ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF
AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 10TH MARCH 1921.)

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Destructive Insects and Pests Acts, 1877 and 1907, hereby orders as follows:—

The provisions of the American Gooseberry Mildew (Fruit) Order of 1915, and of Article 6 of the American Gooseberry Mildew Order of 1919, shall cease to operate as from the date hereof; provided that such revocation shall not—

(i) affect the previous operation of those provisions or anything duly done or suffered under those provisions; or

(ii) affect any right, privilege, obligation, or liability acquired, accrued, or incurred under those provisions; or

(iii) affect any penalty incurred in respect

of any offence committed against those provisions; or

(iv) affect any investigation, legal proceeding, or remedy in respect of any such right, privilege, obligation, liability, or penalty as aforesaid;

and any such investigation, legal proceeding, or remedy may be instituted, continued, or enforced, and any such penalty may be imposed, as if this Order had not been made.
