**W**HEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 4th day of February, 1921 (C.W. 21954/20), in the words following, viz.:—

“Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions, and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

“And whereas by the Regulations for the Government of Your Majesty's Naval Service Flag Allowance is not payable to Officers serving in Flag ships at Home Ports:

“And whereas we consider it desirable in consequence of the size and importance of the Reserve Fleet that at our discretion all or any of the Officers of the Flag ship of the Vice Admiral Commanding this Fleet should receive Flag Allowances:

“We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction as from 1st July, 1920, the payment at our discretion of Flag allowances at the rate of 2s. 6d. a day to such of the Officers of the Flag ship of the Reserve Fleet who would be entitled to such payment under existing Regulations but for the fact that the said Flag ship is in the position of a Flag ship at a Home Port as we may think proper.

“The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal.”

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the said Order in Council of the 7th day of January, 1915, shall be revoked.

The Colony of the Gambia.

### OVERSEAS TRADE.

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF TRADE, DATED FEBRUARY 17TH, 1921, UNDER SECTION 3 OF THE OVERSEAS TRADE (CREDITS AND INSURANCE) ACT, 1920 (10 & 11 GEO. 5, c. 29), ADDING AUSTRIA TO THE SCHEDULE TO THAT ACT.

Whereas by section 1 of the above-mentioned Act the Board of Trade were empowered to grant credits to persons domiciled in, or to Companies incorporated by or under the laws of, the United Kingdom in connection with the export to any country specified in the Schedule to the said Act of goods wholly or partly produced or manufactured in the United Kingdom, subject to the limitations and provisions contained in the said section, and to undertake the business of the insurance of any such goods as aforesaid as therein mentioned.

And whereas by section 3 of the said Act the Board of Trade were further empowered to add to the said Schedule the name of any Country the industrial and financial condition of which has been disorganised by the War:

Now, therefore, in pursuance of the powers in them vested by the above-recited provision and of every other power thereunto them enabling, the Board of Trade do hereby order that the country of Austria be added to the Schedule to the said Act.

### COAL MINES ACT, 1911.

#### PRECAUTIONS AGAINST COAL DUST.

Test prescribed by the Board of Trade for determining the amount of combustible matter in Dust Mixtures which contain Carbonates.

In pursuance of No. 4 of the General Regulations made under the Coal Mines Act, 1911, and dated 30th July, 1920, the Board of Trade hereby prescribe that the following procedure shall be adopted for the purpose of determining the amount of combustible matter in samples of dust mixture which contain carbonates, in

lieu of the procedure prescribed by paragraph (c) of the said Regulations:—

1. A weighed quantity of the dried dust shall be heated to a temperature high enough to ensure complete decomposition of the carbonates,\* in an open vessel, until it no longer loses weight, and the percentage loss of weight shall be determined.

2. A weighed quantity of the dried dust shall be treated with dilute acid in a suitable apparatus, and the percentage loss of weight due to the evolution of carbonic acid gas shall be determined.

3. The difference between the two percentage losses of weight so determined shall be reckoned as the percentage of combustible matter for the purpose of the test.

#### COAL MINES ACT, 1911.

##### PRECAUTIONS AGAINST COAL DUST.

Test prescribed by the Board of Trade for Moist Dust Mixtures which cannot be sieved.

In pursuance of No. 4 of the General Regulations made under the Coal Mines Act, 1911, and dated 30th July, 1920, the Board of Trade hereby prescribe that the following procedure shall be adopted for the purpose of testing the composition of samples of dust mixture which contain such a high percentage of moisture that the mixture cannot be sieved in the manner prescribed by the said Regulations:—

1. The samples collected shall be well mixed, and a weighed quantity of the mixture shall be dried at 212° F. The weight lost shall be reckoned as moisture.

2. The dust so dried shall be treated in the manner prescribed by paragraph (b) of the said Regulation, and the percentage of combustible matter shall then be determined in the manner prescribed by paragraph (c) of the Regulation.

#### MINING INDUSTRY ACT, 1920.

##### DIRECTIONS OF THE BOARD OF TRADE, DATED FEBRUARY 14TH, 1921.

Whereas the Board of Trade deem it expedient that the pithead price of coal should cease to be regulated as heretofore under the Mining Industry Act, 1920. Now, therefore, in pursuance of their powers under the said

Act and of all other powers them hereunto enabling, the Board of Trade direct as follows:—

1. The Directions of the Board of Trade, dated the 25th day of August, 1920, and issued under Section 3, sub-section 1, of the Mining Industry Act, 1920, as to the maximum pithead price chargeable for coal sold for consumption in the British Islands and for coal sold for the bunkering of certain vessels at ports in the British Islands, are hereby cancelled.

2. Nothing herein contained shall affect or prejudice any matter or thing done or suffered, proceeding taken, or penalty incurred under the said Directions during or in respect of the time prior to their cancellation.

3. These Directions shall take effect as from the 1st day of March, 1921.

#### TRADE BOARDS ACTS, 1909 AND 1918.

##### LINEN AND COTTON HANDKERCHIEF AND HOUSEHOLD GOODS AND LINEN PIECE GOODS TRADE BOARD (GREAT BRITAIN)

##### MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES FIXED FOR MALE WORKERS. EFFECTIVE AS FROM 25TH FEBRUARY, 1921.\*

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour, and dated 31st October, 1918, the Trade Board established in Great Britain under the Trade Boards Act, 1918, for the Linen and Cotton Handkerchief and Household Goods and Linen Piece Goods Trade, as specified in the Trade Boards (Linen and Cotton Handkerchief and Household Goods and Linen Piece Goods) Order, 1920, having given due notice on 8th November, 1920, of Proposal to Fix General Minimum Time-Rates and Overtime Rates for Male Workers, hereby give notice, as required by Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, that they have Fixed General Minimum Time-Rates and Overtime Rates for Male Workers, and that the Minimum Rates of Wages as Fixed are as shown in the Schedule set out below:—

The Trade Board further give notice, that they have received notification from the Minister of Labour that he has made an Order dated 10th February, 1921, under Section 4 (2) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, confirming the Minimum Rates of Wages as fixed by the Trade Board, and specifying 25th February, 1921,\* as the date from which such Minimum Rates of Wages shall become effective.

\*Should this date not correspond with the beginning of the period for which wages are paid by an employer who pays wages at intervals not exceeding Seven Days, the rates shall become effective as from the beginning of the next full-pay period, but in no case later than 3rd March, 1921.

## SCHEDULE.

## PART I.

*General Minimum Time-Rates for Male Workers.*

For Workers of 14 and under 15 years of age, 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ d. per hour.

For Workers of 15 and under 16 years of age, 5 $\frac{1}{2}$ d. per hour.

For Workers of 16 and under 17 years of age, 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ d. per hour.

For Workers of 17 and under 18 years of age, 8d. per hour.

For Workers of 18 and under 19 years of age, 10 $\frac{1}{2}$ d. per hour.

For Workers of 19 and under 20 years of age, 11 $\frac{1}{2}$ d. per hour.

For Workers of 20 and under 21 years of age, 1s. 0 $\frac{3}{4}$ d. per hour.

For Workers of 21 years of age and over, 1s. 3d. per hour.

## PART II.

*Overtime Rates for Male Workers (all Ages).*

SECTION I.—In accordance with Section 3 (1) (c) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, the Trade Board have declared the Normal Number of Hours of Work in the Trade to be as follows:—

In any Week, 48.

On Saturday, 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ .

On any other Week-day, 9.

Provided that all hours worked by a worker on Sundays shall be regarded as Overtime to which the Overtime Rates shall apply.

SECTION II.—The Minimum Rates for overtime for all Male Workers in respect of hours worked by a worker in excess of the normal number of hours of work in the trade declared by the Trade Board as set out in Section I of this Part of this Notice, shall be as follows:—

(a) For the First Two Hours of Overtime on any day except Sunday, the Overtime Rate shall be One-and-a-Quarter times the Minimum Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, Time-and-a-Quarter.

(b) For Overtime after the First Two Hours of Overtime on any day except Sunday, the Overtime Rate shall be One-and-a-Half times the Minimum Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, Time-and-a-Half.

(c) For all time worked on Sunday, the Overtime Rate shall be Twice the Minimum Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, Double Time.

(d) For all hours worked in any week in excess of 48, the Overtime Rate shall be One-and-a-Quarter times the Minimum Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, Time-and-a-Quarter, except in so far as higher Overtime Rates are payable under the provisions of paragraphs (b) and (c) of this Section.

The Overtime Rates shall be payable where on any day (not being a Sunday) the number of hours worked exceeds nine, or in the case of Saturday exceeds 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ , notwithstanding that the number of hours worked in the week does not exceed 48.

SECTION III.—The provisions of this Part of this Notice are without prejudice to the

payment of Overtime Rates after a lesser number of hours than those declared by the Trade Boards to be the normal number in the trade, in cases where such lesser number of hours constitutes the number customarily worked in the establishment.

*Note.*—The hours which young persons and children are allowed to work are subject to the provisions of the Factory and Workshop Acts.

## PART III.

The above Minimum Rates shall apply subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts to all Male Workers, in respect of all time during which they are employed in Great Britain in any branch of the trade specified in the Trade Boards (Linen and Cotton Handkerchief and Household Goods and Linen Piece Goods) Order, 1920, that is to say:—

1. The making of such articles as are specified in (a) and (b) below, from linen or cotton or mixed linen and cotton fabrics (excepting knitted fabrics), or from other textile fabrics when the work is carried on in establishments mainly engaged in the making of such articles from the beforementioned fabrics, *viz.*:—

(a) Handkerchiefs (including Mufflers or flags when made in association or in conjunction with handkerchiefs);

(b) Bed-Linen, Towels, Dusters, Table-napery, Bed-Spreads, Tea-cloths, Table-centres, Sideboard-covers, Cushion-covers or similar household articles;

including all or any of the following operations:—

(i) Hooking, cutting or tearing the material;

(ii) Vice-folding;

(iii) Machine hemming, hem-stitching, spoking, over-locking, tambouring, button-holing, and other plain or fancy machine stitching;

(iv) All processes of embroidery or decorative needlework done by machine, whether before or after the making of the articles of the description specified above;

(v) The following processes if done by machine:—Thread-drawing, thread-clipping, top-sewing, scalloping, nickelling and paring;

(vi) All processes of laundering, smoothing, folding, ornamenting, boxing, finishing, warehousing, packing and other similar operations incidental to or appertaining to the making of the articles of the description specified above.

2. The making-up in linen warehouses or in establishments mainly engaged in linen lapping, of linen or mixed linen and cotton or other textile fabrics in the piece, or of linen or mixed linen and cotton or other textile articles cut from the piece, including:—

Measuring, cutting, lapping, ornamenting, boxing, warehousing, packing and similar operations.

## PART IV.

SECTION I.—The above Minimum Rates shall be paid clear of all deductions, other than deductions under the National Insurance

Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments or deductions authorised by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any superannuation or other provident fund.

SECTION II.—The above Minimum Rates of Wages are without prejudice to workers who are earning higher rates of wages.

## UNEMPLOYMENT INSURANCE ACT, 1920.

### MERCANTILE MARINE.

The Unemployment Insurance (Mercantile Marine) (Collection of Contributions) Regulations,\* 1921, dated 31st January, 1921, made by the Minister of Labour under the Unemployment Insurance Act, 1920 (10 and 11 Geo. 5, Ch. 30), after consultation with the Board of Trade.

The Minister of Labour, by virtue of the powers conferred on him by the Unemployment Insurance Act, 1920, and of all other powers in that behalf, hereby makes the following Regulations —

### PART I.

#### GENERAL.

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Unemployment Insurance (Mercantile Marine) (Collection of Contributions) Regulations, 1921

#### *Interpretation*

2.—(i) In these Regulations, unless the context otherwise requires or admits—

“Foreign-going ship” includes a ship engaged in regular trade on foreign stations.

“Employed person” means a person who is or has been since 8th November, 1920, a master, seaman or apprentice to the sea service or sea-fishing service, being an employed person within the meaning of the Act

“The principal Regulations” means the Unemployment Insurance (Collection of Contributions) Regulations, 1920, and the Unemployment Insurance (Exempt Persons) Regulations, 1920.

Subject as aforesaid and save where the context otherwise requires, words and expressions to which meanings are assigned in the principal Regulations have the same respective meanings as in those Regulations, and words and expressions to which meanings are assigned in the Merchant Shipping Acts have the same respective meanings as in those Acts.

(ii) The Interpretation Act, 1889, applies to the interpretation of these Regulations as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

\*These Regulations, although Statutory, are provisional only. Permanent Regulations will be made later.

### PART II.

#### PERSONS EMPLOYED IN HOME TRADE OR FOREIGN GOING SHIPS.

##### *Application of principal Regulations.*

3. Subject to the provisions of these Regulations the principal Regulations shall apply to all persons employed in a home trade ship or a foreign-going ship.

4. Where on account of the absence of an employed person at sea or outside the United Kingdom, an employer or an employed person is unable to perform an act required by the principal Regulations to be done either forthwith or on the happening of a certain event or within a specified time, he shall be deemed to have complied with those Regulations if he performs the act as soon as is reasonably possible after the happening of the event or the expiration of the specified time.

##### *Master to Comply with Owners' Orders.*

5. It shall be the duty of the master of every ship to comply with all orders or directions given to him by the owner of the ship with a view to carrying into effect the provisions of the Act or of these Regulations.

##### *Currency of Books.*

6. Where a ship is at sea or at a port outside the United Kingdom at the termination of an insurance year, the Unemployment Books of any persons employed on that ship shall remain current.

(a) if the engagement terminates in the United Kingdom, until the termination of the engagement; and

(b) if the engagement terminates outside the United Kingdom, until the return of the insured contributor to the United Kingdom.

### PART III.

#### PERSONS EMPLOYED IN FOREIGN-GOING SHIPS.

##### *Issue of Books to Foreign-going Seamen.*

7. For the purpose of the issue of Unemployment Books a Mercantile Marine Office shall be deemed to be a local office within the meaning of the principal Regulations.

8.—(1) The employer shall, as soon as may be after the commencement of the Act and subsequently as may be necessary, apply to a superintendent or consular officer, for a sufficient number of Temporary Unemployment Books (Mercantile Marine) for every foreign-going ship.

(2) The Books to be supplied to an employer in accordance with this Article shall be in such form as the Minister may direct, and shall not be used except for persons employed on a foreign-going ship.

(a) where the employed person has been unable for any reason to obtain an Unemployment Book before joining the ship; or

(b) where all the appropriate spaces on the Unemployment Book have been filled by the affixing of stamps.

(3) Before affixing stamps to a Temporary Unemployment Book (Mercantile Marine) the employer shall insert on the book in the space provided the following particulars of the person

in respect of whom the contributions are payable, that is to say:—

- (i) His full name,
- (ii) His rating,
- (iii) The number of his unemployment book if it is known,
- (iv) The number of his identity Registration Certificate,
- (v) The period for which wages are payable to him, and
- (vi) The name and official number of the ship on which he is employed,

and shall obtain his signature on the book.

(4) Notwithstanding that contributions have been paid in respect of any person by the affixing of stamps to a Temporary Unemployment Book (Mercantile Marine), he shall not be entitled to obtain Unemployment Benefit without first obtaining an Unemployment Book.

*Foreign-going Seamen Not in Receipt of Wages.*

9. In any case in which the employer does not pay wages or other pecuniary remuneration in respect of the employment of any person on a foreign-going ship, he shall affix stamps to the Unemployment Book of that person before the termination of the voyage or before the termination of the agreement, whichever happens first, and shall not be bound to affix stamps on the first day of employment in each week.

*Foreign-going Seamen Left Ashore, Dying, or Deserting.*

10. The following provisions as to the disposal of Unemployment Books shall apply to persons employed on foreign-going ships,

(i) Where an employed person is left behind on shore in any place out of the United Kingdom on the ground of his unfitness or inability to proceed to sea, the master of the ship in which he was employed shall deliver his Unemployment Book, duly stamped, if he is left in a British Possession, to the employed person himself, and, if he is left elsewhere, to the Consular Officer.

(ii) In the event of an employed person deserting his ship or dying during the period of his engagement, the master of the ship shall deliver the Unemployment Book of that person, duly stamped, to a superintendent or Consular officer on the termination of the voyage.

(iii) In any case where, for any reason other than the loss or destruction of the book, the book cannot be delivered in accordance with the foregoing provisions of this Regulation, the employer shall as soon as may be deliver it to a Local Office of the Ministry of Labour.

PART IV.

FOREIGN-DOMICILED SEAMEN.

*Seamen neither Domiciled nor having a Place of Residence in United Kingdom.*

11.—(1) Where contributions are payable in respect of any person excluded from the Act by any Special Order made by the Minister of Labour under Section 39 (a) of the Act, the

managing owner, or, where there is no managing owner, the person to whom the management of the ship is entrusted, by or on behalf of the owner (hereinafter called the Manager), shall send to the Minister of Health a return of such contributions at the same time, in the same manner, and containing the same particulars as may be prescribed under the National Health Insurance Acts, 1911-1920, in the case of contributions payable under Sub-section (3) of Section 48 of the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactment.

(ii) The amount of the contributions payable in respect of the persons comprised in the return shall be paid to the Minister of Health at the time at which the return is made.

## DISEASES OF ANIMALS (DUMFRIES-SHIRE) ORDER OF 1921.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

### *Power to make Regulations for Notification of the death of Cattle in certain cases.*

1. The Local Authority of the District specified in the Schedule to this Order may, in accordance with the provisions of this Order, make Regulations—

(1.) For prescribing and regulating the notice to be given to or by any person or authority in the case of illness of any head of cattle where the animal has died from the illness or been slaughtered on account thereof, and for supplementing or varying for those purposes any of the provisions of Section 4 of the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894; and

(2.) For regulating the removal or disposal of the carcase of any head of cattle to which any such notice relates, or of any dung, fodder or litter which has been in the same place with or used about any such head of cattle.

### *Limitation of Regulations.*

2.—(1.) Nothing in any Regulations made under this Order shall require notice to be given in the case of death produced by, or consequent on, accident or calving.

(2.) Nothing in any Regulations made under this Order shall affect the provisions of any Order of the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries relating to cattle-plague, pleuropneumonia, foot - and - mouth disease, or anthrax.

### *Confirmation of Regulations.*

3.—(1.) Regulations made under this Order shall not take effect unless and until they have been submitted to and confirmed by the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries.

(2.) Unless the Ministry otherwise directs the following provisions shall apply:—

(i.) Notice of intention to apply for confirmation of any Regulations shall be given in one or more of the local newspapers circulating within the District two weeks at least before the making of the application.

(ii.) For two weeks at least before an application a copy of the Regulations proposed to be confirmed shall be kept at the office of the Local Authority of the District, and be open during office hours thereat to the inspection of ratepayers of the District without fee or reward.

(iii.) The Clerk of the Local Authority shall on the application of any such ratepayer furnish him with a copy of the proposed Regulations on payment of sixpence.

(3.) A copy of any Regulations made by the Local Authority under this Order, signed and certified by the Clerk of that Local Authority to be a true copy and to have been duly confirmed, shall be evidence, until the contrary is proved, in all legal proceedings, of the due making, confirmation, and existence of the Regulations, without further or other proof.

### *Offences.*

4. Any person failing to give the notice prescribed by any Regulation made under this Order, or moving or disposing, or permitting the removal or disposal of, a carcase, or of any dung, fodder or litter, in contravention of any

such Regulation, shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

*Short Title.*

5. This Order may be cited as the DISEASES OF ANIMALS (DUMFRIES-SHIRE) ORDER OF 1921.
