PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS in pursuance of the powers conferred on Him by the Treaty of Peace Act, 1919, His Majesty in Council was pleased to make the Treaty of Peace Order, 1919 (hereinafter referred to as the "principal Order"):

And whereas the principal Order was amended by the Treaty of Peace (Amendment) Order, 1920:

And whereas it is expedient that the principal Order as so amended should be further amended in manner hereinafter appearing:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. The provisions of the principal Order, 1919, as amended by the Treaty of Peace (Amendment) Order, 1920, set out in the first column of the Schedule to this Order shall be amended in the manner shown in the second column of that Schedule.

2. Paragraph (vi) of Article one of the principal Order shall have effect and shall be deemed always to have had effect as if the words "or any other person" were therein inserted after the word "creditor."

3. Paragraph (xvii) of Article one of the principal Order shall have effect and shall be deemed always to have had effect as if at the end thereof the following sub-paragraph were added—

"(f) the Custodian shall have power to charge such fees in respect of his duties under this paragraph, whether by way of percentage or otherwise, as the Treasury may fix, and the fees shall be collected and accounted for by such persons in such manner and shall be paid to such account as the Treasury direct, and the incidence of the fees as between capital and income shall be determined by the Custodian."

4. This Order may be cited as the Treaty of Peace (Amendment) (No. 2) Order, 1920, and the principal Order, the Treaty of Peace (Amendment) Order, 1920, and this Order may be cited together as the Treaty of Peace Orders, 1919 to 1920.

Article.	Nature of Amendment.
1 (iv)	After the words "found due," there shall be inserted the words "together with such interest as aforesaid."
1 (xiva)	For the words "Board of Trade" there shall be substituted the words "Clearing Office."
1 (xvii)	At the end of sub-paragraph (c) there shall be added the words "and to require any person having in his possession any documents of title to any such stock, shares or other securities to deliver the same to him, and an acknowledgment signed by him of such delivery to him, shall be a sufficient discharge to the person delivering the same."
	After sub-paragraph (cc) the following sub-paragraphs shall be inserted—
	"(ccc) Where the property, right or interest subject to the charge, consists of any sum of money due to a German national (not being an enemy debt within the meaning of Article 296 of the Treaty), it shall be payable to the Custodian, and shall be paid to him on demand, and the Custodian shall have power to enforce the payment thereof, and for that purpose shall have all such rights and powers as if he were the creditor."
	"(cccc) A certificate by the Custodian that any property, right or interest is subject to the charge shall be sufficient evidence of the facts stated in the certificate, and where any such application, requirement or demand of the Custodian as aforesaid is accompanied by such a certificate the company, municipal authority or other body by whom the securities were issued or are managed, the person in possession of the property transferable by delivery, or the person by whom a sum of money is due shall comply with the application, requirement or demand, and shall not be liable to any action or other legal proceeding in respect of such compliance, but if it is subsequently proved that the property, right or interest was not subject to the charge, the owner thereof shall be entitled to recover the same from the Custodian or if it has been sold the proceeds of sale but not to any other remedy."
1 (xviii)	For the words "ten months" there shall be substituted the words "sixteen months."

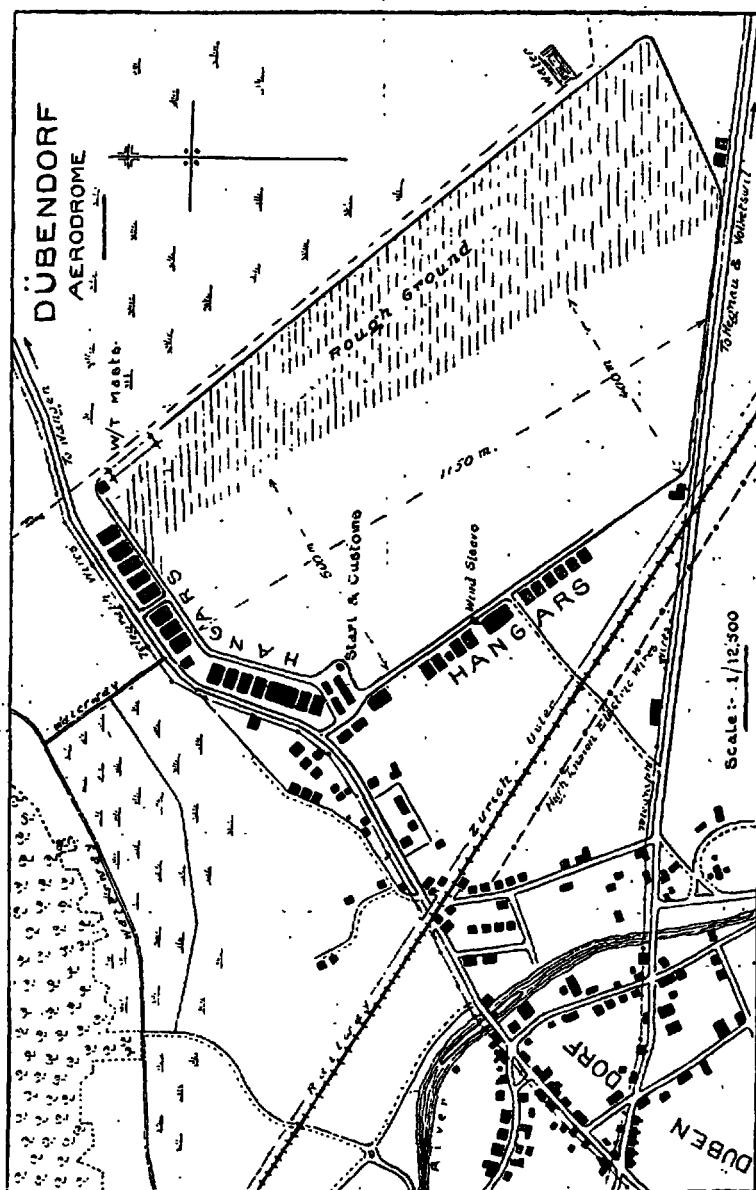

tained in the principal Order, authorise such movement by an Occupation Licence, and the Inspector may insert in the licence such conditions as he may consider necessary or desirable for the purpose of preventing the animals referred to in the licence from coming into contact with any other animals.

(ii.) If in respect of any animal the conditions of a licence granted under this Article are not complied with, the owner of the animal and the person for the time being in charge thereof shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

ORDER OF 1921.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

*Prohibition of Landing except for Slaughter
within Landing Place.*

1.—(1) Cattle, sheep, goats or swine shipped from Ireland shall not, unless and until it is otherwise ordered by the Minister, be landed after the date hereof at any port or place in Great Britain except in accordance with the following provisions of this Order.

(2) Cattle, sheep, goats or swine shipped from any port in Ireland which is mentioned in the First Schedule to the Animals (Landing from Ireland) Consolidation and Amendment Order of 1914, except the ports of Dublin and Waterford, may after the date hereof be landed at any landing place defined by Order of the Minister as a landing place for Irish animals, but only for the purpose of slaughter within the landing place.

(3) The landing of any animals under this Order must be authorised by the Superintendent or person in charge of the landing place.

(4) Animals so landed shall be subject to the provisions of the Animals (Landing from Ireland) Consolidation and Amendment Order of 1914 except that the animals shall not be moved from the landing place, and shall be slaughtered therein within ninety-six hours after their landing.

*Special Provision as to Animals Destined for
Manchester Irish Animals Landing Place.*

2. Animals, if intended to be landed at the Manchester Irish Animals Landing Place under this Order shall not be carried through the Eastham lock until they have been examined by a Veterinary Inspector of the Ministry and unless and until the Inspector certifies that his examination and information do not show that there is, or during the voyage has been, an animal on board affected with Foot-and-Mouth Disease.

Local Authority to Enforce Order.

3. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Offences.

4. If any animal shall be landed or moved in contravention of this Order, or is not slaughtered as hereby required, the owner thereof and the owner and the lessee and the occupier of the place of landing, and the person causing, directing or permitting the landing or movement, and the owner and person in charge of the animal which is not so slaughtered, and the owner and the charterer, and the master of the vessel from which the same is landed as the case may be shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts or defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Contraction of Scheduled District.

1. The Lincolnshire (Ormsby District) (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1920 shall apply only to the Area described in the Schedule to this Order, and that Area, subject to the modification contained in Article 2 of the first-mentioned Order, shall continue to be a Prohibited Area for the purposes of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Control of Movement) Order of 1920.

2. This Order shall come into operation on the twenty-first day of January, nineteen hundred and twenty-one.

3. This Order may be cited as the LINCOLNSHIRE (ORMSBY DISTRICT) (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1921 (No. 2), and shall be read with the Lincolnshire (Ormsby District) (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1920.

AGRICULTURAL WAGES BOARD (ENGLAND AND WALES).

ORDER VARYING THE MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES AT PRESENT IN FORCE FOR MALE WORKMEN OF CERTAIN AGES THROUGHOUT ENGLAND AND WALES, TO COME INTO OPERATION ON THE 1ST MARCH, 1921.

The Agricultural Wages Board (England and Wales) hereby give notice, as required by the above Act, that they have made the following Order:—

1. The wages payable for employment in agriculture in each area described in Column 1 of the Schedule to this Order of male workmen of the respective classes and ages mentioned in Columns 2 and 3 of that Schedule shall be not less than wages at the respective rates specified in Column 4 of that Schedule for the hours specified in Column 5 thereof.

2. The differential rates for overtime employment in each area described in Column 1 of the Schedule hereto of male workmen of the respective classes and ages mentioned in Columns 2 and 3 of that Schedule shall be the rates specified in Column 6 thereof.

3. Provided that where a whole-time workman is employed by the week or any longer period, the wages payable to him for the hours of work agreed between him and the employer in any week (excluding hours of overtime employment) shall not be less than the amount specified in Column 4 of the said Schedule and applicable to that workman, notwithstanding that those hours are less than the hours specified in Column 5 and applicable to him.

4. Provided also that in the case of a workman of less than 18 years of age to whom this Order applies, the minimum rates and overtime rates shall, during the first two months of

his employment in agriculture, be 20 per cent. less than the rates which, but for this provision, would be applicable to him under the preceding clauses of this Order.

5. For the purpose of the above rates, overtime employment shall mean:—(a) In the case of each of the said areas and of workmen of each of the said classes and ages such employment as is described in Column 7 of the Schedule to this Order in relation to such areas and workmen respectively; (b) in the case of all the said areas and workmen of all the said classes and ages (except in any case in which the application of this provision is expressly excluded or varied by the said Column 7) all employment in excess of 6½ hours on a Saturday or on such other day (not being Sunday) in every week as may be agreed between the employer and the workman.

6. In the said Schedule the expression "employment in summer" shall mean employment during the period commencing on the first Monday in March and ending on the last Sunday in October, and the expression "employment in winter" shall mean employment during the rest of the year.

7. For the purpose of the above rates, the hours of work shall not include meal times, but shall include any time during which, by reason of weather conditions, an employer has prevented from working a workman who was present at the place of employment and ready to work.

8. This Order shall apply to all male workmen of the ages specified in the Schedule to this Order employed in agriculture within the meaning of Section 17 (1) of the Corn Production Act, 1917, in any area described in the said Schedule during such time as they are so employed.

9. This Order shall come into operation on the 1st day of March, 1921.
