HEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 5th day of November, 1920 (C.W. 18,993/20), in the words following, viz.:—
"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and

Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, inter alia, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions, and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas Your Majesty was graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council bearing date the 22nd day of January, 1920, to approve, inter alia, of Chief Officers of Your Majesty's Coast Guard Service (Old Scheme) being eligible for retired pay on the following scale with effect from the 1st April, 1919:—

Maximum. Minimum. £200

Addition. £10 for each year's service in charge of a W./T. or \mathbf{War} Signal Station. and £6 for each year's service in charge Stations than above.
