Description and Limits of Infected Place.

The fields known as Six-acre Piece, Court Field, and Lower Orchard, together with the small paddock and sheds situated between Court Field and Lower Orchard, all lying to the south of the road from Gloucester to Churcham, in the occupation of Jack Pearce, in the administrative county of Gloucester.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Swine may be moved without a licence by railway from outside any district scheduled by an Order of the Minister for the purposes of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Control of Movement) Order of 1920, to a railway station situate within the parish of Brierley Hill, in the administrative county of Stafford; and an animal so moved may be moved from the railway station to any slaughterhouse or bacon factory situate within the same parish if accompanied by a Movement Licence granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the county of Stafford.

HEREFORD (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1920 (No. 5).

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

1. Part II. of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Control of Movement) Order of 1920 is hereby applied to the city and county borough of Gloucester.

2. This Order may be cited as the HEREFORD (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF
