For Apprehendia WILLIAM BERKENHEAD

7 Hereas William Berkenhead, being a middle-fized Man, with a little Face, of brown Complex on, about Fifty Years of Age, and bath gone by the Names of Fish, East, West, South and Baker, and was formerly a Custom-House Officer, was beretofore Committed to His Majesty's Prism of Newgate for High-Treason, as being Guilty of the late Harid Conspiracy, and did on Saturday the Nice and twentieth of this Instant August, make his Picape out of the said Prison: We therefore, with the Moite of His Majesty's Privy Council, have thought fit to Issue this Proclamation, Commanding all His Majeffy's Subjects, to Discover, Take and Apprehend the faid William Berkenhead where-ever he may be joud, and to carry him to the next Justice of the Peace? ar Chief Magistrate, who is hereby Required to Commit him to the next Gaol, there to Remain till he shall be illivered by due Course of Law. And We do hereby Require such Justice of the Peace or Chief Magistrate, in give notice thereof to His Majesty's Privay Council, in one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State. and We do kereby Publish and Declare, That whosotver shall Conceal the faid William Berkenhead, foal be Preceded against with the unnost Severity according to Law. And whoseever shall Discovered apprehend the said William Berkenhead, and bring him before such Justice of the Peace or Chief Magistrate, shall receive for Reward the Sum of One thousand Description. thusand Pounds; which field Sum of One thousand Founds the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treafuy are hereby Directed to Pay.

Given at the Council Chamber in Whitehall, the One and thirtieth Day of August, 1696. In the Eighth Year of His Majetty's Reign.

Genoua, Aug. 12. Several Barks are lately arrived here from the Coast of Provence; all the News they bring is, That the French Gallies, 25 in number, are gone from Marseilles towards the Coast of Catalonia.

Ligione, Aug. 13. The Goffpright, Capt. Apilly Commander, failed hence this morning, but 100n after came to an Anchor again. Three French Merchant Ships are arrived here from Smirna, whence they came in Company of feveral others without Convoy, but off Males they met two French Faigats, who convoyed them to Porce Faring near-Timis; where these 3 Ships parted from the rest, bound to Marfalle:, about 8 days ago.

Venice, August 17. The last Letters from the Ceptain-General gave an account. That he continued with the Venetian Pieet at Porto Porto, oxpecting the great Convey from hence, in der the Command of Signior Duodo, upon whose arrival he would put to Sea, and take his Course towards the Arch pelago, to endeavour to meet with the Enemies Fleet; and in case they avoid an Engagement, to make an Attempt upon some of the Islands in the Archipelage. They write from Noples, That the Viceroy of that Kingdom has remitted 160 thousand Crowns to the Governor of Milan, for the Service of the War.

Barcelona, August 11. Our new Viceroy, Don Francisco de Velasco, arrived the last week in the Spanish Camp near Oftalrick; from whence a Detachment of 2000 Foot and 500 Horse was fent the 6th instant under the Command of Don Juan de Acuna, towards the Plana de Vique, to attack some of the Enemies Troops that were marched that way, but the french re-tired before our Forces could come up with them. The Spanish Army continue within their Intrenchments near Ofalrick; but the French are marched nearer to Gironne.

Malaga, Ang. 12. The Mary Rese, Capt. Rogers, arrived here the 27th past in 23 days from Messina; as also two Flushing Privateers, one of them of 40 Guns and 200 Men, who brought in with him two Prizes, one bound to Barbary with 6000 Pieces of Fight, and the other a Satea from Conflantinople, with Silk, Cotton, and other rich Commodities. The same day two Moorish Brigantines landed about 80 Men at the Town of Vilez, but a Party of Spanish Horse and Foot marching down immediately, beat them off, killing feveral, and taking 4 Prisoners. Yesterday arrived here the *Panther* of 36 Guns and 90 Men from Cacia. The Moors continue the Siege of Coura, but if the Success of the Algerines (who have already defeated part of th Emperor of Morreco's Forces) continues, 'tis not to be doubted but they

will quickly raife the Siege.

Cadia, August 12. The Flora for New Spain, which went out the 23th of the last month, was put back by contrary Winds; but on the 28th they fet fail again with 6 Spanish Men of War, who are to convoy them as far as the Canary Islands. The 30th failed hence the Adventure with four English and two Dutch Merchant-ships for Lislon; and the 31th the Canterbury to cruife. The 3d instant arrived 3 Dutch Privateers with a French Prize which they took in the Levant, having on board 6000 Pieces of Eight, the faid Vessel being bound to Earbary to lade Corn; they also took a Satea laden with rich Merchandizes. which they put on Board the other Prize, and fold the Satea in the Streights.
