

tained in the principal Order, authorise such movement by an Occupation Licence, and the Inspector may insert in the licence such conditions as he may consider necessary or desirable for the purpose of preventing the animals referred to in the licence from coming into contact with any other animals.

(ii.) If in respect of any animal the conditions of a licence granted under this Article are not complied with, the owner of the animal and the person for the time being in charge thereof shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

Application of Part II of Principal Order to certain Boroughs.

4. Part II of the principal Order is hereby applied to the city of Birmingham and the boroughs of Banbury, Brackley and Chipping Norton.

Commencement.

5. This Order shall come into operation on the twentieth day of January, nineteen hundred and twenty-one.

Short Title, &c.

6. This Order may be cited as the MIDLAND COUNTIES (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1921 (No. 3).

FIRST SCHEDULE.

Scheduled District to which restrictions apply.

1. A District comprising—

In the administrative county of Stafford:

The borough of Wednesbury, the petty sessional divisions of Bilston, Dudley, Rowley Regis and Wednesbury, and the parishes of Willenhall, Bentley, Short Heath, Pelsall, Walsall Wood, Aldridge, Rushall, Great Barr, Perry Barr, Shenstone, Weeford, Hints, Canwell, Drayton Bassett, Quarry Bank, Amblescote, Brierley Hill, Kingswinford, and Himley;

In the administrative county of Warwick:

The borough of Sutton Coldfield, the parishes of Middleton, Wishaw, Curdworth, Lea Marston, Water Orton, Minworth, Castle Bromwich, Coleshill, Little Packington, Bickenhill, Sheldon, Elmdon, Solihull, Hampton-in-Arden, Barston, Knowle, Packwood, and Tanworth; and such portions of the parishes of Shustoke and Nether Whitacre as lie to the west of the Midland Railway from Coleshill to Tamworth;

In the administrative county of Worcester:

The borough of Stourbridge, the petty sessional divisions of Oldbury, Halesowen, Stour-

bridge (except the parish of Churchill) and Bromsgrove (except the parishes of Upton Warren and Stoke Prior), and the parishes of Wythall, Alvechurch, Beoley, and Tutnall and Cobley.

And also comprising—

The city of Birmingham, and the county boroughs of Dudley, Smethwick, Walsall, and West Bromwich.

2. A District comprising—

In the administrative county of Northampton:

The borough of Brackley, the petty sessional division of Brackley (except the parishes of Astwell with Falcutt, Syresham, Whitfield Evenley, Croughton and Aynho), and the parishes of Byfield and Woodford-cum-Membris.

In the administrative county of Oxford:

The boroughs of Banbury and Chipping Norton, the petty sessional division of Banbury and Bloxham, and the parishes of Hook Norton, Swerford (including its detached part), South Newington, Barford St. Michael (except its detached part), Little Tew, Great Rollright, Heythrop, Over Norton, Little Rollright, Salford, Cornwell, Chastleton, Kingham, Churchill, Sarsden, Lyneham, Idbury, and Ffield;

In the administrative county of Gloucester:

The petty sessional divisions of Moreton-in-Marsh and Stow-on-the-Wold (except the parishes of Naunton, Notgrove, Eyford, Upper Slaughter, Lower Slaughter, Bourton-on-the-Water, Clapton, Little Rissington, Great Rissington, and Great Barrington), and the parishes of Evenlode and Daylesford (transferred by agreement from the county of Worcester);

In the administrative county of Warwick:

The petty sessional division of Southam and parishes of Little Compton, Barton-on-the-Heath, Long Compton, Whichford, Stourton, Great Wolford, Little Wolford, Cherington, Brailes, Sutton-under-Brailes, Compton Wyniates, Tysoe, Ratley and Upton, Shotteswell, and Farnborough.

SECOND SCHEDULE.

Prohibited Areas.

1. An Area comprising the city of Birmingham.

2. An Area comprising the parish of Sheldon, in the administrative county of Warwick.

3. An Area comprising the District No. 2 described in the First Schedule hereto, with the exception of the petty sessional division of Southam, in the administrative county of Warwick.
