LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT, 1888.

BOROUGH OF SHAFTESBURY.

Whereas in pursuance of Section 54 of the Local Government Act, 1888, a representation has been made by the Council of the borough of Shaftesbury that it is desirable that by a Provisional Order under the said Act the boundary of the said borough should be altered so as to include the parish of Alcester and parts of the parish of Cann, in the rural district of Shaftesbury:

And whereas a Provisional Order issued under the said Act may be made for any of the purposes mentioned in Sections 54 and 59 of the said Act, and may also amend any Local and Personal Act:

And whereas by Section 297 of the Public Health Act, 1875, any Act confirming any Provisional Order made in pursuance of any of the Sanitary Acts, or of that Act, may be repealed, altered or amended by Provisional Order made by the Minister of Health and confirmed by Parliament:

And whereas it is proposed that a Provisional Order should be made by the Minister of Health for carrying into effect the proposal contained in the said representation, or such other proposal as he may deem expedient, and that such Order should, so far as seems necessary or proper for the purpose thereof, provide for the matters specified in Section 54 or Section 59 of the said Local Government Act, 1888, and Section 54 of the Local Government Act, 1894, or some of them, and should, so far as appears to be necessary, amend the provisions of the Local Acts in force in the borough or in any area to be affected by such Order, and of the Acts confirming Provisional Orders made under the sanitary Acts of the Public Health Act, 1875, and relating to the borough or any area to be affected, or of some of such Acts:

Notice is hereby given, that W. M. Cross, Esquire, M.Inst.C.E., one of the Inspectors of the Ministry of Health, will attend at the Town Hall, Shaftesbury, on Thursday, the seventeenth day of February, 1921, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, to hold a local inquiry into the subject-matter of the said proposals and all other matters relating thereto:

And notice is hereby further given, that any person interested may attend at such inquiry and be heard with reference to the said proposals and the other matters aforesaid

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ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 18TH JANUARY 1921.)

WILTSHIRE AND DISTRICT (MUZZLING AND CONTROL OF DOGS) ORDER OF 1921 (No. 2).

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Extension of Scheduled District.

1. The Wiltshire and District (Muzzling and Control of Dogs) Order of 1920 shall be read and have effect as if the Area described in the Schedule hereto were included in, and formed part of, the Scheduled District described in the Schedule to that Order.

Commencement.

2. This Order shall take immediate effect: Provided that until the twenty-first day of January, nineteen hundred and twenty-one, a dog in or on any public place in the Area described in the Schedule hereto need not be muzzled if it is led by a person with a collar and chain or other attachment.

Short Title.

3. This Order may be cited as the WILTSHIRE AND DISTRICT (MUZZLING AND CONTROL OF DOGS) ORDER OF 1921 (No. 2), and shall be read with the Wiltshire and District (Muzzling and Control of Dogs) Order of 1920.

SCHEDULE.

Area added to Scheduled District.

An Area in the administrative county of Southampton, comprising the petty sessional divisions of Fareham, Gosport, Havant, Droxford, Petersfield (including its detached part), Alresford, and Alton, and the parishes of Nutley, Preston Candover, Bradley, Ellisfield, Herriard, Tunworth, Weston Corbett, Weston Patrick (including its detached part), Upton Grey, South Warnborough, Long Sutton and Crondall.

And also comprising—

The County Borough of Portsmouth.
