The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

**W**HEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 16th day of February, 1921 (C.W. 19598/20), in the words following, viz. :—

“Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council :

“And whereas Your Majesty was graciously pleased, by Schedule V Section II of Your Order in Council bearing date the 22nd day of January, 1920, to approve certain rates of

pay for Officers of Your Majesty's Navy, with effect from the 1st February, 1919 :

“And whereas it has been deemed desirable, with the concurrence of the Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury, to regard Schoolmasters, Royal Marines, as eligible to be paid on the scale laid down for Schoolmasters, Royal Navy, in Schedule V Section II of Order in Council bearing date the 22nd day of January, 1920 :

“And whereas we consider that the scale of pay laid down for Schoolmasters, Royal Navy, should be improved, and that the improved scale should be applied also to Schoolmasters, Royal Marines :

“We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to approve of Schoolmasters, Royal Navy, receiving pay at our discretion, on the scale set out in Part I of the attached Schedule, with effect as from the 1st February, 1919, and of Schoolmasters, Royal Marines, being paid, at our discretion, on the Naval Schoolmasters' scale as from the same date, subject to the provisions laid down in Part II of that Schedule.

“The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals.

" Headmasters, Royal Marines, ranking with Commissioned Officers from Warrant Rank, and Chief Schoolmasters, Royal Marines, having the relative rank of Lieutenant, Royal Navy, to enter the appropriate scales with seniority 1st February, 1919, or date of promotion to their respective ranks, whichever is the later date.

" Royal Marines Schoolmasters below the rank of Headmaster to count all time less six months towards the scale laid down."

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

## PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by an enactment shortly entitled "The Courts Enactment, 1920," enacted by His Highness the Sultan of Johore in Council, it was, amongst other things, provided that an Appeal might be made to His Majesty in Council, subject to such rules and regulations as might from time to time be prescribed by order of His Majesty in Council, from any judgment or order in any civil matter of the Court of Appeal of the said State of Johore constituted by the said enactment:

And whereas it is expedient to make such rules and regulations as aforesaid for Appeals from the Court of Appeal of the State of Johore to His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, it is hereby ordered by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Johore Appeals Order in Council, 1921.

2. This Order shall come into effect on and from a day to be appointed in that behalf by His Highness the Sultan of Johore in Executive Council, which shall be notified by proclamation to be published in the Gazette of the State of Johore.

3. His Majesty in Council may at any time alter, add to, or revoke this Order. And the Right Honourable Winston Spencer Churchill, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, is to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

## SCHEDULE.

1. In these Rules, unless the context otherwise requires:—

"Appeal" means Appeal to His Majesty in Council.

"His Majesty" includes His Majesty's Heirs and Successors.

"Judgment" includes decree, order or decisions.

"Court" means either the Full Court or a single Judge of the Court of Appeal of the State of Johore according as the matter in question is one which, under the Rules and practice of the said Court of Appeal, properly appertains to the Full Court or to a single Judge.

"Record" means the aggregate of papers relating to an Appeal (including the pleadings, proceedings, evidence and judgments) proper to be laid before His Majesty in Council on the hearing of the Appeal.

"Registrar" means the Registrar or other proper officer having the custody of the Records in the Court appealed from.

"Month" means calendar month.

Words in the singular include the plural, and words in the plural include the singular.

2. Subject to the provisions of these Rules, an Appeal shall lie:—

(a) As of right, from any final judgment of the Court, where the matter in dispute on the Appeal amounts to or is of the value of 500*l.* sterling or upwards, or where the Appeal involves, directly or indirectly, some claim or question to or respecting property or some civil right amounting to or of the value of 500*l.* sterling or upwards; and

(b) At the discretion of the Court, from any other judgment of the Court, whether final or interlocutory, if, in the opinion of the Court, the question involved in the Appeal is one which, by reason of its great general or public importance, or otherwise, ought to be submitted to His Majesty in Council for decision.

3. Where owing to the Court being equally divided in opinion the decision appealed against stands, such decision shall, for the purpose of an Appeal therefrom, be deemed to be a final judgment of the Court.

4. Applications to the Court for leave to appeal shall be made by motion or petition within 21 days from the date of the judgment to be appealed from, and the Appli-

cant shall give the opposite party notice of his intended application.

5. Leave to appeal under Rule 2 shall only be granted by the Court in the first instance:—

(a) Upon condition of the Appellant, within a period to be fixed by the Court, but not exceeding 3 months from the date of the hearing of the application for leave to appeal, entering into good and sufficient security, to the satisfaction of the Court, in a sum not exceeding £500 for the due prosecution of the Appeal, and the payment of all such costs as may become payable to the Respondent in the event of the Appellant not obtaining an order granting him final leave to appeal, or of the Appeal being dismissed for non-prosecution or of His Majesty in Council ordering the Appellant to pay the Respondent's costs of the Appeal (as the case may be); and

(b) Upon such other conditions (if any) as to the time or times within which the Appellant shall take the necessary steps for the purpose of procuring the preparation of the Record and the despatch thereof to England as the Court, having regard to all the circumstances of the case, may think it reasonable to impose.

6. Where the judgment appealed from requires the Appellant to pay money or perform a duty, the Court shall have power, when granting leave to appeal, either to direct that the said judgment shall be carried into execution or that the execution thereof shall be suspended pending the Appeal, as to the Court shall seem just. And in case the Court shall direct the said judgment to be carried into execution, the person in whose favour it was given shall, before the execution thereof, enter into good and sufficient security, to the satisfaction of the Court, for the due performance of such Order as His Majesty in Council shall think fit to make thereon.

7. The preparation of the Record shall be subject to the supervision of the Court, and the parties may submit any disputed question arising in connection therewith to the decision of the Court and the Court shall give such directions thereon as the justice of the case may require.

8. The Registrar, as well as the parties and their legal agents, shall endeavour to exclude from the Record all documents (more particularly such as are merely formal) that are not relevant to the subject-matter of the Appeal, and, generally, to reduce the bulk of the Record as far as practicable, taking special care to avoid the duplication of documents and the unnecessary repetition of headings and other merely formal parts of documents; but the documents omitted to be copied or printed shall be enumerated in a list to be placed after the index or at the end of the Record.

9. Where in the course of the preparation of a Record one party objects to the inclusion of a document on the ground that it is unnecessary or irrelevant, and the other party nevertheless insists upon its being included, the Record, as finally printed (whether in the State of Johore or in England), shall, with a view to the subsequent adjustment of the costs of and incidental to such documents, indicate in the index of papers, or otherwise, the fact that, and the party by whom, the inclusion of the document was objected to.

10. The Record shall be printed in accordance with the Rules set forth in the Appendix hereto. It may be so printed either in the State of Johore or in England.

11. Where the Record is printed in the State of Johore, the Registrar shall, at the expense of the Appellant, transmit to the Registrar of the Privy Council 40 copies of such Record, one of which copies he shall certify to be correct by signing his name on, or initialling, every eighth page thereof and by affixing thereto the seal of the Court.

12. Where the Record is to be printed in England, the Registrar shall, at the expense of the Appellant, transmit to the Registrar of the Privy Council one certified copy of such Record, together with an index of all the papers and exhibits in the case. No other certified copies of the Record shall be transmitted to the Agents in England by or on behalf of the parties to the Appeal.

13. Where part of the Record is printed in the State of Johore and part is to be printed in England, Rules 11 and 12 shall as far as practicable apply to such parts as are printed in the State of Johore and such as are to be printed in England respectively.

14. The reasons given by the Judge or any of the Judges, for or against any judgment pronounced in the course of the proceedings out of which the Appeal arises shall by such Judge or Judges be communicated in writing to the Registrar, and shall by him be transmitted to the Registrar of the Privy Council at the same time when the Record is transmitted.

15. Where there are two or more applications for leave to appeal arising out of the same matter, and the Court is of opinion that it would be for the convenience of the Lords of the Judicial Committee and all parties concerned that the Appeals shall be consolidated, the Court may direct the Appeals to be consolidated and grant leave to appeal by a single Order.

16. An appellant who has obtained an order granting him conditional leave to appeal may at any time prior to the making of an order granting him final leave to appeal withdraw his appeal on such terms as to costs and otherwise as the Court may direct.

17. Where an Appellant, having obtained an order granting him conditional leave to appeal, and having complied with the conditions imposed on him by such order, fails thereafter to apply with due diligence to the Court for an order granting him final leave to appeal, the Court may, on an application in that behalf made by the Respondent, rescind the order granting conditional leave to appeal, notwithstanding the Appellant's compliance with the conditions imposed by such order, and may give such directions as to the costs of the Appeal and the security entered into by the Appellant as the Court shall think fit, or make such further or other order in the premises as, in the opinion of the Court, the justice of the case requires.

18. On an application for final leave to appeal, the Court may inquire whether notice or sufficient notice of the application has been given by the Appellant to all parties concerned, and, if not satisfied as to the notices given may defer the grant of the final leave to appeal, or may give such other directions in the matter as, in the opinion of the Court, the justice of the case requires.

19. An Appellant who has obtained final leave to appeal shall prosecute his Appeal in accordance with the Rules for the time being regulating the general practice and procedure in Appeals to His Majesty in Council.

20. Where an Appellant, having obtained final leave to appeal, desires, prior to the despatch of the Record to England, to withdraw his Appeal, the Court may, upon an application in that behalf made by the Appellant, grant him a certificate to the effect that the Appeal has been withdrawn and the Appeal shall thereupon be deemed, as from the date of such certificate, to stand dismissed without express Order of His Majesty in Council, and the costs of the Appeal and the security entered into by the Appellant shall be dealt with in such manner as the Court may think fit to direct.

21. Where an Appellant, having obtained final leave to appeal, fails to show due diligence in taking all necessary steps for the purpose of procuring the despatch of the Record to England, the Respondent may, after giving the Appellant due notice of his intended application, apply to the Court for a Certificate that the Appeal has not been effectually prosecuted by the Appellant, and if the Court sees fit to grant such a certificate, the Appeal shall be deemed, as from the date of such certificate, to stand dismissed for non-prosecution without express Order of His Majesty in Council and the costs of the Appeal, and the security entered into by the Appellant, shall be dealt with in such manner as the Court may think fit to direct.

22. Where at any time between the Order granting final leave to appeal and the despatch of the Record to England the Record becomes defective by reason of the death, or change of status, of a party to the Appeal, the Court may, notwithstanding the order granting final leave to appeal on an application in that behalf made by any person interested, grant a Certificate showing who, in the opinion of the Court, is the proper person to be substituted or entered on the Record in place of, or in addition to, the party who has died, or undergone a change of status, and the name of such person shall thereupon be deemed to be so substituted or entered on the Record as aforesaid without express Order of His Majesty in Council.

23. Where the Record subsequently to its despatch to England becomes defective by reason of the death, or change of status, of a party to the Appeal, the Court shall upon an application in that behalf made by any person interested, cause a Certificate to be transmitted to the Registrar of the Privy Council showing who, in the opinion of the Court, is the proper person to be substituted, or entered, on the Record in place of, or in addition to, the party who has died or undergone a change in status.

24. The Case of each party to the Appeal may be printed either in the State of Johore or in England and shall, in either event, be printed in accordance with the Rules set forth in the Appendix hereto, every tenth line thereof being numbered in the margin and shall be signed by at least one of the Counsel who attends at the hearing of the Appeal, or by the party himself if he conducts his Appeal in person.

25. The case shall consist of paragraphs numbered consecutively and shall state, as concisely as possible, the circumstances out of

which the Appeal arises, the contentions to be urged by the party lodging the same, and the reasons of appeal. References by page and line to the relevant portions of the Record as printed shall, as far as practicable, be printed in the margin, and care shall be taken to avoid, as far as possible, the reprinting in the Case of long extracts from the Record. The taxing officer, in taxing the costs of the Appeal, shall, either of his own motion, or at the instance of the opposite party, inquire into any unnecessary prolixity in the Case, and shall disallow the costs occasioned thereby.

26. Where the Judicial Committee directs a party to bear the costs of an Appeal incurred in the State of Johore, such costs shall be taxed by the proper officer of the Court in accordance with the rules for the time being regulating taxation in the Court.

27. The Court shall conform with, and execute any Order which His Majesty in Council may think fit to make on an Appeal from a judgment of the Court in like manner as any original judgment of the Court should or might have been executed.

28. Nothing in these Rules contained shall be deemed to interfere with the rights of His Majesty, upon the humble Petition of any person aggrieved by any judgment of the Court, to admit his Appeal therefrom upon such conditions as His Majesty in Council shall think fit to impose.

#### APPENDIX.

I. Records and Cases in Appeals to His Majesty in Council shall be printed in the form known as Demy Quarto.

II. The size of the paper used shall be such that the sheet, when folded and trimmed, will be 11 inches in height and 8½ inches in width.

III. The type to be used in the text shall be Pica type, but Long Primer shall be used in printing accounts, tabular matter, and notes.

IV. The number of lines in each page of Pica type shall be 47 or thereabouts and every tenth line shall be numbered in the margin.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme, bearing date the 20th day of January, 1921, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the



Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to each of the following Benefices, namely, the Church and Cure (being a Rectory) of Grove, and the Church and Cure (being a Vicarage) of Wing, both in the County of Buckingham and in the Diocese of Oxford:

"Whereas by the Will dated the 13th day of May, 1920, of the late Right Honourable Harriet Sarah, Baroness Wantage, the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to each of the said Benefices was devised to the Bishop for the time being of the Diocese in which such Benefices were situate at the time of her death:

"And whereas the said Benefices were at the time of the death of the said Harriet Sarah, Baroness Wantage, and now are situate in the said Diocese of Oxford:

"And whereas Arthur Thomas Loyd, of Lockinge House, Wantage, in the County of Berks, Esquire, the Right Honourable David Alexander Edward, Earl of Crawford and Balcarres, Robert Henry Benson, of Number 26, Old Broad Street, in the City of London, Merchant, Guy Holford Benson, of Number 26, Old Broad Street aforesaid, Merchant, and Lady Jane Evelyn Lindsay, of Burcote Grange, Oxford, Spinster, are the Executors of the said Will in whom, but for the hereinbefore recited devise the said Advowsons would now be vested and they are desirous with a view to the confirmation of the said devise that the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to each of the said Benefices should be transferred to and be vested in the Bishop for the time being of the said Diocese of Oxford in the manner hereinafter recommended and proposed:

"And whereas the Right Reverend Hubert Murray, now Bishop of Oxford, is willing to accept such transfer, and in token of such his willingness and also in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop of the Diocese which by the Acts in the hereinbefore mentioned Act recited or by some or one of them is made necessary, he, the said Hubert Murray, Bishop of Oxford, has executed this Scheme as hereinafter mentioned:

"And whereas the transfer of the Patronage of the said Benefices which is hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed will in our opinion tend to make better provision for the cure of souls in the Parishes or Districts in or in respect of which the right of Patronage or Advowson so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid arises or exists, that is to say, in the Parishes of Grove and Wing:

"Now, therefore, with the consents of the said Arthur Thomas Loyd, The Right Honourable David Alexander Edward, Earl of Crawford and Balcarres, Robert Henry Benson, Guy Holford Benson and Lady Jane Evelyn Lindsay (in testimony whereof they have signed and sealed this Scheme), and with the consent of the said Hubert Murray, Bishop of Oxford (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme and sealed the same with his Episcopal Seal), and by way of confirmation of the hereinbefore recited devise by the Will of the said Baroness Wantage, we, the said Ecclesias-

tical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to each of the said Benefices shall be transferred to the said Hubert Murray, Bishop of Oxford, and his successors in the same Bishopric, and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Hubert Murray, Bishop of Oxford, and by his successors in the same Bishopric for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Oxford.

**W**HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Act, 1919, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme, bearing date the 20th day of January, 1921, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Act, 1919, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of two neighbouring Benefices, that is to say the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Beighton and the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Moulton (Saint Mary) both of which Benefices are situate in the County of Norfolk and in the Diocese of Norwich:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Bertram, Bishop of Norwich, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Act, 1919, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Beighton and Moulton (Saint Mary) duly made their report to the said Bishop of Norwich and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the

said Bishop of Norwich signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Report, but with the assent of the said Bishop of Norwich embodying certain modifications thereof:

"And whereas both of the said Benefices of Beighton and Moulton (Saint Mary) are now full, the Reverend Ralph William Nevill being the present Incumbent thereof:

"And whereas the said Ralph William Nevill has consented to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, if and when the union which is hereinafter recommended and proposed shall take effect:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Bertram, Bishop of Norwich (in testimony whereof he has hereunto set his hand), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That the said Benefice of Beighton and the said Benefice of Moulton (Saint Mary) shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Beighton with Moulton,' and that the Parishes of the said Benefices shall also be united into one Parish for ecclesiastical purposes, and for such other purposes as in the said Act provided.

"2. That the Church of the Parish of Beighton shall be the Parish Church of the United Parish and the Table of Fees for the said Parish of Beighton shall (until revised or altered by proper authority) be the Table of Fees for the United Parish.

"3. That upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect, and the said Ralph William Nevill, if he is then Incumbent of the said Benefices of Beighton and Moulton (Saint Mary) shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"4. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Beighton shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"5. That after the said union has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present and nominate to the United Benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say:—that in each series of three successive turns of presentation for ever thereafter the Patron of the said Benefice of Beighton shall have the first and third turns and the Patron of the said Benefice of Moulton (Saint Mary) shall have the second turn.

"Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been published locally in the manner prescribed in the Statutory Rules made under the said Act and also transmitted in the manner so prescribed to the Patrons affected together with a Notice in each case requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or trans-

mitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the same Rules:

And whereas certain objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners by the Patron of the said Benefice of Beighton:

"Provided that any charges (including any increase of existing charges) imposed or authorized to be imposed on the revenue of the College, whether for College or for University purposes, by any amending Statute made by the College on or after December 1, 1919, and subsequently approved by His Majesty in Council, shall, in the event of any deficiency of the revenues of the College in any year, be postponed to any charges for University purposes imposed or authorized by any Statute in force on November 30, 1919, and not subsequently repealed, or made by the College on or before November 20, 1919, and subsequently approved by His Majesty in Council.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

1. The restrictions on movement of swine imposed by the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908 and the Suffolk (Swine-Fever) Order of 1914 shall not apply to the movement of swine from the sale mentioned in the Schedule hereto to any premises in Great Britain not being a Swine-Fever Infected Place, if the swine are accompanied by a licence in the Form F set forth in the First Schedule to the said Order of 1908, granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the county of Suffolk, and the following conditions, which shall be specified in the licence, are complied with:—

(i) The swine shall be moved to the place of destination specified in the licence and not elsewhere, and shall be there detained and kept separate from all other swine for twenty-eight days, unless they are slaughtered on such premises before the expiration of that period, or are moved under and in accordance with the conditions of a licence, in the Form C set forth in the said First Schedule, to a bacon factory or slaughterhouse in the same Scheduled Area.

(ii) The swine shall be moved by the nearest available route without unnecessary delay, and during the movement shall, so far as is practicable, be kept separate from all swine not being moved with a licence under this Order.

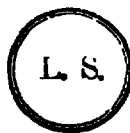
(iii) After completion of the movement the licence shall forthwith be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest police-station in the same district by the person in charge of the swine at the time of completing such movement.

2. A copy of a licence issued under this Order shall be sent by the Inspector granting the same to the Local Authority of the district

in which the place of destination specified in the licence is situate.

3. A licence under this Order shall for the purposes of the above-mentioned Orders be treated as a licence under those Orders.

## AGRICULTURAL WAGES DISTRICT COMMITTEES IN WALES.

1.
