PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the territories in East Africa situate within the limits of this Order and forming part of the Protectorate known as the East Africa Protectorate, are under the protection of His Majesty the King:

And whereas British subjects have settled in large numbers in the said territories and it is expedient, with a view to the further development and more convenient administration of the said territories, that they should be annexed to and should henceforth form part of His Majesty's Dominions:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

I. This Order may be cited as the Kenya (Annexation) Order in Council, 1920.

II. Until further provision shall be made in respect thereof, the limits of this Order are the territories comprised in the East Africa Pro-

tectorate as specified in the East Africa Order in Council, 1902, save and excepting only such territories therein included as form part of the Dominions of His Highness the Sultan of Zanzibar.

III. From and after the coming into operation of this Order the said territories shall be annexed to and form part of His Majesty's Dominions and shall be known as the Colony of Kenya, hereinafter called the Colony.

IV. Nothing in this Order shall affect the validity of any Commission or Instructions issued by His Majesty under the Royal Sign Manual and Signet to the Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the territories now included within the limits of this Order, or of any Order in Council affecting the said territories, or of any Ordinance, Proclamation or Regulations passed or issued under any such Instructions or Order, or of any act or thing done under any such Instructions, Order, Ordinance, Proclamation or Regulations, save in so far as any provision of any such Order in Council, Ordinance, Proclamation or Regulations may be repugnant to the provisions of any Act of Parliament which may, by reason of the annexation hereby

declared, become extended to the Colony or to any Order or Regulation made under the authority of any such Act, or having in the Colony the force and effect of any such Act.

V. This Order shall be published in the Official Gazette of the East Africa Protectorate, and shall thereupon commence and come into operation, and the Governor shall give directions for the publication of this Order at such places and in such manner, and for such time or times, as he thinks proper for giving publicity thereto within the Colony.

VI. His Majesty may from time to time revoke, alter, add to, or amend this Order.

And the Right Honourable Viscount Milner, G.C.B., G.C.M.G., one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, is to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by the Foreign Jurisdiction Act, 1890, it is, amongst other things, enacted that it shall be lawful for His Majesty the King to hold, exercise, and enjoy any jurisdiction which His Majesty now has or may at any time hereafter have within a foreign country in the same and as ample a manner as if His Majesty had acquired that jurisdiction by the cession or conquest of territory:

And whereas by an Order in Council bearing date the Eleventh day of June, 1920, and entitled the Kenya (Annexation) Order in Council, 1920, it is provided that the territories comprised in the East Africa Protectorate save and excepting only such territories therein included as form part of the Dominions of His Highness the Sultan of Zanzibar shall, from and after the coming into operation of the said Order, be annexed to and form part of His Majesty's Dominions and shall be known as the Colony of Kenya:

And whereas the said Order in Council was published in the Official Gazette of the East Africa Protectorate on the Twenty-third day of July, 1920, and thereupon commenced and came into operation:

And whereas His Majesty has this day been pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to direct that Letters Patent be passed under the Great Seal of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland constituting the office of Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Kenya, and, amongst other things, establishing a Legislative Council for the said Colony, with certain powers and authority to legislate for the said Colony, as in the said Letters Patent is more fully set forth:

And whereas it is expedient to make further and other provision for the peace, order, and good government of the territories formerly comprised in the East Africa Protectorate other than those now included in the Colony of Kenya:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers by the Foreign Jurisdiction Act, 1890, or otherwise in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of

His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

I. This Order may be cited as the Kenya Protectorate Order in Council, 1920.

II. This Order shall apply to the territories comprised in the East Africa Protectorate as specified in the East Africa Order in Council, 1902, save and excepting only such territories therein included as from and after the coming into operation of the Kenya (Annexation) Order in Council, 1920, were annexed to and form part of His Majesty's Dominions and are now known as the Colony of Kenya.

III. Nothing in this Order shall affect the validity of any Instructions issued by His Majesty under the Royal Sign Manual and Signet to the Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the territories now included within the limits of this Order, or of any Order in Council affecting the said territories, or of any Ordinance, Proclamation or Regulations passed or issued under any such Instructions or Order, or of any act or thing done under any such Instructions, Order, Ordinance, Proclamation or Regulations save in so far as any provision of any such Order in Council, Ordinance, Proclamation or Regulations may be repugnant to the provisions of this Order.

The territories within the limits of this Order shall be known and described as the Protectorate of Kenya.

IV. In this Order, unless the subject or context otherwise requires,—

"His Majesty" includes His Majesty's heirs and successors.

"Secretary of State" means one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State.

"Colony" means the Colony of Kenya.

"Protectorate" means the Protectorate of Kenya.

"Governor" means the Governor and Commander-in-Chief for the time being of the Colony of Kenya and includes every person for the time being administering the Government of the said Colony.

V. The Governor and Commander-in-Chief for the time being of the Colony (hereinafter called the Governor) shall be the Governor of the Protectorate, and he is hereby authorised, empowered and commanded to exercise on His Majesty's behalf all such powers and jurisdiction as His Majesty at any time before or after the passing of this Order had or may have within the said territories, and to that end to take or cause to be taken all such measures and to do or cause to be done all such matters and things therein as are lawful and as in the interest of His Majesty's service he may think expedient, subject to such instructions as may have been received, or as he may hereafter receive by Order in Council, or under His Majesty's Sign Manual and Signet, or through a Secretary of State.

And in the absence of such Instructions, any Instructions addressed to the Governor of the Colony by His Majesty, or through a Secretary of State shall in so far as they are applicable be observed by the Governor in the exercise of his powers and jurisdiction as Governor of the Protectorate.

VI. The Executive Council of the Colony shall be, and be deemed to be the Executive Council of the Protectorate.

VII. It shall be lawful for the Legislative Council for the time being of the Colony, by any ordinance or ordinances, to exercise and

provide for giving effect to all such power and jurisdiction as His Majesty at any time before or after the passing of this Order has acquired or may acquire in the Protectorate, and generally for the peace, order and good government of the Protectorate and of all persons therein.

Provided as follows:—

(1) That all laws, ordinances, proclamations, byelaws and regulations of whatsoever nature in force at the date of the commencement of this Order within the said Protectorate shall continue in force until repealed or revoked by or in pursuance of any law or ordinance passed by the Legislative Council of the Colony.

(2) That every suit, action, complaint, matter, or thing which shall be depending in any Court having jurisdiction within the said Protectorate at the commencement of this Order shall and may be proceeded with in such Court in like manner as if this Order had not been passed.

VIII. The Governor shall have a negative voice in the making and passing of all such Ordinances as aforesaid. And the right is hereby reserved to His Majesty to disallow any such Ordinances as aforesaid. Such disallowance shall be signified to the Governor through a Secretary of State, and shall take effect from the time when the same shall be promulgated by the Governor.

The right is also hereby reserved to His Majesty, with the advice and consent of Parliament or with the advice of His Privy Council, from time to time to make all such laws or ordinances as may appear to Him necessary for the exercise of such powers and jurisdiction as aforesaid as fully as if this Order had not been made.

IX. In the making and establishing of all such Ordinances the Governor and the Legislative Council shall conform to and observe all rules, regulations and directions in that behalf contained in any Instructions under His Majesty's Sign Manual and Signet, and, until further directed, the Instructions in force for the time being as to the passing of Ordinances by the said Legislative Council for the peace, order and good government of the Colony shall, so far as they may be applicable, be taken and deemed to be in force in respect of Ordinances passed by the said Council by virtue of this Order.

X. When a Bill passed by the Legislative Council is presented to the Governor for his assent, he shall, according to his discretion, but subject to any Instructions addressed to him under His Majesty's Sign Manual and Signet or through a Secretary of State, declare that he assents thereto, or refuses his assent to the same, or that he reserves the same for the signification of His Majesty's pleasure.

No law shall take effect until either the Governor shall have assented thereto in His Majesty's name or on His Majesty's behalf, and shall have signed the same in token of such assent, or until His Majesty shall have given His assent thereto by Order in Council or through one of His Principal Secretaries of State.

XI. The Governor may reserve for the signification of His Majesty's pleasure any Bill passed by the Legislative Council, and shall so reserve any such Bill which is in any way repugnant to or inconsistent with any of the provisions of any Instructions addressed to him under His

Majesty's Sign Manual and Signet. A Bill so reserved shall take effect so soon as His Majesty shall have given His assent to the same by Order in Council, or through a Secretary of State, and the Governor shall have signified such assent by proclamation in the Official Gazette of the Colony.

XII. The Courts now or hereafter established in the Colony shall have in respect of matters occurring within the Protectorate, so far as such matters are within the jurisdiction of His Majesty, the same jurisdiction, civil and criminal, original and appellate, as they respectively possess from time to time in respect of matters occurring within the Colony, and the judgments, decrees, orders and sentences of any such Court made or given in the exercise of the jurisdiction hereby conferred may be enforced and executed, and appeals therefrom may be had and prosecuted in the same way as if the judgment, decree, order or sentence had been made or given under the ordinary jurisdiction of the Court.

XIII. In any of the events in which he is authorised, by the aforesaid Letters Patent, constituting the office of Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony or any other Letters Patent adding to, amending or substituted for the same, to appoint a Deputy within any part or parts of the Colony, the Governor may appoint any person or persons to be his Deputy or Deputies within any part or parts of the Protectorate and in that capacity to exercise, during his pleasure, such of the powers and authorities vested in the Governor as shall in the instrument appointing him be specified and limited, but no others. Every such Deputy shall conform to and observe all such instructions as the Governor shall from time to time address to him for his guidance. Provided nevertheless that by the appointment of a Deputy or Deputies as aforesaid the power and authority of the Governor shall not be abridged, altered, or in any way affected otherwise than His Majesty may at any time hereafter think proper to direct.

XIV. The Governor may constitute and appoint all such Judges, Commissioners, Justices of the Peace and other necessary officers as may be lawfully constituted and appointed by His Majesty, all of whom, unless otherwise provided by law, shall hold their offices during His Majesty's pleasure.

XV. The Governor, in His Majesty's name and on His Majesty's behalf, may make and execute, under the Public Seal grants and dispositions of any lands within the Protectorate which may be lawfully granted or disposed of by His Majesty: Provided that every such grant or disposition be made in conformity, either with some Order in Council or law now or hereafter in force in the Protectorate, or with some Instructions which may be addressed to the Governor under His Majesty's Sign Manual and Signet, or through one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State.

XVI. The Governor may, upon sufficient cause to him appearing, dismiss any public officer not appointed by virtue of a Warrant from His Majesty, whose pensionable emoluments do not exceed one hundred pounds sterling a year, provided that in every such case the grounds of intended dismissal are definitely stated in writing, and communicated to the officer in order that he may have full opportunity of exculpating himself, and that the

matter is investigated by the Governor with the aid of the head for the time being of the department in which the officer is serving.

The Governor may, upon sufficient cause to him appearing, also suspend from the exercise of his office any person holding any office within the Protectorate whether appointed by virtue of any Commission or Warrant from His Majesty, or in His Majesty's Name, or by any other mode of appointment. Such suspension shall continue and have effect only until His Majesty's pleasure therein shall be signified to the Governor. If the suspension is confirmed by a Secretary of State, the Governor shall forthwith cause the officer to be so informed, and thereupon his office shall become vacant. In proceeding to any such suspension, the Governor is strictly to observe the directions in that behalf given to him as Governor of the Colony by any Instructions from His Majesty or signified through a Secretary of State.

XVII. When any crime or offence has been committed within the Protectorate or for which the offender may be tried therein, the Governor may, as he shall see occasion, in His Majesty's name and on His Majesty's behalf, grant a pardon to any accomplice in such crime or offence who shall give such information and evidence as shall lead to the conviction of the principal offender, or of any one of such offenders if more than one; and, further, may grant to any offender convicted of any crime or offence in any Court or before any person having jurisdiction to try any such crime or offence within the Protectorate, a pardon, either free or subject to lawful conditions, or any remission of the sentence passed on such offender, or any respite of the execution of such sentence, for such period as the Governor thinks fit, and may remit any fines, penalties, or forfeitures which may become due and payable to His Majesty.

XVIII. The Seal now or hereafter in use as the Public Seal of the Colony shall be and be deemed to be also the Public Seal of the Protectorate, and shall be used for sealing all things whatsoever that shall pass the said Seal.

XIX. This Order shall be published in the Official Gazette of the Colony, and shall thereupon commence and come into operation; and the Governor shall give directions for the publication of this Order at such places and in such manner, and for such time or times as he thinks proper for giving due publicity thereto within the Protectorate.

XX. His Majesty may from time to time revoke, alter, add to, or amend this Order.

And the Right Honourable Viscount Milner, G.C.B., G.C.M.G., one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, is to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 37, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in

Council, a Scheme, bearing date the 18th day of November, 1920, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 37, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for authorising the sale and disposal of certain property in the City and County of Chester now vested in us:

"Whereas under and by virtue of the two Indentures particulars whereof are set forth in the Schedule hereunder written, the lands, tenements and hereditaments situate in the City of Chester aforesaid, and particularly described in the same Indentures and Schedule became with their appurtenances and are now vested in us:

"And whereas none of the said lands, tenements and hereditaments is subject to any outstanding beneficial lease or grant but the same are now in our possession, but some portions thereof on account of their character or situation are unsuitable or inconvenient to be held or applied for the purposes for which estates vested in us are applicable under the Acts by which our proceedings are governed:

"And whereas with a view to the advantageous appropriation of the same or of the proceeds thereof for the ultimate improvement of our Common Fund it is expedient that the said lands, tenements and hereditaments, or such part or parts thereof as we shall at any time and from time to time think fit should be sold or disposed of, and accordingly that we should be empowered to sell or dispose of our interest in such lands, tenements and hereditaments, or in any part or parts thereof, in such manner as shall appear to us advisable:

"Now, therefore, we humbly recommend and propose that we may be authorized and empowered by instrument or instruments in writing, duly executed according to law, from time to time to sell or dispose of and duly to convey, according to the provisions of the said Act, all or any of the said lands, tenements and hereditaments so vested in us as aforesaid, under and by virtue of the said Indentures or either of them, with their appurtenances, and all our estate, right, title and interest therein or in any part or parts thereof unto and to the use of any person or persons desirous or willing to purchase the same and his or their heirs, executors, administrators or assigns, or otherwise as he or they shall direct or appoint and for such consideration as shall upon due calculation and enquiry appear to us to be just and reasonable, it being our intention to invest the proceeds of such sale from time to time as occasion may arise in the purchase of other lands, tithes, rent-charges, tenements or hereditaments, or of some estate or interest therein convenient to be held by us for the purposes of the Acts by which our proceedings are governed as aforesaid, and in the meantime to invest the said proceeds in some Government or Parliamentary Stock or other public securities in England.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, or of any other Act of Parliament.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the Diocese of Chester.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 8th and 9th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 70; of the Act of the 14th and 15th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 97; and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55; duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Representation, bearing date the 4th day of November, 1920, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 8th and 9th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 70, of the Act of the 14th and 15th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 97, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Representation as to the assignment of a Consolidated Chapelry to the consecrated Church of Saint Hilda, Prestwich, situate within the Parish of Prestwich, in the County of Lancaster and in the Diocese of Manchester:

"Whereas at certain extremities of the said Parish of Prestwich and of the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Saint Margaret, Holyrood, Prestwich, which said extremities lie contiguous one to another, and are

described in the Schedule hereunder written, there is collected together a population which is situate at a distance from the several Churches of such Parish and New Parish respectively:

"And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that certain contiguous portions (being the portions containing the population aforesaid) of the said Parish of Prestwich and of the said New Parish of Saint Margaret, Holyrood, Prestwich, should be formed into a Consolidated Chapelry for all Ecclesiastical purposes, and that the same should be assigned to the said Church of Saint Hilda, Prestwich, situate as aforesaid:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Edmund Arbuthnott, Bishop of Manchester, as such Bishop and also as one of the Patrons of the Rectory of the said Parish of Prestwich, with the consents of the Archdeacon of the Archdeaconry of Rochdale, the Mayor of Oldham, the Chairman of the Urban District Council of Prestwich, and the Churchwarden elected by the Parishioners of the said Parish of Prestwich, as the remaining Patrons of the said Rectory of the Parish of Prestwich, and with the consent of the Reverend Frederic Wilson Cooper, Rector or Incumbent of the said Rectory of the Parish of Prestwich, and as such Rector or Incumbent the Patron of the Vicarage of the said New Parish of Saint Margaret, Holyrood, Prestwich, (in testimony whereof they the said consenting parties have respectively signed and sealed this Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all those contiguous portions of the said Parish of Prestwich and of the said New Parish of Saint Margaret, Holyrood, Prestwich, which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which portions, together with the boundaries thereof are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be united and formed into one Consolidated Chapelry for the said Church of Saint Hilda, Prestwich, situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'the Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Hilda, Prestwich.'

"We, therefore, humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal consideration, and to make such order in respect thereto as to Your Majesty in Your Royal Wisdom shall seem meet.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Hilda, Prestwich, comprising:—

"All those contiguous portions of the Parish of Prestwich and of the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Saint Margaret, Holyrood, Prestwich, both in the County of Lancaster and in the Diocese of Manchester, which, taken together, are bounded upon the south-east by the Parish of Saint Mary, Crumpsall, upon the east by the New Parish of Saint Andrew, Blackley, both in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the north, upon the north-west, upon the south-west and upon the south, by an imaginary line commencing at the point on the eastern side of the old course of the River Irk where the boundaries of the said New Parish of Saint Andrew, Blackley, the said New Parish of Saint Margaret, Holyrood, Prestwich, and the said Parish of Prestwich all meet, and extending thence westward in a straight line (thereby crossing Middleton Road and Heaton Park and also the boundary which divides the said Parish of Prestwich from the said New Parish of Saint Margaret, Holyrood, Prestwich) for a distance of 1 mile and 2 chains or thereabouts to the junction of Bury Old Road and Kenyon Lane, and extending thence south-westward along the middle of Kenyon Lane for a distance of 10 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Bailey Street, almost opposite to the wall or fence forming the northern boundary of the Heaton Park Recreation Ground, and extending thence south-westward to and along the said wall or fence for a distance of $4\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to its western end, and continuing thence south-westward in precisely the same direction and in a straight line (thereby crossing Heaton Street) for a distance of $7\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to a point in the middle of the Manchester, Whitefield and Radcliffe Line of the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Margaret, Holyrood, Prestwich, from the said Parish of Prestwich, and extending thence westward along the last mentioned boundary (thereby following the middle of the said line of railway) for a distance of $6\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries the said line of railway across the footpath leading from Orange Hill to Rectory Lane, and extending thence south-westward along the middle of the said footpath for a distance of 12 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Rectory Lane, and extending thence south-westward across Rectory Lane for a distance of 8 yards or thereabouts to the point where the fence forming the western boundary of the close numbered 261 upon the Ordnance Map of the Civil Parish of Prestwich published in the year 1909 upon the scale of 25 inches to a mile and also upon the map or plan which is annexed to this Representation meets the southern side of Rectory Lane, and extending thence first south-westward and then in various directions along the last mentioned fence and along the fences forming the south-western boundary of the said close and of the closes numbered 260, 311 and 356 upon the said maps for a distance in all of 41 chains or thereabouts to the point where the last men-

tioned fence meets the northern side of Scholes Lane, and extending thence first southward to and then eastward along the middle of Scholes Lane for a distance of 30 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Bury Old Road and Sheepfoot Lane, and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of Sheepfoot Lane for a distance of 33 chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries such lane across the said Manchester, Whitefield and Radcliffe Line of the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of the said line of railway for a distance of 15 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said Parish of Prestwich from the said Parish of Saint Mary, Crumpsall."

And whereas the said Representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Manchester.

TRADE BOARDS ACTS, 1909 AND 1918. COFFIN FURNITURE AND CEREMENT MAKING TRADE BOARD (GREAT BRITAIN).

MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES (AS VARIED) FOR
 MALE WORKERS OF 21 YEARS OF AGE AND
 OVER. EFFECTIVE AS FROM 13TH DECEM-
 BER, 1920.*

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour, and dated 31st October, 1918, the Trade Board established in Great Britain under the Trade Boards Act, 1918, for the Branches of Trade specified in the Trade Boards (Coffin Furniture and Cerement-Making) Order, 1919, having given due Notice on 19th August, 1920, of Proposal to Vary the General Minimum Time-Rates, Piece-Work Basis Time-Rates, and Overtime Rates for Male Workers of 21 years of age and over in the Coffin Furniture section of the Trade, hereby give notice as required by Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, that they have varied such General Minimum Time-Rates, Piece-Work Basis Time-Rates and Overtime Rates, and that the Minimum Rates as varied are shown in the Schedule set out below which is incorporated herewith.

And the Trade Board further give notice that they have received notification from the Minister of Labour that he has made an Order dated 6th December, 1920, under Section 4 (2) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, confirming the Rates as varied by the Trade Board and specifying 13th December, 1920,* as the date from which such Minimum Rates shall become effective.

* *Note*.—Should this date, however, not correspond with the beginning of the period for which wages are paid by an employer who pays wages at intervals not exceeding seven days, the rates shall become effective as from the beginning of the next full pay period, but in no case later than 18th December, 1920.

SCHEDULE.

PART I.

*General Minimum Time-Rates (as Varied) for
 Male Workers of 21 Years of Age and Over.*

SECTION I.—For Male Workers of 21 years of age and over employed as Dressers, Stampers, Polishers or Planishers (including Wheelers).

(a) Dressers and Stampers:—

Workers of Grade I. as hereinafter defined, 80s. per week of 47 hours.

Workers of Grade II. as hereinafter defined, 87s. 6d. per week of 47 hours.

Workers of Grade III. as hereinafter defined, 92s. 6d. per week of 47 hours.

(b) Polishers and Planishers (including Wheelers):—

Workers of Grade I. as hereinafter defined, 81s. 6d. per week of 47 hours.

Workers of Grade II. as hereinafter defined, 90s. 6d. per week of 47 hours.

Workers of Grade III. as hereinafter defined, 95s. 6d. per week of 47 hours.

Provided that a Male Worker entering the trade as a Dresser, Stamper, Polisher, Planisher or Wheeler for the first time at or over the age of 21 may be employed, during the first three months of his employment, at

a rate of 10s. per week less, and during the second three months of his employment at a rate of 5s. per week less than the minimum rate otherwise applicable as set out above.

Definitions.—For the purpose of the above rates the following definitions shall apply:—

Dressers—

A Dresser of Grade I is a Male Worker of 21 years of age or over employed on Dressing and not fulfilling the conditions of Grade II or Grade III next hereinafter respectively defined.

A Dresser of Grade II is a Male Worker, of 21 years of age or over who has had not less than six years' experience as a Dresser and who turns, screws inside and out, files flat and square at the vice, and finishes his own work throughout.

A Dresser of Grade III is a Male Worker of 21 years of age or over who, in addition to fulfilling the conditions of Grade II. as above defined, is also an expert in all processes or is a Charge Hand with the duty of being responsible for all work and order in the shop.

Stampers—

A Stamper of Grade I is a Male Worker of 21 years of age or over employed on Stamping and not fulfilling the conditions of Grade II or Grade III next hereinafter respectively defined.

A Stamper of Grade II is a Male Worker of 21 years of age or over who has had not less than six years' experience as a Stamper and is an expert in all processes, and who undertakes all classes of work of all strengths of metal used.

A Stamper of Grade III is a Male Worker of 21 years of age or over who, in addition to fulfilling the conditions of Grade II as above defined, is an expert in all classes of Stamping, Pressing and Cutting-out by hand or who is a Charge Hand with the duty of being responsible for all work and order in the shop.

Polishers—

A Polisher of Grade I is a Male Worker of 21 years of age or over employed on Polishing and not fulfilling the conditions of Grade II or Grade III next hereinafter respectively defined.

A Polisher of Grade II is a Male Worker of 21 years of age or over who has had not less than six years' experience as a Polisher and is an expert in all processes of any class of common work and can emery-bob and mop best work.

A Polisher of Grade III is a Male Worker of 21 years of age or over who, in addition to fulfilling the conditions of Grade II as above defined, is also an expert in all processes of both common or best work or is a Charge Hand with the duty of being responsible for all work and order in the shop.

Planishers or Wheelers—

A Planisher or Wheeler of Grade I is a Male Worker of 21 years of age or over employed on Planishing or Wheeling and not fulfilling the conditions of Grade II or Grade III next hereinafter respectively defined.

A Planisher or Wheeler of Grade II is a Male Worker of 21 years of age or over who has had not less than six years' experience

as a Planisher or Wheeler and is an expert in all processes and is able to do good class work.

A Planisher or Wheeler of Grade III is a Male Worker of 21 years of age or over who, in addition to fulfilling the conditions of Grade II as above defined, is employed in making Mitred Breast Plates or Handled Plates of any design.

SECTION II.—For Male Workers of 21 years of age and over employed on Packing, Rough Warehousing and Despatching or other operations incidental to or appertaining to the manufacture of Coffin Furniture from any metal by any process:—

(a) Who have had less than one year's experience in the work on which they are employed or similar work, 56s. 6d. per week of 47 hours.

(b) Who have had not less than one year's experience and less than five years' experience in the work on which they are employed or similar work, 63s. 6d. per week of 47 hours.

(c) Who have had not less than five years' experience in the work on which they are employed or similar work, 69s. 6d. per week of 47 hours.

PART II.

Piece-Work Basis Time-Rates (as Varied) for Male Workers of 21 Years of Age and Over.

SECTION I.—The Piece-Work Basis Time-Rates for Male Piece-Workers of 21 years of age and over in the Coffin Furniture Section of the Trade specified in Part IV of this Schedule shall be 12½ per cent. above the appropriate General Minimum Time-Rate as set out in Sections I and II of Part I of this Schedule.

SECTION II.—In cases where a worker is employed on Piece-Work each Piece-Rate paid must be such as would yield, in the circumstances of the case, not less than the appropriate Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate to an ordinary worker, i.e., a worker of ordinary skill and experience in the class of work in question.

PART III.

Overtime Rates (as Varied) for Male Workers of 21 Years of Age and Over.

SECTION I.—In accordance with Section 3 (1) (c) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, the Trade Board have declared the normal number of hours of work in the trade to be as follows:—

In any week (exclusive of Sunday and any Customary Public or Statutory Holidays), 47.

On any day other than Saturday, 9.

On Saturday, 5.

Provided that all hours worked on Sundays and on Customary Public and Statutory Holidays shall be regarded as Overtime to which the Overtime Rates shall apply.

SECTION II.—The Overtime Rates in respect of hours worked by a worker in excess of the declared normal number of hours of work in the trade shall, in the case of workers employed on Time-Work, be as follows:—

(a) For all time worked on Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, the Overtime Rate shall be one-and-a-half times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, i.e., Time-and-a-Half.

(b) For all time worked on Sundays the Overtime Rate shall be twice the General

Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, i.e., Double Time; and

(c) For all other Overtime worked one-and-a-fifth times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, i.e., Time-and-a-Fifth.

The Overtime Rates shall be payable in respect of all hours worked in excess of 5 on a Saturday and in respect of all hours worked in excess of 9 on any other day (not being a Sunday or Customary Public or Statutory Holiday) notwithstanding that the total number of hours worked in the week does not exceed 47.

SECTION III.—The Minimum Rates for Overtime in respect of each hour of Overtime as defined above, worked by workers employed on Piece-Work, shall be:—

(a) For all time worked on Sundays, Piece-Rates each of which would yield, in the circumstances of the case, to an ordinary worker at least the Piece-work Basis Time-Rate applicable, with the addition of the General Minimum Time-Rate applicable as set out above.

(b) For all time worked on Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, Piece-Rates each of which would yield, in the circumstances of the case, to an ordinary worker at least the Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate applicable, with the addition of One-Half of the General Minimum Time-Rate applicable as set out above.

(c) For all other Overtime Worked, Piece-Rates each of which would yield, in the circumstances of the case, to an ordinary worker at least the Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate applicable, with the addition of One-Fifth of the General Minimum Time-Rate applicable as set out above.

PART IV.

The Minimum Rates of Wages set out in Parts I, II, and III of this Schedule shall apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, to all male workers of 21 years of age and over in Great Britain who are employed during the whole or any part of their time in the Coffin Furniture Section of the trade specified in the Trade Boards (Coffin Furniture and Cerement-Making) Order, 1919, that is to say:—

(a) The manufacture, wherever carried on, of Coffin Furniture from any metal by any process.

(b) The manufacture of Cerements, including shrouds, face curtains, face cloths, sidecloths, winding sheets, pillow covers, coffin pads, sleeves or frilling; including

(c) The operations of folding, packing, warehousing, despatching, or other operations incidental to or appertaining to the manufacture of any of the above-mentioned articles.

PART V.

SECTION I.—The General Minimum Time-Rates, Piece-Work Basis Time-Rates and Overtime Rates set out in Parts I, II and III. of this Schedule shall be paid clear of all deductions other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments or deductions authorised by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any superannuation or other Provident Fund.

SECTION II.—The above General Minimum Time-Rates, Piece-Work Basis Time-Rates and Overtime Rates are without prejudice to workers who are earning higher rates of wages, or to Agreements made, or that may be made, between Employers and Workers for the payment of Wages in excess of these Minimum Rates of Wages.

HEREFORD (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1920.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

1. Parts I and IV of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Control of Movement) Order of 1920, hereinafter referred to as "the principal Order," are hereby applied to the District described in the Schedule hereto, which shall be a Scheduled District for the purposes of that Order.

Movement within the Scheduled District.

2.—(1) Where an Inspector of the Ministry considers it necessary or expedient after inquiry that an animal in the Scheduled District should be permitted to be moved within the Scheduled District as often as occasion may require between different parts of the same farm, he may, notwithstanding any prohibition of movement contained in the principal Order, authorise such movement by an Occupation Licence, and the Inspector may insert in the licence such conditions as he may consider necessary or desirable for the purpose of preventing the animals referred to in the licence from coming into contact with any other animals.

(2) If in respect of any animal the conditions of a licence granted under this Article are not complied with, the owner of the animal and the person for the time being in charge thereof shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

Short Title.

3. This Order may be cited as the HEREFORD (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1920.

In the administrative county of Southampton:

The city of Winchester, the boroughs of Lymington, Andover, and Romsey, the petty sessional divisions of Christchurch, Southampton (including its detached part), Hythe, Lymington, Andover, Winchester, Fordingbridge, Ringwood, New Forest, and Romsey, and the parishes of Popham and Woodmancott.

In the administrative county of Somerset:
