner of the aerodrome. No repairs can be carried out. A wind indicator is placed on the S.E. boundary of the aerodrome.

The area most suitable for landing is marked by white lines. The centre of the landing ground is marked by a white circle 132 ft. in diameter, and on the south side of the circle is the name "St. Inglevert," so placed as to be read from the south. A wind sleeve is placed on a 16 metre post near the hangars at the S.E. corner, and a landing "T" is situated near this.

The red or white flag required by the International Convention which indicates the anti-clockwise or clockwise circuit, is hoisted on the post carrying the wind sleeve.

In case of fog, rockets are sent up to indicate the position of the ground and Bengal lights are lighted in the landing circle.

An aerial lighthouse has been installed outside the S.E. corner of the aerodrome, and is in operation every evening from sunset to 1½ hours after sunset. Its characteristic signal is the letter "A" of the Morse Code every 8 seconds, thus:—

White light	.5 sec.
Eclipse	.5 sec.
White light	3.0 secs.
Eclipse	4.0 secs.

There is a wireless station on the aerodrome with an aerial between two masts, one inside the boundary of the aerodrome near the hangars and the other outside near the Boulogne-Calais road (see *Wireless*, para. 3 post).

Obstacle lights are fixed on all high obstacles.

LE BOURGET (Lat. 48° 57' 0" N., Long. 2° 25' 0" E.) is a French Customs Aerodrome situated about 7 miles N.E. of Paris. (See Plan annexed.) Petrol, oil, and water, and hangars are available. A landing "T" is situated in the angle formed by the line of hangars and the offices of the aerodrome. Wind sleeves are fixed on the gables of the centre S.N.Ae. hangar and the workshop hangar. A red flag is hoisted on the offices of the aerodrome when the wind speed is greater than 4 metres per sec. (Approx. 10 m.p.h.) in which case taking off and landing should take place upwind. The flag is lowered when the wind speed is less than 4 metres per sec., in which case taking off and landing should take place towards the north.

On the ground opposite the offices of the aerodrome there is a white "T," which indicates the zone to be used by machines before starting and after landing, for taking up and setting down passengers or freight. The starting zone is to the south of the dividing line and

the arrival zone is to the north of the line. The words "Arrival" and "Departure" are marked on the ground in white letters in French and English.

An aerial lighthouse, showing a white light, is installed on the south side of the aerodrome, and is in operation every evening from sunset to 1½ hours after sunset, and also by request when the arrival of machines is notified. Its characteristic signal is the letter "N" of the Morse Code every 8 seconds, thus:—

White light	3.0 sec.
Eclipse	.5 sec.
White light	.5 sec.
Eclipse	4.0 sec.

The aerodrome is also illuminated by a battery of searchlights, situated near the offices, which illuminate a landing run of about 800 yards.

There is a wireless telegraph station (see *Wireless*, para. 3 *post*) in the aerodrome, with an aerial on the eastern side. This obstacle

is in the position most favourable for machines landing.

(2) White lamps are placed on obstacles as follows:—Two on each Bessoneau hangar, one on each garage.

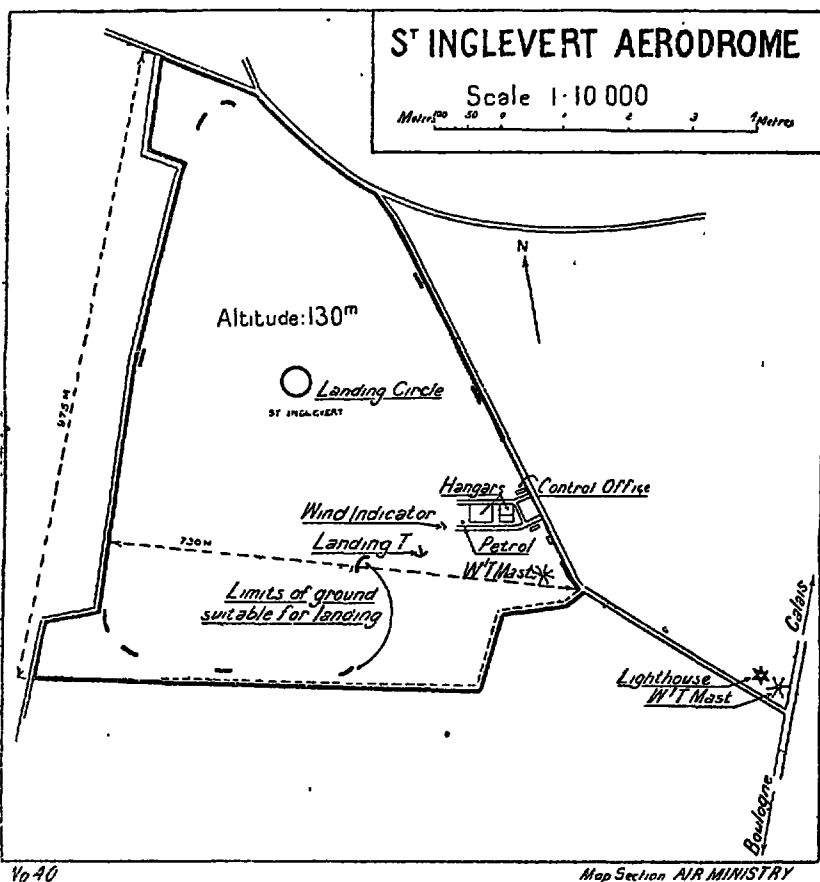
These landing lights are only exhibited when aircraft are expected.

Pilots intending to land at Bordeaux at night should therefore communicate direct with the Commandant, whose telegraphic address is:—

It is not necessary to advise the Commandant beforehand when landing by day. There is a W/T station on the aerodrome with a wireless mast in the north corner. (See "*Wireless*," para. 3, *post*).

LYONS (BRON) (Lat. 45° 44' 0" N., Long. 4° 53' 0" E.) is a Military and Civil Aerodrome, about two miles S.E. of Lyons.



is marked by fabric pennons during the day and a white light at night.

BORDEAUX (TEYNAC) (Lat. 44° 50' 30" N., Long. 0° 42' 0" W.) is a French Civil Aerodrome situated six miles west of Bordeaux. Petrol, oil, and water, and hangar accommodation are available. A landing "T" is situated in the north corner of the ground. A wind sleeve is situated on the hangars near the north corner. Circuits of the aerodrome should in all cases be made in an anti-clockwise direction.

Night Landing Arrangements.—(1) Two white lights, 300 yards apart, are placed on the leeward side of the aerodrome, marking the leeward boundary of the landing and taking-off area. A third white light is placed on the windward boundary, making with the two leeward lights an isosceles triangle; a machine landing must pass over the two leeward lights, heading towards the windward light. When there is no wind the triangle of lights is placed

Three wind sleeves are installed. Two of these sleeves are red, and are situated on the western side of the aerodrome; the third is white, and is situated on the eastern side of the aerodrome. When there is no wind machines should land and take-off from South to North.

An aerial lighthouse, showing a white light, is situated at the S.E. corner of the aerodrome, which is in operation each day from sunset to one hour after sunset. Its characteristic signal is the letter "H" of the Morse Code every 7½ seconds, thus:—

VALENCIENNES (Lat. 50° 20' 0" N., Long. 3° 31' 0" E.) is an emergency landing ground, situated about 1½ miles south of the town of Valenciennes.

An aerial lighthouse, showing a white light, is established on the aerodrome at the N.E. corner of the ground, and is in operation every evening from sunset to one hour after sunset. Its characteristic signal is the letter "V" of the Morse Code every 10 seconds, thus:—

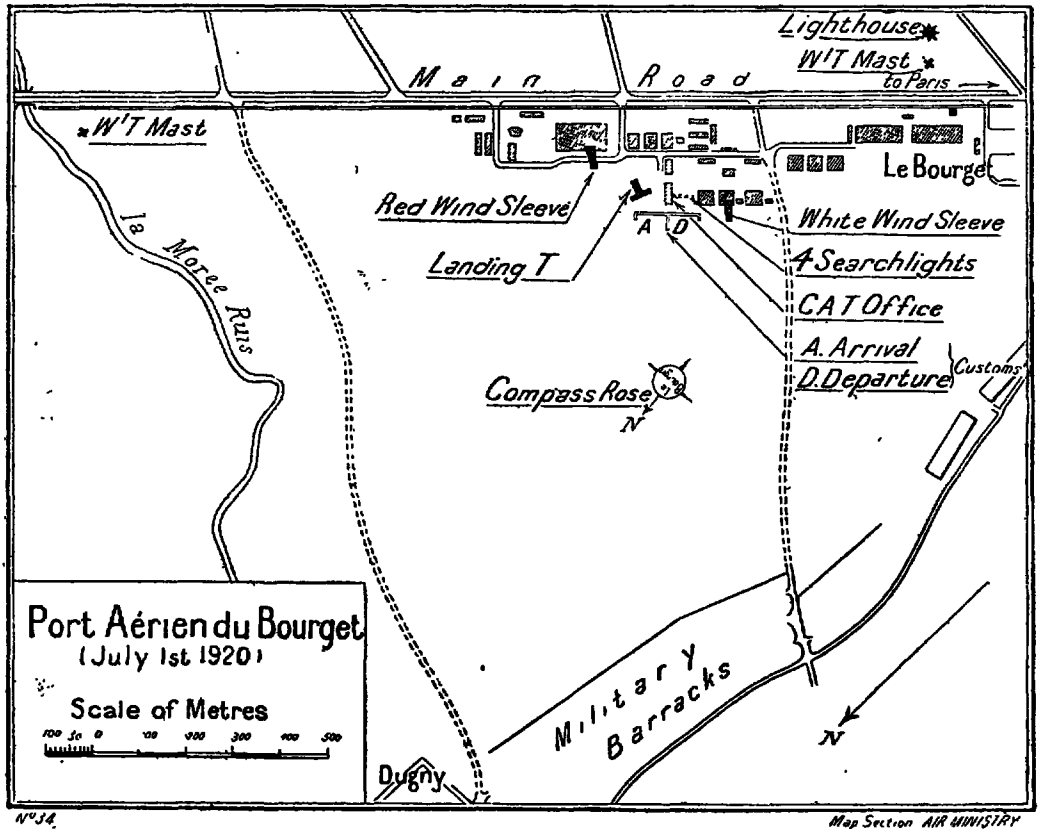

This ground is used by troops, and in order to avoid accidents it is essential that pilots should not land direct, but should first fly round the ground at a height between 600 and 1,200 ft., or fire a signal from the machine, so that troops may have time to clear the ground.

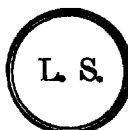
