300295 Pte. C. Jones, M.M., 7th Bn., L'pool R. (Liverpool). (FRANCE)  
(M.M. gazetted 13th September, 1918.)

For bravery and devotion to duty on the 1st September, 1918, during the capture of Hendecourt, when as platoon runner he successfully carried an important message through heavy enemy shell fire, and returned with the answer to his platoon officer in time to join him for the attack.

8719 Coy./S.M. J. Green, M.M., 1st Bn., R. Irish Rif. (Belfast). (FRANCE)

For bravery and initiative during the attack on Gulleghem on the 14th and 15th October, 1918, when he took command of a company, and under heavy machine-gun

fire led them to their objective and subsequently organised them, consolidated his position, and sent back most accurate reports.

130030 Cpl. J. H. Edwards, M.M., 45th Bn., R. Fus. (London). (N. RUSSIA)

For bravery and devotion to duty in September, 1918, in North Russia, when he served his gun single-handed under heavy rifle and machine-gun fire.

His Majesty the KING has been graciously pleased to approve of the award of a Bar to the Military Medal to the undermentioned in recognition of gallant conduct and determination displayed in escaping from captivity, which services have been brought to notice in accordance with the terms of Army Order 193 of 1919.
