A PROCLAMATION  
FOR A BANK HOLIDAY.

GEORGE R.I.

**W**E, considering that it is desirable that Saturday, the First day of January next, should be kept as a close holiday in all Banks in England and Wales, and Ireland, do hereby, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, and in pursuance of Section four of the Bank Holidays Act, 1871, appoint the said Saturday, the First day of January next, to be observed as a Bank Holiday in England and Wales, and in Ireland, for the purposes of the said Act, and We do, by this Our Royal Proclamation, command the said day to be so observed, and all Our loving subjects to order themselves accordingly:

And whereas it is customary for the usual Bank Holidays to be kept as holidays by Our loving subjects generally and not only for the purposes of the said Act, but it is not Our intention that the said First day of January should be kept as a general holiday in England and Wales, and in Ireland:

Now, therefore, We do hereby enjoin that the said First day of January shall not be kept as or deemed by virtue of this Our Royal Proclamation to be a holiday in England and Wales, and in Ireland, for any purposes whatsoever other than the purposes of the said Act.

Given at Our Court at Buckingham Palace, this Twenty-first day of December, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and twenty, and in the Eleventh year of Our Reign.

**W**HEREAS it is provided by the Ministry of Transport Act, 1919, that, as from such date or dates as His Majesty in Council may by Order determine, there shall be trans-

ferred to the Minister of Transport all powers and duties of any Government Department in relation to:—

- (a) Railways;
- (b) Light Railways;
- (c) Tramways;
- (d) Canals, Waterways, and Inland Navigations;
- (e) Roads, Bridges and Ferries, and Vehicles and Traffic thereon;
- (f) Harbours, Docks and Piers:

And whereas it is further provided by the said Act that His Majesty may by Order make such incidental, consequential, and supplemental provisions as may be necessary or expedient for the purpose of giving full effect to any transfer of powers or duties as aforesaid, including provisions for the transfer of any property, rights and liabilities held, enjoyed, or incurred by any Government Department in connection with any powers or duties transferred:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as "The Ministry of Transport (Menai Bridge Transfer of Powers and Property) Order, 1920."

2. The date as from which the powers and duties of the Commissioners of Works in relation to Menai Bridge are transferred to the Minister of Transport shall be the 1st day of January, 1921.

3. As from that date all the property, rights and liabilities held, enjoyed or incurred by the Commissioners of Works shall be transferred to and vested in the Minister of Transport and such rights and liabilities shall be exercisable by or enforceable against the Minister of Transport in like manner as they would have been by or against the Commissioners of Works if this Order had not been made.

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being, or having been, an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions, and provisions, as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas we have found it desirable for disciplinary and other reasons that certain Torpedo Boat Destroyers of Your Majesty's Navy should be made independent commands:

"And whereas we consider that the increase of clerical work involved by this change warrants the payment of an allowance to the rating employed on clerical duties in these vessels:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to authorize the payment with effect as from the 1st May, 1920, of an allowance of 6d. a day to the ratings employed as Captain's Writer on Torpedo Boat Destroyers which are independent commands:

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions, and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas Your Majesty was graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council bearing date the 11th day of February, 1913, to make provision for the promotion of Warrant Officers, non-Commissioned Officers and Men to Commissioned rank in the Royal Marines, and to sanction certain regulations for their rank and promotion whilst undergoing training:

"And whereas we are of opinion that it is desirable to amend these regulations so as to provide that promotion to Commissioned rank be obtainable by Warrant Officers, non-Commissioned Officers and men of the Royal Marines at an earlier age than is at present possible:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to approve of candidates selected for commissions under the provisions of Order in Council of the 11th February, 1913, being granted, on promotion the rank of Probationary Second Lieutenant, Royal Marines, with pay at the rate of 16s. a day, their advancement to the confirmed rank of Second Lieutenant and to higher ranks

continuing to be governed by the regulations already laid down:

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals."

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Act, 1919, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of two neighbouring Benefices that is to say the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Ellerton Priory and the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Aughton with East Cottingwith, both of which Benefices are situate in the County of York and in the Diocese of York:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Cosmo Gordon, Archbishop of York, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Act, 1919, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Ellerton Priory and Aughton with East Cottingwith duly made their Report to the said Archbishop of York and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Archbishop of York signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

"And whereas the said Benefice of Ellerton Priory is now full, the Reverend Frederick Charnock Bamford Darwent being the present Incumbent thereof, and the said Benefice of Aughton with East Cottingwith is at present vacant:

"And whereas the said Frederick Charnock Bamford Darwent has consented to become the first Incumbent of the united Benefice, if and when the union which is hereinafter recommended and proposed shall take effect:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Cosmo Gordon, Archbishop of York (in testimony whereof he has hereunto set his hand), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That the said Benefice of Ellerton Priory and the said Benefice of Aughton with East Cottingwith shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Ellerton Priory with Aughton and East Cottingwith,' but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

"2. That upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect, and the said Frederick Charnock Bamford Darwent, if he is then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Ellerton Priory, shall be the first Incumbent of the united Benefice.

"3. That after the said union has taken effect the course and succession in which the

respective Patrons shall present and nominate to the united Benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, the right of presentation shall be exercised by the Patrons of the said two Benefices alternately, the Patron of the said Benefice of Aughton with East Cottingwith having the right of presentation upon the first avoidance of the united Benefice after the union and every alternate right of presentation, and the Patron of the said Benefice of Ellerton Priory having the right of presentation upon the second avoidance of the united Benefice after the union and every alternate turn thereafter.

"Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been published locally in the manner prescribed in the Statutory Rules made under the said Act and also transmitted in the manner so prescribed to the Patrons affected together with a notice in each case requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the same Rules:

And whereas the prescribed time has elapsed and no such objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners:

following Scheme for effecting the union of two neighbouring Benefices, that is to say the Benefice of Gate Helmsley with Upper Helmsley and the Benefice of Holtby with Warthill, both of which Benefices are situate in the County of York and in the Diocese of York:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Cosmo Gordon, Archbishop of York, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Act, 1919, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Gate Helmsley with Upper Helmsley and Holtby with Warthill duly made their report to the said Archbishop of York, and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Archbishop of York signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

"And whereas the said Benefice of Gate Helmsley with Upper Helmsley is now full the Reverend Arthur Lionel Whitaker being the present Incumbent thereof and the said Benefice of Holtby with Warthill is at present vacant:

"And whereas the said Arthur Lionel Whitaker has consented to become the first Incumbent of the united Benefice, if and when the union which is hereinafter recommended and proposed shall take effect:

"And whereas the Patronage of each of the said Benefices of Gate Helmsley with Upper Helmsley and Holtby with Warthill as to one alternate turn or right of presentation is vested in Your Majesty your heirs and successors and is exercised on behalf of Your Majesty by the Lord High Chancellor of England for the time being and as to the other alternate turn or right of presentation is vested in the said Archbishop of York and his successors:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Cosmo Gordon, Archbishop of York (in testimony whereof he has hereunto set his hand), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That the said Benefice of Gate Helmsley with Upper Helmsley and the said Benefice of Holtby with Warthill shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Gate and Upper Helmsley with Holtby and Warthill' but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

"2. That upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme shall be published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect, and the said Arthur Lionel Whitaker if he is then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Gate Helmsley with Upper Helmsley shall be the first Incumbent of the united Benefice.

"3. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at Warthill at present belonging to the said Benefice of Gate Helmsley with Upper Helmsley shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the united Benefice.

"4. That after the said union has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present and nominate



to the united Benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, the right of presentation shall be exercised by the Patrons of the said two Benefices alternately, the Archbishop of York having the right of presentation upon the first avoidance of the united Benefice after the union and every alternate right of presentation and the Lord Chancellor having the right of presentation upon the second avoidance of the united Benefice after the union and every alternate turn thereafter.

"Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been published locally in the manner prescribed in the Statutory Rules made under the said Act and also transmitted in the manner so prescribed to the Patrons affected together with a Notice in each case requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the same Rules:

**WHEREAS** the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 37, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme, bearing date the 2nd day of December, 1920, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 37, and of the Act of the 19th

and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for constituting a separate District for spiritual purposes to be taken partly out of the Parish of Worplesdon and partly out of the Parish of Woking, both in the County of Surrey and in the Diocese of Winchester:

"Whereas we are satisfied that the said Parish of Worplesdon and the said Parish of Woking are Cures wherein or in parts whereof the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof, and it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular portions of the said Parish of Worplesdon and of the said Parish of Woking which are hereinafter mentioned and described should be constituted a separate District in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

"And whereas there is at present within the limits of the said proposed separate District one consecrated Church or Chapel known as Saint Luke's Church in use for the purpose of Divine Worship, and it is intended that such Church or Chapel shall be used as a Chapel of Ease to the permanent Church which is to be erected within and for the said proposed District:

"And whereas by a certain Indenture bearing date on or about the 2nd day of December, 1920, and made or expressed to be made under the authority of the 'New Parishes Acts, 1843, 1844 and 1856,' or some or one of them, between the Reverend John Collingwood Gainsford Bruce, Rector or Incumbent of the Rectory of the said Parish of Worplesdon, of the first part, the Provost of the College Royal of the Blessed Mary of Eton, near unto Windsor, in the County of Bucks, commonly called the King's College of Our Blessed Lady of Eton nigh or by Windsor, in the said County of Bucks, and the same College, the Patrons of the said Rectory of the Parish of Worplesdon, of the second part, the Right Reverend Edward Stuart, Bishop of Winchester, the Ordinary of the said Rectory of the Parish of Worplesdon, of the third part, and us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, of the fourth part (which Indenture is intended to be enrolled in the Chancery Division of the High Court of Justice), the said John Collingwood Gainsford Bruce did with the consents of the said College of Eton, as such Patrons as aforesaid, and of the said Edward Stuart, Bishop of Winchester, as such Bishop as aforesaid, grant and confirm unto the Minister of the District hereinafter recommended to be constituted and to his successors, and when such District shall have become a New Parish then to the Vicar or Incumbent of such New Parish and to his successors one perpetual clear yearly rent charge or net annual sum of One hundred and thirty pounds to be payable quarterly on the usual quarter days in every year free from and clear of all charges for first fruits and tenths and of all deductions, taxes, charges, rates, assessments and outgoings whatsoever (except on account of the tax on income or property, if any), the first of such quarterly payments in respect of the said clear yearly rent charge or net annual sum of One hundred and thirty pounds to be made on such of the said quarterly days as shall happen next after the date when an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the

London Gazette and to be a proportionate part of the said quarterly payment calculated from the date of the issue of the said Gazette to the said quarterly day of payment and to be for ever issuing and payable out of and charged upon all that the said Rectory of the Parish of Worplesdon and the tithes or tithe commutation, rent charges, glebe lands, hereditaments and all other the endowments and emoluments for the time being to the said Rectory belonging:

"And whereas a capital sum of One thousand five hundred pounds sterling has been contributed and paid to the credit of our account at the Bank of England towards providing a further endowment for the said proposed District, and so soon as the said District shall have become a New Parish as aforesaid then of the said New Parish and towards the maintenance of the Minister or Incumbent thereof for the time being, and we have in respect of such sum agreed and have undertaken to provide and pay by equal quarterly payments on the first day of February, the first day of May, the first day of August, and the first day of November in each year to such Minister or Incumbent as aforesaid, when duly licensed in accordance with the provisions of the firstly hereinbefore mentioned Act, the sum of Seventy-five pounds per annum as long as the said capital sum shall remain in our hands:

"And whereas the said yearly rent charge or net annual sum of One hundred and thirty pounds has been so granted and conveyed as aforesaid and the said capital sum of One thousand five hundred pounds sterling has been so contributed and paid as aforesaid, upon the understanding that (such arrangement appearing to us to be expedient) the whole right of Patronage of the said intended District and of the nomination of the Incumbent thereto should be assigned in the manner hereinafter set forth:

"And whereas the said John Collingwood Gainsford Bruce and the contributors of the said capital sum of One thousand five hundred pounds sterling have nominated the Bishop of Winchester for the time being as the person to whom they desire that the whole right of Patronage of the said proposed District or New Parish (as the case may be) shall be assigned:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Edward Stuart, Bishop of Winchester (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that all those portions of the said Parish of Worplesdon and of the said Parish of Woking which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which portions together with the boundaries thereof are delineated and set forth upon the Map or Plan hereunto annexed, shall upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme become and be constituted a separate District for spiritual purposes and that the same shall be named 'The District of Burpham with Sutton.'

"And we further recommend and propose that the whole right of Patronage of the said District so recommended to be constituted and when such District shall have become a New Parish as aforesaid then of such New Parish and of the nomination of an Incumbent thereto, shall without any assurance in the law other than this Scheme and any duly gazetted Order

of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and upon and from the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette as aforesaid, be assigned to and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Edward Stuart, Bishop of the said Diocese of Winchester, and his successors for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.

"The Schedule to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The District of Burpham with Sutton comprising:—

"1. **ADDITIONAL TREASURY REGULATION UNDER SECTION 4 OF THE PENSIONS (INCREASE) ACT, 1920, RELATING TO PENSIONERS TO WHOM SECTION 1 OF THE ACT APPLIES.**

Where in pursuance of an application an increase of pensions is granted, the increase shall continue in force until the expiration of a period of twelve months from the date as from which the increase is payable unless in the meantime the pensioner dies or ceases to fulfil the statutory conditions.

This Regulation shall be in lieu of No. 6 of the Regulations dated the 30th August, 1920, which is hereby repealed.

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by

the Minister of Labour, and dated 31st October, 1918, the Trade Board established in Great Britain under the Trade Boards Act, 1918, for those branches of the trade as specified in the Trade Boards (Rope, Twine and Net) Order, 1919, having given due notice on the 15th June, 1920, of Proposal to Vary the General Minimum Time-Rates, Piece-work Basis Time-Rates and Overtime Rates for certain classes of Female Workers, hereby give Notice, as required by Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, that they have varied the General Minimum Time-Rates, Piece-Work Basis Time-Rates and Overtime Rates set out in the Schedule of their Notice dated 1st April, 1920, in respect of those classes of Female Workers specified in Part I of the Schedule set out below, such Variation to remain in operation up to 30th April, 1921, and that the Minimum Rates of Wages as Varied are as shown in the Schedule set out below.

And the Trade Board further give Notice that they have received notification from the Minister of Labour that he has made an Order dated 13th December, 1920, under Section 4 (2) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, confirming the Minimum Rates of Wages as Varied by the Trade Board and specifying the 31st December, 1920,\* as the date from which such Minimum Rates of Wages shall become effective.

\*Should this date not correspond with the beginning of the period for which wages are paid by an employer who pays wages at intervals not exceeding seven days, the rates shall become effective as from the beginning of the next full-pay period, but in any case not later than the 6th January, 1921.

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour, and dated 31st October, 1918, the Trade Board established in Great Britain under the Trade Boards Act, 1918, for the Flax and Hemp Trade, as specified in the Trade Boards (Flax and Hemp) Order, 1919, hereby give notice, as required by Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, that they propose to fix a Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate and to vary the Overtime Rates at present fixed and set out in their Notice, dated 30th July, 1920, in their application to Male Hose-Pipe Weavers employed on Piece-Work on Power or Hand Looms, the Proposed Minimum Rates being as shown in the Schedule set out below.

The Minister of Labour has given his consent to the issue of this Notice.

##### *Proposed Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate.*

For Male Hose-ripe Weavers Employed on Power or Hand Looms, 1s. 5d. per hour.

In the case of Male Hose-Pipe Weavers employed on Power or Hand Looms on Piece-Work, each Piece-Rate paid must be such as would yield, in the circumstances of the case, to an Ordinary Worker not less than 1s. 5d. per hour.

##### PART II.

##### *Proposed Variation of Overtime Rates.*

In respect of all time worked in excess of the number of hours declared by the Trade Board, in their Notice dated 30th July, 1920, to be the normal number of hours of work in the trade, Male Hose-Pipe Weavers employed on Piece-Work shall receive, in addition to Piece-Rates, each of which would yield, in the circumstances of the case, to an Ordinary Worker, not less than the Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate specified in Part I of this Schedule, the Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate, one-half of the Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate, or one-quarter of the Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate, according as the Overtime Rate which would have been payable under the provisions of the said Notice dated 30th July, 1920, if the Worker had been employed on Time-Work were Double Time,

Time-and-a-half, or Time-and-a-quarter, respectively.

#### PART III.

The above proposed Minimum Rates of Wages shall apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, to all Male Hose-Pipe Weavers employed on Piece-work on Power or Hand Looms, in respect of all time during which they are employed in Great Britain in any branch of the trade specified in the Trade Boards (Flax and Hemp) Order, 1919, namely:—

The preparing, spinning and weaving (a) of scouted flax, (b) of hemp, (c) of a mixture of scouted flax and any other fibre, or (d) of a mixture of hemp and any other fibre.

##### *Including:—*

(1) The preparing and spinning of waste reclaimed at any stage; and

(2) All packing, despatching, warehousing, storing, or other operations incidental to or appertaining to any of the above-mentioned work;

##### *But excluding:—*

(1) The calendering, bleaching, dyeing or finishing of any of the above-mentioned materials; and

(2) The preparing or spinning of materials required for the making or re-making of (a) rope (including driving rope and banding); (b) cord (including blind and window cord, but excluding silk, worsted and other fancy cords); (c) core for wire ropes; (d) lines; (e) twine (including binder and trawl twine); (f) lanyards; (g) net and similar articles when such spinning or preparing is carried on in the same factory or workshop as the said making or re-making; and

(3) The making or repair of sacks or bags; and also

(4) The weaving of carpets, rugs and mats.

#### PART IV.

SECTION I.—The above Proposed Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate and Overtime Rates shall be paid clear of all deductions other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments, or deductions authorised by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any Superannuation or other Provident Fund.

SECTION II.—The above proposed Minimum Rates are without prejudice to workers who are earning higher rates of wages.

The Trade Board will consider any Objections to the above Proposals which may be lodged with them within two months from the 24th December, 1920. (2) (a) The altering, repairing, renovating, or re-making of any of the above-mentioned tailored garments, except where

included within the scope of the Retail Bespoke Tailoring Trade Board;

(b) The cleaning of such garments where carried out in association with or in conjunction with the altering, repairing, renovating, or re-making of the garments;

(3) The lining with fur of any of the above-mentioned garments where carried out in association with or in conjunction with the making of such garments;

(4) (a) All processes of embroidery or decorative needlework where carried on in association with or in conjunction with the making, altering, repairing, renovating, or re-making of any of the above-mentioned tailored garments other than hand-embroidery or hand-drawn thread work on garments made of linen or cotton or of mixed linen and cotton;

(b) The following processes if done by machine—namely, thread-drawing, thread-clipping, top-sewing, scalloping, nickelling, and paring;

(5) Warehousing, packing, and all other operations incidental to or appertaining to any of the above-mentioned branches of tailoring;

*But excluding—*

(1) Those branches of women's or girls' Bespoke Tailoring and all operations or processes covered by the Trade Boards (Tailoring) Order, 1919;

(2) The making of head-gear;

(3) The making of rubberised or oilskin garments;

(4) Warehousing, packing, and other similar operations carried on in shops mainly engaged in the retail distribution of articles of any description that are not made on the premises.

## PART V.

SECTION I.—The above proposed Minimum Rates of Wages shall be paid clear of all deductions other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments or deductions authorised by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any superannuation or other provident fund.

SECTION II.—The above proposed Minimum Rates of Wages are without prejudice to Workers earning Higher Rates of Wages, or to Agreements made, or that may be made, between Employers and Workers for the payment of Wages in Excess of these Minimum Rates of Wages.

The Trade Board will consider any Objections to the above proposal to vary which may be lodged with them within two months from 21st December, 1920. Such Objections should be in writing and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her full name and address), and should be sent to the Secretary of the Wholesale Mantle and Costume Trade Board (Great Britain), 5, Chancery Lane, London, W.C. 2.

It is desirable that the Objections should state precisely, and so far as possible with reasons, what is objected to.

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour and dated 31st October, 1918, the Trade Board established under the Trade Boards Act, 1918, and the Trade Boards (Women's Clothing) Order, 1919, as varied by the Trade Boards (Shirtmaking) Order, 1920, for the Wholesale Mantle and Costume Trade in Great Britain, as defined in the Regulations made by the Minister of Labour and dated 20th November, 1919, HEREBY GIVE NOTICE, as required by Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, that they PROPOSE TO VARY the General Minimum Time-Rates, Piece-Work Basis Time-Rates and Overtime Rates for Male Workers at present fixed and set out in the Schedule to their Notice dated 19th April, 1920, and effective under an order of the Minister of Labour, dated 17th April, 1920, the variations proposed being as shown in the Schedule set out below :—

Provided that workers who commence employment in the trade at or over the age of 19 shall receive for a period of 12 months a General Minimum Time Rate of 38s. per week of 48 hours, i.e., 9½d. per hour. Provided also that this General Minimum Time-Rate shall be increased by 6s. per week of 48 hours, i.e., 1½d. per hour, in the case of any such worker who is 22 years of age or over. Workers to whom this proviso applies shall, on the expiration of 12 months' employment in the trade, receive such General Minimum Time-Rates as they may be entitled to under the provisions of this Schedule.

## SECTION II

- (a) The weekly rates, set out in Section I. above, are based on a week of 48 hours and are subject to a proportionate decrease according as the number of hours of employment in any week is less than 48.
- (b) In cases where a worker is employed on piece-work, each piece-rate paid must be such as would yield, in the circumstances of the case, to an Ordinary worker an amount not less than the Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate applicable as set out in Section I. above. Provided that in determining as to whether any piece-rate satisfies this condition, regard shall be had to the earnings of workers of 22 years of age and over only.

## PART II.

*Proposed Variation of Overtime Rates for Male Workers.*

Overtime Rates, calculated on the Minimum Rates set out in Part I. of this Schedule, in the manner specified in Part III. of the Schedule to the above-mentioned Notice, dated 19th April, 1920, shall apply, in substitution for the rates set out in Part I. of this Schedule, in respect of all hours worked in excess of the number of hours declared by the Trade Board in the Schedule to the said Notice, dated 19th April, 1920, to be the normal number of hours of work in the trade.

NOTE.—The hours which young persons and children are allowed to work are subject to the provisions of the Factory and Workshop Acts.

## PART III.

SECTION I.—For the purpose of this Notice the following definitions shall apply :—

(a) A Measure Cutter is a person who is capable of taking a complete set of measures and of cutting any garment for a female person from model, patterns and sketches.

(b) A Cutter (other than a Measure Cutter or Knife Cutter or Knifeman) is a person who is employed in :—

(i) Marking-in or marking-up cloth or linings or other materials;

(ii) Laying-up, hooking-up or folding cloth or linings or other materials;

(iii) Cutting cloth or linings or other materials; and

(iv) Dividing; that is, the process ordinarily carried on by Cutters or their assistants of dividing, parting, or separating the parts of garments after being cut and of assembling them into suitable bundles for making-up.

(c) A Knife Cutter or Knifeman is a person who is wholly or mainly employed on Band, Electric or Hand Knife processes.

(d) A Fitter-up is a person who is employed in Fitting-up; that is, a process between that of cutting and that of sewing, baisting or machining, which consists of preparing or fitting accurately the various parts of the garment before being baisted, sewn or machined, such work of preparing or fitting being always done by shears or knives or other cutting appliances, sewing, baisting or machining forming no part or process of fitting-up.

(e) A Tailor is a person who is employed in sewing by hand in the process of making a garment or portion of garment.

(f) A Presser is a person who is employed in Pressing-off by hand or by machine.

(g) A Machinist is a person who is employed in Machining other than as a Plain Machinist as defined in Sub-section (j) of this Section and is capable of machining any garment throughout.

(h) A Passer is a person who is employed

in examining garments, either in the process of being made-up or upon their completion.

(e) An Under-presser is a person who is employed in pressing processes other than Pressing-off.

(j) A Plain Machinist is a person who is employed in the process of making-up Plain Sleeves, Facings, Linings, Inside Pockets, Quilting and Padding.

(k) A Warehouseman is a person employed wholly or mainly upon one or more of the following operations, viz., the assembling, keeping, storing and distributing of stock, but excluding such operations included in the definitions of a Packer or Porter.

(l) A Packer is a person employed wholly or mainly upon the operation of packing goods and materials, but excluding such operations included in the definitions of a Porter or Warehouseman.

(m) A Porter is a person employed wholly or mainly upon one or more of the following operations, viz., unpacking, moving, loading or unloading of goods or materials, but excluding such operations included in the definitions of a Packer or Warehouseman.

#### PART IV.

The respective minimum rates of wages set out in this Schedule shall apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, to all male workers in respect of all time during which they are employed in Great Britain in a branch of the trade specified in the Regulations made by the Minister of Labour dated 20th November, 1919, that is to say:—

Women's, Girls' and Children's ready-made and wholesale bespoke tailoring, and all women's, girls' and children's retail bespoke tailoring carried on in a factory where garments are made up for three or more retail establishments, and any other branch of women's, girls' and children's tailoring, which is not included within the scope of the Retail Bespoke Tailoring Trade Board;

*Including—*

(1) All operations and processes of cutting, making or finishing by hand or machine of coats, costumes, tailored skirts, coat-frocks, mantles, service clothing or similar garments made by tailoring processes;

(2) (a) The altering, repairing, renovating or re-making of any of the above-mentioned tailored garments, except where included within the scope of the Retail Bespoke Tailoring Trade Board;

(b) The cleaning of such garments where carried out in association with or in conjunction with the altering, repairing, renovating or remaking of the garments;

(3) The lining with fur of any of the above-mentioned garments, where carried out in association with or in conjunction with the making of such garments;

(4) (a) All processes of embroidery or decorative needlework where carried on in association with or in conjunction with the making, altering, repairing, renovating or re-making of any of the above-mentioned tailored garments other than hand-embroidery or hand-drawn thread work on garments made of linen or cotton, or of mixed linen or cotton;

## AIR NAVIGATION ACTS, 1911 TO 1919.

DIRECTIONS ISSUED BY THE SECRETARY OF STATE FOR AIR, UNDER THE AIR NAVIGATION REGULATIONS, 1919.

Section V. of the directions issued by the Secretary of State for Air, under the Air Navigation Regulations, 1919, and dated the 30th April, 1919 (Air Navigation Directions I.), is cancelled, and the following provisions are substituted therefor:—

*V.—Log Books.*

1. The authorized patterns to which the log books shall conform in all essentials in accordance with paragraphs 3 of Schedule V. of the Regulations are respectively the Journey Log Book (C.A. Form 26), the Aircraft Log Book (C.A. Form 27), and the Engine Log Book (C.A. Form 28), published by His Majesty's Stationery Office.

2. The log books shall contain all the information and particulars provided for in the authorized patterns referred to in the preceding paragraph, and the instructions for use set out in the authorized patterns shall be complied with. The sections of the journey log book, headed "Navigation Log," need not, however, be fully entered up except when a navigator is carried on the aircraft, provided that in all cases sufficient details are entered in the column headed "Route" to enable the route followed by the aircraft to be clearly identified.

For the purpose of this paragraph the term "repairs" shall be deemed to include all overhauls, replacements, repairs and work of a like nature.

3. The constructor shall fill in and sign the original entries in the log books as far as he is in a position to do so.

Subsequent entries shall be made and signed:—

(a) in the case of the journey and signal log books by the pilot, unless there is a commander of the aircraft other than the pilot, in which event the entries shall be made and signed by such commander:

(b) in the case of the aircraft and engine log books by the ground engineer; provided that as regards matters which could not have come to the notice of the ground engineer, the pilot shall be responsible for making and signing the entries.

4. All entries shall be made in ink except in the case of journey and signal log books; the entries for these may be made in pencil in a rough notebook, but shall be entered in ink in the log book every twenty-four hours. In the event of any official investigation the rough notebook may be called for.

5. No erasures shall be made in, nor pages torn from, any log book.
