## " PART II.

" Headmasters, Royal Marines, ranking with Commissioned Officers from Warrant Rank, and Chief Schoolmasters, Royal Marines, having the relative rank of Lieutenant, Royal Navy, to enter the appropriate scales with seniority 1st February, 1919, or date of promotion to their respective ranks, whichever is the later date.

" Royal Marines Schoolmasters below the rank of Headmaster to count all time less six months towards the scale laid down."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

## PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by an enactment shortly entitled "The Courts Enactment, 1920," enacted by His Highness the Sultan of Johore in Council, it was, amongst other things, provided that an Appeal might be made to His Majesty in Council, subject to such rules and regulations as might from time to time be prescribed by order of His Majesty in Council, from any judgment or order in any civil matter of the Court of Appeal of the said State of Johore constituted by the said enactment:

And whereas it is expedient to make such rules and regulations as aforesaid for Appeals from the Court of Appeal of the State of Johore to His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, it is hereby ordered by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Johore Appeals Order in Council, 1921.

2. This Order shall come into effect on and from a day to be appointed in that behalf by His Highness the Sultan of Johore in Executive Council, which shall be notified by proclamation to be published in the Gazette of the State of Johore.

3. His Majesty in Council may at any time alter, add to, or revoke this Order. And the Right Honourable Winston Spencer Churchill, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, is to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

## SCHEDULE.

1. In these Rules, unless the context otherwise requires:—

" Appeal " means Appeal to His Majesty in Council.

" His Majesty " includes His Majesty's Heirs and Successors.

" Judgment " includes decree, order or decisions.

" Court " means either the Full Court or a single Judge of the Court of Appeal of the State of Johore according as the matter in question is one which, under the Rules and practice of the said Court of Appeal, properly appertains to the Full Court or to a single Judge.

" Record " means the aggregate of papers relating to an Appeal (including the pleadings, proceedings, evidence and judgments) proper to be laid before His Majesty in Council on the hearing of the Appeal.

" Registrar " means the Registrar or other proper officer having the custody of the Records in the Court appealed from.

" Month " means calendar month.

Words in the singular include the plural, and words in the plural include the singular.

2. Subject to the provisions of these Rules, an Appeal shall lie:—

(a) As of right, from any final judgment of the Court, where the matter in dispute on the Appeal amounts to or is of the value of 500*l.* sterling or upwards, or where the Appeal involves, directly or indirectly, some claim or question to or respecting property or some civil right amounting to or of the value of 500*l.* sterling or upwards; and

(b) At the discretion of the Court, from any other judgment of the Court, whether final or interlocutory, if, in the opinion of the Court, the question involved in the Appeal is one which, by reason of its great general or public importance, or otherwise, ought to be submitted to His Majesty in Council for decision.

3. Where owing to the Court being equally divided in opinion the decision appealed against stands, such decision shall, for the purpose of an Appeal therefrom, be deemed to be a final judgment of the Court.

4. Applications to the Court for leave to appeal shall be made by motion or petition within 21 days from the date of the judgment to be appealed from, and the Appli-
