WHEREAS by the West Indian Court of Appeal Act, 1919, it is, amongst other things, enacted that there shall be a Court of Appeal, called the West Indian Court of Appeal, for the Colonies to which the said Act applies, that is to say, the Colonies of Trinidad and Tobago, British Guiana, Barbados, the Leeward Islands, Grenada, St. Lucia, and St. Vincent, and any other Colony that may from time to time be added by Order of His Majesty in Council to the number of Colonies to which the said Act applies (hereinafter called "The Colonies concerned"):

And whereas by the said Act full provision is made for the constitution of the said Court, and it is by the said Act further provided that the said Court shall have jurisdiction and power to hear and determine Appeals (including re-

served questions of law) from any of the Courts of the Colonies concerned, subject however to the provisions of the said Act, and to any provision which may be made by the Legislature of any of those Colonies as to Appeals from that Colony and to Rules of Court made under the said Act:

And whereas the Legislatures of Trinidad and Tobago, British Guiana, Barbados, the Leeward Islands, Grenada, St. Lucia and St. Vincent have passed enactments making provision as to appeals to the said Court from the said Colonies respectively:

And whereas by the said Act it is further provided that the process of the Court of Appeal shall run throughout the Colonies concerned, and any judgment, decree, or order of the Court of Appeal shall have full force and effect in every such Colony, and shall be executed and enforced in like manner as if it were an original judgment, decree, or order of the Court from which the Appeal is brought, and, for all purposes of and incidental to the hearing and determination of any Appeal within its jurisdiction, the Court of Appeal shall have all the power, authority, and jurisdiction vested in the Court from which the Appeal is brought:

And whereas by the said Act it is further provided that subject to any provision which

may be made by the Legislature of any Colony concerned whereby Appeals from any Court in that Colony are to be made in the first instance to the said Court of Appeal, nothing in the said Act shall prejudice or affect the right of any person to appeal to His Majesty in Council:

And whereas by virtue of the Judicial Committee Act, 1844, it is competent to His Majesty by any Order or Orders to be from time to time for that purpose made with the advice of His Privy Council to provide for the admission of an Appeal or Appeals to His Majesty in Council from any judgments, sentences, decrees, or orders of any Court of Justice within any British Colony or Possession abroad although such Court shall not be a Court of Error or a Court of Appeal within such Colony or Possession, and it is also competent to His Majesty by any such Order or Orders as aforesaid to make all such provisions as to His Majesty in Council shall seem meet for the instituting and prosecuting any such Appeals and for carrying into effect any such decisions or sentences as His Majesty in Council shall pronounce thereon:

And whereas it is expedient with a view to equalizing as far as may be the conditions under which His Majesty's subjects in His British Dominions beyond the Seas shall have a right of appeal to His Majesty in Council and to promoting uniformity, in the practice and procedure in all such Appeals, that provision should be made for the instituting and prosecuting of Appeals from the West Indian Court of Appeal to His Majesty in Council and for carrying into effect such decisions or sentences as His Majesty in Council shall pronounce therein in accordance with the Rules and Regulations hereinafter contained:

His Majesty doth, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, hereby order that all Appeals to His Majesty in Council from the said West Indian Court of Appeal be made in accordance with the several rules hereunto annexed.

And it is hereby further ordered that this Order in Council shall take effect in each of the Colonies concerned on such day as shall be named for that purpose by any Proclamation issued by the Officer Administering the Government of the Colony.

RULES.

1. In these Rules, unless the context otherwise requires:—

"Appeal" means Appeal to His Majesty in Council;

"His Majesty" includes His Majesty's heirs and successors;

"Judgment" includes decree, order, sentence, or decision;

"Court" means the West Indian Court of Appeal;

"Record" means the aggregate of papers relating to an Appeal (including the pleadings, proceedings, evidence and judgments) proper to be laid before His Majesty in Council on the hearing of the Appeal;

"Registrar" means the Registrar or other proper officer having the custody of the records in the Court appealed from;

"Month" means calendar month;

words in the singular include the plural, and words in the plural include the singular.

2. Subject to the provisions of these Rules an Appeal shall lie as of right, from any final judgment of the Court, where the matter in

dispute on the Appeal amounts to or is of the value of (£300) three hundred pounds sterling or upwards, or where the Appeal involves, directly or indirectly, some claim or question to or respecting property or some civil right amounting to or of the value of (£300) three hundred pounds sterling or upwards.

3. Applications to admit an appeal shall be made by motion or petition within 21 days from the date of the judgment to be appealed from, and the Applicant shall give the opposite party notice of his intended application.

4. An Appeal under Rule 2 shall only be admitted by the Court in the first instance:—

(a) upon condition of the Appellant, within a period to be fixed by the Court, but not exceeding three months from the date of the hearing of the application, entering into good and sufficient security, to the satisfaction of the Court, in a sum not exceeding (£500) five hundred pounds, for the due prosecution of the Appeal, and the payment of all such costs as may become payable to the Respondent in the event of the Appellant not obtaining an Order, finally admitting the Appeal, or of the Appeal being dismissed for non-prosecution, or of His Majesty in Council ordering the Appellant to pay the Respondent's costs of the Appeal (as the case may be); and

(b) upon such other conditions (if any) as to the time or times within which the Appellant shall take the necessary steps for the purpose of procuring the preparation of the Record and the despatch thereof to England as the Court, having regard to all the circumstances of the case, may think it reasonable to impose.

5. Where the judgment appealed from requires the Appellant to pay money or perform a duty, the Court shall have power, when admitting an Appeal, either to direct that the said judgment shall be carried into execution or that the execution thereof shall be suspended pending the Appeal, as to the Court shall seem just and in case the Court shall direct the said judgment to be carried into execution the person in whose favour it was given shall, before the execution thereof, enter into good and sufficient security, to the satisfaction of the Court, for the due performance of such Order as His Majesty in Council shall think fit to make thereon.

6. The preparation of the Record shall be subject to the supervision of the Court, and the parties may submit any disputed question arising in connection therewith to the decision of the Court, and the Court shall give such directions thereon as the justice of the case may require.

7. The Registrar, as well as the parties and their legal agents, shall endeavour to exclude from the Record all documents (more particularly such as are merely formal) that are not relevant to the subject-matter of the Appeal, and generally to reduce the bulk of the Record as far as practicable, taking special care to avoid the duplication of documents and the unnecessary repetition of headings and other merely formal parts of documents; but the documents omitted to be copied or printed shall be enumerated in a list to be placed after the index or at the end of the Record.

8. Where in the course of the preparation of a Record one party objects to the inclusion of a document on the ground that it is unnecessary or irrelevant and the other party neverthe-

less insists upon its being included, the Record, as finally printed (whether in the Colony concerned or in England) shall, with a view to the subsequent adjustment of the costs of and incidental to such document, indicate in the index of papers or otherwise the fact that, and the party by whom, the inclusion of the document was objected to.

9. The Record shall be printed in accordance with the rules set forth in the Schedule hereto. It may be so printed either in the Colony concerned or in England.

10. Where the Record is printed in the Colony concerned, the Registrar shall, at the expense of the Appellant, transmit to the Registrar of the Privy Council 40 copies of such Record, one of which copies he shall certify to be correct by signing his name on, or initialling every eighth page thereof and by affixing thereto the seal, if any, of the Court.

11. Where the Record is to be printed in England the Registrar shall, at the expense of the Appellant, transmit to the Registrar of the Privy Council one certified copy of such Record, together with an index of all the papers and exhibits in the case. No other certified copies of the Record shall be transmitted to the Agents in England by or on behalf of the parties to the Appeal.

12. Where part of the Record is printed in the Colony concerned and part is to be printed in England, Rules 10 and 11 shall, as far as practicable, apply to such parts as are printed in the Colony and such as are to be printed in England respectively.

13. The reasons given by the Judges for or against any judgment pronounced in the course of the proceedings out of which the Appeal arises shall, by such Judges, be communicated in writing to the Registrar, and shall by him be transmitted to the Registrar of the Privy Council at the same time when the Record is transmitted.

14. Where there are two or more applications to admit Appeals arising out of the same matter, and the Court is of opinion that it would be for the convenience of the Lords of the Judicial Committee and all parties concerned that the Appeals should be consolidated, the Court may direct the Appeals to be consolidated and admit the Appeals by a single Order.

15. An Appellant who has obtained an Order conditionally admitting his Appeal may at any time prior to the making of an Order finally admitting the same withdraw his Appeal on such terms as to costs and otherwise as the Court may direct.

16. Where an Appellant having obtained an Order conditionally admitting his Appeal, and having complied with the conditions imposed on him by such Order, fails thereafter to apply with due diligence to the Court for an Order finally admitting the same the Court may, on an application in that behalf made by the Respondent, rescind the Order conditionally admitting the Appeal; notwithstanding the Appellant's compliance with the conditions imposed by such Order, and may give such directions as to the costs of the Appeal and the security entered into by the Appellant as the Court shall think fit, or make such further or other Order in the premises as, in the opinion of the Court, the justice of the case requires.

17. On an application for final admission of an Appeal, the Court may inquire whether notice, or sufficient notice, of the application

has been given by the Appellant to all parties concerned, and, if not satisfied as to the notice given, may defer granting such final admission or may give such other directions in the matter as, in the opinion of the Court, the justice of the case requires.

18. An Appellant whose Appeal has been finally admitted shall prosecute his Appeal in accordance with the rules for the time being regulating the general practice and procedure in Appeals to His Majesty in Council.

19. Where an Appellant whose Appeal has been finally admitted, desires prior to the despatch of the Record to England to withdraw his Appeal, the Court may, upon an application in that behalf made by the Appellant, grant him a certificate to the effect that the Appeal has been withdrawn, and the Appeal shall thereupon be deemed, as from the date of such certificate, to stand dismissed without express Order of His Majesty in Council, and the costs of the Appeal and the security entered into by the Appellant shall be dealt with in such manner as the Court may think fit to direct.

20. Where an Appellant whose Appeal has been finally admitted, fails to show due diligence in taking all necessary steps for the purpose of procuring the despatch of the Record to England, the Respondent may, after giving the Appellant due notice of his intended application, apply to the Court for a certificate that the Appeal has not been effectually prosecuted by the Appellant and if the Court sees fit to grant such a certificate, the Appeal shall be deemed as from the date of such certificate, to stand dismissed for non-prosecution without express Order of His Majesty in Council, and the costs of the Appeal and the security entered into by the Appellant shall be dealt with in such manner as the Court may think fit to direct.

21. Where at any time between the Order finally admitting the Appeal and the despatch of the Record to England the Record becomes defective by reason of the death, or change of status, of a party to the Appeal, the Court may, notwithstanding such Order, on an application in that behalf made by any person interested, grant a certificate showing who, in the opinion of the Court, is the proper person to be substituted or entered on the Record in place of, or in addition to, the party who has died or undergone a change of status, and the name of such person shall thereupon be deemed to be so substituted or entered on the Record as aforesaid without express Order of His Majesty in Council.

22. Where the Record subsequently to its despatch to England becomes defective by reason of the death or change of status of a party to the Appeal, the Court shall, upon an application in that behalf made by any person interested, cause a certificate to be transmitted to the Registrar of the Privy Council showing who, in the opinion of the Court, is the proper person to be substituted or entered on the Record in place of, or in addition to, the party who has died or undergone a change of status.

23. The Case of each party to the Appeal may be printed either in the Colony concerned or in England and shall, in either event, be printed in accordance with the rules set forth in the Schedule hereto, every tenth line thereof being numbered in the margin, and shall be signed by at least one of the Counsel who attends at the hearing of the Appeal, or by

the party himself if he conducts his Appeal in person.

24. The Case shall consist of paragraphs numbered consecutively and shall state, as concisely as possible, the circumstances out of which the Appeal arises, the contentions to be urged by the party lodging the same, and the reasons of Appeal. References by page and line to the relevant portions of the Record as printed shall, as far as practicable, be printed in the margin, and care shall be taken to avoid, as far as possible, the reprinting in the case of long extracts from the Record. The taxing officer in taxing the costs of the Appeal, shall either of his own motion or at the instance of the opposite party, inquire into any unnecessary prolixity in the case, and shall disallow the costs occasioned thereby.

25. Where the Judicial Committee directs a party to bear the costs of an Appeal incurred in any Colony concerned, such costs shall be taxed by the proper officer of the Court in accordance with the rules for the time being regulating taxation in the Court.

26. The Court shall conform with and execute any Order which His Majesty in Council may think fit to make on an Appeal from a judgment of the Court in like manner as any judgment of the Court should or might have been executed.

27. All or any of the functions or authorities by any of these Rules conferred on the Court may be exercised by the Chief Justice (or Acting Chief Justice) of the Colony in which the judgment under appeal was pronounced.

28. Nothing in these Rules contained shall be deemed to interfere with the right of His Majesty, upon the humble petition of any person aggrieved by any judgment of the Court, to admit his Appeal therefrom upon such conditions as His Majesty in Council shall think fit to impose.

On January 7th, 1919, while a number of rockets and lights were being re-packed at the Royal Naval Ordnance Depôt at Woolwich, one of the rockets ignited and exploded, thus causing other rockets in the same case to explode. Brown, a foreman in the Ordnance

Depôt, immediately threw water upon the flaming case, opened the doors of the storehouse and dragged the case into the open. This he did single-handed, but as a result of his example, other employees came to his assistance, and the fire was eventually extinguished by the use of fire buckets and a portable pump.

The storehouse was full of fireworks and flares of every description, and there was a large store of detonators immediately adjoining; several hundred men and women were at work in the immediate vicinity, and had it not been for the promptitude and determination shown by Brown, there is no doubt that a very serious explosion would have occurred. Brown was fully aware of the fact that the store was full of explosives, and of the danger which he was running, and by his courageous act he certainly saved many lives.

The Colonial Office has forwarded for publication the following Despatch* on military operations in the Somaliland Protectorate:—
From the Governor and Commander-in-Chief, Somaliland Protectorate,
To the Secretary of State for the Colonies.

*Governor's Camp,

30th April, 1920.

My Lord,—

I have the honour to submit the following report on the continuous minor operations and patrols carried out by the troops in this Protectorate against the Dervish forces of the Mullah, Mohammed bin Abdulla Hassan, from the time of the action at Shimber Berris described in my despatch of the 20th February, 1915, and published in the London Gazette of the 2nd August, 1916, to October, 1919, when His Majesty's Government decided upon offensive operations with a view to the final overthrow of the Dervish power.

2. It will be within your Lordship's recollection that the period in question was one of many difficulties in Somaliland. The advance of the Turks in the Aden hinterland in 1915,

their occupation of Lahej, Turko-German propaganda in Abyssinia, the pro-Islamic tendencies of Lij Yasu culminating in the wholesale massacre of Somalis in the neighbouring town of Harrar by Christian Abyssinian soldiers—these and other events could not but react most unfavourably on the credulous and somewhat fanatically disposed Moslems of this Protectorate. Isolated and uneducated, the Somali naturally judged the course of events in the outside world by the measure of our success in dealing with the local Dervish menace. The policy of coastal concentration, which had admittedly shaken our position, had only been abandoned early in 1914; and with the reoccupation of the interior and the re-establishment of our control prestige had to be built up afresh. The outlook was scarcely encouraging, as the absence of reinforcements from outside the Protectorate necessarily entailed a defensive policy on our part, while the Dervishes were in a position where they could launch a raid at will at any point on a front of some three hundred miles extending from the Makhir Coast to Galadi. How well the local forces dealt with this difficult situation in an inhospitable country with few resources may be judged from the narrative which follows.

3. The number, disposition, and composition of the troops varied from time to time. But the force generally available for all purposes, that is, to meet Dervish aggression in the east and to maintain order within the administered area in the west, consisted of 500 Somaliland Camel Corps, 400 Indian Contingent (of whom 150 were mounted and attached to the Camel Corps), and 400 Temporary Garrison, Indian Infantry; total 1,300. In addition, some 320 Somali Illaloes (irregulars) were employed as scouts and to form tribal posts in the outlying areas. The mounted troops, organised on a basis of 1 Indian and 2 Somali Camel Companies and 1 Somali Pony Company, were concentrated as far as possible at Ber and Burao to form a striking force; and the Indian Infantry provided garrisons for Las Khorai, Las Dureh, Burao, and Hargeisa.

4. After the capture and demolition of their forts at Shimber Berris in February, 1915, the Dervishes were driven out of the Ain Valley and retired to their main positions at Tale and Jidali; but they held a series of small advanced forts or block-houses covering these two positions and their grazing grounds. It was our object to confine them to this area and to afford protection to our friendly tribes behind a line drawn roughly from Ankhor on the sea coast through Eil Dur Elan to Badwein at the eastern extremity of the Ain Valley, and thence south-west to the southern border at a point where it is intersected by the 46th degree of longitude, a front of some 200 miles. The mounted troops constantly patrolled the protected area behind this line to ward off attack, and on occasions advanced beyond it for purposes of reconnaissance; and they so impressed on the Dervishes a sense of their range, mobility, and endurance that projected raids were frequently abandoned almost before they were launched. Most valuable, too, during the whole of this period were the services of the Illaloes, who, inured to privation and hardship and displaying often the greatest dash and gallantry, were engaged in continuous minor fighting with small Dervish parties, over whom they eventually acquired a marked moral ascendancy. But a defensive

policy of this character, dictated by circumstances, left the Dervishes with the initiative and, with this advantage, they were sometimes able to effect successful raids against our friendlies, and to make good their retreat with the captured stock. In spite of this, it may be said that the results of the defensive policy exceeded expectations. The number of successful raids was reduced to a minimum and on several occasions severe punishment was meted out to the raiders.

5. The most important actions fought by the mounted troops during this period against formed bodies of Dervishes were those (a) at Endow Pass in October, 1917, and (b) at Ok Pass in March, 1919, both in the north-eastern area of the Protectorate.

(a) On the 6th October, 1917, information was received at Burao that a Dervish force, estimated at 400-500 men, had raided the friendlies in the neighbourhood of Las Dureh. The Camel Corps, moving out at a strength of 10 British Officers, 347 rifles, and 6 machine guns, under the command of Major G. R. Breeding, D.S.O., Reserve of Officers, reached Eil Dur Elan on the morning of the 8th October, and pressing on the same day picked up the tracks of the raiders at a point 27 miles further east by sunset. The column moved off again at 1.30 a.m., as the Dervishes were reported *zawbaed* only 20 miles ahead. Captain H. L. Ismay, 21st Cavalry, Indian Army, with 150 pony rifles and 2 machine guns, was ordered to push ahead rapidly and act as circumstances demanded, the remaining camel rifles and machine guns under Major Breeding moving up as fast as possible in support. On coming up with the Dervishes, Captain Ismay found they had driven the stock through two very difficult passes which they were holding. Using the irregular levy accompanying the troops to create a diversion against the western (Aglub) pass, he attacked the eastern (Endow) pass which was held by some 300 Dervish riflemen, who had taken up a strong position on the crest of the pass and in the caves to cover the withdrawal of the raided camels. The action commenced at 9 a.m. on the 9th October, and at 10 a.m. Captain Ismay was joined by Major Breeding and the remainder of the force. After five hours' sharp fighting, during which heavy casualties were inflicted on the enemy, chiefly by machine-gun fire, the caves were cleared and the Dervishes dislodged from their position. But they were evidently still determined to resist our advance, and Major Breeding decided that he would be unable to reach the summit of the pass with his animals before nightfall. There was thus little chance of overtaking the raided stock, which, on reaching the plateau, would be driven off rapidly, and the force, with but two days' rations in hand, was already 140 miles from its base at Burao, having traversed this distance and fought the action in four days. Accordingly he reluctantly decided that further pursuit was impracticable. The Dervishes had been very severely handled, and in addition to some 70 killed and an unknown number wounded, a good many rifles—most valuable to the Mullah—had fallen into our possession. Our casualties in this action were one British officer and nine other ranks wounded. In his appreciation of this operation the

Officer Commanding Troops, Lieut.-Colonel G. H. Summers,* 26th Cavalry, Indian Army, remarks:—

"Although the stock was not recaptured, severe loss far in excess of the value of the raid was inflicted. The moral effect of the long-sustained, successful pursuit subsequently proved to be great. It is noteworthy that the column traversed 135 miles in 65 hours, including much very difficult and intersected country, before gaining touch with the Dervishes. The troops were under arms for 57 hours, and had only 9 hours' rest in the 75 hours which elapsed between 1600 hours on the 6th October and 1900 hours on the 9th October, 1917. In the course of this operation the Pony Company marched 280 miles in 7 days."

(b) On the 25th February, 1919, telegraphic information was received from Las Dureh that a strong Dervish force was in the neighbourhood of Rajuna. The mounted column under Major C. A. L. Howard, 32nd Lancers, Indian Army, moved out at once, and reached the Ok Pass, 53 miles north-east of Burao, without incident. Major Howard, with two camel companies, moved to Eil Dur Elan to refill at the dump, where he was in a position to cover the friendlies' stock in the Guban plain, while the Pony Company remained at Ok to secure the pass and cover his movements. At dawn on the 1st March this Company, under Captain R. F. Simons, Loyal North Lancashire Regiment, was attacked by a force of some 400 Dervish riflemen, but after an hour's hard fighting the Dervishes were driven off, leaving sixty-three dead outside the *zariba* alone. A report having been despatched to Major Howard, the pony company followed the retiring Dervishes, shepherding them towards the Karumba Pass, on the Rajuna-Las Adey track. At 1 p.m. on the 2nd March they withdrew for water, and the Dervishes, elated by this withdrawal and totally unaware of the presence of the main column, blundered into a trap on the 3rd March, and came under very heavy rifle and machine-gun fire from the camel companies. They retired rapidly, but were headed off by mounted troops, and in spite of very gallant efforts on the part of their leaders they broke in all directions, abandoning the stock captured from the friendlies on the 1st March as well as their own camels, and even throwing away their rifles and clothing. The Dervish casualties in the two actions exceeded 200 in dead alone, while our casualties were two rank and file killed, three wounded. This action may be regarded as the most complete defeat inflicted on the Dervishes since Jidballi in 1904.

6. During the period under review there have been constant engagements and skirmishes with the Dervishes of lesser importance and many a great march, testifying to the efficiency, pertinacity, and powers of endurance of officers

and men of the Camel Corps, of which the following are instances:—

(1) On the 18th April, 1915, the pony company under Captain J. Kingdon, 86th Carnatic Infantry, Indian Army, covered a distance of 120 miles in forty hours without water in pursuit of a Dervish raiding party.

(2) Moving from Burao on the 10th June, 1915, the mounted troops under Lieut.-Colonel T. Astley Cubitt, C.M.G., D.S.O., R.F.A., Officer Commanding Troops, patrolled from Burao to El Afweina via Las Dureh and Las Adey to reconnoitre the country along one of the main lines of advance of Dervish raiders from the Jidali district. At Las Adey on the 24th June a party of Dervish horse was encountered; but after a brief skirmish the Dervishes retired towards Jidali. The distance covered on this patrol was 344 miles. Again, on the 2nd August, 1915, Colonel Cubitt made a reconnaissance to Bohotleh, on our southern border, and, returning to Garrero, traversed the whole of the Ain Valley to Badwein. Three Dervish parties were encountered by the Illaloes during this patrol, and defeated in each case with considerable loss. The column returned to Burao via Shimer Berris, having covered a distance of 316 miles.

(3) In May, 1916, a strong Dervish force attacked Las Khorai, on the Makhir coast, inflicting heavy casualties, amounting to 300 or more, on the Warsangli tribe. They were eventually dispersed and driven off with considerable loss by gunfire from H.M.S. "Northbrook" (Commander L. Turton, R.N., in command), and shortly afterwards a strong fortified post, occupied by 200 rifles, 58th Vaughan's Rifles, Indian Army, was established there for the protection of the town.

(4) On the 23rd April, 1917, Lieut.-Colonel G. H. Summers, with the mounted column which had moved out from Burao on patrol on the 13th April, and camped at Ainabo, received news that a Dervish force under Amir was in the neighbourhood of Durdur Dulbeit in readiness for a raid on a large scale. The column moved to Badwein, and thence carried out a lateral march via Adad and Bihen through very heavy country, flooded by recent rain, to Daba Dalol. At this point on the 29th April Dervish horse were seen, but they galloped off towards El Afweina, which was reconnoitred on the same afternoon and found deserted. The column then withdrew for supplies to Las Adey, and thence, via Las Dureh, to Burao. The Dervishes had abandoned their raid and dispersed to Tale and Jidali. The distance covered on this patrol was 335 miles.

(5) In the middle of April, 1919, remnants of the Dervish force defeated at Ok, fearing punishment at the hands of the Mullah if they returned to Tale, and having collected reinforcements, raided the outlying villages of the friendlies on the sea coast west of Ankhor. The mounted column under Major Ismay moved rapidly via Eil Dur Elan to Ankhor, and pressed the pursuit to within 30 miles of the raiders at Raguda, but owing to the extreme difficulty of the intervening country and the distance of the force from its base, the pursuit had

to be broken off. A refilling dump had in the meantime been established by sea at El Darad, and the column returned via the coast, reaching Berbera on the 19th, and Burao on the 23rd. The distance covered in this patrol was 360 miles. The heat in the maritime plain at this time of year was intense, and the going bad, so that over much of the distance the animals had to be led, and the brackish and sulphurated water left its effect on officers and men. This was one of the most arduous marches made by the Camel Corps.

7. It should be recorded that on two occasions during the war calls were made on the local troops to be held in readiness to co-operate with forces outside the Protectorate. In July, 1915, on a telegraphic request for reinforcements from the General Officer Commanding, Aden Field Force, the Mounted Company, Indian Contingent, with one Infantry Company and two 12-pounder Q.F. guns, marched to the coast ready to embark for Aden, but later the movement was cancelled. And, again, in June, 1917, a composite company of the Camel Corps, with one pony mounted troop, was under orders to co-operate with French and Italian troops in the hinterland of French Somaliland, with a view to the capture of the German Mission in the Danakil country. The French authorities eventually decided, however, that these combined operations were unnecessary.

8. The period covered by this despatch extends over more than four years, during which detachments from the following units of the Indian Army have served in the Protectorate as temporary garrison: 73rd Carnatic Infantry, 1/5th Light Infantry, 58th Vaughan's Rifles and 101st Grenadiers. One and all have rendered valuable services. They have garrisoned isolated outposts in the most desolate and inhospitable regions of the protectorate in the hot weather season under intolerable climatic conditions; and, on occasions, they have been called upon to make forced marches in support of the mounted troops and escort camel convoys with supplies. The conduct of these units throughout has been exemplary.

9. The minor operations here reviewed resulted in the consolidation of our position in Somaliland, militarily and politically, and contributed in no small degree to the success of the subsequent operations. For, throughout this period, the Dervish forces were weakening rapidly by a process of attrition. The tide of Dervishism in Somaliland has never been stationary. It has ebbed and flowed in accordance with the measure of our occupation. As the Mullah's extension westward was checked and pushed back, his means of recruitment by subjugating the weaker tribes failed, and, with our advance, a steady flow of desertion among his own ranks ensued. In the actions at Shimber Berris, Endow, Ok and Karumba the Dervishes lost many killed and wounded and many in the continuous minor fighting with our Ilaloos. Again, with the weakening of the Mullah's power, the attitude of the Mijertein on his eastern flank became more aggressive, and, as Dervish desertion increased, the more ruthless were the methods adopted by the Mullah himself to deal with his wavering followers, culminating in wholesale executions and mutilations at Tale.

Meanwhile, previous sources of ammunition supply were being closed to him by political action, and some cohesion induced among our friendly tribesmen. Understandings were reached with the Somali chieftains outside our own territory bordering the Dervish zone, and much valuable information as to the Dervish organisation and dispositions and the topography was collected by the Intelligence Officer. With the end of the war it was clear that the time had come for the final advance. The troops were in a high state of efficiency, and as the outcome of their many engagements with the Dervishes the Somalis of the Camel Corps had acquired full confidence in themselves and their officers. Consequently, in March, 1919, I was able to represent to Your Lordship that operations on a small scale only would be required for the final subjection of the Mullah and the overthrow of the Dervish power. These proposals were approved; and in October, 1919, His Majesty's Government sanctioned the aerial and military operations which form the subject of another despatch.

10. For services in the field, more particularly at the actions at Endow Pass and Ok Pass, certain officers and men have already been granted military reward.

11. I am glad to avail myself of this opportunity of expressing my deep sense of indebtedness to Lieut.-Colonel (now Major-General) T. Astley Cubitt, C.B., C.M.G., D.S.O., R.F.A., for his invaluable services in Somaliland during the early days of the war. I now desire to bring to Your Lordship's notice the good services rendered by Brevet Major (temporary Lieut.-Colonel) G. H. Summers, 26th Cavalry, Indian Army, who has commanded the Protectorate troops since 1916 with marked ability and success.

ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF
AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 1ST MARCH 1921.)

ANIMALS (LANDING FROM IRELAND)
ORDER OF 1921 (No. 5).

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

PART I.

Revocation of Existing Orders.

1. The Animals (Landing from Ireland) Orders of 1921, and 1921 (Nos. 2, 3 and 4) are hereby revoked.

Regulation of Landing.

2. Cattle, sheep, goats or swine brought from Ireland shall not be landed in Great Britain except in accordance with the provisions of the Animals (Landing from Ireland) (Consolidation and Amendment) Order of 1914 as amended by this Order.

PART II.

Movement from Landing Place of Cattle, Sheep and Goats intended for immediate slaughter.

3. Cattle, sheep and goats landed after the commencement of this Order if intended for immediate slaughter, may be moved from any Landing Place with a licence of an Inspector of the Ministry and subject to the following conditions:—

(i) The animals shall be moved to the place of detention specified in the licence, and not elsewhere, and shall be there slaughtered within a period of ten days after the date of their arrival at such place of detention. Whilst in the place of detention animals moved with a licence under this Article shall not be allowed to come into contact with other animals.

(ii) An animal moved with a licence under this Article shall be moved by the nearest

available route, and during such movement shall not be permitted to come in contact with animals not being so moved.

Movement of Fat Swine out of Landing Place.

4. Swine intended for immediate slaughter may be moved from any Landing Place direct to a slaughterhouse if accompanied by a licence granted under the Swine Fever (Movement from Ireland) Order of 1904, provided that the permission of an Inspector of the Ministry is obtained and the said licence is countersigned by the Inspector. The swine shall be slaughtered within a period of ten days after the date of their arrival at the slaughterhouse specified in the licence.

PART III.

Movement from Landing Place of Animals not intended for immediate slaughter.

5.—(1) Cattle, sheep, goats or swine landed at any Landing Place and not intended for immediate slaughter shall not be moved from the Landing Place except in accordance with the following provisions of this Article.

(2) Any swine accompanied by a licence granted under the Swine-Fever (Movement from Ireland) Order of 1906 may be moved from the Landing Place provided that the permission of an Inspector of the Ministry is obtained and the licence is countersigned by the Inspector. Such swine shall be subject to the provisions of that Order as to subsequent movement and as to detention and isolation after arrival at the place of destination specified in the licence.

(3) The removal of any other animal from the Landing Place must be authorised by a licence granted by an Inspector of the Ministry.

(4) Each animal moved with a licence granted by an Inspector of the Ministry shall be moved to a place of detention specified in the licence, and not elsewhere, and shall be there detained and isolated, under the supervision of a Veterinary Inspector of the Local Authority, from other animals for a period of fourteen days after the date of its arrival, unless it is previously slaughtered in the place of detention.

(5) Animals moved under this Article shall be moved by the nearest available route, and as far as practicable by railway, and during such movement shall not be permitted to come in contact with animals not being moved under this Article.

PART IV.

GENERAL.

Condition of Landing at any Landing Place.

6. The landing of any animals under this Order must be authorised by the Superintendent or person in charge of the Landing Place.

Provision as to Marking.

7. An animal shall not be moved from the Landing Place unless before the movement is commenced it is marked by and at the expense of the owner or his agent in manner following:—

Cattle.—By the clipping of a broad arrow, ↑ about six inches long, on the left hind-quarter of each of the cattle, and by the clipping of the hair off the end of the tail.

Sheep.—By the clipping of a broad arrow ↑ on the forehead of each of the sheep; and also by the painting or stamping of the letter M., about six inches long, on both

sides of each of the sheep with the following composition, namely: Rosin, five parts; oil of turpentine, two parts; and blue or red ochre, one part; melted and used warm; or with some other adhesive composition of a blue or red colour.

Swine.—By the painting or stamping of the letter M, about six inches long, on both sides of each of the swine with the composition above mentioned.

Provisions as to Licences.

8.—(1) Where animals are moved with a licence under this Order, the licence shall forthwith, after completion of the movement, be delivered up to an Inspector of the Local Authority, or be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest Police Station in the same District, by the person in charge of the animals at the time of completing the movement.

(2) A movement licence granted under this Order shall be in force for four days, inclusive of the day of issue.

(3) A copy of a licence under this Order shall be sent by the Inspector granting the licence to the Clerk of the Local Authority of the District in which the place of detention is situate.

Movement from Landing Place subject to other Orders and to Regulations.

9. Nothing in this Order or in any Order relating to the landing or movement of animals brought from Ireland shall be deemed to authorise the movement of an animal in contravention of any other Order of the Minister or of a Regulation of a Local Authority.

Offences.

10.—(1) If any animal shall be removed in contravention of this Order, or is not slaughtered or is not isolated as hereby required, the owner thereof, and the owner and the lessee and the occupier of the Landing Place, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the move-

ment, and the owner and person in charge of the animal which is not so slaughtered or isolated, as the case may be, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts or defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

(2) If any person, with a view unlawfully to evade or defeat the operation of this Order, before the expiration of the period of detention, takes out, effaces, or obliterates, or attempts to take out, efface, or obliterate, any mark on any animal affixed under this Order, the person doing the same, and the person causing, directing or permitting the same to be done, and the owner of the animal, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Commencement.

11. This Order shall come into operation on the fifth day of March, nineteen hundred and twenty-one.

Short Title.

12. This Order may be cited as the ANIMALS (LANDING FROM IRELAND) ORDER OF 1921 (No. 5).

ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF
AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 2ND MARCH 1921.)

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

1. The restrictions on movement of swine imposed by the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908 and the Kent and Surrey (Swine-Fever) Order of 1917 shall not apply to the movement of swine from the sale mentioned in the Schedule hereto to any premises in Great Britain not being a Swine-Fever Infected Place, if the swine are accompanied by a licence in the Form F set forth in the First Schedule to the said Order of 1908, granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the county of Kent, and the following conditions, which shall be specified in the licence, are complied with:—

(i) The swine shall be moved to the place of destination specified in the licence and not elsewhere, and shall be there detained and kept separate from all other swine for twenty-eight days, unless they are slaughtered on such premises before the expiration of that period, or are moved under and in accordance with the conditions of a licence in the Form C set forth in the said First Schedule to a bacon factory or slaughterhouse in the same Scheduled Area.

(ii) The swine shall be moved by the nearest available route without unnecessary delay, and during the movement shall, so far as is practicable, be kept separate from all swine not being moved with a licence under this Order.

(iii) After completion of the movement the licence shall forthwith be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest police-station in the same district by the person in charge of the swine at the time of completing such movement.

2. A copy of a licence issued under this Order shall be sent by the Inspector granting the same to the Local Authority of the district in which the place of destination specified in the licence is situate.

3. A licence under this Order shall for the purposes of the above-mentioned Orders be treated as a licence under those Orders.

MIDDLESEX (ACTON DISTRICT)
(CONTROL OF DOGS) ORDER OF 1921
(No. 2).

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

PART I.

*Prohibition of Movement of Dogs out of
certain District.*

1.—(1.) No dog shall be moved out of the District described in the Schedule hereto, hereinafter referred to as "the Scheduled District," unless it is accompanied by a licence of the Ministry authorising such movement signed by an Officer of the Ministry, and any such licence may be subject to such conditions as to the detention and isolation of the dog or otherwise as the Ministry may think necessary or desirable, which shall be specified in the licence: Provided that this Article shall not apply to—

(a) the movement of a dog under a licence granted by the Ministry under the Importation of Dogs Order of 1914 and the Importation of Dogs (Amendment) Order of 1918 (No. 2) to a port in Great Britain for shipment, or to a place of detention for the purpose of detention and isolation; or

(b) the movement of a dog through the Scheduled District by railway from a place outside the District to another place outside the District without unnecessary delay and without being re-booked within the District.

(2.) If any farm or holding (except any detached part thereof) is partly within and partly without the Scheduled District, the whole shall be deemed to be within the Scheduled District.

Seizure of Dogs in case of Default.

2.—(1.) If a dog has been moved in contravention of this Order or having been moved with a licence under this Order is not detained and isolated or otherwise dealt with as required by the conditions of the licence, an Inspector of the Ministry may seize the dog, and thereupon the Ministry shall detain and isolate it at the place of detention specified in the licence (if any) or any other place of detention selected by them for such time as the Ministry think necessary or expedient.

(2.) If the owner of the dog does not, within ten days after the expiration of the period of detention specified in the licence (if any) or such other period as the Ministry may think necessary or expedient and notify the owner, claim the dog from the Ministry and pay to the Ministry the expenses of detaining and isolating the dog, the Ministry may destroy or otherwise dispose of the dog as the Ministry thinks expedient.

*Notice of Detention in case of Illegal
Movement.*

3.—(1.) Where an Inspector or other Officer of the Ministry, or of a Local Authority, has reason to believe that a dog has been moved in contravention of this Order he may give notice to the owner or person in charge of the dog requiring that the dog shall be detained

and isolated in accordance with the provisions of such notice, and that within a time specified in such notice the dog shall be moved to a place of detention for the purpose of such detention and isolation.

(2.) Such provisions may be inserted in the notice as the Ministry may think necessary or desirable for any of the following purposes, namely:—

(i) For prescribing and regulating the detention and isolation of the dog.

(ii) For prescribing the person by whom and the premises on which the dog shall be detained and isolated.

(iii) For regulating the movement of the dog to the place of detention.

(iv) For prescribing the confinement of the dog in a suitable hamper, crate, box, or other receptacle, or the muzzling of the dog, during its movement by railway, or along a highway or thoroughfare.

(v) For prescribing the mode of isolation of the dog.

(vi) For prescribing the notice to be given of the death or loss of the dog, or of any matter arising in connection with the movement, detention, or isolation of the dog and the persons by whom and to whom the notice is to be given; and

(vii) For prescribing the production of the notice for inspection by an officer of the Ministry or police constable, or officer of the Local Authority.

(3.) The operation of a notice under this Article may be terminated by notice to that effect given by an Inspector or other Officer of the Ministry or of the Local Authority to the owner or person in charge of the dog, on proof to the satisfaction of the Inspector or Officer that the dog was not moved in contravention of the said Order.

(4.) If the owner or person in charge of the dog, after receipt of such notice, fails to move the dog as required by the notice, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(5.) If the provisions inserted in any notice under this Article are not complied with, the owner of the dog and the person in charge of the dog and any person who being required to comply with any such provision fails to do so, shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

PART II.

Control of Dogs in Scheduled District.

4.—(1.) A dog in the Scheduled District shall at all times:—

(a) whilst in or on any public place be efficiently muzzled with an effective wire cage muzzle;

(b) whilst in or on any other place, be kept under control by being—

(i) confined in a kennel or other enclosure from which the dog cannot escape; or

(ii) secured to some premises by a collar and chain; or

(iii) efficiently muzzled with an effective wire cage muzzle; or

(iv) accompanied by the owner or some person deputed by him and under effectual control.

(2.) The provisions of this Article shall not apply to—

(a) any pack of hounds while being exercised under the supervision of two or more competent attendants; or

(b) any dog in charge of a competent person while being used for sporting purposes, or for the capture or destruction of vermin or rabbits, or for the driving or tending of cattle or sheep; or

(c) any dog confined in a suitable hamper, crate, box, or other receptacle, so constructed as to render it impossible for such dog while so confined to bite any person or animal.

Seizure, Detention and Disposal of Uncontrolled Dogs.

5.—(1.) Any dog in the Scheduled District which is not muzzled, or kept under control, as prescribed by this Order, may be seized by the Local Authority or by the police, and any dog so seized shall be dealt with by the Local Authority as follows:—

(i) If the dog is diseased or suspected, or has been bitten by a diseased or suspected dog, it shall be forthwith slaughtered.

(ii) If the dog has been exposed to the infection of rabies it shall be detained, slaughtered, or otherwise dealt with as the Local Authority think expedient, but so that the dog shall not, while detained by the Local Authority, be allowed to come in contact with any other animal.

(iii) In any other case the dog shall be treated as a stray dog seized under the powers conferred by section three of the Dogs Act, 1906.

(2.) No dog so seized shall be given or sold for the purposes of vivisection.

(3.) Every dog shall, for the purposes of this Article, be deemed to have been exposed to the infection of rabies which has been in the same shed, stable, building, kennel, field, or other place, or otherwise in contact with any diseased or suspected dog, or which has in any other way been exposed to the infection of rabies.

Prohibition of Holding of Exhibitions or Shows of Dogs in Scheduled District.

6.—No exhibition or show of dogs whether for sale or otherwise shall be held in the Scheduled District except with a licence of the Ministry, and any such licence shall be subject to such conditions as the Ministry may think necessary or desirable, and shall specify in the licence.

PART III.

GENERAL.

Offences.

7.—(1.) If a dog is moved in contravention of this Order, the owner of the dog, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the dog, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the dog is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(2.) If any dog in the Scheduled District is not muzzled, or kept under control, as prescribed by this Order, the owner of the dog, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(3.) If a dog which is being moved or has been moved with a licence under this Order is not muzzled or confined or is not detained and

isolated or otherwise dealt with as required by the conditions of the licence, the owner of the dog, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(4.) If any person holds, or causes or permits to be held, any exhibition or show in contravention of this Order, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(5.) If a person with a view unlawfully to evade or defeat the operation of this Order or of the conditions of a licence under this Order, allows a dog to stray, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(6.) If the owner or person in charge of a dog fails to give, produce, or do any notice, licence, or thing which by this Order, or by the conditions of a licence thereunder, he is required to give, produce, or do, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

Interpretation.

8.—In this Order—

“The Ministry” means the Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries.

“The Act of 1894” means the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

“Disease” means rabies, “diseased” means affected with rabies, and “suspected” means suspected of rabies.

“Public place” includes any street, highway, thoroughfare, public bridge, royal park, public park, garden or pleasure ground, common, unenclosed land, or other place to which the public have for the time being access.

Other terms have the same meaning as in the Rabies Order of 1919.
