His Majesty the KING has been graciously pleased to award the Edward Medal in silver to Frank Halfpenny under the following circumstances:—

On the 12th January, 1918, at about 10 o'clock in the morning, an explosion of gas and coal-dust occurred in the Minnie Pit of the Podmore Hall Colliery, Staffordshire; there was a great deal of noise caused by the reversal of the air current and a great deal of dust and smoke. Halfpenny was about 500 yards from the bottom of the pit at the top of the new haulage. When the explosion occurred he lay down on the floor, and then reaching the telephone he attempted to communicate with the top. He received no answer, and, although enveloped in smoke, he proceeded without the slightest hesitation to the top of a dip about 800 yards away, where he was able to telephone to the surface and inform the mine manager of the state of affairs below ground. On his way he had found the bodies of two lads lying

in the gutter; these he lifted out and placed by the side, and one of the lads ultimately recovered. In all the circumstances Halfpenny's journey of 800 yards into the dip was a very brave act. Most men, instead of making it would have at once rushed for the shaft, but Halfpenny, instead of doing this, went to see what aid he could render, quite regardless of the risk he himself ran in so doing.

Also the Edward Medal to Frank Platt.

On May 10th, 1920, the walls of the Oak Mills at Shaw, near Oldham, were being pointed by three men. One man named Cavaghan was seated at the top of a wall in a cradle, which was controlled by means of pulleys and ropes. The latter were held by Platt and another labourer standing on the sloping roof of a low shed fifty feet below.

Owing to the displacement of one of the pulley-blocks the cradle swung round, and Cavaghan was precipitated head downwards. Platt's companion ran away, but Platt, standing firm, swung the rope he was holding so as to encircle Cavaghan, and succeeded in doing so. The rope tightening broke Cavaghan's fall, and when he was about twelve feet from Platt's standing place, the latter, taking advantage of a projecting sill, managed to swing Cavaghan on to it. This broke his fall further, while as he recoiled from the window-sill Platt interposed himself so as to save him from injury so far as possible. Both men received injuries to the head, and there is no doubt whatever that Platt's action saved Cavaghan's life. Only wonderful presence of mind and lightning decision could have enabled him to do what he did, and but for his instantaneous action Cavaghan would have been dashed to the ground in two seconds. Platt ran very great risk as, had he failed, he would certainly have been hit by Cavaghan's body falling from a considerable height.

This is the second occasion on which Platt has been instrumental in saving a man from injury by falling.

Also the Edward Medal to George Edward Pilgrim:—

On October 23rd, 1920, while a number of passengers were waiting at Stratford Station on the Great Eastern Railway for a train to Liverpool Street, it became known that the earliest train would start from another platform and many of them, instead of using the subway, proceeded to cross the metals. Three sets of rails separated the platforms, and among the last to cross was a woman accompanied by her child. As she was crossing the centre track, she saw an express train approaching, and thinking that the train was going straight through the station on the centre line of the rails, she rushed across to the edge of the platform where she thought she would be safe. The train, however, did not go through, but was diverted at the points, and came down the line of rails on which the woman was standing, as it was intended to stop at the platform alongside.

Pilgrim, a railway porter in the service of the Great Eastern Railway, was on the platform and realised the dangerous situation of the woman and child. The woman, too, saw the danger, but became terrified and clung to the edge of the platform. The train reached a point about 50 yards from the woman when Pilgrim leapt from the platform on the line

and dragged the woman and child, by main force, across the permanent way and out of danger. The driver of the train applied his brakes with such force that the train parted in the middle, and the engine was not brought to a standstill until it had reached a spot ten yards past the place where the woman had been clinging to the platform. All three persons concerned had a very narrow escape from death, or, at any rate, severe injury. Pilgrim fully realised the danger and, disregarding any consequences to himself, jumped literally in front of the engine and dragged away the stupefied woman and her little girl. But for his prompt and courageous action they could not possibly have escaped.

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF TRADE DATED FEBRUARY 23RD, 1921, AMENDING THE ORDER DATED JANUARY 21ST, 1921, AS TO THE QUALIFICATIONS OF SURVEYORS FOR THE PURPOSES OF SECTIONS 20 AND 21 OF THE COAL MINES ACT, 1911.

PERAMBULATOR AND INVALID CARRIAGE TRADE BOARD (GREAT BRITAIN).

MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES (AS VARIED AND FIXED) FOR MALE AND FEMALE WORKERS. Effective as from 28th February, 1921,* except where otherwise stated.

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour, and dated 31st October, 1918, the Trade Board established in Great Britain under the Trade Boards Act, 1918, for the Perambulator and Invalid Carriage trade, as specified in the Trade Boards (Perambulator and Invalid Carriage Order, 1919), having given due notice on the 22nd October, 1920, of Proposal to Vary General Minimum Time-Rates and Overtime Rates for certain classes of Male and Female Workers and to fix Piece-Work Basis Time-Rates for all Male and Female Workers and General Minimum Time-Rates and Overtime Rates for certain classes of Male and Female Workers, HEREBY GIVE NOTICE, as required by Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, that THEY HAVE VARIED such General Minimum Time-Rates and Overtime Rates for certain classes of Male and Female Workers set out in their Notice dated 18th June, 1920, and effective under an Order of the Minister of Labour dated 17th June, 1920, and that THEY HAVE FIXED Piece-Work Basis Time-Rates for all Male and Female Workers and General Minimum Time-Rates and Overtime Rates for certain classes of Male and Female Workers, and that the Minimum Rates of Wages, as Varied and Fixed, together with the General Minimum Time-Rates and Overtime Rates fixed by the Trade Board and set out in their Notice dated 18th June, 1920, which remain unaffected by this variation, are as shewn in the Schedule set out below, which is incorporated herewith.

The Trade Board FURTHER GIVE NOTICE that they have received notification from the Minister of Labour that he has made an Order dated 18th February, 1921, under Section 4 (2) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, confirming the Minimum rates of wages as now varied and fixed by the Trade Board, and specifying 28th February, 1921,* as the date from which such minimum rates of wages shall become effective.

* Should this date, however, not correspond with the beginning of the period for which wages are paid by an employer who pays wages at intervals not exceeding seven days, the rates shall become effective as from the beginning of the next full pay period, but in any case not later than 6th March, 1921.

PART IV.

Overtime Rates—Male and Female Workers (all Ages).

SECTION I.—In accordance with Section 3 (1) (c) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, the Trade Board have declared the normal number of hours of work in any week to be 48.

Provided that all hours worked on Sundays and the holidays as defined hereafter shall be regarded as Overtime to which the Overtime Rates shall apply.

SECTION II.—The Minimum Rates for Overtime to apply in respect of hours worked by a worker in excess of the declared normal number of hours of work in the trade shall be as follows, clear of all deductions:—

(a) Workers employed on Time-Work:—

(1) For the first ten hours' Overtime in any week the Overtime Rate shall be one and a quarter times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, Time-and-a-Quarter.

(2) For Overtime after the first ten hours of Overtime in any week the Overtime Rate shall be one and a half times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, Time-and-a-Half.

Provided that for all time worked on Sundays, on Christmas Day as respects England and Wales, on New Year's Day as respects Scotland, and on Statutory Bank Holidays (but not including Good Friday when Easter Monday is not worked, and not including Easter Monday when Good Friday is not worked) the Overtime Rate shall be twice the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, Double Time.

(b) Workers employed on Piece-work:—

Workers employed on piece-work shall receive in respect of each hour of Overtime worked piece-rates each of which would yield, in the circumstances of the case to an Ordinary worker at least the equivalent of the appropriate Piece-work Basis Time-Rate, with the addition of:

(1) As respects each of the first ten hours of Overtime in any week, a sum equivalent to one quarter of the General Minimum Time-Rate which would be applicable if the worker were employed on time-work;

(2) As respects each hour in excess of ten hours of Overtime in any week, a sum equivalent to one half of the General Minimum Time-Rate which would be applicable if the worker were employed on time-work;

(3) As respects each hour of employment on Sundays, on Christmas Day as respects England and Wales, on New Year's Day as respects Scotland, and on Statutory Bank Holidays (but not including Good Friday when Easter Monday is not worked, and not including Easter Monday when Good Friday is not worked) a sum equivalent to the General Minimum Time-Rate which would be applicable if the worker were employed on time-work.

NOTE.—The hours which female workers, young persons and children are allowed to work are subject to the provisions of the Factory and Workshop Acts.

PART V.

A learner is a worker under 21 years of age who while employed is engaged during the whole or substantial part of his or her time in learning some branch or process of the trade.

PART VI.

The above Minimum Rates of Wages shall apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, to all male and female workers of the classes specified above in respect of all time during which they are employed in Great Britain in any branch of the trade specified in the Trade Boards (Perambulator and Invalid Carriage) Order, 1919, that is to say, the manufacture wherever carried on of Perambulators, Invalid Carriages (including Spinal Carriages), or Folding Push Cars;

including:—

(a) the manufacture of fittings or accessories where made in association with or in conjunction with perambulators, invalid carriages, folding push cars or wheels intended for use on these articles;

(b) the manufacture of wheels, excluding cycle wheels, intended for use on perambulators, invalid carriages or folding push cars;

(c) the manufacture of motor cycle side car bodies where made in association with or in conjunction with perambulators, invalid carriages or folding push cars;

(d) the repair of perambulators, invalid carriages or folding push cars when carried on in association with or in conjunction with the manufacture thereof;

(e) the manufacture of toy perambulators, toy wheelbarrows, top scooters, nursery yachts, toy cycles, toy cars, toy horses, dolls' houses or other similar toys, when carried on as a subsidiary branch of work in association with or in conjunction with the manufacture of perambulators, invalid carriages or folding push cars, so as to form a common or interchangeable form of employment for the workers;

(f) packing, warehousing, or despatching, or other similar operations incidental to the manufacture of any of the above-named articles;

but excluding:—

(g) the manufacture of motor scooters;

(h) the manufacture of wicker or cane bodies for perambulators, invalid carriages or folding push cars, when such manufacture is carried on in association with or in conjunction with the manufacture of other wicker or cane articles so as to form a common or interchangeable form of employment for the workers.

PART VII.

SECTION I.—The above Minimum Rates of Wages shall be paid clear of all deductions, other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments, or deductions authorised by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any superannuation or other provident fund.

SECTION II.—The above Minimum Rates of Wages are without prejudice to workers who are earning higher rates of wages.

SECTION III.—The Minimum Rates of Wages set out in this Schedule which are marked † have been effective as from 21st June, 1920.

In the administrative county of Dorset:

The borough of Poole, the petty sessional divisions of Shaftesbury, Wimborne, Sturminster, and Blandford, such portions of the petty sessional divisions of Sherborne, Cerne, Dorchester and Wareham as lie to the north and east of the railway line from Yeovil via Maiden Newton, Dorchester, Wareham, and Wimborne to Ringwood.

In the administrative county of Southampton:

The city of Winchester, the boroughs of Lyminster, Andover, and Romsey, the petty sessional divisions of Christchurch, Southampton (including its detached part), Hythe, Lyminster, Andover, Winchester, Fordingbridge, Ringwood, New Forest, Romsey, Fareham, Gosport, Havant, Droxford, Petersfield (including its detached part), Alresford, and Alton, and the parishes of Popham, Woodmancott, Nutley, Preston Candover, Bradley, Ellisfield, Herriard, Tunworth, Weston Corbett, Weston Patrick (including its detached part), Upton Grey, South Warnborough, Long Sutton and Crondall.
