THE COAL (EXPORT AND BUNKERING) AMENDING DIRECTIONS, 1921, DATED THE 8TH DAY OF JANUARY, 1921, GIVEN BY THE BOARD OF TRADE UNDER SECTION 3, SUB-SECTION 1 (A), OF THE MINING INDUSTRY ACT, 1920.

1. The operation of the Directions dated the 8th November, 1920, given by the Board of Trade under Section 3, sub-section 1 (a), of the Mining Industry Act, 1920, for regulating the export of coal and the supply of coal for the bunkering of vessels, is hereby suspended in so far as the said Directions relate to the supply and shipment of coal for the bunkering of vessels proceeding abroad, and the said Directions shall, in such respects remain inoperative until further notice.

2. Clause 4 of the said Directions shall be cancelled, and there shall be substituted therefor the following:—

“ 4.—Application for such permission must be addressed in the form prescribed in the First Schedule hereto,

“ (a) to the Local Representative of the Mines Department, where it is proposed to effect shipment from any of the ports specified in the Second Schedule hereto to any destination abroad;

“ (b) to the Mines Department, Victoria Street, S.W. 1, where it is proposed to effect shipment from any ports other than those specified in the said Schedule.”

3. These Directions may be cited as the Coal (Export and Bunkering) Amending Directions, 1921, and the aforesaid Directions, dated the 8th November, 1920, may be cited as the Coal (Export and Bunkering) Directions, 1920.

4. These Directions shall have effect as from the 10th day of January, 1921.

(3) Wardmaid at a Hospital, which work entails cleaning wards and bringing in the patients' food in the said Metropolitan Asylums Board's Institutions;

(4) Baker at a Training Colony;

(5) Laundry man at a Training Colony, is such employment as to make the said persons employed persons within the meaning of the Unemployment Insurance Act, 1920.

Now, therefore, the Minister, by virtue of the power conferred on him by Section 10 of the said Act, decides that the said employments are not such as to make the said persons employed persons within the meaning of the said Act.

Given under the Official Seal of the Minister of Labour this Sixteenth day of December, in the year One thousand nine hundred and twenty.

Whether the employment by the said Metropolitan Asylums Board of a person as—

(6) Caretaker, whose duty entails cleaning and looking after a Casual Ward, the said Ward not at present being in use, is such employment as to make the said person an employed person within the meaning of the Unemployment Insurance Act, 1920.

Now, therefore, the Minister, by virtue of the power conferred on him by Section 10 of the said Act, decides that the said employment is such as to make the said person an employed person within the meaning of the said Act.

Given under the Official Seal of the Minister of Labour this Twenty-first day of December, in the year One thousand nine hundred and twenty.

Whether the employment by the said Metropolitan Asylums Board of persons as—

(7) Motor Driver at an Ambulance Station whose duties are to drive the ambulances owned by the said Metropolitan Asylums Board.

(8) Stableman, at a Bacteriological Laboratory, and as such grooms, feeds and generally attends to the horses kept in connection with the preparation of diphtheria antitoxic serum, is such employment as to make the said persons

employed persons within the meaning of the Unemployment Insurance Act, 1920.

Now, therefore, the Minister, by virtue of the power conferred on him by Section 10 of the said Act, decides that the said employments are such as to make the said persons employed persons within the meaning of the said Act.

Given under the Official Seal of the Minister of Labour this Twenty-second day of December, in the year One thousand nine hundred and twenty.

Whether the employment by the said Metropolitan Asylums Board of persons as—

(9) Stores porter at a Training Colony, and as such receives, checks and issues out stores, food and clothing in the store room in the said Board's Institutions;

(10) Porter at a Training Colony, and as such is engaged in transporting coals and furniture, cleaning windows, and helping to carry patients at the Institutions maintained by the said Board;

(11) As yard Foreman at a Hospital, and as such is in charge of the stable yard staff and motor drivers in the yards at certain of the said Metropolitan Asylums Board's Institutions,

is such employment as to make the said persons employed persons within the meaning of the Unemployment Insurance Act, 1920.

Now, therefore, the Minister, by virtue of the power conferred on him by Section 10 of the said Act, decides that the said employments are not such as to make the said persons employed persons within the meaning of the said Act.

EAST LANCING SEA DEFENCES.

Whereas the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough of Worthing (hereinafter called "the Corporation"), being the Urban Sanitary Authority for the said Borough and the East Lancing Sea Defence Commissioners (hereinafter called "the Commissioners"), have made application to the Minister of Health for the issue of a Provisional Order under Sections 297 and 303 of the Public Health Act, 1875, to partially repeal, alter or amend the following Act and Provisional Orders, and the Acts of Parliament confirming those Orders, viz.:—

(b) The Provisional Order of the Secretary of State dated the 8th day of April, 1869, relating to the district of Worthing, confirmed by the Local Government Supplemental Act, 1869.

(c) The Provisional Order of the Local Government Board dated the 19th day of June, 1876, relating to the said district, confirmed by the Local Government Board's Provisional Orders Confirmation (Bath, &c.) Act, 1876.

(d) The Provisional Order of the Local Government Board, dated the 5th day of June, 1891, relating to the borough of Worthing, confirmed by the Local Government Board's Provisional Orders Confirmation (No. 14) Act, 1891.

(e) The East Lancing Sea Defence Order, 1913, confirmed by the Local Government Board's Provisional Order Confirmation (No. 15) Act, 1913:

And whereas the Corporation and the Commissioners have applied that provision should be made in the suggested Provisional Order for the purpose of carrying into effect the following proposals, viz.:—

1. To repeal (a) the unrepealed provisions of the Orders of 1876 and 1891, (b) such of the unrepealed provisions of the Order of 1869 as confer any powers or impose any obligations on the Corporation in respect of any area within the parish of Lancing, and (c) the unrepealed provisions of the Act of 1826 (except section 19 thereof) so far as they confer any powers or impose any obligations on the Corporation in respect of any area within the parish of Lancing.

2. To dissolve the Committee appointed under the said Order of 1891, and to transfer to and vest in the Commissioners all sea defence works, real and personal property, rights, privileges, liabilities and obligations which are vested in or enjoyable by or binding on the Committee:

3. To transfer to the Commissioners the powers, duties, liabilities and obligations of the Corporation under the said Act and Orders of 1826, 1869, 1876 and 1891, as amended by the Order of 1913, in so far as they relate to works of sea defence in the parish of Lancing, to alter the areas defined by those Orders for the levy and assessment of rates for the purposes thereof, and to transfer to the Commissioners all sea defence works in the parish of Lancing and all real and personal property, rights and privileges and obligations in connection with defence works in the said parish:

4. To include amongst the purposes for which the Commissioners are constituted the

construction, reconstruction, restoration, repair and maintenance of defences against encroachment by the sea on so much of the sea shore, beach and foreshore as extends from the point marked "C" referred to in sub-division (a) of Article XIII of the Order of 1913, and shown on the maps described in Art. I of the said Order, to the eastern boundary of the borough of Worthing, and any defences which may be necessary to prevent the sea from breaking through, overflowing or percolating on to or through, so much of the main road between Brighton and Worthing as lies between the East Lancing Sea Defence District and the borough of Worthing.

5. To empower the Commissioners to enter upon, take, and use for the purposes of the works which they were by the Order of 1913 and are by the proposed Order to be empowered to execute any part of the sea-shore, beach or foreshore between the said point marked "C" and the eastern boundary of the borough of Worthing and any land which is situate on the south side of so much of the main road between Brighton and Worthing as lies between the East Lancing Sea Defence District and the borough of Worthing, and is subject to the flow and re-flow of the tide thereover or is unoccupied or covered with shingle or sand:

6. To extend the provisions of section 19 of the Act of 1826 (which authorizes the construction of works without the consent of and without making any compensation to the owner or owners, occupier or occupiers of or party or parties interested in the lands or sea coast in or upon which such works shall be made, erected or built) to the whole area over which the Commissioners are to exercise the powers of constructing works conferred upon them by the Order of 1913 as amended by the suggested Provisional Order.

7. To extend the provisions of Article XXIII of the Order of 1913 which prohibits the removal of shingle, sand, beach flints or marl, so as to include therein the seashore, beach or foreshore extending from the said point "C" to the eastern boundary of the borough of Worthing:

8. To provide that the rate in the £ levied at any time in respect of the properties for which a maximum rate equivalent to 10s. in the £ is prescribed by the Order of 1913 shall be three times the rate in the £ levied at the same time in respect of the properties for which a maximum rate equivalent to 3s. 4d. in the £ is prescribed by the said Order of 1913.

9. To require the County Council of the administrative County of West Sussex, the Urban District Council of Shoreham-by-Sea and the Rural District Council of Steyning West to contribute towards the expenditure incurred by the Commissioners, and further to make provision in regard to any deficiency which may arise in the revenue of the Commissioners:

10. To provide that the contributions of the County Council shall be defrayed as general expenses, the contributions of the Urban District Council shall be defrayed from the district fund and general district rate and the contributions of the Rural District Council as special expenses for the benefit of more than one contributory place, under Sections 229 and 230 of the Public Health Act, 1875, and that for the last pur-

pose the contributory places chargeable shall be (a) the whole of the parish of Lancing; (b) such part of the parish of Coombes as is coloured orange on a map submitted with this application to the Minister of Health, (c) such part of the parish of Old Shoreham as is coloured grey on the said map, and (d) such part of the parish of Upper Beeding as is coloured violet on the said map.

11. To include amongst the securities upon which the Commissioners may borrow the contributions which the Commissioners may require from the said County Council, Urban District Council and Rural District Council:

12. To alter the constitution of the Commissioners, to increase the number of the Commissioners, and to provide for the representation thereon of the said Urban District Council and Rural District Council:

13. To empower the Commissioners to recover any rates made by them in the same manner as a local authority are by Section 13 (1) of the Private Street Works Act, 1892, empowered to recover expenses for the repayment whereof the owner of the premises for or in respect of which the expenses are incurred is made liable under that Act, with such modifications as the intended Order may prescribe:

14. To provide that no person other than the Commissioners shall without their consent erect, construct or execute on so much of the seashore, beach and foreshore as extends from the eastern boundary of the borough of Worthing to the point marked "E" on the maps described in Article 1 of the Order of 1913 any works which in the opinion of the Commissioners would injure, interfere with, or diminish the utility of any works for the time being erected or in course of erection by or vested in the Commissioners:

MIDLAND COUNTIES (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1921.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Contraction of Scheduled District.

1. The Midland Counties (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1920 shall be read and have effect as if the petty sessional division of Melton Mowbray, in the administrative county of Leicester, were excluded from and ceased to form part of the Scheduled District described in the Schedule to that Order.

Commencement.

2. This Order shall come into operation on the tenth day of January, nineteen hundred and twenty-one.

Short Title.

3. This Order may be cited as the MIDLAND COUNTIES (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1921.

ADMIRALTY NOTICE TO MARINERS.

No. 1 of the year 1921.

CAUTION WHEN APPROACHING
BRITISH PORTS.

PART I.

CLOSING OF PORTS.

Former Notice.—No. 1 of 1920; hereby cancelled.

(1) My Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, having taken into consideration the fact that it may be necessary to forbid all entrance to certain ports of the Empire, this is to give Notice that on approaching the shores of the United Kingdom, or any of the ports or localities of the British Empire, a sharp look-out should be kept for the signals described in the following paragraph, and for the vessels mentioned in paragraph (5), Part II., of this Notice, and the distinguishing and other signals made by them. In the event of such signals being displayed, the port or locality should be approached with great caution, as it may be apprehended that obstructions may exist.

(2) If entrance to a port is prohibited, three *red* vertical lights by night, or three *red* vertical balls by day, will be exhibited in some conspicuous position, in or near to its approach, which signals will also be shown by the vessels indicated in paragraph (5), Part II., of this Notice.

If these signals are displayed, vessels must approach the port with the greatest caution and implicitly obey all orders or signals given them by the Examination vessel or signal station.

(3) At some ports or localities at home or abroad, search-lights are occasionally exhibited for exercise.

Instructions have been given to avoid directing moveable search-lights during practice on to vessels under way, but mariners are warned that great care should be taken to keep a sharp look-out for the signals indicated in paragraph (2) above, when search-lights are observed to be working.

PART II.

EXAMINATION SERVICE.

(4) In certain circumstances it is also necessary to take special measures to examine vessels desiring to enter ports or localities at home or abroad.

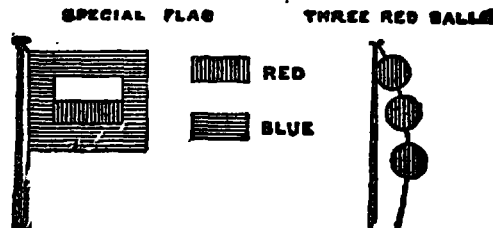
(5) In such case, vessels carrying the distinguishing flags or lights mentioned in paragraph (7) will be charged with the duty of examining ships which desire to enter the port and of allotting positions in which they shall anchor. If Government vessels, or vessels belonging to the local port authority, are found patrolling in the offing, merchant vessels are advised to communicate with such vessels with a view to obtaining information as to the course on which they should approach the port. Such communication will not be necessary in cases where the pilot on board has already received this information from the local authorities.

(6) As the institution of the Examination Service at any port will never be publicly advertised, especial care should be taken in approaching the ports, by day or night, to keep a sharp look-out for any vessel carrying the flags or lights mentioned in paragraph (7), and to be ready to "bring to" at once when hailed by her or warned by the firing of a gun or sound rocket.

In approaching by night any British port in the United Kingdom or abroad, serious delay and risk will be avoided if four efficient all round lanterns, two *red* and two *white*, are kept available for use.

(7) By day the distinguishing flag of the Examination Steamer will be a special flag (white and red horizontal surrounded by a blue border).

Also, three red vertical balls if the port is closed.



Usually the Examination Steamers will fly the blue ensign, but at certain ports they will fly the white ensign.

By night the steamer will carry:—

(a) Three *red* vertical lights if the port is closed.

(b) Three *white* vertical lights if the port is open.

The above lights will be carried in addition to the ordinary navigation lights, and will show an unbroken light around the horizon.

(8) Masters are warned that, when approaching a British port where the Examination Service is in force, they must have the signal letters of their vessel ready to hoist immediately the Examination Steamer makes the signal: "What ship is that?"

(9) Masters are warned that, before attempting to enter any port when the Examination Service is in force, they must in their own interests strictly obey all instructions given to them by the Examination Steamer.

Whilst at anchor in the Examination Anchorage, Masters are warned that it is forbidden, except for the purpose of avoiding accident, to do any of the following things, without permission from the Examination Officer:—

To lower any boat.

To communicate with the shore or with other ships.

To move the ship.

To work cables.

To allow any person or thing to leave the ship.

(10) In case of fog, Masters are enjoined to use the utmost care, and the port should be approached with caution.

(11) When the Examination Service is in force merchant vessels when approaching ports are especially cautioned against making use of private signals of any description, either by day or night; the use of them will render a vessel liable to be fired on.

(12) The pilots attached to the ports will be acquainted with the regulations to be followed.

PART III.

MINE-SWEEPING OPERATIONS.

H.M. Vessels engaged in mine-sweeping operations or exercises are hampered to a considerable extent in their manœuvring powers.

With a view to indicating the nature of the work on which they are engaged, these vessels

will show the signals hereinafter mentioned. For the public safety all other vessels, whether steamers or sailing craft, should endeavour to keep out of the way of vessels flying these signals and not approach them inside the distances mentioned herein, specially remembering that it is dangerous to pass between the vessels of a pair or group sweeping together.

1. SIGNALS THAT WILL BE SHOWN BY DAY.

(a) By vessels working singly:

A black ball at the foremast head, and a similar ball at each yardarm or where they can best be seen.

Vessels showing this signal should not be approached nearer than 900 yards (822^m9).

(b) By vessels working in pairs or groups:

A black ball at the foremast head, and a similar ball at the yardarm or where it can best be seen, on that side on which it is dangerous to pass.

Vessels should not pass within a distance of 400 yards (365^m8) astern of a pair or group of sweepers, or when more than one pair or group are working in company within a distance of 400 yards (365^m8) astern of the rear pair or group. They should on no account attempt to pass between pairs or groups working in company.

2. SIGNALS THAT WILL BE SHOWN BY NIGHT.

As for day, except that all round green lights will be used in a similar manner to and in place of the black balls.

The foregoing caution has been rendered necessary owing to danger of sunken mines on the bottom. Attention is drawn to the cautionary note on the charts on this subject.

The areas defined above, with the exception of a portion of No. 19 and the whole of No. 21, are shaded on the accompanying chartlet, which is intended to provide a ready means of reference.

II. GENERAL INFORMATION REGARDING MINES.

1. Mariners are warned that a certain number of mines have sunk without exploding. It is possible that some of these mines lying on the bottom may still be dangerous. Surface vessels navigating these areas should therefore, whenever possible, have a clear depth of at least six feet between their keels and the bottom when in the vicinity of shoal water or in the approaches to ports and harbours which were subjected to mining operations during the war.

2. In removing prohibitions upon vessels trawling, it is pointed out that a risk, although of a diminishing character, still exists.

The attention of all vessels trawling is drawn to the immunity which may be secured by the use of a suitable protective device to prevent mines entering the trawl.

As can be readily understood, it is not possible to predict for how long a period sunken unexploded mines remain dangerous, and consequently no unnecessary risk should be taken.

3. Mariners are notified that a small percentage of drifting mines are known to exist in a waterlogged condition, a fraction of which may be dangerous. This type of mine is hard to see, and special precautions are therefore necessary to ensure that a good look-out is kept. The striking of low floating flotsam should be avoided.

4. A serious accident has occurred to a vessel at anchor from the explosion of a drifting mine which came into contact with an obstruction on the hull.

When vessels have to anchor in areas where drifting mines may be found it is necessary that all obstructions should as far as possible be removed and gangways triced up before dark in order to minimise risk.

5. In regard to the great importance of the destruction of mines with a view to prevention of loss of life and shipping, attention of Masters

is called to the necessity for strict compliance with the provisions of Chapter II., "Admiralty Instructions for British Merchant Ships," June, 1919, and especially Section xiii., which includes the following:—

"Whenever practicable, vessels should attempt to sink or destroy mines by gun or rifle fire, but no mine is to be sunk in any fairway where the depth of water at low water spring tides is less than 7 fathoms, except when a mine is drifting towards a

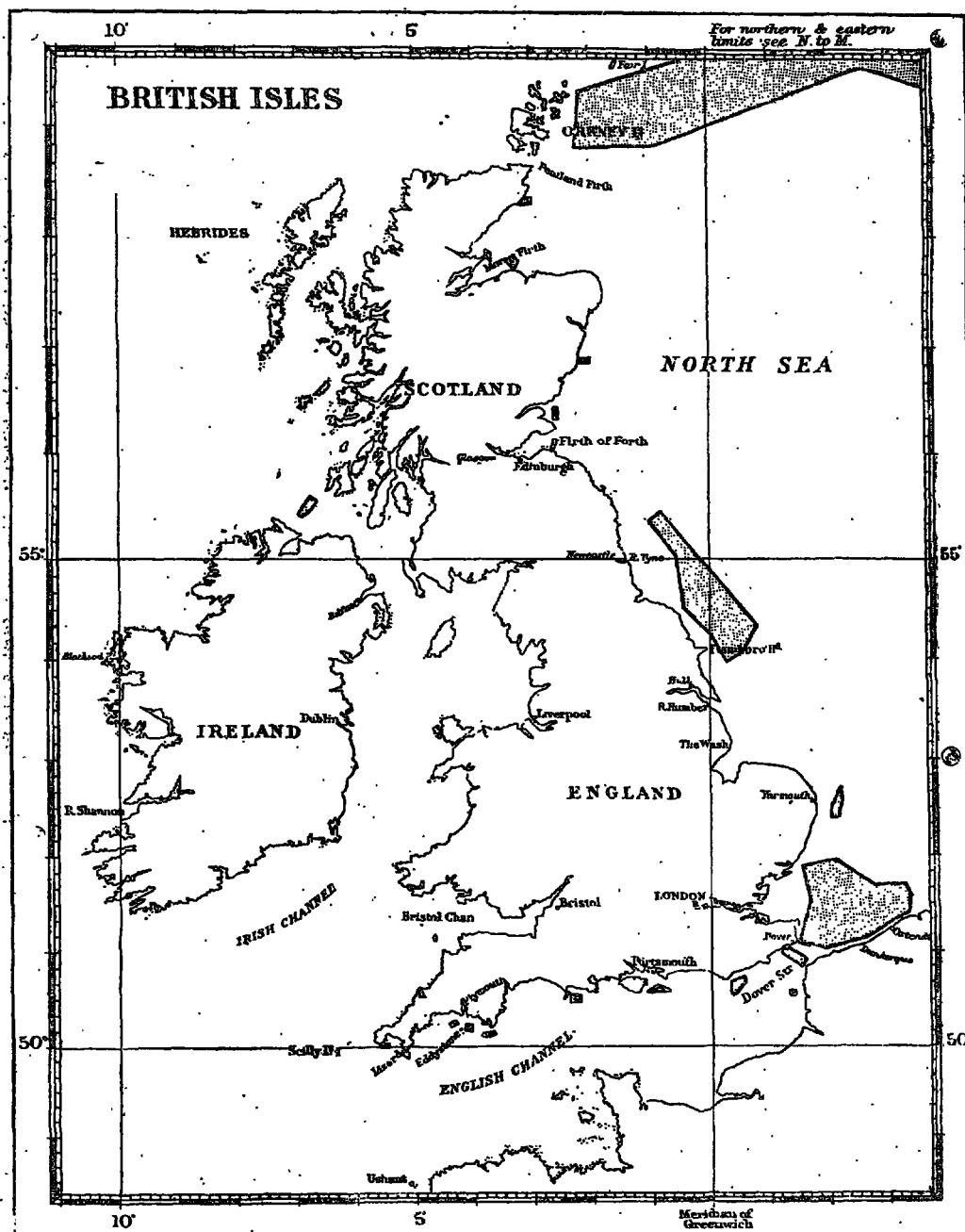

vessel at anchor, and no vessel is to approach within 200 yards of a mine whilst attempting to sink or destroy it.

"The attention of Masters is drawn to the great desirability of taking every opportunity of sinking drifting mines, as their co-operation will help to free the seas of them within a reasonable period."

Before hoisting the mine flag or reporting a mine which has been left afloat, every care should be taken to confirm that the object actually is a mine, in order to prevent unnecessary confusion; the mine flag is a square flag white over blue diagonal.

WARNING SIGNALS DISPLAYED BY BRITISH VESSELS ACCOMPANYING SUBMARINES.

Former Notice.—No. 149 of 1920.

Attention is specially drawn to the following information with regard to vessels accompanying Submarines:—

British men-of-war, Auxiliary Patrol vessels, Royal fleet and Mercantile fleet Auxiliaries and all British Merchant vessels, whenever proceeding in company with Submarines are to fly "M" (International) at the masthead, accompanied by a group from the numeral table in the International Code of Signals, indicating the number of Submarines in company. This signal is a warning to vessels that Submarines are in the vicinity. When "M" flag is displayed vessels are cautioned to steer, so as to give the escorting vessel a berth of at least one mile, and also to pass astern of her. When from any cause this cannot be done, the escorting vessel should be approached at slow speed until warning is given of the danger zone by flags, semaphore or megaphone, as most convenient, a good look-out being kept meanwhile for the Submarines, whose presence may be only indicated by their periscopes showing above water. The use of the large red flag has been discontinued for this purpose.
