UNEMPLOYMENT INSURANCE
(DIRECTIONS TO COMMITTEES) REGULATIONS, 1921.

By virtue of the powers conferred on him by the Unemployment Insurance Acts, 1920 and 1921, the Minister of Labour hereby makes the following Regulations:—

1. The powers and duties of a committee to which a question has been referred by the Minister under Section 3 of the Act are as follows:—

(a) In the case of any applicant to consider and recommend whether he is—

(i) normally in employment such as would make him an employed person within the meaning of the principal Act; and

(ii) whether he is genuinely seeking whole time employment but unable to obtain such employment.

(b) In the case of an applicant who has been engaged in war service but who has failed to be employed in each of ten separate calendar weeks since the 31st day of December, 1919, in an employment which would have made him an employed person within the meaning of the principal Act if that Act had been in force throughout the year 1920, to consider and recommend whether his failure to be so employed is

(i) in consequence of the present war, and

(ii) due to circumstances not within his own control; or, if he is a disabled person,

(iii) due to his disablement;

and if the Committee is satisfied that the applicant's failure to be so employed was due to the causes aforesaid, to recommend whether in the opinion of the Committee the applicant should be treated as if he had been engaged as aforesaid although he has not in fact been so engaged.

2. Upon the consideration by a Committee of any case under these Regulations, if the applicant is an ex-Service man at least one member of the Committee shall, wherever practicable, be an ex-Service man, or if the applicant is a woman at least one member of the Committee shall, wherever practicable, be a woman.

3.—(1) Upon the consideration of any case under these Regulations by a Committee the applicant shall be allowed to be present, and may be represented by any person duly authorised by him in that behalf, and no application shall be refused unless the applicant has been given a reasonable opportunity to attend the meeting of the Committee and to state his case.

(2) If an applicant after having been given a reasonable opportunity to attend fails without good cause to do so the Committee shall not recommend that his application be granted.

(3) A Committee may vary or rescind any recommendation previously made upon fresh facts being brought to the notice of the Committee by the Minister, or upon good cause being shown for the failure of an applicant to attend the meeting of the Committee at which the recommendation was made.

4. In the exercise of the powers referred to in these Regulations a Committee shall have regard to the following directions:—

(1) An applicant shall not be considered to be normally in employment such as would

make him an employed person within the meaning of the principal Act unless such employment is his normal means of livelihood, and it shall not be sufficient to entitle him to be so considered if he proves only that he has been occasionally employed in such employment.

Provided that in the case of an applicant who became engaged in war service before the age of eighteen the applicant shall be considered to be normally in employment such as would make him an employed person within the meaning of the principal Act if he satisfies the Committee that he would normally seek his means of livelihood in such employment.

(2) Persons who by reason of their age or of physical infirmity not arising from war service are not capable of work under ordinary conditions and persons who though occasionally working as wage earners are not ordinarily dependent on wage earning employment for their means of livelihood, shall not be considered to be normally in employment.

(3) An applicant shall not be regarded as genuinely seeking whole time employment but unable to obtain such employment unless—

(a) he has within a reasonable period after becoming unemployed taken steps to obtain employment by registering at an Employment Exchange and otherwise, and

(b) he is available for whole time employment, and

(c) he has reasonable qualifications for the work he seeks, and is prepared, if such work is not available, to accept other work which would be suitable employment within the meaning of Section 7 of the principal Act.

(4) An applicant shall not be regarded as genuinely seeking whole time employment but unable to obtain such employment if within a period of six months before his application a claim by him to unemployment benefit or out-of-work donation has been disallowed on account of his refusal to accept suitable employment, unless the Committee is satisfied that since such claim was disallowed he has been engaged in regular employment such as would make him an employed person within the meaning of the principal Act.

(5) A Committee shall not recommend that a person who has not in fact been engaged during the ten separate calendar weeks required in his case by the Act should be treated as if he had been so engaged, if the Committee considers that the applicant might reasonably have been but has not been employed for some shorter period in an employment which would, if the principal Act had been in force throughout the year 1920, have made him an employed person.

(6) Failure to be employed shall not be considered to be in consequence of the present war unless the applicant proves that owing to his war services he has failed to secure or has failed to retain employment which but for his war service would normally have been available for him.

(7) Failure to be employed shall not be considered to be due to circumstances not

within the applicant's own control unless he satisfies the Committee that he has made every reasonable effort to obtain employment.

(8) Failure to be employed shall not be considered to be due to an applicant's disablement unless the disablement was caused by the war service of the applicant, and shall in no case be so considered if the applicant without reasonable grounds refused or failed to take advantage of any offer of training.

5. In these Regulations—

The expression "the principal Act" means the Unemployment Insurance Act, 1920.

The expression "the Act" means the Unemployment Insurance Act, 1921.

The expression "Committee" means any local committee to which questions may be referred under sub-section (5) of Section 13 of the principal Act or any sub-committee nominated by such Committee. Provided that any sub-committee constituted as aforesaid shall consist of not less than two persons (who need not necessarily be members of the Committee by which the sub-committee was constituted), and shall so far as practicable include at least one representative of employers and at least one representative of employed persons.

The expression "applicant" means a person applying for unemployment benefit under Section 3 of the Act.

The expression "disabled person" and the expression "person formerly engaged in war service" have the same meanings respectively as in the Act, and the expression "engaged in war service" and "war service" bear corresponding meanings.

6. These Regulations may be cited as the Unemployment Insurance (Directions to Committees) Regulations, 1921.

ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 18TH MARCH 1921.)

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

1. The restrictions on movement of swine imposed by the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908 and the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Application Order of 1917 (No. 1) shall not apply to the movement of swine from the sale mentioned in the Schedule hereto to any premises in Great Britain not being a Swine-Fever Infected Place, if the swine are accompanied by a licence in the Form F set forth in the First Schedule to the said Order of 1908, granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the county borough of Reading, and the following conditions, which shall be specified in the licence, are complied with:—

(i) The swine shall be moved to the place of destination specified in the licence and not elsewhere, and shall be there detained and kept separate from all other swine for twenty-eight days, unless they are slaughtered on such premises before the expiration of that period, or are moved under and in accordance with the conditions of a licence in the Form C set forth in the said First Schedule to a bacon factory or slaughterhouse in the same Scheduled Area.

(ii) The swine shall be moved by the nearest available route without unnecessary

delay, and during the movement shall, so far as is practicable, be kept separate from all swine not being moved with a licence under this Order.

(iii) After completion of the movement the licence shall forthwith be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest police-station in the same district by the person in charge of the swine at the time of completing such movement.

2. A copy of a licence issued under this Order shall be sent by the Inspector granting the same to the Local Authority of the District in which the place of destination specified in the licence is situate.

3. A licence under this Order shall for the purposes of the above-mentioned Orders be treated as a licence under those Orders.

GENERAL ORDER OF THE CENTRAL CONTROL BOARD (LIQUOR TRAFFIC) REGULATING THE SALE AND SUPPLY OF INTOXICATING LIQUOR ON GOOD FRIDAY IN ENGLAND AND WALES.

We the Central Control Board (Liquor Traffic) in pursuance of the powers conferred upon us by the Acts and Regulations relating to the Defence of the Realm hereby make the following General Order:—

Areas to which the Order Applies.

1. This Order applies to all areas or parts of areas situate in England or Wales to which the Defence of the Realm (Liquor Control) Regulations, 1915, have been applied.

Hours During which Intoxicating Liquor may be Sold on Good Friday.

2. The hours during which intoxicating liquor may (subject to the provisions of Article 3 hereof) be sold and supplied on Good Friday in licensed premises and clubs whether for consumption on or off the premises shall be as follows:—

(a) In the Welsh Area and the West Gloucestershire Area, the hours between 12.30 p.m. and 2.30 p.m. and between

7 p.m. and 10 p.m. for consumption on the premises, and the hours between 12.30 p.m. and 2.30 p.m. and between 7 p.m. and 9 p.m. for consumption off the premises.

(b) In each of the other areas, the hours during which by the provisions of Article 2 of the Orders of the Board for the said areas such sale or supply for consumption on or off the premises is permitted on Sundays.

And Article 2 of each of the said Orders of the Board shall be read as if the provisions of this Article were inserted therein.

Sale of Spirits for Consumption off the Premises Prohibited.

3. No spirits to be consumed off the premises shall be sold or supplied in any licensed premises or club or be dispatched or taken therefrom on Good Friday, and Article 3 of each of the said Orders shall be read as if the provisions of this Article were inserted therein.

The borough of Henley-on-Thames, the petty sessional divisions of Henley, and Watlington, and the parishes of Thame, Kingsey, Tetsworth and Attington.

In the administrative county of Buckingham:

The borough of Chepping Wycombe, the First Division of the Hundred of Desborough, the Hundreds of Slough, Burnham (including the Chesham Division), and Wycombe, and the Three Hundreds of Aylesbury (including the borough of Aylesbury, but excepting the parishes of Lower Winchendon, Waddesdon, Westcott, Fleet Marston, Quarrendon, Hardwick, and Weedon).

In the administrative county of Surrey:

The parishes of Frimley and Windlesham.

In the administrative county of Southampton:

The borough of Basingstoke, the petty sessional divisions of Odiham (except the parishes of Aldershot, Crondall, Long Sutton and South Warnborough), Basingstoke (except the parishes of Upton Grey, Tunworth, Weston Corbett, Weston Patrick and its detached part, Herriard, Ellisfield, Nutley, Preston Candover, Bradley, Woodmancott, and Popham), and Kingsclere;

In the administrative county of Middlesex:

The parishes of Harefield, Uxbridge, Hillingdon East, Hillingdon West and Cowley;

And also comprising:—

The county borough of Reading.

(3) A District comprising:—

The city of Salisbury and the boroughs of Chippenham, Devizes, Marlborough, Swindon and Wilton.
