WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 22nd day of November, 1920 (E. 7664/20), in the words following, viz.:—

"Whereas by Your Majesty's Order in Council bearing date the 27th day of May, 1915, a Scheme of pensions, grants, and allowances in the nature thereof was framed in pursuance of Section I of the Injuries in War (Compensation) Act, 1914, for the benefit of persons, not being Officers or Seamen of the Royal Navy, or Officers or Soldiers of any of Your Majesty's Land or Marine Forces, in respect of injury or disablement whilst employed affoat by, or under, the Admiralty or Army Council, in connection with warlike operations in which Your Majesty is engaged, and in the case of their

death for the benefit of their widows and other dependants:

"And whereas by Orders of Your Majesty in Council bearing dates the 8th day of June, 1916, and the 11th day of March, 1920, the said Scheme was modified in certain respects:

said Scheme was modified in certain respects:

"And whereas we are of opinion that it is desirable further to vary the said Scheme:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to direct that the Regulations appearing in the Schedule attached hereto shall be deemed to be incorporated in the above cited Orders in Council dated the 27th day of May, 1915, the 8th day of June, 1916, and the 11th day of March, 1920, and to have effect from the dates mentioned in the said Schedule and that any provision of the said Orders which is inconsistent with the Regulations attached hereto shall be void and of no effect, without prejudice however to the validity of any award thereunder made prior to the date of this Order.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals.

#### "SCHEDULE.

"1. Injury and Disablement Pensions.

As from the 1st January, 1920, if in any case the pension which may be awarded under the Order in Council dated the 27th day of May, 1915, as modified by the Orders in Council dated the 8th day of June, 1916, and the 11th day of March, 1920, in respect of an injury or disablement resulting in total destruction of earning capacity is less than a weekly sum of £1 15s. it shall be lawful for the Admiralty or the Army Council at their discretion to award such weekly sum not exceeding £1 15s. as may in the circumstances of each case be deemed appropriate.

In cases where total incapacity subsists it shall be lawful for the Admiralty or Army Council to award allowances at the rates applicable to children other than motherless in respect of children who were existing at the time of the injury or disablement.

# "2. Widows' Pensions.

As from 1st September, 1919, the rates of widows' pensions shall be increased by 40 per cent, and the minimum rates shall be as follows:—

"3. Children's Allowances.

As from 1st September, 1919, the allowance for each child (other than a motherless child) under the age of 16 shall be one-eighth of pay subject to a maximum allowance of £30 per annum or one-sixteenth of pay whichever be the greater, and to minimum allowances as follows:—

In cases in which an allowance has been awarded under the Scheme supplementary to an award under the Workmen's Compensation Act, 1906, the increased rates herein authorized shall apply only in such manner and to such extent as the Admiralty or Army Council may in the circumstances of each case deem appropriate."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

And whereas His Majesty has power by Order in Council to revoke, alter or add to any Order in Council made under the said Acts:

· And whereas it is expedient that the provisions of the Aliens Order, 1920, should be amended in manner hereinafter appearing:

And whereas the provisions of section one of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, have been complied with:

- Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—
- 1. The Aliens Order, 1920, shall be amended as follows:—
  - (a) The following sub-section shall be substituted for sub-section (6) of Article 3—
    - (6) Without prejudice to any other provision of this Article where an alien to whom leave to land has not been granted by an immigration officer is found on shore in the United Kingdom, it shall be lawful for the immigration officer or any constable, notwithstanding any intervening prosecution and imprisonment of the alien, at any time within one month after the arrival of the alien to replace that alien on board the ship in which he arrived in the United Kingdom, or on board any ship belonging to the same owners and bound for the port from which the alien came to the United Kingdom.
  - (b) The following sub-section shall be substituted for sub-section (6) of Article 7—
    - (6) This article applies to any premises, whether furnished or unfurnished, where lodging or sleeping accommodation is provided for reward.
  - (c) The following paragraph shall be substituted for the last paragraph of sub-section (1) of Article 23—

A' reference to the Scottish Board of Health shall be substituted for any reference to the Minister of Health, and a reference to section sixteen of the Summary Jurisdiction (Scotland) Act, 1908, shall be substituted for the reference to section twenty-nine of the Summary Jurisdiction Act, 1879.

(d) The following paragraph shall be added at the end of sub-section (2) of Article 26—

Any permission or direction given, or order or requirement made or other action taken under any Order made under the Aliens Restiction Act, 1914, and no longer in force, shall be deemed to have been given made or taken under the corresponding provision of this Order, and any expulsion order made under the Aliens

Act, 1905, and in force at the time of the repeal of that Act, shall have effect as though it were a deportation order made under this Order.

2. This Order shall come into operation forthwith.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 59th year of His late Majesty King George the Third, Chapter 134; of the Act of the 2nd and 3rd years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 49; and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Representation, bearing date the 21st day of October, 1920, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 59th year of His late Majesty King George the Third, Chapter 134; of the Act of the 2nd and 3rd years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 49; and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Representation as to the assignment of a District Chapelry to the consecrated Church of Saint Alban, situate at Trimdon Grange, in the Parish of Kelloe, in the County of Durham and in the Diocese of Durham:

"Whereas it appears to us to be expedient that a District Chapelry should be assigned to the said Church of Saint Alban, situate at Trimdon Grange as aforesaid:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Herbert Hensley. Bishop of Durham (testified by his having signed and sealed this Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent that it would in our opinion be expedient that all that part of the said Parish of Kelloe, which is described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which part together with the boundaries thereof is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed should be assigned as a District Chapelry to the said Church of Saint Alban, situate at Trimdon Grange as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The District Chapelry of Saint Alban, Trimdon Grange.'

"And with the like consent of the said Herbert Hensley, Bishop of Durham (testified as aforesaid), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, further represent that it appears to us to be expedient that banns of matrimony should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings and burials should be solemnized or performed at the said Church of Saint Alban, situate at Trimdon Grange as aforesaid, and that the fees or dues to be re-

ceived in respect of the publication of banns and of the solemnization or performance of marriages, churchings and burials should be paid and belong to the minister of the same church for the time being:—

"We, therefore, humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal consideration and to make such Order with respect thereto as to Your Majesty in Your Royal Wisdom shall seem meet.

"THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The District Chapelry of Saint Alban, Trimdon Grange, being:—

"All that part of the Parish of Kelloe, in the County of Durham and in the Diocese of Durham, which is bounded upon the south and upon the south-west by the Parish of Trimdon, in the said County and Diocese, upon the north-east by the New Parish of Deaf Hill cum Langdale, in the said County and Diocese, upon the north partly by the last-named Parish and partly by the New Parish of Thornley, in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the north-west, upon the west and upon the south-west, by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Thornley from the said Parish of Kelloe diverges westward from the stream known as the Kelloe Beck, and extending thence first southward and then south-westward along the middle of the Kelloe Beck for a distance of 40 chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries the road leading from Carrs House to Town Kelloe across the said stream, and extending thence southward along the middle of the said road for a distance of 11 chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road leading from the Wingate Arms to Town Kelloe and with a footpath leading towards Trimdon Grange, and extending thence first southward and then in various directions along the middle of the said footpath for a distance of 75 chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road leading from Town Kelloe to Trimdon Grange, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of the last-mentioned road for a distending thence south-eastward tance of 22 chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road leading to Trimdon, and extending thence southward along the middle of the last-mentioned road for a distance of 41 chains or thereabouts to the point where it is crossed by the boundary which divides the said Parish of Kelloe from the said Parish of Trimdon."

And whereas the said Representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Durham.

The city of Winchester, the boroughs of Lymington, Andover, and Romsey, the petty sessional divisions of Christchurch, Southampton (including its detached part), Hythe, Lymington, Andover, Winchester, Fordingbridge, Ringwood, New Forest, and Romsey, and the parishes of Popham and Woodmancott.

In the administrative county of Somerset:

The petty sessional division of Frome (except the parish of Leigh-upon-Mendip), the parishes of Hardington, Hemington, Hinton Charterhouse, Freshford, and such portions of the parish of Wellow as lie to the south and east of the railway from Radstock to Bath, and such portions of the petty sessional divisions of Yeovil and Wincanton as lie to the east and south of the railway line from Yeovil via Castle Cary and Bruton to Frome.
