And whereas it is expedient that the regulation hereinafter mentioned should cease to have effect:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that Regulation 30BB shall be revoked.

WHEREAS at St. Germain-en-Laye, on the 10th day of September, 1919, a Treaty of Peace with Austria (hereinafter re-

ferred to as "the Treaty") was signed on behalf of His Majesty:

And whereas it was provided in the Treaty that the property of nationals of the former Austrian Empire within the territory or under the control of an Allied or Associated State might be constituted a pledge for enemy liabilities upon the conditions laid down in the Treaty:

And whereas by the Treaty of Peace Act, 1919, it was provided that His Majesty might make such appointments, establish such offices, make such Orders in Council, and do such things as appeared to Him to be necessary for carrying out the Treaty, and for giving effect to any of the provisions thereof:

And whereas by Treaty, grant, usage, sufferance, or other lawful means, and by Decree of His Highness the Sultan of Egypt, His Majesty has power and jurisdiction in Egypt:

And whereas there is now in Egypt certain property of nationals of the former Austrian Empire under the control of His Majesty, and it is expedient to make provision for charging such property with the payment of the liabilities for which it may be constituted a pledge by the Treaty in the manner hereinafter provided:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in this behalf by the Foreign Jurisdiction Act, 1890, or otherwise in Him vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. All property, rights and interests in Egypt belonging to nationals of the former Austrian Empire at the date when the Treaty comes into force (not being property, rights or interests acquired under any general licence issued by or on behalf of His Majesty) and the net proceeds of their sale, liquidation, or other dealings therewith, so far as such property, rights and interests or such net proceeds are vested in or otherwise under the control of the custodian of enemy property or other British authority under the Trading with the Enemy Acts or the Trading with the Enemy Proclamations issued from time to time by the General Officer Commanding-in-Chief the British Forces in Egypt, are hereby charged:—

(a) First, with payment of the amounts due in respect of claims by British nationals with regard to their property, rights and interests, including companies and associations in which they are interested in territory of the former Austrian Empire, or debts owing to them by Austrian nationals, and with payment of any compensation awarded by the Mixed Arbitral Tribunal or by an arbitrator appointed by that Tribunal in pursuance of paragraph (e) of Article 249 of the Treaty, and with payment of claims growing out of acts committed by the former Austro-Hungarian Government or by any Austrian authorities since the 28th July, 1914, and before the 12th August, 1914.

(b) Secondly, with payment of the amounts due in respect of claims by British nationals with regard to their property, rights and interests in the territories of Germany, Hungary, Bulgaria and Turkey in so far as those claims are not otherwise satisfied.

Provided that any particular property, rights or interests so charged may at any time, if the High Commissioner thinks fit, be released from the charge so created.

2. In the application and enforcement of the charge created by this Order the claims of or debts owing to British nationals resident or carrying on business in Egypt shall enjoy priority over the claims of or debts owing to other British nationals.

3. All decisions of the Mixed Arbitral Tribunal constituted under Section VI. of Part X. of the Treaty, if within the jurisdiction of that Tribunal, shall be final and conclusive, and binding on all courts.

4. For the purpose of enforcing the attendance of witnesses before the Mixed Arbitral Tribunal, whether sitting in Egypt or not, and compelling the production before the Tribunal of documents, the High Commissioner shall have power to issue orders which shall have the like effect as if the proceedings before the Tribunal were an action in the Supreme Court, and the order were a formal process issued by that Court in the due exercise of its jurisdiction, and shall be enforceable by that Court accordingly, and disobedience to any such order shall be punishable as contempt of court.

5. Sections IV., V. and VI. of Part X. of the Treaty relating to property, rights and interests, to contracts, prescriptions and judgments, and to the Mixed Arbitral Tribunal, and all provisions of the said Treaty affecting or relating to the charge created by this Order shall have full force and effect as law.

6. The time at which the periods of prescription or limitation of right of action referred to in Article 252 of the Treaty shall begin again to run shall be at the expiration of ten months after the coming into force of the Treaty, and the period to be allowed within which presentation of negotiable instruments for acceptance or payment, and notice of non-acceptance or non-payment or protest may be made under Article 253, shall be ten months from the coming into force of the Treaty.

7. Rules made during the war by any recognised exchange or commercial association providing for the closure of contracts entered into before the war by an enemy, and any action taken thereunder are hereby confirmed, subject to the provisos contained in paragraph 4 (a) of the Annex to Section V. of Part X. of the Treaty.

8. The power under the Egypt Order in Council, 1915, to make King's Regulations, shall extend to the issue of regulations for the purpose of enforcing the charge created by this Order, and for making such arrangements as may be required for establishing and assessing the claims and debts for the payment of which the property charged is rendered liable, and for the payment, in whole or in part, of the sums due.

9. In this Order the term "British nationals resident or carrying on business in Egypt" means persons who are subject to the Egypt Order in Council, 1915, and who are so resident or carrying on business.

10. Egyptian nationals resident or carrying on business in Egypt shall share in the benefit of the charge created by this Order on the same terms as British nationals resident or carrying on business in Egypt, provided that during the war such Egyptian nationals were treated by the former Austro-Hungarian Government as enemies, and that their property was subjected by the former Austro-Hungarian Government to exceptional war measures.

11. The expression "nationals of the former Austrian Empire" does not include persons who, within six months of the coming into force of the Treaty, show that they have acquired, *ipso facto* in accordance with its provisions, nationality of an Allied or Associated Power, including those who, under Articles 72 and 76 of the Treaty, obtained such nationality with the consent of the competent authorities, or who, under Articles 74 or 77 thereof, acquired such nationality by virtue of previous rights of citizenship.

12. The Treaty of Peace (Austria) Order, 1920, shall not apply to Egypt, except so far as may be consistent with the provisions of this Order or of any Proclamation issued by the General Officer Commanding-in-Chief the British Forces in Egypt, or with any rules or directions given thereunder.

13. This Order may be cited as the Egypt (Treaty of Peace, Austria) Order in Council, 1920, and shall be read as one with the Egypt Order in Council, 1915.

14. This Order shall be deemed to have had effect as from the date when the Treaty of Peace came into force.

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to approve with effect from the 11th day of June, 1920, the payment of an allowance of 1s. 6d. a day to all Officers below the rank of Lieutenant who have been, or may hereafter be, appointed to Depot Ships for duty with Submarines.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your

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Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

"And whereas we have had under consideration the Regulations governing the entry of Naval Cadets, Special Entry, which provide for the payment by the parents of an allowance at the rate of £50 a year during the period of training as a Cadet, viz., for a period of one and a half years:

"And whereas we are of opinion that it is desirable to remit this allowance in certain cases in order to widen the field of selection to include candidates from the Lower Deck, who are at present excluded by lack of means from entry into the Commissioned Ranks of Your Majesty's Navy:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction, in such necessitous cases as we consider desirable, the payment of this allowance from Naval Funds.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

And whereas under section 2, subsection (1) of the Ministry of Pensions Act, 1916, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that there shall be transferred to the Minister of Pensions the powers and duties of the Admiralty with respect to pensions and grants to persons who have served as officers or men, and to their widows, children, and other dependants, and to persons who have served in the Nursing Service of any of His Majesty's Naval Forces, other than service pensions, so far as such pensions and grants are payable out of moneys provided by Parliament, and not provided exclusively for the purpose of Greenwich Hospital, and that His Majesty may by Order in Council make such adaptations in

the enactments relating to such powers and duties as aforesaid as may be necessary to make them exercisable by the Minister of Pensions and his officers, and may fix the time or times as from which the several powers and duties are to be transferred to him:

And whereas it has been represented to His Majesty by the Minister of Pensions that it is desirable to make further provision in regard to the pensions of commissioned and subordinate officers of His Majesty's Naval, Marine, and Reserve Forces disabled in consequence of former wars, and to the pensions and allowances of widows and children of such officers whose deaths have resulted from former wars, and to the pensions of members of His Majesty's Naval Nursing Service disabled in consequence of former wars:

And whereas the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, having taken the said proposals into consideration, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve thereof and to sanction the following Regulations, that is to say:—

1. The retired pay being paid on the 1st day of April, 1919, under the Regulations for the government of His Majesty's Naval Service, to an officer in respect of a disability due directly and wholly to service in a former war may be increased by the difference between such retired pay and the retired pay which he might receive, according to the degree of his disablement as certified, under the Order in Council of the 29th September, 1917, if he were subject to the provisions of such Order in Council.

2. The pensions and compassionate allowances awarded to the widows and children of officers below the rank of Commander who were killed in action or died within two years as the result of wounds received in action in former wars, or who were drowned or suffered violent death in an immediate act of duty in a former war, or died from the effects of any injury or disease caused by extraordinary exposure or exertion on service in a former war within two years after first being certified to be ill or being so injured, and being paid on the 1st day of April, 1919, may be increased to the rates which might have been awarded under the second and fifth columns of the Second Schedule to the Regulations annexed to the Order in Council of the 29th September, 1917.

3. The pensions being paid on the 1st day of April, 1919, under the Regulations for the government of His Majesty's Naval Service, to any member of His Majesty's Royal Naval Nursing Service in respect of a disability due directly and wholly to service in a former war may be increased by the difference between such pension and the pension which she might receive, according to the degree of her disablement as certified, under the Order in Council of the 29th September, 1917, if she were subject to the provisions of such Order in Council.

4. In these Regulations, unless the context otherwise requires—

(1) "Certified" means certified by a Medical Officer or Board of Medical Officers appointed by the Minister of Pensions for the purpose.

(2) "Order in Council of the 29th September, 1917," refers to the Order in

Council of that date relating to the retired pay of commissioned officers and the families of such deceased officers.

(3) Any reference to the provisions of the Order in Council of the 29th September, 1917, shall include references to such provisions as amended by any other Order in Council, so far as may be applicable.

5. The Minister of Pensions shall be the sole interpreter of these Regulations, and shall give such instructions as he may deem expedient for giving effect thereto.

6. These Regulations shall have effect as from the 1st day of April, 1919, provided that any increase of retired pay, pension, or allowance by virtue of any subsequent Order in Council shall begin from the date when such Order in Council takes effect.

And whereas the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, having taken the said proposals into consideration, is

pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve thereof and to sanction the following Regulations, that is to say:—

1. The pension being paid on the 1st day of April, 1919, under the Regulations for the government of His Majesty's Naval Service, to an officer of warrant rank in respect of a disability due directly and wholly to service in a former war may be increased by the difference between such pension and the pension which he might receive, according to the degree of his disablement as certified, under the Order in Council of the 29th September, 1917, if he were subject to such Order in Council.

2. The pension and compassionate allowances awarded to the widows and children of officers of warrant rank who were killed in action or died within two years as the result of wounds received in action in former wars, or who were drowned or suffered violent death in an immediate act of duty in a former war, or died from the effects of any injury or disease caused by extraordinary exposure or exertion on service in a former war, within two years after first being certified to be ill or being so injured, and being paid on the 1st day of April, 1919, may be increased to the rates which might have been awarded under Articles 11 (1) and 12 (1) of the Order in Council of the 29th September, 1917.

3. In these Regulations, unless the context otherwise requires:—

(1) "Officer of warrant rank" has the meaning assigned to it in the Order in Council of the 29th September, 1917, as far as applicable.

(2) "Certified" means certified by a Medical Officer or Board of Medical Officers appointed by the Minister of Pensions for the purpose.

(3) "Order in Council of the 29th September, 1917," refers to the Order in Council of that date relating to the pensions of officers of warrant rank and the families of such deceased officers.

(4) Any reference to the provisions of the Order in Council of the 29th September, 1917, shall include references to such provisions as amended by any other Order in Council, so far as may be applicable.

4. The Minister of Pensions shall be the sole interpreter of these Regulations, and shall give such instructions as he may deem expedient for giving effect thereto.

5. These Regulations shall have effect as from the 1st day of April, 1919, provided that any increase of pension or allowance by virtue of any subsequent Order in Council shall begin from the date when such Order in Council takes effect.

WHEREAS in accordance with the Local Government Board's Provisional Order Confirmation (No. 14) Act, 1913, (being an Act to confirm a Provisional Order of the Local

Government Board relating to Liverpool and entitled the Liverpool (Extension) Order, 1913), it became the duty of the Council of the City of Liverpool to petition the King to divide the Allerton, Childwall and Little Woolton Ward of the said City into three Wards;

And whereas a majority of the whole Council of the said City of Liverpool, on the fourth day of February, 1920, in pursuance of the provisions of Section 30 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, as amended by Section 2 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1893, agreed to petition and the said Council thereupon petitioned His Majesty that the aforesaid Ward be divided into three Wards (whereby the number of Wards into which the City would be divided would be increased to 39 Wards), and that the existing Councillors for the aforesaid Ward be allocated to the new Wards, one to each Ward:

And whereas His Majesty was pleased, by His Order in Council of the 26th day of April, 1920, to fix the number of Wards into which the City of Liverpool should be henceforth divided, and to order and direct that the number of the said Wards should be thirty-nine:

And whereas on the 15th day of May, 1920, the Right Honourable Edward Shortt, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, did appoint Samuel Pope, Esquire, Barrister-at-Law, a Commissioner to prepare a Scheme for determining the boundaries of such Wards, and for apportioning the Councillors of the said Borough among such Wards:

And whereas by Section 30 (5) of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, it is provided that, in case of alteration of Wards, the Commissioner shall so apportion among the altered Wards the Councillors for those Wards as to provide for their continuing to represent as large a number as possible of their former constituents:

And whereas the said Commissioner has accordingly prepared the following Scheme, dated the 30th day of September, 1920:—

SCHEME FOR THE ALTERATION OF WARD BOUNDARIES FOR THE PURPOSES OF THE SAID LOCAL GOVERNMENT BOARD'S PROVISIONAL ORDER CONFIRMATION (No. 14) ACT, 1913, INCORPORATING THE PROVISIONS OF THE MUNICIPAL CORPORATIONS ACTS, 1882 TO 1910, MADE IN PURSUANCE OF SECTION THIRTY OF THE MUNICIPAL CORPORATIONS ACT, 1882, AND SECTION 2 OF THE MUNICIPAL CORPORATIONS ACT, 1893:

ARTICLE I.—The said Allerton, Childwall and Little Woolton Ward shall be divided into three Wards, which shall be termed respectively the Allerton Ward, the Childwall Ward, and the Little Woolton Ward.

ARTICLE II.—I hereby fix and determine the respective boundaries of the said new Wards to be as follows:—

1. The Allerton Ward shall comprise that part of the area of the City which formed "the Allerton District," as defined in Article 1 (7) of the said Liverpool (Extension) Order, 1913, which said area is indicated by a separate colour and distinguished by the name of the Ward on the map annexed hereto, the boundary of the said Ward being delineated thereon and coloured green.

2. The Little Woolton Ward shall comprise that part of the area of the City which formed "the Little Woolton District," as defined in Article 1 (7) of the said Liverpool

(Extension) Order, 1913, which said area is indicated by a separate colour and distinguished by the name of the Ward on the said Map annexed hereto, the boundary of the said Ward being delineated thereon and coloured yellow.

3. The Childwall Ward shall comprise that part of the area of the City which formed "the Childwall District," as defined in Article 1 (7) of the said Liverpool (Extension) Order, 1913, together with the adjoining portion of the Existing Wavertree Ward referred to in Article VIII (2) of the said Order, the said District and portion of Wavertree Ward aforesaid, as constituting the said new Ward, being indicated by a separate colour and distinguished by the name of the Childwall Ward on the said Map annexed hereto, the boundary of the said new Ward being delineated thereon and coloured blue.

4. The said Map is marked "Map of the Wards of the City of Liverpool as altered 1920," and is signed by me as constituting an integral part of this scheme.

5. Subject and except as hereinbefore provided, the boundaries of the other existing Wards of the said City and the number of Councillors respectively apportioned thereto shall remain unaltered.

ORDER MADE BY THE TREASURY UNDER SECTION 3 OF THE PENSIONS (INCREASE) ACT, 1920.

- (d) the City of London Police Act, 1839, the City of London Police Act, 1874, and the City of London Police (Superannuation) Acts, 1889 and 1894;
- (e) the Special Constables Act, 1914;
- (f) the Police (Naval and Military) Service Acts, 1914 and 1915;

and also to pensioners in receipt of

- (a) pensions granted by the London County Council under any of their powers or duties, or for the payment of which the London County Council are responsible; and
- (b) pensions granted by a local authority in Great Britain under any of the following enactments:—

The Poor Law Officers' Superannuation Act, 1864, and the Acts amending or extending the same.

The Poor Law Officers' Superannuation Act, 1896.

The Asylum Officers' Superannuation Act, 1909.

The Asylums and Certified Institutions (Officers' Pensions) Act, 1918.

TREASURY REGULATIONS UNDER SECTION 4 OF THE PENSIONS (INCREASE) ACT, 1920, RELATING TO PENSIONERS IN RECEIPT OF PENSIONS GRANTED BY LOCAL OR OTHER PUBLIC AUTHORITIES (WITH THE EXCEPTION OF POLICE AUTHORITIES) IN GREAT BRITAIN.

1. The pensioners to whom these rules apply are pensioners who, on the sixteenth day of August, nineteen hundred and twenty, were in receipt of pensions granted by local or other public authorities (with the exception of police authorities) in Great Britain, and to whom the provisions of the Pensions (Increase) Act, 1920 (hereinafter referred to as the Act), have been applied, or may hereafter be applied, by Order under Section 3 thereof, and in whose case the following statutory conditions are fulfilled:—

The pensioner must reside in the British Islands;

The pensioner must have attained the age of sixty years or have retired on account of physical or mental infirmity, or, in the case of a pensioner who is a widow and is in receipt of a pension payable in respect of the services of her deceased husband, must have attained the age of forty years;

The pensioner must satisfy the Pension Authority that his means, including his pension, are less than one hundred and fifty pounds a year, if unmarried, or two hundred pounds a year, if married.

For the purposes of the statutory conditions, a widower or widow with one or more children under sixteen years of age dependent on him or her will be treated as married, and a widower or widow having no such children will be treated as unmarried.

2. An application for an increase of pension under the Act shall be made to the Authority by whom the pension in regard to which the increase is claimed is payable (hereinafter referred to as the Pension Authority).

3. An application in the case of a pensioner who fulfils the statutory conditions at the date of the Order applying the provisions of the Act to him should be made as soon as practicable thereafter. In the case of a pensioner who fulfils the statutory conditions after the making of such an Order, the application should be made not more than three months before or as soon as may be after the statutory conditions are fulfilled.

4. Every application must be accompanied by a declaration in the form set out in the Schedule hereto made before one of the following persons, that is to say, a justice of the peace, a commissioner for oaths, a commissioned officer not below the rank of lieutenant-commander in the Navy or major in the Army, a barrister at law, a minister of religion, a bank manager, or in Scotland a bank agent, a medical practitioner, a collector of customs and excise, an inspector of taxes, the clerk to the Pension Authority.

5. The statement as to amounts in the declaration shall be made with reference to twelve months preceding the date of the declaration, provided that, if the applicant shows to the satisfaction of the Pension Authority that there has been such a change of circumstances that his means in the ensuing year will be materially reduced, the Pension Authority may take such change into consideration.

6. Where, in pursuance of an application, an increase of pension is granted, the increase shall continue in force for twelve months, unless in the meantime the pensioner dies or ceases to fulfil the statutory conditions. The said twelve months may be reckoned from a date not earlier than the date of application, or, in a case where the application is made within three months of the date of the Order applying the provisions of the Act to the applicant, from the 1st April, 1920, or the date on which the statutory conditions are fulfilled, if later.

7. Applications for the continuance and reassessment of increases of pensions, accompanied by a like declaration, shall be sent to the Pension Authority not more than three nor less than two months before the expiration of the first and every subsequent period of twelve months.

8. The means of a pensioner shall for the purposes of the Act include:—

(a) the pension in respect of which the increase is claimed;

(b) any other pension, grant, allowance or annuity (including Old Age Pension) received by the pensioner;

(c) the annual value of any land or house property, subject to the deduction of ground rent, mortgage or loan interest, or other annual charge;

(d) interest or dividends on stocks or shares or on mortgages or other securities or on bank deposits;

(e) profits or wages of any trade, business, profession, office, employment or vocation, including overtime pay and war bonus, if any; and

(f) the annual value of any other benefit or privilege whatsoever enjoyed by the pensioner.

9. For the purposes of the Act, a pensioner shall be deemed to reside in the British Islands if his permanent place of abode is in the British Islands, and if he continues to dwell therein during the time the increase is payable, provided that a pensioner shall not be disqualified from receiving the increase by reason only that he or she is only temporarily absent from the British Islands for a period not exceeding three months in any one year, or for such further period as the Pension Authority may determine that he or she has been prevented from returning by causes beyond his or her control.

10. The pensioner shall, if and when required by the Pension Authority, produce any birth, death, or marriage certificate or such other documentary evidence relative to the fulfilment of the statutory conditions as the Authority may consider necessary.

11. Where the Pension Authority is satisfied by the certificate of a justice of the peace, or minister of religion and of a duly qualified medical practitioner, that a pensioner is of unsound mind or otherwise incapable of making a declaration in the prescribed form, it may accept a declaration made on behalf of the pensioner by any person who appears to the Authority a proper person to represent the pensioner.

12. Any question which may arise in connection with the fulfilment by the pensioner of the statutory conditions or any of them shall be determined by the Minister of Health or in the case of a pensioner in receipt of a pension granted by a Pension Authority in Scotland by the Secretary for Scotland, whose decision shall be final.

DECLARATION BY A PENSIONER IN RECEIPT OF A PENSION GRANTED BY A LOCAL OR OTHER PUBLIC AUTHORITY (NOT BEING A POLICE AUTHORITY) CLAIMING AN INCREASE OF PENSION UNDER THE PENSIONS (INCREASE) ACT, 1920.

Any person who knowingly makes a false statement or false representation for the purpose of obtaining or continuing an increase of pension, or for the purpose of obtaining or continuing such increase at a higher rate than that appropriate to the case, either for himself or herself or for any other person, is liable on summary conviction to imprisonment for a term not exceeding six months and, in the case of a pensioner, to forfeit any pension or increase of pension payable to him or her.

TREASURY REGULATIONS UNDER SECTION 4 OF THE PENSIONS (INCREASE) ACT, 1920, RELATING TO CERTAIN POLICE PENSIONERS.

1. The pensioners to whom these rules apply are pensioners who on the sixteenth day of August, nineteen hundred and twenty, were in receipt of pensions granted

under the Metropolitan Police Acts, 1829 to 1909;

under the Police Acts, 1839 to 1910;

under the Police (Scotland) Act, 1890, and the Police (Scotland) Act (1890) Amendment Act, 1910;

under the City of London Police Act, 1839, the City of London Police Act, 1874, and the

City of London Police (Superannuation) Acts, 1889 and 1894;

under the Special Constables Act, 1914;

under the Police (Naval and Military Service) Acts, 1914 and 1915;

and in whose case the following statutory conditions are fulfilled :—

The pensioner must reside in the British Islands;

The pensioner must have attained the age of sixty years or have retired on account of physical or mental infirmity, or, in the case of a pensioner who is a widow and is in receipt of a pension payable in respect of the services of her

deceased husband, must have attained the age of forty years;

The pensioner must satisfy the Pension Authority that his means, including his pension, are less than one hundred and fifty pounds a year, if unmarried, or two hundred pounds a year, if married.

For the purposes of the statutory conditions, a widower or widow with one or more children under sixteen years of age dependent on him or her will be treated as married, and a widower or widow having no such children will be treated as unmarried.

2. An application for an increase of pension under the Pensions (Increase) Act, 1920 (hereinafter referred to as the Act), shall be made to the Authority through whom the existing pension is payable (hereinafter referred to as the Pension Authority).

3. An application in the case of a pensioner who fulfils the statutory conditions at the date of the making of these rules should be made as soon as practicable. In the case of a pensioner who fulfils the statutory conditions at a later date, the application may be made not more than three months before that date.

4. Every application must be in the form set out in the Schedule hereto, and the declaration on the form must be made before and witnessed by one of the following persons, that is to say—

A Justice of the Peace.

A Commissioner for Oaths.

A Commissioned Officer (not below the rank of Lieutenant-Commander in the Navy or Major in the Army).

A Barrister at Law.

A Minister of Religion.

A Bank Manager (or in Scotland a Bank Agent).

A Medical Practitioner.

A Collector of Customs and Excise.

An Inspector of Taxes.

A Police Officer not below the rank of Inspector.

5. The statement in the declaration as to the means of the applicant shall be made in respect of the twelve months preceding the date of the declaration, and the amount of any increase of pension to be granted under the Act shall be determined with reference thereto. Provided that if the applicant shows to the satisfaction of the Pension Authority that there has been such a change of circumstances that his means in the ensuing year will be materially reduced, the Pension Authority may take such change into consideration.

6. An application for the continuance or re-assessment of an increase of pension shall be made on 1st March in each year, or within one week before or after that date, in the prescribed form, and must be accompanied by a statement of the means of the pensioner during the preceding twelve months.

7. Subject to the provisions of the Act, the first grant of any increase of pension shall be payable as from the date when the statutory conditions were fulfilled, and any subsequent grant shall be payable as from 1st April; and

the grant shall continue until 31st March next following, unless in the meantime the pensioner dies or ceases to fulfil the statutory conditions.

8. The means of a pensioner shall for the purposes of the Act include:—

(a) the pension in respect of which the increase is claimed;

(b) any other pension, grant, allowance or annuity (including Old Age Pension) received by the pensioner;

(c) the annual value of any land or house property, subject to the deduction of ground rent, mortgage or loan interest, or other annual charge;

(d) interest or dividends on stocks or shares or on mortgages or other securities or on bank deposits;

(e) profits or wages of any trade, business, profession, office, employment or vocation, including overtime pay and war bonus, if any; and

(f) the annual value of any other benefit or privilege whatsoever enjoyed by the pensioner.

9. For the purposes of the Act, a pensioner shall be deemed to reside in the British Islands, if his permanent place of abode is in the British Islands and if he continues to dwell therein during the time the increase is payable, provided that a pensioner shall not be disqualified from receiving the increase by reason only that he or she is only temporarily absent from the British Islands for a period not exceeding three months in any one year, or for such further period as the Pension Authority may determine that he or she has been prevented from returning by causes beyond his or her control.

10. The pensioner shall, if and when required by the Pension Authority, produce any birth, death or marriage certificate or such other documentary evidence relative to the fulfilment of the statutory conditions as the Authority may consider necessary.

11. Where the Pension Authority is satisfied by the certificate of a justice of the peace or a minister of religion, and of a duly qualified medical practitioner, that a pensioner is of unsound mind or otherwise incapable of making a declaration in the prescribed form, it may accept a declaration made on behalf of the pensioner by any person who appears to the Authority a proper person to represent the pensioner.

12. Subject to the provisions of the Act, any increase of pension shall be paid in the same manner and on the same conditions as the existing pension; and where the payment of an existing pension is apportioned between two or more police authorities the payment of any increase shall be similarly apportioned.

13. Any question which may arise in connection with the fulfilment by the pensioner of the statutory conditions or any of them shall be determined by the Secretary of State, or the Secretary for Scotland, as the case may be, whose decision shall be final.

COMMUNICATION BETWEEN CREDITORS AND DEBTORS OF BRITISH AND AUSTRIAN NATIONALS.

TREATY OF PEACE (AUSTRIA) ORDER, 1920.

The Administrator of Austrian Property, pursuant to Section I (ii) of the Treaty of Peace (Austria) Order, 1920, hereby licenses direct communication between British creditors and Austrian debtors with regard to the adjustment of accounts or settlement of pre-war debts, or debts arising out of pre-war transactions or contracts, due by Austrian nationals to British nationals. The draft of the agreement embodying the terms of the proposed settlement must be submitted in duplicate to the Administrator for his approval, and such approval in writing obtained before any such agreement can be entered into.

Apart from the penalties incurred by the breach of this licence, no agreement for the settlement of such debts or claims will be valid or binding on the parties in the absence of such written approval.

The Administrator also hereby licenses communication in writing between British debtors and Austrian creditors with regard to pre-war debts or debts arising out of pre-war transactions or contracts, with the sole object of ascertaining particulars of indebtedness between the parties, provided that no proposal or suggestion is made for the payment or settlement of such debts except through the Clearing Offices, and that the party so communicating shall retain true copies of such communications.

Any direct communication outside the scope of this licence is an offence punishable by fine and/or imprisonment.

As a result of discussions which took place in London between the Board of Trade and the Austrian Minister of Finance, the attached memorandum was communicated to the Austrian Government by His Majesty's Representative at Vienna, on the 27th August.

In reply, a note dated the 2nd October has been received by His Majesty's Representative from the Austrian Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, of which a translation is given below.

"By a note dated August 27th, 1920, His Britannic Majesty's Government made known the conditions subject to which Section 3 and the annex thereto of Part X of the Treaty of St. Germain between the United Kingdom and the British Colonies and Protectorates, with the exception of Egypt on the one hand, and the Austrian Republic on the other, would be applied."

"The Government of the Austrian Republic would accept those conditions with an expression of thanks, and declares it will take the necessary steps to ensure their observance and execution by the Austrian Republic and its citizens in so far as the United Kingdom and India and New Zealand, which have notified their adhesion within the time appointed, are concerned. The Austrian Government, however, takes this opportunity of expressing the hope that still further facilities will be granted to it and to its citizens as regards the settlement of private pre-war debts."

His Britannic Majesty's Government having given notice that they adopt Section 3 and the annex thereto of Part X of the Treaty of St. Germain as between Austria on the one hand and the United Kingdom and the British Colonies and Protectorates, with the exception of Egypt, on the other hand, and being desirous of affording all opportunity to the Austrian Government for the full execution of their obligations thereunder, are prepared to agree that the said Section and annex shall be subject in their application to the provisions set out below.

H.M. Government expect that the Austrian Government will agree to accept notice of the adoption of the said Section and annex as between Austria and any of the British Dominions or India if given at any time within a period of one month from the present date.

(1) Notwithstanding the provisions of Article 248 (a) of the Treaty of St. Germain, direct communication may be permitted with the consent of the two Clearing Offices between the interested parties with regard to the settle-

ment of debts due by Austrian nationals to British nationals. Such settlements may be permitted with the sanction of the Clearing Offices in each case.

The British Clearing Office will be prepared to consider applications made before 31st March, 1921, for the release of property, rights and interests chargeable under paragraph 4 of the annex to Article 249 of the Treaty with a view to the settlement of debts by amicable arrangement, provided that the proportion of the assets so to be released to the amount of the debts removed by the arrangement from the operation of the Clearing Offices is not such as, in the opinion of the British Clearing Office, will have the effect of reducing the dividend payable from Austrian property subject to the charge to British creditors generally.

(2) The proceeds of liquidation of Austrian property, rights and interests and cash assets of Austrians, within the territories of the British Empire in respect of which notice has been given of the adoption of the Clearing Office system, will be credited to the Austrian Government in the account referred to in paragraph 11 of the annex to Article 248.

Similarly, the proceeds of liquidation of British property, rights and interests, and cash assets of British nationals, for which the Austrian Government is liable to account in accordance with the provisions of Section IV of Part X of the Treaty of St. Germain, shall be credited to the British Government in this account. Compensation awarded by the Mixed Arbitral Tribunal under paragraph (e) of Article 249 shall also be credited in the same account.

(3) H.M. Government expect that the Austrian Government will use its best endeavours to collect the debts due through the Clearing Offices from its nationals to British nationals as promptly as possible. This requirement applies, in the case of debts originally payable in kronen, only to the original amount in kronen of such debts with interest thereon at the rate provided by Section III of Part X of the Treaty.

His Britannic Majesty's Government will not require payment of the balances referred to in paragraph 1 of the annex to Article 248 within the periods therein prescribed. In return the Austrian Clearing Office shall pay to the British Clearing Office not later than the 31st March and the 30th September in each year beginning with the year 1921 the sterling value of the amounts collected from Austrian nationals during the previous six months, the sum to be paid in each half-year being not less than 250,000 pounds sterling or the sterling equivalent of 140,000,000 kronen, whichever of the two is the greater. Each of the first eight minimum payments to be made may, however, be reduced to the extent of 100,000 pounds or the sterling equivalent of 56 million kronen by the amounts previously paid in cash, direct by Austrian debtors to British creditors in accordance with arrangements sanctioned by the Clearing Offices, and provided out of funds which are not chargeable under the Treaty.

Such payments shall continue until the balance against Austria in the account above referred to, with simple interest at 5 per cent., shall have been fully met.

The payment to be made by 31st March, 1921, shall include the sterling value at the current rate of exchange of the proceeds of

liquidation and cash assets of British nationals referred to in Article 249 (h) (1) of the Treaty of Peace.

(4) H.M. Government propose that the detailed arrangements for the restitution of British property in Austria should form the subject of a further agreement to be arrived at at the earliest possible date.

(5) Subject to the right of the British authorities to refuse permission in any particular case and to the Laws for the time being in force, Austrian nationals will be permitted upon request notified to the appropriate British authority to bid at any sale by auction of their property in the United Kingdom.

(6) It is to be understood that none of the above provisions affect the liability of the Austrian Government under the Treaty of Peace in respect of the currency and rate of exchange at which monies shall be credited through the Clearing Offices.

UNEMPLOYMENT INSURANCE ACT, 1920.

THE UNEMPLOYMENT INSURANCE (ASSOCIATIONS) REGULATIONS,* 1920.

*These Regulations, although statutory, are provisional only. Permanent Regulations will be made later.

The Minister of Labour, by virtue of the powers conferred on him by the Unemployment Insurance Act, 1920, hereby makes the following Regulations:—

Application for an Arrangement under Section 17.

1. Every application by an association of employed persons for an arrangement under Section 17 of the Unemployment Insurance Act, 1920 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act"), shall be made in the form set forth in the Schedule to these Regulations or in such other form as the Minister of Labour (hereinafter referred to as "the Minister") may direct, and shall be accompanied by a copy of the rules of the association.

Power to Cancel Arrangements.

2. The Minister may at any time, by notice in writing to that effect, cancel as from the date of the notice, or any later date specified in the notice, any arrangement made with an association under Section 17 of the Act, if in his opinion the association ceases to comply with any of the conditions contained in the arrangement, or in these Regulations, without prejudice, however, to any right of the association to receive, under sub-Sections (1) and (6) of that Section, such sums as may be properly payable to the association in respect of any period prior to the termination of the arrangement.

An arrangement made by the Minister of Labour under Section 105 of the National Insurance Act, 1911, shall, if the Minister and the association so agree, and subject to such modifications as may be required to meet the requirements of the Act and of these Regulations be continued in force on and after the 8th November, 1920, but not after the 31st

December, 1920, and so long as it is so continued, shall be deemed to be an arrangement under Section 17 of the Act.

Required Conditions of an Arrangement.

3. It shall be a condition of every arrangement made with an association under Section 17 of the Act that:—

(i) The arrangement shall apply only in respect of those members of the association who are of a class entitled under the Rules of the association to receive when unemployed payments representing a provision for unemployment at least equal to the provision mentioned in Section 17 (1) (a) of the Act as the minimum provision enabling the Minister to make an arrangement under the Act.

(ii) The association shall have in each locality where members are employed such a system of ascertaining the wages and conditions prevailing in every employment within the meaning of the Act in which its members are engaged and of obtaining from employers notification of vacancies for employment and giving notice thereof to its members when unemployed as is in the opinion of the Minister reasonably effective for securing that unemployed persons competent to undertake the particular class of work required shall, with all practicable speed, be brought into communication with employers having vacancies to fill.

(iii) The association shall furnish the Minister with such information as he may require with regard to the working of the arrangement, including the administrative expenses incurred in connection therewith and so far as may be required by the Minister for the purpose of enabling him to determine the sums which are properly payable to the association under Section 17 of the Act shall allow the Minister to inspect any books of account, vouchers and other documents relating to the payments by or to the association in connection with unemployment benefit.

Notices between Minister and Association.

4. (1) As soon as may be after any members of the association have lodged their unemployment books in accordance with the regulations made by the Minister of Labour in that behalf at a local office with a view to claiming from the association payment in respect of unemployment the Minister shall send to the association a notice stating the names of those members and the number of days (if any), and the rate of unemployed benefit (if any), which in the opinion of the Minister each of those members would have been entitled to receive if he had claimed direct, and, if in the case of any such member the Minister is not satisfied that he would have been entitled to receive any unemployment benefit under the Act if he had applied for it the notice shall contain a statement to that effect.

Provided that the Minister shall not be bound to send notice under this Regulation to the association more often than once in any one week.

(2) The association shall from time to time at such intervals as may be provided by the arrangement made with the association, send to the Minister a notice containing a statement

showing in respect of every member of the association in respect of whom it is proposed to claim payment under Section 17 of the Act, the days on which he has proved that he was unemployed in accordance with the terms of the arrangement.

Every such statement shall be made up in such a manner as to show separately the days of unemployment proved by each member in each week of the period covered by the statement.

(3) In the case of an association with branches the notice required under paragraph (1) of this Regulation to be sent to the association shall, if the association so require, be sent to a specified branch of the association and the notice required by paragraph (2) of this Regulation to be sent by the association may as respects the members belonging to any branch of the association be sent by that branch instead of by the association.

Provision as to Payments to Associations

5.—(1) Payments by the Minister under Section 17 of the Act to an association with which an arrangement has been made shall be made at such intervals as may be specified in the arrangement or agreed upon between the Minister of Labour and the association.

(2) If it is found that the amount of any such payment is in excess of the amount which ought properly to have been paid, the Minister may (without prejudice to any other remedy) deduct the amount of the excess from any payments to which the association may be subsequently entitled.

(3) In determining for the purposes of Section 17 of the Act the aggregate amount which an employed person would have received during any period by way of unemployment benefit under the Act had he applied for it direct, no account shall be taken of—

(a) any period during which the employed person's book was not lodged at a local office, unless the lodging of the book was dispensed with in accordance with any Regulations made by the Minister of Labour in that behalf;

(b) any period in respect of which the employed person has not furnished evidence that he was unemployed either by signing a register in accordance with the arrangement, or in such other manner as may be specified in the arrangement; or

(c) any other period during which the employed person would not have been entitled to receive unemployment benefit if he had applied for it.

Contributions towards Administrative Expenses.

6. In any case in which the Minister is of opinion that an association has failed wholly or partly to carry out the terms of the arrangement or has carried them out negligently or inefficiently, the Minister may decline to make any payment by way of contribution to the administrative expenses of the association, or may make such reduction as he thinks fit in the payment so to be made, without prejudice to the right of the Minister to discontinue the arrangement.

Reference to Umpire of Questions arising under an Arrangement under Section 17.

7. If any question arises between the Minister and an association as to the amount of

any payment which ought to be, or which has been made to the association under sub-Section (1) of Section 17 of the Act, the question shall, if either the Minister or the association so require, be referred for determination to the Umpire, whose decision shall be final.

Provided that if the question relates to the amount which an employed person, being a member of the association, would have received by way of unemployment benefit if no arrangement had been made with the association under Section 17 of the Act, the question shall be determined by reference to an insurance officer, a court of referees, and the Umpire, as the case may require, in like manner as if the employed person had made a claim to unemployment benefit, and the provisions of the Act, and the Regulations made thereunder relating to the determination of claims to unemployment benefit shall apply accordingly, subject to the following modifications:—

(a) All rights conferred on the employed person by the aforesaid provisions shall be vested in the association, and may be exercised only by or on behalf of the association.

(b) The Minister or the association may in all cases require the recommendations of the Court of Referees to be referred to the Umpire for determination.

Commencement and Short Title.

8. These Regulations shall come into operation on the 8th day of November, 1920, and may be cited as the Unemployment Insurance (Associations) Regulations, 1920.

ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 13TH OCTOBER 1920.)

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

1. The provisions of the Sheep Scab Order of 1920 shall not apply to the owner, occu-

pier or person in charge of the premises described in the Schedule hereto, or to the said premises, or to any sheep thereon, whilst this Order remains in force.

2. The exemption contained in the preceding Article shall be subject to the following conditions:—

(a) No sheep other than those to be used for the experiments shall be kept in the Shed Field described in the Schedule hereto;

(b) No sheep shall be grazed or kept in any field, enclosure, shed or other place immediately adjoining the Shed Field; and

(c) No sheep shall be moved out of the Shed Field except by licence granted by an Inspector of the Ministry, and then only for the purpose of being moved in a float direct to a slaughterhouse, where it shall be detained until slaughtered.

(d) No dung, fodder, litter or other thing that has been in contact with sheep in the Shed Field shall be moved from or out of the Shed Field without a licence of an Inspector of the Ministry, and no such licence shall be granted unless the dung, fodder, litter or other thing has been disinfected to the satisfaction of the Inspector.

3. This Order shall remain in force from the date hereof until the Minister is satisfied that the premises are no longer required to be used in connection with experiments in the dipping of sheep, and notifies the occupier of the premises to that effect.
