ORDER OF THE BOARD OF TRADE, DATED 1ST JANUARY, 1921, UNDER THE THIRD SCHEDULE TO THE COAL MINES ACT, 1911 (1 & 2 GEO. 5, C. 50), PRESCRIBING MANNER OF TESTING HORSES FOR GLANDERS BEFORE BEING TAKEN UNDERGROUND.

In pursuance of the Third Schedule to the Coal Mines Act, 1911, and of the provisions of the Mining Industry Act, 1920, the Board of Trade hereby prescribe that horses before being taken underground shall be tested for glanders by a duly qualified veterinary surgeon in the following manner:—

(1) The test shall consist of the hypodermic injection of mallein, followed by the taking of the temperature of the animal at the 6th, 9th, 12th, 15th and 20th hours respectively after the injection, but may be combined with any supplementary test.

(2) The animal to be tested shall rest for 24 hours before the test is applied.

(3) The physiological variation of the animal's temperature shall be noted before the test is applied.

(4) The test shall not be applied to any animal while showing an abnormal temperature.

(5) The animal shall not be worked for a period of 30 hours after the injection.

(6) The test shall not be applied to any animal which, after making reasonable inquiry, the veterinary surgeon knows to have received a mallein injection within the preceding month.

(7) The mallein used for the test shall be obtained from the Royal Veterinary College, and shall be used in the dose specified by the College.

The Order dated 17th May, 1912, made by

the Secretary of State, in pursuance of the Third Schedule to the Act, is hereby revoked.

UNEMPLOYMENT INSURANCE ACT, 1920.

Whereas application has been made to the Minister by the Metropolitan Asylums Board, Embankment, E.C. 4, for a decision of the question whether the employment of a person at a Hospital as Foreman, and as such supervises the porter staff, whose duties include carrying patients and stores in and out of certain Institutions maintained by the said Board, is such employment as to make that person an unemployed person within the meaning of the Unemployment Insurance Act, 1920.

Now therefore the Minister, by virtue of the power conferred on him by Section 10 of the said Act, decides that the said employment is not such as to make the said person an employed person within the meaning of the said Act.

JUTE TRADE BOARD (GREAT BRITAIN).

PROPOSAL TO VARY AND FIX MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES FOR A CERTAIN CLASS OF FEMALE WORKERS EMPLOYED AS LEARNERS IN THE WEAVING SECTION OF THE TRADE.

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour, and dated 31st October, 1918, the Trade Board established under the Trade Boards Act, 1918, for the Jute Trade in Great Britain, as specified in the Trade Boards (Jute) Order, 1919, hereby give notice, as required by Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, that they propose to vary the General Minimum Time-Rates at present Fixed and set out in the Schedule to their Notice dated 3rd June, 1920, and the Overtime Rates at present fixed and set out in the Schedule to their Notice dated 22nd October, 1920, in their application to a certain class of Female Workers employed as Learners in the Weaving Section of the Trade, and to Fix Overtime Rates for certain classes of Female Workers employed as Learners on Time-work in the Weaving Section of the Trade, the Proposed Minimum Rates being as shown in the Schedule set out below.

The Minister of Labour has given his consent to the issue of this Notice.

SCHEDULE.

PART I.

Proposed Variation of General Minimum Time-Rates for Female Weaving Learners (as defined in Part III of this Schedule).

SECTION I.—In lieu of the General Minimum Time-Rates set out in the Trade Board's Notice, dated 3rd June, 1920, and effective

under the Order of the Minister of Labour, dated 1st June, 1920, Female Weaving Learners, as defined in Part III of this Schedule, shall receive during one (and not more than one) period of learnership, which shall not exceed two months, a General Minimum Time-Rate of 18s. per week of 48 hours.

Provided that, in the case where a Weaving Mistress has immediate responsibility for the instruction of not more than one Female Weaving Learner, the Minimum Rate set out in this Part of this Schedule shall only apply where the Weaving Mistress is paid by the employer in respect of such responsibility the sum of not less than 5s. per week in addition to her own earnings on Piece-work.

(NOTE.—*The Method of remuneration prescribed in the above proviso for a Weaving Mistress who has immediate responsibility for the instruction of not more than one Female Weaving Learner does not apply in cases where a Weaving Mistress is engaged in instructing Learners of Weaving under a group system of instruction.*)

SECTION II.—The above proposed General Minimum Time-Rate is a weekly rate based on a week of 48 hours, and shall be subject to a proportionate adjustment according as the number of hours spent by the Female Weaving Learner in the factory or workshop under contract of employment in any week is less than 48.

PART II.

Proposed Overtime Rates and Proposed Variation of Overtime Rates for Female Learners of Weaving.

Overtime Rates to be paid in respect of all hours worked by Female Weaving Learners employed on Time-work in excess of the number of hours declared by the Trade Board to be the normal number of hours of work in the trade shall be as follows:—

(a) Female Weaving Learners (other than those specified in paragraph (b) of this Part of this Notice), employed on Time-work, shall receive Overtime Rates, calculated on the General Minimum Time-Rate specified in Section I of Part I of this Schedule, in the manner set out in Part II of the Notice J. (5) issued by the Trade Board and dated 22nd October, 1920.

(b) Female Weaving Learners employed on Time-work in the Municipal Burgh of Brechin, the Parish of Brechin, the Municipal Burgh of Forfar, the Parish of Forfar, the Burgh of Kirriemuir, the Parish of Kirriemuir, the Burgh of Blairgowrie, the Burgh of Carnoustie or the Parish of Logie Pert, who in accordance with the established practice of the establishment attend (i) for nine hours per day on five days of the week and for three hours on Saturday, or (ii) only on five days a week, shall receive Overtime Rates calculated on the General Minimum Time-Rate specified in Section I of Part I of this Schedule, in the manner set out in Part I of the Notice J. (6) issued by the Trade Board and dated 29th October, 1920.

PART III.

For the purpose of the application of the Minimum Rates specified in Parts I and II of this Schedule, a Female Weaving Learner shall be deemed to mean a Female Worker who is:—

(a) Definitely and effectively learning

Weaving under the immediate instruction of a Weaving Mistress.

(b) Employed under conditions such that she shall cease to be employed on Time-work, and shall be employed on Piece-work at the earliest date practicable.

PART IV.

The above proposed Minimum Rates of Wages shall apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, to the classes of Female Workers specified in Part III of this Schedule, in respect of all time during which they are employed in Great Britain in any branch of the trade specified in the Trade Boards (Jute) Order, 1919, that is to say:—

The preparing, spinning or weaving (a) of jute, or (b) of jute and any other fibre except flax or hemp;

Including—

(1) The preparing and spinning of waste reclaimed at any stage, and

(2) All packing, despatching, warehousing, storing, or other operations incidental to or appertaining to any of the above-mentioned work; but

Excluding—

(1) The calendering, bleaching, dyeing, or finishing of any of the above-mentioned materials, and

(2) The preparing or spinning of materials required for the making or remaking of (a) rope (including driving rope and banding); (b) cord (including blind and window cord, but excluding silk, worsted and other fancy cords); (c) core for wire ropes; (d) lines; (e) twine (including binder and trawl twine) (f) lanyards; (g) net and similar articles, when such preparing or spinning is carried on in the same factory or workshop as the said making or remaking; and

(3) The making or repair of sacks or bags: and also

(4) The weaving of carpets, rugs or mats.

PART V.

SECTION I.—The above proposed Minimum Rates of Wages shall be paid clear of all deductions other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments or deductions authorised by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any superannuation or other provident fund.

SECTION II.—The above proposed Minimum Rates of Wages shall be without prejudice to Workers who are earning higher Rates of Wages.

The Trade Board will consider any Objections to the above Proposals to Vary and Fix which may be lodged with them within two months from 17th January, 1921. Such Objections should be in writing and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her full name and address), and should be sent to the Secretary of the Jute Trade Board (Great Britain), 5, Chancery Lane, London, W.C. 2.

It is desirable that the Objections should state precisely, and so far as possible with reasons, what is objected to.

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour and dated 31st October, 1918, the Trade Board established under the Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, for that Section of the Tailoring Trade specified in the Trade Boards (Tailoring) Order, 1919, which is covered by the Regulations made by the Minister of Labour and dated 15th January, 1920, with respect to the Ready-Made and Wholesale Bespoke Section of the Tailoring Trade in Great Britain, hereby give Notice, as required by Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918 (the Minister of Labour having given his consent to such Notice being given) that they Propose to Vary the General Minimum Time-Rates, Piece-work Basis Time-Rates and Overtime Rates for Female Workers at present fixed and set out in the Schedule to their Notice dated 2nd October, 1920, and effective under an Order of the Minister of Labour dated 2nd October, 1920, the proposed Minimum Rates of Wages being as shown in the Schedule set out below.

SCHEDULE.

PART I.

Proposed Variation of General Minimum Time-Rates for Female Workers.

SECTION I.—Female Workers (other than Learners as specified in Section II. of this Part of this Schedule), namely:—

Overtime Rates, calculated on the Minimum Rates of Wages specified in Parts I and II of this Schedule in the manner specified in Part III of the Schedule to the above-mentioned Notice, dated 2nd October, 1920, shall apply, in substitution for the rates set out in Parts I and II of this Schedule, in respect of all hours worked in excess of the number of hours declared by the Trade Board in the Schedule to the above-mentioned Notice, dated 2nd October, 1920, to be the normal number of hours of work in the trade.

NOTE.—The hours which females, young persons and children are allowed to work are subject to the provisions of the Factory and Workshop Acts,

PART IV.

The above Minimum Rates of Wages shall apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, to all Female Workers in respect of all time during which they are employed in Great Britain in any branch of Ready-made and Wholesale Bespoke Tailoring as defined in the Regulations made by the Minister of Labour, and dated 15th January, 1920; that is to say:—

Men's and Boys' Ready-made and Wholesale Bespoke Tailoring; and all Men's and Boys' Retail Bespoke Tailoring carried on in a factory where garments are made up for three or more retail establishments; and any other branch of Men's and Boys' Tailoring which is not included within the scope of the Regulations, dated 12th December, 1919, with respect to the Constitution and Proceedings of a Trade Board in Great Britain for Retail Bespoke Tailoring;

Including:—

(1) (a) The altering, repairing, renovating or re-making of men's or boys' tailored garments, except where included within the scope of the above-mentioned Regulations with respect to Retail Bespoke Tailoring;

(b) The cleaning of such garments where carried out in association with or in conjunction with the altering, repairing, renovating or re-making of the garments;

(2) The lining with fur of the above-mentioned garments where carried out in association with or in conjunction with making of such garments;

(3) All processes of embroidery or decorative needlework, where carried out in association with or in conjunction with the above-mentioned branches of tailoring;

(4) All warehousing, packing, and other operations incidental to or appertaining to any of the branches of tailoring in question;

But excluding:—

(1) The making of head-gear;

(2) The making of rubberised or oilskin garments;

(3) The making of boys' ready-made washing suits or sailor suits, where carried out in association with or in conjunction with the making of garments to be worn by women or girls, or by children without distinction of sex.

Provided that workers who commence employment in the trade at or over the age of 19 shall receive for a period of 12 months a General Minimum Time-Rate of 38s. per week of 48 hours, i.e., 9½d. per hour. Provided also that this General Minimum Time-Rate shall be increased by 6s. per week of 48 hours, i.e., 1½d per hour, in the case of any such worker who is 22 years of age or over. Workers to whom this proviso applies shall, on the expiration of 12 months' employment in the trade, receive such General Minimum Time-Rates as they may be entitled to under the provisions of this Part of this Schedule.

SECTION VII.

The weekly rates, set out in Section VI. of this Part of this Schedule are based on a week of 48 hours and are subject to a proportionate decrease according as the number of hours of employment in any week is less than 48.

SECTION VIII.

In cases where a worker is employed on piece-work, each piece-rate paid must be such as would yield, in the circumstances of the case, to an ORDINARY worker an amount not less than the Piece-work Basis Time-Rate applicable. Provided that in determining as to whether any piece-rate satisfies this condition, regard shall be had to the earnings of workers of 22 years of age and over only,

PART II.

Proposed Variation of Overtime Rates for Male Workers.

Overtime Rates, calculated off the Minimum Rates of Wages set out in Part I of this Schedule, in the manner specified in Part II of the Schedule to the above-mentioned Notice, dated 13th August, 1920, shall apply, in substitution for the rates set out in Part I of this Schedule, in respect of all hours worked in excess of the number of hours declared by the Trade Board in the Schedule to the said Notice, dated 13th August, 1920, to be the normal number of hours of work in the trade.

NOTE.—The hours which young persons and children are allowed to work are subject to the provisions of the Factory and Workshop Acts.

PART III.

For the purpose of this Notice the following definitions shall apply:—

SECTION I.—(a) A Measure Cutter is a person who is employed in any process of Measure Cutting, and is capable of taking a complete set of measures, and of cutting any garment for a Male person from model patterns, and has sufficient technical knowledge to draft men's trousers and alter the balance and distribution of widths, lengths, etc., for any garment for a Male person (excluding alterations to stock patterns).

(b) A Cutter (other than a Measure Cutter or Knife Cutter or Knifeman) is a person who is employed in:—

(i) Marking-in or marking-up cloth or linings or other materials;

(ii) Laying-up, hooking-up or folding cloth or linings or other materials;

(iii) Cutting cloth or linings or other materials; and

(iv) Dividing; that is, the process ordinarily carried on by Cutters or their assistants of dividing, parting, or separating the parts of garments after being cut and of assembling them into suitable bundles for making-up.

(c) A Knife Cutter or Knifeman is a person who is wholly or mainly employed on Band, Electric or Hand Knife processes.

(d) A Fitter-up is a person who is employed in Fitting-up; that is, a process between that of cutting and that of sewing, baisting or machining, which consists of preparing or fitting accurately the various parts of the garment before being baisted, sewn or machined, such work of preparing or fitting being always done by shears or knives or other cutting appliances, sewing, baisting or machining forming no part or process of fitting-up.

(e) A Tailor is a person who is employed in Sewing by hand in the process of making a garment or portion of garment.

(f) A Presser is a person who is employed in Pressing-off by hand or by machine.

(g) A Machinist is a person who is employed in Machining other than as a Plain Machinist as defined in Sub-Section (j) of this Section and is capable of machining any garment throughout.

(h) A Passer is a person who is employed in examining Garments, either in the processes of being made up or upon their completion.

(i) An Under-Presser is a person who is employed in pressing processes other than Pressing-off.

(j) A Plain Machinist is a person who is

employed in the process of making-up Plain Sleeves, Facings, Linings, Inside Pockets, Quilting and Padding.

(k) A Warehouseman is a person employed wholly or mainly upon one or more of the following operations, viz., the assembling, keeping, storing and distributing of stock, but *excluding* such operations included in the definitions of a Packer or Porter.

(l) A Packer is a person employed wholly or mainly upon the operation of packing goods and materials, but *excluding* such operations included in the definitions of a Porter or Warehouseman.

(m) A Porter is a person employed wholly or mainly upon one or more of the following operations, viz., unpacking, moving, loading or unloading of goods or materials, but *excluding* such operations included in the definitions of a Packer or Warehouseman.

SECTION II.—The expression "London District" means the Metropolitan and City of London Police Districts.

SECTION III.—The expression "Heavy Cotton Clothing" means articles of clothing for Male persons made wholly or mainly of cords, moles or other fustians, jeans, drills or other similar cotton material, but excluding gabardine raincoats.

PART IV.

The above Minimum Rates of Wages shall apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, to all Male Workers in respect of all time during which they are employed in Great Britain in any Branch of Ready-Made and Wholesale Bespoke Tailoring as defined in the Regulations made by the Minister of Labour and dated 15th January, 1920; that is to say:—

Men's and Boys' ready-made and wholesale bespoke tailoring; and all men's and boys' retail bespoke tailoring carried on in a factory where garments are made up for three or more retail establishments; and any other branch of men's and boys' tailoring which is not included within the scope of the Regulations, dated 12th December, 1919, with respect to the Constitution and Proceedings of a Trade Board in Great Britain for Retail Bespoke Tailoring;

Including:—

(1) (a) The altering, repairing, renovating or remaking of men's or boys' tailored garments, except where included within the scope of the above-mentioned Regulations with respect to Retail Bespoke Tailoring.

(b) The cleaning of such garments where carried out in association with or in conjunction with the altering, repairing, renovating or remaking of the garments;

(2) The lining with fur of the above-mentioned garments where carried out in association with or in conjunction with the making of such garments.

(3) All processes of embroidery or decorative needlework, where carried out in association with or in conjunction with the above-mentioned branches of tailoring.

(4) All warehousing, packing and other operations incidental to or appertaining to any of the branches of tailoring in question.

But excluding:—

(1) The making of headgear;

(2) The making of rubberised or oilskin garments;

(3) The making of boys' ready-made washing suits or sailor suits, where carried out in association with or in conjunction with the making of garments to be worn by women or girls, or by children without distinction of sex.

PART V.

SECTION I.—The above Minimum Rates of Wages shall be paid clear of all deductions other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments or deductions authorised by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any superannuation or other provident fund.

SECTION II.—The above minimum rates of wages are without prejudice to workers earning higher rates of wages, or to agreements made, or that may be made, between employers and workers for the payment of wages in excess of these minimum rates of wages.

PART VI.

The Trade Board further give notice that the Notice of Proposal R.M. (5), issued by the Trade Board and dated 2nd October, 1920, proposing to vary the minimum rates of wages at present effective for certain classes of Male Workers is withdrawn, such proposed variation having been merged in the proposed variation specified in Sections I and VI of Part I and in Part II of this Schedule.

The Trade Board will consider any Objections to the above Proposal to Vary which may be lodged with them within two months from the 14th January, 1921. Such Objections should be in writing and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her full name and address), and should be sent to the Secretary of the Ready-made and Wholesale Bespoke Tailoring Trade Board (Great Britain), 5, Chancery Lane, London, W.C. 2.

It is desirable that the Objections should state precisely, and so far as possible with reasons, what is objected to.

Position.—On flagstaff situated at a distance of about 200 feet northward from the extremity of the Eastern arm.

Lat. $51^{\circ} 07\frac{1}{4}'$ N., long. $1^{\circ} 20\frac{3}{4}'$ E.

The undermentioned traffic signals for regulating the traffic through the Eastern entrance are now exhibited in the above position:—

By Day:

Three red balls, in the form of a triangle, will be shown to indicate when a vessel is leaving the harbour, and no vessel is to approach the entrance from seaward while this signal is shown.

Two red balls, vertical, will denote that a vessel is approaching the entrance from seaward, and no vessel is to leave the harbour.

Three red balls, vertical, will denote that the entrance is closed, and vessels cannot leave or enter.

When no signal is shown on the mast, it will denote the entrance is clear both inwards and outwards, but a lookout must be kept when a vessel is approaching in case the signal is put against her.

By night:

Three white lights, in the form of a triangle, will denote that a vessel is approaching the entrance from seaward, and no vessel is to leave the harbour.

Three red lights, in the form of a triangle, will denote that a vessel is leaving the harbour, and that no other vessel is to enter or approach so as to obstruct the entrance.

Three red lights, vertical, will denote that the entrance is closed, and vessels cannot leave or enter.

When no lights are shown on the mast it will denote that the entrance is clear both inwards and outwards, but a lookout must be kept when a vessel is approaching in case the signal is put against her.

The foregoing signals are also exhibited at the Western entrance as described in the Admiralty publications.

Note.—The words "Traffic Signals (see note)" are to be placed on the chart against the flagstaff in the position given above, and since the signals are now shown from both entrances the first line of the Note which relates to the position of the signals is to be expunged.
