**ADDITIONAL TREASURY REGULATION UNDER
SECTION 4 OF THE PENSIONS (INCREASE) ACT,
1920, RELATING TO PENSIONERS IN RECEIPT
OF PENSIONS GRANTED BY LOCAL OR OTHER
PUBLIC AUTHORITIES (WITH THE EXCEPTION
OF POLICE AUTHORITIES) IN GREAT BRITAIN.**

Nos. 6 and 7 of the Regulations dated the 11th October, 1920, relating to pensioners in receipt of pensions granted by Local or other Public Authorities (with the exception of Police Authorities) in Great Britain are hereby repealed, and the following shall be substituted therefor:—

6. Where in pursuance of an application an increase of pension is granted, the increase shall continue in force until the expiration of a period of twelve months from the date as from which the increase is payable unless in the meantime the pensioner dies or ceases to fulfil the statutory condi-

tions. Provided that in the case of a first application the increase may, if the Pension Authority think fit and subject to the provisions of the Act, continue in force until the 31st March, 1922.

7. Applications for the continuance and reassessment of increases of pensions, accompanied by a like declaration, shall be sent to the Pension Authority not more than three nor less than two months before the expiration of the first period for which the increase is granted and of every subsequent period of twelve months.

TRADE BOARDS ACTS, 1909 AND 1918. BOOT AND SHOE REPAIRING TRADE BOARD (GREAT BRITAIN).

PROPOSAL TO VARY MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES FOR MALE APPRENTICES (MAINLY BY THE ALTERATION OF CLASSIFICATION AND CONDITIONS).

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour, and dated 31st October, 1918, the Trade Board established under the Trade Boards Act, 1918, in Great Britain for the branches of trade specified in the Trade Boards (Boot and Shoe Repairing) Order, 1919, hereby give notice, as required by Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, that they propose to vary the Minimum Rates at present applicable to Male Apprentices as set out in the Schedules to their Notices dated 15th November, 1919, and 13th May, 1920, by the substitution of the provisions set out in the Schedule below for those set out in the before-mentioned Schedules.

SCHEDULE.

PART I.

Proposed Minimum Rates for Male Apprentices.

SECTION I.—The General Minimum Time-Rates for Male Indentured Apprentices, as defined in Part III of this Schedule, shall be as follows:—

Class A.—Apprentices who are apprenticed to Boot and Shoe Repairing in all its branches, including re-welting, hand-sewn repairs, benching, finishing by hand or machine, and patching:—

Apprentices of 14 and under 15 years of age, 9s. per week of 48 hours.

Apprentices of 15 and under 16 years of age, 14s. per week of 48 hours.

Apprentices of 16 and under 17 years of age, 17s. per week of 48 hours.

Apprentices of 17 and under 18 years of age, 22s. per week of 48 hours.

Apprentices of 18 and under 19 years of age, 27s. per week of 48 hours.

Provided that in the case of Apprentices indentured prior to the 15th May, 1920, the above rates shall also apply to Indentured Apprentices who are under adequate instruction in Boot and Shoe Repairing in all its branches, including re-welting, hand-sewn repairs, benching, finishing by hand or machine, and patching, notwithstanding that the Indentures do not in terms so provide.

The minimum rates payable to Apprentices of Class A. of 19 years of age and over shall be those for the time being in force applicable to workers other than Apprentices.

Class B.—(a) Apprentices who are apprenticed for a period of five years to Hand-sewn Making; and

(b) Apprentices who are apprenticed for a period of five years to Hand-sewn Making and Repairing, and not less than one-third of whose time is spent in Hand-sewn Making:—

During the 1st year of apprenticeship, 10s per week of 48 hours.

During the 2nd year of apprenticeship, 15s. per week of 48 hours.

During the 3rd year of apprenticeship, 20s. per week of 48 hours.

During the 4th year of apprenticeship, 25s. per week of 48 hours.

During the 5th year of apprenticeship, 32s. per week of 48 hours.

Provided that in the case of Apprentices indentured prior to 15th May, 1920, the above rates shall also apply to Indentured Apprentices who are under adequate instruction in Hand-sewn making or Hand-sewn making and Repairing, notwithstanding that the Indenture provides also for instruction in Boot and Shoe Repairing generally.

Provided also that the minimum rates payable to Apprentices of Class B of 21 years of age and over shall be those for the time being in force applicable to workers other than Apprentices.

Class C.—Apprentices who are apprenticed for a period of five years to Rivet and Combination Making and Repairing and not less than one-third of whose time is spent in Rivet and Combination Making:—

During the 1st year of apprenticeship, 10s. per week of 48 hours.

During the 2nd year of apprenticeship, 15s. per week of 48 hours.

During the 3rd year of apprenticeship, 20s. per week of 48 hours.

During the 4th year of apprenticeship, 25s. per week of 48 hours.

During the 5th year of apprenticeship, 30s. per week of 48 hours.

Provided that in the case of Apprentices indentured prior to the date on which the minimum rates set out in this Notice come into operation the above rates shall also apply to Indentured Apprentices who are under adequate instruction in Rivet and Combination Making and Repairing, notwithstanding that the Indenture does not expressly provide for such instruction and notwithstanding that the Indenture also provides for instruction in other branches of work.

Provided also that the minimum rates payable to Apprentices of Class C of 20 years of age and over shall be those for the time being in force applicable to workers other than Apprentices.

SECTION II.—The minimum rates payable to all Male Apprentices other than those specified in Section I of this Part of this Schedule shall be the appropriate minimum rates for the time being in force applicable to workers other than Male Indentured Apprentices of the classes specified in Section I of this Part of this Schedule.

PART II.

Proposed Overtime Rates for Male Apprentices.

SECTION I.—In accordance with Section 3 (1) (c) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, the Trade Board propose to declare the normal number of hours of work in the Trade to be as follows:—

In any week, 48

On Monday, 8.

On any day other than Monday, Saturday, Sunday or Customary Public and Statutory holidays, 9.

Provided that all hours worked by a worker on Sundays and Customary Public and Statu-

tory holidays, and all hours worked on Saturdays (subject to the provisions set out below) shall be regarded as overtime to which the Overtime rates shall apply.

The above-mentioned provisions shall not prejudice a worker's claim to a Saturday half-holiday where it is now given

SECTION II.—The proposed minimum rates for Overtime in respect of hours worked by a worker in excess of the declared normal number of hours shall be as follows:—

1. On any day other than Saturdays, Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays:—

(a) For the first two hours' overtime, one-and-a-quarter times the minimum rate otherwise applicable—*i.e.*, Time-and-a-Quarter.

(b) For Overtime after the first two hours of Overtime, one-and-a-half times the minimum rate otherwise applicable—*i.e.*, Time-and-a-half.

Provided that where it is or may become the established practice of an Employer to require attendance only on five days a week, the Overtime rates set out in paragraphs 1 (a) and (b) of this Section shall not be payable on any day except Friday, Saturday, Sunday and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays until the number of hours worked exceeds $9\frac{1}{2}$ and $11\frac{1}{2}$ respectively, and shall not be payable on Friday until the number of hours worked exceeds 10 and 12 respectively. In the application of this proviso, one other day in each week not being Saturday or Sunday may be, by agreement between the employer and the worker, substituted for Friday.

2. On Saturday in respect of:—

(a) That class of worker who customarily attends on five days a week:

i. For the first two hours of Overtime (that is to say, for the first two hours worked on Saturday) one-and-a-quarter times the minimum rate otherwise applicable—*i.e.*, Time-and-a-quarter.

ii. For Overtime after the first two hours of Overtime, one-and-a-half times the minimum rate otherwise applicable—*i.e.*, Time-and-a-half.

(b) That class of worker who customarily attends on six days a week:

For the first two hours' Overtime worked after the first four hours of work on Saturday, one-and-a-quarter times the minimum rate otherwise applicable—*i.e.*, Time-and-a-quarter, and for all subsequent Overtime, one-and-a-half times the minimum rate otherwise applicable—*i.e.*, Time-and-a-half

NOTE.—During the first 4 hours worked on Saturday the minimum rate applicable for this class of worker is the appropriate minimum rate set out in Part I of this Notice.

3. On Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, for all time worked, twice the minimum rate otherwise applicable—*i.e.*, Double Time.

In the application of the above Overtime Rates, any other day not being Sunday may be, by agreement in writing between an employer and a worker substituted in place of Saturday as the weekly short day.

NOTE.—The Overtime rates set out in Paragraphs 1, 2 and 3 of this Section are payable in respect of all hours of overtime worked on any day, notwithstanding that the number of hours worked in the week does not exceed 48.

PART III.

For the purpose of this Notice a Male Indentured Apprentice is defined to be a worker who:—

(a) Is employed during the whole of his time under an Indenture of Apprenticeship which, in the case of Apprenticeships commencing after the date on which the minimum rates set out in this Notice come into effect, is in the form set out in Part IV of this Schedule; which, in the case of an apprenticeship commenced before the date on which the minimum rates set out in this Notice come into effect, provides for the effective instruction of the Apprentice in one of the sections of the trade specified in Section I of Part I of this Schedule, appropriate to the Apprentice according as his employment comes within the scope of Class A or Class B or Class C; which in the case of Apprentices coming within the scope of the first proviso under Classes A, B, and C, respectively, of Section I of Part I of this Schedule, is an Indenture of Apprenticeship to some branch of Boot and Shoe Repairing or making; and

(b) Has been registered with the Trade Board in accordance with Rules laid down from time to time by the Trade Board; Provided that:

(i) The registration may be cancelled if the conditions of apprenticeship are not complied with;

(ii) An employer may employ a worker at the rates and under the conditions specified in this Schedule for male indentured apprentices without registration for a probationary period not exceeding three months, but in the event of such worker being continued thereafter at his employment as an apprentice, the probationary period shall be included in his period of apprenticeship.

(iii) Provided also that—

In cases where the number of Journey-men employed in the workshop in which the apprentice is employed throughout the period of 12 months prior to the date of application for registration is:—

Three or less,

Four to six,

Seven to Nine,

the registration and employment of male workers as apprentices at the minimum rates of wages set out in Part I of this Schedule shall be limited to:—

One,

Two,

Three,

and thereafter one additional apprentice may be employed for every additional three or fewer than three journeymen.

PART IV.

Form of Indenture of Apprenticeship.

The form of Indenture of Apprenticeship referred to in Part III of this Notice is as follows:—

1. The Apprentice of his own free will and with the consent of the Guardian hereby binds himself to serve the Employer as his Apprentice in his craft of (1) _____ for the term of (2) _____ years from the date of these presents.

2. In consideration of the covenants and agreements entered into by the Guardian and the Apprentice, the Employer hereby covenants with the Guardian and the Apprentice and with each of them severally as follows:—

(a) That he will keep the Apprentice as his Apprentice during the said term and to the best of his power, skill and knowledge instruct the Apprentice or cause him to be instructed in (3) _____

(b) That he will keep the Apprentice under his own supervision or place him under a fully qualified Journeyman (or Journey-men).

(c) That he will pay the Apprentice every week during the said term wages in accordance with the appropriate scale of wages for the time being in force for Male Indentured Apprentices under the orders of the Boot and Shoe Repairing Trade Board (Great Britain).

(d) That during the said term he will not require the apprentice to work in excess of the number of hours declared by the Trade Board to be the normal number of hours of work in the trade.

(e) That during the said term he will not put the Apprentice on piece-work.

(f) That for any periods of absence from work owing to sickness not exceeding in the aggregate four weeks in any one year, he will on receipt of a weekly medical certificate supplied by a duly qualified medical practitioner pay the apprentice full wages in respect of such period or periods of absence from work.

(g) That if the Employer shall die or become permanently incapacitated through illness or injury, to be certified by a duly qualified medical practitioner, or shall cease to carry on the said trade of (4) _____ before the expiration of the said term of apprenticeship, the Employer or his Executors or administrators as the case may be shall, if requested so to do by the Guardian and the Apprentice, find another suitable Employer for the Apprentice to take over this Indenture. Provided that in the case of the retirement or death of a partner in a

(2) Insert the number of years appropriate to the apprenticeship.

(3) Insert, as the case may be, "Boot and Shoe Repairing in all its branches, including re-welting, hand-sewn repairs, benching, finishing by hand or machine and patching," or "Hand-sewn making," or "Hand-sewn Making and Repairing, not less than one-third of the apprentice's time during the said term to be spent on Hand-sewn making," or "Rivet and Combination making and repairing, not less than one-third of the apprentice's time during the said term to be spent on Rivet and Combination Making."

(4) Insert "Boot and Shoe Repairer" or "Boot and Shoe Maker" or "Boot and Shoe Maker and Repairer," as the case may be.

firm the surviving partner or partners shall be deemed to be the Employer for the purposes of this Indenture.

(h) That he will not hold the Apprentice liable to make good the value of any work which the Apprentice may spoil, except in the case of wilful or malicious damage.

(i) That he will cause the Apprentice to attend, during the term of this Indenture, such Technical Classes as may be available and may be agreed by the parties hereto, for the instruction of the Apprentice in the art, craft or trade of Boot and Shoe Making and/or Repairing, and that if such classes occur during the ordinary working hours, the hours so spent shall be reckoned in the total number of working hours of the Apprentice.

(j) That he will not cause the Apprentice to suffer any loss of wages by reason of his attendance at any Technical Classes as aforesaid or by reason of his attendance at school in accordance with the provisions of the Education Act, 1918.

(k) That he will grant to the Apprentice, without loss of wages, the Customary Public and Statutory Holidays.

(l) That for the purposes of ascertaining the progress of the Apprentice and the adequacy of the instruction, he will, on the request of the Apprentice or Guardian, submit the Apprentice for such examination as may be required by the Boot and Shoe Repairing Trade Board (Great Britain).

(m) That he will supply the Apprentice forthwith, upon its execution, with a true copy of this Indenture.

3. In consideration of the premises, the Guardian and the Apprentice respectively and severally covenant with the Employer as follows:—

(a) That the Apprentice shall truly and faithfully, during the said term, serve the Employer as his Apprentice and his secrets keep and shall diligently attend to the work to which he is apprenticed and at all times willingly obey the lawful and reasonable commands of the Employer, and shall not wilfully absent himself from the Employer's service without leave.

(b) That the Apprentice shall not do any wilful damage or knowingly suffer any damage to be done to the goods, moneys or other property of the Employer.

(c) That the full working time of each year of apprenticeship (except for agreed Customary or Public Holidays and for periods of short duration not exceeding in the aggregate four weeks in any year during which the Apprentice is prevented from working through sickness or other unavoidable cause) shall be completed before the Apprentice becomes entitled to the General Minimum Time Rate fixed by the Trade Board for the ensuing year of apprenticeship.

(d) That the Apprentice shall willingly perform all such shop duties as are usually done by apprentices.

(e) That the Apprentice shall attend such Technical Classes as may be agreed as provided in paragraph (2) (i) of these presents provided that he suffers no loss of wages by so doing.

(f) That in case the Apprentice shall at any time during the said term be wilfully disobedient to lawful orders or commands of the said Employer, or be slothful or negli-

gent, or shall otherwise grossly misbehave himself towards the Employer or his other employees, then it shall be lawful for the Employer to discharge the said Apprentice, subject to the following provisions:—

(1) That the dismissal shall not operate until 14 days after notice of intention to dismiss has been served upon the Guardian and the Trade Board; and

(2) In the event of the Guardian or Apprentice within the said 14 days notifying the dispute (if any) to the Trade Board under Clause 4 hereof, or in the event of the Trade Board notifying the Employer of their intention of investigating the circumstances under the said Clause, the said dismissal shall not operate until one week after the receipt by the Employer of the recommendation of the Trade Board, provided that such recommendation (if any) shall be made within four weeks of the matter being notified to the Trade Board.

4. In the event of any dispute arising, involving allegations of unsuitability or misconduct on the part of the Apprentice or of failure on the part of the Employer to teach the Apprentice as provided for in this Indenture, which cannot be settled amicably between the parties hereto, the Employers, the Guardian and the Apprentice respectively, hereby severally and mutually covenant that the matters in dispute shall stand referred in the first instance to the Boot and Shoe Repairing Trade Board (Great Britain), and any recommendations made by the Trade Board shall be considered by the parties hereto with a view to effecting a settlement thereof.

PART V.

SECTION II.—The Proposed Minimum Rates of Wages set out in this Schedule are without prejudice to workers who are earning higher rates of wages.

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour and dated 31st October, 1918, the Trade Board established under the Trade Boards Act, 1918, in Great Britain for the branches of trade specified in the Trade Boards (Brush and Broom) Order, 1919, HEREBY GIVE NOTICE, as required by Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, that they PROPOSE TO VARY the General Minimum Time-Rates, Piece-Work Basis Time Rates and Overtime Rates at present fixed and set out in the Schedule to their Notice, dated 28th May, 1920, and effective under Orders of the Minister of Labour, dated 29th December, 1919, and 26th May, 1920, in respect of certain classes of Female Workers, and that they Propose to Fix General Minimum Piece-Rates and Overtime Rates for certain classes of Male and Female Workers and to Vary (the Minister of Labour having given his consent to such notice being given) certain minimum rates in their application to Male Apprentices in the Bone Brush Section of the trade at present fixed and set out in the Trade Board's Notice dated 18th October, 1920, and effective under the Order of the Minister of Labour dated 15th October, 1920, the proposed minimum rates of wages being as shown in the Schedule set out below.

(b) Female Pan-Setting Learners.

For the purpose of the application of the Minimum Rates set out in Section II. of Part III. of this Schedule, a pan-setting learner is defined as being a female worker (of any age) who:—

(a) is employed during the whole of her time in accordance with the provisions of this Schedule under an Agreement for a period of two years in the form prescribed by the Trade Board as set out in Part VII. of this Schedule. Provided that no worker shall be permitted to serve more than one period of two years as a pan-setting learner at the minimum rates fixed by the Trade Board and in accordance with the conditions laid down by the Trade Board from time to time.

(b) has been registered with the Trade Board in accordance with Rules from time to time laid down by the Trade Board, or has made application for such registration which has been duly acknowledged and is still under consideration.

Provided that:—

(i) The Registration may be cancelled if the other conditions of learnership are not complied with.

(ii) An employer may employ a worker at the special rates and under the special conditions for pan-setting learners without registration for a probation period not exceeding four weeks; but in the event of the worker being continued thereafter at her employment as a pan-setting learner the probation period shall be included in her period of learnership.

PART VII

Form of Agreement prescribed by the Trade Board for Female Pan-Setting Learners.

For the purpose of the application of the Minimum Rates set out in Part III. of this Schedule a female pan-setting learner shall be employed under an agreement in the following form:—

Memorandum of Agreement made this day of _____ between (hereinafter referred to as "the Employers") of the one part and (hereinafter referred to as "the Learner") of the other part.

Whereas the Learner is desirous of being trained in the branch of the Brush and Broom Trade known as the operation of "Pan-Setting" and the Employers being engaged in the said trade are willing to give her such training.

Now it is hereby mutually agreed as follows:—

1. The Learner will enter and continue in

the service of the Employers and they will receive and retain her in their service as a Learner for the period of two years from the date of this Agreement subject nevertheless to the provisions for earlier determination contained in Clause 5. hereof

2. During the said term of service the Learner will apply herself diligently to learn the said operation and will faithfully serve the Employers and obey their lawful commands, and they on their part will cause her to be well and sufficiently instructed in the said operation.

3. The Employers will pay to the Learner wages in accordance with the current rates of wages applicable to female learners employed as "Pan-Setters" as fixed from time to time by the Brush and Broom Trade Board (Great Britain), subject, however, to this proviso that if the Learner shall at any time be absent from her duties (whether by reason of sickness or any other cause whatsoever) without the consent of the Employers the Learner shall not be deemed to be employed for the period of such absence, and shall not be entitled to any wages for such period. The wages payable to the Learner under this agreement shall be deemed to accrue from hour to hour.

4. Subject to the Provisions of this Agreement, the working hours and conditions of the said service shall be those applying to the women operatives at the factory of the Employers for the time being.

5. If the Learner wilfully disobeys any lawful order of the Employers or otherwise wilfully misconducts herself towards the Employers or those in their employment it shall be lawful for the Employers to discharge the Learner from their service and absolutely determine this Agreement.

6. If either of the parties hereto desires for any reason to determine this Agreement before the expiration of the said period of two years, or in the event of any dispute arising involving allegations of unsuitability or of failure to apply herself diligently to learn the said operation on the part of the Learner or of failure on the part of the Employers to cause her to be well and sufficiently instructed in the said operation or of wrongful exercise by the Employers of their power to dismiss the Learner under Clause 5 hereof which cannot be settled between the parties hereto the Employers and the Learner hereby mutually agree that the matters in dispute shall stand referred in the first instance to the Brush and Broom Trade Board (Great Britain) with a view to effecting a settlement thereof.

7. On the due completion of the said term of service this Agreement shall be given by the Employers to the Learner with a Certificate endorsed thereon and signed by or on behalf of the Employers that the said term of service has been duly served.

(16) dated 18th October, 1920, in their application to Apprentices in the Bone Brush Section of the trade as specified in Section IV. of Part I. of the Schedule to the said Notice by providing in Part III. (b) of the said Schedule that:—

In cases where the number of Journeymen who have been in the service of the employer in the branch or branches of trade to which the Apprentice is bound, throughout the period of 12 months prior to the date of application for Registration has been:—

- 5 and under.
- From 6 to 10.
- From 11 to 15.
- From 16 to 20.
- From 21 to 25.

The Registration and employment of Male Workers as Apprentices at the Minimum Rates set out in Section IV. of Part I. of the Schedule to the Trade Board's Notice M. (16) dated 18th October, 1920, shall be limited to:—

- 1 in lieu of 2 as at present provided.
- 2 in lieu of 4 as at present provided.
- 3 in lieu of 6 as at present provided.
- 4 in lieu of 8 as at present provided.
- 5 in lieu of 10 as at present provided.

And, thereafter, one additional Apprentice (in lieu of two as at present provided) may be employed for every additional five or fewer than five such Journeymen.

PART IX.

SECTION I.—The respective Minimum Rates set out in this Schedule shall apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, to all workers (including Home-workers) of the classes specified in this Schedule in respect of any time during which they are employed in Great Britain in any branch of the trade specified in the Trade Boards (Brush and Broom) Order, 1919, that is to say, the manufacture of brushes (other than feather brushes) or brooms;

Including the following operations, where all or any of them are carried on in association with or in conjunction with the manufacture of such brushes or brooms:—

(a) The drafting, dressing, or mixing of bass, whisk, or similar fibres, or animal bristles or hair, and the working of wood, bone, ivory, or celluloid;

(b) All finishing, warehousing, packing, or other operations incidental to or appertaining to the manufacture of such brushes or brooms;

But excluding the following operations:—

The sawing and turning of wood as a preliminary operation to the manufacture of such brushes or brooms, the making of metal parts, and the mounting of brushes with metal or tortoiseshell backs.

Provided that nothing in this Schedule shall apply to female apprentices or female learners employed under an Indenture or Written Agreement respectively entered into prior to 31st January, 1921, and providing for the

proper instruction of the apprentice or learner in the operation or branch of work known as pan-setting.

SECTION II.—The Minimum Rates set out in this Schedule shall be paid clear of all deductions other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments, or deductions authorised by any act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any superannuation or other provident fund.

SECTION III.—The Minimum Rates set out in this Schedule are without prejudice to workers who are earning higher rates of wages.

The Trade Board will consider any Objections to the above Proposals which may be lodged with them within two months from 1st February, 1921. Such Objections should be in writing and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her full name and address), and should be sent to the Secretary of the Brush and Broom Trade Board (Great Britain), 5, Chancery Lane, London, W.C. 2. It is desirable that the Objections should state precisely and so far as possible with reasons, what is objected to.

PILOTS' LICENCES: COMPULSORY EXAMINATION IN NAVIGATION.

(208144/20.)

It is hereby notified:—

All applicants for a licence or for a renewal of licence as pilot will be required, as from 1st April, 1921, to undergo a technical examination in navigation, as laid down by the Air Navigation Directions, 1919. This examination, hitherto waived, will be *viva voce*, and will be conducted by an Air Ministry Board.

A syllabus, compiled in the form of questions as a guide to candidates, is attached. It is subdivided into the following groups:—Definitions, Rules as to Lights, Rules as to Signals, Rules of the Air, Rules for Air Traffic on and in the Vicinity of Aerodromes, Regulations for Preventing Collisions at Sea, Articles of the International Air Convention, and Navigation.

The answers to questions 1 to 68 will be found in Annex D of the Convention relating to International Air Navigation, and those to questions 69 to 100 in the Articles of the Convention itself. The remainder are general navigation questions.

When instruments are required to solve a question they will be supplied by the Board of Examination.

When a paragraph of the Convention is referred to in a question by its number, the paragraph will be read to the candidate by a member of the Board.

Applicants for Private Pilot's Flying Certificates (Class A Licence) will be examined in questions 1 to 100 only; in the case of candidates for the Royal Aero Club Certificate the examination may be carried out, under arrangements to be made, by the Royal Aero Club.

(iii) After completion of the movement the licence shall forthwith be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest police-station in the same district by the person in charge of the swine at the time of completing such movement.
