

ORDER OF THE REGISTRAR-GENERAL
IN ENGLAND.

(Dated 14th December, 1920.)

Whereas by the 21st Section of the Births and Deaths Registration Act, 1874, and Section 3 of the Ministry of Health Act, 1919, it is enacted that the Registrar-General, with the sanction of the Minister of Health, may from time to time alter Registration Sub-districts:—

1. And whereas it is expedient, in order that Gillingham Municipal Borough may be wholly included in one Sub-district of Medway Registration District, that the part of that Borough now included in Rochester and Chatham Sub-district should be transferred to Gillingham Sub-district;

2. Now, therefore, I, Sir Bernard Mallet, K.C.B., Registrar-General of Births, Deaths and Marriages in England, in exercise of the powers given me by the first-mentioned Act, and with the sanction of the Minister of Health, do hereby order and declare that the foregoing alteration shall take effect accordingly.

3. This Order shall come into operation on the first day of January, nineteen hundred and twenty-one.

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1. And whereas it is expedient that New Forest Registration District should be re-divided into two Sub-districts to be known and constituted as follows:—

1. Lyndhurst Sub-district to comprise the parishes of Bramshaw, East Bramshaw, Colbury, Copythorne, Eling, Lyndhurst, Minstead and Netley Marsh; and

2. Fawley Sub-district to comprise the parishes of Beaulieu, Dibden, Exbury, Fawley, Marchwood, and Denny Lodge;

2. Now, therefore, I, Sir Bernard Mallet, K.C.B., Registrar-General of Births, Deaths and Marriages in England, in exercise of the powers given me by the first-mentioned Act, and with the sanction of the Minister of Health, do hereby order and declare that the foregoing alteration shall take effect accordingly.

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1. And whereas it is expedient that Wigton Registration District should be re-divided into two Sub-districts to be known and constituted as follows:—

1. Wigton Sub-district to comprise the parishes of Aikton, Allhallows, Aspatia and Brayton, Blennerhasset and Kirkland, Boltons, Caldbeck, High Ireby, Low Ireby, Kirkbampton, Oulton, Sebergham, Thursby, Torpenhow and Whitrigg, Uldale, Westward, Wigton, Woodside, and Waverton; and

2. Abbey Holme Sub-district to comprise the parishes of Allonby, Bromfield, Blencogo, Bowness, Dundraw, Hayton and Mealo, Holme Abbey, Holme Low, Holme St. Cuthbert, Holme East Waver, Kirkbride, Langrigg and Mealrigg, and Westnewton, together with Skinburness Marsh (common to Holme Abbey, Holme Low, and Holme St. Cuthbert parishes).

2. Now, therefore, I, Sir Bernard Mallet, K.C.B., Registrar-General of Births, Deaths and Marriages in England, in exercise of the powers given me by the first-mentioned Act, and with the sanction of the Minister of Health, do hereby order and declare that the foregoing alteration shall take effect accordingly.

INCOME TAX.
