Awarded the Distinguished Service Order. Maj. John Robert Mutchison, 38th Cent. India. Horse, I.A.

On the 24th April, 1920, when Semakh was heavily attacked by Arab tribesmen and Bedouins, Major Hutchison displayed great ability in the organisation of the few troops at his disposal for the defence of an extended area.

The situation was for some time critical, and the small garrison in danger of being overcome. It was due to this officer's able handling of the situation that the attack was definitely repulsed before reinforcements could reach him.

Awarded a Bar to the Military Cross.

Capt. Dysart Edward Whitworth, M.C., 2nd

For gallantry and coolness on April 22nd, 1920, when on a reconnaissance in the Jordan Valley with about 85 lances, he was surrounded by a horde of 500-600 armed Bedouin. He withdrew fighting to Beisau village, just in time to prevent the Bedouin seizing it. The situation became critical until the numerous exits had been secured. Subsequent repeated attacks by the Arabs in greatly superior numbers were repulsed. Captain Whitworth's coolness and able handling of his weak force undoubtedly largely contributed to the saving of Beisan village and railway station.

# Awarded the Military Cross.

Lt. William Henry Lloyd, 10th Bn., Midd'x R. (T.F.), attd. R.C. of Sigs.

For gallantry and devotion to duty at Beisan on the 22nd April, 1920, when that village was being attacked by the Ghazzawiyeh tribe. This officer had arrived at Beisan station in the morning with the intention of laying a telephone line. Early in the afternoon the village was attacked in large numbers. He at once organised the few men in the vicinity and beat off a tentative attack made on the station about an hour later, and then proceeded to lay a cable to the village under cover of 6 sowars, in spite of fierce fighting taking place at other exits, and which might have had to be encountered on his route.

Throughout the ensuing night he displayed resource and energy in sending up rations and ammunition to the defence and in the operations of the next two days in obtaining communication with Semakh.

For gallantry and devotion to duty during a fire at the Arsenal at St. Thomas's Mount (India) on the night of 18/19th June, 1920. These soldiers were the first to undertake the removal of the bombs from the immediate vicinity of the flames, which they continued to do until ordered to rejoin the guard. The work was of a highly dangerous nature, involving risks of explosion.

For gallantry and devotion to duty during a fire in an ammunition store shed at Basra on 3rd July, 1919.

These N.C.Os., by a total disregard of personal danger, materially assisted in averting what might have proved a serious disaster, by dismantling stacks and boxes of phosphorus and incendiary shells, some of which were actually burning. In spite of the fumes and risk of burns and explosion, they continued the work of removal until the bay of the store was cleared.
