RETAIL BESPOKE TAILORING TRADE BOARD (GREAT BRITAIN).

PROPOSAL TO VARY AND FIX MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES FOR MALE AND FEMALE APPREN-

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour and dated 31st October, 1918, the Trade Board established under the Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, for those branches of the trade specified in the Trade Boards (Tailoring) Order, 1919, which are covered by the Regulations made by the Minister of Labour and dated 12th December, 1919, with respect to the Retail Bespoke Section of the Tailoring Trade in Great Britain hereby give notice as required by Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, that they propose to vary certain General Minimum Time-Rates and Overtime Rates at present Fixed and set out in the Schedules to their Notices (R.B. 4.), (R.B. 6.), and (R.B. 7.) dated respectively the 4th June, 1920, the 15th July, 1920, and the 8th October, 1920, in their application to certain Male and Female Apprentices, and to Fix General Minimum Time-Rates and Overtime Rates for certain other Male and Female Apprentices, the Proposed Minimum Rates of Wages and the conditions attaching thereto being as shown in the Schedule set out below.

The Minister of Labour has given his consent to the issue of this Notice.

SCHEDULE.

PART I.

For the purpose of the application of the Minimum Rates of Wages for Male and Female Apprentices set out in this Schedule,

the following Definition shall apply:—
A Male or Female Apprentice is a worker

(a) Is employed during the whole of his or her time under an Indenture of Apprenticeship in the form set out in Part IV. of this Schedule, or in such other form as is in general conformity therewith which provides for the Apprentice being taught to make throughout the following garment or garments for not less than the appropriate period specified below:-

Male Apprentices.

Period of Garment or Garments: A pprenticeship. 5 Years Coats.

Breeches Trousers, Coats, 5 ,,and Waistcoats •••

Female Apprentices.

Male and Female Apprentices.

Any other combination of Garments not specified in this Part of this Schedule AND

(b) Has been registered with the Trade Board in accordance with rules from time to time laid down by the Trade Board, or has made application for such registration, which has been duly acknowledged and is still under consideration.

Provided that:-

(i) The registration may be cancelled if the other conditions of apprenticeship are not complied with.

(ii) An employer may employ a worker at the rates and under the conditions specified in this Schedule for apprentices without registration for a probationary period not exceeding three months, but in the event of such worker being continued thereafter at his or her employment as an apprentice, the probationary period shall be included in his or her period of apprenticeship.

Provided also that:

If a Male Apprentice, prior to being registered as an Apprentice under the provisions of this Schedule, has received continuous instruction in Retail Bespoke Tailoring at any Institution or School where there is a class for Retail Bespoke Tailoring which is approved by the Retail Bespoke Tailoring Trade Board (Great Britain), the period of apprenticeship applicable as specified in this Part of this Schedule shall, in such a case, be reduced by one year for every two School years during which the Apprentice has been so instructed subsequent to his attaining the age of 14 years, and that every two School years during which the apprentice has been so instructed at any such Institu-'tion or School shall be reckoned as one year of apprenticeship for the purpose of ascertaining the General Minimum Time Rate applicable to him under the provisions of this Notice during the period of his apprenticeship.

PART II.

Proposed General Minimum Time-Rates for Male and Female Apprentices.

Section I.—For Male and Female Apprentices as defined in Part I of this Schedule who are provided by the employer with (a) Board (Dinner and Tea) or with (b) Full Board and Lodging, the General Minimum Time-Rates shall be as follows:

Proposed General Minimum Time-Rates: Per week of 48 hours.

(a) Where employer provides Apprentice-with Board (Dinner and Tea).

During the 1st year of their Apprenticeship,

During the 2nd year of their Apprenticeship,

During the 3rd year of their Apprenticeship, :8s.

During the 5th year of their Apprenticeship,

(b) Where Employer provides Apprentice with Full Board and Lodging.

During the 1st year of their Apprenticeship,

During the 5th year of their Apprenticeship,

SECTION II.—For Male Apprentices as defined in Part I of this Schedule, other than Male Apprentices as specified in Section I of this Part of this Schedule, the General Minimum Time-Rates shall be as follows:

Proposed General Minimum Time-Rates:

During the 1st year of their Apprenticeship, 10s. per week of 48 hours.

During the 2nd year of their Apprenticeship, 12s, per week of 48 hours,

During the 3rd year of their Apprenticeship, 17s. 6d. per week of 48 hours.

During the 4th year of their Apprenticeship, 25s. per week of 48 hours.

During the 5th year of their Apprenticeship, 35s, per week of 48 hours.

Provided that notwithstanding anything contained in this Notice, Male Apprentices who are registered with the Trade Board as Apprentices under the provisions of Section II of Part I of the Schedule to the Board's Notice (R.B.4) dated 4th June, 1920, prior to the date on which the General Minimum Time-Rates set out in this Section become effective, shall be entitled to the appropriate General Minimum Time-Rates specified in Section II of Part I of the Schedule to the said Notice R.B.4 during the continuance of their apprenticeship in accordance with the conditions specified in the said Section.

Provided also that on and after the said effective date, the provisions of Section II of Part I of the Schedule to the said Notice R.B.4 shall cease to apply to any Male Apprentices other than those so registered with the Trade Board prior to such effective date.

SECTION III.-For Female Apprentices as defined in Part I of this Schedule other than Female Apprentices as specified in Section I of this Part of this Schedule, the General Minimum Time-Rates shall be as follows:-

Proposed General Minimum Time-Rates:

During the 1st year of their Apprenticeship, 8s. per week of 48 hours.

During the 2nd year of their Apprenticeship, 10s. 6d. per week of 48 hours.

During the 3rd year of their Apprenticeship,

17s. 6d. per week of 48 hours. During the 4th year of their Apprenticeship,

25s. per week of 48 hours. During the 5th year of their Apprenticeship, 34s. per week of 48 hours.

PART III.

Proposed Overtime Rates for Male and Female 'Apprentices.

SECTION I.—For Male Apprentices (as defined in Part I of this Schedule) employed on Time-work, Overtime Rates, calculated on the appropriate General Minimum Time-Rates specified in Section I or in Section II of Part II of this Schedule in the manner set out in Section II (A) of Part I of the Schedule to the Notice (R.B. 6), issued by the Trade Board dated 15th July, 1920, shall apply in substitution for the Minimum Rate which would otherwise be applicable, in respect of all hours worked, in accordance with the provisions of this Notice, in excess of the number of hours declared by the Trade Board in their said Notice (R.B. 6) dated 15th July, 1920, to be the normal number of hours of work in the trade.

SECTION II.—For Female Apprentices (as defined in Part I of this Schedule) employed on Time-work, Overtime Rates, calculated on the appropriate General Minimum Time-Rates specified in Section I or in Section III of Part II of this Schedule in the manner set out in Section II (A) of Part II of the Schedule to the Notice (R.B. 7), issued by the Trade Board dated 8th October, 1920, shall apply in substitution for the Minimum Rate which would otherwise be applicable in respect of all hours worked, in accordance with the provisions of this Notice, in excess of the number of hours declared by the Trade Board in their said Notice (R.B. 7) dated 8th October, 1920, to be the normal number of hours of work in the trade.

PART IV.

Proposed Form of Indenture of Apprenticeship.

This Indenture, made the day of , one thousand nine hundred and , between

of a minor of the age of years (hereinafter called the "Apprentice") of the first part,

of the parent or guardian of the Apprentice (hereinafter called the "Guardian") of the second part, and

carrying on business as Retail Bespoke Tailors at , hereinafter called the "Employers") of the third part;

Witnesseth as follows, that is to say:

1. The Apprentice of his/her own free will and with the consent of the Guardian hereby binds himself/herself to serve the Employers as their Apprentice in their trade of Retail Bespoke Tailoring for the term of years from the date of these presents.

2. In consideration of the covenants entered into by the Guardian and the Apprentice, the Employers hereby covenant with the Guardian and the Apprentice and with each of them severally as follows:—

- (a) That they will keep the Apprentice as their Apprentice during the said term, and to the best of their power, skill and knowledge, instruct the Apprentice or cause him/her to be instructed by a fully-qualified tailor or tailoress in the making throughout of the following garment/garments, namely,*
- *Here insert garment or garments which the Apprentice is to be taught to make throughout.

and in everything relative to the work of making and completing the said garment/ garments. (b) That they will pay to the Apprentice every week during the said term wages at not less than the appropriate Minimum. Rates of wages fixed or as varied from time to time by the Retail Bespoke Tailoring. Trade Board (Great Britain) for Male/Female Apprentices and made effective.

(c) That during the first three years of apprenticeship they will not require the apprentice to work in excess of the number of hours declared by the Retail Bespoke-Tailoring Trade Board (Great Britain) to be the normal number of hours of work in the

trade.

(d) That during the said term of apprenticeship they will not put the Apprentice on piece-work.

(e) That for any period or periods of absence from work during the first two years of apprenticeship through sickness, not exceeding in the aggregate three weeks in any one year of apprenticeship, they will on receipt of a medical certificate supplied by a duly qualified medical practitioner pay the Apprentice full wages in respect of such period or periods of absence from work.

(f) That if the Employers (or the survivor of them) shall die or become permanently incapacitated through illness or injury (to be certified by a duly qualified medical practitioner) or shall cease to carry on the said trade of Retail Bespoke Tailoring before the expiration of the said term of apprenticeship the Employers (or the survivor of them or their/his Executors or Administrators as the case may be) shall if requested so to do by the Guardian and the Apprentice find another suitable Employer for the Apprentice to take over this Indenture.

Provided that in the case of the retirement or death of a partner in a firm, the surviving partner or partners shall be deemed to be the employer or employers of the Apprentice for the purpose of this Indenture.

* The words in brackets should be omitted if the Employers are a Company incorporated under the Companies Acts.

(g) That they will not hold the Apprentice liable to make good the value of any work which the Apprentice may spoil, except in the case of wilful or malicious damage.

- (h) That they will afford facilities for the Apprentice to attend during the term of this Indenture such Technical Classes as may be agreed by the parties hereto for the instruction of the Apprentice in the art, craft or trade of Retail Bespoke Tailoring and that if such classes occur during the ordinary working hours the hours so spent shall be reckoned as hours of employment under this Indenture.
- (i) That they will not cause the Apprentice to suffer any loss of wages by reason of his/her attendance at any Technical Classes as aforesaid or by reason of his/her attendance at school in accordance with the provisions of the Education Act, 1918.

(j) That they will grant to the Apprentice without loss of wages the customary Public

and Statutory Holidays.

*(k) That they will provide the Apprentice with good and sufficient †full board and lodging, †dinner and tea.

* Strike out this Clause if not applicable: † Strike out words not applicable.

- (k)/(l) That they will supply to the Apprentice forthwith upon the execution of these presents a true copy of this Indenture.
- 3. In consideration of the premises the Guardian and the Apprentice respectively severally covenant with the Employers as follows:—
 - (a) That the Apprentice shall truly and faithfully during the said term serve the Employers as their Apprentice, and their secrets keep and shall diligently attend to the work to which he/she is apprenticed and at all times willingly obey the lawful and reasonable commands of the Employers, and shall not wilfully absent himself/herself from the Employers' service without leave.
 - (b) That the Apprentice shall not do any wilful damage or knowingly suffer any damage to be done to the goods or other property of the Employers.
 - (c) That the Apprentice shall willingly perform all workshop duties as are usually done by Apprentices.
 - (d) That the Apprentice shall attend such Technical Classes as may be agreed as provided in paragraph 2 (h) of these presents provided that he/she suffers no loss of wages by so doing.
 - (e) That save as otherwise provided in this Indenture, if the Apprentice shall at any time be absent from his/her duties (whether by reason of sickness or any other cause whatsoever) without the consent of the Employers, the Apprentice shall not be deemed to be employed during the period of such absence and shall not be entitled to any wages for such period.
 - (f) That the Guardian will during the term of apprenticeship provide the Apprentice with suitable clothes and all other necessaries (except board and lodging).*
- * Strike out the words in brackets if Employers do not provide board and lodging under this Indenture.
 - (g) That in case the Apprentice shall at any time during the said term be wilfully disobedient to the lawful orders or commands of the Employers, or be slothful or negligent or shall otherwise grossly misbehave himself/herself towards the Employers or their other employees then it shall be lawful for the Employers on notice in writing addressed to the Guardian of their intention so to do to discharge the Apprentice from their service.
- 4. In the event of any dispute arising involving allegations of unsuitability on the part of the Apprentice or of failure on the part of the Employers to instruct the Apprentice as provided for in this Indenture which cannot be settled between the parties hereto the Employers, the Guardian and the Apprentice respectively hereby severally and mutually covenant that the matters in dispute shall stand referred in the first instance to the Retail Bespoke Tailoring Trade Board (Great Britain) and any recommendations made by the Trade Board shall be considered by the parties hereto with a view to effecting a settlement thereof.

PART V.

The above Minimum Rates of Wages shall apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, to all Male and Female Apprentices of the classes specified above, in respect of all time during which they are employed in Great Britain, in any branch of Retail Bespoke Tailoring as defined in the Regulations made by the Minister of Labour and dated 12th December, 1919, that is to say—

Those branches of men's, women's, boys' and girls' bespoke tailoring in which the tailor supplies the garment direct to the individual

wearer and employs the worker direct.

A worker shall be deemed to be employed by the tailor direct, if employed by another worker in the employ of the tailor, to whom a minimum rate of wages fixed under the Trade Boards Acts is applicable, or if employed by a sub-contractor engaged in cutting, making or finishing garments exclusively for the tailor in the tailor's shop or in a building of which the shop forms part or to which the shop is attached;

Including:

(1) (a) The altering, repairing, renovating or re-making of men's, women's, boys' or girls' tailored garments where carried out for the individual wearer by a tailor who employs the worker direct as defined above.

(b) The cleaning of such garments where carried on in association with or in conjunction with the repairing, renovating or re-

making of the garments;

(2) The lining with fur of the above-mentioned garments where carried out in association with or in conjunction with the making of such garments;

(3) All processes of embroidery or decorative needlework where carried out in association with or in conjunction with the above-mentioned branches of tailoring;

(4) The packing and all other operations incidental to or appertaining to any of the above-mentioned branches of tailoring;

But Excluding:

 All or any of the above-mentioned operations where carried on in a factory where garments are made up for three or more retail establishments;

(2) The making of head-gear.

PART VI.

Section I.—The General Minimum Time-Rates set out in this Schedule are weekly rates, based on a week of 48 hours, and shall be subject to a proportionate decrease according as the number of hours of employment in any week is less than 48.

SECTION II.—The Minimum Rates of Wages set out in this Schedule shall be paid direct to the Apprentice by the Employers.

SECTION III.—The Minimum Rates of Wages set out in this Schedule shall be paid clear of all deductions other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments, or under the Unemployment Insurance Act, 1920, or deductions authorised by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any superannuation or other provident fund.

Section IV.—Subject to the provisions of Section II. of Part II. of this Schedule, nothing in this Schedule shall apply to Apprentices employed under an Indenture or Contract in writing respectively entered into prior to the date on which the Minimum Rates of Wages set out in this Schedule become effective, providing for the effective instruction of the Apprentice in making one or more of the garments specified in Part I. of this Schedule.

The Trade Board will consider any Objections to the above Proposals to Vary and Fix which may be lodged with them within two months from the 22nd March, 1921. Such Objections should be in writing and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her full name and address), and should be sent to the Secretary, Retail Bespoke Tailoring Trade Board (Great Britain), 5, Chancery Lane, London, W.C. 2.

It is desirable that the Objections should state precisely, and so far as possible with reasons, what is objected to.

DRESSMAKING AND WOMEN'S LIGHT CLOTHING TRADE BOARD (ENGLAND AND WALES).

PROPOSAL TO VARY THE MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES FOR FEMALE WORKERS IN THE RETAIL BESTCKE DRESSMAKING TRADE AND FOR CERTAIN OTHER CLASSES OF FEMALE WORKERS.

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour, and dated 31st October, 1918, the Trade Board established in England and Wales under the Trade Boards Act, 1918, and the Trade Boards (Women's Clothing) Order, 1919, as varied by the Trade Boards (Shirtmaking) Order, 1920, for Dressmaking and the Making of Women's Light Clothing as defined in the Regulations made by the Minister of Labour and dated 24th November, 1919, HEREBY GIVE NOTICE, as required by Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, the Minister of Labour having given his consent to such Notice of Proposal being given), that they PROPOSE TO VARY the General Minimum Time-Rates, Piece-Work Basis Time-Rates, and Overtime Rates for Female Workers at present fixed and set out in the Schedule to their Notices dated 21st May and 22nd November, 1920, and effective under-Orders of the Minister of Labour dated 18th May and 18th November, 1920, in their application to certain classes of Female Workers, so that, in lieu of such Minimum Rates, the General Minimum Time-Rates, Piece-Work Basis Time-Rates and Overtime Rates for the classes of Female-Workers specified in the Schedule set out below, shall be as shown therein.

PART V.

Definitions.

The Retail Bespoke Dressmaking Trade shall be deemed to be those portions of the Dressmaking and Women's Light Clothing Trade specified in the above-mentioned Regulations made by the Minister of Labour, and dated 24th November, 1919, in which the employer supplies the garment direct to the individual wearer and employs the worker direct.

A Fully Qualified Worker shall be deemed to be a worker who takes bodices, skirts, gowns, or blouses direct from the fitter, and makes them up without supervision other than the general supervision of the fitter or the work-room foreman or forewoman.

A Qualified Worker shall be deemed to be a worker who takes bodices, skirts, gowns, or blouses direct from the fitter and makes them up under supervision.

A Female Learner is a worker who:—

(a) Is employed by an employer who provides such Learner with reasonable facilities for practically and efficiently learning one of the branches of the trade as carried on by the employer, or the various processes involved in the making of any of the articles specified in the definition of the trade specified in Part VI. of the Schedule to this Notice; and

(b) Has received a certificate or has been registered in accordance with rules from time to time laid down by the Trade Board, and held subject to compliance with conditions specified in this definition, or has made application for such certificate or registration which has been duly acknowledged, and is still under consideration. Provided that the certification or registration of a Learner may be cancelled if the other conditions of learnership are not complied with.

Provided that an employer may employ a Female Learner on her first employment without a certificate or registration for a probation period not exceeding four weeks, but in the event of such Learner being continued thereafter at her employment, the probation period shall be included in her period of learnership.

Provided that, notwithstanding compliance with the conditions contained in this

definition, a person shall not be deemed to be a Learner if she works in a room used for dwelling purposes, and is not in the employment of her parent or guardian.

PART VI.

The above proposed Minimum Rates of Wages shall apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, to all workers in England and Wales of the Classes specified in this Schedule, in respect of all time during which they are employed in any branch of the trade specified in the Regulations made by the Minister of Labour, dated 24th November, 1919, as varied by the Trade Boards (Shirtmaking) Order, 1920, that is to say:—

Those branches of the Women's Clothing Trade that are engaged in the making of Non-Tailored Garments, namely, the making from textile or knitted fabrics of (a) non-tailored wearing apparel (other than hand-kerchiefs) worn by women or girls, or by children without distinction of sex, or (b) boys' ready-made washing suits or sailor suits, where carried out in association with or in conjunction with the making of garments to be worn by women or girls or by children without distinction of sex;

Including:

(1) All operations or processes of cutting, making or finishing by hand or machine of dresses, non-tailored skirts, wraps, blouses, blouse-robes, jumpers, sports-coats, neckwear, tea-gowns, dressing-gowns, dressing jackets, pyjamas, underclothing, underskirts, aprons, overalls, nurses' and servants' caps, juvenile clothing, baby-linen, or similar non-tailored articles;

(2) The making of field bonnets, sunbonnets, boudoir caps or infants' millinery, where carried on in association with or in conjunction with the making of any of the articles mentioned in paragraph (1) above;

(3) (a) The altering, repairing, renovating or re-making of any of the above-mentioned articles;

(b) The cleaning of any of the abovementioned articles, where carried on in association with or in conjunction with the altering, repairing, renovating or re-making of such garments;

(4) All processes of embroidery or decorative needlework where carried on in association with or in conjunction with the making, altering, repairing, renovating, or re-making of such articles other than hand embroidery or hand-drawn thread work on articles made of linen or cotton or of mixed linen and cotton;

(5) The following processes if done by machine: Thread-drawing, thread-clipping, top-sewing, scalloping, nickelling, and paring;

(6) Laundering, smoothing, folding, ornamenting, boxing, packing, warehousing or other operations incidental to or appertaining to the making, altering, repairing, renovating or remaking of any of the abovementioned articles;

But Excluding:

(a) The making of knitted articles; the making of underclothing, socks and stockings, from knitted fabrics; and the making from knitted fabrics of articles mentioned in paragraphs (1) and (2) above, where

carried on in association with or in conjunction with the manufacture of the knitted fabrics

(b) The making of gloves, spats, gaiters,

boots, shoes, and slippers;

(c) The making of headgear, other than the articles mentioned in paragraph (2)

(d) The branches of trade covered by the Trade Boards (Corset) Order, 1919;

(e) The making of rubberised or oilskin

garments;

(f) The making of women's collars and cuffs and of nurses' stiff washing belts where carried on in association with or in conjunction with the making of men's or boys' shirts or collars;

(g) Warehousing, packing and other similar operations carried on in shops mainly engaged in the retail distribution of articles of any description that are not made on the

premises;

And Excluding also:

(h) Any processes or operations included in the Appendix to the Trade Boards (Shirtmaking) Order, 1920.

PART VII.

Section I.—The above proposed Minimum Rates shall be paid clear of all deductions other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments, or deductions authorised by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any Superannuation or other Provident Fund.

Section II.—The above proposed Minimum Rates are without prejudice to workers who are earning higher rates of wages or to agreements made or that may be made between employers and workers for the payment of wages in excess of the Minimum Rates.

The Trade Board will consider any Objections to the above Proposal to Vary which may be lodged with them within two months from 23rd March, 1921. Such Objections should be in writing and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her full name and address), and should be sent to the Secretary of the Dressmaking and Women's Light Clothing Trade Board (England and Wales), 5, Chancery Lane, London, W.C. 2.

It is desirable that Objections should state precisely, and so far as possible with reasons,

what is objected to.
