**PRESENT,**

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

**W**HEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 7th day of October, 1920 (N. 16368/20), in the words following, viz.:—

“Whereas it is provided by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being, or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions, and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

“And whereas we have had under consideration the titles, rates of pay and conditions of service of the Artisan classes of Your Majesty's Navy, and are of opinion that for greater efficiency certain changes should be made therein:

“And whereas we are also of opinion that the pay of certain Artificer ratings on entry should be improved:

“We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by your Order in Council, to sanction the proposals contained in the accompanying Schedules, to take effect as from 1st October, 1918, power being reserved to us to vary the rates of pay within the scales laid down, or to associate payment with such conditions as may be deemed necessary:

“The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals.

3. Artisans, 4th Class, to be advanced to Artisan, 3rd Class, after 3 years' service above Artisan, 5th Class, including the acting time allowed to reckon; to Artisan, 2nd Class, after 6 years of such service; and to be eligible for advancement to Chief Artisan after 12 years of such service.

## II.—CONDITIONS OF SERVICE.

2. Shipwrights, 5th Class, whether entered direct or rated from Boy Shipwright, to be advanced to Acting Shipwright, 4th Class, after not more than one year's service as Shipwright, 5th Class.

3. Shipwrights, 4th Class, to be advanced to Shipwrights, 3rd Class, after 3 years' service above Shipwright, 5th Class, including the period of Acting time allowed to reckon; to Shipwright, 2nd Class, after 7 years of such

service; and to Shipwright, 1st Class, after 12 years of such service.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by section 26 of the Pluralities Act, 1838, after reciting that "Whereas in some instances Tithings, Hamlets, Chapelries, and other Places or Districts may be separated from the Parishes or Mother Churches to which they belong, with great advantage, and Places altogether Extra-Parochial may, in some instances, with advantage be annexed to Parishes or Districts to which they are contiguous, or be constituted Separate Parishes for ecclesiastical purposes," it is, amongst other things, enacted, "That when with respect to his own Diocese it shall appear to the Archbishop of the Province, or when the Bishop of any Diocese shall represent to the said Archbishop, that any such Tithing, Hamlet, Chapelry, Place or District within the Diocese of such Archbishop, or the Diocese of such Bishop, as the case may be, may be advantageously separated from any Parish or Mother Church, and either be constituted a Separate Benefice by itself or be united to any other Parish to which it may be more conveniently annexed, or to any other adjoining Tithing, Hamlet, Chapelry, Place, or District, Parochial or Extra-Parochial, so as to form a Separate Parish or Benefice, or that any Extra-Parochial Place may with advantage be annexed to any Parish to which it is contiguous, or be constituted a Separate Parish for ecclesiastical purposes; and the said Archbishop, or Bishop, shall draw up a scheme in writing (the scheme of such Bishop to be transmitted to the said Archbishop for his consideration) describing the mode in which it appears to him that the alteration may best be effected,"

and how the changes consequent on such alteration in respect to Ecclesiastical Jurisdiction, Glebe Lands, Tithes, Rent Charges, and other Ecclesiastical Dues, Rates and Payments, and in respect to Patronage and rights to pews, may be made with justice to all parties interested; and if the Patron or Patrons of the Benefice or Benefices to be affected by such alteration shall consent in writing under his or their hands to such scheme, or to such modification thereof, as the said Archbishop may approve, and the said Archbishop shall, on full consideration and inquiry, be satisfied with any such scheme, or modification thereof, and shall certify the same and such consent as aforesaid, by his report to His Majesty in Council, it shall be lawful for His Majesty in Council to make an Order for carrying such scheme, or modification thereof, as the case may be, into effect":

And whereas the Right Reverend Frank Theodore, Lord Bishop of Peterborough, hath made a representation in writing, dated the 28th day of June, 1920, to the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Randall Thomas, Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, as follows:—

"I, Frank Theodore, Lord Bishop of Peterborough, in pursuance of the 26th Section of the Pluralities Act, 1838, do hereby represent to your Grace as follows:—

"There is in the County of Rutland and my Diocese of Peterborough the Vicarage or Benefice of Oakham with the Chapelries or Hamlets of Egleton, Brooke, and Gunthorpe belonging thereto.

"That the population according to the last Census is as follows:

Oakham	...	...	3,668
Egleton	...	...	120
Brooke	...	...	80
Gunthorpe	..	..	40

"That there is a Church at Oakham and also a Church in each of the said Chapelries or Hamlets of Eggleton and Brooke.

"That there is accommodation in the Parish Church of Oakham for 800 persons and in the Church at Eggleton for 100 persons, and in the Church at Brooke for 70 persons.

"That the net annual value of the said Benefice of Oakham with the Chapelries or Hamlets aforesaid is £300.

"That the Patron of the said Benefice of Oakham with the Chapelries or Hamlets aforesaid is Wilfred H. M. Finch, of Turvey Abbey, in the County of Bedford, Esquire.

"That there is also in the said County of Rutland and my said Diocese of Peterborough the Vicarage or Benefice of Braunston, the Parish whereof contains a population of 379 persons or thereabouts with accommodation in the Parish Church for 150 persons.

"That the net annual value of the said Benefice of Braunston is £240.

"That the Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of Lincoln are the Patrons of the said Benefice of Braunston.

"That the Chapelry or Hamlet of Brooke is distant about 2½ miles from the Parish Church of Oakham and one mile from the Parish Church of Braunston.

"That it appears to me, and I do hereby represent to your Grace that under the provisions of the said Pluralities Act, 1838, the said Chapelry or Hamlet of Brooke, the boundaries of which are well known and defined, may be advantageously separated from the said Parish of Oakham and annexed to the said Parish of Braunston.

"That pursuant to the directions contained in the 26th Section of the Pluralities Act, 1838, I the said Lord Bishop have drawn up a scheme in writing annexed to this Representation describing the mode in which it appears to me that the alterations above proposed may best be effected and how the changes consequent on such alteration in respect to Ecclesiastical Jurisdiction, Glebe Lands, Tithes, Rent Charges and other Ecclesiastical Dues, Rates and Payments, and in respect to Patronage and rights to pews may be made with justice to all parties interested, and I do hereby submit the same to your Grace together with the consents in writing of the Patrons and Incum-

bents of the said Benefices of Oakham and Braunston respectively to the intent that, if your Grace shall on full consideration and inquiry be satisfied with such Scheme you may certify the same and such consents as aforesaid to His Majesty in Council":

And whereas the said Scheme drawn up by the said Bishop and the Consents referred to in the said Representation are as follows:—

"Scheme.

"It is proposed to separate the Chapelry or Hamlet of Brooke for all Ecclesiastical purposes from the Ecclesiastical Parish of Oakham and to annex the said Chapelry or Hamlet to the Ecclesiastical Parish of Braunston.

"That the Incumbent of Braunston shall have sole and exclusive Cure of Souls within such Chapelry or Hamlet so proposed to be separated from Oakham and annexed to Braunston as aforesaid.

"That the Inhabitants residing within the said Hamlet or Chapelry of Brooke shall be entitled to accommodation in the Parish Church of Braunston, but shall cease to be entitled to any right or accommodation in the Parish Church of Oakham except nevertheless any person or persons (if any) possessing a legal right by Faculty or otherwise to any pew or sitting in the said Parish Church of Oakham who may not be willing to relinquish and give up the same.

"That the Inhabitants of the aforesaid Chapelry or Hamlet of Brooke shall have such and the same right to have Marriages, Baptisms, Churchings, and Burials solemnized and performed in the Parish Church of Braunston as they might have had in the Parish Church of Oakham.

"That all fees and Ecclesiastical Offerings arising from or within the said Chapelry or Hamlet of Brooke and the tithe rent charge belonging to the said Vicarage of Oakham, and issuing out of lands in the Parish of Brooke particularly described in the Schedule hereto shall henceforth belong to the Incumbent of Braunston.

"That no alteration shall be made in the Patronage of the said Benefices or either of them.

" That the Patronage of the said Vicarage of St. Oswald, Durham, is vested in the Dean and Chapter of Durham.

" That the Reverend Charles Richard Jubilee Loxley is the present Vicar thereof.

" That there is also in the County and our Diocese of Durham the Vicarage of St. Cuthbert, Durham, the Parish whereof is adjoining to the Parish of St. Margaret, Durham, aforesaid and contains according to the last census a population of 4,792 people.

" That the net annual value of the benefice of St. Cuthbert, Durham, is £397.

" That the Patronage of the said Vicarage of St. Cuthbert, Durham, is vested in the Dean and Chapter of Durham.

" That the Reverend Richard Edward Tolliday is the present Vicar thereof.

" That there is also in the County and our Diocese of Durham the Vicarage of Bearpark the Parish whereof is adjoining to the Parish of St. Margaret, Durham, aforesaid and contains according to the last census a population of 4,000 people.

" That the net annual value of the Benefice of Bearpark is £317.

" That the Patronage of the said Vicarage of Bearpark is vested in the Dean and Chapter of Durham.

" That the Reverend John Kendall Hawke is the present Vicar thereof.

" That there is also in the County and our Diocese of Durham the Vicarage of Esh the Parish whereof is adjoining to the Parish of Bearpark aforesaid and contains according to the last census a population of 5,500 people.

" That the net annual value of the Benefice of Esh is £393.

" That the Patronage of the said Vicarage of Esh is vested in the Right Reverend The Lord Bishop of Manchester in right of his See.

" That the Reverend William Wilkinson Dibb Firth is the present Vicar thereof.

" That the Patrons and Incumbents are consenting parties to the separation and annexation hereinafter proposed and the matters and things in the Scheme hereto annexed stated and proposed.

" That it appears to us the said Lord Bishop that the portion of the said Parish of St. Margaret, Durham, adjoining the said Parish of St. Cuthbert, Durham, which is shown on the plan annexed hereto and coloured pink thereon containing a population of 50 people or thereabouts may under the provisions of the Acts of Parliament passed in the first and second years of the Reign of her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 106, and the second and third years of the same Reign, Chapter 89, be separated from the said Parish of St. Margaret, Durham, and be annexed for Ecclesiastical purposes to the said Parish of St.

Cuthbert, Durham; that the portion of the Parish of St. Oswald, Durham, which is shown on the said plan and is coloured purple thereon and containing a population of 125 people or thereabouts may under the same provisions be separated from the said Parish of St. Oswald, Durham, and be annexed for Ecclesiastical purposes to the said Parish of St. Margaret, Durham, which it immediately adjoins; that the portion of the Parish of Bearpark which is shown on the said plan and is coloured green thereon and containing a population of 30 people or thereabouts may under the same provisions be separated from the said Parish of Bearpark and be annexed for Ecclesiastical purposes to the said Parish of St. Margaret, Durham, which it immediately adjoins; and that the portion of the Parish of Bearpark which is shown on the said plan and is coloured brown thereon and containing a population of 50 people or thereabouts may under the same provisions be separated from the said Parish of Bearpark and be annexed for Ecclesiastical purposes to the said Parish of Esh which it immediately adjoins.

" That it is proposed if this scheme be carried into effect it shall not affect the present state of the Patronage of the said five Benefices of St. Margaret, Durham, St. Oswald, Durham, St. Cuthbert, Durham, Bearpark and Esh.

" That pursuant to the direction contained in the 26th Section of the said first mentioned Act of Parliament we the said Lord Bishop have drawn up a scheme in writing appended to this Representation describing the mode in which it appears to us that the alterations above proposed may be best effected and how the changes consequent upon such alterations may be made with justice to all parties interested, and we the said Lord Bishop submit the same to Your Grace to the intent that Your Grace may, if on full inquiry you shall be satisfied with the said scheme, certify the same and such consents to His Majesty in Council: "

And whereas the said Scheme drawn up by the said Bishop and the Consents referred to in the said Representation are as follows:—

#### " SCHEME.

" It is proposed to separate that portion of the Parish of St. Margaret, Durham, shewn on the annexed plan and coloured pink, immediately adjoining the Parish of St. Cuthbert, Durham, from that Parish and to annex the same for Ecclesiastical purposes to the Parish of St. Cuthbert, Durham; to separate that portion of the Parish of St. Oswald, Durham, shewn on the annexed plan and coloured purple, immediately adjoining the said Parish of St. Margaret, Durham, from that Parish and to annex the same for Ecclesiastical purposes to the said Parish of St. Margaret, Durham; to separate that portion of the Parish of Bearpark, shewn on the annexed plan and coloured green, immediately adjoining the said Parish of St. Margaret, Durham, from that Parish and to annex the same for Ecclesiastical purposes to the said Parish of St. Margaret, Durham; and to separate that portion of the said Parish of Bearpark, shewn on the annexed plan and coloured brown, immediately adjoining the Parish of Esh from that Parish and to annex the same for Ecclesiastical purposes to the said Parish of Esh.

"That the Rector of St. Margaret, Durham, and the Vicars of St. Oswald, Durham, and Bearpark shall cease to have Cure of Souls respectively in the said portions so separated and annexed respectively, and the Rector of St. Margaret, Durham, and the Vicars of St. Cuthbert, Durham, and Esh, respectively, shall have exclusive Cure of Souls within the limits of the same respectively.

"That the inhabitants of the said portions so separated and annexed as aforesaid shall have the same rights as to Pews and the performance of all offices and Services of the Church at the respective Parish Churches of St. Margaret, Durham, St. Cuthbert, Durham, and Esh, and otherwise in relation to the same Churches and the Parishes thereto respectively belonging as the other inhabitants of the Parishes of St. Margaret, Durham, St. Cuthbert, Durham, and Esh, aforesaid respectively.

"That the fees for all such offices and services performed for the inhabitants of the said portions of the Parishes of St. Margaret, Durham, St. Oswald, Durham, and Bearpark, so separated and annexed as aforesaid respectively or arising within the limits of the same and usually payable to the Incumbent of a Benefice shall belong to the Incumbents of the Benefices of St. Margaret, Durham, St. Cuthbert, Durham, and Esh, respectively.

"That no alteration shall be made in the Patronage of any of the said five Benefices affected by this Scheme, or in respect of the Tithe Rent Charges or any other endowments of either of the Benefices affected by this Scheme.

"That it appears to the said Lord Bishop that that portion of the said Parish of Saint Margaret, Durham, adjoining the said Parish of Saint Cuthbert, Durham, which is shown on the plan annexed hereto and coloured pink thereon, containing a population of fifty persons or thereabouts, may under the provisions of the Acts of Parliament passed in the first and second years of the Reign of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 106, and the second and third years of the same Reign, Chapter 89, be separated from the said Parish of Saint Margaret, Durham, and be annexed for Ecclesiastical purposes to the said Parish of Saint Cuthbert, Durham.

"That that portion of the Parish of Saint Oswald, Durham, which is shown on the said plan and is coloured purple thereon, and containing a population of one hundred and twenty-five persons or thereabouts, may under the same provisions be separated from the said Parish of Saint Oswald, Durham, and be annexed for Ecclesiastical purposes to the said Parish of Saint Margaret, Durham, which it immediately adjoins.

"That the portion of the Parish of Bearpark, which is shown on the said plan and is coloured green thereon, and containing a population of thirty persons or thereabouts, may under the same provisions be separated from the said Parish of Bearpark and be annexed for Ecclesiastical purposes to the said Parish of Saint Margaret, Durham, which it immediately adjoins, and that the portion of the Parish of Bearpark, which is shown on the said plan and is coloured brown thereon, and containing a population of fifty persons or thereabouts, may under the same provisions be separated from the said Parish of Bearpark and be annexed for Ecclesiastical purposes to the said Parish of Esh which it immediately adjoins.

"That the said Lord Bishop hath drawn up a Scheme in writing appended to this Representation describing the mode in which it appeared to him that the alterations above proposed may be best effected, and how the changes consequent on such alterations may be

made with justice to all parties interested, which Scheme together with the consents thereto in writing of the Patrons and Incumbents of the Benefices to be affected have been transmitted to us by the said Lord Bishop for our consideration.

"The Representation and Scheme of the said Lord Bishop and the Consents before referred to are hereunto annexed.

"And We the Archbishop being on full consideration and inquiry satisfied with the said Scheme do hereby pursuant to the said Act of the first and second years of the Reign of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 106, certify the same and such Consents as aforesaid to Your Majesty in Council, to the intent that Your Majesty in Council may in case Your Majesty in Council shall think fit so to do make and issue an Order for carrying such Scheme into effect.

**W**HEREAS the Minister of Health, after giving to the Incumbent and the Churchwardens of the Parish of Llanllwchaiarn, in the County of Cardigan; the Incumbent and the Churchwardens of the Parish of Llanidloes, in the County of Montgomery; and the Incumbent and the Churchwardens of the Parish of Watford, Rugby; 10 days' previous Notice of his intention in that behalf, has, under the provisions of the Burial Act, 1853, as amended by subsequent enactments, made Representations to His Majesty in Council that, for the protection of the public health, the opening of any new Burial Ground in the Civil Parish of Llanllwchaiarn, in the said County of Cardigan; the Civil Parish of Llanidloes, in the said County of Montgomery; and the Civil Parish of Watford, in the County of Northampton, save with the previous approval of the Minister of Health, should be prohibited, and that Burials should be discontinued therein, as follows, viz.:—

**LLANLLWCHAIARN.**—Forthwith and entirely in the Llanllwchaiarn Parish Church, and in the Churchyard attached thereto in the said Parish. Provided that—

(a) In any walled grave now existing in the said Churchyard, burial may be allowed of the body of any member of the family of the person or persons heretofore buried in such grave subject to the condition that every coffin buried in such grave be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.

(b) In the said Churchyard, in any grave space in which no interment has heretofore taken place, the burial may be allowed of the body of any person for whom or of any member of a family for which such grave space has been reserved and appropriated as a burial place, with the exclusive right of burial therein, subject to the condition that no part of the coffin containing the body shall be at a depth less than three feet below the

level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave.

**LLANIDLOES.**—Forthwith and entirely in the Parish Church of Llanidloes and in the Churchyard attached thereto. Provided that—

(a) In any walled grave now existing in the said Churchyard, burial may be allowed subject to the condition that every coffin buried in such grave be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.

(b) In any earthen grave now existing in the said Churchyard, the burial may be allowed of the body of any member of the family of the person or persons heretofore buried in such grave, subject to the condition that no part of the coffin containing the body shall be at a depth less than three feet below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave.

(c) In the said Churchyard, in any grave space in which no interment has heretofore taken place, the burial may be allowed of the body of any person for whom or of any member of a family for which such grave space has been reserved and appropriated as a burial place, with the exclusive right of burial therein, subject to the condition that no part of the coffin containing the body shall be at a depth less than three feet below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave.

**WATFORD.**—Forthwith and entirely in the Parish Church of Watford, Rugby, and in the Churchyard attached thereto. Provided that—

(a) In the vault beneath the Church belonging at the present time to Baron Henley a further burial may be allowed subject to the condition that the person who buries the body in the vault shall within a period of twenty-four hours after the deposit in the vault of the coffin containing the body, cause the coffin to be wholly and permanently embedded in and covered with a layer or layers of good cement concrete, not less in any part than six inches in thickness.

(b) In the earthen graves now existing in the said Churchyard in which the remains of the undermentioned persons are interred a further burial may be allowed in each grave, subject to the condition that no part of the coffin containing the body shall be at a depth less than three feet below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave:—

The following Statute made by the University of Cambridge, on the 20th day of October, 1920, has been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of its having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions of the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877.

STATUTE to alter and amend the Statutes in relation to the University of Cambridge made under the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877, 44 Vic., ch. 21, which amending Statute is now submitted for the approval of His Majesty the King in Council.


We, the Chancellor, Masters and Scholars of the University of Cambridge, in pursuance of the power given to us by the 53rd section of the said Act, do hereby alter and amend the Statute made under the said Act in relation to our said University in manner following:—

*Statute A, Chapter III.*

By repealing the first paragraph of Section 3, intituled "Right of Voting," and substituting therefor the following Section to form an amended first paragraph of Section 3:—

*Right of Voting.*

3. The following persons shall have the right of voting in the Senate, namely, the Chancellor, the Vice-Chancellor, Doctors of Divinity, Law, Medicine, Science and Letters, Doctors of Music who before being admitted to their first degree have kept by residence at least nine terms, Doctors of Philosophy at the end of seven years from the beginning of their first term of residence, provided that not less than two years have elapsed since their creation, Bachelors of Divinity and Masters of Arts, Law, Surgery and Music.

**OVERSEAS TRADE (CREDITS AND INSURANCE) ACT, 1920.  
(10 & 11 Geo. 5, ch. 29.)**

Whereas by section 1 of the above-mentioned Act the Board of Trade were empowered to grant credits to persons domiciled in, or to Companies incorporated by or under the laws of, the United Kingdom in connection with the export to any country specified in the Schedule to the said Act of goods wholly or partly produced or manufactured in the United Kingdom, subject to the limitations and provisions contained in the said section, and to undertake the business of the insurance of any such goods as aforesaid as therein mentioned:

And whereas by section 3 of the said Act the Board of Trade were further empowered to add to the said Schedule the name of any Country the industrial and financial condition of which has been disorganised by the War:

Now, therefore, in pursuance of the powers in them vested by the above-recited provision and of every other power thereunto them enabling the Board of Trade do hereby order that the Country of Bulgaria be added to the Schedule to the said Act.

**THE UNEMPLOYMENT INSURANCE (EXEMPT PERSONS) REGULATIONS\*, 1920.**

The Minister of Labour, in virtue of the powers conferred on him by the provisions of Section 3 of the Unemployment Insurance Act, 1920, hereby makes the following regulations:—

*Application for Certificate.*

1.—(1) Any employed person who can prove that he is either—

(a) in receipt of any pension or income of the annual value of twenty-six pounds or upwards, which does not depend on his personal exertions; or

(b) ordinarily and mainly dependent for his livelihood upon some other person; or

(c) ordinarily and mainly dependent for his livelihood on the earnings derived by him from an occupation, employment in which does not make him an employed person within the meaning of the Act,

may apply to the Minister for an Unemployment Insurance Exemption Certificate exempt-

ing him from liability to be insured under the Act, and every application for such a certificate shall be made on the appropriate form prescribed in the first Schedule hereto or in such other form as the Minister may deem expedient and shall be forwarded to the Minister in such manner as he may from time to time direct.

(2) Every person making application for an Unemployment Insurance Exemption Certificate or for the renewal of such a certificate shall—

(a) state fully and correctly all particulars required to be given in the form of application; and

(b) make a full disclosure of all facts on which he relies to show that he is entitled to exemption; and

(c) furnish such further evidence in relation to his application as the Minister may in any particular case require.

*Form of Certificate.*

*Unemployment (Exempt Persons) Book.*

2.—(1) An Unemployment Insurance Exemption Certificate shall be in the form prescribed in the second Schedule hereto or in such other form as the Minister may deem expedient, and any employed person who shows that he is the holder of an Unemployment Insurance Exemption Certificate, or of a certificate of exemption granted upon the same grounds as those mentioned in Regulation 1 of these Regulations under the provisions of the National Insurance Act, 1911, shall be entitled to an Unemployment (Exempt Persons) Book, in place of an Unemployment Book, and so long only as the holder of a certificate of exemption granted under the National Insurance Act, 1911, is the rightful holder of an Unemployment (Exempt Persons) Book that certificate shall have effect as an Unemployment Insurance Exemption Certificate.

(2) An Unemployment (Exempt Persons) Book shall be in such form as the Minister may from time to time direct, and any regulations for the time being in force with regard to the issue, custody and stamping of Unemployment Books shall, so far as they are not inconsistent, apply to the issue, custody and stamping of Unemployment (Exempt Persons) Books.

*Expiration, Avoidance and Renewal of Certificate.*

3.—(1) An Unemployment Insurance Exemption Certificate shall remain in force for such period not exceeding five years from the date of its being granted or renewed as may be specified in the certificate:—

Provided that:—

(a) if while the certificate is in force the circumstances of the exempt person alter in such a way as to disentitle him to exemption the certificate shall thereupon become void; and

(b) if at any time the exempt person gives notice to the Minister that he desires that the certificate of exemption granted to him shall be cancelled the certificate shall be cancelled accordingly and shall thereupon become void as from such date as the Minister may determine.

(2) An Unemployment Insurance Exemption Certificate which has expired or become void shall be surrendered forthwith by the



holder thereof to the Minister together with a statement in such form as the Minister may direct of the circumstances in which the certificate is surrendered, and any employed person surrendering an expired or void Unemployment Insurance Exemption Certificate or Certificate of Exemption granted under the provisions of the National Health Insurance Act, 1911, shall at the same time surrender to an Employment Exchange or other local office of the Unemployment Fund the Unemployment (Exempt Persons) Book held by him and shall be entitled to receive instead thereof an Unemployment Book.

(3) Where an exempt person desires to obtain a renewal of his Unemployment Insurance Exemption Certificate he may, if he can prove that he will after the expiration of that certificate continue to be qualified under the first paragraph of Regulation 1 of these Regulations, make application to the Minister before the expiration of his certificate for the renewal thereof in such a manner as the Minister may direct.

*Re-insurance of Exempt Persons.*

4. Where an employed person who has been an exempt person subsequently become a person liable to be insured under the Act every two contributions paid in respect of him during the period when he was the rightful holder of an Unemployment (Exempt Persons) Book shall, when he has exchanged his Unemployment (Exempt Persons) Book for an Unemployment Book in accordance with the foregoing Regula-

tion, be treated as if they had been one full contribution paid in respect of him as the holder of an Unemployment Book.

Provided that no person shall be entitled to receive any unemployment benefit in respect of contributions paid in respect of him while he was the holder of an Unemployment (Exempt Persons) Book until twelve contributions, or during the period of twelve months next after the eighth day of November, 1920, four contributions have been paid in respect of him as the holder of an Unemployment Book exclusive of any contributions paid in respect of him before he ceased to be an exempt person.

*Interpretation.*

5. In these regulations the expression "Minister" means the Minister of Labour, and the expression "the Act" means the Unemployment Insurance Act, 1920.

*Short Title.*

6. These regulations may be cited as the Unemployment Insurance (Exempt Persons) Regulations, 1920, and shall come into operation on the 8th day of November, 1920.

## TRADE BOARDS ACTS, 1909 AND 1918.

STAMPED OR PRESSED METAL WARES  
TRADE BOARD (GREAT BRITAIN).PROPOSAL TO VARY AND TO FIX MINIMUM RATES  
OF WAGES FOR MALE AND FEMALE WORKERS.

In accordance with the Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour, and dated 31st October, 1918, the Trade Board established in Great Britain under the Trade Boards Act, 1918, for the Stamped or Pressed Metal Wares Trade as specified in the Trade Boards (Stamped or Pressed Metal Wares) Order, 1919, hereby give notice, as required by Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918 (the Minister of Labour having given his consent to the issue of such Notice), that they Propose to Vary the General Minimum Time-Rates, Piece-work Basis Time-Rates, and Overtime Rates for Female Workers at present fixed and set out in their Notice dated 9th September, 1920, in respect of certain classes of Female Workers, so that in lieu of such Minimum Rates the General Minimum Time-Rates, Piece-work Basis Time-Rates and Overtime Rates for the classes of Female Workers specified in Parts I and II of this Notice shall be as set out below. The Trade Board further give notice that they Propose to Fix Piece-work Basis Time-Rates for Male Workers and to Vary the Overtime Rates for Male Workers as set out in their Notice dated 9th September, 1920, the proposed Piece-work Basis Time-Rates and proposed variation of Overtime Rates for Male Workers being as shown in Parts III and IV of this Notice.

## PART I.

*Proposed Variation of General Minimum  
Time-Rates for Certain Classes of Female  
Workers.*

SECTION I.—For Female Workers who are employed as Polishers or as Drop Stampers:—

(a) Workers of 18 years of age and over:—

During first 12 months of employment after the age of 18, from 9d. to 11d. per hour.

After completion of 12 months of employment after the age of 18, from 9d. to 1s. per hour.

Provided that, in the case of Female Workers entering the trade for the first time at or over the age of 18 years, as Polishers or as Drop Stampers, the General Minimum Time-Rate applicable during the first two months of employment shall be 10d. per hour.

(b) Workers of 17 and under 18 years of age, from 7½d. to 9½d. per hour.

Workers of 16 and under 17 years of age, from 6½d. to 8½d. per hour.

Workers of 15½ and under 16 years of age, from 5½d. to 7½d. per hour.

Workers of 15 and under 15½ years of age, from 5d. to 7½d. per hour.

Workers under 15 years of age, from 4d. to 6d. per hour.

SECTION II.—For Female Workers who are employed as Hand-brush-Japanners and are capable of finishing all classes of work, Hand-brush-lacquerers, Blow-pipe-braziers or solderers using ordinary hand-iron or blow-pipe with bar solder:—

(a) Workers of 18 years of age and over:—

During first 12 months of employment after the age of 18, from 9d. to 10d. per hour.

After completion of 12 months of employment after the age of 18, from 9d. to 11d. per hour.

Provided that, in the case of Female Workers entering the trade for the first time at or over the age of 18 years, the General Minimum Time-Rate applicable during the first two months of employment shall be 9d. per hour.

(b) Workers of 17 and under 18 years of age, from 7½d. to 8½d. per hour.

Workers of 16 and under 17 years of age, from 6½d. to 7½d. per hour.

Workers of 15½ and under 16 years of age, from 5½d. to 6½d. per hour.

Workers of 15 and under 15½ years of age, from 5d. to 6½d. per hour.

Workers under 15 years of age, from 4d. to 5d. per hour.

## PART II.

*Proposed Variation of Piece-work Basis Time-  
Rates for Certain Classes of Female  
Workers (All Ages).*

(a) For Female Workers who are employed

as Polishers or as Drop Stampers, 1s. 1d. per hour.

(b) For Female Workers who are employed as Hand-brush-Japanners and are capable of finishing all classes of work, Hand-brush-lacquers, Blow-pipe-braziers or solderers using ordinary hand-iron or blow-pipe with bar solder, 1s. per hour.

In the case of all Female Workers employed on Piece-work, each Piece-rate paid shall be such as would yield, in the circumstances of the case, to an Ordinary worker, not less than the equivalent of the appropriate Piece-work Basis Time-rate.

### PART III.

#### *Proposed Piece-work Basis Time-Rates for Male Workers (all Ages).*

The Piece-work Basis Time-Rate for each of the classes of Male Workers specified in Part I of the Trade Board's Notice dated 18th September, 1920, proposing to vary General Minimum Time-Rates and Overtime Rates for certain classes of Male Workers, shall be 10 per cent. above the appropriate General Minimum Time-Rates proposed therein.

The Piece-work Basis Time-Rate for each class of Male Workers other than those specified above shall be 10 per cent. above the General Minimum Time-Rate applicable to such class as fixed by the Trade Board and set out in Section (i) of Part I of the Schedule to the Trade Board's Notice dated 9th September, 1920, fixing Minimum Rates.

In the case of all Male Workers employed on Piece-work, each Piece-Rate paid shall be such as would yield, in the circumstances of the case, to an ordinary worker, not less than the equivalent of the appropriate Piece-work Basis Time-Rate.

### PART IV.

#### *Proposed Variation of Overtime Rates.*

Overtime Rates calculated on the Proposed Minimum Rates specified in Parts I, II and III of this Notice, in the manner set out in Part III of the Notice issued by the Trade Board, dated 9th September, 1920, shall apply in substitution for the proposed Minimum Rates otherwise applicable, as set out in Parts I, II and III of this Notice, in respect of all hours worked in excess of the number of hours declared by the Trade Board in the above-mentioned Notice, dated 9th September, 1920, to be the normal number of hours of work in the Trade.

### PART V.

The above proposed Minimum Rates of Wages shall apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts and of this Notice, to all workers in Great Britain in respect of all time during which they are employed in any branch of the trade specified in the Trade Boards (Stamped or Pressed Metal Wares) Order, 1919, that is to say:—

The manufacture from metals (other than precious metals) by the processes of cold stamping or cold pressing (including cutting or piercing) of cabinet fittings, window fittings, curtain accessories, stationers' sundries, drapers' sundries, fittings for gas or electric light, fittings for suit-cases or handbags or purses, buckles, eyelets, ferrules, labels, collar studs, tie-clips, thimbles, photograph frames, stamped chains, bells, fancy nails (excluding

the shanks), parts of safety razors (excluding the blades), parts of braces or suspenders, corset steels or busks, whistles, tin-openers, medals or any similar articles or metal parts of such articles;

*Including:*

(a) the operations of annealing, hardening, barrelling, polishing, bronzing, nickelling, lacquering, japanning, non-vitreous enamelling, tinning, or assembling where these operations are carried on in association with or in conjunction with the manufacture of such stamped or pressed metal articles;

(b) the operations of carding, boxing, packeting, labelling, weighing, packing, warehousing or despatching, where these operations are incidental to or appertaining to the manufacture of such stamped or pressed metal articles;

*But excluding:*

(a) the operations specified in the Trade Boards (Hollow-ware) Order, 1913;

(b) the making of buttons or any operations incidental thereto;

(c) the making of coffin furniture or any operations incidental thereto;

(d) the making of pins, hairpins, hooks and eyes, hair-curlers, snap fasteners or safety pins or any operations incidental thereto;

(e) the making of steel pens and the making of stationers' metal sundries or other similar metal articles when carried on as a subsidiary branch of work in association with or in conjunction with the making of steel pens, so as to provide a common or interchangeable form of employment for the workers,

(f) the minting of coinage of the realm;

(g) the process of hand-embossing.

### PART VI.

SECTION I.—The above proposed Minimum Rates of Wages shall be paid clear of all deductions, other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by subsequent enactments, or deductions authorised by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any Superannuation or other Provident Fund.

SECTION II.—The above proposed Minimum Rates of Wages are without prejudice to workers who are earning higher rates of wages, or to agreements made or that may be made between employers and workers for the payment of wages in excess of these minimum rates of wages.

The Trade Board will consider any Objections to the above Proposals which may be lodged with them within two months from the 23rd October, 1920. Such Objections should be in writing, and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her full name and address), and should be sent to The Secretary, Stamped or Pressed Metal Wares Trade Board (Great Britain), 5, Chancery Lane, London, W.C. 2. It is desirable that the Objections should state precisely, and so far as possible with reasons, what is objected to.

MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES (AS VARIED AND FIXED) FOR CERTAIN CLASSES OF MALE AND FEMALE WORKERS.

Effective as from 25th October, 1920.\*

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour, and dated 31st October, 1918, the Trade Board established under the Trade Boards Act, 1918, for the Jute Trade in Great Britain, as specified in the Trade Boards (Jute) Order, 1919, having given due notice on 12th June, 1920, of Proposal as therein shown, to vary the General Minimum Time-Rates fixed by the Trade Board for Female Workers and set out in the Schedule to their Notice dated 3rd June, 1920, and to fix Overtime Rates for Male and Female Workers employed on Time-work, HEREBY GIVE NOTICE, as required by Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, that THEY HAVE VARIED the General Minimum Time Rates in their application to Certain Classes of Female Workers, and HAVE FIXED Overtime Rates for Male and Female Workers employed on Time-work, the Overtime Rates as fixed to apply in substitution for the General Minimum Time Rates otherwise applicable in respect of hours worked in excess of the number of hours declared by the Trade Board to be the normal number of hours of work in the trade, and that the Minimum Rates of Wages as varied and fixed are as shown in the Schedule set out below.

And the Trade Board FURTHER GIVE NOTICE that they have received notification from the Minister of Labour that he has made an Order dated 21st October, 1920, under Section 4 (2) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, confirming the Minimum Rates of Wages as varied and fixed by the Trade Board, and specifying 25th October, 1920,\* as the date from which such Minimum Rates of Wages shall become effective.

\* Should this date not correspond with the beginning of the period for which wages are paid by an employer who pays wages at intervals not exceeding seven days, the rates shall become effective as from the beginning of the next full pay period, but in any case not later than 31st October, 1920.

Customary Public and Statutory Holidays the Overtime Rate shall be Twice the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, i.e., Double Time.

(c) The Overtime Rates shall be payable where on any day (not being a Sunday or Customary Public or Statutory Holiday), the number of hours worked exceeds 8½, or in the case of Saturday exceeds 4½, notwithstanding that the number of hours worked in the week does not exceed 48.

Provided that the above Overtime Rates shall not apply to those classes of workers in the Municipal Burgh of Brechin, the Parish of Brechin, the Municipal Burgh of Forfar, the Parish of Forfar, the Burgh of Kirriemuir, the Parish of Kirriemuir, the Burgh of Blairgowrie, the Burgh of Carnoustie or the Parish of Logie Pert, who in accordance with the established practice of the establishment attend:

(a) For nine hours per day on five days of the week and for three hours on Saturday, or

(b) Only on five days a week.

NOTE.—The hours which Female workers, young persons and children are allowed to work

are subject to the provisions of the Factory and Workshop Acts.

### PART III.

The above Minimum Rates of Wages shall apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, to all Male and Female Workers specified in this Notice in respect of all time during which they are employed in Great Britain in any branch of the Trade specified in the Trade Boards (Jute) Order, 1919, that is to say:—

The preparing, spinning or weaving (a) of jute or (b) of jute and any other fibre, except flax or hemp,

*Including:*

(1) The preparing and spinning of waste reclaimed at any stage, and

(2) All packing, despatching, warehousing, storing, or other operations incidental to or appertaining to any of the above-mentioned work.

*But excluding:*

(1) The calendering, bleaching, dyeing or finishing of any of the above-mentioned materials, and

(2) The preparing or spinning of materials required for the making or remaking of (a) rope (including driving rope and banding), (b) cord (including blind and window cord, but excluding silk, worsted and other fancy cords), (c) core for wire ropes, (d) lines, (e) twine (including binder and trawl twine), (f) lanyards, (g) net and similar articles, when such preparing or spinning is carried on in the same factory or workshop as the said making or remaking; and

(3) The making or repair of sacks or bags; and also

(4) The weaving of carpets, rugs or mats.

### PART IV.

SECTION I.—The above Minimum Rates of Wages shall be paid clear of all deductions other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments or deductions authorised by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any superannuation or other provident fund.

SECTION II.—The above Minimum Rates of Wages are without prejudice to workers who are earning higher rates of wages.

### UNEMPLOYMENT INSURANCE ACT, 1920.

#### PROPOSED DECISION BY THE MINISTER.

Pursuant to paragraph (2) of the Unemployment Insurance (Determination of Questions) (Provisional) Regulations, the Minister of Labour hereby gives notice of his intention to give a decision on or after the 10th day of November, 1920, on a question that has arisen in an application made to him for his decision under Section 10 of the Unemployment Insurance Act, 1920—namely, whether the employment of a person as a chauffeur in private employment is or will be such employment as to make the person an employed person within the meaning of the Act.

Any person or body claiming to be in-

terested may, before the date specified, make, or cause to be made, representations in writing to the Minister with reference to this question or may apply to the Minister to be heard orally.

The Minister may himself require the attendance of any person appearing to him to be interested to give oral information on the subject of the above question.

(i) checking, testing, grading, weighing, measuring;

(ii) cleaning goods;

(iii) barrelling, bundling, bagging, boxing, basketing, parcelling, packeting, packing, unpacking;

(iv) labelling, ticketing;

(v) collecting, despatching, delivering,

(vi) horse or motor-keeping, care of vehicles;

(vii) warehousing, storing, cold-storing, stock-keeping;

(viii) portering, loading, unloading, lift or hoist operating, time-keeping;

(ix) heating, cleaning premises, cleaning, adjusting or sharpening implements, cleaning receptacles or utensils;

(x) stacking, window or show-case dressing;

(xi) bunching, mossing, wiring, potting, shelling, trimming, watering;

(xii) clerical work, commercial travelling or canvassing;

*But excluding*—

(a) the sale of hop-flowers;

(b) the sale of goods for export and operations incidental thereto, except when carried on in conjunction with the sale of goods for distribution within the United Kingdom;

(c) operations of cleaning or maintenance of premises and operations performed at docks, wharves, warehouses or elsewhere, when such operations are performed by workers not directly employed by employers engaged in the business specified in paragraphs 1 or 2 above;

(d) operations performed on board ships by workers who form part of the crew;

(e) operations performed by workers employed by wholesale merchants or brokers who do not employ warehouse workers or carters;

(f) the transport of goods by common carriers;

(g) operations performed by workers engaged in any industry or trade concerned

exclusively with carting and operations incidental thereto;

(h) Post Office business;

(i) operations in agriculture within the meaning of the Corn Production Act, 1917;

(j) sales and operations included in the Trade Boards (Milk Distributive) Order, 1920.

## TRADE.

The Fish, Poultry, Game and Rabbits Distributive Trade, that is to say:—

(1) The wholesale or retail sale for human consumption off the premises of fish, poultry, game or rabbits in or in connection with any establishment or business or branch or department in which such sale is the main or principal business of that establishment or business or branch or department.

(2) The sale of any goods or the cooking, preparing or serving for sale of food or drink for consumption on or off the premises when performed in or in connection with and by workers principally engaged in an establishment or business or branch or department of the kind specified in paragraph (1) above.

*Including*:—the following or similar operations when incidental to or carried on in conjunction with the operations specified in paragraph (1) or (2) above:—

(i) Checking, grading, sorting.

(ii) Weighing, boiling, cutting, gutting, cleaning, cleansing, dressing, freshing, shelling, opening, filleting, spitting, curing, smoking, plucking, trussing, skinning, boning.

(iii) Labelling, ticketing, barrelling, bundling, packing, unpacking, parcelling, bagging, boxing, basketing.

(iv) Collecting, delivering, despatching, portering, loading, unloading, lift or hoist operating, time-keeping, cleaning or heating premises.

(v) Storing, stock-keeping, warehousing, cold storing, refrigerating.

(vi) Cleaning, adjusting or sharpening implements, cleaning utensils or receptacles, window or show-case dressing.

(vii) Horse or motor keeping, care of vehicles.

(viii) Clerical work, buying, commercial travelling or canvassing.

*But excluding*:—

(a) the sale or the cooking or preparing or serving for sale of fried fish when carried on as a main or principal business and sales of any goods and any operations when carried on in connection with, and by workers principally engaged in, such business.

(b) The sale of tinned fish when carried on as a distinct business, or as subsidiary to a business not of the kind specified in (1) or (2) above; and sales of any goods and any operations when carried on in connection with, and by workers principally engaged in, such business.

(c) Operations performed by workers employed in an establishment or business or branch or department principally engaged in the curing or smoking of fish.

(d) The sale of goods for export and operations incidental thereto, except when carried on in association with the sale of goods for consumption within the United Kingdom.

(e) Operations performed by workers employed by wholesale merchants or brokers who do not employ warehouse workers or carters.

(f) Operations performed by workers employed in boats or ships or in operations incidental to fishing.

(g) Operations of cleaning or mainten-

ance of premises and operations performed at docks, wharves, or warehouses or elsewhere when such operations are performed by workers not directly employed by employers engaged in a business of the kind specified in (1) or (2) above.

(h) Operations performed by common carriers or by workers in any industry or trade concerned exclusively with carting and operations incidental thereto.

(i) Operations performed by workers in or in connection with any establishment or business or branch or department principally engaged in the production of fish at hatcheries or fish farms or the rearing of poultry or game or rabbits.

And whereas by the Ministry of Health Act, 1919, the powers and duties of the Local Government Board were transferred to the Minister of Health;

And whereas the Board of Trade have, in pursuance of the said Regulation numbered 2JJ made the Coal and Fuel (Emergency) Order, 1920:

Now therefore, in pursuance of his powers in that behalf, and by arrangement with the Board of Trade, the Minister of Health hereby Orders as follows:—

1. In these Regulations, unless the contrary intention appears:—

(a) The expression "Local Authority" means, as the case may be, the Mayor, Aldermen, and Commons of the City of London in Common Council assembled, the Council of a Metropolitan Borough, the Council of a Municipal Borough or other Urban District, the Council of a Rural District, or the Council of the Isles of Scilly;

(b) The expression "District" means the District subject to the jurisdiction of the Local Authority for the purposes of the Public Health (London) Act, 1891, or of the Public Health Act, 1875, as the case may be.

2. The Minister of Health hereby confers and imposes upon the Local Authority and upon such of their officers as they may designate or appoint for the purpose the powers and duties necessary to provide for the due discharge within their District, or any part thereof, in conformity with the Defence of the Realm Regulations, of the functions assigned to Local Authorities by the Coal and Fuel (Emergency) Order, 1920.

3. (1) Any expenses incurred by a Local Authority in the execution of this Order shall be defrayed in like manner as if the expenses had been incurred in the execution of the Public Health Act, 1875, or of the Public Health (London) Act, 1891, as the case may be.

(2) Where any Local Authorities have combined for any of the purposes of this Order, any expenses incurred by those Local Authorities thereunder shall be defrayed in such proportions as may be agreed upon, or in default of agreement as may be determined by the Minister of Health.

4. This Order may be cited as "The Local Authorities (Coal and Fuel Emergency) Order, 1920."
