STATUTE made by the Governing Body of Eton College on the 22nd day of February, 1921.

Whereas Statutes for the Government of Eton College were made by the Governing Body of the said College under the Public Schools Act, 1868, and approved by His Majesty the King in Council on 24th October,

And whereas the said Governing Body in

exercise of the powers for this purpose conferred upon them by Section 11 of the said Act have resolved to alter Statute XXIII (2) of the said Statutes in the following manner.

Be it enacted as follows:-

From and after the date of His Majesty's Order in Council approving this Statute, Statute XXIII (2) shall read as follows:—

"In regard to Foundation Scholarships awarded at or after the election of 1923 the Scholars shall be lodged and maintained during each School time within the precincts of the College and each of them shall be charged an inclusive sum of £50 per each School-time for education and maintenance.

"The Provost and Fellows shall have power to decide in such manner as they shall from time to time determine if any Scholar is in need of assistance and if they shall deem that he is in need of assistance shall have power to remit such sum either wholly or partially according to a Scale graduated in accordance with such need.

"Provided always that the Provost and Fellows shall have power at any time and from time to time to vary the sum chargeable to Foundation Scholars for such education and maintenance as circumstances may require, but any such variation shall not

affect any Scholar entered before such variation has been made and come into force." Sealed with the Common Seal of the Provost and College of Eton in the presence of

The restrictions on movement of swine imposed by the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908 and the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Application Order of 1917 (No. 2) shall not apply to the movement of swine from the sale mentioned in the Schedule hereto to any premises in Great Britain not being a Swine-Fever Infected Place, if the swine are accompanied by a licence in the Form F set forth in the First Schedule to the said Order of 1908, granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the county of Cumberland, and the following conditions, which shall be specified in the licence, are complied with:—
 - (i) The swine shall be moved to the place of destination specified in the licence and not elsewhere, and shall be there detained and kept separate from all other swine for twenty-eight days, unless they are slaughtered on such premises before the expiration of that period, or are moved under and in accordance with the conditions of a licence in the Form C set forth in the said First Schedule to a bacon factory or slaughterhouse in the same Scheduled Area.


(ii) The swine shall be moved by the nearest available route without unnecessary delay, and during the movement shall, so far as is practicable, be kept separate from all swine not being moved with a licence under this Order.

(iii) After completion of the movement the licence shall forthwith be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest policestation in the same district by the person in charge of the swine at the time of completing such movement.

2. A copy of a licence issued under this Order shall be sent by the Inspector granting the same to the Local Authority of the District in which the place of destination specified in the licence is situate.

3. A licence under this Order shall for the purposes of the above-mentioned Orders be treated as a licence under those Orders.
