The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS it is provided by subsection (1) of section two of the Mining Industry Act, 1920, that there shall as from such date or dates as His Majesty in Council may determine, be transferred to the Board of Trade all the powers of a Secretary of State under enactments relating to mines and quarries:

And whereas it is further provided by the subsection (4) of the said section that His Majesty in Council may by Order make such consequential and supplemental provisions as appear necessary or expedient for the purpose of giving full effect to any transfer of powers or duties by or under the said Act, including provision for the transfer and vesting of any property, rights, and liabilities held, enjoyed, or incurred by any Government Department in connection with any powers or duties transferred:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, in pursuance of the said Act and of all other powers enabling Him in that behalf, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. The date as from which the powers of a Secretary of State under enactments relating

to mines and quarries are by virtue of subsection (1) of the said section to be transferred to the Board of Trade shall be the 6th day of December, 1920.

2. All lands, buildings and other property held, and all rights enjoyed, by a Secretary of State in connection with the powers transferred by subsection (1) of the said section shall as from the said 6th day of December, 1920, by virtue of this Order, be transferred to and vest in the Board of Trade, but subject to all liabilities affecting the same.

3. This Order may be cited as the Mining Industry (Transfer of Powers and Property) Order, 1920.

WHEREAS by Section 2 of the Pharmacy Act, 1868, it is enacted that the several Articles named or described in the Schedule (A) to that Act shall be deemed Poisons within the meaning of that Act, and that the Council of the Pharmaceutical Society of Great Britain may, from time to time, by Resolution, declare that any Article in such Resolution named ought to be deemed a Poison within the meaning of that Act, and that thereupon the said

Society shall submit the same for the approval of the Privy Council; and that if such approval shall be given, then such Resolution and approval shall be advertised in the London Gazette; and, on the expiration of one month from such advertisement, the Article named in such Resolution shall be deemed to be a Poison within the meaning of that Act:

And whereas by Section 1 of the Poisons and Pharmacy Act, 1908, it is enacted that Schedule (A) to the Pharmacy Act, 1868, be repealed, and the Schedule to the Poisons and Pharmacy Act, 1908, substituted therefor, and that the said last-named Schedule may be amended by adding thereto or removing therefrom any Article in the manner provided by Section 2 of the Pharmacy Act, 1868:

And whereas the Council of the Pharmaceutical Society of Great Britain did on the 17th day of November, 1920, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them by the Pharmacy Act, 1868, as amended by the Poisons and Pharmacy Act, 1908, resolve and declare as follows:—

“(a) That the description in Part 1 of the schedule to the last named Act ‘Coca, any preparation or admixture of, containing 1 or more per cent. of coca alkaloids’ ought to be removed therefrom and that the description ‘Coca, any preparation or admixture of, containing 0.1 or more per cent. of coca alkaloids’ ought to be added thereto.

“(b) That Ecgonine and all preparations or admixtures containing 0.1 per cent. of Ecgonine ought to be added to Part 1 of the Schedule to the Poisons and Pharmacy Act, 1908.

“(c) That the description in Part 1 of the Schedule to the last named Act ‘Opium and all preparations or admixtures containing 0.75 or more per cent. of Morphine’ ought to be removed therefrom, and that the description ‘Opium and all preparations or admixtures containing 0.2 or more per cent. of Morphine’ ought to be added thereto.

“(d) That Diamorphine (also known as Heroin) and all preparations or admixtures containing 0.1 per cent. of Diamorphine, ought to be added to Part 1 of the Schedule to the Poisons and Pharmacy Act, 1908.

“(e) That Zinc Chloride and liquid preparations of Zinc Chloride, except preparations intended to be used for soldering or other purely industrial purpose, provided that they are contained in closed vessels labelled with the word ‘Poisonous,’ and bearing the name and address of the seller and a notice of the special purpose for which the preparations are intended, ought to be added to Part 2 of the Poisons and Pharmacy Act, 1908.

“(f) That the description in Part 2 of the Schedule to the last named Act ‘Coca, any preparation or admixture of, containing more than 0.1 per cent. but not less than 1 per cent. of coca alkaloids,’ ought to be removed therefrom.”

And whereas the said Society have submitted their Resolution for the approval of the Privy Council, and the Lords of the Privy Council are of opinion that the said Resolution should be approved:

Now, therefore, Their Lordships are hereby pleased to signify their approval of the said Resolution.

The following Statutes, made by the Governing Body of Clare College, Cambridge, on the 28th day of October, 1920, and sealed on the 22nd day of November, 1920, have been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of their having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions of “The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877.”

STATUTES to alter the Statutes framed by the Commissioners appointed under the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877, in relation to Clare College, in the University of Cambridge, such amending Statutes being duly made at a General Meeting of the Governing Body of the said College specially summoned for the purpose and held on the 28th of October 1920, and passed at the said General Meeting by the votes of not less than two-thirds of the persons present and voting, and now submitted for the approval of His Majesty the King in Council.

We, the Master and Fellows of the said College, in exercise of the powers given us by the 54th Section of the said Act, do hereby alter the Statutes framed by the said Commissioners in manner following, that is to say:—

1. By amending Statute 3 in the following manner, namely:—

(a) By omitting paragraph 2, namely, the words, “One of the Fellows shall be called the Fellow on the foundation of Dr. Coles,” and by substituting for these words the following words, namely:—

“Two of the Fellows shall be called the Fellows on the foundation of Dr. Coles.”

(b) By omitting the fifth and sixth paragraphs, namely, the words, “The election to vacant Fellowships shall be held on some fixed day in the year, which shall be determined from time to time by the Master and Fellows.

“Twenty-one days before the aforesaid day of election a notice shall be published by the Master of any vacant Fellowship or Fellowships. The Master shall also send notice of such vacancy or vacancies to each one of the Fellows at least fourteen days before the day of election,” and by substituting for these paragraphs the following paragraphs, namely, the words:—

“The election to vacant Fellowships shall be held on such day or days as shall in each case be determined by the Master and Fellows.”

“The Master shall send notice in writing to each one of the Fellows at least fourteen days before the day fixed for any election.”

(c) By omitting the twelfth paragraph, namely, the words, “If more than one Fellowship be vacant at the same time, the same form of procedure shall be repeated in filling up each vacancy,” and by substituting for these words the following words, namely:—

“If at an election more than one vacancy is to be filled up, the same form of procedure shall be repeated in filling up each vacancy.”

2. By amending Statute 5 in the following manner, namely:—

By omitting the first paragraph, namely, the words, “The Master and Fellows may, by a vote in which not less than two-thirds of the whole body concur, elect persons distinguished in literature, science, or art to Honorary Fellowships, tenable for life. They may, how-

ever, by a like vote terminate the tenure of an Honorary Fellowship," and by substituting for these words the following words, namely:—

"The Master and Fellows may, by a vote in which not less than two-thirds of the whole body concur, elect distinguished persons to Honorary Fellowships, tenable for life. They may, however, by a like vote terminate the tenure of an Honorary Fellowship."

3. By amending Statute 6 in the following manner, namely:—

(a) By omitting paragraph 4, namely, the words, "No one shall be allowed to compete for a Scholarship before commencing residence in the University, if his age exceeds nineteen years on the first day of the academical year in which the Examination for such Scholarship or Exhibition is held. The maximum emolument of such entrance Scholarship or Exhibition shall be eighty pounds (80*l.*) a year, inclusive of room rent and all allowances. The tenure shall be for not more than two years unless it be prolonged at some time during such two years by a resolution of the Master and resident Fellows," and by substituting for these words the following words, namely:—

"No one shall be allowed to compete for a Scholarship or Exhibition before commencing residence in the University if his age exceeds nineteen years on the first day of the academical year in which the Examination for such Scholarship or Exhibition is held, saving that in each year one Exhibition and no more may at the discretion of the Master and Resident Fellows be freed from this limitation. The maximum emolument of such entrance Scholarship or Exhibition shall be eighty pounds (80*l.*) a year, inclusive of room rent and all allowances. The tenure shall be for not more than two years unless it be prolonged at some time during such two years by a resolution of the Master and resident Fellows."

(b) By omitting paragraph 5, namely, the words, "The Master and resident Fellows shall elect the Scholars and Exhibitioners, regard being had to the moral character and learning of the Candidates; but they shall not be required to fill up any vacant Scholarship, if in their opinion there be no competent candidate."

(c) By adding after paragraph 4 the following paragraph, namely, the words:—

"The Master and resident Fellows may elect graduate members of the University under the standing of Master of Arts, or graduate members of other Universities, to Research Studentships. There shall not be more than two Research Students at any one time whose emoluments are governed by the provisions of paragraph 7 of Statute 25. Preference in election shall (*caeteris paribus*) be given to graduate members of the College. The tenure shall be determined in each case by the Master and Resident Fellows."

(d) By omitting the last sentence of paragraph 6, namely, the words, "They may also, subject to the above provision, prolong the tenure of any particular holder of a Scholarship, promote a deserving Scholar to a Scholarship of greater value, or give two Scholarships to the same Scholar," and by substituting for these words the following words, namely:—

"They may also, subject to the above provision, prolong the tenure of any particular holder of a Scholarship, Exhibition or Research Studentship, promote a deserving

Scholar or Exhibitioner to a Scholarship or Exhibition of greater value, or give two Scholarships or Exhibitions to the same person."

(e) By adding after paragraph 6 the following paragraphs, namely, the words:—

"The Master and Resident Fellows shall elect the Scholars, Exhibitioners and Research Students, regard being had to the moral character and learning of the Candidates, but they shall not be required to fill up any vacant Scholarship, Exhibition or Research Studentship, if in their opinion there be no candidate of sufficient merit."

"Any Scholar, Exhibitioner or Research Student may notify his desire to forego his emoluments, in which case he shall be designated an Honorary Scholar, Exhibitioner or Research Student, and retain his status and privileges in all respects save as regards emoluments."

4. By amending Statute 10 in the following manner, namely, by omitting in paragraph 2 the following words, "or with the presentation to a College Benefice."

5. By amending Statute 12, Section (b) in the following manner, namely:—

(a) By omitting the first and second paragraphs, namely, the words, "The Tutor, if there be one only, and the two Senior of the Tutors, if there be more than one, and the Bursar shall, if Fellows, be *ex officio* members of the Council."

"If either of the two Senior of the Tutors or the Bursar be not a member of the Council, he shall attend the meetings of the Council as an Assessor, but shall not have a vote," and by substituting for these words the following words, namely:—

"The Tutor, or Tutors if not more than two, and the two senior of the Tutors, if more than two, and the Bursar, if Fellows and not at the time of their appointment members of the Council, shall as vacancies arise become members *ex officio* in the order of their Seniority as Fellows of the College, and until that time shall attend the meetings of the Council as Assessors, but shall not have a vote."

(b) By omitting paragraph 11, namely, the words, "This Statute shall come into operation on the day of the Annual Meeting of the Master and Fellows which shall be held next after its approval by the Queen in Council."

6. By amending Statute 17 in the following manner, namely:—

By omitting paragraphs 4 and 6, namely, the words, "One at least of the Tutors, and also the Dean or some other College Officer, shall reside in College during that portion of each term which is appointed by the Master for the residence of the Undergraduates; and during that part of the long vacation in which members of the College *in statu pupillari* are allowed to reside, at least one College Officer or Fellow shall reside in College."

"Every College Officer (other than the Master) or Fellow who is fulfilling the duty of residence in College under these Statutes shall sleep in College at least six nights in each week, provided always that when two persons are so residing in College, they shall not both be absent on any one night. Provided also always, that a house communicating with the College and approved by the Master and Fellows, shall for the purposes of this section be deemed to be within the College," and by substituting for these words the following words, namely:—

"Of the Tutors, the Dean and Assistant Tutors, one at least or as many more as the Master and Resident Fellows may from time to time consider necessary, shall sleep in College or in a suitable house communicating with the College and approved by the Master and Fellows, each night during that portion of each term which is appointed by the Master for the residence of the Undergraduates, and during that part of the long vacation in which members of the College *in statu pupillari* are allowed to reside."

7. By amending Statute 22 in the following manner, namely:—

(a) By omitting paragraph 3, namely, the words, "The Tutors shall be appointed in the first instance for a period of three years, and on the expiration of such period the Master and Fellows shall have power to confirm the appointment for a further period, on the expiration of which further period a Tutor may be re-elected for further periods of five years at a time," and by substituting for these words the following words, namely:—

"A Tutor shall be appointed in the first instance for a period of three years, on the expiration of which period a Tutor may from time to time be re-elected for any further period not exceeding five years."

(b) By omitting paragraph 6, namely, the words, "It shall be the duty of a Tutor to watch over the conduct of his pupils *loco parentis*, and to advise them in respect of both their studies and conduct," and by substituting for these words the following words, namely:—

"It shall be the duty of each Tutor and Assistant Tutor to watch over the conduct of his pupils *in loco parentis*, and to advise them in respect both of their studies and conduct."

8. By amending Statute 23 in the following manner, namely:—

By omitting paragraph 1, namely, the words, "If a Tutor vacate his office in the interval between two successive annual meetings for the election of College Officers, the Master shall summon a meeting of the Master and Fellows to elect a new Tutor. A Tutor thus elected shall hold office till the next annual meeting for the election of College Officers and for three years in addition, and on the expiration of such period the Master and Fellows shall have power to confirm the appointment for a further period, on the expiration of which further period he may be re-elected for further periods of five years at a time," and by substituting for this paragraph the following paragraph, namely, the words:—

"If a Tutor vacate his office in the interval between two successive annual meetings for the election of College Officers, the Master shall summon a meeting of the Master and Fellows to elect a new Tutor. A Tutor thus elected shall hold office till the next annual meeting for the election of College Officers and for three years in addition, on the expiration of which period he may from time to time be re-elected for any further period not exceeding five years."

9. By amending Statute 25 in the following manner, namely:—

(a) By adding at the end of the paragraph marked (2) the following words, namely:—

"And a dividend of one hundred and twenty five pounds (125*l.*) to any Research Student elected under the provisions of Statute 6."

(b) By adding immediately after the last-mentioned paragraph a new paragraph as follows:—

"(3) To the payments of such sums to the Tuition Fund as the Council may direct."

(c) By omitting the words, "If in any year the Divisible Fund with additions (if any) from the Surplus Fund shall be insufficient for the payment of the dividends above specified to such of the Master and Fellows as are under the operation in all respects of these Statutes and the Scholarship Fund, then such sums as the Divisible Fund with such additions (if any) will admit shall be paid in the proportions above mentioned by way of dividend for that year to the said Master and Fellows and the Scholarship Fund respectively," and by substituting for these words the following words, namely:—

"If in any year the Divisible Fund with the additions (if any) from the Surplus Fund shall be insufficient for the payment of the dividends above specified to such of the Master and Fellows as are under the operation in all respects of these Statutes, the Scholarship Fund and the Research Students, then such sums as the Divisible Fund with such additions (if any) will admit shall be paid in the proportions above mentioned by way of dividend for that year to the said Master and Fellows, the Scholarship Fund and the Research Students respectively."

10. By amending Statute 27 in the following manner, namely:—

By omitting paragraphs 3, 4, 6 and 8, namely, the words, "Every Fellow, except in the cases hereinafter specified, shall vacate his Fellowship at the expiration of five years and eleven months from the time of his election, but he shall receive the whole dividend for the last year."

"If at the end of the five years and eleven months aforesaid a Fellow be filling the office of Professor, Public Orator, Registry, or Librarian in the University, or the office of Tutor, Dean, Bursar, or Lecturer in the College, he shall retain his Fellowship so long as he continues to fill the said office or fills any other of the said offices."

"The Master and Fellows may, by vote in which not less than two-thirds of the whole body concur, prolong the tenure of a Fellow, on account of his marked services in literature or science, either for life or for periods not exceeding five years and eleven months; and they may in the same manner and for the same reason, but not otherwise, re-elect a Fellow whose tenure has expired."

"The Master and Fellows may by vote in which not less than two-thirds of those present at a meeting specially summoned for the purpose, of which at least fourteen days' notice has been given to each Fellow, concur, elect an ex-Fellow to any of the offices of Tutor, Dean, Bursar, or Lecturer, and may thereupon re-elect him to a Fellowship to be held so long only as he fills any of such offices, unless in the meantime he shall become entitled under any provision of these Statutes to retain his Fellowship for life," and by substituting for these paragraphs respectively the following paragraphs, namely, the words:—

"Every Fellow except in the cases hereinafter specified shall vacate his Fellowship at the expiration of three years from the time of his election, unless the Master and Fellows at a meeting of which at least fourteen days' notice in writing has been given to each Fellow, held

not more than six calendar months before the expiration of such period of three years, shall, by a vote in which not less than two-thirds of those present and voting concur, prolong the tenure of such Fellow for a further period of three years.

"If at the end of any period of the tenure of his Fellowship, a Fellow be filling the office of Professor, Public Orator, Registrary or Librarian in the University, or the office of Tutor, Dean, Bursar or Lecturer in the College, he shall retain his Fellowship so long as he continues to fill any such office."

"The Master and Fellows may by a vote in which not less than two-thirds of those present concur, prolong the tenure of a Fellow, who has held his Fellowship not less than five years and six months, on account of his marked services in literature or science, either for life or any fixed period not exceeding six years, and they may in the same manner, and for the same reason, but not otherwise, except as hereinafter provided, re-elect a Fellow whose tenure has expired."

"The Master and Fellows may by a vote in which not less than two-thirds of those present at a meeting specially summoned for the purpose, of which at least fourteen days' notice in writing has been given to each Fellow, concur, elect an ex-Fellow to any of the offices of Tutor, Dean, Bursar or Lecturer, and may at any subsequent election of Fellows re-elect him to a Fellowship to be held so long as he fills any of such offices, but no longer, unless in the meantime he shall have become entitled under any provision of these Statutes to retain his Fellowship for life."

11. By amending Statute 35 in the following manner, namely:—

By omitting paragraph 3, namely, the words, "If any difference shall arise with regard to the meaning of any part of these Statutes, the question shall be referred to the Master and Fellows. If a majority of the whole body of the Master and Fellows agree as to the meaning, their decision shall be binding; otherwise they shall refer the question without loss of time to the Visitor, who shall, with the concurrence of at least one of the two Assessors assigned to him by the University, place such construction upon the words in question as he shall think most consonant with the meaning and intent of these Statutes, and his construction shall be held to be the true construction," and by substituting for these words the following words, namely:—

"If any question shall arise in regard to the meaning of any part of these Statutes, it shall be decided by the Master and Fellows, but it shall be competent for any party affected by such decision to appeal to the Visitor, provided he appeal within two calendar months or within such extended period (if any) as shall be allowed by the Master and Fellows for the purpose after the decision shall have been given, but failing an appeal within the time allowed for the purpose the decision of the Master and Fellows shall be final. The Visitor if appealed to within due time may with the concurrence of at least one of the two Assessors assigned to him by the University affirm, vary or reverse the decision of the Master and Fellows and his decision shall be final."

12. By amending Statute 36 in the following manner, namely:—

(a) By omitting paragraph 6, namely, the words, "In order to effect gradually the reduction in the number of Fellowships to fourteen,

the Master and Fellows may suppress each alternate vacant Fellowship until the number be reduced to fourteen."

(b) By omitting paragraph 8, namely, the words, "Any Fellow elected between the fourteenth day of March, 1878, and the sixth day of October, 1880, shall be entitled to hold his Fellowship for six years and eleven months and to receive the dividend of a Fellowship for seven years," and by substituting for these words the following words, namely:—

"Nothing in these amending Statutes contained shall prejudice or affect the rights and tenure of Fellows elected between the 14th day of March, 1878, and the date when these amending Statutes shall be approved by His Majesty in Council, but such rights and tenure shall be and remain regulated by the Statutes of the College as existing on the first day of October, 1920."

THE TREATIES OF PEACE (COPYRIGHT) RULES, 1920.

DATED 29TH NOVEMBER, 1920.

By virtue of the provisions of the Trading with the Enemy Acts, 1914 to 1918, the Treaty of Peace (Germany) Act, 1919, the Treaties of Peace (Austria & Bulgaria) Act, 1920, the Treaty of Peace (Germany) Order, 1919, the Treaty of Peace (Austria) Order, 1920, and the Board of Trade Order, dated the 9th day of November, 1920, the Board of Trade do hereby make the following rules:—

Preliminary.

1. These Rules may be cited as the Treaties of Peace (Copyright) Rules, 1920, and shall come into operation from and immediately after the 29th day of November, 1920.

Interpretation.

2. In the construction of these Rules any words herein used the meanings of which are defined by the Order of the Board of Trade, dated the 9th day of November, 1920, or the Copyright Act, 1911, shall have the meanings thereby assigned to them respectively.

"Comptroller" shall mean the Comptroller of the Industrial Property Department, Board of Trade.

"Department" shall mean the Industrial Property Department, Board of Trade, 25, Southampton Buildings, London, W.C. 2.

Fees.

3. The fees to be paid under these Rules shall be those specified in the first Schedule to these Rules.

Forms.

4. The forms herein referred to are the forms contained in the second Schedule to these Rules. Such forms shall be used in all cases to which they are applicable, and may be modified as directed by the Comptroller to meet other cases.

Leaving.

5. Any application, notice, or other document, authorized or required to be left, made, or given, at the Department or to the Comptroller, or to any other person under these Rules, may be sent by a prepaid or official paid letter through the post, and, if so sent, shall be deemed to have been left, made or given at the time when the letter containing the same would be delivered in the ordinary course of post. In proving such sending, it shall be sufficient to prove that the letter was properly addressed and put in the post.

Where any letter or document is required by these Rules to be transmitted to the owner of the copyright and the name and address of such owner cannot be ascertained, such letter or document may be sent to the person whose name and address appears upon the work in question as purporting to be the publisher or proprietor thereof, or, if no such name or address appears upon the work, then to such other person as may appear to the Comptroller to be the interested party. A letter so addressed, or addressed to an applicant in any proceedings under these Rules at the address for service appearing on the application, shall be deemed to be sufficiently addressed.

Every applicant under Rules 8, 9 and 10 of these Rules shall furnish an address for service in the United Kingdom.

Voluntary Dealings in regard to a Restored Copyright.

6. Where any assignment or assurance of a restored copyright or any licence under a restored copyright has been agreed between parties, application for the consent of the Board of Trade to any such assignment, assurance or licence shall be made on Form T.P. (Copyright) No. 1 before the execution of the document effecting such assignment, assurance or licence. Such application shall be accompanied by two copies of the draft document proposed to be executed, and by a statutory declaration that such proposed assignment, assurance or licence does not form part of any other transaction or series of transactions between the parties concerned in reference to the restored copyright, and that no valuable consideration other than that mentioned in the draft document has been or will be paid or given in respect of the proposed assignment, assurance or licence.

Devolution of Title by Operation of Law.

7. Where any person claims to be entitled to the benefit of or any interest in a restored copyright by virtue of operation of law, arising after the outbreak of war, he shall make application for the consent of the Board of Trade to his title as claimed being recognised

upon Form T.P. (Copyright) No. 2. Such application shall be accompanied by a copy of the instrument or other document under which the applicant claims title.

APPLICATION FOR LICENCE UNDER RESTORED COPYRIGHT OTHER THAN UNDER RULE 6.

8. An application for the grant of a licence under a restored copyright shall be made upon Form T.P. (Copyright) No. 3. Such application shall be accompanied by an unstamped copy, a copy of the work in respect of which a licence is desired, and a statement in duplicate setting out fully the reason for making the application, the facts upon which the applicant bases his case, and the terms of the licence which he is prepared to accept. A copy of the application and of the statement will be transmitted to the owner of the copyright.

Upon such application being made and copy thereof transmitted to the owner of the copyright, the latter, if desirous of contesting the application, shall within one month of the date of transmission of such copy, or such further time as the Comptroller may allow, leave at the Department a counter-statement fully setting out the grounds upon which the application is contested, and on so leaving shall deliver to the applicant a copy thereof.

Upon receipt of such counter-statement and/or any further evidence the Comptroller may require, the Comptroller shall proceed to determine the application.

APPLICATION FOR REVISION OF LICENCE.

9. An application for the revision of a licence, whether granted by the Custodian, or under these Rules, under a restored copyright shall be made upon Form T.P. (Copyright) No. 4. Such application shall be accompanied by an unstamped copy and a statement in duplicate setting out fully the facts upon which the applicant bases his case and the terms of such licence as he is prepared to accept or grant. A copy of the application and of the statement will be transmitted by the Comptroller to the owner of the copyright or the Licensee concerned as the case may be.

Upon such application being made and copy thereof transmitted the owner of the copyright or licensee, as the case may be, if desirous of contesting the application, shall, within one month of the date of transmission of such copy, or such further time as the Comptroller may allow, leave at the Department a counter-statement fully setting out the grounds upon which the application is contested, and on so leaving shall deliver to the applicant a copy thereof.

Upon receipt of such counter-statement and/or any further evidence the Comptroller may require, the Comptroller shall proceed to determine the application.

APPLICATION FOR THE EXPROPRIATION, TAKING OVER OR SALE OF A RESTORED COPYRIGHT.

10. An application for the expropriation, taking over or sale of any restored copyright shall be made on Form T.P. (Copyright) No. 5. Such application shall be accompanied by an unstamped copy, a copy of the work in question, and a statement in duplicate setting out fully the reason for making the application and the facts upon which the applicant bases his case. A copy of the application and of the statement will be transmitted by the Comptroller to the owner of the copyright.

Upon such application being made and copy thereof transmitted to the owner of the copyright, the latter, if desirous of contesting the

application, shall, within one month of the date of transmission of such copy, or such further time as the Comptroller may allow, leave at the Department a counter-statement fully setting out the grounds upon which the application is contested, and on so leaving, shall deliver to the applicant a copy thereof.

Upon receipt of such counter-statement and/or any further evidence the Comptroller may require, the Comptroller shall proceed to determine whether the application shall be granted and be referred to a special tribunal for the settlement of terms.

Where it is decided to grant the application and refer it to a special tribunal for the settlement of terms, application to be heard by special tribunal shall be made upon Form T.P. (Copyright) No. 6.

HEARINGS.

11. Before deciding any issue raised under Rules 8, 9 and 10 of these Rules or before exercising any discretionary power given to the Comptroller under the Order of the Board of Trade, dated the 9th day of November, 1920, or these Rules, adversely to any party the Comptroller shall give ten days' notice, or such longer notice as he may think fit, to the party or parties as the case may be of the time when he is prepared to hear such party or parties or their representatives.

EVIDENCE.

12. In lieu of or in addition to any oral evidence that may be given at a hearing the Comptroller may require any party to file evidence by way of statutory declaration and allow any declarant to be cross-examined on his declaration.

TRANSLATIONS.

13. If any instrument or document (other than a work the subject of an application) furnished in accordance with these Rules is in a foreign language, an English translation thereof shall be annexed thereto. The Comptroller may if he thinks fit require such translation to be verified by statutory declaration or otherwise to his satisfaction.

COSTS.

14. The Comptroller may award costs in any proceedings under these Rules and direct how and by what parties they are to be paid. Further, in any case in which he thinks fit the Comptroller may require any person initiating proceedings to give security for costs, and in the event of such security not being forthcoming, may dismiss the application in question.

GENERAL.

15. Where, under these Rules, any person is required to do any act or thing, or to sign any document, or to make any declaration on behalf of himself or of any body corporate, or any document or evidence is required to be produced or left with the Comptroller, or at the Department, and it is shown to the satisfaction of the Comptroller that from any reasonable cause such person is unable to do such act or thing, or to sign such document or to make such declaration, or that such document or evidence cannot be produced or left as aforesaid, it shall be lawful for the Comptroller, upon the production of such other evidence and subject to such terms as he may think fit, to dispense with any such act or thing, document, declaration or evidence.

DEFENCE OF THE REALM (LIQUOR CONTROL).

GENERAL ORDER OF THE CENTRAL CONTROL BOARD (LIQUOR TRAFFIC) FOR RELAXING, IN ENGLAND AND WALES, FOR THE DAYS PRECEDING CHRISTMAS, CERTAIN OF THE RESTRICTIONS IMPOSED UPON THE DISPATCH OF INTOXICATING LIQUOR FROM LICENSED PREMISES.

We, the Central Control Board (Liquor Traffic), in pursuance of the powers conferred upon us by the Acts and Regulations relating to the Defence of the Realm, hereby make the following General Order:—

Areas to which the Order Applies.

1. This Order shall apply to all areas or parts of areas situate in England or Wales to which the Defence of the Realm (Liquor Control) Regulations, 1915, have been applied.

Duration of the Order.

2. This Order shall be in force on the 15th, 16th, 17th, 18th, 20th, 21st, 22nd, 23rd and 24th days of December, 1920.

Effect of Order.

3. During such time as this Order is in force it shall be lawful, notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in the Orders of the Board for the aforesaid areas, to dispatch intoxicating liquor from licensed premises at any time in the forenoon.

Provided always that nothing herein shall be deemed to authorise the dispatch of spirits on Saturday, the 18th day of December.

Other Provisions of the Orders to Remain in Force.

4. Save as by this Order expressly provided, the provisions of each of the said Orders shall remain in full force.

DEFENCE OF THE REALM (LIQUOR CONTROL).

GENERAL ORDER OF THE CENTRAL CONTROL BOARD (LIQUOR TRAFFIC) REGULATING THE SALE AND SUPPLY OF INTOXICATING LIQUOR ON CHRISTMAS DAY AND AUTHORIZING THE GRANT OF SPECIAL EXEMPTIONS ON NEW YEAR'S EVE IN ENGLAND AND WALES.

We the Central Control Board (Liquor Traffic) in pursuance of the powers conferred upon us by the Acts and Regulations relating to the Defence of the Realm hereby make the following General Order:—

Areas to which the Order Applies.

1. This Order applies to all areas or parts of areas situate in England or Wales to which

the Defence of the Realm (Liquor Control) Regulations, 1915, have been applied.

Hours during which Intoxicating Liquor may be Sold on Christmas Day.

2. The hours during which intoxicating liquor may (subject to the provisions of Article 3 hereof) be sold and supplied on Christmas Day in licensed premises and clubs whether for consumption on or off the premises shall be follows:—

(a) In the Welsh Area and the West Gloucestershire Area, the hours between 12.30 p.m. and 2.30 p.m. and between 7 p.m. and 10 p.m. for consumption on the premises, and the hours between 12.30 p.m. and 2.30 p.m. and between 7 p.m. and 9 p.m. for consumption off the premises.

(b) In each of the other areas, the hours during which by the provisions of Article 2 of the Orders of the Board for the said areas such sale or supply for consumption on or off the premises is permitted on Sundays.

And Article 2 of each of the said Orders of the Board shall be read as if the provisions of this Article were inserted therein.

Sale of Spirits for Consumption Off the Premises Prohibited.

3. No spirits to be consumed off the premises shall be sold or supplied in any licensed premises or club or be dispatched or taken therefrom on Christmas Day, and Article 3 of each of the said Orders shall be read as if the provisions of this Article were inserted therein.

Grant of Special Exemptions on New Year's Eve.

4. Notwithstanding anything contained in Article 2 of the Orders of the Board now in force in the said Areas, it shall be lawful to sell and supply intoxicating liquor for consumption on the premises and to consume intoxicating liquor thereon during any specified hours between the hours of 10 p.m. on December 31st, 1920, and 12.30 a.m. on January 1st, 1921, under an order or licence granted in pursuance of section 57 or section 64 of the Licensing (Consolidation) Act, 1910.

1. Parts I and IV of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Control of Movement) Order of 1920, hereinafter referred to as "the Principal Order," are hereby applied to the District described in the Schedule hereto, which shall be a Scheduled District for the purposes of that Order.

Movement within the Scheduled District.

2.—(1) Where an Inspector of the Ministry considers it necessary or expedient after inquiry that an animal in the Scheduled District should be permitted to be moved within the Scheduled District as often as occasion may require between different parts of the same farm, he may, notwithstanding any prohibition of movement contained in the Principal Order, authorise such movement by an Occupation Licence, and the Inspector may insert in the licence such conditions as he may consider necessary or desirable for the purpose of preventing the animals referred to in the licence from coming into contact with any other animals.

(2) If in respect of any animal the conditions of a licence granted under this Article are not complied with, the owner of the animal and the person for the time being in charge thereof shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

Short Title.
