#### PRESENT.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS there was this day read at Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 3rd day of March, 1921 (C.W. 323/21), in the words following, viz. :-

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, inter alia, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions, and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas Your Majesty was graciously pleased by Your Order in Council of the 22nd January, 1920, to sanction, inter alia, revised rates of Command Money for Officers in command of individual ships of Your Majesty's Fleet and to authorize the payment of Entertainment Allowance to Captains and Commanders appointed in command:

"And whereas we consider that at our discretion all or any of the Officers who may be placed in command of groups of vessels of Your Majesty's Fleet should receive payment of command money together with Entertaining Allowance, where appropriate:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to authorize us to grant at our discretion, and with effect as from the 1st July, 1920, Command Money and Entertaining Allowance at the rates laid down in Your Majesty's Order in Council of the 22nd January, 1920, to such of the Officers in command of groups of vessels as we may think proper, seagoing or harbour rates to be payable as follows:

Command of groups of Seagoing rates. submarines in full commission.

Command of groups of Seagoing vessels, other than submarines, in full commission.

Harbour rates. according the nature of the employment.

or

Command of groups of Harbour rates except ships in Reserve Commission (includ-Reserve ing submarines).

Commanders who hold sea-going posts.

"The allowances hereby authorized to be additional to the Command Money and Entertaining Allowance issuable in respect of individual ships in the group, and, in the case of Captains, to be at such of the rates authorized for that rank as may to the Admiralty appear appropriate in each instance:

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, inter alia, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions, and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas Your Majesty was graciously pleased by Your Order in Council bearing date the 22nd day of January, 1920, to approve, inter alia, of the following revised rates of pay for Mates and Lieutenants serving in the Royal Navy on the 1st May, 1919, to take effect from the 1st February, 1919, viz.:—

"And whereas we are of opinion that these rates are inadequate for the Officers promoted to the rank of Mate prior to the 1st January, 1920, as most of these Officers were considerably over the normal age at the time of their promotion:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to authorize us, at our discretion, to grant the following revised rates, with effect from the 1st January, 1920, to Mates, and to Lieutenants promoted from Mate, who were on the List on the 18th December, 1920, and who were promoted to the rank of Mate prior to the 1st January, 1920:—

#### PRESENT.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 4th day of March, 1921 (N.P. (1) 1053/1921), in the words following, viz.:—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, inter alia, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions, and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas during the war with Germany allowances under the designation of Children's Allowance and Separation Allowance were granted in respect of the maintenance of the families of married and widower officers and men."

"And whereas by Section 10 of Schedule V to Your Majesty's Order in Council bearing date the 22nd day of January, 1920, the said allowances were abolished as regards Officers as from the 1st day of January, 1920:

"And whereas by Your Majesty's Order in Council bearing date the 13th day of August, 1920, it was decided that the Separation Allowance previously paid in respect of ratings and ranks of the Royal Navy and Royal Marines below Officer should be replaced as from the 7th day of October, 1920, by a new allowance styled Marriage Allowance:

"And whereas in consequence of these arrangements ratings and ranks below Officer became liable to serious loss on promotion to Warrant rank notwithstanding generally

higher rates of pay accorded to Warrant Officers:

"And whereas we are of opinion that any rating or rank who is married or a widower with a child or children should, on promotion to Warrant rank, if his emoluments before promotion exceeded the minimum pay of his rank as a Warrant Officer, be allowed at our discretion to enter the scale of pay appropriate to his Warrant rank at a special rate not exceeding the maximum:

"And whereas in view of the urgency of the matter an Order to this effect was issued to the Fleet on the 20th day of November, 1920:

"And whereas we are further of opinion. that subject to certain conditions a similar concession should be made at our discretion to married and widower Warrant Officers promoted before the 20th day of November, 1920, even though their promotion may have occurred before the introduction of Separation Allowance and may not have entailed less at

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to empower us at our discretion to grant special rates of pay to Warrant Officers with effect from dates not earlier than the 1st day of January, 1920, in accordance with the regulations set forth in the Schedule annexed hereto.

" The Commissioners of Your Lords Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals.

#### "SCHEDULE.

"Rules applicable to Warrant Officers promoted on or after 20th November, 1920.

"(1) A Warrant Officer promoted to that rank after the 20th November, 1920, who can show that his daily emoluments (calculated in the manner prescribed in paragraph (2) below) as a rating on the day preceding the date of his promotion, exceeded his daily rate of full pay as a Warrant Officer on the ordinary scale, may be paid at a special rate of full pay determined in the manner prescribed in paragraph (5) hereunder.

"(2) The daily emoluments as a rating, on which the comparison between emoluments as a rating and as an Officer is to be made for the purpose of these regulations, are as follow:

(a) Substantive Pay;(b) Non-Substantive Pay;

c) Badge Pay;

(d) Kit Upkeep Allowance;

(e) Marriage Allowance,

at the rates payable on the day preceding that of promotion to Warrant rank.

- "Rules applicable to Warrant Officers promoted before the 20th November, 1920.
- "(3) A Warrant Officer promoted before the 20th November, 1920, who can show that his daily emoluments (calculated in the manner prescribed in paragraph (4) below) as a rating on the day preceding the date of his promotion, either exceeded or would have exceeded his daily emoluments as a Warrant Officer if the rates of pay, non-substantive pay and allowances applicable on the 20th November, 1920, had been then in force, may be paid at a special rate of pay determined in the manner pre-

scribed in paragraph (5) below.

"(4) The daily emoluments as a rating, on which the comparison between emoluments as a rating and as an Officer is to be made for the purpose of these regulations, are to be determined as follow:

(a) Substantive Pay calculated on rating and seniority on the day preceding that of promotion to Warrant rank, but at the rates in force on the 20th November, 1920.

(b) Non-Substantive Pay as payable on the day preceding that of promotion to Warrant rank, but at the rates in force on the

20th November, 1920.

(c) Badge Pay calculated on Badges held on the day preceding that of promotion to Warrant rank, but at the rates in force on the 20th November, 1920.

(d) Kit Upkeep Allowance calculated at the daily equivalent of the rate, if any, actually payable to the rating on the day preceding that of promotion to Warrant rank.

(e) Marriage Allowance

(i) Officers promoted before the 1st

January, 1920.

The allowance is in all cases to be calculated in respect of the wife and children under 14 years of age, if any, living on the 31st December, 1919, whether the Officer was married before the date of his promotion or not, and at the rates in force on the 20th November, 1920;

(ii) Officers promoted on or after the 1st January, 1920, but before the 20th November, 1920.

The allowance is in all cases to be calculated in respect of the wife and children under 14 years of age, if any, living on the day preceding the date of promotion and at the rates in force on the 20th November, **192**0.

"Rules applicable to all Warrant Officers.

(5) The special rate of pay may be either

(a) a sum equal to the daily emoluments, calculated in the manner prescribed in paragraph (2) or paragraph (4), whichever be applicable, of the Officer on the day preceding his promotion whenever the total of such daily emoluments is a multiple of sixpence,

(b) a sum equal to the next multiple of sixpence above such daily emoluments whenever the total thereof is not a multiple of

sixpence,

subject to the proviso that, where the special rate thus determined is in excess of the maximum rate of full pay prescribed for the Officer's rank under the Order in Council of the 22nd January, 1920, the special rate shall not exceed that maximum.

"(6) (a) Allowances in respect of qualifications which are payable continuously with the ordinary rates of full pay as Warrant Officer (e.g., Dagger Allowance) are not to be paid concurrently with the special rate.

(b) Allowances which depend upon the performance of special duties, such as Command Money and Store Allowance, or which are of a compensatory nature, such as Lodging Money and Provision Allowance, may be paid concurrently with the special rate.

"(7) An Officer in receipt of a special rate of pay shall not be granted any increment of pay until such time as under ordinary regulations he may become eligible by length of service as Warrant Officer for a higher rate on the normal scale.

"(8) An Officer, however, in receipt of a special rate of pay under these regulations who, after the date of the award thereof, may qualify for an allowance in respect of qualifications (e.g., Dagger Allowance) may be permitted to receive the normal rate of full pay appropriate to his rank and seniority together with the allowance, whenever such payment becomes more to his advantage than the special rate of pay.

"(9) A special rate of pay under these regulations shall not be granted to any Warrant Officer from a date earlier than the 1st January, 1920, or the date of his promotion to Warrant rank, whichever be the later date."

#### PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, inter alia, that all pay, wages, pensions, bounty money, grants, or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in His Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an officer, seaman, or marine, or to the widow or any relative of a deceased officer, seaman, or marine, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions, and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

And whereas by Sub-Section (1) of Section 2 of the Ministry of Pensions Act, 1916, as amended by Section 1 of the War Pensions Act, 1920, it is enacted, inter alia, that there shall be transferred to the Minister of Pensions the powers and duties of the Admiralty with respect to pensions and grants to persons who have served as officers or men, and to their widows, children, and other dependants, and to persons who have been employed in the nursing service of any of His Majesty's Naval Forces, other than service pensions, so far as such pensions and grants are payable out of moneys provided by Parliament and not provided exclusively for the purpose of Greenwich Hospital, and so far as such powers and duties relate to pensions and grants to which the War Pensions Acts apply, and that His Majesty may by Order in Council make such adaptations in the enactments relating to such powers and duties as aforesaid as may be necessary to make them exercisable by the Minister of Pensions (hereinafter referred to as "the Minister '') and his officers:

'And whereas certain' Regulations were September, 1917, giving sanction to the pensions and grants which might be awarded to commissioned and subordinate officers of His Majesty's Naval, Coastguard, Marine, and Reserve Forces disabled, and to the families of such officers deceased, and to members of His Majesty's Nursing Service disabled, in consequence of the Great War (hereinafter referred to as "the war"):

And whereas it has been represented to His Majesty by the Minister of Pensions that it is desirable to make further provision concerning such pensions and grants:

And whereas the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury have signified their con-

currence in these proposals:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, having taken the said proposals into consideration, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve thereof and to sanction the grant of pensions, allowances and gratuities to such officers and nurses disabled, and to the families of such officers and nurses deceased, whose claims arise in respect of service during the war, on the scales and subject to the conditions set forth in the Regulations hereto annexed, in substitution for those laid down in the Order in Council of 29th September, 1917, with effect (subject to the provisions of the Fifth Schedule to the said Regulations) from the 1st day of April, 1920, and further, to empower the Minister of Pensions to make or revise grants under previous Orders in respect of any claims which may have arisen between the outbreak of the war and the aforesaid 1st day of April, 1920: Provided always that, if more favourable to the officer or nurse, the pension, allowance, or gratuity payable under existing regulations shall be granted, and no grant to an officer or nurse, or to the family of an officer, shall be re-assessed to their disadvantage; and provided further that any widow, child, or dependant of an officer pro-moted during the war from a rank or rating below that of a commissioned officer from warrant rank shall not be less favourably treated than if he had continued to serve in the lower. rank.

#### REGULIATIONS.

#### PART I.—OFFICERS DISABLED.

An officer who retires, relinquishes his commission, or reverts to the Retired, Reserve. or Emergency List on account of medical unfitness certified as either attributable to or aggra-vated by naval or military service during the war, and not being due to his serious negligence or misconduct, may, subject to Article 8, be granted the retired pay shown in columns 3 to 7 of Part I. of the First Schedule to these Regulations which corresponds to the degree of his disablement as certified:

## Provided that-

(1) If the officer (other than an officer to whom the Order in Council of the 13th October, 1920, applies) holds a permanent commission in the Royal Navy or Royal Marines, he may be

#### (a) If he retires,—

(i) The retired pay (other than the halfpay rate for his rank and seniority) or gratuity for which he is eligible under Section IX. of Schedule V. to the Order in Council of the 22nd January, 1920, together with an addition as in column 8 of Part I. of the First Schedule hereto; or

(ii) If eligible therefor, the annual sum set forth in Part II. of the First Schedule hereto, together with an addition as in column 8 of Part I. of that Schedule; or

(iii) The half-pay of his rank and seniority as laid down in Section VII. of Schedule V. to the aforesaid Order, without any addition whatsoever,

whichever be applicable and to the officer's

advantage; and

(b) If he reverts to the retired list, his service retired pay, or such retired pay reassessed under the said Order in Council of the 22nd January, 1920, together with an addition (unless retired pay is re-assessed at the half-pay rate), as in column 8 of Part 1. of the First Schedule to these Regulations, and, if the officer has been promoted before being pronounced permanently unfit to a higher rank than that for which such service retired pay was awarded, a further addition corresponding to the difference between the retired pay under columns 3 to 7 of Part 1. of the First Schedule hereto appropriate to the rank for which such service retired pay was awarded and the retired pay under such columns appropriate to the highest rank in which he served during the war.

(2) If the officer was promoted during the war to a temporary commission in the Royal Marines or the Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve from a warrant rank of the Royal Navy or Royal Marines or from a seaman or marine serving on a long service engagement, or from a pensioner of either Force, he may be granted the retired pay or gratuity for which he is eligible under Section IX. of Schedule V. to the Order in Council of 22nd January, 1920, or the service pension of which he is in receipt, with an addition for his disability as in column 8 of Part I. of the First Schedule hereto.

(3) If the officer is in receipt of a wounds pension, he may be granted in addition thereto

only-

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(a) the retired pay for which he would have been eligible under the Regulations in force before the commencement of the war, or (if not eligible therefor) at a rate equal to his half-pay under those Regulations, with an addition (subject to conditions and limitations approved by the Minister) not exceeding 20 per cent. of such retired pay and the

wounds pension; or (b) if he is an officer to whom proviso (1)(a) of this Article applies, the retired pay, annual sum, or gratuity, for which he is eligible under (i) or (ii) of that paragraph, but without the addition therein referred to;

(c) if he is an officer to whom proviso (1) (b) of this Article applies, the service retired pay therein referred to without the addition; or

(d) if he is an officer to whom proviso (2) of this Article applies, the retired pay, service pension, or gratuity for which he is eligible thereunder, without the addition; or

(e) the difference between the wounds pension and the retired pay to which the officer would be entitled under these Regulations if

he was not in receipt of wounds pension; whichever be applicable and to the officer's

advantage

(4) If the officer has lost the sight of both eyes as the result of wounds received in action, he shall be granted not less than £300 a year in wounds pension and retired pay taken together.

(5) If the officer is in receipt of retired pay or pension for a disability other than that in respect of which the claim under these Regulations arises, such retired pay or pension

(a) in consequence of service prior to the

(b) greater, by reason of length of service, than the disability pension he would have received as a seaman or marine for his rank

he may be granted in addition thereto the retired pay as in column 8 of the First Schedule hereto, which corresponds to the degree of disablement sustained in the war as an officer.

(6) If the officer is in receipt of pension for a disability sustained in the war as a seaman or marine, and other than that in respect of which the claim under these Regulations arises, such pension being not greater, by reason of length of service, than the disability pension he would have received for rank alone, he may be granted in addition thereto the retired pay shown in columns 3 to 7 of Part I of the First Schedule hereto appropriate to the difference between the disablement due to his combined disabilities and the disablement due to his disability sustained as a seaman or marine.

(7) If the officer's combined retired pay (or pension or gratuity) and addition under provisos (1), (2), (5), or (6) should at any time be less than the retired pay to which he is entitled under columns 3 to 7 of Part I of the First Schedule hereto, he may be granted such retired pay in lieu of such combined retired pay (or pension or gratuity) and addition.

(8) Subject to the preceding provisos, if the officer is already in receipt of pension or retired pay as a seaman, marine, or officer, it shall be suspended so long as he is receiving a higher

rate under these Regulations.

 If an officer on or after demobilisation, or on or after retirement, or relinquishing his commission, or transfer to or reversion to the Retired, Reserve or Emergency List, otherwise than for misconduct or in circumstances which do not, in the opinion of the Minister, justify the award, is certified to be disabled by wounds, injuries or disease attributable to or aggravated by naval or military service during the war, such disablement not having been caused or aggravated by his serious negligence or misconduct, he may be granted retired pay under Article 1 or gratuity under Article 8 of these Regulations, with effect from the date from which his claim is established. But the benefit of proviso (1) to Article 1 shall only be granted if the officer is certified to have been permanently unfit for general service on his retirement or reversion

1B. Except in those cases where the disablement has reached its final condition, a grant of retired pay shall be temporary, at the rate appropriate to the temporary disablement, and the grant shall be reviewed from time to time until a permanent assessment can be made or

the grant ceases.

2.—(1) In cases of pecuniary need the Minister may, at his discretion, grant to a disabled officer who is in receipt of or eligible for retired pay under these Regulations an education allowance not exceeding £80 a year in respect of each child above the age of 8. The continuance of the allowance shall depend upon the continuance of the retired pay and on the Minister being satisfied as to the education the child is receiving.

(2) In any case in which, in the opinion of the Minister, it may become necessary to secure the proper care of a child on behalf of whom an education allowance is payable, the allowance instead of being paid to the parent may be administered under such conditions as the Mini-

ster may determine.

3.—(1) An officer in receipt of retired pay under Article 1 of these Regulations, or of a wounds pension in lieu thereof, whose pre-war

earnings (excluding any addition thereto under paragraph (b) of Article 30 (5)) exceeded £132 a year and who, within one year from the 2nd July, 1920, or one year after the notification to him of the first award of retired pay under Article 1, whichever is the later date, shall prove to the satisfaction of the Minister the amount of his pre-war earnings, may, at the same time or at any time thereafter, make application for alternative retired pay, and if he shows that his retired pay together with any wounds pension of which he is in receipt, and together with the average earnings of which he remains capable, are less than his proved prewar earnings, he may be granted alternative retired pay in lieu of retired pay or retired pay and wounds pension.

Alternative retired pay may be granted temporarily or permanently, and shall be of an amount which, together with any wounds pension of which the officer is in receipt and together with the average earnings (if any) of which he is judged capable, shall not exceed his pre-war earnings up to £300 a year plus half any pre-war earnings between £300 and £600

a year; provided that—

(a) in assessing the average earnings (if any) of which an officer remains capable any decrease thereof not due to the disablement for which the officer is in receipt of retired pay or wounds pension shall be disregarded, and the refusal or neglect to undergo any course of treatment or training which in the opinion of the Minister would materially increase the officer's earning capacity may be taken into account: and

taken into account; and
(b) where owing to physical incapacity or
other cause over which the officer had no control he has been unable to prove the amount
of his pre-war earnings within the time above
specified the Minister may, in his discretion,

extend such time.

(2) Alternative retired pay shall be payable as from the date from which the claim thereto is established.

(3) Where, in the opinion of the Minister, it may become necessary to secure the proper care of a child of an officer in receipt of alternative retired pay, the Minister may deduct from the alternative retired pay such sum as he may deem sufficient for the maintenance of such child, and may administer the same under such conditions as he may determine.

4.—(1) When permanent retired pay has been granted, it shall not be altered on account of any change in the officer's earning capacity, whether resulting from training or other cause; neither shall it be subject to review except—

(a) when an officer whose retired pay is assessed under Article 1 of these Regulations claims that there has been a substantial increase in the extent of the disablement due to the original cause;

(b) when an officer whose retired pay is assessed under Article 1 of these Regulations, and who has duly proved his pre-war earnings as provided by Article 3 shows that it would be more advantageous to him to be assessed under that Article; or

(c) under the following subsection or under

Article 30a or 30b.

(2) The Minister may at any time order the review of any retired pay in any case where—

(a) retired pay has, by error in interpretation or fact, been granted to a disabled officer in excess of the amount appropriate to the degree of his disablement;

(b) the Minister has reason to believe that

retired pay has been obtained by any improper means; or

 $(\hat{c})$  retired pay has been granted by error.

5. Half the retired pay awarded under the preceding Articles may be subject to the condition that the disabled officer shall undergo medical treatment in an institution or otherwise for any period during which it is certified that such treatment is necessary in his interests.

Such misconduct of the officer as shall render it necessary, in the discretion of the Minister, to discontinue treatment may be deemed to be

refusal to undergo treatment.

- 6. In any case where it is certified that an officer should undergo any course of medical treatment in an institution or otherwise for a disability which renders him eligible for retired pay or gratuity under Article 1 or 8 of these Regulations, he may be granted, for such period and subject to such conditions as the Minister may determine—
  - (a) retired pay at the rate for the highest degree of disablement (subject to any necessary adjustments in respect of wounds pension, retired pay or gratuity already awarded) for the purpose of undergoing the treatment which he is certified to require and whilst deemed unable in consequence to provide for his own support and that of his family, a deduction of such an amount as the Minister may determine being made from the officer's retired pay on account of the cost of his maintenance in the institution;

(b) if he is certified to require treatment which does not render him unable to provide for his own support and that of his family, but requires him to absent himself from his work on one or more occasions in the week, an allowance not exceeding £1 a week for the time he is required to absent himself;

(c) the necessary medical and other expenses and allowances incidental to the treatment of such disability up to such amount as the Minister may determine.

- 7. Where a constant attendant is necessary and the officer is disabled in the highest degree, there may be granted to or on behalf of the officer, under such conditions as the Minister may determine, an allowance not exceeding £100 a year. The allowance shall be in addition to any retired pay awarded under the foregoing Articles, or to any wounds pension in lieu thereof.
- 8. In any case where the degree of disablement is assessed at less than 20 per cent. or, in exceptional circumstances, where it is considered by the Minister more in the interests of the officer, a gratuity or temporary allowance may be granted in place of any retired pay under these Regulations. The grant will be subject to such conditions as the Minister may determine and its amount will not exceed £500 and will depend on the nature of the disablement and other circumstances of the case.
- 9. An officer who retires, relinquishes his commission, or reverts to the Retired, Reserve, or Emergency List on account of medical unfitness, such unfitness being neither attributable to nor aggravated by naval or military service, and not being due to the serious negligence or misconduct of the officer, may be granted a gratuity or temporary allowance. The grant will be subject to such conditions as the Minister may determine. In exceptional circumstances it may amount to a sum not exceeding £300, and generally it will depend on the extent to which the officer is incapaci-

tated and on the other circumstances of the

# PART II.—WIDOWS AND OTHER RELATIVES OF OFFICERS DECEASED.

10. Pensions and gratuities to the widows, children and relatives of deceased officers, for which provision is made in the following Articles, shall only be given as a reward of the officer's services, and no pension or gratuity shall be granted or continued to a deceased officer's widow or relative who, in the opinion of the Minister, is unworthy of a grant from public funds, and it shall be in the power of the Minister to terminate or suspend any pension that may have been granted to any such person or to provide for the administration of a pension or gratuity under such conditions as he may determine.

The widow of an officer may be granted—

 If the officer, otherwise than through his serious negligence or misconduct, and not being an officer of the Royal Marines on

shore strength-

(a) is killed in action, or suffers violent death due directly and wholly to war service, or is killed or dies of injuries sustained on flying duty or while being carried on duty in aircraft under proper authority, or is drowned while on duty, or dies as a result of the destruction of ship, or dies within seven years from wounds or injuries so received, or

(b) dies from illness which is certified as caused by extraordinary exposure or exertion on service within seven years after having been first removed from duty on

account of such illness, or

(c) dies in consequence of injuries received in the performance of naval or military duty otherwise than under (a) within seven years after having been

so injured,

and the widow is over 40 years of age, or has a child eligible for an allowance under the Article next following, a pension as in the second column of the Second Schedule hereto; but if the widow is not over 40 and has no child so eligible then a pension as in the third column of the said Schedule.

(2) If the officer, otherwise than through his serious negligence or misconduct, and being an officer of the Royal Marines on

shore strength-

(a) is killed in action, or suffers violent death due directly and wholly to war service, or is killed or dies of injuries sustained on flying duty or while being carried on duty in aircraft under proper authority, or dies within seven years from wounds or injuries so received, or

(b) dies from illness which is certified as directly traceable to fatigue, privation, or exposure incident to active operations in the field within seven years after having been first removed from duty on account

of such illness, or

(c) dies in consequence of injuries received in the performance of naval or military duty otherwise than under (a) within seven years after having been

so injured,

and the widow is over 40 years of age, or has a child eligible for an allowance under the Article next following, a pension as in the second column of the Second Schedule hereto; but if the widow is not over 40 and has no child so eligible then a pension as in the third column of the said Schedule.

(3) If the officer, otherwise than through his serious negligence or misconduct—

(a) dies of disease attributable to or aggravated by naval or military service other than under subsection (1) (b) or (2) (b) of this Article within seven years after having been first removed from duty on account of such disease, or

(b) dies of injuries attributable to naval or military service other than under subsection (1) (a), (1) (c), (2) (a) or (2) (c) of this Article, within seven years after having been first removed from duty on

account of such injuries, or

(c) not having been removed from duty for the disability, dies of a wound or injury within seven years of its receipt, or of a disease within seven years of the termination of his active service during the war: provided that a claim has been made and admitted in respect of such disability under Article 1 or 8 of these Regulations, and that such disability is certified as attributable to or aggravated by such service; or (if no such claim has been made and admitted) that, a continuous medical history being shown from the termination of such active service, the disability can be so certified,

and the widow is over 40 years of age, or has a child eligible for an allowance under the Article next following, a pension as in the fourth column of the Second Schedule hereto; but if the widow is not over 40 and has no child so eligible, then a pension as in the fifth column of the said Schedule.

(4) If the officer dies in the circumstances referred to in subsection (1) (a) or (2) (a) of this Article, a gratuity, in addition to pension, as in the sixth column of the Second Schedule hereto: provided that, where it would be more favourable to her the amount of the gratuity shall be equal to a year's full pay of the rank which the officer held on the 31st March, 1917, and for this purpose Officer's Command Money and other full-pay allowances, except Table Money and Field Allowance, shall be included.

12.—(1) The widow of an officer awarded a pension under the preceding Article may be granted a further allowance at the rate of £36 a year for each child maintained by her.

This allowance may be granted or continued up to the age of 18 in the case of sons and up to the age of 21 in the case of daughters, unless the child is otherwise provided for or marries, and may be granted or further continued after such ages in the case of children who are apprentices receiving not more than nominal wages, or are being educated at a secondary school, technical institute, or university.

school, technical institute, or university.

(2) The above allowance may also be granted or continued after the specified ages in very special cases in which it is shown (a) that the child became afflicted during the officer's lifetime with some mental or bodily infirmity rendering it dependent upon him and incapable of making adequate exertion for its own support; (b) that such incapacity dates from a period before the child reached the limit of age; and (c) that it is in distressed circumstances. The allowance may be granted or continued for such term as the Minister may decide.

(3) If the officer dies in the circumstances referred to in Article 11 (1) (a) or (2) (a) a gratuity of one-third of the amount laid down in Article 11 (4) may be granted, in addition to children's allowance, for each child.

(4) The widow of an officer awarded a pension under Article 11 or 13 may, if in pecuniary need, be granted, at the discretion of the Minister, an education allowance not exceeding £80 a year for each child above the age of 8. The continuance of the allowance shall depend on the Minister being satisfied as to the education the child is receiving.

(5) In any case in which, in the opinion of the Minister, it may become necessary to secure the proper care of a child on behalf of whom an allowance is payable, the allowance, instead of being paid to the widow, may be administered under such conditions as the Minister may

determine.

13.—(1) A widow who-

(a) is over 40 years of age or has a child eligible for an allowance under the preceding Article,

(b) is in receipt of a pension under Article 11 of these Regulations, and

(c) makes application and shows that she was married to the officer before the commencement of the war or of his naval or military service, whichever was the later, and that her pension under Article 11 with any children's allowances under Article 12 (1), and (2) and any pension under Article 17 in respect of the officer is, or eventually may be, less than two-thirds of the alternative retired pay that might have been awarded to her husband under Article 3 had he survived and been incapable of supplementing that retired pay by earnings

may be granted, in lieu of such pension and such children's allowances and pension, an alternative pension (which shall not exceed twothirds of such alternative retired pay) up to a

maximum of £300 a year: provided-

(i) that application shall be made within one year from the 2nd July, 1920, or one year after notification to the widow of the award of pension under Article 11, whichever is the later;

(ii) that such widow's pension under Article 11 (together with any such children's allowances and pension) shall, if greater than the alternative pension assessed under this sub-section, continue until it becomes

less than the alternative pension;

(iii) that if a widow to whom an alternative pension has been granted under this sub-section ceases to be eligible for a pension under this sub-section, but would be eligible for a pension under Sub-section (2) of this Article, her alternative pension shall cease to be calculated under this sub-section and shall be thenceforth calculated under that sub-section; and

(iv) that the provision in Article 3 (3) of these Regulations to secure the proper care of a child shall apply in the case of any pension awarded under this sub-section.

(2) A widow who

(a) is not over 40 years of age and has no child eligible for an allowance under the preceding Article,
(b) is in receipt of a pension under

Article 11, and

(c) makes application and shows that she was married to the officer before the com-

mencement of the war or of his naval or military service, whichever was the later. and that her pension under Article 11 with any pension under Article 17 in respect of the officer is, or eventually may be, less than one-half of the alternative retired pay that might have been awarded to her husband under Article 3 had he survived and been incapable of supplementing that retired pay by earnings,

may be granted, in lieu of such pension, an alternative pension (which shall not exceed onehalf of such alternative retired pay) up to a maximum of £225 a year: provided-

(i) that application shall be made within one year from the 2nd July, 1920, or one year after the notification to the widow of the award of pension under Article 11, whichever is the later:

(ii) that such widow's pension under Article 11 (together with any pension under Article 17) shall, if greater than the alternative pension assessed under this sub-section, continue until it becomes less than the alternative pension; and

(iii) that when the widow reaches the age of 40 the alternative pension may be raised from one-half of such alternative retired pay to two-thirds thereof up to a maximum of

£300 a year.

(3) If the officer's pre-war earnings (exclusive of the addition under Article 30 (5) (b), were less than £132 a year, his pre-war earnings (inclusive of such addition) may be substituted for the alternative retired pay in the preceding sub-sections of this Article.

(4) Any pension under Article 17 shall be deducted from a widow's alternative pension.

14. The widow of an officer not eligible for pension under Article 11 may be granted a gratuity of not less than one and not more than three years' pay of the appointment held by the officer: provided that-

(a) the officer dies during the war, while on full pay, or, after removal from full pay, from the injury or disease for which he was removed from full pay or some closely connected disease, and there is a continuous

medical history of sickness; and (b) the widow is disqualified only through the insufficiency of the officer's service for an ordinary pension under the terms of the King's Regulations and Admiralty Instruc-

tions.

The amount of the gratuity, within the above limits, shall be at the discretion of the Minister, and may be paid in a lump sum or in instalments as he may determine. In the event of the officer leaving motherless children, a similar grant may be made to them under such conditions as the Minister may determine.

15. Any pension granted to the widow of an officer under these Regulations shall cease on her re-marriage; but in the event of her again becoming a widow, her pension (subject to adjustment under Article 30A) may be restored, wholly or in part, if she is otherwise qualified, and if in the opinion of the Minister her pecuniary circumstances are such as to justify the restoration. Allowances for children under Article 12 may be paid after re-marriage.

16.—(1) The widow of an officer who was at the time of his death (not being due to his serious negligence or misconduct) in receipt of retired pay of not less than £70 a year may,

provided she was living with the officer at the time of his death, be granted a pension of not more than one-half of the deceased officer's retired pay, and in no case at a higher rate than as in the fifth column of the Second Schedule hereto, this grant to be subject to such conditions as the Minister may determine and to cease on re-marriage.

(2) "Widow" in this Article means a

widow.

(a) the circumstances of whose husband's death do not entitle her to a pension under Article 11 of these Regulations; and

(b) who, if her husband had died in the circumstances set forth in Article 11, would have been eligible for a pension under that

Article.

(3) The motherless children of an officer whose widow would have been eligible for a pension under this Article may be granted pensions at the rates and subject to the conditions of Article 17 (1) and (2), the total of the pensions not to exceed one-half of the officer's re-

tired pay.
(4) "Retired pay" in this Article means retired pay in consequence of disability attributable to or aggravated by naval or military service during the war at the rate the officer was receiving or might have received under columns 3 to 7 of the First Schedule to the Regulations annexed to the Order in Council of the 29th September, 1917.

17.—(1) The child of an officer who has died in the circumstances set forth in Article 11 of these Regulations may be awarded a pension of £60 a year where the child is or becomes motherless, or has been removed from the control of its mother. In the event of two or more children being maintained by one person in the same household, the amount will be reduced to £50 for each child after the first.

(2) The grant, continuance and administration of the pension shall be subject to the same conditions as those set forth for children's allowances in Article 12 (1), (2) and (5).

(3) A child granted a pension under subsection (1) of this Article shall be eligible for a gratuity under the conditions of Article 12 (3), and for an education allowance under the conditions laid down in Article 12 (4).

18. The following conditions shall apply to the grant or continuance of pensions to the relatives, other than widows and children, of deceased officers under Articles 19 and 21

below:

(1) It shall be granted only if the officer dies in the circumstances set forth in Article

11 of these Regulations.

(2) It shall be granted or continued only if the pecuniary and other circumstances of the relative are such as, in the opinion of the Minister, to justify the award.

(3) Subject to the provisions of sub-section (2) of the following Article, it shall not exceed the pension which has been or would have been awarded to the officer's widow under Article 11 (1), (2) or (3), as the case may be, if under 40 and childless.

(4) It shall not be transferable; except that where it is granted to one of two parents, or to two or more sisters or brothers, it may be continued wholly or in part to the survivor or survivors, and that where it has been granted to a parent it may on the death of such parent be continued, wholly or in part,

to a sister who is otherwise eligible for a pension in respect of the deceased officer.

(5) It shall cease on marriage or remarriage.

19.--(1) A pension may be granted to the parent or parents of an officer of such an. amount as the Minister may decide, subject to the conditions of Article 18 and such other conditions as he may determine, regard being had to pre-war dependence, if any, and to the age or infirmity of the parent or parents.

(2) A pension may be granted in respect of each son who has died in the circumstances set forth in Article 11, subject to such conditions and limits as the Minister may determine.

20. A gratuity not exceeding the value of one year's pension of a widow under 40 and childless may be granted to the parent or parents jointly of an officer, at the discretion of the Minister, in special cases where the conditions for pensions laid down in the two pre-

ceding Articles are not fulfilled.

21.—(1) A pension may be granted to the sister or brother (or sisters or brothers) of an officer, provided they were wholly or partially dependent on him for support. The pension shall be of such an amount as the Minister may decide, subject to the conditions of Article 18 and such other conditions as he may determine, and shall not be granted or continued to a brother after the age of 18, or to a sister after the age of 21, unless he or she is unfitted by age or infirmity to earn his or her living.

(2) A pension under the same conditions may be granted in respect of each brother who has died in the circumstances set forth in Article 11, subject to the limit laid down in

Article 18 (3).

22. A gratuity not exceeding one-half the value of one year's pension of a widow under 40 and childless may, at the discretion of the Minister, be granted to the sisters or brothers jointly in special cases where the conditions for pensions laid down in Articles 18 and 21 are not fulfilled.

#### PART III.—NURSES DISABLED OR DECEASED.

23. A member of the Royal Naval Nursing Service, or the Royal Naval Nursing Service Reserve (hereinafter referred to as a nurse), who retires on account of medical unfitness certified as either attributable to or aggravated by naval or military service during the war and not being due to her serious negligence or misconduct, may, subject to Article 28, be granted the pension shown in the Third Schedule to these Regulations which corresponds to the degree of her disablement as certified: Provided that a nurse who is eligible for or in receipt of a pension under the terms of the Order in Council of the 9th February, 1901, or the 8th August, 1911, may be granted either-

(a) Such pension together with an addition as shown in column 6 of the Third Schedule hereto, or

(b) the pension provided by columns 3 to 5 of that Schedule for her rank and degree of disablement,

whichever is more favourable.

23a. If a nurse on or after demobilisation or on or after retirement, or transfer or reversion to the Reserve, otherwise than for misconduct or in circumstances which, in the opinion of the Minister, do not justify an award, is certified to be disabled by wounds, injuries, or disease attributable to or aggravated by naval or military service during the war, such disablement not being due to her serious negligence or misconduct, she may be granted pension or gratuity under Article 23 or 28, with effect from the date from which her claim is established. But the benefits of proviso (a) to Article 23 shall only be granted if the nurse is certified to have been permanently unfit for general service on her retirement.

23b. Except in those cases where the disablement has reached its final condition a pension shall be temporary, at the rate appropriate to the temporary disablement, and the grant shall be reviewed from time to time until a permanent assessment can be made or the grant ceases.

23c.—(1) A nurse in receipt of pension under Article 23 of these Regulations whose pre-war earnings (excluding any addition thereto under paragraph (b) of Article 30 (5)) exceeded £95 a year and who, within one year from the 2nd July, 1920, or one year after the notification to her of the first award of pension under Article 23, whichever is the later date, shall prove to the satisfaction of the Minister the amount of her pre-war earnings, may, at the same time or at any time thereafter, make application for alternative pension, and if she shows that her pension together with the average earnings of which she remains capable, are less than her proved pre-war earnings she may be granted alternative pension in lieu of pension under Article 23.

Alternative pension may be granted temporarily or permanently and shall be of an amount which, together with the average earnings (if any) of which the nurse is judged capable, shall not exceed her pre-war earnings up to £250 a year: provided that—

- (a) in assessing the average earnings (if any) of which a nurse remains capable any decrease thereof not due to the disablement for which the nurse is in receipt of pension shall be disregarded, and the refusal or neglect to undergo any course of treatment or training which in the opinion of the Minister would materially increase the nurse's earning capacity may be taken into account; and
- (b) where owing to physical incapacity or other cause over which the nurse had no control she has been unable to prove the amount of her pre-war earnings within the time above specified, the Minister may, in his discretion, extend such time.
- (2) Alternative pension shall be payable as from the date from which the claim thereto is established.
- 24.—(1) When a permanent pension has been granted it shall not be altered on account of any change in the nurse's earning capacity, whether resulting from training or other cause; neither shall it be subject to review except.—
  - (a) when a nurse whose pension is assessed under Article 23 claims that there has been a substantial increase in the extent of the disablement due to the original cause, or
  - (b) when a nurse whose pension is assessed under Article 23 of these Regulations, and who has duly proved her pre-war earnings as provided by Article 23c shows that it would be more advantageous to her to be assessed under that Article; or

- (c) under the following sub-section or under Article 30a or 30b.
- (2) The Minister may at any time order the review of any pension in any case where—
  - (a) a pension has, by error in interpretation or fact, been granted to a disabled nurse in excess of the amount appropriate to the degree of her disablement;
  - (b) the Minister has reason to believe that a pension has been obtained by any improper means; or
    - (c) a pension has been granted by error.
- 25. Half the pension awarded under Article 23 or 23c may be subject to the condition that the disabled nurse shall undergo medical treatment in an institution or otherwise for any period during which it is certified that such treatment is necessary in her interests.

Such misconduct of the nurse as shall render it necessary, in the discretion of the Minister, to discontinue treatment, may be deemed to be refusal to undergo that treatment.

- 26. In any case where it is certified that a nurse should undergo any course of medical treatment in an institution or otherwise for a disability which renders her eligible for pension or gratuity under Article 23 or 28 of these Regulations, she may be granted, for such period and subject to such conditions as the Minister may determine—
  - (a) a pension at the rate for the highest degree of disablement (subject to any necessary adjustments in respect of pension or gratuity already awarded) for the purpose of undergoing the treatment which she is certified to require and whilst deemed in consequence incapable of work, a deduction of such amount as the Minister may determine being made from such pension on account of the cost of her maintenance in the institution;
  - (b) if she is certified to require medical treatment which does not render her incapable of work, but requires her to absent herself from her work on one or more occasions in the week, an allowance not exceeding 16s. a week for the time she is required so to absent herself;
  - (c) the necessary medical and other expenses and allowances incidental to the treatment of such disability up to such amount as the Minister may determine.
- 27. In addition to any pension awarded under the foregoing Articles there may be granted, under such conditions as the Minister may determine, to or on behalf of a nurse disabled in the highest degree, an allowance not exceeding £52 a year in any case where a constant attendant is necessary.
- 28. In any case where the degree of disablement is assessed at less than 20 per cent., or where, in exceptional circumstances, it is considered by the Minister more in the interests of the nurse, a gratuity or temporary allowance may be granted in place of any pension under these Regulations. The grant will be subject to such conditions as the Minister may determine, and its amount will not exceed £300, and will depend on the nature of the disablement and the other circumstances of the case.
- 29. A nurse who retires on account of medical unfitness certified to be neither attributable to nor aggravated by naval or military

service may be granted a gratuity or temporary allowance. The grant will be subject to such. conditions as the Minister may determine. exceptional circumstances it may amount to a sum not exceeding £200, and generally it will depend on the extent to which the nurse is incapacitated and on the other circumstances of the case.

29a. Pensions or gratuities may be awarded to the relatives of deceased nurses in accordance with the terms of Articles 18 to 22 of these Regulations so far as they may be applicable, and under such conditions as the Minister

#### may determine.

#### PART IV.—GENERAL PROVISIONS.

- 30. In these Regulations, unless the context otherwise requires-
  - (1) "Officer" means a commissioned or subordinate officer on the permanent or temporary or supplementary lists of the Royal Navy, Royal Marines, or the Reserves, who has served and been in receipt of Naval pay as such during some period of the war, but does not include a commissioned officer from warrant rank or a warrant officer.
  - (2) "Widow" means the widow of any officer, but shall not include a widow whose marriage took place after the end of the war, or after the termination of his active service during the war, or after the receipt of the wound or injury which caused his death, or after his removal from duty on account of the contraction or aggravation of the disease which caused his death: provided always that the widow of a permanent regular officer married after such date (but not later than the 2nd July, 1920), shall not be disqualified if the officer survives his marriage by at least one year, or it can be shown that he was manifestly in good health at the date of his marriage.
  - (3) "Child" means the legitimate child of an officer born before or within nine months after his demobilisation, retirement, relinquishment of his commission, transfer, or reversion to the Retired, Reserve, or Emergency List, and may include a step-child regularly maintained by him; but shall not include a child whose mother is excluded by (2) above.
  - (4) "Parent" includes a grandparent or other person who has been in the place of a parent to an officer, and has wholly or mainly supported him for not less than one year at some time before the commencement of the war
- (5)—(a) "Pre-war earnings" means in the case of an officer who was in employment under a contract of service the average earnings during the twelve months immediately preceding the outbreak of the war. Average earnings shall be computed generally in such manner as is best calculated to give the rate at which the officer was being remunerated, and, so far as may be applicable, in accordance with the provisions of the Workmen's Compensation Act, 1906: provided that where in the course of such twelve months there was a change in the officer's rate of remuneration, and such change was not of a temporary but of a reasonably permanent nature, then the average earnings shall be calculated on the officer's earnings during the period since such

- change in his remuneration, or since the last of such changes if there were more than one. In the case of an officer in a trade, business, or profession, the average profits of the last three years preceding the commencement of the war shall be taken, or of such lesser period as he engaged therein.
- (b) In computing the average earnings or average profits of an officer an addition of 60 per cent. may be made to any such earnings or profits.
- (6) "Pre-war dependence" means amount representing the annual value of the support afforded to, or of benefits conferred upon a relative by an officer for a reasonable period immediately preceding the commencement of the war, or of his naval or military service, if later, exclusive, however, of any increase thereof due to circumstances arising out of the war in the case of entry into service or commission subsequent to the commencement of the war, and shall include the following:
  - (a) Amount regularly contributed by the officer if he received no material benefits in return therefor.
  - (b) Amount regularly contributed by the officer in excess of expenditure incurred on his account.
    - (c) Money value of any benefit conferred
- upon the relative by the officer.

  (7) "Certified" means, in respect of any medical certification, certified by a medical officer or Board of Medical Officers appointed for the purpose by the Admiralty or by the Minister.
- (8) "Prescribed" means prescribed by Instructions issued by the Minister.
- (9) "Wounds pension" includes wounds gratuity.
- (10) The provisions of this Part of these Regulations shall, so far as they are applicable, apply to and in respect of nurses in the same way as they apply to and in respect of officers.
- (11) "The Great War" and "the war" shall have the same meaning as the expression "the present war" in the War Pensions Act,

30a. The rates of retired pay, pension, and allowance specified in the Fourth Schedule hereto, and any retired pay, pensions, and allowances awarded under or by virtue of the Articles therein mentioned (hereinafter referred to as the scheduled rates), shall be deemed to be based on the cost of living for the year 1919, and shall be subject as prescribed to increase or decrease in accordance with the increased or decreased cost of living as compared with the cost of living for the year 1919, such increased or decreased cost being determined by a certificate to be furnished in January of the year 1923 and of each succeeding year for this purpose by the Minister of Labour: provided that the scheduled rates shall not be reduced below the minimum rates set forth in the second column of the Fourth Schedule hereto, and that no re-adjustment shall take effect before the 1st day of April, 1923.

There shall be no re-adjustment in the year 1923 unless the certificate of the Minister of Labour shows a difference between the cost of living in the year 1919 and in the year 1922 of at least 5 per cent., nor shall there be any re-adjustment in any succeeding year unless the certificate of the Minister of Labour shows that the cost of living for the previous year differs from the cost of living in the year as to which the last re-adjustment was made (or the year 1919 if there had been no re-adjustment) by at least 5 per cent. of the cost of living in the year 1919.

"Cost of living" in this Article means the general cost of living of working-class families.

- 306. Where an officer is injured or killed in such circumstances that any retired pay, pension, allowance, or grant is payable to or in respect of him under these Regulations or the Order in Council to which they are annexed, and where he or his widow, child, or dependant receives compensation from or on behalf of a third party, for the act, omission, or circumstances which caused the injury or death, any such compensation may be taken into consideration in assessing any retired pay, pension, allowance, or grant which might be awarded to or in respect of the officer, and where the compensation is received after assessment it may be taken into consideration and the assessment may be amended or cancelled accordingly.
- 31.—(1) The rate of retired pay or pension or gratuity granted under these Regulations may be determined according to the temporary, acting, or local rank held by the officer at the time he was killed, wounded, injured, or removed from duty in consequence of disablement.
- (2) Any existing Regulations as to the relative rank which should govern the rate of retired pay for a disabled officer, or the pension,

- gratuity, or allowance for the widow, child, or relative of a deceased officer shall remain in force and be applicable to grants made under these Regulations.
- (3.) Any retired pay, pension, or grant to or in respect of an officer of the Royal Marines not holding a permanent commission who relinquished his commission, was demobilised, or died before the 1st April, 1919, shall be assessed, so far as regards the relative rank of the officer, in accordance with the scale of rank set forth in the First Schedule to the Regulations annexed to the Order in Council of the 29th September, 1917, relating to the retired pay of commissioned officers.
- 31a. In special circumstances, to be determined by the Minister, the retired pay granted to an officer or any portion of it may be suspended or withheld.
- 32. Except as modified by these Regulations, any general conditions governing the grant, issue, and administration of retired pay to officers and of pensions to their families laid down in Orders in Council and King's Regulations and Admiralty Instructions issued by the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty shall remain in force and be applicable to grants made under these Regulations.
- 33. The Minister shall, subject to the provisions of the War Pensions Acts, 1915 to 1920, be the sole administrator and interpreter of these Regulations, and shall be empowered to issue such detailed instructions in reference thereto as he may from time to time deem necessary.

#### PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, inter alia, that all pay, wages, pensions, bounty money, grants, or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in His Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an officer, seaman, or marine, or to the widow or any relative of a deceased officer, seaman, or marine, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions, and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

And whereas by Sub-section (1) of Section 2 of the Ministry of Pensions Act, 1916, as amended by Section 1 of the War Pensions Act, 1920, it is enacted, inter alia, that there shall be transferred to the Minister of Pensions the powers and duties of the Admiralty with respect to pensions and grants to persons who have served as officers or men and to their widows, children, and other dependants, other than service pensions, so far as such pensions and grants are payable out of moneys provided by Parliament and not provided exclusively for the purpose of Greenwich Hospital, and so far as such powers and duties relate to pensions and grants to which the War Pensions Acts apply, and that His Majesty may by Order in Council make such adaptations in the enactments relating to such powers and duties as aforesaid as may be necessary to make them exercisable by the Minister of Pensions (hereinafter referred to as "the Minister") and his officers:

And whereas to His Majesty's Order in Council of the 29th September, 1917, Regulations were annexed giving sanction to the pensions and grants which might be awarded to Commissioned Warrant Officers and Warrant Officers (including Royal Marine Gunners) of His Majesty's Naval, Coastguard, and Reserve Forces (therein referred to as officers of warrant rank) disabled, and to the families of such officers deceased, in consequence of the Great War (hereinafter referred to as "the war"):

And whereas by His Majesty's Order in Council of the 22nd January, 1920, the collective expression and title of "Commissioned Warrant Officers" was abolished, and the term Commissioned Officers from Warrant Rank established in respect to officers of the grade lying between Warrant Officer and Lieutenant:

And whereas by a further Order of His Majesty in Council dated the 22nd January, 1920, all Warrant Officers, Class I, of the Royal Marines now rank with Naval Warrant Officers:

And whereas it has been represented to His Majesty by the Minister that it is desirable to make further provision concerning such pensions and grants as were sanctioned by His Majesty's aforesaid Order in Council of the 29th September, 1917, and that such further provision should include pensions and grants to or in respect of Warrant Officers (Class I) of the Royal Marines:

And whereas the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, having taken the said proposals into consideration, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve thereof and to sanction

the grant of pensions, allowances and gratuities to such commissioned officers from warrant rank and warrant officers disabled, and to the families of such officers deceased, whose claims arise in respect of service during the war, on the scales and subject to the conditions set forth in the Regulations hereto annexed, in substitution for those laid down in His Order in Council of 29th September, 1917, with effect (subject to the provisions of the Fifth Schedule to the said Regulations) from the 1st day of April, 1920, and further, to empower. the Minister to make or revise grants under previous Orders in respect of any claims which may have arisen between the outbreak of the war and the aforesaid 1st day of April, 1920. Provided always that, if more favourable to any such officer, the pension, allowance, or gratuity payable under existing regulations shall be granted, and no grant to an officer, or to the family of an officer, shall be re-assessed to their disadvantage; and provided further that the widow, child, or dependant of a commissioned officer from warrant rank promoted, or of a warrant officer appointed or promoted, to that rank during the war, shall not be less favourably treated than if he had served or continued to serve in some lower rank or rating of his class.

#### REGULATIONS.

#### PART I.-OFFICERS DISABLED.

1.—An Officer (as defined in Article 23 (1) of these Regulations) who retires, relinquishes his commission or warrant, or reverts to the Retired or Reserve List on account of medical unfitness certified as either attributable to or aggravated by naval or military service during the war, and not being due to his serious negligence or misconduct, may be granted the retired pay shown in column 3 or 4 of Part I of the First Schedule to these Regulations which corresponds to the degree of his disablement as certified:

Provided that-

(1) If the officer (not being an officer to whom the Order in Council of the 13th October, 1920, applies) holds a permanent commission or warrant, or is a Divisional Chief Officer or Chief Officer of Coast Guard other than in the Coast Guard Pensioner Force, he may be granted—

(a) if he retires, the retired pay for which he is eligible under Section IX of Schedule V of the Order in Council of the 22nd January, 1920, together with an addition as in column (5) or (6) of the First Schedule

hereto;

(b) if he reverts to the Retired List, his service retired pay, or such retired pay reassessed under the said Order in Council of the 22nd January, 1920, together with an addition as in column (5) or (6) of the First Schedule hereto.

- (2) If the officer is a Divisional Chief Officer or Chief Officer of the Coast Guard Pensioner Force, he may be granted, in addition to his pension as a seaman or marine and to the gratuity for which he is eligible under Section IX of Schedule V of the Order in Council of the 22nd January, 1920, in respect of his Coast Guard service, an addition as in column (5) or (6) of the First Schedule hereto.
- (3) If the officer does not hold a permanent commission or warrant, but was appointed or

promoted during the war to a temporary commission or warrant, he may be granted—

- (a) if he is a pensioned seaman or marine, or on promotion was a seaman or marine serving on a long service engagement, either—
  - (i) the service retired pay for which he is eligible under the Order in Council of the 22nd January, 1920; or
  - (ii) the service pension or re-assessed service pension to which he is entitled as a seaman or marine,
- whichever be the greater, together with an addition as in column (5) or (6) of the First Schedule hereto;
- (b) if he is in receipt of a permanent pension as a seaman or marine for a disability which has been aggravated by naval or military service as an officer during the war, and if he was eligible for a service pension when discharged for disability, such service pension with an addition as in column (5) or (6) of the First Schedule hereto;
- (c) if not within the terms of paragraph (a) or (b) above, the permanent pension he would have received if he had continued to serve in the rank or rating which he last held before promotion, if qualified therefor by length of service, whether his service was continuous or not.
- (4) If the officer is in receipt of a wounds pension he may be granted in addition thereto only—
  - (a) the retiring pension for which he would have been eligible for service under the Regulations in force before the commencement of the war, with an addition (subject to conditions and limitations approved by the Minister) not exceeding 20 per cent. of such retiring pension and wounds pension; or
  - (b) if he is an officer to whom proviso (1) of this Article applies, the service retired pay for which he is eligible thereunder without the addition; or
  - (c) if he is an officer to whom proviso (2) of this Article applies, the pension and gratuity therein referred to without the addition; or
  - (d) if he is an officer to whom proviso (3)
    (a) or (b) of this Article applies, the service retired pay or pension therein referred to, without the addition; or
  - (e) the difference between the wounds pension and the retired pay to which the officer would be entitled under these Regulations, if he was not in receipt of wounds pension;

whichever be the greatest.

- (5) If the officer has lost the sight of both eyes as the result of wounds received in action he shall be granted such retired pay as, together with wounds pension and service retired pay or pension, if any, shall not be less than £225 a year, if he is a commissioned officer from warrant rank, or £175 a year, if a warrant officer.
- (6) If the officer is in receipt of retired pay or pension for a disability other than that in respect of which the claim under these Regulations arises, such retired pay or pension being—
  - (a) in consequence of service prior to the war; or

(b) greater, by reason of length of service, than the disability pension he would have received as a seaman or marine for his rank alone.

he may be granted in addition thereto the retired pay as in column (5) or (6) of the First Schedule hereto, which corresponds to the degree of disablement sustained in the war as an officer.

- (7) If the officer is in receipt of pension for a disability sustained in the war as a seaman or marine, and other than that in respect of which the claim under these Regulations arises, such pension being not greater, by reason of length of service, than the disability pension he would have received for rank alone, he may be granted in addition thereto the retired pay shown in columns 3 or 4 of Part I. of the First Schedule hereto appropriate to the difference between the disablement due to his combined disabilities and the disablement due to his disability sustained as a seaman or marine.
- (8) If the officer's combined retired pay (or pension or gratuity) and additions under provisos (1), (2), (3), (6), or (7) should at any time be less than the retired pay to which he is entitled under columns 3 or 4 of Part I. of the First Schedule hereto he may be granted such retired pay in lieu of such combined retired pay (or pension or gratuity) and additions
- (9) Subject to the preceding provisos, if the officer is already in receipt of pension or retired pay as a seaman, marine, or officer, it shall be suspended so long as he is receiving a higher rate under these Regulations.
- la. If an officer on or after demobilisation, or on or after discharge or retirement, or relinquishing his commission or warrant, or transfer to or reversion to the Reserve List, otherwise than for misconduct or in circumstances which do not, in the opinion of the Minister, justify the award, is certified to be disabled by wounds, injuries or disease attributable to or aggravated by naval or military service during the war, such disablement not having been caused or aggravated by his serious negligence or misconduct, he may be granted retired pay or gratuity under Article 1 or 8 of these Regulations, with effect from the date from which his claim is established. But the benefit of proviso (1) to Article 1 shall only be granted if the officer is certified to have been permanently unfit for general service on his retirement or reversion to the Retired or Reserve List.
- · 1b. Except in those cases where the disablement has reached its final condition, a grant of retired pay shall be temporary at the rate appropriate to the temporary disablement, and the grant shall be reviewed from time to time until a permanent assessment can be made or the grant ceases.
- 2.—(1) A disabled officer granted retired pay under Article 1 of these Regulations may be granted during the continuance of such retired pay for each of his children under the age of 16 a children's allowance at the yearly rate set forth in the Second Schedule to these Regulations.
- (2) The allowance may (subject to the continuance of the retired pay) be granted or continued beyond the age of 16 in the case of young persons receiving not more than nominal wages or of children being educated at secondary schools, technical institutes or

- universities, and may be granted or continued between the ages of 16 and 21 in the case of a child incapable through mental or physical infirmity of earning a living, provided the infirmity existed before the child attained the age of 16.
- (3) In any case in which, in the opinion of the Minister, it may become necessary to secure the proper care of a child on behalf of whom an allowance is payable, the allowance instead of being paid to the parent may be administered under such conditions as the Minister may determine.
- 3.—(1) An officer in receipt of retired pay under Article 1 of these Regulations, or of a wounds pension in lieu thereof, whose pre-war earnings (excluding any addition thereto under paragraph (b) of Article 23 (5)) exceeded £112 a year if a commissioned officer from warrant rank, or £95 a year if a warrant officer, and who, within one year from the 2nd July, 1920, or one year after the notification to him of the first award of retired pay under Article 1, whichever is the later date, shall prove to the satisfaction of the Minister the amount of his pre-war earnings, may, at the same time or at any time thereafter, make application for alternative retired pay, and if he shows that his retired pay together with any children's allowances and wounds pension of which he is in receipt, and together with the average earnings of which he remains capable, are less than his proved pre-war earnings, he may be granted alternative retired pay in lieu of retired pay or such pay, allowances and pension.

Alternative retired pay may be granted temporarily or permanently, and shall be of an amount which, together with any wounds pension of which the officer is in receipt and together with the average earnings (if any) of which he is judged capable, shall not exceed his pre-war earnings up to £260 a year plus half any pre-war earnings between £260 and £340 a year: provided that—

- (a) in assessing the average earnings (if any) of which an officer remains capable any decrease thereof not due to the disablement for which the officer is in receipt of retired pay or wounds pension shall be disregarded, and the refusal or neglect to undergo any course of treatment or training which in the opinion of the Minister would materially increase the officer's earning capacity may be taken into account; and
- (b) where owing to physical incapacity or other cause over which the officer had no control he has been unable to prove the amount of his pre-war earnings within the time above specified the Minister may in his discretion extend such time.
- (2) Alternative retired pay shall be payable as from the date from which the claim thereto is established.
- (3) Where, in the opinion of the Minister, it may become necessary to secure the proper care of a child of an officer in receipt of alternative retired pay, the Minister may deduct from the alternative retired pay such sum as he may deem sufficient for the maintenance of such child, and may administer the same under such conditions as he may determine.
- 4.—(1) When permanent retired pay has been granted, it shall not be altered on account of any change in the officer's earning capacity,

whether resulting from training or other cause; neither shall it be subject to review except—

(a) when an officer whose retired pay is assessed under Article I of these Regulations claims that there has been a substantial increase in the extent of the disablement due to the original cause;

(b) when an officer whose retired pay is assessed under Article 1 of these Regulations, and who has duly proved his pre-war earnings as provided by Article 3 shows that it would be more advantageous to him to be

assessed under that Article; or

(c) under the following subsection or under Article 24 or 25.

(2) The Minister may at any time order the review of any retired pay in any case where—

(a) retired pay has, by error in interpretation or fact, been granted to a disabled officer in excess of the amount appropriate to the degree of his disablement;

(b) the Minister has reason to believe that retired pay has been obtained by any im-

proper means; or

(c) retired pay has been granted by error.

5. Half the retired pay and children's allowances (if any) awarded under the preceding Articles may be subject to the condition that the disabled officer shall undergo medical treatment in an institution or otherwise for any period during which it is certified that such treatment is necessary in his interests.
Such misconduct of the officer as shall render

Such misconduct of the officer as shall render it necessary, in the discretion of the Minister, to discontinue treatment may be deemed to be

refusal to undergo treatment.

- 6. In any case where it is certified that an officer should undergo any course of medical treatment in an institution or otherwise for a disability which renders him eligible for retired pay or gratuity under Article 1 or 8 of these Regulations, he may be granted, for such period and subject to such conditions as the Minister may determine—
  - (a) retired pay and children's allowances at the rate for the highest degree of disablement (subject to any necessary adjustments in respect of wounds pension, retired pay or gratuity already awarded) for the purpose of undergoing the treatment which he is certified to require and whilst deemed unable in consequence to provide for his own support and that of his family, a deduction of such an amount as the Minister may determine being made from the officer's retired pay on account of the cost of his maintenance in the institution;
  - (b) if he is certified to require treatment which does not render him unable to provide for his own support and that of his family, but requires him to absent himself from his work on one or more occasions in the week, an allowance not exceeding 17s. 6d. a week for the time he is required to absent himself;

(c) the necessary medical and other expenses and allowances incidental to the freatment of such disability up to such amount as

the Minister may determine.

7. Where a constant attendant is necessary and the officer is disabled in the highest degree, there may be granted to or on behalf of the officer, under such conditions as the Minister may determine, an allowance not exceeding £78 a year in the case of a commissioned officer from warrant rank or £65 a year in the case of a warrant officer. The allowance shall be in

addition to any retired pay awarded under the foregoing Articles or to any wounds pension in heu thereof.

- 8. In any case where the degree of disablement is assessed at less than 20 per cent. or, in exceptional circumstances, where it is considered by the Minister more in the interests of the officer, a gratuity or temporary allowance may be granted in place of any retired pay under these Regulations. The grant will be subject to such conditions as the Minister may determine and its amount will not exceed £400 and will depend on the nature of the disablement and other circumstances of the case.
- 9. An officer who retires, relinquishes his commission or warrant, or reverts to the Retired or Reserve List, on account of medical unfitness, such unfitness being neither attributable to nor aggravated by naval or military service, and not being due to the serious negligence or misconduct of the officer, may be granted a gratuity or temporary allowance. The grant will be subject to such conditions as the Minister may determine. In exceptional circumstances it may amount to a sum not exceeding £250, and generally it will depend on the extent to which the officer is incapacitated and on the other circumstances of the case.

# PART II.—WIDOWS AND OTHER RELATIVES OF OFFICERS DECEASED.

10. Pensions and gratuities to the widows, children and relatives of deceased officers, for which provision is made in the following Articles, shall only be given as a reward of the officer's services, and no pension or gratuity shall be granted or continued to a deceased officer's widow or relative who, in the opinion of the Minister is unworthy of a grant from public funds, and it shall be in the power of the Minister to terminate or suspend any pension that may have been granted to any such person or to provide for the administration of a pension or gratuity under such conditions as he may determine.

11. The widow of an officer may be granted—

(1) If the officer, otherwise than through his serious negligence or misconduct,

(a) is killed in action, or suffers violent death due directly and wholly to war service, or is killed or dies of injuries sustained on flying duty or while being carried on duty in aircraft under proper authority, or is drowned while on duty, or dies as a result of the destruction of ship, or dies within seven years from wounds or injuries so received, or

(b) dies of disease certified as contracted or commencing while on duty or having been aggravated by naval or military service within seven years after having been removed from duty on

account of such disease, or

(c) dies of injuries attributable to naval or military service other than under subsection (1) (a) of this Article, within seven years after having been removed from duty on account of such injuries, or

(d) not having been removed from duty for the disability, dies of a wound or injury within seven years of its receipt, or of a disease within seven years of the termination of his active service during the

war; provided that a claim has been made and admitted in respect of such disability under Article 1 or 8 of these Regulations, and that such disability is certified as attributable to or aggravated by such service; or (if no such claim has been made and admitted) that, a continuous medical history being shown from the termination of such active service, the disability can be so certified,

and the widow is over 40 years of age, or has a child eligible for allowance under the Article next following a pension as in the second column of the Third Schedule hereto; but if the widow is not over 40 and has no child so eligible, then a pension as in the third column of the said Schedule.

- (2) If the officer dies in the circumstances referred to in sub-section (1) (a) of this Article, a gratuity, in addition to pension, as in the fourth column of the Third Schedule hereto, provided that, where it would be more favourable to her, the amount of the gratuity shall be equal to a year's full pay of the rank which the officer held on the 31st March, 1917, and for this purpose any full-pay allowances shall be included.
- 12.—(1) The widow of an officer awarded a pension under the preceding Article may be granted a further allowance for each child maintained by her at the following annual rates—£30 for the first child, £25 for the second child, and £18 for the third and each subsequent child.

This allowance may be granted or continued up to the age of 18 in the case of sons and up to the age of 21 in the case of daughters, unless the child is otherwise provided for or marries, and may be granted or further continued after such ages where the conditions of Article 2 (2) are fulfilled

(2) If the officer dies in the circumstances referred to in Article 11 (1) (a) a gratuity of one-third of the amount laid down in Article 11 (2) may be granted, in addition to children's allowance, for each child.

(3) In any case in which, in the opinion of the Minister, it may become necessary to secure the proper care of a child on behalf of whom an allowance is payable, the allowance, instead of being paid to the widow, may be administered under such conditions as the Minister may determine.

13.—(1) A widow who-

(a) is over 40 years of age or has a child eligible for an allowance under the preceding Article,

(b) is in receipt of a pension under Article 11 of these Regulations, and

(c) makes application and shows that she was married to the officer before the commencement of the war or of his naval or military service, whichever was the later, and that her pension under Article 11 with any children's allowances under Article 12 (1), and any pension under Article 17 in respect of the officer is, or eventually may less than two-thirds of the alternative retired pay that might have been awarded to her husband under Article 3 had he survived and been incapable of supplementing

that retired pay by earnings, may be granted, in lieu of such pension and such children's allowances and pension, an alternative pension (which shall not exceed

two-thirds of such alternative retired pay) up to a maximum of £200 a year: provided

(i) that application shall be made within one year from the 2nd July, 1920, or one year after notification to the widow of the award of pension under Article 11, whichever is the later;

(ii) that such widow's pension under Article 11 (together with any such children's allowances and pension) shall, if greater than the alternative pension assessed under this sub-section, continue until it becomes less than the alternative

pension :

(iii) that if a widow to whom an alternative pension has been granted under this sub-section ceases to be eligible for a pension under this sub-section, but would be eligible for a pension under sub-section (2) of this Article, her alternative pension shall cease to be calculated under this sub-section and shall be thenceforth calculated under that sub-section; and

(iv) that the provision in Article 3 (3) of these Regulations to secure the proper care of a child shall apply in the case of any pension awarded under this sub-section.

(2) A widow who

(a) is not over 40 years of age and has no child eligible for an allowance under the preceding Article, (b) is in receipt of a pension under

Article 11, and

(c) makes application and shows that she was married to the officer before the commencement of the war or of his naval or military service, whichever was the later. and that her pension under Article 11 with any pension under Article 17 in respect of the officer is, or eventually may be, less than one-half of the alternative retired pay that might have been awarded to her husband under Article 3 had he survived and been incapable of supplementing that retired pay by earnings,

may be granted, in lieu of such pension, an alternative pension (which shall not exceed onehalf of such alternative retired pay) up to a

maximum of £150 a year: provided—

(i) that application shall be made within one year from the 2nd July, 1920, or one year after the notification to the widow of the award of pension under Article 11,

whichever is the later;

(ii) that such widow's pension under Article 11 (together with any pension under Article 17) shall, if greater than the alternative pension assessed under this sub-section, continue until it becomes less than the alternative pension; and

(iii) that when the widow reaches the age of 40 the alternative pension may be raised from one-half of such alternative retired pay to two-thirds thereof up to a maximum of

£200 a year.

- (3) If the officer's pre-war earnings (exclusive of the addition under Article 23 (5) (b)), were less than £112 a year in the case of an officer commissioned from warrant rank, or £95 a year in the case of a warrant officer, his pre-war earnings (inclusive of such addition) may be substituted for the alternative retired pay in the preceding sub-sections of this Article.
- (4) Any pension under Article 17 shall be deducted from a widow's alternative pension.

14. The widow of an officer not eligible for pension under Article 11 may be granted a gratuity of not less than one and not more than three years' pay of the appointment held by the officer: provided that-

(a) the officer dies during the war, while on full pay, or, after removal from full pay, from the injury or disease for which he was removed from full pay or some closely connected disease and there is a continuous

medical history of sickness; and

(b) the widow is disqualified only through the insufficiency of the officer's service for an ordinary pension under the terms of the King's Regulations and Admiralty Instructions.

The amount of the gratuity, within the above limits, shall be at the discretion of the Minister, and may be paid in a lump sum or in instalments as he may determine. In the event of the officer leaving motherless children, a similar grant may be made to them under such conditions as the Minister may determine.

15. Any pension granted to the widow of an officer under these Regulations shall cease on her re-marriage; but in the event of her again becoming a widow, her pension (subject to adjustment under Article 24) may be restored, wholly or in part, if she is otherwise qualified, and if in the opinion of the Minister her pecuniary circumstances are such as to justify the restoration. Allowances for children under Article 12 may be paid after re-

marriage.

16. (1) The widow of an officer who was at the time of his death (not being due to his serious negligence or misconduct) in receipt of retired pay of not less than £50 a year may, provided she was living with the officer at the time of his death, be granted a pension of not more than one-half of the deceased officer's retired pay and in no case at a higher rate than as in the third column of the Third Schedule hereto, this grant to be subject to such conditions as the Minister may determine and to cease on re-marriage.
(2) "Widow" in this Article means a

widow-

(a) the circumstances of whose husband's death do not entitle her to a pension under

. Article 11 of these Regulations; and

(b) who, if her husband had died in the circumstances set forth in Article 11; would have been eligible for a pension under that

(3) The motherless children of an officer whose widow would have been eligible for a pension under this Article may be granted pensions at the rates and subject to the conditions of Article 17 (1) and (2), the total of the pensions not to exceed one-half of the

officer's retired pay.

(4) "Retired pay" in this Article means retired pay in consequence of disability attributable to or aggravated by naval or military service during the war at the rate of pension the officer was receiving or might have received under column (3) or (4) of the First Schedule to the Regulations annexed to the Order in Council of the 29th September, 1917.

17.—(1) The child of an officer who has died in the circumstances set forth in Article 11 of these Regulations may be awarded a pension of £40 a year where the child is or becomes motherless, or has been removed from the control of its mother. In the event of two or more children being maintained by one person

in the same household, the amount will be reduced to £35 for each child after the first.

(2) The grant, continuance and administration of the pension shall be subject to the same conditions as those set forth for children's allowances in Article 12 (1) and (3).

(3) A child granted a pension under subsection (1) of this Article shall be eligible a gratuity under the conditions

Article 12 (2).

18. The rollowing conditions shall apply to the grant or continuance of pensions to the relatives, other than widows and children, of deceased officers under Articles 19 and 21

(1) It shall be granted only if the officer dies in the circumstances set forth in Article

11 of these Regulations.

(2) It shall be granted or continued only if the pecuniary and other circumstances of the relative are such as, in the opinion of the Minister, to justify the award.

(3) Subject to the provisions of subsection (2) of the following Article, it shall not exceed the pension which has been or would have been awarded to the officer's widow under Article 11 (1) if under 40 and childless.

(4) It shall not be transferable; except that where it is granted to one of two parents. or to two or more sisters or brothers, it may be continued wholly or in part to the survivor or survivors, and that where it has been granted to a parent it may on the death of such parent be continued, wholly or in part, to a sister who is otherwise eligible for a pension in respect of the deceased officer.

(5) It shall cease on marriage or re-

marriage.

19.—(1) A pension may be granted to the parent or parents of an officer of such an amount as the Minister may decide, subject to the conditions of Article 18 and such other conditions as he may determine, regard being had to pre-war dependence, if any, and to the age or infirmity of the parent or parents.

(2) A pension may be granted in respect of each son who has died in the circumstances set forth in Article 11, subject to such conditions and limits as the Minister may determine.

20. A gratuity not exceeding the value of one year's pension of a widow under 40 and childless may be granted to the parent or parents jointly of an officer, at the discretion of the Minister, in special cases where the conditions for pensions laid down in the two pre-

ceding Articles are not fulfilled.

21.-(1) A pension may be granted to the sister or brother (or sisters or brothers) of an officer, provided they were wholly or partially dependent on him for support. The pension shall be of such an amount as the Minister may decide, subject to the conditions of Article 18 and such other conditions as he may determine, and shall not be granted or continued to a brother after the age of 18, or to a sister after the age of 21, unless he or she is unfitted by age or infirmity to earn his or her living.

(2) A pension under the same conditions may be granted in respect of each brother who has died in the circumstances set forth in Article 11, subject to the limit laid down in Article

18 (3).

22. A gratuity not exceeding one-half the value of one year's pension of a widow under 40 and childless may, at the discretion of the Minister, be granted to the sisters or brothers jointly in special cases where the conditions for pensions laid down in Articles 18 and 21 are not fulfilled.

#### PART III -GENERAL PROVISIONS.

- 23. In these Regulations, unless the context otherwise requires:—
  - (1) "Officer" means a commissioned officer from warrant rank or a warrant officer (except a warrant officer, Class II., of the Royal Marines), on the permanent or temporary, or supplementary lists of the Royal Navy, Royal Marines, or Royal Naval Reserve, or a Divisional Chief Officer or Chief Officer of Coast Guard, who has served and been in receipt of naval pay as such during some period of the war.
  - (2) "Widow" means the widow of any officer, but shall not include a widow whose marriage took place after the end of the war, or after the termination of his active service during the war, or after the receipt of the wound or injury which caused his death, cr after his removal from duty on account of the contraction or aggravation of the disease which caused his death; provided always that the widow of a permanent regular officer married after such date (but not later than the 2nd July, 1920), shall not be disqualified if the officer survives his marriage by at least one year, or it can be shown that he was manifestly in good health at the date of his marriage.
  - (3) "Child" means the legitimate child of an officer born before or within nine months after his retirement, relinquishment of his commission or warrant, or reversion to the Retired or Reserve List, and may include a stepchild regularly maintained by him; but shall not include a child whose mother is excluded by (2) above.
  - (4) "Parent" includes a grandparent or other person who has been in the place of a parent to an officer, and has wholly or mainly supported him for not less than one year at some time before the commencement of the war
  - (5) (a) "Pre-war earnings" means in the case of an officer who was in employ-ment under a contract of service the average earnings during the twelve months immediately preceding the out-break of the war. Average earnings Average earnings shall be computed generally in such manner as is best calculated to give the rate at which the officer was being remunerated, and, so far as may be applicable, in accordance with the provisions of the Workmen's Compensation Act, 1906: provided that where in the course of such twelve months there was a change in the officer's rate of remuneration, and such change was not of a temporary but of a reasonably permanent nature, then the average earnings shall be calculated on the officer's earnings during the period since such change in his remuneration, or since the last of such changes if there were rocre than one. In the case of an officer in a trade, business, or profession the average profits of the last three years preceding the commencement of the war shall be taken, or of such lesser period as he engaged therein.
  - (b) In computing the average earnings or average profits of an officer an addition of

- 60 per cent. may be made to any such earnings or profits.
- (6) "Pre-war dependence" means the amount representing the annual value of the support afforded to or of benefits conferred upon a relative by an officer for a reasonable period immediately preceding the commencement of the war, or of his naval or military service, if later, exclusive, however, of any increase thereof due to circumstances arising out of the war in the case of entry into service or becoming an officer subsequent to the commencement of the war, and shall include the following—
  - (a) Amount regularly contributed by the officer if he received no material benefits in return therefor.
  - (b) Amount regularly contributed by the officer in excess of expenditure incurred on his account.
  - (c) Money value of any benefit conferred upon the relative by the officer.
- (7) "Certified" means, in respect of any medical certification, certified by a medical officer or Board of medical officers appointed for the purpose by the Admiralty or by the Minister.
- Minister.
  (8) "Prescribed" means prescribed by instructions issued by the Minister.
- instructions issued by the Minister.

  (9) "Wounds pension" includes wounds gratuity
- gratuity.
  (10) "The Great War" and "the War" shall have the same meaning as the expression "the present war" in the War Pensions Acts, 1915 to 1920.
- 24. The rates of retired pay, pension, and allowance specified in the Fourth Schedule hereto, and any retired pay, pensions, and allowances awarded under or by virtue of the Articles therein mentioned (hereinafter referred to as the scheduled rates), shall be deemed to be based on the cost of living for the year 1919, and shall be subject as prescribed to increase or decrease in accordance with the increased or decreased cost of living as compared with the cost of living for the year 1919, such increased or decreased cost being determined by a certificate to be furnished in January of the year 1923 and of each succeeding year for this purpose by the Minister of Labour: provided that the scheduled rates shall not be reduced below the minimum rates set forth in the second column of the Fourth Schedule thereto, and that no re-adjustment shall take effect before the 1st day of April,

There shall be no re-adjustment in the year 1923 unless the certificate of the Minister of Labour shows a difference between the cost of living in the year 1919 and in the year 1922 of at least 5 per cent., nor shall there be any re-adjustment in any succeeding year unless the certificate of the Minister of Labour shows that the cost of living for the previous year differs from the cost of living in the year as to which the last re-adjustment was made (or the year 1919 if there had been no re-adjustment) by at least 5 per cent. of the cost of living in the year 1919.

- "Cost of living" in this Article means the general cost of living of working-class families.
- 25. Where an officer is injured or killed in such circumstances that any retired pay, pension, allowance, or grant is pavable to or in respect of him under these Regulations or the

Order in Council to which they are annexed, and where he or his widow, child, or dependant receives compensation from or on behalf of a third party, for the act, omission, or circumstances which caused the injury or death, any such compensation may be taken into consideration in assessing any retired pay, pension, allowance, or grant which might be awarded to or in respect of the officer, and where the compensation is received after assessment it may be taken into consideration and the assessment may be amended or cancelled accordingly.

26.—(1) The rate of retired pay or pension or gratuity granted under these Regulations may be determined according to the temporary, acting, or local rank held by the officer at the time he was killed, wounded, injured, or removed from duty in consequence of disable-

ment.

(2) Any existing Regulations as to the relative or corresponding rank which should govern the rate of retired pay for a disabled officer or

pension for the widow or relative of a deceased officer shall remain in force and be applicable to grants made under these Regulations.

27. In special circumstances, to be determined by the Minister, the retired pay granted to an officer or any portion of it, may be sus-

pended or withheld.

28. Except as modified by these Regulations, any general conditions governing the grant, issue, and administration of retired pay to officers and of pensions to their families laid down in Orders in Council and King's Regulations and Admiralty Instructions issued by the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty shall remain in force and be applicable to grants made under these Regulations.

29. The Minister shall, subject to the provisions of the War Pensions Acts, 1915 to 1920, be the sole administrator and interpreter of these Regulations, and shall be empowered to issue such detailed instructions in reference thereto as he may from time to time deem

necessary.

THEREAS by subsection (2) of section five of the Petroleum (Production) Act, 1918, it is enacted that His Majesty may by Order in Council transfer to any Government Department or authority all or any of the powers conferred by the said Act on the Minister of Munitions:

And whereas it is expedient that all the said powers should be transferred to the Board of Trade, and, when so transferred, should, subject to the directions of the Board, be exercised through the Secretary for Mines:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

- 1. All the powers of the Minister of Munitions under the Petroleum (Production) Act, 1918, shall be transferred to the Board of Trade, and the powers so transferred shall, subject to the directions of the Board of Trade, be exercised through the Secretary for Mines.
- 2. All rights and liabilities acquired or incurred by the Minister of Munitions under licences granted in pursuance of the Petroleum (Production) Act, 1918, shall be transferred to the Board of Trade, and the Board of Trade shall, as respects such rights and liabilities, be deemed in law the successors of the Minister of Munitions.
- 3. This Order may be cited as the Petroleum Production (Transfer of Powers) Order, 1921.

HEREAS it is provided by section one of the Anthrax Prevention Act, 1919, that His Majesty may by Order in Council make provision for preventing the importation into the United Kingdom, either absolutely or except at specified ports and subject to any specified conditions as to disinfection and otherwise, of goods infected or likely to be infected with Anthrax:

And whereas it is further provided by the said section that an Order under that section may contain a declaration that goods of any specified class which are of any specified origin, or are exported from or through any specified country or place are goods likely to be infected with Anthrax, and that any such declaration shall be conclusive for all purposes:

And whereas it is further provided by the said section that an Order in Council under that Act may apply as respects any goods specified in the Order any of the provisions (including penal provisions) of the Customs Consolidation Act, 1876, or any Act amending or extending that Act, with respect to goods whereof the importation is prohibited under those Acts with such modifications as appear necessary or expedient:

And whereas it appears to His Majesty that the goods hereinafter described are goods likely to be infected with Anthrax:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, in pursuance of the powers conferred on Him by the said recited Act and of all other powers enabling Him in that behalf, to declare, and it is hereby declared:—

That all Goat Hair produced in or exported from or through India, and all wool and animal hair produced in or exported from or through Egypt, including the Anglo-Egyptian Soudan, and all goods mixed therewith are goods likely to be infected with Anthrax, and that such goat hair and wool and animal hair and all goods mixed therewith are referred to in this Order as "infected goods."

And His Majesty is further pleased, by and with the advice aforesaid and in exercise of the powers aforesaid, to order, and it is hereby ordered:—

- 1. Except at the Port of Liverpool, and subject to the conditions specified in the next following paragraph of this Order, the importation into the United Kingdom of any infected goods on and after the 1st day of June, 1921, is hereby prohibited, of the Customs and the provisions 1876, with resp the importation Consolidation Act, respect goods whereof prohibited under that Act are hereby applied to infected goods prohibited by this Order to be imported as if such goods were enumerated and described in the Table of Prohibitions and Restrictions Inwards contained in Section 42 of that Act.
- 2. (1) The conditions under which infected goods may be imported into the Port of Liverpool are the conditions following, that is to say:—
  - (a) All packages containing goat hair produced in or exported from or through India shall be secured by means of red lashing bands and shall be visibly and legibly marked with the letters and words "E:I. Goat Hair" or "E.I. Goat," and all packages containing wool or animal hair produced in or exported from or through Egypt (including the Anglo-Egyptian Soudan) shall be visibly and legibly marked with the letters and word "Egypt."

(b) The Importer of infected goods at the time of making entry of such goods with the Customs snall state in writing the country of origin and the true trade de-

scription of such goods.

(c) All packages containing infected goods shall when landed be placed together and shall not be mixed with any other goods, and shall be delivered to the Director of the Government Wool Disinfecting Station (Home Office) at Liverpool or any duly appointed agent of His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Home Affairs, who shall remove them to such station for disinfection.

(d) Infected goods shall not be removed from the said Station until the Director of such Station has issued a certificate that such goods have been disinfected; and if such goods are not removed by the Importer from such Station within 48 hours of the issue and delivery to him of such certificate such goods shall be removed and warehoused at the expense of the Importer as the said Secretary of State or his duly appointed agent shall from time to time direct. For the purposes of this condition such certificate if not delivered by hand shall be deemed to be delivered when the same is sent by post addressed to the Importer at his last known place of address in the United Kingdom.

(e) The Importer shall pay the necessary expenses in respect of any such removal to and from the said Station and of disinfecting the goods and of any such

warehousing after disinfection.

(f) If infected goods are lost, destroyed or daziaged, whether by fire or any other means whatsoever and, whether whilst being removed either to or from the said Station or at the said Station or being warehoused as aforesaid no claim for compensation shall be brought against His Majesty or any Officer or Servant of His Majesty or against the said Secretary of State or any of his Agents in respect of any such goods so lost, destroyed or damaged as aforesaid.

(2) If any of the foregoing conditions is not complied with in respect of any infected goods imported into the Port of Liverpool, section 42 of the Customs Consolidation Act, 1876, shall apply to such goods as if they were goods enumerated and described in the Table of Prohibitions and Restrictions Inwards contained in that section and as if the importation of such goods had been absolutely prohibited and the provisions of that Act with respect to goods whereof the importation is prohibited under that Act shall apply to such infected goods accordingly.
