

to the united Benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, the right of presentation shall be exercised by the Patrons of the said two Benefices alternately, the Archbishop of York having the right of presentation upon the first avoidance of the united Benefice after the union and every alternate right of presentation and the Lord Chancellor having the right of presentation upon the second avoidance of the united Benefice after the union and every alternate turn thereafter.

"Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been published locally in the manner prescribed in the Statutory Rules made under the said Act and also transmitted in the manner so prescribed to the Patrons affected together with a Notice in each case requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the same Rules:

And whereas the prescribed time has elapsed and no such objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners:

And whereas neither of the two Benefices affected by the said Scheme is situate in a City or Municipal Borough:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the two Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme, and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Act.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of York.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 37, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme, bearing date the 2nd day of December, 1920, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 37, and of the Act of the 19th

and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for constituting a separate District for spiritual purposes to be taken partly out of the Parish of Worplesdon and partly out of the Parish of Woking, both in the County of Surrey and in the Diocese of Winchester:

"Whereas we are satisfied that the said Parish of Worplesdon and the said Parish of Woking are Cures wherein or in parts whereof the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof, and it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular portions of the said Parish of Worplesdon and of the said Parish of Woking which are hereinafter mentioned and described should be constituted a separate District in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

"And whereas there is at present within the limits of the said proposed separate District one consecrated Church or Chapel known as Saint Luke's Church in use for the purpose of Divine Worship, and it is intended that such Church or Chapel shall be used as a Chapel of Ease to the permanent Church which is to be erected within and for the said proposed District:

"And whereas by a certain Indenture bearing date on or about the 2nd day of December, 1920, and made or expressed to be made under the authority of the 'New Parishes Acts, 1843, 1844 and 1856,' or some or one of them, between the Reverend John Collingwood Gainsford Bruce, Rector or Incumbent of the Rectory of the said Parish of Worplesdon, of the first part, the Provost of the College Royal of the Blessed Mary of Eton, near unto Windsor, in the County of Bucks, commonly called the King's College of Our Blessed Lady of Eton nigh or by Windsor, in the said County of Bucks, and the same College, the Patrons of the said Rectory of the Parish of Worplesdon, of the second part, the Right Reverend Edward Stuart, Bishop of Winchester, the Ordinary of the said Rectory of the Parish of Worplesdon, of the third part, and us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, of the fourth part (which Indenture is intended to be enrolled in the Chancery Division of the High Court of Justice), the said John Collingwood Gainsford Bruce did with the consents of the said College of Eton, as such Patrons as aforesaid, and of the said Edward Stuart, Bishop of Winchester, as such Bishop as aforesaid, grant and confirm unto the Minister of the District hereinafter recommended to be constituted and to his successors, and when such District shall have become a New Parish then to the Vicar or Incumbent of such New Parish and to his successors one perpetual clear yearly rent charge or net annual sum of One hundred and thirty pounds to be payable quarterly on the usual quarter days in every year free from and clear of all charges for first fruits and tenths and of all deductions, taxes, charges, rates, assessments and outgoings whatsoever (except on account of the tax on income or property, if any), the first of such quarterly payments in respect of the said clear yearly rent charge or net annual sum of One hundred and thirty pounds to be made on such of the said quarterly days as shall happen next after the date when an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the
