Although subjected to enemy rifle and machine-gun fire at close range, he gallantly carried out the task allotted to him. Throughout the operation Major Grimshaw set a fine example to his men.

Capt. Geoffrey Percival Troughton-Dean, 24th Punjabis, I.A. (Dated 26th August, 1920.)

For gallantry and skilful leadership near Ismid, on the 15th June, 1920. It was entirely due to his boldness and coolness under heavy fire at short range that his company succeeded in reaching Ismid.
