

ERRATUM.

THE TRADE BOARDS (FRUIT, FLOWER AND VEGETABLE DISTRIBUTIVE) ORDER, 1920.

Special Order, dated October 21st, 1920, made by the Minister of Labour under Section One of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, applying the Trade Boards Acts, 1909 (9 Edw. 7, c. 22)

and 1918 (8 and 9 Geo. 5, c. 32), to the Fruit, Flower and Vegetable Distributive Trade.

In the Appendix to the above-mentioned Special Order gazetted in the London Gazette of 26th October, 1920, the words "paragraph 1 or 2 above" in exclusion (c), lines 6 and 7, should read "paragraphs 1, 2 or 3 above."

CORSET TRADE BOARD.

MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES (AS VARIED) FOR FEMALE AND MALE WORKERS.

Effective as from 29th November, 1920.*

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour, and dated 31st October, 1918, the Trade Board established under the Trade Boards Act, 1918, for the Corset Trade as specified in the Trade Boards (Corset) Order, 1919, having given due notice on 21st July, 1920, of Proposal to Vary the General Minimum Time-Rates, Piece-work Basis Time-Rates and Overtime Rates for Female and Male Workers, HEREBY GIVE NOTICE, as required by Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, that THEY HAVE VARIÉD the General Minimum Time-Rates, Piece-work Basis Time-Rates and Overtime Rates for Female and Male Workers and that the Minimum Rates of Wages as varied are as shown in the Schedule set out below, which is incorporated herewith.

And the Trade Board FURTHER GIVE NOTICE that they have received notification from the Minister of Labour that he has made an Order dated 18th November, 1920, under Section 4 (2) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, confirming the minimum rates of wages as varied by the Trade Board and specifying 29th November, 1920,* as the date from which such minimum rates of wages shall become effective.

* Should this date not correspond with the beginning of the period for which wages are paid by an employer who pays wages at intervals not exceeding seven days, the rates shall become effective as from the beginning of the next full pay period, but in any case not later than 5th December, 1920.
