FACTORY AND WORKSHOP ACT, 1901.

The Home Secretary hereby gives notice, in pursuance of Section 80 of the Factory and Workshop Act, 1901, that he has certified the following processes incidental to the manufacture of indiarubber, and of articles and goods made wholly or partially of indiarubber, viz.:—(a) Vulcanising by means of the process known as the cold cure process; (b) any other process involving the use of carbon bi-sulphide, sulphur chloride, carbon-chlorine compounds, or benzol; (c) any process involving the use of lead or lead compounds, to be dangerous, and that he proposes to make regulations to apply to all factories and workshops or parts thereof in which such manufactures and processes are carried on.

COUNTY OF LONDON.

Scheme of the London County Council for regulating the holding of Courts of Quarter Sessions for the County of London, as provided by Section 42 (7) of the Local Government Act, 1888.

PART I.—GENERAL.

1. The provisions of the Act II, Geo. IV, and 1 Will. IV, cap. 70, as to the times for holding Quarter Sessions shall not apply to the County of London.

2. Quarter Sessions shall be held at Newington in the months of January, April, July and October in every year, and the first Sessions held in each of those months shall be General Quarter Sessions.

3. Adjourned Quarter Sessions shall be held at Newington for all such business as aforesaid in each of the months aforesaid, and in all the other months of the year at intervals of not less than two weeks or more than three weeks after the beginning of each preceding Quarter Sessions or adjourned Quarter Sessions.

4. In the month of November of every year the Clerk of the Peace shall prepare a list showing the days to be fixed for the Sessions to be held during the ensuing year, in accordance with the foregoing provisions. In the list so to be prepared special days shall be appointed for hearing appeals. Such list shall be laid before the November Sessions, and shall be revised and settled at such Sessions, and be printed and issued by the Clerk of the Peace; and Sessions in accordance with such list, when so revised and settled, shall be held during the year.

5. The Sessions so fixed shall, so far as practicable, be continued from day to day, until the business to be dealt with at such Sessions is completed. And it shall be the duty of the justices to take the steps necessary to secure

that there shall be as many Courts sitting at the same time as may be required for the discharge of the business with proper expedition. For this purpose, in addition to the Courts presided over by the Chairman and the Deputy Chairman, there may be, on the direction of the London County Council, with the approval of the Secretary of State, in pursuance of Section 42 (6) of the Local Government Act, 1888, a third Court, and, if necessary, a fourth Court, each to be presided over by one of the justices. Any of the above-mentioned Courts may be held at the same time, and, subject to the provisions of this Scheme, shall be so held whenever necessary to prevent delay in the disposal of pending business.

6. It shall be the duty of the justices to take care that these provisions for the disposal of business shall, so far as is reasonably practicable, be strictly observed. Nevertheless, a committal for trial or recognisance shall not be invalidated, nor shall the power of the Sessions be affected by any disregard of the provisions of this Scheme, as to the place or time of trial, and every Court of Sessions held in and for the County of London, at whatever place or time such Court is held, shall have complete power to hear, determine and dispose of any case or matter arising in the said county, notwithstanding an objection that such case or matter ought to be, or had been, heard and determined at the Sessions held at another place, or at another time.

7. Every Court of Sessions of the Peace, and every adjournment thereof, shall have the same jurisdiction in every respect, including the power of hearing and determining appeals, as if such Court were Quarter Sessions and every Sessions shall, as circumstances require, be deemed to be Quarter or adjourned Quarter Sessions, and, if held simultaneously, to be divided Courts of the same Sessions.

PART II.—APPEALS UNDER THE VALUATION (METROPOLIS) ACT, 1869.

1. At every adjourned January Quarter Sessions, sittings of the Court shall be fixed to hear appeals under the Valuation (Metropolis) Act, 1869.

2. Such sittings shall begin not earlier than the 1st of February then next ensuing, and shall be so arranged as to enable the Court to determine all appeals (except where a valuation list or valuation is ordered) before the ensuing 31st of March.

3. The Court shall at the same Sessions appoint, with the consent of the Ministry of Health, a clerk and other persons to assist the Court in the performance of their duties under the Act.

4. Appeals may be heard at any place authorised for the time being for holding Quarter Sessions for the County of London, or in the City of London, or at one or both of such places, at the same time, or at different times, as the Court shall from time to time determine.

5. At every adjourned April Quarter Sessions the Court shall assign the remuneration (subject to the approval of the Ministry of Health) of the clerk and other officers appointed as aforesaid for the year ended the 31st of March then last past.

6. A separate account shall be kept of the expenses incurred by the Court in respect of the exercise of its jurisdiction under the Valua-

tion (Metropolis) Act, 1869, and such account, made up to the 31st of March in every year, shall be submitted to and be examined by the Court at the ensuing adjourned April Quarter Sessions.

7. Such account, when approved by the Court, shall be submitted by the Clerk of the Court for such audit as the Ministry of Health may direct, with a view to the same, when audited, being paid in the manner prescribed by the Valuation (Metropolis) Act, 1869.

This Scheme shall come into operation on the 1st of January, 1921, and shall continue in force until otherwise determined.

TRADE BOARDS' ACTS, 1909 AND 1918. TOBACCO TRADE BOARD (GREAT BRITAIN).

PROPOSAL TO VARY OVERTIME RATES FOR MALE AND FEMALE WORKERS.

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour, and dated 31st October, 1918, the Trade Board established in Great Britain under the Trade Boards Act, 1918, for those Branches of the Trade specified

in the Trade Boards (Tobacco) Order, 1919, hereby give Notice, as required by Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, that they propose to Vary (the Minister of Labour having given his consent to such Notice being given) the Overtime Rates at present fixed and set out in the Schedule to their Notice dated 17th July, 1920, and effective under the Order of the Minister of Labour dated 14th July, 1920, and to declare the Normal Number of Hours of Work in the trade for the purpose of the application of the Overtime Rates, the proposed Overtime Rates and declared Normal Number of Hours of Work in the trade being as shown in the Schedule set out below.

SCHEDULE.

PART I.

Proposed Overtime Rates for Male and Female Workers (all Ages).

SECTION I.—In accordance with Section 3 (1) (c) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, the Trade Board propose to declare the Normal Number of Hours of Work in the Trade to be as follows:—

In any week	48
On any week-day (other than Saturday)	9
On Saturday	5

Provided that all hours worked by a worker on Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays shall be regarded as Overtime to which the Overtime Rates shall apply.

SECTION II.—In lieu of the Overtime Rates at present fixed and set out in the Trade Board's Notice dated 17th July, 1920, and effective under the Order of the Minister of Labour, dated 14th July, 1920, the Overtime Rates for Male and Female Workers to apply in substitution for the Minimum Rates which would otherwise be applicable in respect of all hours worked by Male and Female Workers, whether engaged on Time-work or on Piece-work, in excess of the declared normal number of hours, shall be as follows:—

(1) For the First Two Hours' Overtime on any day, except Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, the Overtime Rate shall be One-and-a-Quarter times the Minimum Rate otherwise applicable—*i.e.*, Time-and-a-Quarter.

(2) For Overtime after the First Two Hours of Overtime on any day, except Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, the Overtime Rate shall be One-and-a-Half times the Minimum Rate otherwise applicable—*i.e.*, Time-and-a-Half.

(3) For all time worked on Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, the Overtime Rate shall be Twice the Minimum Rate otherwise applicable—*i.e.*, Double Time.

(4) For all hours worked in any week in excess of 48 the Overtime Rate shall be One-and-a-Quarter times the Minimum Rate otherwise applicable—*i.e.*, Time-and-a-Quarter, except in so far as higher Overtime Rates are payable under the provisions of paragraphs 2 and 3 of this Section.

The Overtime Rate shall be payable where on any day (not being a Sunday or a Customary Public or Statutory Holiday) the number of hours worked exceeds nine, or in the case of Saturday exceeds five, notwithstanding that the number of hours worked in the week does not exceed 48.

Provided that—

Where it is or may become the established practice of an employer to require attendance only on five days a week, the Overtime Rates shall only be payable on such days after 9½ hours have been worked.

NOTE.—The hours which female workers, young persons and children are allowed to work are subject to the provisions of the Factory and Workshop Acts.

SECTION I.—The above proposed Overtime Rates shall apply as provided above and subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, to all workers in Great Britain who are employed in any branch of the trade specified in the Trade Boards (Tobacco) Order, 1919, that is to say, the manufacture of Tobacco, Cigars, Cigarettes, Cigarette Tubes and Snuff, including all preparatory processes, and including also the operations of storing, and store-keeping, boxing, packeting, labelling, parcelling and despatching and all other warehousing and packing operations incidental to the manufacture of any of the above-mentioned articles.

SECTION II.—The above proposed Overtime Rates shall be paid clear of all deductions, other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments, or deductions authorised by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any superannuation or other provident fund.

The Trade Board will consider any Objections to the above Proposal to Vary which may be lodged with them within two months from 5th January, 1921. Such Objections should be in writing and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her full name and address), and should be sent to the Secretary of the Tobacco Trade Board (Great Britain), 5, Chancery Lane, London, W.C. 2.

It is desirable that the Objections should state precisely, and so far as possible with reasons, what is objected to.

PROPOSAL TO VARY MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES FOR MAKING CERTAIN SIZES OF DOLLED OR TOMMIED CHAIN AND OF HAND HAMMERED CHAIN (ON THE BASIS OF THE LOWEST QUALITY).

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour, and dated 31st October, 1918, the Trade Board established in Great Britain under the above Act for the Trade of Hammered and Dolled or Tommied Chain Making hereby give notice that, seeing that the specified period of operation of the minimum rates for making certain sizes of Dolled or Tommied Chain and of Hand Hammered Chain set out in the Notice issued by the Trade Board on 1st October, 1920, will

expire on 31st March, 1921, they again propose to vary the General Minimum Time-Rates and the General Minimum Piece-Rates set out in the Notice, dated 1st March, 1918, by providing that the minimum rates set out in the said Notice dated 1st October, 1920, shall be continued in operation after the 31st March, 1921, subject to the variation of the General Minimum Piece-Rates for making from Iron of $\frac{3}{8}$ " and $\frac{1}{2}$ " diameter, respectively, Dotted or Tommied Short Link Chain, or Short Link Hand Hammered Chain, as follows:—

(a) Where the employer provides (in addition to the iron) the workshop where the work is carried on and the tools and the fuel:—

Size of Iron and Proposed Variation—

For $\frac{3}{8}$ ", from 22s. 2d. per cwt. to 24s. 11d. per cwt.

For $\frac{1}{2}$ ", from 17s. 10d. per cwt. to 20s. 1d. per cwt.

(b) Where the worker provides (in respect of iron provided by the employer) the workshop where the work is carried on and the tools and the fuel or any one of these three heads of outlay:—

Size of Iron and Proposed Variation—

For $\frac{3}{8}$ ", from 29s. 7d. per cwt. to 33s. 3d. per cwt.

For $\frac{1}{2}$ ", from 23s. 9d. per cwt. to 26s. 9d. per cwt.

This proposal is issued with the consent of the Minister of Labour.

THE UNEMPLOYMENT INSURANCE (ASSOCIATIONS) (SUPPLEMENTARY) REGULATIONS, 1920.

deemed to be an arrangement under Section 17 of the Unemployment Insurance Act, 1920.

2. These Regulations may be cited as the Unemployment Insurance (Associations) (Supplementary) Regulations, 1920.

2.—(1) Where an inspector of the Ministry considers it necessary or expedient, after inquiry, that an animal in the Scheduled District should be permitted to be moved within the Scheduled District as often as occasion may require between different parts of the same farm, he may, notwithstanding any prohibition of movement contained in the principal Order, authorise such movement by an Occupation Licence, and the inspector may insert in the licence such conditions as he may consider necessary or desirable for the purpose of preventing the animals referred to in the licence from coming into contact with any other animals.

(2) If in respect of any animal the conditions of a licence granted under this Article are not complied with, the owner of the animal and the person for the time being in charge

thereof shall each, according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

3. Part II of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Control of Movement) Order of 1920 is hereby applied to the several boroughs and urban districts described in the Second Schedule hereto.

to any Scheduled District, an animal may, subject as hereinafter provided, be moved from any premises in a district which is for the time being a Scheduled District for the purposes of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Control of Movement) Order of 1920, except from premises situate in any Area which is for the time being a Prohibited Area for the purpose of that Order, to a railway station in any of the boroughs or the parish described in the Schedule hereto, if accompanied by a Movement Licence granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the district from which the animal is moved; and an animal so moved may be moved from the railway station to any slaughterhouse or bacon factory situated within the same borough or parish, as the case may be.

(ii.) Animals moved with a licence under this Order shall be moved as far as is practicable by railway, and shall not be untrucked, except for the purpose of feeding or watering the animals within the railway station premises where such untrucking takes place, until their arrival at the railway station to which they are consigned, and whilst being moved from that railway station to the slaughterhouse shall not be moved on any road which is not in the said borough or parish.

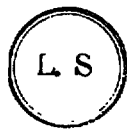
(iii.) Licences issued under this Order shall specify the slaughterhouse or bacon factory to which the animal is to be moved.

(iv.) The provisions of Part IV. of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Control of Movement) Order of 1920 shall apply to any animals moved with a licence under this Order, and to licences granted under this Order. 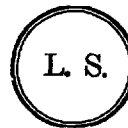
