

“ Provided that any charges (including any increase of existing charges) imposed or authorized to be imposed on the revenue of the College, whether for College or for University purposes, by any amending Statute made by the College on or after December 1, 1919, and subsequently approved by His Majesty in Council, shall, in the event of any deficiency of the revenues of the College in any year, be postponed to any charges for University purposes imposed or authorized by any Statute in force on November 30, 1919, and not subsequently repealed, or made by the College on or before November 20, 1919, and subsequently approved by His Majesty in Council.
