PRESENT,
The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 9th day of November, 1920 (N.P. (2) 2725/20), in the words following, viz.:—

“Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, and other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions, and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

“And whereas Your Majesty was graciously pleased by Your Order in Council bearing date the 25th day of March, 1920, to sanction the grant of Gratuities to men of the Royal Navy, Royal Marines, Royal Naval Reserve, and

Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve, who have served during the present war, in respect of such service; and similarly to men of Colour entered under Naval Non-Continuous Service Engagements, provided they were borne on Ships' Books on the 1st December, 1919:

“And whereas we are of opinion that Native Ratings who served during the war under similar conditions, but were discharged prior to the 1st December, 1919, are equally deserving of this reward:

“We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction the payment to such Native Ratings of Gratuities on the prescribed scale, and subject to the same conditions.

“The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals.”

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS in pursuance of the Bishops Resignation Act, 1869, a Representation has been made to His Majesty by the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Cosmo Gordon, by Divine Providence Lord Archbishop of York, Primate of England and Metropolitan, at the instance of the Right Reverend Edmund Arbutnot, by Divine Permission Lord Bishop of Manchester, and as such a Bishop of a diocese within and of the Province of York, that the said Bishop is desirous of resigning his Bishopric (such resignation to take formal effect upon the 1st day of *January*, 1921), reason that he is incapacitated by permanent physical infirmity from the due performance of his duties as Bishop:

And whereas His Majesty is satisfied of such incapacity, and that the said Bishop has canonically resigned:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to declare, and it is hereby declared, that the said Bishopric of Manchester is vacant, the vacancy taking effect on the 1st day of *January*, 1921, and His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased to direct, and it is hereby directed, that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the Diocese of Manchester.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS His Majesty has been pleased to approve a change in the Constitution of the Army Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. The Secretary of State is to be responsible to His Majesty and Parliament for all the business of the Army Council. All business other than business which the Secretary of State specially reserves to himself, is to be transacted in the following principal subdivisions:—

(a) The Under Secretary of State shall be responsible to the Secretary of State for the administration of business affecting the Territorial Force Associations and War Department Lands, and for so much of the other business of the Army Council as may be assigned to him, from time to time, by the Secretary of State.

(b) The First Military Member of the Army Council (the Chief of the Imperial General Staff), the Second Military Member of the Army Council (the Adjutant-General), the Third Military Member of the Army Council (the Quartermaster-General), the Fourth Military Member of the Army Council (the Master-General of Ordnance), and the Fifth Military Member of the Army Council (the Deputy Chief of the Imperial

General Staff) shall be responsible to the Secretary of State for the administration of so much of the business relating to the organisation, disposition, personnel, armament, and maintenance of the Army, as may be assigned to them, or each of them, from time to time, by the Secretary of State.

(c) The Finance Member of the Army Council shall be responsible to the Secretary of State for the finance of the Army and for so much of the other business of the Army Council as may be assigned to him, from time to time, by the Secretary of State.

(d) The Surveyor-General of Supply shall be responsible to the Secretary of State for the business relating to Army Contracts and the administration of Factories belonging to the War Office (other than the Royal Army Clothing Factory) and for so much of the other business of the Army Council as may be assigned to him, from time to time, by the Secretary of State.

(e) The Secretary of the War Office shall be Secretary, and a Member, of the Army Council and responsible to the Secretary of State for the preparation of all official communications of the Council and for the interior economy of the War Office: he shall also be responsible on his appointment as Accounting Officer of Army Votes, Funds and Accounts for the control of expenditure and for advising the Secretary of State and the Administrative Officers at the War Office and in Commands on all questions of Army expenditure.

He shall further be charged with such other duties as may be assigned to him, from time to time, by the Secretary of State.

So long as there are two Joint Secretaries of the War Office, one of them will be appointed to exercise all the financial functions above mentioned.

2. This Order in Council shall be substituted for the Orders in Council dated the 15th day of *February*, 1909, and the 9th day of *February*, 1920.

WHEREAS it is provided by the Ministry of Transport Act, 1919, that as from such date or dates as His Majesty in Council may by Order determine there shall be transferred to the Minister of Transport all powers and duties of any Government Department in relation to:—

(a) Railways;

(b) Light Railways;

(c) Tramways;

(d) Canals, Waterways, and Inland Navigations,

(e) Roads, Bridges and Ferries, and Vehicles and Traffic thereon;

(f) Harbours, Docks and Piers.

And whereas it is further provided by the said Act that His Majesty may by Order make such incidental, consequential and supplemental provisions as may be necessary or expedient for the purpose of giving full effect to

any transfer of powers or duties as aforesaid, including provisions for the transfer of any property rights and liabilities held enjoyed or incurred by any Government Department in connection with any powers or duties transferred:

And whereas the powers and duties of the Board of Trade in relation to the Athy-Wolfhill Colliery Railway and the Castlecomer Colliery Railway were transferred to the Minister of Transport by the Ministry of Transport (Board of Trade Exception of Powers) Order, 1919, but the property rights and liabilities in connection therewith have not yet been so transferred:

And whereas it is expedient for giving full effect to the transfer of the powers and duties before mentioned that the property rights and liabilities held enjoyed or incurred by the Board of Trade in connection with the Athy-Wolfhill Colliery Railway and the Castlecomer Colliery Railway should be transferred to the Minister of Transport:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as "The Ministry of Transport (Athy-Wolfhill and Castlecomer Colliery Railways Transfer of Property) Order, 1920."

2. As from the 3rd day of December, 1920, all the property rights and liabilities held enjoyed or incurred by the Board of Trade in connection with the Athy-Wolfhill Colliery Railway and the Castlecomer Colliery Railway shall be transferred to and vested in the Minister of Transport and such rights and liabilities shall be exercisable by or enforceable against the Minister of Transport in like manner as they would have been by or against the Board of Trade if this Order had not been made.

3. In the construction and for the purposes of any Act of Parliament, judgment, decree, order, award, deed, contract, regulation, by-law, or other document passed or made before the date hereof in relation to the Athy-Wolfhill Colliery Railway and the Castlecomer Colliery Railway the name of the Minister of Transport shall be substituted for the name of the Board of Trade.

WHEREAS on the 20th day of January, 1914, an International Convention for the Safety of Life at Sea, and for purposes incidental thereto, was duly entered into by His Majesty and the other Signatory Powers more especially referred to and set out in the said Convention:

And whereas a Statute 4 & 5 Geo. V, c. 50, intituled "An Act to make such amendments of the law relating to Merchant Shipping as are necessary or expedient to give effect to an International Convention for the Safety of Life at Sea" (being the Convention above referred to) was passed on the 10th day of August, 1914.

the short title of which is "The Merchant Shipping (Convention) Act, 1914":

And whereas by Section 29, Sub-section 5, of the said Act it was provided as follows:—

"This Act shall come into operation on the 1st day of July, 1915:

"Provided that His Majesty may, by Order in Council, from time to time postpone the coming into operation of this Act for such period, not exceeding on any occasion of postponement one year, as may be specified in the Order":

And whereas by divers Orders in Council the coming into operation of the said Act has been from time to time postponed, and now stands postponed, by virtue of an Order in Council of the 11th day of June, 1920, until the 1st day of January, 1921:

And whereas His Majesty deems it expedient that the provisions of the said Act should be further postponed:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, in pursuance of the powers vested in Him by the above-recited provision, and of all other powers Him thereunto enabling, doth order, and it is hereby ordered, that the provisions of the Merchant Shipping (Convention) Act, 1914, shall be postponed from coming into operation until the 1st day of July, 1921.

WHEREAS by treaty, grant, usage, sufferance or other lawful means His Majesty has power and jurisdiction in the territories of or adjacent to East Africa named in the first column of the Schedule to this Order:

And whereas by certain Orders in Council mentioned in the second column of the said Schedule and respectively set opposite to the names of the said territories specified as aforesaid in the first column thereof the Fugitive Offenders Act, 1881, has been applied to the said territories respectively as if each of them were a British Possession:

And whereas by reason of the contiguity of the Colony of Kenya and of the said territories and the frequent intercommunication between them it seems expedient to His Majesty and conducive to the better administration of justice therein that Part II of the Fugitive Offenders Act, 1881, should apply to the said Colony and territories as hereinafter provided:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue of the powers in this behalf by the Fugitive Offenders Act, 1881, the Foreign Jurisdiction Act, 1890, or otherwise in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as "The East Africa Fugitive Offenders Order in Council, 1920."

2. (1) Part II of the Fugitive Offenders Act, 1881, shall apply to the Colony of Kenya

and the territories named in the first column of the Schedule to this Order.

(2) The foregoing provision shall be deemed to be in addition to and not in substitution for any provision of the like nature made in respect of the said Colony by any other Order in Council, or in respect of the territories named in the first column of the Schedule to this Order by the Orders in Council mentioned in the second column thereof and respectively set opposite to the names of the said territories specified as aforesaid in the first column thereof.

3. The Governor of the said Colony and the High Commissioner for Zanzibar and the Governor of each of the said other territories shall cause this Order to be proclaimed therein, and this Order shall come into operation on a day to be fixed by such Proclamation.

4. His Majesty may from time to time revoke, alter, add to, or amend this Order.

And the Right Honourable Viscount Milner, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, is to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme, bearing date the 21st day of October, 1920, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the Church and Cure (hereinafter called 'the said Benefice') of Saint James, Ryhill, in the County of York and in the Diocese of York:

"Whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Saint James, Ryhill, is vested in the Honourable George Williams Phipps Winn, of Number 31, Montagu Square, London, W., Granville Robert Croft, of Nostell Priory, Wakefield, Esquire, and the Honourable Cecil Henry Winn, of Number 12, Buckingham Palace Gardens, London, S.W., as Trustees, and the said George William Phipps Winn, Granville Robert Croft, and Cecil Henry Winn are therefore the Patrons or persons entitled

to present or nominate to the said Benefice in case the same were now vacant:

"And whereas the said George William Phipps Winn, Granville Robert Croft, and Cecil Henry Winn are desirous that the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Saint James, Ryhill, should be transferred to and be vested in the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Cosmo Gordon, now Archbishop of York, and his successors in the same Archbishopric:

"And whereas the said Cosmo Gordon, Archbishop of York, is willing to accept such transfer and in token of such his willingness and also in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop of the Diocese which by the Acts in the hereinbefore mentioned Act recited or by some or one of them is made necessary, he, the said Cosmo Gordon, Archbishop of York, has executed this Scheme as hereinafter mentioned:

"And whereas the transfer of the Patronage of the said Benefice of Saint James, Ryhill, which is hereinbefore mentioned and herein-after recommended and proposed, will render the same Benefice more eligible for augmentation out of Funds under our control, and this circumstance will in our opinion tend to make better provision for the cure of souls in the Parish or District in or in respect of which the right of Patronage or Advowson so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid arises or exists, that is to say, in the New Parish of Saint James, Ryhill:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said George William Phipps Winn, Granville Robert Croft, and Cecil Henry Winn, being the persons whose consents as Patrons are required by the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts and of the Act of the 1st and 2nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 106 (in testimony of which consents they have signed and sealed this Scheme) and with the consent of the said Cosmo Gordon, Archbishop of York (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme and sealed the same with his Archiepiscopal Seal), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day

of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Saint James, Ryhill, shall be transferred to the said Cosmo Gordon, Archbishop of York, and his successors in the same Archbishopric and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Cosmo Gordon, Archbishop of York, and by his successors in the same Archbishopric for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of York.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her late Majesty, Queen Victoria, chapter 37, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme, bearing date the 11th day of November, 1920, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter 37, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for authorizing the sale and disposal of certain property in the parish of Huish Episcopi, in the County of Somerset, now vested in us:

"Whereas under and by virtue of a certain Indenture bearing date the 21st day of December, 1901, and made between Octavia Augusta Frederica Lovibond, of 'Friedheim,' Heathview Gardens, Putney Heath, in the Metropolitan Borough of Wandsworth, Widow, of the one part, and the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England of the other part, the land situate in the parish of Huish Episcopi aforesaid, containing one acre three roods and nineteen perches or thereabouts, and particularly described in the said Indenture and coloured pink on the plan drawn thereon became with its appurtenances and is now vested in us:

"And whereas the said land is not subject to any outstanding beneficial lease or grant, and the same is now in our possession, but on account of its character or situation is unsuitable or inconvenient to be held or applied for the purposes for which estates vested in us are applicable under the Acts by which our proceedings are governed:

"And whereas with a view to the advantageous appropriation of the same or of the proceeds thereof for the ultimate improvement of our Common Fund, it is expedient that the said land or such part or parts thereof as we shall at any time and from time to time think fit should be sold or disposed of, and accordingly that we should be empowered to sell or dispose of our interest in such land or in any part or parts thereof, in such manner as shall appear to us advisable:

"Now, therefore, we humbly recommend and propose that we may be authorized and empowered by instrument or instruments in writing, duly executed according to law, from time to time to sell or dispose of and duly to convey, according to the provisions of the said

LLANIDLOES.—Forthwith and entirely in Parish Church of Llanidloes and in the Churchyard attached thereto. Provided that—

(a) In any walled grave now existing in the said Churchyard burial may be allowed subject to the condition that every coffin buried in such grave be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.

(b) In any earthen grave now existing in the said Churchyard, the burial may be allowed of the body of any member of the family of the person or persons heretofore buried in such grave, subject to the condition that no part of the coffin containing the body shall be at a depth less than three feet below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave.

(c) In the said Churchyard, in any grave space in which no interment has heretofore taken place, the burial may be allowed of the body of any person for whom or of any member of a family for which such grave space has been reserved and appropriated as a burial place, with the exclusive right of burial therein, subject to the condition that no part of the coffin containing the body shall be at a depth less than three feet below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave.

WATFORD.—Forthwith and entirely in the Parish Church of Watford, Rugby, and in the Churchyard attached thereto. Provided that—

(a) In the vault beneath the Church belonging at the present time to Baron Henley a further burial may be allowed subject to the condition that the person who buries the body in the vault shall within a period of twenty-four hours after the deposit in the vault of the coffin containing the body, cause the coffin to be wholly and permanently embedded in and covered with a layer or layers of good cement concrete, not less in any part than six inches in thickness.

UNEMPLOYMENT INSURANCE ACT, 1920.

PROPOSED HEARING BY THE MINISTER.

- (1) As attendant on the staff of a drapery establishment at meals taken by the staff in a dining room on the business premises, and
- (2) As a housemaid for the staff of a drapery establishment who reside in premises belonging to the establishment,

is such employment as to make that person an employed person within the meaning of the Act and especially,

- (a) whether the employment is employment in domestic service, and
- (b) whether the person is employed in a trade or business carried on for the purposes of gain ;

and further gave notice that persons claiming to be interested could, on or before the 6th December, 1920, make representations in writing or apply to be heard orally in connection with this question.

Now, therefore, the Minister of Labour hereby gives notice that an enquiry will be held at 8, Richmond Terrace, on Monday, 20th December, at 11 o'clock in the forenoon.

All persons claiming to be interested may attend to make oral representations on the above date at the time and place mentioned. Names and addresses of all persons wishing to attend the hearing must be received by the Principal Assistant Secretary, Ministry of Labour, Employment Department, Queen Anne's Chambers, Westminster, S.W. 1, not later than 17th December, 1920. Failure to comply with this may entail refusal of a hearing.

SECTION II.—As respects the classes of workers specified in Section I. of this Part of this Notice.

1.—(a) In the case of classes of whole-time workers employed by the week or longer period, whose customary working week consists of a number of hours less than 48, but not less than 44, a "week" means a week of the number of hours customarily worked by the class in question;

(b) In all other cases a "week" means a week of 48 hours.

2.—For the purpose of calculating the hourly rate applicable in respect of each hour of employment the rates set out above must be divided:

(a) In the case of the workers referred to in paragraph 1 (a) of this Section, by the number of hours per week customarily worked by the class in question;

(b) In all other cases by 48.

3.—Payment at not less than the hourly rate, calculated as described in paragraph 2 of this Section, must be made for all hours of employment (not merely for those constituting a "week" as described in paragraph 1).

PART III.

The proposed rates set out in the respective scales A, B and C in Parts I. and II. of this Notice shall apply as follows:—

SECTION (i).—The rates set out in Scale A shall apply (a) to all areas administered by Rural District Councils, and (b) to all areas which are administered by Municipal Borough Councils or Urban District Councils and which, according to the Census of 1911, had

a population of less than 5,000; but so as in neither case to apply to any area within the Metropolitan Police District.

SECTION (ii).—The rates set out in Scale B shall apply to all areas other than those specified in Sections (i) and (iii) of this Part of this Notice.

SECTION (iii).—The rates set out in Scale C shall apply to the area comprising the City of London and the Metropolitan Police District.

PART IV.

The above proposed Minimum Rates of Wages shall apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, to all workers in England and Wales, as specified in this Notice, in respect of all time during which they are employed in any branch of the trade specified in the Trade Boards (Grocery and Provisions) Order, 1920, that is to say:—

(b) the retail sale of any one or more of such articles is the main or principal business of that establishment or business or branch or department.

2. The wholesale sale (except when incidental to manufacture or production) of any of the articles specified in Schedule II. in or in connection with any establishment or business

or branch or department in which such sale is the main or principal business of that establishment, business, branch or department.

3. The sale of other goods when any such sale is carried on in association with the sales specified in paragraph 1 or paragraph 2 above if such sale involves the employment of workers who are also employed in those sales;

Including the following or similar operations when incidental to or carried on in conjunction with the sales specified in 1, 2, or 3, above:—

- (i) Checking, testing, grading.
- (ii) Weighing, measuring.
- (iii) Packeting, boxing, bundling, bagging, parcelling, packing, unpacking, labelling.
- (iv) Collecting, despatching, delivering.
- (v) Stock-keeping, warehousing, storing, cold-storing, refrigerating.
- (vi) Portering, loading, unloading, lift or hoist operating.
- (vii) Timekeeping, cleaning premises.
- (viii) Adjusting implements, cleaning implements, utensils or receptacles.
- (ix) Cleaning goods.
- (x) Window or show-case dressing.
- (xi) Garaging, horse or motor keeping, cleaning vehicles.
- (xii) Mixing, blending, crushing, grinding, mincing, shredding, cutting.
- (xiii) Sausage making, bacon processing, ham processing, ham boiling, ham or bacon curing.
- (xiv) Roasting coffee, blanching almonds.

- (b) The sale of goods for export and operations incidental thereto except when carried on in conjunction with the sale of goods for distribution within the United Kingdom.
- (c) The transport of goods by common carriers.
- (d) Operations performed by workers engaged in any industry or trade concerned exclusively with carting and operations incidental thereto.
- (e) Post Office business.
- (f) Operations in agriculture within the meaning of the Corn Production Act, 1917.
- (g) Operations performed by workers employed by wholesale brokers or merchants who do not employ warehouse workers or carters.
- (h) Sales and operations incidental thereto covered by the Trade Boards (Milk Distributive) Order, 1920.

PART V.

SECTION (i).—The above proposed General Minimum Time-Rates shall be paid clear of all deductions other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments, or deductions authorised by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any Superannuation or other Provident Fund.

SECTION (ii).—The above proposed General Minimum Time-Rates are without prejudice to workers who are earning higher rates of wages or to agreements made or that may be made between employers and workers for the payment of wages in excess of these minimum rates of wages.



MIDDLESEX (ACTON DISTRICT) (CON-
TROL OF DOGS) ORDER OF 1920.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

*Prohibition of Movement of Dogs out of
certain District.*

1. (1) No dog shall be moved out of the District described in the First Schedule hereto, hereinafter referred to as "the Scheduled District," provided that this Article shall not apply to—

(a) the movement of a dog under a licence granted by the Minister under the Importation of Dogs Order of 1914 and the Importation of Dogs (Amendment) Order of 1918 (No. 2) to a port in Great Britain for shipment, or to a place of detention for the purpose of detention and isolation; or

(b) the movement of a dog through the Scheduled District by railway from a place outside the District to another place outside the District without unnecessary delay and without being re-booked within the District.

(2) If any farm or holding (except any detached part) is partly within and partly without the Scheduled District, the whole shall be deemed to be within the Scheduled District.

*Prohibition of Movement of Dogs out of
Inner Controlled Area.*

2. No dog shall be moved out of the Area described in the Second Schedule hereto (hereinafter referred to as "the Inner Controlled Area"), provided that this Article shall not apply to—

(a) the movement of a dog under a licence granted by the Minister under the Importation of Dogs Order of 1914 and the Importation of Dogs (Amendment) Order of 1918 (No. 2) to a port in Great Britain for shipment, or to a place of detention for the purpose of detention and isolation; or

(b) the movement of a dog through such Area by railway from a place outside the Area to another place outside the Area without unnecessary delay and without being rebooked within the Area.

*Control and Muzzling of Dogs in Inner
Controlled Area.*

3. (1) A dog in the Inner Controlled Area shall at all times—

(a) whilst in or on any public place be efficiently muzzled with an effective wire cage muzzle, and shall also be led by a person with a collar and chain, or other attachment: Provided that the requirement as to leading shall not apply to a dog in charge of a competent person while being used for the driving or tending of cattle or sheep;

(b) whilst in or on any other place be—

(i.) confined in a kennel or other enclosure from which the dog cannot escape; or

(ii.) secured to some premises by a collar and chain; or

(iii.) efficiently muzzled with an effective wire cage muzzle.

Provided that paragraph (b) shall not apply to any pack of hounds while being exercised under the supervision of two or more competent attendants, or to any dog in charge of a competent person while being used for the capture or destruction of vermin or rabbits.

(2) The provisions of this Article shall not apply to any dog confined in a suitable hamper, crate, box or other receptacle, so constructed as to render it impossible for such dog while so confined to bite any person or animal.

*Seizure, Detention and Disposal of
Uncontrolled Dogs.*

4. (1) Any dog in the Inner Controlled Area which is not muzzled, or kept under control, as prescribed by this Order, may be seized by the Local Authority, or by the police, and any dog so seized shall be dealt with by the Local Authority as follows:—

(i.) If the dog is diseased or suspected, or has been bitten by a diseased or suspected dog, it shall be forthwith slaughtered.

(ii.) If the dog has been exposed to the infection of rabies it shall be detained, slaughtered, or otherwise dealt with as the Local Authority think expedient, but so that the dog shall not, while detained by the Local Authority, be allowed to come in contact with any other animal.

(iii.) In any other case the dog shall be treated as a stray dog seized under the powers conferred by section three of the Dogs Act, 1906.

(2) No dog so seized shall be given or sold for the purposes of vivisection.

(3) Every dog shall, for the purposes of this Article, be deemed to have been exposed to the infection of rabies which has been in the same shed, stable, building, kennel, field, or other place, or otherwise in contact with any diseased or suspected dog, or which has in any other way been exposed to the infection of rabies.

*Prohibition of Holding of Exhibitions or
Shows of Dogs in Scheduled District.*

5. No exhibition or show of dogs, whether for sale or otherwise, shall be held in the Scheduled District (including the Inner Controlled Area).

Seizure of Dogs in case of Default.

6. (1) If a dog has been moved in contravention of this Order an Inspector of the Ministry may seize the dog, and thereupon the Ministry shall detain and isolate it at any place of detention selected by them for such time as the Ministry consider necessary or expedient.

(2) If the owner of the dog does not, within ten days after the expiration of such period as the Ministry may think necessary or expedient and notify to the owner, claim the dog from the Ministry and pay to them their expenses of detaining and isolating the dog, the Ministry may destroy or otherwise dispose of the dog as they think expedient.

*Notice of Detention in case of Illegal
Movement.*

7. (1) Where an Inspector or other Officer of the Ministry, or of a Local Authority, has reason to believe that a dog has been moved in contravention of this Order, he may give

notice to the owner or person in charge of the dog requiring that the dog shall be detained and isolated in accordance with the provisions of such notice, and that within a time specified in such notice, the dog shall be moved to a place of detention for the purpose of such detention and isolation:

(2) Such provisions may be inserted in the notice as the Ministry may think necessary or desirable for any of the following purposes, namely:—

(i.) For prescribing and regulating the detention and isolation of the dog.

(ii.) For prescribing the person by whom and the premises on which the dog shall be detained and isolated.

(iii.) For regulating the movement of the dog to the place of detention.

(iv.) For prescribing the confinement of the dog in a suitable hamper, crate, box, or other receptacle, or the muzzling of the dog, during its movement by railway, or along a highway or thoroughfare.

(v.) For prescribing the mode of isolation of the dog.

(vi.) For prescribing the notice to be given of the death or loss of the dog, or of any matter arising in connection with the movement, detention, or isolation of the dog, and the persons by whom and to whom the notice is to be given; and

(vii.) For prescribing the production of the notice for inspection by an Officer of the Ministry, or police constable, or officer of the Local Authority.

(3) The operation of a notice under this Article may be terminated by notice to that effect given by an Inspector or other Officer of the Ministry, or of the Local Authority, to the owner or person in charge of the dog, on proof to the satisfaction of the Inspector or Officer that the dog was not moved in contravention of the said Order.

(4) If the owner or person in charge of the dog, after receipt of such notice, fails to move the dog as required by the notice, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(5) If the provisions inserted in any notice under this Article are not complied with, the owner of the dog and the person in charge of the dog, and any person who being required to comply with any such provision fails to do so, shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

Offences.

8. (1) If a dog is moved in contravention of this Order, the owner of the dog, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the dog, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the dog is moved shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

(2) If any dog is not kept under control in manner prescribed by this Order, the owner of the dog, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Local Authority to Enforce Order.

9. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Interpretation.

10. In this Order—

“The Minister and the Ministry” mean the Minister and Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries.

“The Act of 1894” means the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

“Disease” means rabies, “diseased” means affected with rabies, and “suspected” means suspected of rabies.

“Public place” includes any street, highway, thoroughfare, public bridge, Royal park, public park, garden or pleasure ground, common, unenclosed land, or other place to which the public have for the time being access.

Other terms have the same meaning as in the Rabies Order of 1919.

Commencement.

11. This Order shall come into operation on the tenth day of December, nineteen hundred and twenty.

Short Title.

12. This Order may be cited as the MIDDLESEX (ACTON DISTRICT) (CONTROL OF DOGS) ORDER OF 1920.
